Clarke, Grella, Kennedy and Prutton in the Scunthorpe squad. We then go on the road for two league fixtures before returning to SN1 for the Capital One Cup tie against Aston Villa. I am delighted to report that we are on track to be totally soldout for this fixture and The County Ground will rock once more.


Let's hope we can win today but above all else enjoy the game and keep the faith.


I have missed the past few games with injury but have had a great week with Claudio Donatelli and I have been working hard towards a full recovery. Nowadays you have to be very careful with hamstring injuries because you don't want to return to action too early and then 'bang' you are injured again with the potential for being out for even longer than before. We haven't spent any time at the training ground talking about that specific fact because it's just another game. People move on and that's football. We know coming into today's game that we have to press all over the pitch, be angry and fight for the ball. Our last few home games have been against teams at the lower end of the division and the results haven't been what we would have wanted.

Today we have to go out and believe we can win the game, try our absolute hardest and keep creating opportunities. Your support has been fantastic all season and please keep the noise going as we look for three points at The County Ground.

Town were drawn away at Leicester City at the fourth round stage and lost 2-0 at The King Power Stadium at the end of January. This season's first round tie will take place on Saturday 3rd November 2012 and ticket details will follow next week after the draw is made.



#### Keith O'Halloran...

A Republic of Ireland Under-21 international, O'Hallloran spent a short spell on loan with Scunthorpe during the 1995/96 season, making seven appearances on loan from Middlesbrough. He was brought to Wiltshire by Colin Todd in June 2000, making 48 appearances in midfield that season. An horrific leg break at Bournemouth in September 2001 spelled the end of his Town career. After nearly two years of rehabilitation and a number of reserve team games, O'Halloran was released. He later played for Shamrock Rovers in his native Ireland.

#### Frank Burrows...


A popular figure at both clubs, Burrows joined Scunthorpe in 1965 from Raith Rovers and made over 100 appearances in three years before joining Swindon for £13,000 in 1968. In his first season at the club, the centre-half was part of the side that won the 1969 League Cup and achieved promotion from Division Three. The Scotsman spent eight years at The County Ground, making over 350 appearances and scoring nine goals before moving onto the coaching staff.

#### Bob Smith...

SIGNED for the Iron from Manchester United in 1964, Smith made 82 appearances and scored 12 goals in three years at the club before departing for Grimsby Town. At the conclusion of his playing career, Smith moved into coaching and was appointed Town manager in 1978. His Swindon side challenged for promotion from Division Three before a successful League Cup run the following season. Under his stewardship, Town reached the semi-final, famously knocking out Arsenal in the quarter final before losing to Wolverhampton Wanderers.

#### Alan Sproates...

SPROATES was brought in during the summer of 1963 from Sunderland. In just over two years at The County Ground, the youngster rarely got a look in and made only five appearances before leaving for Darlington in September 1965. Town only won once when Sproates was on the field, a 2-0 win over Bury in December 1964. After a successful spell with Darlington, the midfielder spent the 1974/75 season with Scunthorpe, making 24 appearances before enjoying the twilight of his career in Australia and the USA.

# Chamological Chamber of the Chamber

I am really glad I chose to come to Swindon. I like it down here and I am settled too.

TEN years ago Jay McEveley made his debut for Blackburn Rovers in a League Cup tie against Walsall. At the time the defender was just starting out at Ewood Park after making the switch from Everton and he made a total of 15 appearances during the 2002/03 campaign which included lining up against Manchester United at Old Trafford.

His performance against the Red Devils caught the eye with a robust display against the likes of David Beckham and Ruud Van Nistelrooy. The future looked bright for the youngster who went on to feature against Manchester City and Tottenham Hotspur later in the same season. However, a series of injuries hampered the defender's progress and he was loaned out to Burnley, Gillingham and Ipswich Town before eventually leaving Ewood Park on a permanent basis - signing for Derby County for £600,000 in January 2007. He made over 100 appearances in a two-anda-half year stay with the Rams and after almost two years

with Barnsley, he arrived at The County Ground on loan in March of this year.

