



Welcome to New York Stadium for today's visit of Swindon Town.

It has been a good week on the road for the club, two wins, two good performances and two clean sheets, as a management team we couldn't really have asked for anymore from our players.

Even after our steady start to the campaign most observers would have said we were second favourites for the game at Brentford last weekend, but inside the club we knew we could win at Griffin Park such is the confidence that is flowing through the ranks at the moment. We knew that we may have to surrender the ball to Uwe Rosler's side for chunks of the game, but it is what you do with the ball that counts and aside from a couple of attempts, we restricted them to very few chances. In contrast I felt we had several opportunities at the other end, especially in the second half when Brentford went looking for an equaliser, and overall I don't think anyone can argue that we fully deserved the three points. I thought we were excellent

throughout but I will give special mention to Scott Shearer who made two excellent saves, and handled and distributed the ball brilliantly, confirming to everyone inside and outside the camp that he is a top class 'keeper who is back in prime form.

As I stated after the Brentford game I wanted to make some changes for the midweek match at York, whilst still giving the club every opportunity to progress because we firmly believe that the Johnstone's Paint Trophy is a trophy that we can win. The lads who came in, the likes of Michael Tidser, Richard Brindley, Adam Collin, Pablo Mills and Danny Hylton all did well, they gave the performance I was looking for and showed that they are all hungry to break into our starting 11 for today's visit of Swindon. My only disappointment is that we couldn't give any game time to Tom Eaves or Matt Tubbs. Tom rang Denis the physio on the Tuesday morning with a stomach complaint, whilst Tubbsy picked up a knock in training but it doesn't look too serious and we are hopeful at having them back with us shortly.

Coupled with the return to fitness of Daniel Nardiello and Michael O'Connor, we nearly have a full squad available again. Claude Davis is getting closer to a return, whilst we are keeping our fingers crossed Kari Arnason will return from international duty unscathed, so we only have David Worrall currently out on our long term injury list.

Today I would like to offer a warm welcome to Mark Cooper and his staff who are making the journey north from Wiltshire. Swindon are a club we have watched a few times this season, and it seems that they are building a very young and promising side at the County Ground that will have designs on a play-off place this season. It promises to be an exciting game this afternoon, and we have had plenty of them at New York already this season, so get behind the lads as always and enjoy the game!







THE STORY SO FAR...

Mark Cooper took the helm at the County Ground just weeks before the start of the new season, and with several new faces at the club, the former Darlington and Peterborough United manager was charged with going one step further than last year's play-off heartbreak and taking them to the Championship.

Several new faces arrived at the club, with the loan signings of Alex Pritchard and Ryan Mason key, whilst Nile Ranger and Dany N'Guessan's arrival after the campaign was under way gave Cooper's side an added boost.

It was an encouraging start for the Robins, who went down by just a solitary goal at Peterborough before responding with victory in their first home game. However, it's in the Capital One Cup that they have had the most attention, and following a late victory over Torquay in the first round, they landed a trip to Loftus Road to face high-flying QPR. Ranger fired home his first in Swindon red, before Pritchard put the icing on the cake in the closing moments to seal victory, and set up a dream tie at home to Chelsea in round three.

In front of the Sky cameras, the home side impressed, with another former Spurs youngster Yaser Kasim going close, but ultimately succumbed to two first-half goals by Fernando Torres and the Brazilian Ramires.

Unfortunately that cup momentum didn't transfer into the early league form and they are yet to record successive victories in Sky Bet League One. The Millers will be hoping that doesn't turn around today as they come into the game off the back of a victory over Ronnie Moore's Tranmere Rovers last week thanks to N'Guessan converting from the spot.

One of several players to join Swindon on loan from Premier League big-hitters Tottenham Hotspur during the summer, Alex Pritchard is certainly starting to make a name for himself.

