

## Good afternoon everyone and welcome to Paolo Di Canio, his Swindon staff and players

We had one of our toughest 90 minutes of the season at the County Ground in August when we lost 3-0. A lot has happened at both clubs since then but Swindon have been in and around the play-offs for virtually all season which is not surprising given the quality and depth of their squad.

We had Swindon scouted again at Orient on Tuesday and by all accounts they should have won to extend an already impressive unbeaten run. So it is going to be tough for us but hopefully both sides can put on a good show for the TV cameras and give the viewers a positive showcase for League One football.

What won't help us is that we haven't played for three weeks since the 2-0 defeat at Tranmere. No matter how much training you do nothing beats playing and, of course, there is the mental side too. Players are attuned to play at the end of the week and it can be tiring to get all keyed up for a game which is then called off.

That, as you know, is what happened on Tuesday when the referee postponed the Preston match at 6.40pm. For me, I felt we could definitely have started the game. I think conditions were worse against Yeovil and Sheffield United and their manager was certainly a lot less keen to play than me, which was surprising given how far they and their fans had come.

Could we have finished the match? Possibly not. It rained heavily for the rest of the night and would have ruined the pitch which, as we know, is struggling at the moment. All ifs and buts of course, but the bottom line is that it was another game we didn't play and means that we are going to be playing Saturday-Tuesday-Saturday now for most of the rest of the season. That can be a good thing if we get some results going and build momentum and let's hope we can start today because it would give us a massive lift ahead of two tough trips to Sheffield United and Scunthorpe.

We will only know at the end of the season whether our enforced break has turned out to be a blessing in disguise. It has enabled a few lads who were carrying knocks to shake them off and has meant we have been able to fully integrate the seven players who have come into the squad during the January transfer window. I would like to welcome all of them to Crawley Town.

We lost Hope, of course, and I must admit to being surprised at the lack of interest in some of our other players, not that we were of a mind to sell anyone of course.

I have said before that the time to judge me as manager of this club is when I have put together a squad which I am happy with and has my stamp on it. This process will continue in the summer but for now I am pleased with the


players we have brought in.



# Good afternoon

### Welcome to all our supporters and those who have made the trip from Swindon

Let's hope first and foremost that the weather has relented and allowed us to get the game on. Sky Sports are here to cover live the first of two successive home games, giving Richie and the players a great platform

to show what we are about to a national TV audience.

No one was more disappointed than the people here at the club when Tuesday's match was called off at relatively short notice.

I can understand the reaction of supporters, especially those who made the trip down from Preston, but as a club I can assure you that we did everything we could to make sure the game was played and we followed Football League procedures.

On Monday we were in constant contact with the Met Office and because of the poor forecast we decided to organise a precautionary pitch inspection at 9.30am on Tuesday morning, an hour before Preston were due to begin their journey south by train.

Despite the rain on Monday night the pitch was perfectly playable and Warren Atkin, who was appointed to do the inspection by the Football League, spoke to the match officials after completing his check.

We were then in constant contact with the match officials throughout the day. It rained for most of the day but the pitch stood up to the elements and when Mr Hooper and his team arrived at 5pm he had no concerns after checking the conditions.

Unfortunately, the rain got heavier after that time. Mr Hooper had another look at 6pm and at that time was still confident the game would go ahead. He then decided to make his final decision at 6.30pm once Preston had arrived and he could consult both managers.

The decision to postpone the game was made at 6.40pm with Graham Westley, the Preston manager,

particularly concerned about player safety. Mr Hooper felt even if he did get the game underway that it wouldn't be completed. I'm old enough to remember matches being played in much worse conditions but we

had to take it on the chin.

From the club's point of view, it would certainly have been a lot more cost-effective had we postponed it at 9.30am. We could have cancelled the programme print run and food and, of course, let the matchday staff know. Instead, we have to incur all those costs. I can understand the frustrations of the Preston fans but I refute any accusations that we didn't monitor conditions sufficiently during the day to flag up any potential problems. As I

said, at 6pm the referee was happy for the game to go ahead - long after the Preston fans would have started their journey.


Of course Tuesday's issues are part of an underlying issue with our pitch that we will be addressing in the summer. I will bring you more details of that soon.

On Monday we stage our first Fans' Forum of the season in the Stadium Suite from 7.30pm. I will be there to outline our plans across a wide range of issues and, of course, take questions from the floor. I'm sure it will be a lively debate but it is a date I have been looking forward to for some time. It's open to all and I look forward to seeing you there.




