



On injuries...

WE will be missing a few players through injury again this evening. Hopefully a few of the ones that are out tonight will be back over the next few weeks but we will have to make the most of what we have. Alan McCormack, Tommy Miller are out but Troy Archibald-Henville should be okay. The fixture schedule in England is heavy and we have had a lot of games recently, but we have a free week next week. The plan is that we will put the players through a mini pre-season which can help us going into the Christmas period because we want to be strong and fresh as we go through into January.

On Flint's red card...

I don't want to judge the decision. Aden Flint was booked and sent off in the last few games. In the second half we didn't challenge on the ground and he made a bad tackle. I don't want to judge whether it was a red card, but it destroyed the last half an hour. Perhaps it looked worse than it was but we have to respect the rules.

WE have to make a performance. Our record against high level teams is good and if we win then that would be fantastic. We must approach the game in the right way and a draw would not be a bad result.

Danny Wilson, who was manager during my time in Sheffield, will be back at Swindon tonight. I saw him at the LMA meeting at the start of the season and I have no problem with him. This evening I will smile and greet him because we will both be on the touchline as managers and have our jobs to do.

On early training...

WE had the players back in for training on Sunday morning at 7.30am, after going out of the FA Cup on Saturday to Macclesfield Town. I am the guide of the group and have to lead them. I have tried to encourage the players because the players have to understand what's going on. The session on Sunday was good but coming in early it was a punishment for them. I had warned the players prior to the games against Colchester, Leyton Orient and Macclesfield but they didn't listen and it didn't work as

we saw from the FA Cup result. The players have to understand what a privilege it is to be a professional footballer. We had a meeting with them on Sunday too and it was positive.

On the captaincy....

SIMON Ferry is a very intelligent guy and he deserved to have the captain's armband on Saturday against Macclesfield. We were without Alan and Tommy on Saturday and I chose Simon. He is fully committed all the time and this is why he will be captain again this evening.


In reflection...



IT was a very bad performance and we didn't play to the levels. We had a few chances in the first half but we didn't take them. I warned

the players that this game would be difficult. You can teach the young players but the older players – it's difficult to change the mentality. I said this would be a difficult game and I was right. I want to change the mentality here. In some way they did well until a few weeks ago, but I cannot accept with this kind of attitude. The first goal was from long distance and finished in the net but my goalkeeper should have saved it. It was a fantastic strike from distance with precision. It is typical to strike from distance in England.

Tonight it's back to the league against Sheffield United after what was a very disappointing day all round on Saturday in the FA Cup against Macclesfield Town...

IT was a shocking result at the weekend and the lads were pretty disgusted with the performance after the game in the dressing room. Macclesfield probably wanted it more than us and we do ourselves justice with a poor performance. We are all disappointed to be out of the FA Cup at such an early stage but we now have to get back to league duty and get things going again.

We will continue to work hard and hopefully with that sort of application and discipline we will continue to make strides in the league now.





The Scottish Under-21 international originally signed a one-year deal in August 2011 and made his debut against Brentford. The powerfully-built midfielder had spent time on trial with the Blades and impressed manager Danny Wilson enough to be offered a

contract. He began his career with Dundee and reportedly attracted interest from Celtic before signing for Burnley in 2008, making over 100 appearances for the Clarets, as well as having loan spells at Scunthorpe United and Notts County. The 23-year old has been regularly involved so far this term and has 17 appearances to his name.



Defender - Lecsinel Jean-Francois



THE defender will be well-known to Swindon Town fans after a successful spell here at The County Ground. The Haiti international signed for the Blades in the summer of 2011 and was Danny Wilson's first signing. The 26-year old made an impressive start to his Blades career before suffering a knee injury, which ended his campaign in March. He began

his career with Paris Saint-Germain and had spells with Sedan, Falkirk and Guingamp before arriving at The County Ground on trial in January 2009. In total he made 58 league appearances for the Robins. 
Club Connections...

A number of former Swindon Town heroes also played for tonight's visitors Sheffield United. Here are profiles of some performers who have played for both clubs...

Steve Foley...