The 20-year-old made a big impression to a worldwide audience this season with an exciting performance in the Capital One Cup against Chelsea, a game screened live on Sky Sports. The Robins were given many a glowing glance for their efforts against Jose Mourinho's star-studded line-up and Pritchard in particular shone with a composed display at the heart of Swindon's engine room. Not scared to run with the ball and try his luck from distance, his energetic performance coupled with some patient passing football by Mark Cooper's side brought many plaudits.


Pritchard, who has been nurtured at Tottenham's Academy, made his league debut on loan at Peterborough United last season. He made six appearances for Darren Ferguson's side at the back end of the season, also playing in their heartbreaking relegation on the final day of the season against Crystal Palace.

This season he was recruited by then manager Kevin McDonald, alongside Spurs teammates Ryan Mason, Massimo Luongo and Grant Hall. Before the highly-publicised performance against Chelsea, he also starred as Swindon knocked Championship side Queens Park Rangers out of the cup in the second round, finding the net in the last minute to seal a 2-0 victory. Pritchard has also been on target in the 1-1 draw with MK Dons and has so far featured 10 times for Cooper's outfit this season.





Hill, considered by many to be a football innovator after abolishing the maximum wage among other things, played for Brentford and Fulham, as well as managing Coventry City.



GUESS THE LINK?

Each week, *Millers Matchday* will be profiling three former players of our opponents who each share a common theme. This week it's three ex-Swindon Town players, but can you guess what they all have in common?

GEORGE NDAH

English-born Nigerian striker George Ndah started his career as an apprentice at Crystal Palace, and signed a professional contract in 1992. He scored 26 goals in 101 appearances at Selhurst Park before moving to Swindon Town after loan spells at Bournemouth and Gillingham.

Ndah became a firm fans' favourite at the County Ground after scoring just 12 minutes into his debut and was voted the clubs player of the year in 1999. A two-year spell at Swindon resulted in the striker plundering 21 goals in 80 appearances and earning a call up to the Nigeria squad. However, injury prevented him from playing and he was never called up again.

Unfortunately for the frontman, injury played a key part during his spell at next club Wolverhampton Wanderers after he broke his leg in just his third game for the team against local rivals West Bromwich Albion. A seven year spell that was plagued by injury ended in 2006 after scoring 15 goals in 87 games in a Wolves shirt.



KEVIN HORLOCK

Northern Ireland international midfielder Kevin Horlock came through the ranks at West Ham United, but joined Swindon Town in 1992 without making a single appearance at Upton Park. Playing one season in the Premier League with the Robins during a five year spell, Horlock made a name for himself as a versatile midfield player who possessed an accurate delivery from set-pieces.

After 26 goals in 200 appearances at the County Ground, Horlock joined Manchester City in 1997 and went on to represent the Maine Road club in three divisions and during two promotions. The midfielder scored the clubs opening goal during the famous play-off final victory against Gillingham, when they were 2-0 down with five minutes remaining.

Horlock played 232 appearances and scored 44 goals at Manchester City before leaving




in 2003 for West Ham. Spells followed with Ipswich Town, Doncaster Rovers and Mansfield Town before the midfielder, capped 32 times by Northern Ireland, dropped into non-league with Needham Market, where he is currently player/assistant manager.

JAN AGE FJORTOFT

Powerful Norwegian striker Jan Age Fjortoft started his career with local club HamKam before prolific spells with Tippeligaen side Lillestrom and Austrian Premier League side Rapid Vienna, where he became only the second foreigner to win the player of the year award in 1989 after striking 63 times in 129 appearances.

Fjortoft moved to England in 1993 and signed for Premier League new boys Swindon Town for a then club record £500,000 but couldn't stop the Robins from being relegated despite a run of 13 goals in his last 17 matches of the season. The striker's infamous aeroplane celebration was a regular fixture again during the next campaign as the Norwegian plundered a further 25 goals in all competitions before leaving the County Ground for Middlesbrough in 1995.

