




A lot of hard work has been done this season already and momentum is the key word that's down to the previous

Town Shortlisted For FL Award...

THE Football League has announced the shortlists for The Football League Awards 2013 and STFC have been nominated for an award.

The club have been nominated for the Perform Best Use of Digital award – for the 'STFC Adventure' campaign run throughout December. The campaign included the 'Festive Friday' fixture agaist Tranmere Rovers witnessed by almost 9,000 fans.

This year there are a total of 17 awards, with the winners being announced at the gala ceremony at The Brewery, London, on Sunday 24th March 2013.

A total of 24 clubs have made the shortlists for the eight categories announced. Huddersfield Town and Plymouth Argyle lead the way with three nominations each, while a further four clubs have two nominations.



Board Report...

Good afternoon from what has been another very tumultuous week at The County Ground.

MAY I begin by welcoming our guests from Preston North End, fresh from having appointed Simon Grayson as their new manager. This renewed welcome has been long in the waiting as it was 7th December 1985 when Preston North End last visited The County Ground!

I am also delighted to be able to officially welcome Jed McCrory and his consortium as the new owners of Swindon Town FC. The completion of the transaction, completed on Thursday, heralds a new era for STFC and I am sure that everyone who has the Club's best interests at heart, wishes them every success with their new venture. However, with the opening of a new chapter, we should not allow the old chapter to close without expressing sincere thanks to the January 2008 Consortium (Andrew Black, Sir Martyn Arbib, Andrew Fitton, and Jeremy Wray) for their generous support of the Club these past five years.

So what has been happening since we last all got together for the Hartlepool fixture? The much talked about and widely anticipated transfer of ownership of the club became somewhat protracted, largely due to administrative issues and beyond the club's control. Frustrated by what he perceived as an intolerable delay, Paolo Di Canio drew a line in the sand which required the takeover to complete by last Monday evening. When the deadline passed he announced his resignation and left the club. An unfortunate way for such an era in the club's history to end in this way.

Tuesday dawned and it was time to travel to Tranmere Rovers for the re-arranged fixture. Despite all that was going on around them,

the team put in a truly magnificent performance, and left Prenton Park with a well-deserved 3-1 victory, a victory which took Swindon Town to the top of League One. Immediately after the game Fabrizio Piccareta announced that he and the entire Italian back office coaching team had resigned and that Tranmere would be their final match. Thank you gentlemen for your contribution and we wish you well for the future.

Immediately after the Tranmere game I was approached by a group of players asking that consideration be given to the appointment of Tommy Miller and Darren Ward as Interim Managers, as the squad felt that they were sufficiently well drilled and had sufficient momentum to continue to progress without the immediate appointment of a new manager. The following day Tommy and Darren were appointed to the role and we have all been impressed by the manner in which they have risen to the challenge. The Club is also very grateful to all of those who have offered their professional support in this interim period and we are delighted that Fraser Digby will assume a temporary role as the goalkeeping coach. Others will be added to the coaching team in due

With the club now safe in the hands of new owners, in pole position and with a real determination to continue where Di Canio and his team left off, it is the perfect time for all supporters and the town to get behind the club and help it on the final push to promotion. As Delia Smith famously said: "Let's be having you."

Enjoy your afternoon now that everyone can relax once more.



Goalkeeper - Declan Rudd



2012/13 Apps: 5



THE goalkeeper joined the Preston ranks on loan from Norwich at the end of January. After joining Norwich aged nine, he progressed through the youth ranks before being named as a substitute for the final game of the 2007/08 season. He signed a three-year contract with the Canaries in July 2009 and made his senior debut as a substitute in September of the same year. He also made an

appearance as the Canaries earned back to back promotions to the Barclays Premier League, deputising for goalkeeper John Ruddy against Barnsley in September 2010. The 'keeper signed a new three-year deal in July 2011 and was also called up to the England Under-21s that summer where he was an unused substitute during their Euro 2013 qualifying campaign.

Forward - Stuart Beavon



2012/13 Apps: 31

BORN in Reading, the 28-year old striker spent time in the nonleague game with the likes of Ardley United, Wallingford, Didcot Town and Weymouth before a move into the Football League with a loan spell at Wycombe Wanderers. The frontman initially joined the Chairboys in February 2009 and made the move a permanent one that summer. After two full seasons with the club, he

caught the eye last term, finishing the 2011/12 campaign with 25 goals from just 45 appearances. Such impressive form caught the eye of former Preston boss Graham Westley, who finally got his man in the dying hours of the transfer window in August 2012. Having netted on his debut for the Whites against Swindon, away fans will be after a repeat performance this afternoon.



Forward - Joe Garner



2012/13 Apps: 27



THE 24-year old joined Preston from Watford in January on an 18-month deal. He started his career at Blackburn, working his way through the youth ranks before signing a loan deal with Carlisle in January 2007. He scored his first professional goal one month later at Brunton Park against Yeovil. After making an impression in Cumbria, he joined United on a permanent deal in August 2007,

breaking the club's transfer record fee. Less than a year after joining, he was sold to Nottingham Forest for over £1m. Spending three years at the former European Champions, he joined Watford for an undisclosed fee in August 2011. The Hornets agreed to cancel the striker's contract which allowed him to link up with the club he supports. He made his debut for the Lilywhites against Coventry City.

