




afcb chairman EDDIE MITCHELL



FORM


Swindon travel south today in scintillating form, with four straight wins behind them.

After winning the League 2 title last season, they carried on their form in to this one.

Early on in the season they also enjoyed a great run in the League Cup, winning at Premier League side Stoke before finally going out in the fourth round.

There was a drop in form in late November, but they have responded to that in emphatic style. After a 1-1 draw against Doncaster on 8 December. they won 2-0 at Oldham in their last away game and have played at home in their last three. The first two of those ended in 5-0 wins over Tranmere and Portsmouth, and they could have won by the same scoreline last Saturday against Carlisle, having to settle in the end for a 4-0 win.

Swindon are in fifth place in the table and have taken 45 points from 25 games and have an impressive goal difference of plus 28.



MANAGER **PAULO DI CANIO**

As a player, Paulo played for the likes of Lazio, Juventus, Napoli, Milan, Celtic, Sheffield Wednesday, West Ham and finished his playing career at Cisco Roma.

He was appointed as manager at Swindon in May 2011 and immediately changed the club's fortunes. In his first season in charge, he led them to the League 2 title with 93 points and also a trip to Wembley in the JPT Final.

The elevation to League 1 has been a smooth transition, with Swindon playing a style of attacking football that mirrors Di Canio as he looks to lead the Robins to a successive promotion.

HE PLAYED FOR BOTH CLUBS

ALAN CONNELL

Striker who started his career at Ipswich, before joining Bournemouth in 2002, enjoying a great start to his Cherries career before suffering a serious injury. He spent three years at Bournemouth before a season at Torquay, Hereford and Brentford. He returned to Bournemouth in August 2008, but was unfortunately injured in his first training session. He did play his part in the club staying in the league and then gaining promotion, scoring the second goal at Burton and twice in the final home game in 2010 against Port Vale. He moved to Grimsby in 2010 and was a huge success and was quickly snapped up by Swindon. He then played a big part in the Robins promotion last season. He is now at Bradford City.





25 August 1923, Division Three (South) Swindon Town 3 Bournemouth & Boscombe Athletic 1 This was a truly historic day in the history of the Cherries as they played in the Football League for the first time. A week later, Swindon provided the opposition for the first home game, with that one finishing 0-0.

22 September 2012, noower League 1 Swindon Town 4 AFC Bournemouth 0

The Cherries had few complaints about the margin of the final score as a rampant Swindon were excellent in this game. Two goals from Matt Ritchie and strikes from Andy Williams and Adam Rooney gave the Robins their first win over the Cherries since 2007



Highly rated 21 year old London born keeper, who started his career with Fulham and gained experience in 2010 on loan at Bromley. He also represented England at Under 16, 17 and 19 level.

After many years at Craven Cottage, it was at Crystal Palace where he signed his first professional contract. Whilst at Selhurst Park, he gained more valuable experience at Bromley again, Boreham Wood and Histon, before joining Swindon on loan in October 2011.

He made a big impression during his loan spell, keeping a number of clean sheets and signed permanently in January last year.

He was firmly established as the first choice keeper at the club and made 41 appearances last season as he enjoyed a promotion season.

This season has seen him make 31 appearances so far and he is currently in fine form, having kept four clean sheets in his last four appearances.


EXPERIENCED CAPTAIN: ALAN MCCORMACK

Dublin born player who is club captain at Swindon and can play in defence or midfield.

The 26 year old started his career at Preston North End, spending five years as a professional at Deepdale. His appearances were limited for the Lilywhites, but he did gain experience during loan spells at Leyton Orient, Motherwell and two at Southend.

In 2007, he made the switch to Southend a permanent one and went on to play a major part in the side from 2007 to 2010. playing alongside a number of players who would go on to play for Bournemouth. He made 130 league appearances for Southend before in 2010, along with his United teammate Simon Francis, signed for Charlton.

After a season at the Valley, he signed for Swindon in July 2011 and quickly established himself in the side as he gained a League 2 championship winning medal. He has been a major part of the the year last season.

THE DANGER MAN: MATT RITCHIE

Talented winger who can look back at a tremendous performance against Bournemouth earlier this season.

Gosport born, he started his career at Portsmouth, but most of his senior appearances came during loan spells away from Fratton Park. His first loan spell could have come here at Bournemouth as he came here on trial alongside Joel Ward. Ward did sign for the season, but Ritchie stayed at Portsmouth, going out on loan later for the rest of the campaign at Dagenham.

During the next season, he signed at Notts County on loan before moving to Swindon on loan in February 2010. He moved back to the County Ground in the October on loan, scoring against Bournemouth in his second game of that spell.

He signed permanently for the Robins in January 2011 and was soon on target against the Cherries again in a 3-2 defeat in their last game here.



DANGER ON THE LEFT WING: RAFFAELE DE VITA

25 year old Rome born winger, who has spent his football career in the UK. He started at Blackburn Rovers, coming through the club's youth academy before signing as a professional in 2006.

After not breaking in to the Rovers first team, he moved north of the border and signed for Livingston. He spent three years at the Scottish club and became a firm favourite, scoring 21 goals in his 67 league appearances for the Lions.

De Vita signed for the Robins in June 2011 and he played a starring role in last season's title winning campaign.

This season has seen him make 22 appearances and he is showing fine form of late. He netted both goals in the 2-0 win at Oldham, scored the second in the 5-0 win over Tranmere and then last Saturday, scored the fourth in the emphatic victory over Carlisle.


