It's game by game at the minute and we will see what happens. We want to keep things as per as much as possible as well as keeping the players' focus.


Tommy and I get on really well. We have played against each other on a number of occasions and since I arrived we've got to know each other even better.



THE Shakers took the lead in Friday's away clash at Notts County, but ended on the wrong end of a 4-1 scoreline. Kevin Blackwell made three changes during the game so could make changes to the line-up for this evening's encounter in Wiltshire. Experienced striker Craig Fagan came off the bench and could be an option in the frontline, whilst Mark Carrington also featured at Meadow Lane.

THE last meeting between the two sides saw a first minute goal from James Collins earn all three points for the Robins at Gigg Lane back in early October. There have been 44 previous encounters between the two teams and Swindon go into tonight's game with the upper hand with 21 wins from those matches. The last game at The County Ground against Bury was a 2-1 win for Town in 2006.

Here's a look at some key members of the Bury squad that are expected to feature for the visitors this evening as they come to The County Ground in search of success.

#### Goalkeeper - Trevor Carson



CARSON signed a two-year contract for Sunderland in October 2010, keeping him on Wearside until summer 2012. The Northern Ireland U21 international served as second-choice stopper for much of the 2009/10 season, beating off competition from Marton Fulop and Craig Gordon. Carson was released by the Black Cats at the end of last season without making

his full debut for Sunderland, but did appear in friendly matches as well as featuring on the bench. He enjoyed a successful spell at Gigg Lane in September 2011, playing eight games prior to being recalled back to Sunderland. The stopper spent time with Hull City on loan before rejoining Bury for a second loan spell. He signed a two-year deal with the Shakers last summer.

#### Defender - Joe Skarz


THE left-back signed for the Shakers before the 2010/11 season when he put pen to paper on a two-year contract. A free transfer addition from Huddersfield Town, he quickly agreed terms with the Shakers, despite interest from several clubs. A product of the youth system, he made his debut for Huddersfield Town following several impressive performances for the Terriers'

second string. He started his first game at left back in a 1-1 draw with Scunthorpe United in November 2006. Progress was swift for the youngster and he made a total of 68 league appearances for the club before a move to Bury in the summer of 2010. He finished his first season as the only member of the first team squad to have played every minute of every game in all competitions.

#### Forward - Andy Bishop



NOW Bury's longest-serving player, the prolific striker was signed at the end of the 2005/06 season by former manager Chris Casper from York City. Bishop came to Gigg Lane with a good pedigree from his days with the Minstermen and quickly adapted to league football as he continued with his goal scoring skills. He finished his first three seasons as the club's leading scorer with 63 goals to his

tally. He started his career with Walsall but never played for the first team at The Banks's Stadium. Loaned out to Kidderminster Harriers, Rochdale and Yeovil over two seasons, he was eventually released from Walsall and signed for York. Another 34 goals came his way with the Minstermen before Bury secured his signature. In his seventh season at Gigg Lane, he has now notched over 80 goals.

## Club Connections...

**Town's** Tom Otrebski profiles a range of players who have played for both Swindon Town and Bury ahead of tonight's League One meeting...

Andy Rowland...

THE STFC Hall of Famer spent five years at Gigg Lane and scored nearly 60 goals in over 170 outings before moving down south in 1978. His association with Swindon Town would last for 20 years: As a player he appeared in a League Cup semi-final and played his part in kick-starting Town's revival under Lou Macari. After moving onto the coaching staff he witnessed promotion to the Premier League and even took temporary charge of the first team before the arrival of Steve McMahon. He sits 7th on the all-time Swindon top-scorers list with 98 goals.

#### Brian Williams...

SALFORD-born Williams was a graduate of the Bury youth system and made over 150 appearances for the Shakers between 1971 and 1977. He moved to Wiltshire in the summer of 1978 and racked up over a century of appearances scoring ten goals. He was also a member of the squad that reached the semi-finals of the League Cup.

#### Darren Bullock...

A midfielder known for his toughtackling nature, Bullock was signed by Steve McMahon in February 1997. He netted on his debut against Birmingham City at The County Ground before going on to make over 60 appearances. In February 1999, he was sold to Bury. Bullock stayed at Gigg Lane until 2002 making just over 50 appearances.

#### lan Miller...

ANOTHER graduate of the Bury youth ranks, Miller would go on to make a handful of appearances before departing Gigg Lane. Along with Williams, he joined Swindon in

the summer of 1978 and would go on to make over 150 appearances in a three season stay. The final part of the triumvirate of players in today's 'Club Connections' to have played a part in Swindon's run to the League Cup semi-finals.

SPENT the early part of his career with Alfreton Town in non-league. Danny Wilson brought Flint to The County Ground in January 2011. After only three appearances, Flint was loaned back to Alfreton for the remainder of the season. At the beginning of the 2011/12 campaign, Flint established himself as a key member of the side.



**FLINT** scored on the opening day of the season against Crewe to cement his place as first-choice centre-half. He made 40 appearances as Town cruised to the League Two title and reached the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Final at Wembley.