AFTER graduating from Liverpool's academy, Foley came to Sheffield United via Grimsby, signing for the Blades in 1985. Two years and 66 appearances later, Lou Macari brought Foley to Swindon in June 1987. In a five year spell at The County Ground, Foley made nearly 180 appearances for the Town, notching 29 goals. He played 90 minutes of Swindon's play-off final win over Sunderland in 1990. In February 1992, he was sold to Stoke City.

signed for Town ahead of the 1977/78 season. In four years at the club he was part of the side that reached the semi-final of the League Cup in 1980 before returning to Portsmouth. Lou Macari brought him back to The County Ground in 1985 where he played a part in Town's back-to-back promotions from Division Four to Division Two. In the summer of 1988 he joined Stoke and went on to play for Leeds before joining Sheffield United and playing 24 times for the Blades.





Ray McHale...

SHEFFIELD-born McHale joined
Town from Halifax in September 1976.
He made over 200 appearances
and scored 42 goals from midfield.
Was part of the Swindon side that
reached the League Cup semi-final in
1980 before moving to First Division
Brighton. In 1982, McHale joined
Sheffield United. In three years at
Bramall Lane, he made over 60
appearances.

Jan-Rage Fjortoft...

SWINDON'S big money signing of 1993/94, Fjortoft joined from Rapid Vienna for a fee of £500,000. After a slow start to his Town career the Norwegian scored 13 goals in 17 games as Town were relegated from the Premier League. Known for his 'Aeroplane' celebration, Fjortoft carried his scoring streak into the next season. This attracted interest from bigger clubs & he was sold to Middlesbrough for £1.3 million in March 1995. He joined Sheffield United in 1997 and made 34 appearances, scoring 19 times.



To play a part in another promotion for Swindon this year would be special.

ONE of the most experienced players in the Town squad, Paul Benson is hoping to add a fourth promotion to his CV by helping the Robins to League One success this term. With nearly 100 goals to his name in less than 250 league appearances, his knowledge of the net could be a vital component as the fixture schedule steps up a gear towards the hectic Christmas period.

Benson knows all about hard graft. A late starter in the professional game, he was rejected by Southend United as a youngster before making a name for himself with non-league side White Ensign.

107 goals in 65 games was enough to convince John Still, then manager of Dagenham & Redbridge, to take a look and the rest – as they say – is history.

Fast forward seven years and the striker can be found in typically accommodating mood a few hours after training with the Robins' squad ahead of Town's FA Cup clash with Macclesfield Town. Benson has certainly made his mark since joining

the club in a swap deal back in January that saw Leon Clarke return to London following an ill-fated spell along the M4. Benson's first goal secured the FA Cup third round win over Wigan Athletic before he was named Player of the Month for February after five goals in six games to add further fuel to Town's promotion steam train.

He finished the 2011/12 title winning season with 13 goals from 29 games and has three to his name so far this term. As the Robins prepare to continue their League One journey, Benson sat down with the official matchday programme to give his take on all things STFC and beyond...

How would you assess the season so far for the team?

It's been a bit up and down. There have been some very good performances as well as some disappointing displays. At home we haven't really got going and have been below par in certain home games and unfortunately we haven't been able to continue the good form that we had at The County



Ground last season. However we are in seventh position in the league and go into the Sheffield United game on the back of a big league win at Stevenage. At the moment we have 25 points from 15 games and that's not too far off where we need to be really.

You played in League One a few years back with Charlton Athletic. How would you compare the strength of the division from then to now?

When I was at Charlton in League One there were some very big sides in the division. I think sometimes you can be misled by the size of the club and their ability. Look at Bradford City: they are a massive club but find themselves in League Two. Stevenage are not as big a club but have made a great start to the season and Crawley are up there too. There may not be the big clubs that were in the league a few years back, like Norwich, Sheffield Wednesday or Leeds United, but it's a tough division to get out of, as it's a very competitive one.

Town's last League One game was the 4-0 victory at Stevenage ten days ago. There were changes to the side that day yet the result was an emphatic one. Does that re-iterate the strength of the squad?

