


Welcome back to The County Ground this evening for our Johnstone's Paint Trophy encounter against Plymouth Argyle...

BOARDROOM UPDATE



WELCOME back to The County Ground for the visit of Plymouth Argyle in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy.

THIS week, I feel I must share a letter with you all that I sent to the football authorities recently.

Dear Sirs,

I felt the need to write a letter today regarding a number of issues that are worrying me, not just concerning Swindon Town Football Club but the Football League in general as it strives to improve its profile.

I am concerned that Swindon Town are rumoured to be becoming a 'soft touch' and a Club that can be bullied on the football pitch.

We believe that the standard of officiating in our fixtures this season has been poor in terms of looking after our players during a game. The style of refereeing also encourages opposition teams to be over-aggressive. We are trying to play a different style of football which we believe is more pleasing on the eye. It also helps us to attract the community in Swindon and the surrounding areas to watch a team displaying this brand of football. Attracting sponsors has also been made easier with the style of football adding to the fanbase and increasing media interest.

Unfortunately, as a result of this, we feel that opposition teams approach us with a more physical game that we believe oversteps the mark. We have no

issues with the physical side of the game because we accept that there is no right or wrong way to play the beautiful game but we feel that officials should be stepping in to not only protect our players but improve the game as a spectacle. We currently have an injury list that has eleven First Team players on it.

We would urge the football authorities to review the games that Swindon Town have played this season and clarify where we are going wrong or explain how decisions are given that we feel are outside the laws of the game. I can cite clear examples of this grievance. In our home fixture with Bristol City, the visitors' Aden Flint made a two-footed challenge on Nicky Ajose from behind yet was only punished with a yellow card. In our most recent fixture at Preston North End, Kevin Davies made two late and reckless challenges on Nathan Thompson and Grant Hall.

We believe that these types of tackles have no place in the game yet they continue to go unpunished which leaves other sides to think that this is acceptable.

While the Football League strives to improve its product for both television audiences and sponsorship purposes, I feel the need to write this letter because I believe that while this continues to happen on the

pitch not only could the lack of consistency spark more crowd trouble, it could also deter media from covering the lower leagues in addition to putting off major sponsors and potentially reducing attendances at matches.

We have taken steps to tackle this and have called in a referees' assessor to talk to our players and show them the aspects of the game that they struggle to adhere to. Most of our cautions this season have been for verbal dissent. I must stress that whilst we actively discourage dissent towards officials, I would argue that the refereeing of some of our games this season has been a cause of frustration for our players.

I would urge the Football League and the Professional Game Match Officials Board to set up a committee like they have in the Premier League where clubs can take advantage of a review system to look back on certain aspects of the game.

I look forward to hearing your response.




THE Pilgrims come into 2013/14 off the back of a campaign that saw them narrowly avoid relegation from the Football League.

AFTER a 3-0 win over Portsmouth in the Capital One Cup, Argyle would only register two victories in the league in the opening two months of last campaign. In the early part of October, back-to-back wins arrived against Barnet and Rochdale before the Pilgrims went on a run towards Christmas that saw them pick up just eight points from the next eleven games in the league. The one anomaly in that succession of draws and defeats was a 2-0

win over York City. A defeat at Bristol Rovers proved to be manager Carl Fletcher's last game in charge as he was sacked after the match. Five days later, current incumbent John Sheridan was installed as the new manager. Results began to improve, with two wins coming from an undefeated first four games sparking a run that would see Argyle lose just once in March but crucially pick up 12 points from four wins. As the season entered April, just two

wins from five games meant it would be a nervous final day encounter with Rochdale. Argyle would lose 1-0 at Spotland but stayed up due to Barnet and Aldershot both tasting defeat and ultimately falling through the trapdoor. They finished 21st in the final table, one point clear of the drop zone. This term, they have registered just three wins from their opening eleven fixtures and secured their place in round two of the JPT by knocking out Cheltenham Town on penalties.

