

Enjoy the match today and keep up the noise levels.



Swindon Town has won the Perform Best Use of Digital Award at the Football League Awards 2013...

MARK Isaacs, Operations Manager and Derrick Johnson, Head of Creative and Design received the award at the gala ceremony at The Brewery, London, on Sunday evening in front of over 600 guests from clubs, sponsors and the football industry. This year there were a total of 17 awards with 34 clubs shortlisted for honours.

Swindon Town's Christmas ADVENTure campaign beat competition from Birmingham City, Bristol City, Crystal Palace, Leeds United and Plymouth Argyle to win the overall award.

Launched in December 2012, the main objective for the Christmas ADVENTure campaign was to drive attendances, raise awareness and engage supporters through e-marketing, the official website, social media channels, club sponsors and partners. The club's achievement included a significant increase in revenue from online tickets, a 30% increase in matchday revenues and an 18% increase in match day hospitality sales.

On winning the award Mark Isaacs, Operations Manager, said: "It is important that we engage with supporters through digital technology. We feel we have to be in continuous communication with

Greg Clarke, Chairman of The Football League, said: "The Football League Awards 2013 has






In The Spotlight...

The Latics come to The County Ground with a mix of youth and experience in their ranks. Here's a closer look at some of their squad for today's encounter...

Defender – Jean Yves M'voto



2012/13 Apps: 40



THE defender joined Oldham in August 2010 on loan from Sunderland before making the move a permanent one in 2011. It was for Paris St Germain that the central defender cut his teeth having been spotted playing local football. Though he never played first-team football for PSG, M'voto was scouted by Sunderland who signed him for a reported £300,000 transfer fee in

January 2008 and handed a threeand-a-half year contract. He never played a senior game for the Black Cats but was loaned to Southend and Oldham to gain valuable firstteam experience. He was such a big hit at Boundary Park that when his Sunderland released him at the end of the 2010/11 season, the Latics persuaded him to accept a two-year contract.

Midfielder - Korey Smith

23 2012/13 Apps: 20

THE 22-year old midfielder joined on loan from Premier League side Norwich in mid-March. He signed his first professional contract with the Canaries in 2008 after progressing through the youth ranks. He made his senior Norwich debut at Carrow Road in 2009. He made his full debut against Charlton and scored his first goal in the 5-2 win over Wycombe. The League

One title-winning season proved to be a breakthrough season as he made 40 appearances and he added to that experience by making 28 appearances in City's 2010/11 Championship campaign. He spent part of last season on loan to Barnsley where he made 12 appearances. In September he joined Yeovil Town for a three-month loan stint.



Forward - Jose Baxter



20 2012/13 Apps: 38



THE striker signed a four month contract for Latics in September 2012. He made a goalscoring debut the following day as a substitute in the 2-2 draw against Notts County. He started out with Everton at the age of six and graduated through the ranks to become the Toffees' youngest ever first-team player eclipsing Wayne Rooney who had earlier held the honour. He made

15 appearances for Everton but after rejecting the offer of a new two-year contract in the summer as he wanted to play regular first-team football. Baxter spent pre-season at Crystal Palace, but the offer of a contract failed to materialise and he then joined the Latics, initially on trial, before signing a short-term contract and he has impressed in Oldham colours this term.

Club Connections...

Town's Tom Otrebski profiles a range of players who have played for both Swindon Town and Oldham Athletic ahead of today's League One meeting...

Chris Ogden...

OLDHAM-born Ogden graduated from the youth ranks at the Latics and made over 120 appearances between 1971 and 1978. After moving to Wiltshire in the summer of 1978, the goalkeeper made 29 appearances in his first campaign but found opportunities limited when Jimmy Allan was preferred as Number One. He left for Rotherham in November 1979.

Frank Large...

THE centre-forward began his career with Halifax before spells at QPR and Northampton. Joined Swindon in 1964 and in a six-month stay in Wiltshire, made 17 appearances and scored four goals. Came to Oldham in the 1965/66 season and made 34 appearances before moving back to Northampton. He would go on to play for a further four clubs at home and abroad before retiring.

Sam Parkin...