Club Connections...

Ray Treacy...

THE striker was brought in as a replacement for Arthur Horsfield in 1972 for a club record £35,000 from Charlton Athletic. The Irish international scored 18 goals in 60 appearances for Town before departing for Preston in December 1973. In three years at Deepdale, Treacy notched 11 times in 58 appearances.

Simon Gibson...

GIBSON joined Town from Chelsea in 1983. During his fourteen-month stay at The County Ground, the centre-half made just over 40 appearances and scored five goals. In December 1984 he made the switch to Preston. He would go on to mirror his career statistics from his spell in Wiltshire, making 42 appearances and notching five goals.


David Lucas...

AFTER coming through the youth ranks, Lucas made over 120 appearances for Preston in a ten-year stay at Deepdale. After spells with Sheffield Wednesday and Leeds, Danny Wilson brought him to SN1 in the summer of 2009. He was a virtual ever-present as Town made the League One play-off final. After defeat to Millwall, Lucas would find his 2010/11 season interrupted by injuries and, after Swindon's relegation, was allowed to leave at the end of the campaign.

Billy Wareing...

WAREING made his debut for Preston in 1910 and was a regular for the next two seasons. In the early part of North End's Second Division-winning campaign of 1912/13 he moved to Everton having made 79 appearances and scored two goals. The left-half moved to Swindon in 1920 and played

in Town's first ever league match: a 9-1 win over Luton. He racked up nearly 170 appearances in five years in Wiltshire and scored 10 goals before his retirement in 1925.

ROONEY began his career in Ireland before spells in England with Stoke, Bury and Chesterfield. After moving to Inverness Caledonian Thistle, the Dubliner scored 66 goals for the Highlanders, prompting Birmingham City to sign him in June 2011.

SWINDON Town's last spell in League One proved to be a frustrating one for Aden Flint. The big defender was signed from Alfreton Town in January 2011 but made just two first team appearances for the club before being sent back to the Derbyshire club on loan.

These days the 23-year old is fast making up for lost time and Tuesday's outing at Tranmere Rovers was his 50th league appearance in Swindon Town colours. Flint has seen the highs and lows of football during his time with the Robins so far and made 40 appearances during the League Two title-winning campaign.

Flint's path to the professional game has been a tough one. During his time with Alfreton he also held down a job tarmacing roads – but is now determined to capitalise on his Football League opportunity.

You've now clocked up 50 appearances in a Swindon shirt. Surely that's a fantastic milestone to reach after a truncated start to your Town career?

Time has gone quickly and it

certainly went fast when I first joined the club. When I first signed for Swindon I made a few appearances and then went back to Alfreton on loan. After coming back I settled in well and it's great to have 50 games under my belt, but I don't want to settle for that. The hard work has only just started and there are guys in the side who have played 300 or 400 games. That's the aim for me. Tommy Miller has played over 400 games in his career and shows what can be done.

Which game stands out as your personal favourite?

Making my debut for Swindon will always be a good memory. It was at home against Rochdale and it was great to make my professional debut. It was a good game to play in and I will always remember it. That was a good one, but the best for me was the Port Vale one at the end of last season. Winning the league in such style will always stick with me. There was a great atmosphere at the ground that day and it's a game that a lot of the lads who took part in it will remember for a long time.



Pre-season training at Swindon has been notoriously tough over the past few years, how have you found things?

I can run all day given the length of my legs! People are fitter than me with shorter legs, but I worked hard during both pre-seasons and like to be as fit as I can.

The squad has changed a lot since you first arrived. How have you adjusted to those changes?

There have been a few comings and goings but that's what a team needs. New players mean more competition for places and I have tried to improve my own game too. Players have been brought in around me so I am thankful to still be a part of what's going on here at Swindon.

Last season must have been the pinnacle of your own career so far. You couldn't have written a better script for a first full season as a professional could you?

You're right - I certainly didn't have too much cause for complaint last season with the way things went. We had a great run in the FA Cup and won the league with a fantastic run of results. I played 40 games last season and it was brilliant to have been a part of such a successful side. The only regret from last season was that I didn't play in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final, but injury put paid to that.

Do you believe Swindon have what it takes to achieve back to back promotions?

It's possible. We are top at the minute but we need to try and


turn some of the draws we have had into wins. Beating Tranmere in the week was a massive result.

Shortly after signing for Swindon, Paul Hart sent you back to your former club on loan. How much did you learn from that process?

Obviously I was disappointed to go back. I thought I had come into a struggling League One side and felt I could help and I wanted to offer something, but Paul Hart went for experience. I was captain before I carne to Swindon so it was nice to be able to help Alfreton to promotion. At the same time it was disappointing to see Swindon get relegated at the end of the same season.