The striker represented his country at the 1994 World Cup and enjoyed further spells in England with Sheffield United and



Barnsley before ending his five-year spell in the country by joining German side Eintracht Frankfurt. He became a cult hero in Frankfurt by scoring a decisive 89th minute goal in the final game of the 1998-99 season, keeping Eintracht up.


GOALKEEPER:
SHAY GIVEN

You'll know him for...440 Premier League appearances, most notably for Newcastle United, Manchester City and Aston Villa. Also has 125 Ireland caps and played at the 2002 World Cup and Euro 2012.



DEFENDER:
NEIL RUDDOCK

You'll know him for...being a big, bruising defender for the likes of Southampton, Tottenham, Liverpool and West Ham in the 1990s. Has also appeared on reality TV shows I'm A Celebrity...Get Me Out of Here and Big Brother and has one England cap.



MIDFIELDER:
MICHAEL CARRICK

You'll know him for...winning five Premier League titles, a UEFA Champions League and two League Cups as the mainstay of Manchester United's midfield in the past seven years. Previously played for Spurs and West Ham.



MIDFIELDER:
GLENN HODDLE

You'll know him for...either being one of the most talented players of his generation with Tottenham and England in the 1980s or his managerial career, most notably with England, whom he led to the 1998 World Cup in France.



STRIKER:
JAN ÅGE FJØRTOFT

You'll know him for...his time in England's top two divisions in the 1990s, where, along with Swindon, he had spells at Middlesbrough, Sheffield United and Barnsley. Also played 71 times for Norway.

THE A TO Z OF SWINDON TOWN

A – Alan Sugar's advisor on *The Apprentice* and presenter of *Countdown* Nick Hewer was born in Swindon. Other famous Swindonians include model and TV presenter Melinda Messenger and former *Never Mind the Buzzcocks* presenter Mark Lamarr.

B – Welsh defender and current youth-team coach Paul *Bodin*, who played over 200 times for the club, was voted player of the year in 1993. Other former winners include Australian goalkeeper Frank Talia and striker Duncan Shearer.

C – The club's *cup* heroics during the 1960s and 70s meant they were almost expected to beat higher league opposition whenever they played them. This culminated in them winning the 1969 League Cup, Swindon's only major trophy.

D – The home of *Disney World*, Orlando, Florida, is one of Swindon's twin towns. Others include Salzgitter in Germany and Ocotlan in Nicaragua.

E – Swindon was named an *Expanded Town* under the Town Development Act 1952 and this led to a major increase in its population.

F – Former England manager *Fabio Capello* started both legs of the 1969 Anglo-Italian Cup final but was on the losing side, as his AS Roma team lost 5-2 to Swindon.

G – *Glynncorwg* in Wales is the birth place of Swindon's most capped player Rod Thomas, who played 30 times for his country whilst a Town player.

H – Former England, Chelsea and Tottenham manager Glenn *Hodde* began his managerial career at the County Ground. Spending a two year spell as player-manager between 1991-93.



I – Australian striker Danny *Invincible* scored 27 goals in 144 appearances for the club across a three year spell, including a goal in 2001 that effectively saved Swindon from relegation.

J – David Murray *John*, Swindon's town clerk from 1938 to 1974, is seen as a pioneering figure in Swindon's post-war regeneration; his last act before retirement was to sign the contract for Swindon's tallest building, which is now named after him.

K – Swindon has hosted the Summer Breeze Festival on an annual basis since 2007 and has boasted headliners such as *KT Tunstall* and Toploader.

L – On 20 February 2007 the club played in a *landmark* League game away to Barnet, which meant Swindon had played a League game at home and away against every team who, in the 2006-07 season, were a League club.

M – Striker Harry *Morris* holds all of the Robins goal scoring records after plundering an impressive 229 strikes in 279 matches. He also holds the record for most goals in a game and most goals in a single season.

N – Swindon reached the FA Cup semi-finals for the first time in the 1909-10 season, losing to eventual winners *Newcastle United*.

