Chris Morgan took temporary charge of the Blades after Danny Wilson and Frank Barlow left the club on Wednesday evening.

The former defender, captain and coach spoke to the players on Thursday morning ahead of the club calling a press conference later that day.

Here is a taste of the comments he made on Thursday...

Obviously the situation arose on Wednesday night, it is never nice when a manager and assistant manager have to leave a football club.

Danny and Frank have done everything in their power in the last two years to make Sheffield United successful. They worked so hard, as have all the staff and the players, now we find ourselves in a position with five games to go and the aim remains promotion.

Two fantastic men, who I owe everything to, have left this football club and we all must accept a share of the responsibility. Danny and Frank have been into the training ground and told us all to go and win promotion and finish the job off.

I must stress, like I already have done to the players, the five games are stepby-step, starting with Swindon Town.

The supporters will get right behind us, as they understand exactly what the challenge is that lies ahead.

Myself and David Unsworth, who will assist me, will stress to the players that it is their responsibility to give the crowd something to shout about. It is our jobs to get the supporters backing but I am sure they will remain right behind us. What we need is a really positive

performance and if we produce that then the fans will believe again, we must have that belief throughout the remainder of the season, in all areas.

We have enjoyed a lot of success over the last couple of seasons and we must go out with confidence on Saturday, take the game by the scruff of the neck and really stamp some authority on the game from the first minute.

It is an old cliché but we will take one game at a time and hopefully those positive results will be enough to see us win promotion.

Preparations for the weekend started on Thursday morning, in the dressing room at the training ground.

When a manager leaves, you are always going to have disappointment and the lads will have a lot of different thoughts going through their minds.

That includes those that have been playing and others that haven't. I've spoken to them all and both myself and David told them the immediate thought is Swindon Town – the players have a big responsibility and I think they understand that.

Welcome to today's fixture against Swindon Town. I sincerely hope the Swindon team, its management, officials and supporters had a safe journey and they return home safely to Wiltshire after the game.

Of course, you will be aware that a number of important decisions have been taken since the Crawley game. Late on Wednesday evening we announced that Danny Wilson and Frank Barlow had left the club and that Chris Morgan had been placed in temporary charge for the remainder of the season.

With regards supporters' events, there was a 'Fans Forum' last night organised by the Handsworth Blades, in conjunction with our Supporter Liaison Officer, John Garrett, Kevin McCabe and David Green were in attendance and I'm sure the results of which will be well-documented. Staying on the theme of supporters, as we continue to work on our Equality Standard, we are supporting the Level Playing Field Weeks of Action today. We strive continuously to work with the football authorities to promote inclusion and to combat discrimination across the board and today we recognise the efforts made throughout the game to involve those with any form of disability to enjoy being a part of it.

Moving forward, all the lads will get behind Morgs and I'm pretty sure the fans will do the same.

Now is not the time for feeling sorry for ourselves, thinking that everything is against us, or looking for excuses. It is up to us, the players, to step up to the plate and change our own fortunes.

It is pointless thinking about what might have been in recent weeks, we have to move on and we have got five crucial games remaining, starting today.

We need a big performance and speaking to the lads after Tuesday night's defeat, they are of the same mind – determined to produce the goods on our own turf.

It has been a nightmare few days since Tuesday, you can't completely get the defeat out of your system until you have had chance to put things right.

Gearing up for charity tournament

A group of car service and salesmen are the latest team to sign up to Weston Park Hospital Cancer Charity's five-aside tournament – which is set to adorn Bramall Lane this summer.

The men from Sytner Sheffield BMW will be hoping for the perfect pitch, a dynamic driving force and speed down the wing at the football tournament on Sunday 26th May.

The Team of Steel Cup will raise vital funds for the Cancer Charity's 'Do Your Bit' campaign, which is raising funds for a new Cancer Research and Treatment Suite at Weston Park.

The Sytner team will have the chance to play against former Blades and Owls legends on the

day, as well as teams from some of the city's biggest firms like Sheffield Forgemasters International.