Despite being just 26, Williams has already made 322 appearances in his career.


He started his career with his home town club, Hereford United, going on to quickly establish himself in the first team. In 2007, he signed for Bristol Rovers, and spent three twice on loan, before in July 2010, signed for Yeovil.

It was last season that he hit the headlines when in a golden 14 game spell, he scored an impressive 12 goals.

He signed for Swindon in the summer and has been a big hit at the County Ground. He scored his first goal for the club at Portsmouth and then scored his first home goal against Bournemouth soon after.

He is currently on eight goals, and included in that tally are braces against Portsmouth on New Year's Day and again on Saturday against Carlisle.





IN FORM STRIKER:

Currently enjoying a fine spell in front of goal is striker Jim Collins. The 22 year old is a product of the Aston Villa academy, but it was a move to Shrewsbury in January 2011 that saw his senior career take off.

He scored eight goals in the remainder of that season as the Shrews reached the League 2 play-offs.

He enjoyed another tremendous season last time out, scoring 16 goals as Shrewsbury celebrated promotion along with Swindon.

He started this season in League 1, but not with the Shrews, after making the switch to Swindon

In 28 appearances this season, he has grabbed 13 goals, including a hat trick at Premier league Stoke in the Capital One Cup and five in his last two games, with Collins hitting four goals in 22 minutes against Portsmouth on New Year's Day.


WE SAID "I was pleased with the point and more pleased with the performance. I thought we were excellent in the second half. It was never going to be a free flowing football match. It's a tight pitch and whenever you go to Griffin Park, it's always a battle. It was a little too frenetic in the first half so we had to adapt. We had great chances in the second half and we are kicking ourselves that we didn't take one of them. We grabbed the initiative in the second half and really should have won. I was pleased with the players' attitude and commitment to the cause." Eddie Howe

THEY SAID "Today, you could see the Christmas programme took its toll on us. I felt we were not as fresh, as mobile, as energetic, as sharp mentally as we normally are. The first half was not a great game of football in general. Both teams cancelled each other out. Second half I felt we were in the game. I went for it in the last 20 minutes, playing two strikers, and it nearly cost us the game. It allowed them to take over and they had some big chances. When you can't win, make sure you don't lose and 18 months ago we would have lost that game." Uwe Rosler









After coming on late in recent games after recovering from injury, midfielder Richard Hughes was thrust in to the starting eleven last week at Wigan.

He showed all his experience with a masterful display, controlling much of the game, and would have played the full 90 minutes if not for a nasty gash to the head late on.

With so many games in a short period of time, preparation time has been at a minimum, with just a few days for the midfielder to get ready for the cup tie, "It is difficult at

this time of year because of the sheer volume of games," said Hughes, "It wasn't until the Friday that we had the opportunity to work on what we were going to do because Thursday was a recovery day. The gaffer pulled me over and told me I was going to play behind Harry and Eunan, so we only had the one day to work on it. With the whole

team as confident as they are and playing the way they are, it is easy to come in to this sort of environment and it was very enjoyable."

It was hard to imagine that it was his first start since October 2012, and Richard was pleased with his contribution, but was as modest as ever, "I have to be honest and say that there were other players who I felt

played much better and that was my take on it. For me it was very difficult to point out individuals when it was such a good team performance. Whether it's getting on the ball and making things happen or whether it's sacrificing yourself for the team. For example, you look at Matt Tubbs up front on his own, making himself the extra man in midfield by tracking back. He made Harry and Eunan's job easier, therefore making my job easier also. It was a team effort because you could go through everyone and talk positively about their contribution. A team is only as strong as the weakest link in the chain, and there were no weak links. Personally, with the type of player that I am, it's impossible for me to be effective if the team is not doing the same thing and visa-versa."

Hughes not only had praise for the players on the pitch, but to those who organise things off the pitch, "Credit to the manager because he

was unfortunate, but just one of those things. It was two players going for the ball and it was one of those situations where I knew straight away that there was contact as I was a little dazed and stunned. The next thing I knew there was claret everywhere and not being horrible, I was hoping it was his! I looked down and unfortunately it wasn't and I knew my game was over then with the amount of stitches and treatment required and only two minutes left. I was pleased though that hamstring and fitness wise, I came through unscathed."

There has been no time to relax since the game at the DW Stadium or even the replay as the team have been preparing for the massive clash with Swindon. Hughes missed the game at the County Ground but was at the game and saw the Cherries slip to 18th place in the table.

A fantastic run of form has seen Bournemouth rise in to the top

of us and deservedly so. It is up to us to claw them back. Swindon are one of those teams, and they were very good when we played them in September. They were excellent and the four goals between the two teams was a fair result. They were simply much better than us on the day. They are the only team this season that have got any sort of result like that against us, other defeats have usually been by the odd goal.

"We are a different team now and we are approaching games in a very different way. We had a lot of injuries for that game as well, so we go in to today in clearly better spirits. We know we have to perform to our maximum. The manager has reminded us all week in training that today will be our toughest game of the season. He said it before Brentford and he said it before Wigan, and he means it. He is not saving it for effect, this is the truth and everyone is up for this game."



the big man talks

to David James - PART TWO

SF: You got in to the Watford team at an early age.