O – The subject of Swindon fans' most intense rivalry is with *Oxford United* and a large number of terrace chants from both Oxford and Swindon refer to this, whether they are playing each other or not.

P – The Robins ill-fated solitary season in the *Premier League* resulted in them setting the record for most goals conceded in a single season. They let in 100 goals during the 1993-94 campaign.

Q – Northern Ireland international striker Jimmy *Quinn* scored 61 goals for the Robins during three separate spells with the club. He also managed the club between 1998 and 2000.



R – Former Everton, Aston Villa and Bari striker Paul *Rideout* started his career at Swindon and is the club's youngest ever player. He was aged 16 years and 107 days when he played against Hull City in November 1980.

S – Former England winger Mike *Summerbee* was voted into the club's greatest ever 11 in 2010. Other members include goalkeeper Fraser Digby, defender Colin Calderwood and midfielder Alan McLoughlin.



T – Defender John *Trollope* made an incredible 889 (770 in the league) appearances for the club between 1960 and 1980. This is not only a club record but a Football League record for most league appearances at one club.

U – Swindon is the UK's largest centre of population without its own *university* (by comparison, there are two universities in nearby Bath, which is half Swindon's size).

W – Multiple *Whitbread* book awards winner *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time* by Mark Haddon is set in Swindon.

X – Between 2000-02, the club's kit was supplied by *Xara*. Other past kit suppliers include Lonsdale, Lotto and current supplier Adidas.

Y – Swindon hold the record for the *youngest* ever Football League defence, after they played a 17-year old goalkeeper and two 18-year old defenders in a game against Peterborough in 1960.

Z – French-Algerian winger Sofiene *Zaaboub* who was renowned for wearing gloves whatever the weather, spent two seasons at the club from 2006 and made 56 appearances.

Mark Bradley netted his first goal of the season to seal all three points at Griffin Park last week and ensure the Millers bounced back from the first defeat of the season with a solid victory on the road.

The right-back ghosted in at the far post to beat former Miller Toumani Diagouraga to the ball and nod home the decisive goal, before running away with a clear message in his celebration.

"I should have scored a few in the Peterborough game and the lads were getting on my back so I just put them right and gave them a little shush after that," Bradley told *Millers Matchday*. "It was a great ball in from Prings, he's got a good delivery so you have to gamble on it which I did, moved about a bit and got on the end of it at the back post. I just seem to get on the end of them which is a bonus. Similarly at Wigan last week we've worked the ball well and I took a gamble at the far post and managed to get into the right area and had a tap in."

Supporters who travelled north of the border will have seen a similar story in the game against Livingston when he opened the scoring in that game after connecting with Michael Tider's set-piece, but the former Welsh international has finally admitted that he's a full fledged defender now.

"I think I have now been converted to a full-back, I've played that many games there that it's become much more natural to me. You have a lot more defensive responsibility in being disciplined and learning that the game is played in front of you rather than around you. In midfield you're everywhere with short-sharp bursts but playing at full-back they're longer runs forward and then even longer running back."

Who are ya?

Perhaps the most well known of the teams we've featured so far, AZ Alkmaar are a top flight Dutch team who were crowned Champions back in 2009. Their success in the last decade follows on from a fruitful period in the 80s, but aside from that they have been very much planted in mid-table after spending eight years in the second tier at the end of the last century. A 3-0 victory over the Go Ahead Eagles recently secured their 500th Eredivisie win and placed them fifth in the all-time rankings.

Quarter finalists in the Europa League two years ago, and Dutch Cup winners last season, the trophy room at the AFAS Stadium is far from bare, unlike the dugout following the sacking of Gertjan Verbeek in September.

Famous Faces:

Dutch international Dirk Marcellis and Norwegian Markus Henriksen are probably the standout players in the current crop, although like the Millers, they feature an Icelandic international, Johann Berg Gudmundsson who had 27 caps to his name and is likely to be in action this weekend.