#### Did you know...

**FLINT** has received two international caps at England 'C' level.

#### 2012/13 Season...

THE centre-half has made 20 appearances for the Town this season and has passed the 50 appearance mark in Town colours. His only goal of the campaign to date was scored at Stoke City in the Capital One Cup to put Swindon 3-2 up in Extra Time.



#### Career so far...

ZUBAR joined Plymouth Argyle in the summer of 2010. In his time at Home Park, the defender made 34 appearances before being allowed to join AFC Bournemouth in September 2011. I used to play up front for my Sunday team as a kid, but went in goal after an injury...

**HAVING** returned to The County Ground just under a week ago as interim goalkeeping coach, Fraser Digby now takes charge of two bright prospects in the STFC goalkeeping department.

Digby's Town CV as a player includes two victorious appearances at Wembley, countless Player of the Year awards amassed during over 500 games in Swindon colours. Back on the STFC training ground following the departure of Domenico Doardo, the 46-year old former Manchester United stopper is now passing on his considerable knowledge to Wes Foderingham and Leigh Bedwell.

COYR sat down with Town's goalkeeping duo ahead of

tonight's visit of Bury to get the lowdown on how they ended up between the sticks, their career path to The County Ground and how much they expect to learn from Digby himself.

#### Why did you become a goalkeeper?

LB: My Dad wouldn't let me be a 'keeper because he didn't want me to be the one to get blamed for everything. I think my brother managed to talk him round and I was soon taking my place in goal and loved it.

WF: I used to play up front for my Sunday team, although I think every youngster starts up front and then drifts back. One day someone needed to go in goal and I did okay. My technique wasn't great

but I managed to keep the ball out and it went from there.

#### Who is your favourite ever goalkeeper and why?

LB: Shay Given. I don't believe he is the best ever 'keeper in technical terms but he has had a great career and served his club and country so well. I watched Wes play against him earlier this season and that was heartbreaking.

WF: I am going to have to say two. Shay Given because of his qualities. I supported Newcastle United when I was growing up and I think he's one of the best 'keepers they have ever had there. I grew up watching David James and he bounced back from a few mistakes really well. I



faced him earlier in the season for Bournemouth too and I think the conditions certainly played a part that day.

#### What's the best save you have ever made during your career?

LB: For some reason I seem to make a lot of stops with my face! I always get caught in the boat and have had a few smacks there. It's happened in games as well as training, but they all count don't they?

WF: The one in the closing stages of the Tranmere game was good but Bedders says I made a lot out of it. My favourite is the penalty stop against Cheltenham last season. That was a really important moment. We really believed we could win the league after that win.

#### Which is the best save that you can ever remember?

LB: Craig Gordon's effort against Bolton a few seasons ago. It was a close range stop but I have no idea how he got across to get to the ball. It was voted the best save ever I think – it was on the line and he put it over the bar.


WF: A save from Lyon goalkeeper Grégory Coupet - simply unbelievable. The centre-half played the ball back but it was too high, so the 'keeper somehow headed the ball back against the bar. The follow up from the striker was a low shot into the corner but somehow Coupet got down to it and saved that too!


In your opinion who should be in goal for England at the moment? LB: I'm going to have to say Joe Hart. Wes has to be close, but I think he has a few more years before he catches Joe Hart!

WF: Me! No I'm joking. At the moment I don't think you can look past Joe Hart as Bedders said. He is head and shoulders above any other English 'keeper around at the moment. Ben Foster is probably the closest, but I will stick with Joe Hart for number one.

#### Do you have any matchday routines or superstitions?

LB: I always wear red boxers. That's about all I have at the moment, although I have followed Wes to a certain extent. He has one pair of gloves for the warm-







up and one for the game, which is what I do now too.

WF: When I get to the ground I usually get changed straight away into my kit and then go and get a rub down from one of the masseurs. I have the same routine each matchday and that hasn't changed really. It's served me well so far.

#### Which gloves do you wear at the moment?

LB: They're from a company called F-Line who are a small business so it's nice to support them. I used to wear gloves from a lot of the major brands such as Umbro, Nike and adidas but at the moment I prefer F-Line gloves. They're extremely comfortable.

WF: Umbro – I have worn the same brand of gloves since the age of sixteen but that deal comes to an end at the end of this season so I have to look for a new supplier now.

#### What is the best thing about being a goalkeeper?

LB: Being able to tip one out of the top comer in the last minute of a game! Being able to stop someone scoring an absolute worldy is the best feeling in the world.

WF: I would say saving a penalty in a cup final and going onto win the game.

#### And the worst thing?

LB: As a 'keeper it has to be the ball going through your legs or through your hands. You just want the ground to swallow you up if that happens.


WF: Being subbed after 21 minutes of a game! I'd say that or making a horrendous error to cost my team the game.



There have been some mad and very individual goalkeepers to have graced the game. You're your memory, who are the craziest goalkeepers you can remember?

LB: Good question, I'll have to go for Fabien Barthez. Most 'keepers seem to have a screw loose which is why they play in the position they do. Barthez was a bit eccentric and did some weird things. I remember reports during his playing days that he even urinated on the pitch during a European game!