DJ: I made my debut against Millwall at home and we lost 2-1 with Teddy Sheringham being credited the winner, although it was never a goal. I was chucked in and because we lost, I thought that would be it for me and I would be left out. In the second game of the season we played Plymouth and I was in again and we drew 1-1. I came out for a punch and nearly scored an own goal, but also made a good save. I thought though after the game that I would be dropped after the bad punch, so I was constantly on the edge, but stayed in the side. Colin Lee was the manager and I went to see him about a new contract. He said that after I'd played ten games, he would consider it. This was more to do with what other people were telling me to do.

SF: You had broken in to the first team so you must have thought you deserved a better contract.

DJ: Not after four games, it was just people telling me what to do. Colin Lee was sacked and I didn't sign a new contract. I played every game that season. I was advised by a bad agent not to sign a contract. For me, it was about staying down south, and I would have been happy

doing that. I had spent seven years at Watford and loved it there. Liverpool came in, so I saw out the following season and signed for them in 1991 under Graeme Souness.

SF: That must have been incredible to go to a club of such stature.

DJ: To be honest, I just saw it as a bigger Watford. I was 21 and signed for Liverpool for three years and never looked beyond that. I was interested in clubs like Liverpool when I was at Watford, but more interested in how Watford were doing than who was winning the Premier League. It didn't take me long to realise that Liverpool was a different place to Watford.

SF: Did you get straight in to the team at Liverpool?

DJ: Yes, by chance because
Bruce Grobalaar went off for an
international with Zimbabwe. I
started the first game, the first game
to be shown live on Sky and Teddy
Sheringham scored the winner
again and he was proving to be my
nemesis. I played the first 12 games
and progressively got worse because
I didn't fully understand what was
going on. It was a completely new
environment, it was a different world.
Gradually through the course of the
season I got another chance and
things worked out ok. I foolishly

got sent off with two games left which meant I couldn't play at the start of the next one and I didn't play for about eight months.

SF: Who was in goal at the time?

DJ: Bruce Grobalaar and Mike Hooper. Graeme Souness got the sack and Roy Evans was appointed. I got another chance and then rarely missed a game for the next four years.

SF: In what year did you leave Liverpool?

DJ: I left in 1999.

SF: Why did you leave?

DJ: Brad Friedel had been brought in and I wasn't the first choice goalkeeper. I had a year left on my contract and I wasn't prepared to go on a Bosman ruling and take the mickey out of free status. Aston Villa came in after I had a conversation with Doug Ellis at a horse racing night. Mark Bosnich had signed for Manchester United so I signed for them under manager John Gregory. We reached the FA Cup Final in my first season there. It was the last ever FA Cup final at the old Wembley, and it was annoying to lose to Chelsea. I had a good couple of years at Villa and by this stage I was looking at football as a career and the end of the career.

SF: At what age were you at that time?

DJ: I was 29 and people were retiring at around their mid-thirties, so I thought I had a few years left and I couldn't sit on the bench because I wanted to get back in to the England squad. I had only made one appearance for England, but got back in to the squad when I was at Villa and started a few games under Sven.

I made one England appearance before I was 30 and 52 after. That is kind of the wrong way of doing things. They were a couple of enjoyable years at Aston Villa before West Ham came in. I had been away from the south for nearly ten years and I felt I needed to go back down there, so signed for them.

SF: Who brought you there?

DJ: Glenn Roeder.

SF: Did you enjoy it at West Ham?

DJ: It was a very frustrating time. It was a very talented squad, but badly run in the way the team was set up. It was always destined to fail because there was a lack of organisation. We got relegated and a lot of the players left straight away, the big names if you like. I was adamant that I was going

to stay because I was part of the problem and I felt I needed to. I was on a good run of Premier League games by then. I only missed one game for Villa and didn't miss any as soon as I got in at West Ham after recovering from an injury. I felt I had to rectify the problem and stayed until the Christmas. Alan Pardew came in and it quickly got to the understanding that it was best that I wasn't at the club. We all felt it was a good opportunity to move on and I went up to Manchester City with Kevin Keegan.

SF: Did he know you from his time as England manager?

DJ: He would have done yes. I didn't play under him for England, but he brought me in to the squad. The beauty for me at West Ham was that I was still the England number one keeper even though they were in the Championship, but I felt in order to do my best for England, I needed to be playing at the top level. So I moved to Manchester City, which was a tremendous experience. The stadium at the time was the best in England.

SF: Was that still Maine Road?

DJ: No, it was Eastlands. What struck me about City was the amount of work they were doing off the field in the community. It resonated with what I was used to at Watford and I had missed out on that for a few years.

SF: The community part of a club is something I know you are very interested in.

DJ: For me, football clubs represent communities. Moving on quickly, going from Manchester City to Portsmouth, the community spirit there is better than anything I have ever known, even more so than Watford. Watford can be described as the flag bearers, but Portsmouth take it to another level. The club itself wasn't so much interested in creating supporters, but helping the community. That is a fundamental difference. You can send a team of coaches out and try and get people interested in the club, but Portsmouth send people out to teach reading and writing. I know that as a Premier league club they have a little more money to spend on it like setting up a computer suite for schools to come in. It had Portsmouth badges on it, but it was about helping the local community. I thought it was amazing.

SF: There are not many players who would look at that side of things. You won the FA Cup at Portsmouth, was that the second attempt?

DJ: No, the third attempt. I played in four cup finals and they were all 1-0. For me, it was great to get the winners medal because it meant that I got the FA Cup and the FA Youth Cup.