**THE GAFFER: JOHN SHERIDAN:**

SHERIDAN started his playing career at Manchester City before moving to Leeds United in 1982. He made over 200 appearances for the Elland Road side and arrived at Sheffield Wednesday in 1989 via a stint at Nottingham Forest. Whilst at Hillsborough, he helped the Owls gain promotion to the top flight and secured a League Cup victory with a goal in the 1991 final. Had spells at Bolton and Oldham before finishing his career. Also represented the Republic of Ireland in the

1990 and 1994 World Cups. Started out as a manager at Oldham before taking the reins at Chesterfield where he guided the Spireites to the League Two title in 2011. Despite JPT success in 2012 when Town were the losing finalists, he could not stop their relegation from League One. Was appointed boss at Home Park in January of this year after resigning from his post at Chesterfield earlier in the season. Steered the Pilgrims to safety last term.

MCCORMICK re-joined the Pilgrims in the summer after making 157 appearances for Argyle between 2001-08. In 2008 he was sentenced to seven years and four months imprisonment after he was found guilty of causing the deaths of two children by dangerous driving. Following his release from prison in June 2012, he enjoyed a spell at Truro City before sealing a move to Oxford until the end of last season.

Guy Branston

THE veteran defender has made over 400 appearances during fourteen years in the game. After joining Plymouth on loan as a youngster in the 1998/99 season, Branston has gone on to play for a number of different clubs including Sheffield Wednesday, Notts County and Torquay United. Was brought back to Home Park by John Sheridan in January of this year and was rewarded with a one year deal for the 2013/14 campaign.

Curtis Nelson

A product of the Academy at Stoke City, Nelson signed apprentice forms at Plymouth before breaking into the first team under Peter Reid. He made 38 appearances during the 2010/11 season and featured regularly before a knee injury cut his progress short. Hit the ground running last season under John Sheridan and has now made over 70 appearances for Argyle. Nelson has also represented England at Under 18 level.

Romuald Boco


BOCO came to England for the first time in 2005 when he joined Accrington Stanley. He featured regularly for Stanley, helping the club return to the Football League. In 2007 he joined Irish Premier League side Sligo Rovers. He has since had spells at Burton, Chinese side Shanghai East Asia and two separate spells back in Ireland before rejoining Accrington. Signed for Argyle in the summer. He is also an established international for Benin.

THE Argentine was on trial with the Pilgrims in 2011 but, due to the shackles of administration, could not sign a contract and subsequently penned a deal with Burton Albion. First team appearances at the Pirelli Stadium were limited and he moved to Home Park in the summer of 2012 after his release. After notching two goals in 32 outings last term, he was rewarded with a new deal in the summer.



A graduate of the youth system at Oldham Athletic, Alessandra spent a short time on loan at Chester City before breaking into the first team at Boundary Park. He netted eight times for the Latics before moving to Morecambe in 2011. Turned down a new deal with the Shrimps in the close season and opted for a move to Plymouth. Found the net against Cheltenham Town in Round 1.

Jamie Reckord

ON loan from Wolves, 21 year-old Reckord turned professional at Molineux in 2010. Made his Wolves debut at the start of the 2011/12 campaign after a loan spell at Northampton during the latter stages of the previous season. He has also been on loan at Scunthorpe United and was briefly with Coventry City at the start of 2012/13. Joined Argyle on a three-month loan deal on transfer deadline day.




Paul Wotton

WOTTON made his debut for Argyle in February 1995 and went on to skipper the Pilgrims through one of the most successful periods in the club's history. He helped Plymouth claim two divisional titles in three seasons as Argyle leapt from the basement division to the second tier. In 2008, he bade farewell to Home Park and joined Southampton. After loan spells at Oxford and Yeovil, he rejoined the Pilgrims in January 2012.




Hamza Bencherif

ANOTHER deadline-day signing, Bencherif learned his trade with Nottingham Forest and spent time on loan with Lincoln City in 2007. After his release from The City Ground, he went on to make 68 appearances for Macclesfield before joining Notts County ahead of the 2011/12 campaign. After leaving the Magpies, he penned short-term deal at Home Park and made his debut in the last round against Cheltenham Town.