Jason Cole, assistant service manager of Sytner Sheffield, said: "We are all big football fans and the business sponsors both of the city's football teams.

"We have more than 110 staff members at our Broad Lane site and unfortunately cancer is something that has affected some of our lives, and so we thought taking part in the tournament was a great way to raise money for a local, worthwhile cause."

Sytner service manager Paul Godbehere will be joining his colleagues when they step out onto the hallowed Lane turf and the charity is very close to the 33 year-old's heart.

Paul, from Waterthorpe, said: "I lost my mum, Carol, to cervical cancer when I turned 18 and my dad, Mick, also passed away five years ago from cancer of the chest.

"My mum was treated at Weston Park Hospital and so my brothers, sister and I are keen cancer charity fundraisers. This will be my first fundraiser for Weston Park Hospital Cancer Charity, and as a United fan it's a great way to get involved with the charity; I'm really excited for the big day."

Two of the footballing legends taking part in the tournament who originate from the Steel City are Carl Bradshaw and John Pearson.

Tina Harrison, acting deputy director of Weston Park Hospital Cancer Charity, said: "We are so pleased Sytner has thrown its support behind our big event – it's great to see the city's



businesses coming together on the field. It is going to be a fantastic day.

The Do Your Bit campaign is raising money to provide a new Cancer Research and Treatment Suite at Weston Park Hospital which will allow patients access to a wider range of new cutting edge anti-cancer treatments, as well as enabling significant development of the hospital's ground-breaking programme of clinical trials.

The fundraising has received support from not-for-profit health insurance provider and Blades sponsor, Westfield Health. Westfield's Charitable Trust has pledged £350,000 to the campaign - its biggest ever single donation, kick-starting the campaign with £100,000 and then matching all Do Your Bit donations pound-for-pound, up to a further £250,000.

Weston Park Hospital Cancer Charity needs to raise £1.5million in total this year in order to fund a wide range of projects that support pioneering cancer research and help to improve the treatments and care for people living with cancer.

Weston Park Hospital provides care for cancer patients from across the region, which means that patients from Sheffield, Rotherham, Barnsley, Doncaster, Worksop, Chesterfield, and beyond benefit from donations made to the charity.

I am, by nature, nosey – the term in the corridors of football is more commonly referred to as 'being busy' – I always believe that knowledge is power!

Sitting upstairs at the kitchen table

one night I was 'nebbing' in on Mum and Dad discussing the then plight of their Newsagents business, it was the mid 1970s and, for a variety of reasons, things were not going very well indeed. Dad was old school where business was concerned and a lot that had been agreed on the shake of a hand with his partner had gone up in a puff of smoke when he keeled over and died suddenly.

They were discussing the number of staff that they had and what could be done to ease the situation. Now, as we all know, anyone who was a friend of the family in those days automatically became referred to as 'Auntie or Uncle' – this was a decent ploy as it generally meant that you could screw a slightly better birthday or Christmas present out of the deal, so the pleasantries were worthwhile.

'Auntie' Edna worked in the shop. She and her husband were friends of Mum and Dad, dating back to around the war. The conversation sadly pointed to the fact that she, along with several others, would have to sacrificed as part of the sad and ultimately futile task of trying to keep the business ticking over – and I have to add that these decisions were taken with more than a fair dose of angst.

As Dad took me out through the shop one morning to drop me off at school good old 'Auntie' Ed was busying herself behind the counter. "Good morning John Paul, how are you today?" she said.

"Great thanks, Dad is sacking you... bye," came the reply as I helped myself to a handful of Cadbury's Roses from the tin.

"Oh, is he?" she spat through gritted teeth. "See you when get back," said Dad as he manhandled me out of the door. I wouldn't have minded, but it was closed at the time! He wasn't best pleased and that's for sure.

Edna was a good member of staff. It was the times that dictated what was happening with the money that was being paid out, it certainly wasn't personal and, thankfully, when all was explained, the friendship survived – and I learned a valuable lesson... keep yer gob shut!