SF: So you enjoyed your time at Portsmouth?

DJ: I loved it. We were always the underdogs pretty much, but we surprised people. The club is old school, the pitch still has a mound in both goalmouths! You don't even see that in League 1 now. The combination of the club, the playing staff, the off field staff and the supporters made for a tremendous blend. That all came to an end though with the administration as everyone knows. I terminated my kick in clause in order to play. My focus was on playing a season out rather than not playing. I wasn't going to get paid, so I thought if I could help the club I would.

SF: From that though you were playing in the World Cup finals.

DJ: That was good and I think I was the oldest debutant in the World Cup.

SF: Who did you play against?

DJ: I played against Algeria. My England career was great, it spans 13 years which is something I'm proud of. I had been in squads, but never playing in the actual finals. As I say though, my second England appearance came when I was 30, so maybe that's the way it was supposed to pan out.

SF: And from playing in the World Cup, you went to Bristol City.

DJ: I did and that brought me back to the community stuff again as there is a lot of hunger in Bristol to be involved with the community. I got involved in a graffiti project while I was there which was great. The car park there had a 150 metre wall and I said to them, why can't we paint it? They said yes and we got a load of spray cans at a discounted price, got some local artists down and did it. It was different, but what is a community? It is everybody. The idea of just doing football related things is almost like saying that if you like football, we'll accept you. Bristol is one of the main hubs of street art in England. I saw that in the city centre and I thought why not have it at the football club? I had two years at Bristol City and here we are now at Bournemouth.

SF: I would imagine you didn't know much about League 1 when you came here.


DJ: In fairness, it's easy not to know much about League 1. The Premier league is the be all and end all. It's arguably the best league in the world and people have spent a lot of money to make sure that everybody gets the opportunity to see that. You drop down in to the Championship and then watch the Football league Show, and that programme is predominantly about the Championship. You only see the goals from League 1, and not the football.

SF: I also imagine that if a whole League 1 match was on TV, then Premier League players wouldn't watch it.

DJ: I think if a League 1 game was on, then players would watch to tell you the truth.

SF: How does Bournemouth compare to any preconceptions you may have had?

DJ: The standard is very high. My first training session on the Thursday was not so good though. I was only training then and hadn't signed anything. On the Friday though, I thought, 'where did this come from?' The lads were pinging the ball around, looking so confident and it was much better than what I had experienced in the previous two years. I saw better things in the Friday session than I had seen in two years in the Championship. That was in training though and we went out against Walsall and didn't do what we did on the Friday I wondered why it didn't work, and I think it was down to confidence in front of the supporters.



SF: We lost a few at home at the start of the season and the nerves were clicking in. Did you think you had made the wrong decision signing the contract?

DJ: It was all a mad rush and I didn't have much time to think about it and had a two day preseason essentially. I think when you go in to a club, either you go in as bold as brass, you are quiet or as I did, I just had conversations with people. There is a common ground that we are footballers and that always helps to bed in.

SF: I think a lot of us didn't really know what to say to you because you are David James, who played in the Premier League, for England and in the last World Cup finals.

DJ: What is nice is that from my viewpoint, I want the team to do well and I want to be involved. I had conversations with all the players and this is where the players knew that I am just like them. Having these conversations made me realise that there is a hunger in this squad, no matter who I spoke to. When we are out there training, no one is looking to shirk off. On any given day, someone may have an off day, myself included, but generally, everyone is pushing themselves to be doing that little bit more. When you have that hunger and enthusiasm; that is where the manager comes in to play to get

them to contain that. Rather than let people go wild or suffocate them like a mentos in a coke bottle. If you do that, it's going to explode. He knows which direction it must go and that's a strength. We know what we are supposed to do and what we can do, and if we don't, we are disappointed. Here it is clear and concise. One thing I have never done in my career is to win promotion having not spent too many years with teams who can achieve that, and I haven't won the league. My aim is to do that here.

SF: I won promotion here a couple of years ago with a really good bunch of lads, and that made it feel so special.

DJ: I still have the hunger and I'm the same as all the lads here.

There are three factors. Physical; can I play? Mental; Do I want to play? The third factor is does the manager want me to play, it's as simple as that.

SF: That's the same for me.

DJ: Put it this way, at the start of this season, I thought the third factor had kicked in because no one wanted me. I say that loosely because there were some offers, but that was at places that didn't suit me or the family. It was horrible. I have had moments in my career when I thought I don't want to do this, only short periods and that's horrible. I just keep going. It's not

about getting to the end of the season and see what happens then. My agent mooted to me about having short term contracts with clubs, but that doesn't work. I need the commitment and mentally I have to be like that. I signed for Bournemouth, regardless of what league they are in, I want to do my best for the club. Every time I go out on to that field, I want to be the best I can. That doesn't mean it will be a world beating performance. it may be rubbish, but what it means is that I try my best. If someone said to me I have six months, I would just say why? What do I do after that?

SF: Is a thousand games on your mind?

DJ: To be honest, I don't know how many I'm on, I'm getting all my stuff ready to move at the moment, so that's what I'm thinking about. If I do it, it will be alright. I wouldn't play just to get to a thousand games. If I got to five short, I wouldn't try and play five games just for that. The three factors come in again, physical, mental and if someone wants me, Would be any value or would it be just selfish?

SF: I couldn't look at it like that!