Callum Kennedy, who could line-up against the Robins this afternoon in Scunthorpe colours, and Alessandro Cibocchi both provided competition for the left-back slot last term but were ousted from the side following McEveley's arrival on loan. With both players having now departed SN1, the Liverpudlian has firmly established himself as Paolo Di Canio's first choice.

With 14 appearances to his name this season, the 27-year old is keen to help the Robins secure a second successive promotion for personal and professional reasons. After a testing ten-year career, the defender is now settled in Wiltshire and has his eyes firmly focused on success.

Let's start by talking about Wembley and your Town debut - which must feel like ages ago now...

It does seem like a long time ago and a lot has happened since then. I have changed



clubs, moved to Swindon permanently and we won the league last season too. I have done another pre-season since then but whilst it seems like a while ago, I have really enjoyed my time here at Swindon so far.

#### What do you remember from the final and were you surprised to be thrown straight into the line-up on your debut?

It was a surprise but it wasn't a bad place to make my debut. I am thankful to the manager for giving me that chance and it was a little weird going straight in, because it was difficult not knowing exactly how the team played. The understanding is there now but as a new player it takes a few weeks at least to get used to how everyone goes about their game.

#### If Carlsberg did loan spells, yours was probably up there with the best of them wasn't it?

You're right. Winning the league and playing in a cup final at Wembley is what most players would dream of from a loan spell but that's how it turned out. I did well enough that the manager wanted to sign me on a permanent deal as well and things have worked out for me.

#### How tough was the decision to join permanently?

You could see the way the club was going and Swindon's ambition was clear. The target is to get to the Championship as soon as possible and I want to help the club get there. The stadium and the lads here is set up for it and the faith the

manager showed in me was a big part of it too. That gave me a lot of confidence and I am really glad I chose to come to Swindon, I like it down here and I am settled too.


#### Your fitness has improved a lot since you first arrived and playing regularly has played a big part in that hasn't it?

We work hard not just in preseason but also in the weeks when we don't have a Tuesday game or a midweek game. Fitness is a big part of how we play and the manager and his staff always make sure the lads are in good condition. This is probably the fittest I have ever been for a good while to be honest with you and that's down to how the manager wants me to play. He wants me to overlap and get forward a lot. At other clubs that's not always the case - sometimes it's just give the ball to the winger and back them up. To be able to run up and down the wing for 90 minutes once or twice a week you have to be very fit.

#### It's fair to say there isn't a lot of down time at Swindon, but that all helps players' focus on and off the pitch...

You can't be off your game here. If you are not eating or drinking the right things then you're not on top of your game at the weekend. Everyone has to be on top of their game in training let alone in matches and if you do something wrong then you won't be in the team for the Saturday. There is pressure but there's a right way to go about things on and off the pitch and






that plays an important part in results and success for the team.

It's around ten years since you started out with Blackburn Rovers. How do you look back on that time of your career?

There's a little bit of regret really to be honest with you but that's mainly down to the injuries I had back then, which hampered me a lot. They stopped me from becoming a regular in certain places and I had two bad knee injuries during my time with Blackburn.




They stopped me pushing on to where I wanted to be and my career could have taken a different path. I could have been a regular Premier League player but things didn't go that way. I am happy with the way things have turned out though and I just want to get back to a good level and that for me now is the Championship.

#### In your opinion who has been the best left-back during the course of your career?

I am going to have to give you the obvious answer and that's Ashley Cole. He has been playing at the top level for years





and played in the Champions
League and Premier League
on a regular basis. Another
player to mention is Bainesy
(Leighton Baines), but he's only
now getting the recognition that
he deserves. I remember him
playing for Wigan Athletic in the
Championship and he carried
his form on for them into the
Premier League. He is doing well
and whilst his first season with
Everton was a bit stop-start, he
hasn't looked back since.

#### Do you think the time has come for Leighton Baines to become the regular left-back for England?

Looking at the San Marino game it looks like it's certainly in Roy Hodgson's mind. I wouldn't have any qualms about putting him in at international level ahead of Ashley Cole. It's all about form and not about names. You can't play players just on reputation, it has to be on form and if lads like Bainesy are doing it week in, week out for their clubs then they should be starting for England. That's how it is.