There was relief for Swindon fans and manager Paolo Di Canio as the Robins prepared for today's game after former owner Andrew Black exchanged contracts on the sale of his 98% shareholding to a consortium led by Banbury United owner Ged McCrory.

Seven parties expressed an interest despite Swindon's reported debts of £13m and it was confirmed on Wednesday that McCrory would be taking over, although there was a blow to Swindon's promotion hopes when striker Matt Ritchie was sold to rivals Bournemouth later in the day for a reported £500,000 fee. At present Di Canio's side are the inform team in npower League One having picked up 17 points from a possible

21 which has seen them climb to fourth position. His team also have the best scoring and defensive record in the third tier and they look odds-on for the play-offs and could well go up automatically.

Di Canio has urged his side to remain focussed heading into each league game as they aim for back-to-back promotions. He said: "My focus is on the football. I would like to have a very stable situation like last year, but the club is up for sale and the best way is to behave as a professional.

"I have inner motivation and I always try and take the positives from everything. It is my job to help the players keep their focus and to keep going. The players here have behaved completely professionally and for me and my staff there is no distraction." Although the Italian remains positive heading into this afternoon's game at Broadfield Stadium, he admits some of his players have been worried by the uncertainly of Swindon's future. He added: "For me it's not a distraction but I'm an adult person, it




"It's my job to help them to focus and let them understand that it's the best way to have a chance to remain or even if that's not the case to go somewhere else".

#### What do you know about Crawley Town?

I think of how quickly the club have come up through the Football League over the years and the recent rivalry between them and Swindon.

#### How are Swindon playing at the moment?

They are playing very well at the moment - they have been unbeaten recently, scoring a lot of goals and playing very attractive football. Not only that, but they have been very solid at the back and not letting their opponents have much of a chance on goal. If they can keep this up they will certainly make the top six.

Obviously with the club being in such good form and already sitting comfortably within the play-offs do you think they could even challenge to go up automatically?

I think that will depend on what happens with the sale of the club something may have been sorted by the time we face Crawley today. If we can keep the players we have got on loan and the matter is resolved quickly then it is a possibility. However, it's all up in the air at the moment.

Do you think the off-field problems will have an impact on their season?

It hasn't had much of an impact at the moment and the players have been dealing with it really well. Due to the weather they haven't played much, but so far they have got through it, knuckled down and remained focussed.

#### Which Swindon player should we keep an eye on this afternoon?

Watch out for Andy Williams upfront who we signed from Yeovil Town. He is already in double figures for the season, and it is just not his goals that make him a good striker - he has fantastic pace and always causes a threat against all opposition.

What is your score prediction between the two sides this weekend? I think I'll go for 1-1.

Finally, what are your promotion predictions?

I really don't think first and second place will stay the same so I'll say Brentford to go up and I'll stick with Tranmere Rovers. Swindon will make the play-offs.

# Paolo Di Canio

One of the English game's more colourful characters, Paolo Di Canio is also proving to be a shrewd manager as he plots back-to-back promotions for Swindon.

As a player, the Italian began his career at Lazio where he played over 50 times for the club scoring four goals, helping them win promotion to Serie A in the 1987-88 campaign. In 1990 he joined Juventus but later fell out with manager Giovanni Trapattoni resulting in him having spells at Napoli, AC Milan and Celtic.

After 15 goals in 37 appearances for the Hoops, the striker made his way to England and signed for Sheffield Wednesday for £4.2 million where he became an instant fans' favourite. However, he was in the news for the wrong reasons in 1998 for his infamous push on referee Paul Alcock after he was sent off against Arsenal, resulting in an 11-match ban.



The Swindon skipper began his career at Preston North End after impressing during trials in 2002, although he had to wait until 30 August 2003 to make his professional debut on loan at Leyton Orient. After returning to North End the midfielder still found it hard to break into the first team and had loan moves to Southend United and Motherwell.

He then had a second loan spell at Southend resulting in him signing for the club on a permanent basis. He made over 100 appearances for the Shrimpers before signing for Charlton Town in June 2010. With first-team opportunities limited at the Addicks. McCormack signed for Swindon in July 2011 and he helped the club win promotion to League One as champions as well as picking up the club's Player of the Season award.

#### 2: Simon Ferry


The Scottish-born midfielder joined the Robins from Celtic in 2010 when he signed a three-year contract and has been pretty much a regular in their side since then.