ONE of Swindon's most prolific scorers of the 21st century, Parkin spent time on loan at Boundary Park during the 2000/01 season making seven appearances. In August 2002, Andy King secured the striker's services and he made an immediate impact, netting a hat-trick on his debut against Barnsley. 'Super Sam' went on to plunder over 20 goals in each of his three seasons in Wiltshire and helped fire Town to the play-offs in 2003/04. He departed for Ipswich in the summer of 2005 having made over 130 appearances. His tally of 73 goals puts him 16th on the all-time Swindon top-scorers chart.

LOU Macari persuaded John Kelly to turn down Bristol City to sign for Town in the summer of 1987. The midfielder would only make eight appearances for Swindon and netted just once, against West Bromwich Albion, before being allowed to join Oldham on Ioan. LETTER TO FOUNDER CLUBS

2nd March.

Every year it is becoming more and more difficult for football clubs of any standing to meet their friendly engagements and even arrange friendly matches. The consequence is that at the last moment, through cup-tie interference, clubs are compelled to take on teams who will not attract the public.

I beg to tender the following suggestion as a means of getting over the difficulty: that ten or twelve of the most prominent clubs in England combine to arrange home-and-away fixtures each season, the said fixtures to be arranged at a friendly conference about the same time as the International Conference

This combination might be known as the Association Football Union, and could be managed by representative from each club. Of course, this is in no way to interfere with the National Association; even the suggested matches might be played under cup-tie rules. However, this is a detail.

My object in writing to you at present is merely to draw your attention to the subject, and to suggest a friendly conference to discuss the matter more fully. I would take it as a favour if you would kindly think the matter over, and make whatever suggestions you deem necessary. I am only writing to the following – Blackburn Rovers, Bolton Wanderers, Preston North End, West Bromwich Albion, and Aston Villa, and would like to hear what other clubs you would suggest.

A lot has happened over the last few months but we are going to give it our all to try and secure promotion.

A year ago Simon Ferry was a member of the Town side gunning for promotion to League One. Twelve months on and the midfielder remains a principal part of the Swindon midfield, with a second successive promotion in his sights.

THE Scot reached an impressive total of 54 appearances last season as a series of successful cup runs added to the demands on Town's campaign. This time around the likeable 25-year old has clocked up 43 appearances to date and has found the net on five occasions his best ever total during his time with the Robins. His first two strikes were away from The County Ground, with the matchwinner at Shrewsbury Town at the end of September followed by the opener at Walsall in November. Don't shout it too loudly, but he's found his shooting boots on home turf too. He has notched in front of the home faithful in February and March as well as a superb finish at Griffin Park (after rounding former teammate Jonathan Douglas). His performances around the park have been noted too and he remains one of the first names on the Town teamsheet under new manager

COYR sat down with the midfielder on Tuesday afternoon to gauge his views on the season so far, international football and why he hopes May proves to be a football free month.

So there are seven games to go with promotion still a possibility. How do you feel now we are at the business end of the season?

It's definitely an exciting time to be involved with the Club. It has been a long season and a lot has happened over the last few months but we are going to give it our all to try and secure promotion. A lot of effort has gone in this season and we don't want that to go to waste. It has been a tiring season in some ways; we were in every day under the old manager so it seems like a longer season than usual. If you had offered us second spot with seven games to play we'd have taken that without doubt. We are not taking anything for granted though. We have been there

or thereabouts this season and still having a chance of promotion is a great position to be in.

What will be the key to winning promotion?

Our away form has been good so if we can go to Doncaster and nick three points then we will be well on the right track. We need to improve our home form, but we have been playing well recently. Even at Brentford I thought we dominated the game but didn't get the win.

How much did you learn from being a part of a promotion winning team last year?

The main thing I learned is the importance of sticking together. You need everyone to work hard and to be consistent if you are going to achieve success. I don't think we have had many losing runs this season so we have been consistent to an extent. There have been a few draws that we should have won. but that's what we have to work towards in terms of targets for the remaining games.

How much did you learn from Paolo Di Canio during his time

He was all about winning and that rubbed off on the players, many of whom were signed by him. We had a good run in the cups last season and obviously won promotion. There was a lot of hard work but based on results that worked. That was his way of doing things but we are into the new era now.

Can you describe how the atmosphere has changed since Kevin MacDonald took over?

The new gaffer has so much passion for the game and it has been an enjoyable few weeks. He wants us to pass the ball and to play with freedom. In training it has all been about working with the ball and short-sharp games. There has been a lot of fitness too and there have been some really hard running sessions.

