On a side note, when Sam was here last week for the Plymouth game, it was an absolute pleasure chatting to him prematch about how much he was enjoying his time down at Exeter City at the moment. With the winless away run in the league now over, here's hoping the Robins soar higher than the Magpies this evening.








GOOD afternoon and welcome back to The County Ground for tonight's fixture with Notts County...




MAN OF THE MATCH

COUNTY will be hoping to build on their 12th-placed finish last term under the guidance of Chris Kiwomya.

THE Magpies made a fine start to the 2012/13 campaign, losing just once in August and September, having just missed out on a Play-Off spot the season before on goal difference. A 1-0 home reverse to Walsall was the only blot on Keith Curle's copybook until the start of October when successive home defeats brought a seven-match unbeaten run to an end. October saw a change in County's fortunes with only two

away wins coming from their seven games and included a Johnstone's Paint Trophy exit at the hands of Sheffield United. The Magpies would not lose again until the middle of December and registered a 1-0 victory over Town at Meadow Lane in late November. A winless Christmas and New Year period, including a home FA Cup defeat to Rotherham United, was halted by two wins over Oldham and Portsmouth. A home defeat to bottom club

Hartlepool signalled the end of Keith Curle's reign, just a week after his astonishing 22-match unbeaten run away from home had been ended at Leyton Orient.

With Chris Kiwomya now in the hot-seat, County won just five more games over the course of the campaign, finishing comfortably in midtable in League 1. This term, the Meadow Lane side have only registered two league wins, both arriving in their last four fixtures.

THE PLAYERS



NOTTS COUNTY



BIALKOWSKI started out at Górnik Zabrze in his native Poland before moving to Southampton in 2006. In six years at St. Mary's he made over 40 appearances for the South Coast outfit and had spells on loan at Ipswich and Barnsley. Moved to Meadow Lane in the summer of 2012 and has clocked up nearly 60 appearances for the Magpies, Also has international honours with the Polish youth teams.



THE right full-back began his career at Doncaster Rovers and had a spell at Crystal Palace towards the end of his time at the Keepmoat Stadium. In July 2012 he moved south to join Portsmouth and made over 20 appearances for Pompey. In the January transfer window he made the switch to Crawley Town. After 14 starts for the Red Devils last term, he signed for Notts County in the summer.




LEARNT his trade in his native Ireland before making the switch to Leicester City. In his time at the King Powe Stadium, the left full-back had loan spells at Mansfield and Leeds. Had further temporary spells at Crewe and Oldham before signing for Swindon during the 2009/10 campaign, helping Town to the League One Play-Off final. He signed permanently in August 2010 and spent one season with Swindon. Moved to Notts County in June of 2011.



LABADIE came through the ranks at West Bromwich Albion and enjoyed loan stints at Shrewsbury Town, Cheltenham Town and Tranmere Rovers before signing permanently for the Prenton Park side in June 2010. He made the switch to Meadow Lane in the summer of 2012 and scored four times in a loan spell at Torquay United earlier this year. The hardworking midfielder has netted once from thirteen outings so far this term.



THE midfielder started out with Glasgow giants Celtic and with his home-town club, Dundee. He also had spells with clubs in Germany and Switzerland before moving to Norwich City in 2007. He has since played for the likes of Dundee United, Livingston and Ross County in his native Scotland and, after a successful trial this summer, he penned a deal with Notts County. He has also earned international honours with Scotland's Under-21s.



THE Trinidad and Tobago international graduated from the youth ranks at Reading. He has gone on to play for a number of different league and non-league clubs, representing Peterborough, Aldershot, Kettering, Wycombe, York and Luton. Carne to Meadow Lane initially on loan in January 2013 and earned a permanent switch later on that month. The midfielder has made ten appearances so far this term.

THE centre-half started his career with Fulham and had loan stints at Coventry City before moving north to Derby County in 2006. During a five-year stay at Pride Park, he racked up over a century of appearances for the Rams and played in the Premier League. After a brief spell at Leyton Orient, Leacock joined the Magpies in the summer of 2012. He is the current Club Captain at Meadow Lane.