He joined Celtic as a schoolboy but two years out because of a serious ankle injury meant he did not get his career going until 2009.



#### 3: James Collins


The Crawley defence will certainly want to keep James Collins quiet this afternoon, Collins has already notched 13 goals for the Robins so far this campaign. The Irishman rejected a new contract at Shrewsbury Town to join Paolo Di Canio's side on a twoyear deal last year.

Collins came through the Aston Villa youth team and spent brief loan spells at Darlington and Burton Albion to gain first-team experience. However, once he returned to Villa Park he was still unable to find a place in the side and moved to Shrewsbury Town in January 2011. He finished the 2010-11 campaign with eight goals from 23 games and last season impressed further, netting 17 times in 47 appearances to help the club secure promotion to League One as runners-up to Swindon.

#### 4: Wes Foderingham

Goalkeeper Foderingham started his career with Fulham's youth team making his professional debut out on loan at non-league outfit Bromley. He then signed a contract with Crystal Palace before returning on loan at Bromley followed by brief stints at Boreham Wood and Histon.

He initially signed for Swindon on loan in October 2011 and made an instant impact by not conceding a single goal in his first five league games. After only being considered third choice by Crystal Palace Di Canio secured the 22-year-old's signature on a two-anda-half year deal and he proved to be a key factor in the Robins promotion season, making a number of superb saves and keeping 16 clean sheets out of 17 at the County Ground.

## Muzzy Dumbuya

#### YOU HAD A FEW OFFERS IN THE TRANSFER WINDOW SO WHY CRAWLEY?

I had various options but once I spoke to the manager it was an easy decision. His enthusiasm to sign me and what he is trying to achieve at Crawley won me over. I had offers from other clubs and a Turkish club but Richie didn't give me too much time to make my decision so I had to say yes!

#### **OUR FANS LOVED THE WAY** YOU PLAYED AGAINST US FOR PORTSMOUTH IN DECEMBER. IS THAT WHAT YOUR GAME IS ABOUT?

It's all about energy and enthusiasm from first whistle to last. I am a defender first and foremost and prefer the right-hand side but I also love to get forward. I will always give 150% every time I pull on a Crawley shirt - I can quarantee that to the fans. If my lungs come out of my chest at the final whistle I know I have done my job.

#### WHAT WERE YOUR IMPRESSIONS OF CRAWLEY FROM THE BOXING DAY GAME?

Very favourable. They are a young side and at 25 I suppose I am one of the older guys in the team now! They worked hard and there seemed to be a real togetherness in their squad and a lot of energy. I think Crawley are capable of getting in the play-offs which is the main reason why I came here.

#### WAS IT A SURPRISE TO BE RELEASED BY PORTSMOUTH?

Nothing really surprises me in football.

I felt sorry for the manager (Guy Whitingham) because he was told to cut the budget and some of us had to leave. We shook hands and wished each other all the best. What's happening there is a real shame. especially for the fans who don't deserve that.



#### TELL US ABOUT MUZZY THE INTERNATIONAL?

Well, I made my debut for Sierra Leone in September in an Africa Cup of Nations qualifier against Tunisia. It's why I didn't play for Portsmouth in the game against Crawley here. It was a great honour for me but unfortunately we didn't qualify as

we drew the game 0-0 when we had to win. I have been watching the tournament on TV and the World Cup qualifiers start in March and hopefully I will be involved again. I left the country at the age of 5 because of the civil war but I am proud to play for the Leone Stars.


#### YOU DIDN'T MAKE YOUR LEAGUE DEBUT UNTIL RELATIVELY LATE. DOES THAT MAKE YOU MORE **HUNGRY TO SUCCEED?**

Yes, definitely. I was still playing in non-league at the age of 21 and I don't want to go back there. I know how hard it is to make it as a professional and know I don't want it to end. It's a great life and I am determined to enjoy it as long as possible.

#### WHAT ARE YOUR HOPES FOR THE REST OF THE SEASON?


I want to be around an energetic team and that is one of the reasons why I joined and why I think we can push on towards the play-offs. The manager has also brought some new faces into the squad and once we all settle down I think we are going to be very hard to beat. 




# A QUICK WORD WITH

## Matt Sparrow

#### YOUR MOVE SEEMED TO COME ABOUT QUITE QUICKLY.

You could say that! I had my contract cancelled by Brighton and on the same day Richie Barker was on the phone. We sorted something out and within a few hours I was signing for the club and then joining the boys on the coach to Tranmere.