Football Clubs are like any place of work, for instance if you knew someone who was involved with the Police and they were working on a murder case, would you be asking them continuously how things were going and who you had arrested or interviewed that week? Well, you might, but do you think that you would get the answer for which you were looking? Probably not.

All managers, for instance, are very different in the approach that they will have to the team training up at Shirecliffe. Some have been fairly relaxed to people rocking up and watching from a reasonable distance whilst the lads are put through their paces, others have viewed it with a mixture of apprehension and a certain amount of mistrust, particularly the day before a game is concerned as the set plays, marking and overall tactics can be gleaned from watching on.

The day before a game it is not unreasonable to find the access gates locked and stewards on duty, not because we are that way inclined as a club, but because we want to make sure that no- one is feeding that sort of information back to the wrong sources. Don't forget, in the case of the training ground for instance, it is the office for the first team – it is where they meet, eat and work – also,

it is where their belongings are kept whilst they are out on the training pitches doing their jobs, and a certain amount of common sense has to be applied.

We went through a spell of always having people up there hanging round with balls and shirts to be signed, this, as you can imagine, got an even bigger issue in the Premier League. A kid with a ball is one thing, we have all been there and having something signed by your heroes is something that you will never stop cherishing.

I still have a faded permawhite ball, signed by all the Fourth Division Championship team one school holiday at the Ball Inn training ground. The signatures are faded but I still recall the joy of having them all together and it is something that I would not swap for the world.

The advent of eBay and other such sites meant that people saw the chance to make a few quid – like a say, one kid with a ball or a shirt is one thing, a bloke with a bag of balls or shirts is a completely different subject, and believe me, there were plenty of those.

The final straw came when the ever affable Phil Jagielka was tapped in the car park one matchday for a shirt. I think he was told a tale about some special event it was for, and Jags being Jags fell for it, the very next game he met the geezer in question and handed a white away shirt over, signed it for the lad and had a picture handing it over and shaking hands. That very night it was for sale on one of the auction sites.

When you work in the game you will doubtless hear and see things around the place that are not for public consumption, they stay indoors, and that is quite right. The same happens in all types of businesses.

When I read some of the 'in the know' stuff on various websites I roll my eyes and shake my head... God only knows where they get some of it from. The majority turns out to be wrong, but on the occasions that the information is true, it can still prove counter productive to the business if the facts get into the wrong hands.

It hasn't happened here but at other clubs the team has been leaked a day before the game and used by opposition managers - that is not helpful to anyone, except the other team.

Loose lips sink ships, so goes the saying, but in our case it could lead to losing football matches and other such problems... that's why I've learned to keep schtum, although it came a little late for 'Auntie' Edna!

WE CAN STILL PUT THINGS RIGHT - RYAN

Ryan Flynn has set a target of five wins from the last five matches.

Despite the 2-0 defeat to Crawley Town in midweek which put a dent in the Blades hopes of a top two finish, the Scottish winger predicts there will be plenty more twists and turns at the summit of League One in the next fortnight.

Ryan could understand the frustrations of the supporters at full-time on Tuesday and he admits it is down to the players to put things right, starting today, against Kevin MacDonald's Robins:

"Tuesday night was particularly disappointing, having played quite well in the first-half without getting that crucial breakthrough.

"We were in control of the game, but in the second-half we didn't create as much. When we score first we usually go on and win, so ultimately we are all frustrated again.

"We make two slips defensively and get done with the ultimate sucker punches.

"There are five games left, we will take them one at a time, but I certainly think we need to win all five to be sure of automatic promotion.

"We still have time to put things right, but obviously the key to our success is our home form.

"Bramall Lane should be a massive advantage to us but it hasn't of late, this is an ideal chance to put things right and

we have to grasp the opportunity with both hands.

"The fans are frustrated and rightly so, as were the players the other night. We were annoyed and disappointed afterwards, but we all need to stick together for the next few weeks.