Marvin Morgan

THE 6ft 4in striker began his career in the non-leagues with Wealdstone's youth team before moving on to have spells at Yeading and Woking. Joined Aldershot in 2008 and scored 28 times in three seasons at The Rec then moved to Shrewsbury Town ahead of the 2011/12 season. He bagged 11 goals as the Shrews clinched promotion to League One alongside Swindon. After his release in the summer, he penned a deal with Argyle.



Reuben Reid

REID started out with Argyle after turning down a career as a first-class cricketer. After making his debut in the 2005/06 season he had loan stints at Kidderminster, Torquay, Wycombe and Brentford before being released. Signed for Rotherham in 2008 before securing a switch to then-Championship side, West Bromwich Albion. 

CONOR HOURIHANE


THE former Republic of Ireland youth international is the current Argyle captain looking to lead from the front against Town this evening.

HOURIHANE began his career with hometown club Bandon in Ireland before signing for Douglas Hall AFC in Cork. He soon began to attract the attention of several clubs including the likes of Liverpool, Chelsea and Celtic. In 2007, it was the presence of former Republic of Ireland and Manchester United midfielder Roy Keane, then manager of Sunderland, that persuaded him to join the Black Cats. Following his move to the north-east of England, he represented his country at both Under 19 and Under 21 level. With first team opportunities limited in his two-year stay at the Stadium of Light, the midfielder followed his former manager to Ipswich Town after his contract expired with Sunderland in 2010. Hourihane again found it difficult to break into the first team at Portman Road and, after Keane's sacking, he was released at the end of the 2010/11 campaign. In July 2011, he penned a permanent deal with Argyle after impressing on trial and made his professional debut in

a draw at Shrewsbury Town. After scoring his first goal in a 3-2 win at Dagenham and Redbridge, the Irishman went on to rack up 42 appearances for Plymouth in all competitions and played in both of the Pilgrims' 1-0 defeats to Swindon that season. The following campaign he was given the captain's armband and went on to contribute five goals in 47 outings from the heart of midfield. This term he has made 11 appearances, finding the net just once in a 3-1 win at Cheltenham Town.




CLUB CONNECTION

We now find you at St. Johnstone, Rory. How is football treating you these days?

Pretty good actually. I haven't been involved as much as I'd like, but I've just had an international call up and I'm hoping to get a more regular place for club and country. I've been on the bench a bit so I'm working hard trying to change that.

When you were at Swindon you used to make a habit of coming off the bench and finding the net, but can it be hard influencing a game as a sub?

I need to try and get back to those habits! At the moment I'm trying to develop more as a player who plays the whole game as opposed to an impact player coming off the bench, but you just have to try and get what you can when you're given the opportunity, even if it's 20 minutes.


Your international call up is good timing with World Cup qualification coming to a climax. It must trigger

memories of four years ago when you scored the winning goal that took New Zealand to South Africa. Incredible scenes!

It was the biggest highlight of my football career – it doesn't get any bigger than that. It was in front of a home crowd who weren't really expecting us to go through, so it was out of this world. It was global news and the goalkeeper and I were in the world team of the week, it was a great time. I've got a lot of football memorabilia from all my clubs in a box, but in particular I have a load of stuff around that game.

And New Zealand are in a healthy position this time, looking good for a play-off place?


We've lost a few players from that team of four years ago and that can alter the dynamic. Our captain Ryan Nelsen now coaches in America and he's a big loss, but we've gained some promising youngsters. It'll be hard to beat that team because don't forget we went unbeaten in the World Cup and not many teams can say that!

Maybe this time we can get through to the next round, but to even get there we're going to have to get past Mexico, Panama or Honduras. It's going to be tough. I've had the call for the next four of games, which takes us to LA to play against Honduras, so it'll be great to be back in the setup. It gives me an opportunity to get back in the team because it's been a while. I've had a lot of injuries over the last three years, but I'm back training now and raring to go.

So, how are you getting on in the SPL? This is your second club after a spell at Aberdeen.

The standard is really good. It's not the Championship or Premier League and obviously we have Celtic who are the best side, but I would say the rest of the league is a mixture of League 1 and League 2 standard. It's a great little league that gets good coverage and it was a good move for me at the time because I had been going through a lot of injuries. Playing once a week is a lot easier for my body than the relentless nature of the Saturday/Tuesday regularity of England.