One of the reasons behind the recent excellent form of the Cherries has been the many partnerships all over the field, none more impressive than in the heart of defence.

Steve Cook has been so solid at the back alongside Tommy Elphick. The injury to Miles Addision is a massive blow, but it has given the opportunity for Cook to have an extended run in the side, something he has taken with both hands, "I am pleased with the run of games I'm on and the performances. Before I was filling in all the time, left back, right back,

but now I'm playing in my favoured position and doing well, which is very pleasing." The only goals conceded since 1 December have come from penalties, and much of that is down to the great understanding the defence have, "The gaffer has said that he wants partnerships all over the pitch, and we have everyone linking up really

It is all about partnerships, we are all good friends off the pitch and that has really helped on it." You would have been forgiven

having not let in a goal in their previous four games, "It's set to be the game of the day and it is massive for us.

"The gaffer said to us that this is the biggest game of the season, as he has done for all recent games. That's true and we are taking every game as it comes. This is huge and a match we need to win to send out a message to the rest of the league."

Cook played the full tortuous 90 minutes at Swindon earlier this season and it's a memory he would like to try and partly eradicate today, "It is a bad memory, and we would love to get one over on them today. I think it was the worst game we've had this season, we embarrassed ourselves.

"That is no disrespect to them because they were very good on the day, but equally we were bad. We feel we have something to prove today and they have seen nowhere near the best from us."

We need everyone behind us to help us get the win."

During the week, Cook saw the huge queues of supporters buying tickets for forthcoming matches, and he admits that playing to a full house is a huge lift, "We weren't exactly putting up a show for people earlier this season, but we still got great support. Now, everyone is coming here in their numbers and getting right behind us and as I said, it's getting us over the line. I don't think people realise what a difference they make. The supporters are winning us games, they are helping us to hold on and we will need that again today because it's going to be a tough one."

One thing that Steve sees as vital is the side getting back in to the top six as soon as possible. The incredible run has seen the side enter the promotion fray, and he is determined that they firmly establish themselves as one of the divisions' front runners,

Elphick defensive partnership was formed in their days together at Brighton, but Steve revealed that it wasn't the case, "We only played together a couple of times. He is a couple of years older than me and was injured all of last season. Before that, I was 17 when I started to break through and played in the same side a couple of times, but nothing like this."

The only recent goal that the Cherries have conceded was a penalty at Scunthorpe, while today's visitors Swindon can boast a similar record

After today, there is the little matter of an FA Cup replay on Tuesday, but that game at the moment is far from the players' minds, "We can't think ahead of ourselves, we just have to take each game as it comes. No one is thinking about the Wigan game. Saturday has gone and the focus immediately went to the Swindon game. I know the supporters are turning up in their numbers again and in good voice and that will be massive. At Wigan the supporters got us over the line and that is what we want today. "We have only been in the top six for a brief period and we want to get back there. All we can do is to concentrate on ourselves and win our games.

"We are not looking at fixtures and hoping that teams drop points, we know that if we keep winning then we are going to be up there. Once we get back in to the top six, we don't want to stop there; we want to be in the top two. We just need to keep winning our games, focus on ourselves and not worry about what other teams are doing."

He made his debut on the opening day of that season away at Boston and played in the first three games. A poor performance at Swansea though saw him lose his place, with Jamie Ashdown being brought in. Ashdown was injured away at Macclesfield and Tardif recalled before he was also injured, being stretchered off in a League Cup tie against Brentford.

A number of keepers were brought in before Tardif was handed a start against Hull, but was again injured. His finest moment in a Bournemouth shirt came at Crewe in the FA Cup, when he was a hero of a penalty shoot-out. Within a few days though he turned in to the villain as he was sent off in the Fourth Round tie at Stoke. He made two more appearances for the Cherries before returning to Portsmouth.

In 2004 he signed for Oxford United where despite being a regular, he left the professional game to concentrate on work away from football. He also played in non-league football and in his native Guernsey and currently works and lives in the Fareham area.



KEVIN SCRIVEN

Goalkeeper who was given the squad number when he was drafted

in to the first team squad in 2004. He spent two years as a youth player and one as a professional and signed for Farnborough in 2005 without making a first team appearance for Bournemouth.

He joined Havant & Waterlooville in 2007. He gained national coverage when he saved a penalty against Swansea in the FA Cup that helped the Hawks to a tie at Liverpool. He has been the number one choice keeper at Sutton United since 2009, making nearly 200 appearances.

The development squad returned to action after a break over the Christmas period and were involved in a hard fought 3-3 draw at Brentford on Tuesday.


Chris Hargreaves included a number of trailists in the side, with Josh Wakefield returning to action after his loan spell at Dagenham.

AFC Bournemouth Academy with MATTY HOLMES

The Academy has now returned back to Training after their Christmas break. This weekend will see the Academy Teams play in house games against each other in preparation for their first scheduled games on Sunday 20th January against MK Dons.

This week's Staff Article is from our Under 11 Head Coach Jeff Taylor. Jeff is in his second season coaching at the Academy, Jeff previously coached at Bournemouth Electric Youth Football Club.

JEFF TAYLOR JOURNAL

Tuesday Training

6.25pm and the boys start to arrive for training and as usual, they can't wait to get the footballs out of the bag. The session has been planned & marked out; the month's topic is shooting and finishing. The arrival activity is working in pairs passing the ball with their weaker foot.