#### WAS IT A DIFFICULT DECISION TO MAKE TO COME TO THE **BROADFIELD?**

I had other offers, including one from my old club Scunthorpe, but once Richie contacted me it wasn't a hard decision at all. I live in Hassocks and being able to stay in the area was a factor.

#### DO YOU KNOW ANY OF YOUR NEW TEAM-MATES?

I knew Michel Kuipers from my Brighton days but other than him I didn't know anyone, although I have obviously played against a few of them. I played against Gary Alexander in the League One play-off final in 2009 when we both scored twice. Scunthorpe won the game 3-2 and I have already reminded Gaz of that!

#### BEING LOCAL, I GUESS YOU ARE WELL AWARE OF CRAWLEY'S RECENT SUCCESSES.

You can't have missed it to be honest. To go from non-league to competing for promotion from League One in less than two years reflects well on the club. I guess Crawley have got used to constantly over-achieving and you could say we are doing that again this season when you compare the club to some of the others in the division.



#### YOU HAVEN'T PLAYED A GREAT DEAL THIS SEASON. HOW IS YOUR **MATCH FITNESS?**

It's not too bad. I have always been fit and managed to avoid serious injuries and when I came on for the last 20 minutes at Tranmere I felt fine. We have got quite a busy schedule coming up and hopefully I can get plenty of games under my belt and maintain a good level of performance.

#### YOU HAVE BEEN AROUND THE SQUAD FOR A FEW DAYS NOW. WHAT CAN WE REALISTICALLY ACHIEVE THIS SEASON?

I think we can reach the play-offs. Why not? I have got promoted three times from League One and each season the play-off places are extremely competitive. 



However, the other reason is that 50% of the takings that don't go in prizes go towards things we believe you might like.

Recently, whilst selling the tickets before a match, a potential customer decided not to buy a ticket because "I've no idea where the money is going". We enlightened him, but were quite surprised because we thought it was well publicised. Obviously not as well publicised as we thought! So it's time to rectify that.

There are a number of reasons why it's called the 50/50 draw. Firstly, 50% of what we take goes back to the winners. The other 50% goes to good causes. And that 50% is split 50/50 between CTSA community initiatives and club projects. Oh, and those club projects are agreed with the CTSA and are designed to attract young supporters to Crawley Town and improve the experience for them when they get here. **1946** The Sussex County League fixture away to Bexhill Wanderers was abandoned after 20 minutes due to poor conditions with neither side finding the net.

1952 Tom Reagan and Wilfred Cole were on target as the Reds were held to a 2-2 draw at home to East Grinstead in the Sussex County League.

**1957** Crawley scored five times without reply at Horsham in a Metropolitan League encounter. On the scoresheet were Ernie Randell (2), Ray Jeffries (2) and Roger Maguire.

1971 The Reds went down to a 3-1 defeat at home to Horsham in the Premier Midweek Floodlight League with Phil Basey scoring for the home side.

**1980** There was a goalless draw when the Reds visited Salisbury in the Southern League. 1985 Crawley's goals in the 2-0 victory over Willenhall Town in the Southern League were scored by David Myers and Terry Robbins.

1991 A share of the points was the outcome of the Southern League fixture at Town Mead with Worcester City. Jimmy Brown netted the Reds' goal.

**1993** Reds progressed to the third round of the Sussex Floodlight Cup with an 8-5 aggregate victory over Lewes. Paul Fishenden and a treble from Craig Whitington gave Crawley a 4-2 win in the second round second leg tie at Town Mead.

2000 Brighton Reserves knocked their hosts out of the Sussex Senior Cup at the third round stage. The replay ended 2-1 to the Seagulls with Dean Wordsworth netting from the penalty spot for the home side. 2002 The Southern League fixture away to Ilkeston Town finished 0-0.

A comfortable passage into the fourth round of the FA Trophy for Crawley as they thumped Droylsden 8-0 at the Broadfield Stadium. Both Magno Vieira and Jamie Cook notched hat-tricks with each netting one from the penalty spot. The other two were scored by Jon-Paul Pittman and Dannie Bulman.

The naysayers have been saying it for ages. And perhaps we got a glimpse what they're talking about during last weekend's FA Cup Fourth Round ties: Premier League footballers have gone soft.