Let's go back to your spell at Swindon then; you experienced all the highs and lows during your time here...

That's right. I had all sorts but Swindon were one of the clubs who gave me the confidence to kick on as a player.

What do you remember about joining the club, because I seem to recall you always used to play well against us with Barnsley?

It was one of those things. I was just a youngster at Barnsley and I was finding it hard. It was

a strange time because I was developing but for some reason I always used to play well or score goals against Swindon and that must have caught the eye of Andy King. He then gave me an opportunity to try a new club. I had been at Barnsley for five years and there was a lot of pressure on me back then, there were high expectations of what player I would be but I was just a young lad learning my trade. Their crowd could be hard on me.


I remember starting quite well at Swindon and I came off the bench and scored in my first game, a 3-2 defeat. Things went from there and Andy [King] gave me a lot of confidence to express myself. I was just finding my way that season. Sam [Parkin] and Tommy [Mooney] would start most games and I'd try and come on and build my confidence. I remember scoring a few off the bench, so I enjoyed it.

There was a bit more pressure on me in that second season and I didn't really deliver. I had to go out on loan to Yeovil and I knew when I came back from there it was my last chance. In my third season I really started to fire.

Ironically Swindon found that season really hard but you just couldn't stop scoring...

It was a good time for me personally because I had so much confidence. I was happy away from football and the fans were really good to me as well. From day one they always got behind me, even when I would go back with other clubs. That meant a lot.

Well, your goal against Bristol City is still revered in these parts. It is and will

always be part of Swindon folklore.

It's a special goal and I find it hard to try and beat it! The closest I came was a volley that won goal of the season, but I've never had a goal like that bicycle kick.

It was one of those moments where people remember where they were when it happened.

It was just a crazy time. It was a big game for us and it was against Bristol City too. I always seemed to do well against them for some reason. I think I thrived in those big games.

You came off the bench in that game, and then again at Port Vale when we were three goals down. Never a dull moment...

Swindon always seemed to be involved in exciting games. It was because Andy [King] always wanted to attack. I always thought that if we had defended better back then we could have finished top, but it was always exciting. Andy wasn't scared to chuck the kitchen sink at teams in games.

Andy King is a funny one; he polarises fan opinion but most players who played under him tend to sing his praises.

I really enjoyed playing under him. He gave me confidence to kick on and he was the first manager who really believed in my abilities. He really helped me.

You seemed settled off the pitch at Swindon, too?

In my last season I was really happy. I was living with Stefani [Miglioranzi] at the time. He was the one who introduced me to church.

Christianity is a really important part of your life now, isn't it?

Yes. I've always believed, but at that stage of my life I was going out all the time. I was up in Old Town and living the footballer's lifestyle, but Stef probably wondered if that was the best thing for me to be doing. One day, he suggested going to church and while at first I wasn't sure, when I got there I'd never felt so much peace in my life. I was like, 'wow, this is amazing'. So one week I was out on the town and the next I was in church with Stef [laughs]! I loved that time in my life.

Now, faith is everything. My wife, my family and my faith mean the world to me and I believe my faith has kept me going through some tough times in my career. It has kept me strong, humble and given me strength. I believe my faith took me to the World Cup as well. The last three years have been a testing time and


sometimes I wonder if it was God saying it was time for me to be tested, to see how strong my faith was. When I was at Plymouth I was injured, we went into administration and we hadn't been paid for seven months. I was coming to the end of my contract and no-one was calling on that phone. That was when I needed my faith and the lord provided. I'm still here playing and loving it.

We talked about the ups and downs at Swindon, but Plymouth really have experienced everything, haven't they?

It's a great club and I loved my time there. If they had offered me a contract I probably would have stayed because I really enjoyed it. The Plymouth fans have been long suffering. When I moved from Swansea to Plymouth Ian Holloway was in charge and that was a great time. We were in the top six of the Championship, so it's fair to say I experienced the highs with Plymouth, followed by the lows.

You mention Swansea, they've not done bad recently have they?! Could you sense good times were coming when you were at the club?