STARTED out with Middlesbrough before making his name with Hartlepool United. In six years at Victoria Park, he racked up over 200 appearances and moved to Notts County in June 2012. Last term he not only played every minute of the Magpies' league campaign, he also claimed a clean-sweep of the club's individual end-of-season awards. Despite starting out as a midfielder, Liddle now plies his trade at the heart of the Notts County defence.



THE wide-man joined Notts County on loan from Aston Villa in September 2013. The 18-year old has come through the ranks at Villa Park and has made it to the fringes of the First Team. This current stint at Meadow Lane is his first taste of senior football. Since making his debut at MK Dons, he has now made five appearances for the Magpies. Grealish also has international honours with the Republic of Ireland youth teams.



AFTER coming through the ranks at Ipswich Town, the frontman had a loan spell at Millwall before joining Bristol City in the summer of 2009. The 25 year-old notched eight times for the Robins then moved on to Barnsiey ahead of the 2011/12 campaign. Last season he found the net nine times for Charlton Athletic and moved to Meadow Lane in the summer. Has already netted three times for his new employers.



THE Martinique international forward had spells with a host of different clubs in France before moving across the Channel to Hereford United in June 2011. He netted eight times for the Bulls in 2011/12 then made the switch to Meadow Lane in July of 2012. Last term he claimed the Golden Boot award at Notts County and extended his stay with the Magples. Arquin has scored three times from twelve outings this season.




AT the start of his career, the 24 year-old Canadian penned a deal with West Bromwich Albion. He had loan spells at Exeter City and St Johnstone before signing permanently for the Saints. He signed for Stevenage in the summer of 2012 and made 46 appearances in all competitions in his debut season at the Larnex Stadium, scoting seven goals. Joined County on loan in September and netted on his Notts debut against Tranmere.




THE Scot has already made an impression at Meadow Lane and will be looking to continue his fine run of form against the Town this evening.

A native of Glasgow, McGregor has been with Celtic since he joined at Under-11 level. The creative attacker is at home both in midfield and up front and has quickly become a crucial element in Celtic's success at youth level. He played a big part in the youths' quadruple double and made his Hoops debut in a pre-season friendly with Spanish giants Real Madrid during their tour of the USA. An injury last term halted his progress but he announced his arrival back on the scene ahead of the 2013/14 campaign, netting the winning goal in Celtic's pre-season friendly victory against Brentford. His progress with Celtic alerted the bosses at international level: he has represented and scored for Scotland's youth teams from Under-16s through to the Under-19s and is soon hoping to make an impact with the Under-21s. In the summer, he agreed a loan move to Meadow Lane until January 2014 and made the perfect start to his County career, scoring one and assisting another in the Magpies' 3-2 win over Fleetwood Town in the first round of the Capital

One Cup back in August. His current goal ratio stands at a goal every two games: he has netted six times in twelve outings in all competitions this term. He has found the net in his last two appearances for the Magpies and scored a brace in County's 4-0 win over Crewe Alexandra during their last League One fixture.



INTERPORT OF THE POST OF THE P

Five clean sheets this season, Wes, are you happy with the way the campaign is shaping up?

I think we've done really well. I think we've surprised a few people who thought we'd struggle and instead we've shown we have good quality players who like to get the ball down and play the right way. We're growing with every game, every performance, so I think we're heading towards the right end of the table.

I think you're right when you say some supporters have been surprised. Presumably you're not, though, because you must have seen the potential in 'the project', otherwise you wouldn't have stayed with the club this sumer, right?


That's right. I spoke to Mark
[Cooper], Jed [McCrory] and Lee
[Power] and they told me their
plan [to get the young lads from
Tottenham] to try and build an
exciting young squad capable
of playing good football. I bought
into that and I also thought this
was the best place for me to play.
I'm playing regularly and adding
experience all the time. There aren't
many 21 or 22 year olds around
the country who play every week.


And you knew a lot of the lads coming in having played with and against some of them, right?