We start off with some activation work to get the boys warmed up and then into some exercises that concentrate on footwork and agility. Then 15mins of technical work that helps them to work on their ball manipulation skills and hopefully get near to 1000 touches of the ball, which is approximately a touch of the ball every second.

As the session starts to get competitive, it's important to keep reminding them about good technique and also encourage good play. The Academy is focused on producing technically good players who play out from

the back through the thirds of the pitch and are brave in possession. To encourage this, out of the 90 minute session only the first 15 minutes is done without a football.

Thursday Training

There's a full squad at training tonight with no injuries and the goalkeepers are also in attendance. The boys are asking lots of questions about the game this coming Sunday; their main concern seems to be if they will be wearing the blue AFCB away shirts. The session runs similarly to Tuesday's, the players performed a passing drill in a team shape to help them in their game for the weekend. After a good 90min workout the boys are all looking forward to Sunday and playing against Reading FC U11's.

Sunday - Match Day

Up at 7am as the club mini bus leaves Dean Court at 8am for the journey to Reading FC's training ground. A couple of the U11 players are on the mini bus and they are really

excited about playing a Premier League team's Academy. It also gives me a chance to chat with them about the game and some of the things we have worked on in training.

Out for the warm up at 10.30am for an 11am kick off and the boys are buzzing as they have seen most of Reading's first team squad on the training ground in preparation for their Monday night match at home. The warm up goes well and the boys start the game well and score two great goals in the first five minutes of the game. Both goals started with our goal keeper playing out from the back.

I am especially pleased that the finishes are so good because we have been working hard in training sessions on build up play to finishing. We went on to score another two goals, again both great finishes. We eventually got back to Dean Court at 3.30pm after a great away day at Reading FC.

TODAY'S SKILL SESSION

The under 9's, under coach Wayne Gavin, will provide the half-time skill session on the pitch.





THE ESSENTIAL GUIDE TO ...

Walsall

WALSALL

Situated in the West Midlands, Walsall is a large industrial town with a population of around 250,000.

THE BANKS'S STADIUM

Built in 1990, the Banks's Stadium was one of the first of the new wave of football stadiums, and originally was almost identical to Scunthorpe's Glanford Park. One end has been redeveloped in to a large stand, with the club gaining revenue from the prominent roof advertising which can be seen from the M6, which runs right next to the ground. The away stand is exactly like the one at Scunthorpe and does have a number of supporting pillars, but this should not detract from the view as there are 2,000 seats available.

DRIVING TO THE BANKS'S STADIUM

The postcode is WS1 4SA and the Banks's Stadium is 190 miles from Bournemouth.

Take the A338, A31, M27, M3, A34, M40, M42 and join the M6 northbound. Exit the M6 at junction 7 and take the A34 signposted Walsall. Be aware of the many speed cameras on this stretch of road! At the



end of a short dual carriageway by the Bell Inn pub, turn left in to Walstead Road, and continue on this road until you reach the stadium which is on your right. The ground is signposted from the A34. There is an away supporters car park right outside the visitors end at the cost of £3 per car.

AFCB AT WALSALL

Walsall used to be a real bogey ground for the Cherries. From 1973 to 2005, the occasional draw was all that Bournemouth enjoyed, apart from a memorable win in the Auto Windscreens Shield Final. The barren run was finally ended where despite going a goal behind after seven seconds, the side won 2-1. Since then we have won three more and drawn one, so hopefully the change in fortunes can continue.

FOOD

There is a McDonalds in the retail park next to the ground, but aside from that, there is little at the stadium.

DRINK

It is a bit of a barren place for a drink around the stadium itself. There is a large supporters club that admits a number of away supporters and serves decent beer and snack food. That's it close to the ground, with the nearest pub being a 15 minute walk away next to the Morrisons. You can park in the away supporters car park, and then hop on the train from Bescot to Walsall and have much more choice in the town centre. 9





COLCHESTER v SCUNTHORPE

Colchester have raided Portsmouth for a couple of players - signing winger Jack Compton, who had been on a short-term deal at Fratton Park, and making defender Josh Thompson's loan spell at the Essex club permanent. Also arriving on loan have been Burnley forward George Porter and Reading striker Dominic Samuel, while midfielder John-Joe O'Toole has joined Bristol Rovers on a month's loan, as has Millwall keeper Steve Mildenhall who had been on loan at Scunthorpe. Meanwhile, Scunthorpe themselves have signed Akpo Sodje on a contract until the end of the season following his recent decision to reject a new deal at Preston, and extended fellow striker Karl Hawley's contract until the summer.

LEYTON ORIENT v CREWE

Levton Orient suffered two postponements over the festive season, after their trip to Notts County fell victim to a waterlogged pitch, while their home Boxing Day tie against today's visitors Swindon was called off on Christmas Day for the same reason. While most other clubs have been replenishing their squads since the transfer window opened, Crewe boss Steve Davis says he is "ticking the days off" until it shuts - and hopes to keep his current squad together.

MILTON KEYNES DONS v BURY

Striker Izale McLeod, who is Milton Kevnes' all-time top scorer since their formation in 2004, has rejoined Karl Robinson's side on an 18-month contract following his release by Portsmouth, Robinson has also signed Brighton midfielder Ryan

Harley on loan until the end of the season, and re-signed Wolves midfielder Zeli Ismail for a second loan spell at Stadium MK. Bury, by contrast, have been under a Football League transfer embargo since early December after borrowing money from the Professional Footballers' Association, but the League has sanctioned the extensions of strikers Troy Hewitt and Tom Hopper's loan spells from QPR and Leicester.