"I think it is a good thing we are playing Swindon and Brentford so quickly, but obviously the only focus at the moment is on beating Swindon."

The 24-year-old returned to the starting line-up against the Red Devils after missing two matches with an ankle

problem and despite the reversal, Ryan insists he would rather be in the thick of the action than stuck on the sidelines:

"I am not a good watcher; it is doubly frustrating because you can't help the lads, even though you can see more.

"I was disappointed not to score against Crawley, I couldn't get any closer, but hopefully a goal isn't too far round the corner."

"I am a positive person and I only want to look forward now, not dwell on what has happened in the past"



"I must move forward and remain optimistic about the future."

That is the message from Lecsinel Jean-Francois as he recovers from a serious knee surgery for the second time in just over 12 months.

United's Haitian international, who will be familiar opposition fans as he signed from today's visitors in the summer of 2011, recovered from the major damage to his left knee that he suffered in March 2012 in just over seven months, making his comeback in front of the live Sky cameras in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy.

But despite completing a rigorous rehabilitation programme, which ensured he was fully fit upon his return to competitive action, his 14 minute cameo appearance at Meadow Lane started several more weeks of injury anguish.







Last month, just over a year after going under the knife on his left knee, Lecsinel, along with the unfortunate Diego De Girolamo, was back on the operating table to have his right knee reconstructed.

Naturally a bubbly character, who always seems to have a big smile on his face despite the injury nightmare that has plagued much of his United career to date, the defender insists he will be back.

Lecsinel takes up the story: "It has been a really frustrating year or so for me, but obviously I have to deal with it and move on.

"Unfortunately the injury to my right knee came only weeks after I had returned to full fitness after damaging my left knee against Oldham Athletic.

"I am a positive person and I only want to look forward now, not dwell on what has happened in the past because I can't change anything.

"I worked so hard to overcome the injury I suffered against Oldham and throughout the last few months my left knee has felt absolutely fine, so it is doubly frustrating that a fresh injury has ruled me out for pretty much the full season.

"I felt so fit and strong when I made my return at Notts County in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy, so this injury came totally out of the blue.

"When you are coming back from a serious injury you expect to be fit for a long time after because it isn't very often that you are

unlucky enough to pick up serious injuries consecutively in the space of nine months.

"Now I have had the operation on my right knee I am keen to focus on my rehabilitation again, I must move forward and remain optimistic about the future.

"To miss close to two years of football is hard to accept, but I have must thank my team-mates, the management and our excellent medical staff for all their support.

"My family gives me all the strength I need to make a successful return and the biggest thing is I still have the desire to come back and prove myself.

"There is still a lot to achieve in my career and thankfully there is still plenty of time to achieve those targets."

Having already damaged his right knee before becoming a Blade, many a lesser man would perhaps walk away from the prospect of grafting behind the scenes throughout the summer months, but Lecsinel says he owes it to himself, the medical staff and the club to bounce back again.

The knock he suffered against the Magpies in October 2012 didn't appear that serious at the time, but as the weeks and months ticked by it became apparent the left-back would have to come to terms with being operated on again.

Lecsinel concluded: "I am solely focused on returning to competitive action as soon as possible and, as I have said



before, I am willing to do whatever it takes in the months ahead.

"This is the third time I have had knee surgery, twice on my right leg and once on the left so I know exactly what is ahead of me.

"The medical resources we have at Sheffield United are very good and I know I can trust the staff to manage my rehabilitation plan correctly.

"I have had the ACL reconstructed in my right knee, my meniscus (cartilage) was also damaged.

"At Notts County I damaged the meniscus on the outside of my right knee: we tried our best to recover without surgery.

"If that had been the case I would have been in contention as we speak, but unfortunately things didn't work out to plan and it was my personal decision to undergo surgery again.

"Before I committed myself to have surgery the medical staff got plenty of expert opinions from doctors and specialists.