You have spent most of the season playing alongside Tommy Miller in midfield. How tough was it to adjust when he was appointed joint player-manager?

I didn't play in both of those games, but it was the players that wanted Darren and Tommy to have their chance. I saw Nick Watkins straight after the Tranmere game and said that the boys wanted them in charge until a new manager was appointed. They both have so much experience; they're well respected and have been brilliant all season for us.

Have you learned a lot from Tommy since he arrived at the Club last summer?







He plays in the same position as me and he has so much experience in the game. He's played in the Premier League and he's very fit for his age too. I've learnt a lot from him.

And what about Darren Ward?

I have changed my diet a bit and he has had a bit of influence with a few of the other lads too. I am eating more organic food these days but haven't changed things drastically. Little bits here and there, but it has helped.

At the other end of the scale youngster Louis Thompson came off the bench against Notts County. What's it been like training with him this season?

He's been brilliant. As a player you get judged when you first come and train with the first team and to be fair Louis hasn't looked out of place at all. He has composure and he's come on in big games for us. He has handled himself very well so far.

What do you remember of your first involvement in senior training as a Celtic player?

I was called up to train with the senior lads and there were a lot of big players in the squad back then. They used to get on your case a little so you had to be thick-skinned and know how to look after yourself. If I had listened to everyone back then I wouldn't be playing football now. It has stood me in good stead for the rest of my career because you have to be able to accept criticism in football too.


One player to leave these parts was your good friend Paul Caddis. You must have been delighted for him to return to international duty earlier this week...


Yeah I was so pleased for him. He called me the night before it was announced and said you'd never have believed that our old gaffer had been on the phone. In my opinion he deserves his call-up and he will do well for them. I always knew how good a player he was so it didn't come as a shock when he told me he had got the call.

Do you still hold out hope of being called up for Scotland duty one day?

I don't think so. Scotland have a lot of quality midfielders that play in the Premier League every week so don't need me. Some people may think they're a bad side but they're not bad enough to give me a call-up! I haven't given it too much thought in all honesty - I am just concentrating on what I am doing with Swindon.

You worked with Gordon Strachan at Celtic. Do you think he can turn things around?





During my time with Celtic he was very good to me and I think he will do well for Scotland. He was always out on the training field and he loves coaching; trying to make his players the best they can be. He is the sort of guy Scotland need at the moment and although they lost to Wales, I think he'll sort things out.

There are six games to go following today's match against Oldham. Can Town get over the line and secure promotion?

We are not in second place without good reason. It has been the most turbulent season during my time with the Club yet the boys have done really well. We have all stuck together and to be sitting second in the table with seven games to go is a credit to the mentality within the squad.

There are meetings with a number of your former Town teammates to come too, starting with Billy Paynter on Monday at Doncaster Rovers...

Doncaster have probably been the most consistent team in the division and they're still grinding out results. We know every game will be tough and Monday will be no different. I got on well with Bill when he was here. He helped me settle in and was a great guy to have around the place.

Sheffield United away seems to be the one that all Town fans are looking forward to. Is that the standout game from your point of view?

That game won't mean anything unless we get the results we need between now and then. If we go there with the chance of automatic promotion then yes it will be a big game. If we don't do well until that

game comes around then we won't have anything to play for.

Today Oldham are in the way of three points. What do you remember of the game at Boundary Park earlier in the season?

We controlled the game despite a scrappy start. The first goal went our way and then Raffa got another one and that was that. They had a wee go in the second half but there was no chance of them coming back into the game. Today will be different because they have a new manager in place and I am sure they'll be fighting for their lives to stay in this division.

Have you ever scored twice in a game?




You only scored two goals last season, but have five to your name so far this season. What's happened?!

YOUNGER readers might need some guidance about the match that took place at the County Ground on April 10th 1993 because Town, challenging for promotion to the top flight, were set a stern test by a club that has spent the most recent four years in the Conference.

Relegation threatened Luton
Town came to Swindon, and
while we were forced to do
without suspended strikers
Dave Mitchell and Steve White,
the Hatters were able to call
upon former favourite Chris
Kamara, future Robin David
Preece and another Town
loanee of the future Martin
Williams.