That's right. I knew Ryan Mason having played with him in some of the England age groups and Yaser [Kasim] from when I was younger, so it has been nice to meet with some old friends. We're all in the same boat; young players trying to get to the next level.

Yaser told us last week that you used to play for the same team when you were younger. I bet you thought you'd got rid of him!

[Laughs] Yaser's a good friend of mine. We met at a club called





Westway when we were eight or nine and now I say to him every day: 'I don't know what you've been taking but you used to be the worst player ever'. He used to be centre half and he was just the worst! Overnight something's clicked for him. I went to Fulham first and he came down on trial before joining Spurs, so we went our separate ways. It was a really difficult time for him when he left Tottenham, so I'm really proud of him for the way he carried on. It's easy for youngsters to pack it in when they have obstacles put in their way, but he kept going and had faith in his ability. He's been brilliant here, so I've got no doubts he'll go on to play at a higher level because he has unbelievable ability.

Have you been happy with your form personally?

Yes, I think I've done alright. There are certain situations where I think I could have done better and I'm still going to make the odd mistake; I'm still young and the way we play sometimes exposes me with the ball at my feet more, but in general I've been happy. I've put in some good performances and I was pleased with how I played against Chelsea.

You're almost playing as a sweeper at times. Have you had to work on that part of your game?

The thing is, I'm comfortable with the ball at my feet but goalkeepers aren't the same as outfield players in that we don't have their vision – we don't work on that day to day. It's something I feel more and more goalkeepers have to do, though. If you want to play at the top level, you're going to have to have that in your locker. That's the way football is heading and goalkeepers are becoming a

more important part of the play. Fraser [Digby] is good at sharing his experiences and he tries to help you where possible. He tries to ensure you stay calm on the ball whatever the situation.

There's certainly more competition for places in the goalkeeping department this season. Does that help?

Definitely. I've not had too much competition until now because Phil Smith was released and the other keepers were young lads coming through, so it's good to have other players here. It helps in training as well and it's better for all of us. We're able to do more drills and more varied drills, so we all benefit. Extra competition can only help all of us

What do you make of the centre-back pairing in front of you, Grant [Hall] and Darren [Ward]?

push on.

I think it's a really good combination. You have Darren. who has done everything in the game. He's played so many matches and at the highest level, and then you have Grant, who's up and coming and who has good ability. He hasn't got Wardy's experience, but they help each other out and complement each other's game. Wardy has really improved with his feet, too, and he's been one of our best players. That's testament to the way we're playing.

Earlier, you touched on your decision to stay in the summer... other players were leaving and we all probably expected you to do the same. So what was it that persuaded you to stay?

My favourite outfield player was Alan Shearer. I'm a Newcastle fan, so he was fantastic to watch when I was growing up. I also used to like David James and Shay Given.

Is it frustrating seeing Jack Butland get a lot of credit and a place in the England Under-21s sauad?

Mitchell Singh (vio Facebook)

I think I can do the job but ultimately it's not my decision, it's not in my hands. It doesn't bother me that much because your club is where you make a name for yourself. International football is a great opportunity if it happens, but I won't lose any sleep over it. I'd love to play for the senior team but if it doesn't come then it doesn't come. I've played at U16 and U17 levels but not made it into the Under-21s, but I won't lose any sleep over it.

What is your favourite hobby?

Oscar Benton, (aged six months, via Victoria Marchant, via Facebook)

Probably playing on the Xbox. I've been on that a lot recently. I've just taken up golf as well, so I'm often down the driving range. I'm quite ambidextrous; I use my right hand for golf, my left for tennis etc. It's a weird one!

I don't want to be a no.2. I don't want to sit on the bench, I want to keep playing and improving and I felt this was the best place to do that. I've still only had limited experience in League 1 and a season in League 2, so I feel I needed another year or more at this level to develop further. I'm still only 22 and there's time to move up. And like I say, there aren't many keepers at my age who can say they've played 100-odd games. My aim is to keep developing.