Norwich's defeat to non-league Luton, Liverpool's woeful exit at Oldham, Tottenham's loss to Leeds and Chelsea's inability to see off Brentford were all symptoms of a general malaise in the top flight. But is it really?

Cup shocks are what make the FA Cup what it is. If teams from lower divisions had never beaten top clubs the 'magic of the FA Cup' would never exist and the competition would probably be on equal footing with the League Cup.

Last weekend there was a sense that some teams had been caught out as some of the most talented and skilful footballers on the planet were made to look very ordinary. Some of the commentary I heard from the Brentford v Chelsea game on Sunday neatly summed it up. The remark that Chelsea's left-sided players would expect to be more in the game now they were not playing on a heavily sanded part of the pitch made me smile. Kind of adds credence to the "sure, he's a good player, but can he do it on a wet evening in front of 500 people" adage doesn't it?

The same happened at Boundary
Park, where I'm sure Crawley will
put up a better fight than Liverpool
did when they go there at the end
of the season. £12 million striker
Daniel Sturridge went missing and his
teammates were found wanting against
the sheer passion Oldham threw at
them. Remember, this is an Oldham
team fighting to avoid relegation from

League One. But in the end, good old fashioned stick it up 'em football and treacherous weather conditions did for Brendan Rodgers' men.

But maybe it's the booming success of the Premier League? All that money sloshing around means top flight players don't want for anything and get to play on bowling green-type surfaces all week long in training and on matchdays.

So imagine the culture shock when presented with a rain-lashed surface which has been churned up all season long. Not to mention the thunderous tackles.

Yes, you get the odd crunching challenge in the top flight, but perhaps the players at non-league and Leagues One and Two levels are more conditioned to it?

But before we all line-up to put the boot into 'lazy' Premier League footballers, let's not forget that this was by no means the first time top-flight clubs have had a bad day in the FA Cup. In 2008, just one Premier League team made the semi finals.

Luton's win at an albeit weakened
Norwich team (five of that team
started against Liverpool the previous
week) was the first time non-league
opposition had dumped a top flight
club out since Sutton did it to 1987
winners Coventry City in 1989.
Luton's achievement is arguably
more impressive, coming away from
home and without the advantage of a
'leveller' on a home pitch.


You look at the likes of Hereford beating Newcastle in 1972 (that footage of Ricky George's winner will still be wheeled out on third round weekend for millennia to come) and realise these results are liberally scattered through history.

So perhaps rather than bemoan the slipping standards of the pampered elite, let's revel in the achievements of the Davids against the Goliaths.

#### How do you think you have been playing Three weeks without a game. The boys must be going stir-crazy?

You could say that. We were really disappointed Tuesday's game was called off. There had been no indication when we arrived that there was a problem and the next thing we knew was the referee taking both managers out onto the pitch and calling it off. #### Did you set yourself any objectives during the season?

Not really, I just want to play regularly and enjoy my game. When I am enjoying it I feel my performance improves every time. I feel this season I have been enjoying my football, which for me is crucial.

# How has League One compared to League

There's more quality, the teams in League One try and play more football in comparison to teams in League Two. The players are a higher standard, which has helped me up my game. League One is what you think it will be: better players, better stadiums, better teams.

#### What's your preferred position?

A bit of a cliche but I'm just happy playing anywhere. For the MK Dons game I played out wide and scored two but in other games I've played up front and I've played just behind the striker. I'm just happy playing really that's the main thing for me. Wherever the team need me to play. I'll play. Who's the toughest team you've faced this season?

Early on when we played Swindon and lost 3-0 - that was quite a tough game. Without being disrespectful the teams we played higher up the leagues in the cups I didn't find too difficult but that was because we played really well against the likes of Bolton, Swansea and Reading.

# How would you reflect on your time so far with Crawley?

It's been very good. We got promoted and League One's been great so far. We hit a little blip but we're doing well again and I've scored ten so far this season so it's been good overall. What's the Gaffer like?

He's good. I wasn't in the team for about 10-12 games and that was tough. I had a chat to him during that period and he was good about it. When we have been playing he's been giving us good feedback when

been giving us good feedback when he felt we needed it. We've worked hard when Richie has felt we needed to. Overall he's been very good for us. Who's the joker in the pack?

There's quite a few. I'd say Bully because he puts it about and Nicky Adams gets involved in the banter but he's more the brunt of it. Bully's the main one.


#### Best trainer?