## You played for England at youth and Under-20 level, so you must have played with a lot of current England players?


I was in the England Under-21s with a lot of the lads who are now well established in the England side and in the Premier League. The likes of Glenn Johnson, Peter Crouch and Jermaine Defoe were all there at the time. I was in the Under-21 set-up when I was only 17-years old so a lot of people who are playing for England were there. It was a tremendous experience for me to go away and play with those guys.

#### You stated earlier that your target is a return to the Championship with Swindon. What do you make of the start to the season you've made?

We are only a few points off the top two and that's a great achievement. When you consider we aren't playing at our best at the moment in terms of playing consistently or fluidly, then there is more to come. It's been an odd week really results wise but we have to make sure we pick up extra points along the line. We know that if we can get a run going then there's no reason we can't make a big challenge for this league.

## Scunthorpe United are the opponents this afternoon and they come to The County Ground with a host of former Town players in their squad. It has the makings of a testing afternoon doesn't it?

This game starts a big week for us. There are three big games with Scunthorpe, Crewe and Stevenage and we know we have to make the most of the opportunity we have. Our season can take a path after these three games and we know that. If we can get six, seven or nine points then we can really make a statement. If we don't get the results then we could be hovering around the play-offs, just hoping or being in midtable. This squad of players is too good for that and we need to make sure that at the end of these three games we are going on an upward path.

#### Football costs money.

IT costs owners, managers and, most of all, it costs fans.

The BBC's thorough Price of Football survey, released on Thursday, detailed exactly what we can expect to fork out if we were to follow any one of 166 clubs across the United Kingdom.

And my does it make depressing reading.

Once upon a time this sport of ours was all about the people, yet now the cheapest ticket to a game of football in the top four divisions in England appears to be rising, on average, by more than five times the rate of inflation.

How can that be justified?

Well, it comes down to one thing - the pursuit of success. If you want a better product, as Paolo Di Cenio intimated in reports by the Adver and the Beeb during the week, you need to be digging a little deeper into your pockets.

But pockets only stretch so far before you're tearing through the lining of your trousers and grasping at thin air. Football needs to recognise that there will come a point where watching our national sport becomes too expensive for many supporters whose love for their local club runs deep in their blood following decades of family association.

To be fair to Swindon Town, prices at The County Ground have stayed where they were since last season - with the exception of a 20p rise in a cup of cha.

But elsewhere there seems to be little advocation for the soaring costs fans are expected to pay to see their team.

And this is what will damage local football in the very near future. Clubs must understand that for generations to continue to cheer on their community side, to forge a

heart-felt bond with their local team, it involves family encouragement.

That means father taking son, mother taking daughter - or vice versa - to games, actively encouraging the next breed of in our case Swindon fans to abandon the lure of Premiership outfits hundreds of miles away and instead root for the club on their doorstep.

But if mum or dad can't afford to bring their family along, what hope is there that youngsters will choose to follow a team who regularly face Carlisle and Gillingham rather than one who can count Manchester United and Chelsea among their arch-rivals?

We can all accept the expense of the game we love, we don't expect it to be served out for free, but there is a line to be drawn between reaching for the stars and distancing ourselves so far from the heartbeat of the sport - the fans - that the game dies inside.

The BBC's Price of Football survey once again showed that, without some sort of mediation, cost can spiral out of control. We see it in every walk of life, but let's not encourage it within our beautiful game.




# Premier Bound...

TOWN moved up to fifth in the table with this emphatic defeat of Notts County, through industrious midfield work by Micky Hazard, Martin Ling and Nicky Summerbee.

Feeling more pleased than most though would have been Kevin Horlock, making his League debut for Town and scorer of the fourth goal.

The game was almost a third of the way through before Ling slid home a Mitchell cross, then it was Mitchell's turn to beat Colin Calderwood to Summerbee's pass to nod home six minutes later.

The strike was Mitchell's eighth of the season. Shaun Taylor had a header cleared off the line, then just after the break Summerbee increased the margin to three, finishing a Craig Maskell cross at the near post.

Dean Thomas' deflected goal past Nicky Hammond for the visitors on 55 minutes heralded chances for Kevin Bartlett, Phil Turner, Gary Lund and Steve Slawson as County threatened.