"I am sure I will continue to get the club's backing and that in itself makes me even more determined to return fit and stronger this time.

"My left knee isn't a problem at all and it won't be throughout my rehabilitation during the summer. I have 100 per cent trust in my left knee and I know myself if I look after myself and do what has been advised I will be fine.

"I remain sure in my own mind that I will be back, so please don't forget me, I will be back before you know it."

THE LADS STILL BELIEVE - MATT

Matt Hill is confident the Blades can bounce back from the midweek defeat to Crawley Town, when Swindon Town provide the next challenge today.

The experienced campaigner, who has been deployed at right-back in the last two matches in the absence of the suspended Tony McMahon, says there is no time to get too downhearted:

"Tuesday night was a massive kick in the teeth but I am sure this group of lads will bounce back, hopefully against Swindon.

"The lads have to believe that anything remains possible, it would be foolish and unprofessional to just give an opportunity like this up, having worked so hard this season.

"Crawley played well and caught us on the counter-attack but two mistakes have ultimately cost us.

"As a defender or a goalkeeper, when you make a mistake you are often punished by conceding a goal, but that is the nature of the beast and you often live and die by your mistakes.

"Defensively it isn't a problem, playing on the right, and

going the other way I had to double check how far forward I was getting because I kept getting a nose bleed!

"Seriously, though, it seems silly for me to say, but I am probably more of a threat cutting in on my left foot from the right because when play opens up I have a sight of goal and the chance to shoot."

18 October 1997

Blades fans were in optimistic mood at the start of the 1997-98 season. With a strike force containing the likes of returning hero Brian Deane, Jan Aage Fjortoft and Gareth Taylor and a midfield boasting Don Hutchison and Dane Whitehouse, promotion prospects looked very good indeed.

Fans were a little surprised when boss. Nigel Spackman, added to his striking options at the end of September by signing Brazilian born striker, Marcelo, from Spanish football.

In this photograph we see Marcelo scoring on his league debut in the home game against QPR. He had come on as a substitute and his goal came via this header in the 73rd minute which gave the Blades a 2-1 lead. He is seen rising above Rangers defenders Rufus Brevett and Steve Morrow.

Earlier in the game Brian Deane had given United a 31st minute lead but Unitedites were shocked when struggling Rangers equalised in the 58th minute through Paul Murray. Sadly for Marcelo there was no winning start for him in English league football as Morrow scored in the final minute to earn the Londoners a point in front of an attendance of 18,006. Marcelo became a key striker helping the club qualify for both the play offs and an FA Cup semi final.

Triple Assault: The 2002-03 season

On Saturday 26th April, the Blades hosted fellow play-off qualifiers, Wolves.

Both clubs were eager to maintain their momentum; United currently third on 76 points, with Wolves fourth with 74 and the Black Country side were in excellent form, having already won 11 away games.

Although top scorers Kenny Miller and former Blade, Nathan Blake, weren't starting, Dean Sturridge and George Ndah were impressive deputies. Unusually, United started with Paul Peschisolido and Steven Kabba up front, something of a 'lightweight' pairing. Warnock had Asaba and Allison on the bench, however, whilst Dean Windass was rested.

A crowd of 22,000, including over 3,000 visitors, were treated to a superb game. After just two minutes, Joleon Lescott's attempted pass was blocked by Peschisolido, who chased down the rebound and lobbed Wolves 'keeper, Matt Murray, to make it 1-0. Yet after ten minutes the scores were level – Sturridge, breaking through midfield, threaded the ball to Ndah who, beating the offside trap and smashed past Kenny.

On the stroke of half-time, the visitors had the lead. A one-two between Edworthy and Rae, on the right edge of the area, led to a mis-hit shot from the latter, fortuitously falling to Sturridge, who smashed the ball into Kenny's net, to the groans of the Kop. Ten minutes into the second half, Lescott made another serious blunder as he inexplicably pushed over Kabba in the area, Michael Brown calmly putting away the resulting penalty.