Louis Van Gaal, Jimmy Floyd Hasselbaink, Mousa Dembele and Phillip Cocu have all pulled on the red and white of the Cheese Farmers in the past.



ANY OTHER BUSINESS?

A restaurant in Paris has paid homage to Zlatan Ibrahimovic by creating a "Zlatan burger." This week we host the Top Five...

HOME TOWN HEROES

This week for our Top Five we have a look at Home Town heroes - they were all Rotherham-born and bred and went on to play significant roles for the Millers.

This is a category we may revisit again later in the season, perhaps to look at some of the older players from an era when playing for your home town club was more common than it is now.

But this one starts with a player who became idolised both in Rotherham and in Swindon - for different reasons.

DANNY WILLIAMS

A fantastic servant to Rotherham United as a player, coach and then manager. Danny was a wholehearted, never-say-die wing half loved by the Millers fans and was a key figure in the sides of the halcyon period immediately after WW2. His career (not counting wartime football) spanned from 1946 to 1960, one of

his final games being in the famous FA Cup, third round win over Arsenal in a second replay at Hillsborough.

At one point he was working as a miner at Silverwood Colliery and playing for the Millers and would tell the tale that if he'd had a poor game on the Saturday, his mates at the pit would let him know about it on Monday morning!

After stopping playing for the first team he became reserve team player-coach and then first team manager in 1962.

He became Swindon manager in 1965 and in 1969 he not only took them to promotion from the Third Division (confirmed with a 1-1 draw at Millmoor) but also won the League Cup that season with arguably the biggest major cup final shock in history when they beat Arsenal 3-1.

Danny, who will be 89 in November and may be the oldest surviving former player, lives in Bournemouth but still has family in Thrybergh.



JOHN BRECKIN



No one has given service to the club over a longer period of time than John Breckin - now involved on matchday duties behind the scenes in the sponsors' lounges here at the New York Stadium.

John has the club, and the town, in his blood having been spotted playing for Rotherham Boys and joining the Millers straight from Wingfield School.

He made his debut at 18 and was to become a permanent fixture in the left back spot - an excellent left back at that and one who loved to attack.

He played in promotion-winning sides, was captain and made a total of 467 appearances of which 409 were league appearances making him one of only four players to play over 400 league games for the club.

Off the field he has done almost 'everything', at various times being youth team coach, reserve team coach, first team coach, assistant manager and even caretaker manager.

Of course, everyone acknowledges his role as assistant to Ronnie Moore as the club enjoyed their back-to-back promotions in 2000 and 2001 up to The Championship.

TREVOR SWIFT


Known to all as "Swift", he came through the ranks and gave the club excellent service and was captain at one stage.

A strong solid player, his natural position was at centre half but he made a switch to right back to accommodate Dave Watson at centre half in 1968 although he did return to centre defence the following season, at the time partnering Watson who was to make another switch and play up front.

Trevor gave everything for the cause, at times battling through injury when others might have not made it, and made over 325 appearances which also included a stint in midfield.



HOME TOWN HEROES



His final season was in midfield and was the promotion season from Division Four of 1974/75. His last Millers appearance of all in that successful campaign was back in his old No 5 shirt in centre defence when he helped secure a vital 1-0 win at Darlington at Easter.

RICHARD FINNEY

Another of those young schoolboy talents snapped up by the club, Richard was actually still an amateur when he made his debut shortly after his 18th birthday.

The reason for the amateur status is that he was still at college and taking his exams - once they were all passed he turned professional.

He became a regular in the No 7 shirt, a player of sharpness and intelligence with an eye for goal and a knack of being in the right place at the right time.

He already had more than 270 games behind him and over 80 goals, he had his career cruelly cut short at only 24 by a knee injury.

Richard then had a spell as assistant secretary at the club and later a successful spell in the Football in the Community scheme.