OLDHAM v BRENTFORD

Oldham announced on New Year's Day that three members of manager Paul Dickov's coaching staff assistant boss Gerry Taggart, fitness coach Paul Butler and reserve coach Lee Duxbury - were being placed on gardening leave "and will take no further part in the club's plans for the future" following a run of four successive defeats. Chairman Simon Corney said: "We, as a board, are unanimous in the belief that the chemistry of our backroom team is not right." Brentford have handed a new 18-month contract to defender Shaleum Logan, who started at right-back against the Cherries on New Year's Day, while allowing fellow defender Leon Legge to join Gillingham on a month's loan with a view to a permanent deal.

PORTSMOUTH v NOTTS COUNTY

Portsmouth, still waiting for their financial future to be resolved, have signed ex-Southampton striker David Connolly on a month's contract. The 35-year-old Republic of Ireland international had been without a club since he was released by the Saints last summer. Notts County striker Lee Hughes has left Meadow Lane by mutual consent

after scoring 66 goals in three-anda-half seasons with the Magpies, and has subsequently joined Port Vale, Manager Keith Curle is hoping to make Luton midfielder Andre Boucaud's loan spell permanent, but has released defenders Tom Williams and Carl Regan, while allowing on-loan striker Chris Iwelumo to return to his parent club Watford.

SHEFFIELD UNITED v YEOVIL

Sheffield United began the year by signing Premier League players from both north and south of the border, capturing Stoke defender Danny Higginbotham on a free transfer before signing Motherwell striker Jamie Murphy for an undisclosed six-figure fee. Yeovil have signed versatile left-sided Middlesbrough player Matthew Dolan on a month's loan and made Carlisle striker Paddy Madden's loan spell permanent for an undisclosed fee, while signing another Irish player, ex-Shelbourne midfielder Kevin Dawson, until the end of the season. Leaving Huish Park is defender Curtis Haves-Brown, who has joined Cambridge United on a free transfer.

SHREWSBURY v HARTLEPOOL

Shrewsbury have lost the services of ex-Bournemouth loan striker Ryan Doble, who broke a bone in his hand in training in late December, and is expected to be sidelined for six weeks. However, boss Graham Turner has strengthened his squad by capturing Sheffield United midfielder David McAllister for an undisclosed fee, signing Charlton defender Yado Mambo on loan for the rest of the season and borrowing Watford midfielder Stephen McGinn for a month. Bottom club Hartlepool



























ended their 22-game winless run in spectacular style in their last match of 2012, picking up only their second win of the season by winning 3-2 at Sheffield United, knocking the Blades off the top of the table.

STEVENAGE v DONCASTER

Stevenage have signed teenage Southampton striker Sam Hoskins on loan for the second half of the season, while allowing fellow striker Dani Lopez to remain on loan at Aldershot for another month - and have also recruited Watford's Steve Leo Beleck in an unusual transfer (see below). Before manager Dean Saunders' departure to Wolves (also see below). Doncaster signed Fleetwood midfielder Lee Fowler, who had played under him at Wrexham, for an undisclosed fee, captured Peterborough striker Emile Sinclair on loan, extended Preston striker lain Hume's loan spell for the rest of the season and handed non-contract defender Andy Griffin a contract until the end of the campaign.

TRANMERE v CRAWLEY

Tranmere, who lead League One on goal difference after the festive fixtures, have extended the loan spells of Sheffield Wednesday midfielder Liam Palmer until the end of the season, and Bolton striker Michael O'Halloran and West Brom defender Donervon Daniels for a further month. Crawley have signed striker Lateef Elford-Alliyu until the end of the season following his release by Bury, while striker Richard Brodie returned from his loan spell at Morecambe at the start of January, but then left the Broadfield Stadium almost immediately to join Grimsby on loan for the rest of the season.

CARLISLE v COVENTRY (SUNDAY)

Carlisle welcomed striker Rory Lov back to first-team action on New Year's Day, just over a year after breaking his leg in December 2011. Coventry have lost the services of ex-Bournemouth loan striker David McGoldrick, whose loan spell from Nottingham Forest expired on 1 January, before Forest loaned him to loswich for the rest of the season. However. boss Mark Robins has replaced him by signing Charlton striker Leon Clarke on a free transfer, handing him a two-and-a-halfyear contract. Meanwhile, the Sky Blues have extended Derby midfielder James Bailey's loan for the rest of the season, and handed fellow midfielder Franck Moussa a new 18-month deal.

PRESTON v WALSALL (SUNDAY)

As well as allowing Canadian striker lain Hume to extend his loan spell at Doncaster for the rest of the season, Preston have signed Watford striker Joe Garner and handed defender Luke Foster a contract until the end of the season after he impressed while on non-contract terms. Forward Chris Holroyd, who had been on loan at Macclesfield, has left Deepdale by mutual consent, while defender Todd Kane has returned to Chelsea after completing his loan spell. Walsall have re-signed Nottingham Forest keeper Karl Darlow on a month's loan with a view to keeping him for the rest of the season, while handing a professional contract to teenage youth team defender Mal Benning who has impressed since breaking into the team at right-back.