When you look at your decision to join the club and drop down the divisions from Fulham, you must be happy with the way things have gone? I'd say if was the

best decision of my

life. When you're a young player it's easy to try and hold on to that Premier League or Championship status and stay there for as long as you can, but I felt that was only going to have a negative effect if I did that. You need to find a level where you can compete and get there as quickly as possible.

Presumably you had certain expectations of what could happen here, but surely you didn't predict seven clean sheets in your first nine games...

No, but it wasn't just down to me, it was down to the defensive unit as a whole. I certainly wasn't Superman in goal saving everything, but I was playing my part in the unit. The defence did get broken down at times but they helped me out massively. It made it easier coming into a team that was strong defensively. That start gave me confidence.

And just one goal conceded at home in that first season... were you surprised by your consistency given you'd only played first-team football at non-League level?

Yeah, probably. I remember doing an interview with someone when I first joined and I remember telling that person that consistency was going to be the hardest thing, because as a young goalkeeper I was going to make mistakes. I felt there were always going to be situations that required split-second decisions and it's difficult to consistently make the right one. But I'm pleased that I've been able to do that more often than not. I think I can count on one hand the mistakes I've made, which is great for a goalkeeper of my age.

Did you take any notice of the records as they tumbled that season?

I'd be lying if I said I didn't have an eye on them, but I wouldn't say they were that important to me. I remember I was close to a record playing against AFC Wimbledon and we conceded, but it turned out to be one of my best games in a Swindon shirt. That was more important to me than the clean sheet, the fact that we didn't lose the game and I had played a part in that.

You've won a league title and cleaned up various player of the year awards, but what's been your highlight at Swindon so far?

Winning League 2 was great because I'd never won a title before and the feeling in the dressing room afterwards will stay with me forever.

The lowlight is obvious... what do you make of that Preston experience looking back? To be honest, not much fazes me. I knew I'd made a mistake and whether I thought it was the right decision to be substituted is irrelevant. I'm young, I'll make mistakes but I'm not afraid to hold my hands up when I do. I think a lot of young goalkeepers might have crumbled with some of the things that were said about me, but

I'm proud of the way I came back from that.

It can be tough being a goalkeeper, as Joe Hart is finding out...

Every footballer makes mistakes but goalkeepers are highlighted more because if we make a mistake it's a goal. Other players can lose the ball or whatever and there are other players to help them out, but we're the last line of defence. Joe Hart is a fantastic goalkeeper and young goalkeepers look up to him. People will put pressure on him but he should be given a bit of a break. I'm sure he'll come through it.

There are games when you seem to have little to do for long amounts of time: how do you keep your concentration in passages of play like that?

It can be difficult, but I can't complain. When I joined, we were in League 2 and I only had to save a shot here and there, which is great for the team. There were a few games when we were winning 1-0 and I had to make a save that helped us get that 1-0 win, so they're important moments. It's so important to do the right thing when you're called into action and I'm pleased I've been able to do that.



7. BLACK BOOTS:

WE continue our look back at what was acceptable in the 80s by this week focusing on the progression of football boots back in a time when black cleats reigned supreme...

IT is very rare to catch a modern day footballer sporting a pair of black boots with today's players opting for the more luminous options on offer, even those garish pink polka-dot boots that Puma released last year.


Despite the emergence of white boots a decade earlier, traditional black boots, in particular Adidas' timeless classic the Copa Mundial, were still the preferred choice of the majority of footballers plying their trade in the 1980s but it was the work of former Liverpool and Middlesbrough player Craia Johnston that was to change the development of football boots for ever.

Johnston wanted to create a boot that provided greater traction between football boot and the ball, and football boot and the around. After much testing, including filming German legend Franz Beckenbauer testing the boots out in the snow, the legendary Adidas Predator was born. Despite the fact the boots were not released until the 1990s. Johnston's innovative design paved the way for Umbro, Lotto and Spanish company Kelme to produce their first football cleats in the 80s, ushering

in a golden period of success for these companies as football boots, all of a sudden, took on a whole new importance as a fashion accessory as well as just being a vital tool with which to play the game.