But Town were not to be deterred. Weathering the potential come back, Horlock struck a thunderous right-footed drive past Steve Cherry on 79 minutes, before substitute John Moncur concluded the rout with three minutes remaining after further good work down the right by Mitchell.


A day earlier, Hazard had turned down a £130,000 move to his home town club of Sunderland, admitting to feeling unsettled that Town had actually accepted the bid.





**STFC** Academy manager Jeremy Newton talks about a busy week for Town's youngsters with Academy reviews and games against Tottenham Hotspur and Oxford United....

#### Academy Reviews...

THIS week at The County
Ground all Academy players aged
13 to 16-years old have been
through their six-weekly reviews
with their individual coaches. Jamie
Pitman, Academy Phase Coach,
has also been in attendance as
part of his new role with the club.

The new EPPP legislation states that all players in this age group have to have reviews every six weeks and these are written reports on the four-corner module: tactical, technical, psychological and physical. There is also an action plan given to players for them to follow up ahead of their next review. In addition, the coaches and the players have to agree a six-week achievable target, a medium target and a long-term target. These targets will be reviewed as part of each review.

#### Spurs to host Swindon...

STFC Under-16's side will play Tottenham Hotspur at their new training ground in Enfield this weekend. The training facility is a state of the art arena and will give the Town players an excellent opportunity to line-up against Premier League opposition. STFC have good working relations with Spurs as well as a number of other top-flight clubs and these games offer the players not only a challenge, but great experience.

## Player and coach packs...

THIS season all full-time Academy staff (Paul Bodin, Sean Wood, Jamie Pitman, Steve Hale and Jeremy Newton) have had an input into a new pack for both players and part-time coaches for the new STFC Academy. The players' pack is specific to each player and will include nutrition, hydration, fitness, technical and tactical information. For the coaches, the packs include a wide range of tactical and technical drills in order to work towards a uniformed understanding of the way the Academy wishes to play.

This is the first season that each and every Town Academy player will have received an individual player pack and it is an indication of just how in-depth the coaching programme is for young players at The County Ground. A huge amount of work goes in to developing each player, from part-time and full-time staff, as the Academy players work their way towards a two-year scholarship before a potential professional contract.

# The Promotion Story...

COYR continues the look back at Town's first promotion-winning season of 1962/63. The next month of that campaign saw Bert Head's men keep in touch with the top two in Division Three...

TOWN'S second fixture of a busy September schedule was a home tie against Brighton and Hove Albion, Cliff Jackson and Jack Smith both found the back of the net but Ernie Hunt stole the show with a hat-trick, capping a 5-1 rout.

Next up for Town came two trips to sides in the relegation places: Crystal Palace and Carlisle United. Two goal-less draws earned Swindon two away points.

On the 22nd September, Bert Head's side returned to winning ways against Wrexham at The County Ground, A goal from Roger Smart and a brace from Hunt securing a 3-0 win. A week later, Town travelled to Halifax Town, another side in the Division Three relegation spots. Jackson, Hunt and Smith all scored to put Swindon 3-0 up and cruising inside an hour at The Shay. In the last twenty minutes however, the Shaymen rallied and produced a stunning comeback sealing a 4-3 win in the 90th minute with a goal from Brian Redfearn.

In between times, the Robins beat Darlington 4-0 in a League Cup second round tie. Town's first home league fixture of October threw up a local derby against Bristol Rovers and the team responded well from their setback at Halifax. Cliff Jackson and Bobby Woodruff had the home side 2-0 up at the break before Jack Smith added a third with seven minutes to play, securing a 3-0 win for Town.

Table-topping Watford were the next visitors brushed aside at The County Ground. Arnold Darcy equalised before a late double from Jack Smith earned Town two vital points.

Three days later, Swindon travelled to Bristol Rovers for the return fixture, going down 2-0 at Eastville. Just four days later, Town faced Bristol City at Ashton Gate. Two goals up at the break through Cliff Jackson and Ernie Hunt, second-half goals from the home side pegged Swindon back, stealing a share of the spoils.

Town were sent crashing out of the League Cup, losing 5-0 at Notts County before welcoming Reading to The County Ground on the 20th October. Hunt opened the scoring for the Robins but an equaliser eleven minutes from time sent the visitors home with a point.