It goes to show that if you can find that level of performance then you have a chance in any game, no matter who it's against or what team is put out. I don't think the side that went out against Stevenage was a


weakened side. John Bostock is one of the better players in this league and Raffa came into the side and did what he usually does and put in a performance. Miles started his first game for the club and grabbed a goal as well. He did really well and it was one of those matches where a lot of the lads were at the top of their game and went out with the right attitude.


Talking about Miles Storey, he has really shone over the last few weeks...

He had an unbelievable week last week didn't he? Some professional players can play their entire careers and not have a week like he did. He scored on his full debut at Stevenage and then came off the bench to score twice against a Premier League side in the cup. He won't forget that in a hurry! He has done really well and stuck at it too. He has worked hard in training and I am sure he will remain focused. The gaffer has done a great job of keeping his feet on the ground and he's being managed well. The players and management have a role to play and he's shown what he can do over the last few games.

What is the most memorable week of your career to date?

I remember one week when I was at Dagenham where I played in a 5-3 win against Torquay on the Saturday and then scored four against Shrewsbury the Tuesday after. That was probably the top of the tree for me in terms of scoring goals; I think I finished that season with 22 goals.





You came into the professional game late didn't


That's right. I didn't come in until I was 24-years old with Dagenham. I played for Southend as a kid and then was released and didn't get back into the pro game until John Still gave me the opportunity. It makes me appreciate football more and that's why I try and work as hard as I can in training and in games. I have had a nine-tofive job so I know all about life away from the football world. Being a professional is hard work




because there is a lot involved in terms of training and the physical demands, but it's all worth it. I say all this tinged with a bit of regret because I wish I had come into the game a lot earlier, but seeing it from the other side has made me realise that I am very lucky to be doing what I am doing.

Promotion this season is the target and should that happen, it would mean back-to-back successes for you as well...

It would be special that's for sure. I had a double promotion with Dagenham and that was an unbelievable feeling. I played for them in the Conference right through to League One. It was nice to play some part for Swindon last year but the club






would have gone up last season whether I had signed or not. This season it would be nice to play some sort of part in helping the club to the Championship and that would mean a lot to me.


There is plenty of competition for the striking places. What's your take on the current crop of frontmen?

We have a fantastic bunch of lads here. I roomed with 'Colio' in pre-season in Italy and got on really well with him - he's a great guy. 'Willo' is fantastic too, 'Roons' has been a good addition since he arrived too. Miles has come in and done well and he has a lot of potential. I get on well with all the forwards and I am enjoying the competition for places that we have here.

Sheffield United stand in the way of three points this evening. There probably won't be a bigger test at home this year will there?

They are a big side and a good side as well. They have a great manager who will be known by all the Swindon fans. He is steering them in the right direction and they were unlucky not to go up last year. It's always tough to bounce back after such a setback but they have made a great start and are doing well. They find themselves in a nice position in the league and they look strong across the pitch. It's going to be a tough test for us but hopefully if we can perform to the levels we know we can do. then we will put ourselves in with a chance of winning. It's going to be an interesting game, but hopefully an exciting one too.









Wherever you turn at the minute there's a massive game for Swindon Town.

FIRST it was the trip to high-flying Stevenage, then the high-profile clash with Aston Villa. Now, after our FA Cup adventure ended so miserably before it even began, the visit of Sheffield United is the perfect chance for the Robins to get back on track.

And, just as if life needed an extra dollop of drama at present, this evening marks the return of a former manager to The County Ground dug-outs.

Danny Wilson is remembered in a variety of lights by Town fans.

Many have struggled to forgive him for the way the Swindon team under him capitulated in 2010/11 and drifted rudderless towards relegation.

I take a very different stance. Danny brought great success to Town during his one full season in charge, he brought smiles to Swindon faces and an attractive brand of football to a club which had endured a difficult couple of years.

He was the man who brought you Austin and Paynter, Ferry and Douglas, plucked Danny Ward from obscurity and got the best out of Jon-Paul McGovern despite fractious beginnings.