The goals continued and ten minutes later the visitors were back in front. Robert Page pulled down Cameron in the box and Sturridge made it 3-2 from the spot.

As the final whistle approached United seemed beaten, when Mark Rankine lifted the ball down the middle of the pitch and Peschisolido, nipping between two defenders, hit it on the half-volley over Murray and into the roof of the net. It was yet another spectacular finish from 'Pesch' and enough to rescue a point.

Three days later, United faced Bradford City in their final home game. At Sunday's PFA annual awards the club had been honoured by the selection of both Michael Brown and Michael Tonge in the Division One team of the season. This was compensation for Brown, who had lost out to Paddy Kenny as the Supporters' Player of the Year and Tonge, who was runner-up to Phil Jagielka as Young Player of the Year.

The Bradford game saw ex-Bantams Stuart McCall and Dean Windass play for United: with ex-Blades Aidan Davison and Gus Uhlenbeek and future Lane players, Simon Francis and Andy Gray, featuring for City.

Veteran McCall rolls back the years

Incredibly, due to United's profligacy in front of goal and the superb form of Davison, there was no score at half-time. Yet the home side scored three times in a ten-minute second half spell to win the game.

Brown's screamer opened proceedings and he ended it with a penalty after Peter Ndlovu had made it two. Absent from the United line-up was Nick Montgomery, who was gaining his first Scotland under-21 cap against Austria in Dundee.

United's final game of the regular season took place on Sunday 4th May, at Watford -Kenny was replaced in goal by Gary Kelly and Marcel Cas was given a start. Importantly, Michael Brown was rested.

Over 2,000 travelling Blades saw a lacklustre game with Watford winning 2-0 with late goals from Scott Fitzgerald and Neil Cox.

McCall made his 45th appearance of the season against the Hornets, a magnificent return for a player just a month away from his 39th birthday.

After a superb career with Bradford City, Everton, Glasgow Rangers and Scotland, with an array of medals to match, Neil Warnock pulled off a masterstroke by signing Stuart as player-coach in early July 2002. Given specific coaching responsibilities in the reserves, his team won the Avon Insurance League Premier Division. Injury meant Stuart missed the start of pre-season, so for the first three games, Jagielka and Tonge were United's central midfield pairing.

The game at Burnley on 24th August brought Stuart's first start and the familiar central pairing of McCall and Brown was established. Importantly, although not wearing the armband, McCall was in reality a captain on the field. His speed of thought, his ability to evaluate game situations, calm assurance and ability to encourage the youngsters was crucial for United.

His passing was accurate and, on occasions, showed real vision, such as when setting up Tonge against Liverpool.

In front of the back four, he provided defensive protection for the team and with Ndlovu, Brown and Tonge providing the legs around him, his reduced pace wasn't a serious issue. Asked to mark Patrick Vieira at Old Trafford, Stuart remarked to Warnock, "don't worry, I'll run through his legs!"

What a shame the Blades didn't secure McCall's services a couple of seasons earlier.

Interesting fact

Left back John Trollope made his first league appearance for Swindon on 20 August 1960. the opening day of that season. and his final appearance on 8 November 1980. In total he made 770 league appearances for Swindon (including three as substitute) and he holds the league record for most appearances for one club. Between 1961 and 1968 he made 328 consecutive league appearances and 368 in league and cup. The euphoria that follows Paolo Di Canio around belonged to Swindon Town for the bulk of this League One campaign and while life after the firebrand Italian may not be quite as exciting and unpredictable, it could still prove to be highly productive.

While Di Canio took great pride in telling anyone who would listen to him that he was the sole reason why Swindon claimed promotion from League Two last season, the players he left behind at the County Ground are doing their best to prove that the club's recent successes were not just down to the manager who has taken over at Premier League side Sunderland in the last couple of weeks.

From the comments offered up by Di Canio in the weeks since he walked out of Swindon, you could have been forgiven for thinking he filled all eleven positions in his own team as the Robins claimed promotion last April and backed it up with a solid push for a place in next season's Championship.