INTERIM Under-18s Manager Jamie Pitman reviews what has been a disappointing start to the Youth Alliance campaign...



IT'S been a difficult period for us recently. We've had a number of injuries to the Second Year apprentices and it has affected us physically especially with the demands of playing games. It's been a transition period and one in which the First Years accept that they will be playing a lot of games and it's certainly been an eye-opener for them. The step up from the Under 16s to Under 18s is auite considerable and the difference between First and Second Years physically and mentally is quite big.

I would say that this has been a good period of character building for the lads and it will only be beneficial to those

involved. Results haven't been great but performances have been ok. The way we're trying to develop the players to play in the first team is different to the youth football in the league we're playing in - a lot of the teams are very physical and very direct but we're trying to play the right way as the first team are. We're trying to educate them so that when they do step up into the first team they do know what they're doing and they have the capability to play at that level.

Having said that, there are lots of positives to take: the First Years have adapted well and all the players are very conscious about working hard and trying to develop as a group and as individuals but we're just getting undone due to some defensive frailties.


We have Cheltenham up next who are going really well then we have the FA Youth Cup coming up in early November so we've got things to look forward to. The boys are working really hard and, as I've said before, it's tough for them because it's a big transition period at the moment. The First Years are still getting used to that massive difference being a First and Second Year Scholar.

RETRORED

THIS week's edition of Retro Red takes a look at a World Cup finalist that came to little old Swindon over 20 years ago...

BACK in the latter half of the 1960s, there was a tendency to bracket England's World Cup victory of 1966 with West Ham United.

That was because The Hammers' influence had been so great - with the inclusion of Geoff Hurst, Martin Peters and Bobby Moore in the final - that some London-based media men (and aren't they all?) seemed to think it was West Ham who were Warld Champions, rather than England.

Just think the credence that would have come Swindon's way had Alf Ramsey concluded that there was a winger worthy of inclusion in his side after all and picked Don Rogers instead of unveiling his 'Wingless Wonders'.

Imagine Don sitting the West Germany keeper Hans Tilkowski on his backside as he won the World Cup for England, just as he did to Bob Wilson of Arsenal at the same venue three years later.

But in 1990 we signed a player who came so close to being our own World Cup winner. Not someone who had won the tournament years before and was seeing out his career with a less fashionable team, like Bobby Charlton eventually did at Preston, but a player whose medal was still that of a current World Cup champion.

After Paul Gascolgne wept his way out of Italia '90, West Germany defeated Argentina in the final. Just four months later, one of that beaten team chose to move to Wiltshire to further his footballing career.

Nottingham Forest were also on the trail of the central defender but it was the influence of fellow countryman and Town manager Ossie Ardiles that made Nestor Lorenzo opt for the West Country rather than Nottinghamshire to take his football to a higher level.

His Town debut, after joining from Italian club Bari for a fee described as either £160,000 or £400,000 depending on where you read it, brought a goal, a booking and a 3-0 win over Portsmouth.

Strangely, that was about as good as it got for Lorenzo. A hugely disappointing season saw us avoid relegation by two points and, while making over 20 appearances all fold, the departure of Ardiles to Newcastle seemed to lessen the reason for the cultured defender to stay in England.


The successful central defensive pairing of Shaun Taylor and Colin Calderwood, with new manager Glenn Hoddle operating as sweeper, reduced the First Team chances of the World Cup finalist even further.

There were suggestions that the Argentinean's outings were hampered by an appearance clause making it cost-prohibitive to play him, something that is supported by the fact that when Hoddle suffered injury, Nestor still couldn't make the team despite being the obvious choice to replace the player/manager.

With his contract running out in the summer of 1992, Nestor departed for the aptly named San Lorenzo in his native country, subsequently plying his trade in the top flight once more with Boca Juniors, although he was never again selected for his country.

Lorenzo arrived at Swindon at a difficult time and despite his undoubted ability, was denied the opportunity to show his skills to the fullest.