SHAUN GOODWIN

Never called anything other than 'Raggy', the slightly-built midfielder became a crowd favourite in the late 1980s and 1990s.

Another who took the route from schoolboy signing through the ranks to the first team making his debut at 18.

Fans loved to see him get on the ball and go at the opposition which he did with regularity and it was no surprise that he became a target for top flight clubs with Kenny Dalglish reportedly close to taking him to Liverpool whilst Everton

strongly fancied him and had him training with them.

But he never got the opportunity and was to have a 10 year career with the Millers which reached 350 appearances and included two promotions one of which saw an excellent midfield combination of Raggy's youthful exuberance, energy, running and skill dovetail perfectly with the wily experience of former international Tony Grealish alongside whom "Raggy" blossomed.



After retiring in the late 80s, Alan 57, who was born in West Bromwich, returned to the Midlands and he currently runs the Globe Inn pub in Tamworth.


9. JOHN DUNGWORTH

ROB GRATEFUL FOR MILLERS OPPORTUNITY



It's probably fair to say that Rob Milsom has surprised a few people this season.


When the 26-year-old signed a deal in the summer he was not a familiar name and after he turned out at left-back in pre-season, no one could have imagined the impact he would go on to make.

So fast-forward through the opening two months of the campaign and the former Fulham trainee is an early contender for player of the season after a string of accomplished displays in central midfield.

His ability to pass the ball and look comfortable in possession have been the key skills shown by the midfielder and he puts that down to his grounding at Craven Cottage.

"I had a good upbringing at Fulham, I really enjoyed my time there," he exclusively told *Millers Matchday*. "We worked a lot on technique and keeping the ball so that had a big impact on the type of player I am and the technique I have."

"I am happy with my form at the moment. It's been a positive start to the season.

"There is more to come from me, but I believe in my ability and I am grateful that Rotherham gave me the chance and hopefully I can keep my level of performance consistent.

"Our squad has a lot of quality, especially in midfield. They are all good players so I know if I take my foot off the gas these guys can come in and put in a good performance so it is important that I remain consistent to stay in the team."

With Milsom coming from Aberdeen, Michael Tidser signing from Morton and plenty of other reported targets from north of the border, it is clear that boss Steve Evans sees the Scottish leagues as a good breeding ground.

And, although they sometimes get negative press in England, Milsom believes the leagues are littered with quality players.

"The SPL is a mixed league, you have Celtic who are in the Champions League and then teams that can barely stay in the division, so it's difficult to compare the SPL and League One," he added.

"It's not all negative, though, there are some really good players who I am sure will get a chance to progress elsewhere, but it is a good stepping stone for your career if you can go there and do well.

"I don't have too much negative things to say about it."

Milsom has been an integral part of the Millers squad that have started the season so encouragingly and that has led to hopes of a second successive push for promotion.

Although admitting it's still early days, the midfielder insists the squad has enough quality to challenge.

"When I came in I knew we had a great squad with lots of ability," he said.

"Obviously you're never quite sure at the start of the season how things will pan out, but from the early games of the season you can tell we have what it takes to be right up there.

"With our start, we have to aim as high as possible. We can easily compete with anyone in this league, so if we can keep making sure we keep winning at home and then pick up some results away we can definitely be up there at the end of the season."

SWINDON TOWN

STEVE AIZLEWOOD Centre Half. Began his League career at 16 with Newport County, the home town club with whom he made 191 appearances before moving to Swindon in 1976. With 1023 appearances and 43 goals for Swindon, he finished the season in 1977 as the club's top scorer. Signed full time for Swindon in 1977, and made his League debut two months later. A total of 114 League appearances at the beginning of the season.

DAVID CUNNINGHAM Midfield. A Scot who started his career with Brechin City before moving down to Southern in 1973. He made 56 appearances for Southern and spent a period on loan to Hantsport before joining Swindon on a free in 1977.