Craig Maskell was denied a couple of early chances but it was England striker Kerry Dixon and Kamara who got in a tangle for the visitors to spurn an opportunity from three yards.

Further chances fell the way of Luton as Dixon again twice failed to find the net and Preece added to the ineptitude in front of goal.

It was well into the second half before we started to create any meaningful impact through first Craig Maskell, then Martin Ling who failed to direct a header goalwards.

Then debutant Chris Hamon, on for Ross MacLaren, tested Luton keeper Alec Chamberlain (pictured right), before supplying the assist that won the game. Flicking the ball into the path of marauding left-back Paul Bodin it was the prolific defender who sealed three points, firing past the opposition keeper seven minutes from time to keep our promotion charge on track.

Glenn Hoddle said 'This is a long way into the season and it's the first time I can say we played poorly. To actually play like that and end up winning is the sign of a good side'.



THE trip is the third time we have been away and it's vital for the lads and their long term development at Swindon Town. The idea of the trip was to cover the 'Four Corners': the Social, Technical, Tactical, and Psychological aspects of their development.

Socially: to mix in with the players in their current age group and meet other players in the same age groups, as well as getting to know other members of staff. Technically and Tactically: playing against European players and their systems and styles. The last element is psychological: being away from home with no parents the lads have to look after themselves, preparing, and being professional players.

The players will have games against De Graafschap, Gravenzande, Den Haag, SPD USA, PSV Eindhoven and FC Emma. The week was very intensive, both physically and mentally. We have 10 members of staff on the trip along with two sports therapists, a kit and equipment manager, a Match Analyst and a Child Welfare officer as well as the STFC coaches.

All the players will train together and eat together. They will prepare for the games with prematch meals, travel to games on coaches and will have rest periods before games to try and educate the players to become like professionals. Hopefully in years to come, it becomes important to their development.

The first game kicked off against De Graafschap with the U12s playing 11v11. The U10s/U11s had three teams and played 9v9. The U12s won 4-1 thanks to two goals from U11 Levi Irving, one from Oscar Webster, and one from Connor Hibbs. The game was filmed by our analyst Mike Haynes and the players watched the game back to enhance their learning. This will be a valuable tool for the Academy and we hope it will be a huge benefit to the players and the staff. We will utilise it throughout the week with all the age groups having their games filmed.

The U10s/U11s mixed side eventually lost 4-2, with Town's goals coming from Rhys Wells and Miles Littlechild. It was a pleasing performance. It was important that we rotated the players around and, with a lot of games scheduled, it's important that we had no injuries.





The FA Cup Story...

Tomorrow marks 101 years to the day when Town stepped out at Stamford Bridge to contest an FA Cup semi-final with Barnsley. COYR looks back on what was Swindon's second semi-final appearance in just two years...

DESPITE being crowned
Southern League Champions the
season before and contesting the
Charity Shield with Manchester
United, Swindon's success
over the course of the 1911/12
campaign would come in the
FA Cup.

Sutton Junction and Notts
County were despatched 5-0 and
2-0 respectively before Town were
handed a trip to West Ham United
in Round Three, Swindon took
the Hammers to a replay at The
County Ground and duly thrashed
them 4-0 thanks in some small
part to two own goals.

Everton visited Wiltshire in the quarter final. Bob Jefferson and Archie Bown were the Town goalscorers as they secured a place in the last four with a 2-1 victory.

On 30th March 1912, over 48,000 packed into Stamford Bridge to witness Swindon's tussle with Barnsley for a place in the FA Cup final. The Town lineup read like a list of STFC Hall of Fame members: Len Skiller, Jock Walker, Billy Silto and Freddy Wheatcroft were just some of the names involved. However, Sam Allen's team and in particular Swindon great Harold Fleming were unable to work their magic against the tough-tackling Tykes and the game finished 0-0.

The exploits of the first match took their toll: the talismanic Fleming joined Billy Tout on the list of those sidelined and Town went into the replay at Meadow Lane the following Wednesday without two of their most influential players.

Despite the set-back, Swindon might have taken the lead against the Yorkshire side in the first half. Having been awarded a penalty, Archie Bown had his kick saved. Phil Bratley scored the winning goal in the second half to seal Barnsley's place in the final, where they would go onto beat West Bromwich Albion.