However, the County Ground set-up is not just about a solitary dominant personality and while results have hardly been electrifying since the managerial change in mid-February, the Robins are coming to Bramall Lane this afternoon with hopes of a play-off finish very much in their sights.

A hat-trick of draws in their last three home matches did little for manager Kevin MacDonald as he looks to make his mark at Swindon, yet the ambition is burning brightly in the squad he inherited from Di Canio, with the Robins players knowing that a handful of wins in the next few weeks should push their season into overtime. A play-off finish would be a fine achievement for a team that could so easily have been derailed by the furore surrounding Di Canio's exit, yet experienced professionals like Alan McCormack, Andy Williams and Darren Ward have the nous to keep the Robins show on the road.

Their flirtations with the upper echelons of the English game is reviving memories of not so distant triumphs for the club that spent a solitary season in the Premier League after manager Glenn Hoddle guided them to promotion with a play-off victory at Wembley back in 1993.

Hoddle is one of many high profile managers who have held power at Swindon down the years, with Ossie Ardiles, Steve McMahon, Dennis Wise and current Blades boss Danny Wilson among those who have held the top job at the Country Ground.

Adding MacDonald's name to that illustrious list of Swindon managers seemed like a wise move, as the one-time Republic of Ireland assistant manager arrived with a fine coaching reputation and the respect of all in the game.

The Swindon side he has taken charge of boast a hugely impressive record on their travels, with their 2-0 win at Yeovil last month their tenth win on the road this season. Indeed, if they had reciprocated that record at their County Ground home, a top two finish could have been well within their grasp.

As it is, Swindon retain hope that they can snare a promotion place this season and if they manage to get across the finishing line, the notion that all of Swindon's recent successes were down to the departed Di Canio will be banished for good.

Interview with the visitors manager



Making the transition from respected coach to under-pressure manager rarely seems to be comfortable, yet Kevin MacDonald is convinced he has what it takes to succeed after being given his big chance at Swindon.

Filling the huge boots of Paolo Di Canio was never likely to be an easy task for this former Aston Villa coach, who arrived at Swindon with a fine reputation for being one of the game's top training ground operators, yet MacDonald admits he has much to prove in his first permanent manager's role.

Having briefly taken charge of Aston Villa in the Premier League last season, MacDonald had a taste of the kind of spotlight that falls upon you when you are the top man at a club, but he is eager to embrace the opportunity that has come his way at Swindon.

"The offer that came my way from Swindon was one I couldn't refuse," MacDonald stated. "They were in a good position when I was arrived, having done very, very well under Paolo Di Canio, and aim is to continue that progress.

"I have been reasonably successful as a coach and now I need to see if I can be a success as a manager. Having worked with a lot of younger players during recent years, Swindon appealed to me as they have a reputation for bringing kids through their ranks and the club made it clear to me that they want to continue doing that.

"Obviously this club is ambitious and we want to try and get promotion to the Championship as soon as possible, but there are a lot of good teams in this league and we have to try and push forward and make it a successful end to the season."

Swindon have built their success around a solid defensive record this season and their form on the road has also been hugely impressive, yet MacDonald believes the secret to his side's promotion hopes will be making the most of the chances his team create in front of goal.

"We have been missing some chances and it is not just the strikers who have been guilty of that," states MacDonald. "I don't blame any individual and it is probably just a case of relaxing a little bit more in front of goal.

"The players here are still good finishers and they will prove that if they keep working hard. You score as a team and you defend as a team and since I have been here, we have probably been a little wasteful in front of goal.

"We have brought in some players to

compliment those who have been in the top six of League One all season and hopefully we can win our remaining games and we will see where that takes us."

The Swindon media pack who have been spoilt with the extravagant comments of Di Canio over the last year will have to make do with the more laid back approach served up by the quietly spoken MacDonald, but his brand of cool, calm touchline composure may be just what this club needs after its recent turbulence.