ANDREW FORD Defender. Joined A.F.C. Bourne mouth straight from school and stayed there for two years before joining Southern. Whilst there he was selected in the P.F.A.'s Fourth Division team, and also won the Player of the Year award last year immediately prior to his move to Swindon.

CHRIS GUTHRIE Forward. Born in Newcastle, he made just five appearances for home town club before moving to Southern where he made 107 appearances, was leading goalscorer and voted Player of the Year. He then moved to Sheffield United in 1975 and made 58 League appearances before moving to Swindon in 1977. Ex-England Schoolboy international.

RAY McHALE Midfield. Sheffield born, he made 123 appearances for Chesterfield before moving to Halifax in 1978. In both clubs he did not miss a match, making 86 appearances and being the leading

goalscorer in 1976/77. Moved to Swindon in 1976 and had made 41 appearances to the start of the season.

JOHN McLAUGHLIN Full Back. London born, he served his apprenticeship with Colchester United where he played 68 times before joining Swindon for a £25,000 fee in 1973. A regular member of the team since then, he has spent some time in midfield as well as full back, and has made 100 appearances to the start of the present term.

DAVID JOBS Forward. Made his League debut for Swindon in 1972 and has made 172 appearances in his career. Last seasons leading goalscorer, he is an orthodox winger and although usually defined on the left, he can play either side.

COLIN PROPHETT Defender. Crewe born, he played as an amateur for Alexandra before moving to Sheffield Wednesday where he made his pro. debut and 113 League appearances. After a spell where he played 24 First Division games he moved to Swindon in 1974. To the start of the season he had made 112 appearances. Club captain, he usually plays as sweeper.

KENNY STROUD Midfield. London born, Swindon Town is his first and only club he has turned pro. in 1970 after moving his apprenticeship at the County Ground. Made a total of 120 appearances to the end of last season.

MK DONS



WHERE IS IT?

Milton Keynes is situated in Buckinghamshire, about 45 miles north-west of London. It was designated as one of several new settlements by the government in the 1960s, designed to combat the housing shortfall after the Second World War.



HOW DO I GET THERE?

Take the M1 from Rotherham all the way down to junction 14. Take the third exit at the end of the sliproad, signposted Milton Keynes. The rest of the journey is simply a story of eight roundabouts:

- First roundabout: take second exit.
- Second roundabout: take first exit.
- Third roundabout: take second exit.
- Fourth roundabout: take second exit.
- Fifth roundabout: take third exit.
- Sixth roundabout: take second exit.
- Seventh roundabout: take second exit.
- Eighth roundabout: take first exit.

Another option is the train, though it is quite an awkward, long and expensive journey. It would require getting a train from Rotherham Central to Sheffield, before changing for either Tamworth or Birmingham New Street where you can then get a train to Milton Keynes central. From the station, Stadium:MK is reachable by bus – either Bill's Minibuses,

which runs services especially for supporters on matchdays or the number 1 Arriva service which serves the stadium from the train station's adjacent bus station twice an hour.

WHERE DO I PARK?



There are 2,000 car parking spaces at the stadium, costing £7 each. Alternatively, street parking on the surrounding industrial estate. As a word of warning, the nearby Asda car park is often patrolled on matchdays.

WHAT IS THERE TO DO?



Milton Keynes is home to Bletchley Park, which housed the government decryption department during the Second World War. It was at Bletchley Park where the codes generated by the Germans' Enigma and Lorenz machines were cracked – a critical moment in the war providing key intelligence for the allies in numerous important battles and situations. Now Bletchley Park is home to the Bletchley

Park museum and the National Museum of Computing which, according to reviews, is well worth a visit.

WHO SHOULD I LOOK OUT FOR?



Forward Patrick Bamford, 20, on loan from Chelsea is an excellent prospect and has scored nine goals already this season. Another promising youngster is 17-year-old midfielder Dele Alli, who manager Karl Robinson has hailed as one of the brightest talents in English football. Of their more experienced players, former Manchester United winger Luke Chadwick is vastly experienced at this level and has played over 200 games for the Dons.