I always look out for my old teams and it's hard not to take notice of Swansea playing in Europe and finishing in the top half of the Premier League. They have always played good football. When I was there I really needed to leave because that was when I was going out and enjoying myself the most. I needed to get away and start afresh and that's when I went to Plymouth. I then married my wife, so I look back at my time there very fondly. And I haven't looked back since.



RETRO RED

DAVE Wallis takes us back to the days of Lou Macari and what turned into a Freight Rover Fright Night for Swindon...

ONE of the previous incarnations of the Johnstone's Paint Trophy was the Freight Rover Trophy. On Tuesday 10th March 1987 we faced Aldershot at The County Ground with further progression in mind.

We had already accounted for Leyton Orient and Brentford in a round-robin, three-team affair, before eliminating Bournemouth on penalties and then Hereford by four goals to two.

That took us to the Southern area semi-final and one, two-legged area tie away from a Wembley finale. Five minutes into the second half we could have been forgiven for looking forward to an area final against either Bristol City or Gillingham, who were contesting the other semi.

That was because two minutes before the break, midfielder Peter Coyne headed into the Shots' box where Steve White's own header somehow squirmed past goalkeeper Tony Lange and inside the post.

Then, just three minutes into the second period it was White again who chased a long ball and shot towards goal. As the ball looked as though it might trickle wide, predator Jim Quinn arrived at the far post to tuck away the second goal of the match at the Stratton Bank end.

If that looked done and dusted, referee Alan Gunn was to produce a controversial twist to change our destiny.

On fifty minutes, the Shots' Martin Foyle raced towards goal. Town 'keeper Fraser Digby did his best to shut down the space and, while well outside his penalty area, 'Diggers' stuck out a foot and felled the striker as he was steered away from the danger area.

Some thought that there was no direct goalscoring opportunity and a yellow card was appropriate but Gunn decided a red card was necessary and we were down to ten men with over half an hour to play.

That left Quinn to switch from goalscorer to goalkeeper as the future Town boss took the gloves from the early-bath-bound Digby, weakening our own potency up front.

Six minutes later, the stand-in 'keeper parried Ian McDonald's shot to Aldershot's Andy King and the future Swindon manager finished well to reduce the visitors' deficit.

Undeterred, Quinn produced an excellent full-length save before Mike Ring found the net with a well-placed, long-distance effort with twenty minutes to go.

It was in the last minute of the match when McDonald swung over a corner and Steve Wignall turned home the loose ball.

So, no Wembley trip or even the prestige of an area final for us.

In the other semi-final, Bristol City overcame Gillingham and then disposed of Aldershot before losing on penalties to Mansfield at Wembley.

OPERATIONAL UPDATES

COYR looks back on a busy summer for Town's operations department..

SINCE the end of last season, the Club's operations team have been working on implementing a new system that covers ticketing and retail, as well as the introduction of the new STFC MyWorld online shopping experience. With the changes made in a compressed time-frame before the 2013/14 campaign started, COYR sat down with Operations Manager Mark Isaacs this week to talk about the developments over the last few months and what the future holds for supporters under the new digital system.

Q. Firstly, Mark, can you give us some background as to why the new system has been installed?

The new system was essential to ensure that all areas of the Club were working together. We found in the past that the systems in place meant that each area of the company's data sat in its own database and therefore, when talking to supporters, we didn't believe we were targeting the right areas when sending email campaigns as an example. We also found that our loyal supporters were not being rewarded to the level that is required for a business of our size.

Q. It sounds like you had a busy summer, how did the implementation go from a logistical and operational point of view?

With the minimal amount of

time we had before Season Tickets had to be issued, I believe that the implementation of ticketing and retail, incorporating new websites and back-office systems, went extremely smoothly. Obviously, with all new systems you are going to have some issues and, as everybody is aware, the only real issue we had was with Season Tickets due to a delay in integration between new systems and our turnstile entry system. The main thing, as far as I'm concerned, is that all Season Ticket holders had their new season card by the first league game of the season and I would like to thank all Season Ticket holders for their patience and understanding during this process.