You played three times for Swindon in League One before that loan spell, how are you finding life in the division this time around?

When I first joined Swindon I found it tough to adjust. The game was played at such a fast pace and it went over my head a little. I was playing with far better players than I was at Alfreton but I have adjusted to it now. In League One now there are experienced players who have dropped down the Championship and they're doing well in this division. I think it's a tight league too. Charlton won the league at a canter last season but this year it's much closer.

You held down a day job whilst also playing with Alfreton – you've had to do things the hard way haven't you?

Yeah - I was doing a normal job working on the roads before I signed professional with Swindon. I'd often be doing a night shift tarmacing as well as training and playing for Alfreton. I know what it's like to have a proper job and I will always remember where I have come from. I think I am pretty lucky to have come from playing non-league and having a day job to becoming a professional footballer.

Swindon played at Colchester a few weeks back. Things could have been very different had you signed for them instead of putting pen to paper at The County Ground...

I did go and talk to Colchester but then I heard of the interest from Swindon and came here for talks. I had the call and then came over and met Danny Wilson for talks and that was that.

This season has again been a successful one for Swindon so far. Which game sticks out as your favourite of 2012/13 to date and why?

So far this season I would say the Stoke one. It was a great game and to score in that game was fantastic. There have been a lot of highs this season and that night was one of them with the way we played and it went on to be a decent run in the cup.

With the highs come the lows and there have been some difficult moments. You were sent off against Scunthorpe and Macclesfield at the back end of last year, what do you remember of those?

I have got those of my system now and I have learned from my mistakes. They were both stupid, immature moments but I think I have grown up since then. I had to take the consequences and missed a few games which didn't help the team. I think I have moved on from those now.

Darren Ward has been steadying influence at the back for Swindon since joining on loan and then signing a permanent deal in January. How have you found playing alongside him?

'Wardy' is the perfect pro to be honest with you. He is vastly experienced and is always talking during games. He has certainly helped me with positioning and we talk to each other throughout each match we play together. His situation has changed slightly over the last few days given his caretaker role now with Tommy, but they are both very professional and will do their best for the club. Everyone is looking forward to getting back into action at home with the target being another win.

What do you remember of the game up at Preston earlier in the season?

We had just come off the back of a great win at Stoke City on the Tuesday and we were on


a massive high. I think it was a typical case of going from a high to a low and not being consistent with our results. It backfired on us and we didn't play well that day.

Your old schoolmate Lee Holmes could be back playing at The County Ground this afternoon after his loan spell here last season. Do you keep in touch still?

I do yes and have a lot of time for Lee. We have known each other since we were really young although he was a few years above me at school. He did well here last season but missed the game earlier in the season at their place with a nasty injury. He's back involved there now and it will be good to catch up.

Today is the first of back to back home games ahead of Bury's visit to The County Ground on Tuesday. What targets have you set for these fixtures?

After a long trip up to Tranmere on Tuesday it's good to be back at home. The Hartlepool game was a little frustrating because we created chances and should have come away with a win. We have to give it our all against Preston and get as many points as we can from these home fixtures. It's been a busy week, but we're ready to give our all again.







Match Analysis...

Then, after a period of sustained passing, Hartlepool gradually began advancing further up the pitch and with fifteen minutes to play, got their reward. Swindon failed to deal with a ball into the box and substitute Andy Monkhouse was on hand to poke home and level against his former employers.



THE penultimate day of February 1993 brought the return of a Town favourite when midfielder Alan McLoughlin visited the County Ground, As a member of Portsmouth's team he was looking to help cement their place in the automatic promotion frame.

The game was watched by over 14,000 people, but looked destined to finish scoreless.

Hall Of Fame...

Peter Downsborough will be back at The County Ground this afternoon to be inducted into the STFC Hall of Fame...

PETER Downsborough was a well-established goalkeeper with his native Halifax when he signed for Swindon. His Town career would stretch from 1965 to November 1973 and see him make 320 appearances for Town.

Swindon had just returned to Division Three following relegation when he signed but Peter enamoured himself to fans straight away by keeping a clean sheet against local rivals Oxford United and by the season's end, many felt that had he been at the club the previous season they would never have been relegated.

He missed just four League matches in his first season with Town but injuries limited his appearances for a couple of years. It was perhaps no coincidence


that when he was ever-present in 1968/69 Swindon won promotion and the Football League Cup. Normally an unspectacular 'keeper who prevented goals by skilful


positioning rather than full-length dives, he gave an untypical performance in the final of the league cup pulling out a number of fantastic saves to keep Arsenal at bay despite a rugged physical buffeting. At the end of the season, his consistency and dependability was recognised by Town fans who voted him their Player of the Year in what was arguably the most successful in the club's history.

He was again ever-present in the following League campaign of 1969/70 when Swindon finished fifth and reached Round Six of the FA Cup, their best performance in the competition since before the First World War. He remained firstchoice 'keeper for the following two seasons before joining Bradford City in November 1973.