WHO WILL I RECOGNISE ON THE PITCH?



The only former Miller plying his trade at Stadium:MK currently is Jon Otsemobor. Otsemobor moved to Millmoor upon being released from Liverpool in 2005, but lasted just 10 games and half a season before he



moved on to Crewe. He has had a successful career, racking up over 200 games since he left the Millers for Crewe, Norwich, Southampton, Sheffield Wednesday and his current club.

WHO WILL I RECOGNISE IN THE STAND?



There are plenty of well-known people to have been born in Milton Keynes, but most will probably have found a football team before MK Dons were formed in 2004. Some of the people who fall into that category include Olympic 2012 gold medallist Greg Rutherford, golfer Ian Poulter and Rugby League star Sam Tomkins.

WHAT HAPPENED THE LAST TIME WE WERE THERE?







With even a single defeat leaving fans calling for a manager's head, it was a refreshing change to see that Walsall manager Dean Smith this week signed an extension to his contract that will see him tied down at Banks's Stadium until 2016.

Smith, a former teammate of Millers Assistant Manager Paul Raynor was handed the reigns in January 2011, and after guiding the Saddlers to ninth place in League One last time out has started in a similar fashion this year, albeit without star players Will Grigg and Febian Brandy who were both sold on to divisional rivals Brentford and Sheffield United.

The former Sheffield Wednesday and Leyton Orient player was youth team manager at Walsall before his big break in the hotseat and it's clear that he believes in securing the long-term future of the club.

"From the start, this was always going to be a long-term project," said Smith to the BBC. "We're still in the early stages of that, but things are certainly progressing well. I want to continue building for the future of this club and, whilst I am offering the players longer term deals, it gives it more credence if I have the same. This club is known for trying to do things the correct way and we are investing in the infrastructure of the club to make it a more forward-thinking place with solid foundations."

At the other end of the table, Ronnie Moore and David Weir have both come under scrutiny as their teams struggle at the bottom of the table, but both are coming out fighting.


Speaking after Tranmere's narrow defeat to Swindon last week Moore praised the application from his players and insists they're up for the challenge, whilst Weir knows that only victories will do.

"You get two manager of the months in the first few months last season and everybody's telling me you're rubbish this season," Moore told BBC Radio Merseyside.

"I don't read papers and I don't listen to what's being said but that's the way it goes, you've just got to dig deep and keep going. I've thought they've given everything and I can't ask more from any of them in terms of effort, commitment and desire."



Speaking after the Blades rescued a 1-1 draw at home to Crawley Town, Weir had this to say: "Patience isn't relevant in football. We're all sensible and we know that we can't afford to keep losing games," he told BBC Radio Sheffield. We're trying to install something over a period of time and we need to see improvements and we need to see results. Hopefully this result will buy me some time, I'm taking a lot of positives from it."

Rotherham United's Academy suffered late heartache after an injury time winner denied them a point against Hull City.

Garreth Barker's side wasted a host of opportunities and were made to pay at the death much to the Millers frustration, when Tigers striker Niall Doran coolly slotted the ball beyond Charlie Bryan.

"The game got a little too open towards the end when the players were a little mentally and physically fatigued, resulting in a 91st minute goal conceded," Barker told *Millers Matchday*.

"We felt hard done to overall; we really should have been 2-0 up at half-time, perhaps even more in front because we had two good claims for a penalty turned away. In the second-half we had three or four clear-cut chances, one late in the game which could have won it for us but it wasn't to be."

"We have some of the long-term injured coming back to fitness now," added Barker.

"Luke Gibson has trained well and is




SHOW RACISM THE RED CARD

Supporters queued around the block to get a glimpse of the Millers stars who appeared at the club's main partner for a very special signing session.