WF: Jens Lehmann, the Germany 'keeper. He was on another level to Barthez, I remember seeing him arguing

with his defenders and pushing them in the head. Surely a little crazv.

#### So if all goalkeepers are slightly crazy, how would you assess each other?

LB: Wes is a great 'keeper and has many good qualities. His shot-stopping is unbelievable and the speed around the goal is superb.

WF: Bedders has improved so, so much. When I first came to the Swindon on loan he was in the youth team but you could tell technically was good. He has been coached well and has come on leaps and bounds since turning pro.

Gary Roberts scored a couple of superb goals a week ago at Tranmere Rovers, with the second a speculative longrange strike. What is the furthest distance you have been beaten from?

LB: I have never been beaten from the half-way line that's for sure. I remember being beaten by a strike from Jordan Obita at Reading. I used to play with him for the county, but it was a game for Swindon against Reading and he chipped me from the edge of the box. It was a great finish and there wasn't a lot I could do about it.

WF: Probably the free-kick against Macclesfield Town in the FA Cup game earlier in the season. I think it took a deflection off Flinty but I got the blame for it. That wasn't a good day.

#### Have you ever come up for a corner or scored a goal?

LB: I used to score a few in my youth team days in training. We used to play keep-ball all the time and that was good fun. I enjoyed playing outfield with the rest of the lads but I haven't had much of a chance to do that of late.

WF: I have never done it in a professional game although I ran up to celebrate with the lads after the third goal against Tranmere Rovers last week. It was an incredible strike from Robbo and made sure of the victory.

#### You haven't had long working with Fraser Digby, but how has that been for you both so far?

LB: It's been great. Obviously he is a Swindon Town legend but his input has been great so far. I am sure I will learn a lot from him.

WF: I had so many tweets from fans telling me how good he was as a player here. He achieved a lot for the club so it's good to have the chance to learn from him. He has done a few different drills with us and I'm sure there's a lot of good stuff to come.









## Match Analysis...

**Town** drew 1-1 with Preston North End at The County Ground as they began life under interim managers Tommy Miller and Darren Ward.

IN a first half of very few chances, Town's best chance came through player-manager Tommy Miller after just six minutes. He burst through from midfield and made a solid connection with Andy Williams' cross only for Declan Rudd in the Preston goal to react brilliantly and turn the ball away to safety.

After the bright start the match deteriorated into a midfield battle with neither side able to gain a foothold in the final third. A clearance by one of the visitors' centre-halves only dropped to Roberts on the right hand edge of the box. His eventual right-footed effort was slightly miscued and it flew across the face of goal and wide.

Six minutes into the second half the visitors took the lead. Town

ADAM Rooney showed good composure to level the game against Preston after coming off the bench... allowed a cross to be knocked back across goal and when the ball dropped to Hayhurst he rifled home from inside the six yard box.

Then, with 15 minutes to play, substitute Adam Rooney hauled Swindon level. After replacing Raffa De Vita seconds earlier, Rooney made the most of a defensive mixup, latched onto the loose ball and calmly stroked the ball into the comer.

Town's best chance to win it dropped to Aden Flint who met a corner with his head and watched as Rudd denied him with a neat reflex save. As the ball was recycled, Alan Navarro blazed over from Miller's cut-back.





It would never come easy but with new owners in place in Wiltshire it will be interesting to see where we go as a club from here. The incoming board certainly have plenty of ideas to engage with the fans, and hopefully the supporters will take them up on any such initiatives.

Finally, a word for tonight's visitors. Bury are finding life tough at present as they deal with a second transfer embargo of the season following their need to take out a PFA loan to cover their cashflow issues.

No one wants to see a Football League club suffer, on or off the field, and I'm sure I speak for everyone here tonight when I wish for stability at Gigg Lane in the not-so-distant future.





THIS match had everyone salivating in anticipation as manager Kevin Keegan brought league leaders Newcastle United to the County Ground.

Town assistant boss John Gorman commented 'It will be a big test for Newcastle. Every team coming here seems frightened of us and change their style to try to counter us'. Over 17,500 supporters shared his enthusiasm.

Boss Glenn Hoddle though unfit was presented with the Manager of the Month award ahead of kick-off, but there were some dissenting comments after defender David Kerslake had been sold to Leeds during the week.

Transfer deadline days, eh?

Despite the apparently
weakened team, a traditional
Shaun Taylor header which
passed over the bar gave
notice of our intentions. The
match fluctuated as Town's
Paul Hunt and then United's
Lee Clarke threatened, but it
was David Kelly who crashed
the ball past Fraser Digby two
minutes before the break.

Six minutes into the second period Steve White was clattered to the ground in the penalty box, and spot kick expert Paul Bodin made no mistake.

t Less than five minutes later it was the same combination who engineered the lead. White forced a corner which was swung in by Bodin for Colin Calderwood to scramble home and give Town all three points.

Keegan praised Town. 'Give credit to Swindon. They do not have the resources but they battled for a result and they can be proud of that'.

Newcastle, who had future Town defender Mark Robinson on the bench, completed the season at the top of the table, while Town finished the day in third position.