The trouble is in football, as in most walks of life, that it's easier to remember the negatives. They hold a poignant and powerful punch.

For whatever reason, in his third season in Wiltshire it all went wrong for Danny Wilson and Swindon Town. Whether that was down to the management, the players, tactics or culture is up for debate, but at the end of it all Town finished dead last without

so much as a whimper.

That's what people remember. They forget the 6-0 aggregate victory over Leeds, giddy success at Southampton, that barmy night at The Valley and the pride of seeing the Robins

crest dangling from a giant balloon at Wembley.

They forget the crisp passing, the sensational forward play and the resillence in defence which handed Swindon their equal best league finish for more than a decade.

I hope when Darny returns this evening with a Sheffield United team he is moulding into real title-challengers he is given the reception his entire time in Wiltshire deserves.

From a personal point of view he was a pleasure to work with, even if we did not always see eye to eye, and as a fledgling reporter starting out in the industry he imparted to me a few nuggets of wisdom which I still value today.

Of course, we want him to go home miserable tonight, but for all the right reasons.







WHEN Craig Maskell opened the scoring against Barnsley with just four minutes gone, few suspected that the majority of the play would take place in Town's own half.

With penalty ace Paul Bodin injured, Maskell collected his thirteenth goal of the season after Gary Fleming had floored Nicky Summerbee, but from then on there was only one contender for man of the match.

First Colin Calderwood cleared a Gerry Taggart in-swinging corner off the goal line, then Town keeper Nicky Hammond took centre stage.

Hammond twice foiled Andy Liddell and stopped further goal bound efforts from Owen Archdeacon and future Town defender Mark Robinson.

Wayne Biggins, with four goals in as many matches, tested the in-form goalie with a 25 yard free-kick which Hammond first punched clear before parrying Taggart's follow up.

The Adver gave Hammond a perfect ten, while local MP Simon Coombes presented the traditional champagne after the stopper left the pitch to a standing ovation.

Hammond paid tribute to Fraser Digby for his performance.

'I did play well – but it's a case of having to with the competition from Fraser. I know that if not I will be out of the side.'

Manager Hoddle however was hardly effusive.

"Nicky Hammond did his job. He is paid to stop the ball going in the net, and everything that hit the target he was there to save."

The boss made a point of shaking the hand of each of the opposition at the end, but Barnsley playmaker Neil Redfearn said 'The gesture impressed us, but we still can't believe we fost'.

The hard fought victory hoisted Town to second in the table.

Shining bright...

After 50 years of service, the floodlights at SN1 are now part of a dying breed...

THE County Ground has seen many great nights played out under the floodlights. With the once commonplace floodlight pylons slowly becoming more scarce as stadiums nationwide are updated or rebuilt, the pylons at SN1 proudly remain as a reminder of a bygone era.

The first floodlights were installed in 1951 but they could only be used for friendly matches or reserve team games until they were improved. The first match played under floodlights at The County Ground was on the 29th February 1956 when Millwall were the visitors for a rearranged fixture. A Maurice Owen goal earning Town a 1-0 victory. Swindon were second only to Portsmouth to stage a floodlit League game but within weeks, the Players Union had vetoed the idea of floodlit matches demanding extra pay for their members to be involved.

The current pylons were installed in 1960 and used

for the first time on the 28th September. Unfortunately, the lights did not prove to be a good luck charm the second time around as Swindon were beaten 2-1 by Watford.

They are 120 feet high and originally housed twenty-four 1,500 watt lamps and cost £15,000 to erect, most of which was funded by the Supporters Club. The system was upgraded in 1975 and again in 1992.

Today, the floodlights are constantly maintained to ensure they comply with Football League regulations. In addition to checking the pylons to ensure they are structurally sound, the average Lux level must also be checked. The minimum average Lux level for Leagues One and Two is 350 and at the last





reading, The County Ground lights are at an average level of 380 Lux. The minimum level for clubs in the Championship and the Premier League is 500 and 800 Lux respectively meaning that with the potential of promotion and the prospect of higher level football at some point in the future. The County Ground will – quite literally – be a brighter place.