OTHER NEWS DONCASTER LOSE SAUNDERS TO WOLVES Doncaster are

looking for a new manager after boss Dean Saunders left



to join Championship side Wolves last Monday, less than 48 hours after the Molineux club sacked manager Stale Solbakken following their FA Cup defeat by non-League side Luton. Rovers chairman John Ryan said: "In the 15 years I've been chairman here, we have always had a plan B. We've been very under-rated this season and I can't believe there are six clubs ahead of us in the betting for the League One title. There's nothing in this league that frightens me."

WATFORD "SUB-LET" STRIKER TO STEVENAGE

Stevenage have completed the signing of Cameroonian striker Steve Leo Beleck from Watford - but the deal is far from straightforward. Beleck's parent club is Italian Serie A side Udinese, who are owned by the Pozzo family who bought Watford last summer. The 19-year-old was one of a number of Udinese players who joined the Hornets on season-long loans for 2012-13, but has now been re-loaned by Watford to Stevenage for the rest of the campaign. World football's governing body FIFA recognises international loans as regular transfers - allowing the player(s) in question to be re-loaned, as long as the deal stretches between two transfer windows.



Cherries HEAVEN



Saturday 13 January 1996 **Division Two**

Peterborough United 4 AFC Bournemouth 5

This was surely one the most remarkable games ever witnessed, a wonderful match that ebbed and flowed with a spectacular finale.

The Cherries had beaten the Posh 3-0 in the first home game of the new season, with Steve Jones scoring a hat trick, and he was to haunt United again.

Neither side went in to the game in any sort of form that would suggest a classic. Peterborough were 16th in the table, while the Cherries were 11th and had not won in three. Bournemouth included loan striker George Ndah in the side, and he gave the Cherries the lead with an excellent strike early on. His game was to finish early though through an ankle injury, and that was to prove to be his final action in a Bournemouth shirt.

Peterborough managed to get in to the break level when Sean Farrell equalised, and it was very much a run of the mill game.

The second half though was just sensational. Gary Martindale scored two in quick succession to put the home side 3-1 up as it appeared they would comfortably claim the three points. Far from it as the Cherries staged an excellent comeback.



Chris Casper, who was on loan from Manchester United, headed home at the far post to reduce the deficit and then Scott Mean, who was making his first start for some weeks after injury, levelled the game.

It was all pretty breathless stuff, but nothing compared to the final ten minutes. Martindale scored his second of the game with a spectacular scissor kick with nine minutes remaining, surely the Posh were going to win now! But no, back came Bournemouth.

The end of the game was all about one man, Steve Jones. Six minutes from time, he latched on to a Russell Beardsmore through ball, took the ball past two defenders before sending a perfect strike home.

If that was good, what happened next has deservedly gone down in Cherries folklore as one of the greatest

goals ever seen. Just sixty seconds after the equaliser, the ball was played to him with his back to goal on the edge of the box and in one movement, he flicked it up and hit it on the volley to send in an unstoppable strike.

There were around 200 Bournemouth supporters on the Moy's End terrace that day, and the scenes when that flew in were ones that still live in the memory now, Jones ran straight in to the crowd and was immediately mobbed by players and supporters alike.

Jones even came close to completing a hat trick that would have rivalled James Hayter's for time, but I'm sure he would have been more than satisfied with the two terrific goals that he did score, particularly that second one which ranks as one of the best seen by a Bournemouth player.

Cherries

Saturday 11 December 1999 Division Two

Notts County 5 AFC Bournemouth 1

This was the third meeting between Bournemouth and County in the space of six weeks. The sides had met at Meadow Lane in the FA Cup, drawing 1-1, with Bournemouth winning the replay 4-2.

Confidence was high as the sides met for the first time in the league. The Cherries had been incredibly inconsistent in the league, with no consecutive wins so far. That record was to continue not only at Meadow Lane but until November 2000!

The Cherries had won 2-0 at Cambridge the week before while County hadn't won in five. The omens for the day took a turn for the worse when the kitman was seen rushing around outside the ground at around 2.00 pm searching for Bournemouth supporters and frantically asking if they were wearing the red and black shirt.

It transpired that Carl Fletcher's shirt had been left behind at Dean Court and there were no spare shirts! So a supporter was left without a shirt while the County club shop printed it up ready for the game.



As is turned out, Fletcher had a game to forget and only lasted 45 minutes as he was taken off at half time. County had recently signed Brett Angell on loan. and his first touch of the ball in the opening minute resulted in the opening goal. Before the Cherries could recover, it was 2-0 when lan Richardson found the net.

Things were going from bad to worse and after eight minutes, it was 3-0 when Angell scored his second of the game. From then on, it was game over as County comfortably strolled through the rest of the half, but before the break, Mark Stallard made it 4-0 to end a completely miserable 45 minutes for Bournemouth.

Mel Machin made changes at half time, but they had little effect. Angell marked his debut with a hat trick as he made it 5-0 before an hour had been played.

You would have thought by now that Meadow Lane would be rocking, but the home supporters in the 4.199 crowd were not the ones being heard. As fed up as the Bournemouth supporters were, housed in the vast Kop, they decided to just enjoy the day!

It was gallows humour at its best - 6-5, we're going to win 6-5 - a popular chant. The noise got louder and louder and the travelling faithful finally got something to cheer about when John O'Neill scored with four minutes remaining. The players just went back to the half way line, while the supporters celebrated like promotion had just been secured.

It was a case of making the most of it, because this was truly an awful day for a game that was over before ten minutes had been played.