Q. Explain a little bit more about the e-ticketing side of things and how supporters can now print their match tickets at home.

One of the main issues with the old system was that we only had 5% of our supporters purchasing online due to two main reasons. One being that the ease of purchasing online was quite long-winded. The second was the online charges that supporters incurred when booking. So, apart from implementing a new online ticket system that incorporates an easy-to-use online seating map, we also introduced no fees when purchasing tickets online. Now, when purchasing

online, you are not only going to have the option to purchase your ticket and have this sent to you at home, you can also collect your tickets at the STFC Store. More importantly, you can now print your tickets at home. This process is still improving and we have seen a jump from 5% online sales to now around 40% which is a major step change in supporters' purchasing habits.

Q. So supporters are now being rewarded for their support with the new loyalty points system?

This was a fundamental part of the introduction of any new system. We wanted to reward loyal supporters that attend matches both here at The County Ground and away from home. There are two parts to the loyalty system. When you purchase your tickets you are awarded loyalty points that can be used in priority windows for certain matches. Everybody could see the benefits of that for the Chelsea match where loyal supporters were able to purchase their tickets before they went on general sale. Over the last few weeks, we have now introduced Club Cash. When you purchase merchandise from the STFC Store as a Season Ticket holder, you will get 10% Club Cash and also as a MyWorld member, you will receive 5% Club Cash. Club Cash is still in its infancy as a process and over the coming months will be in full operation.



Q. The MyWorld concept is something completely new. What was the thinking behind that?

The STFC MyWorld concept was something that the new Board had worked on in different organisations before taking their position at the Club. This is now being developed further to enable a supporter who is a MyWorld member - this would be Season Ticket holders or someone who has signed up to MyWorld membership - to gain loyalty cash by shopping through the MyWorld portal. This is still being developed and over the next few months you should see further improvements.

Q. How does the retail side of the operation now work? Can I still buy my home shirt with 'Luongo' and '4' on the back?

The major change to the online sales operation is now linked to the stock system in-house. So now when you make a transaction online, you are guaranteed that this product will be in stock whereas previously this would not necessarily have been the case. Also a major improvement for supporters is that they can now choose online to have personalisation on their official Swindon Town replica shirt.

Q. Finally, how is this going to benefit Town supporters in the long term?

By working with an international brand like Ticketmaster, it allows us the opportunity to enhance the supporters' experience and be able to offer further discounted products. An exciting product will be released over the next month which we hope all supporters will benefit from. Further details will be announced shortly.

It was a tough pre-season for Swindon with a big turnover in the squad as the board tried to restructure the finances to balance the aspiration of being promoted to the Championship on a wage budget which is more typical of a club in League One aiming to be both self sufficient and successful.

This meant that a few of the players who came to The County Ground in the close season hadn't had the fitness work that most managers would have hoped for and with the amount of games Swindon have played against some very tough opponents, it was almost inevitable that little niggles would appear.

These are sure to be ironed out over the next few weeks as players get games under their belt but last Saturday couldn't have helped. Preston set themselves up to try and physically dominate Town on their home soil and are one of the teams in the league who seem to have taken the perception that League One is a tougher division at its word.

Don't get me wrong, Swindon can hold their own in this league but the severity of some of the challenges would have been picked apart on national television shows covering games two leagues above. Although it's also fair to say there is one Preston player who was equally robust (feel free to use your own description) playing in the



Premier League as he is in this division and I think all of Town's defence knew they'd been in a game when they left Deepdale but the question in their minds might ask what game they were actually playing.

I've watched it back and it wasn't too dissimilar to a challenge Kevin Davies made on Grant Hall last week, so maybe things haven't changed as much as I thought!

At the end of last week's match, Mark Cooper said his team looked lethargic and that it took them until the 75th minute to get going. That was after a week where Town played a local derby and then Chelsea in the cup. There have been no such distractions this week and I'm sure we'll see some of the squad being moved around for tonight's match against Plymouth as well.

It's hard to be optimistic when the treatment table needs to be the same size as something that you'd see at a medieval banquet but all the squad have been in for fitness tests this week and the signs are good. COYR.