We once had a losing World Cup finalist playing for us and it's unfortunate for him and Town that more was not able to be made of his presence.



PICTURED: Nestor Lorenzo lines up for the 1991,92 season team photograph.





There was also a special mention for Mavis Knight for her hard work on the Pounds for Points scheme which contributed £4000 towards our support of youth development.



THE BOX



TURNING Points, defining moments, every team has them during the course of a season and last weekend's stunning win at Rotherham could well prove to be Swindon's...

TO be honest, I wasn't expecting a great deal from Town's first ever trip to the New York Stadium last Saturday. The wind and the rain did little but increase my trepidation and Rotherham's fine start to the season had me convinced that it was going to be another long afternoon away from the home comforts we have enjoyed at The County Ground so far this season.

However, despite a very nervous first fifteen minutes in which Rotherham had numerous opportunities to open the scoring, I was left speechless by the end of the afternoon's proceedings and for those of you who know me that is no mean feat. After overcoming the initial onslaught and slow start, Swindon settled into a rhythm and were soon at their scintillating best, where certain passages of play had vou believing you were at the Nou Camp rather than in Southern Yorkshire so elegant was some of the build-up play. All four goals were carved from moments of genius, and even though Massimo Luongo's effort had a slice of luck about it, the build-up play was sublime.

The opening goal, courtesy of an exquisite Alex Pritchard freekick summed up the excellence of Town's play on an afternoon when the weather was anything but. Mark Cooper's troops,



resembling Inter Milan in their new black and blue striped away kit, had a swagger about them which belied the fact that they were still without an away win in the league.

For all of Swindon's attacking prowess and free flowing football, it was the steely, hardened core to the team that impressed me the most. When, in previous games, the defence may have wilted when faced with the pressure they were exposed to in those first fifteen minutes by Rotherham, Darren Ward and co stood tall and

resolute, saw out the threat and then proceeded to build a base which frustrated and tormented the hosts for the duration of the afternoon.

On the long journey back to SN1, I was reminded of another long trip up north two years ago, Swindon's 2-0 win at Accrington Stanley which kick-started a 13-game unbeaten run in all competitions which propelled Town up the table and put them in good stead for the success they would taste in May.


Now, I am not naive enough to think that one result defines a season but I certainly believe that Swindon's win last Saturday has now given Cooper's troops a platform on which to build and it helps that they have now shaken the monkey off their backs with regards to their away form.

Coming into tonight's game against Notts County at Fortress County Ground, Swindon are just two points off the play-off places and are perfectly placed to now stitch together a run of wins and really cement themselves as play-off contenders. The demolition of Rotherham has sent out a clear message to the rest of the league and rightly so.



COACHES' CORNER



TOWN'S Sports Scientist Michael Cooper is back in Coaches' Corner and describes what it's been like over the past few weeks...




OBVIOUSLY with the few injuries we have got it has been a bit touch-and-go recently but it looks like the boys have come out the other side unscathed. The squad is getting back together and that reflects in performances on the pitch. Since the start of the season, my job hasn't really changed much. Obviously I look at matches from a physical point of view and I must say that we look better and better with every game that passes. The lads are looking fit and strong compared to their opposite numbers. Off the field, I devote a lot of time to players' late-stage rehabilitation. So, when players come back from injury it's about simply getting


them back up to same level as the players who aren't injured. Paul Godfrey, the physio, will oversee the whole process but then at the last point they do a clearance session to make sure their fitness is up to standard and then they'll come back into the group. It's always busy for me regardless of injuries or not because of the volume of games we have and how quick the turnaround is. We rely on the physio, who does a very good job in helping players come back from injury, then once they're in rehabilitation, it's all about making sure they're ready to go again on a matchday. A

lot of our injuries recently have been trauma injuries rather than soft tissue injuries. Football is a contact sport and you can't avoid getting injured. It is part of the game but it is just unfortunate that we have had so many trauma injuries. On a day-to-day basis, it's all about getting players to stay at that same consistent level of fitness. That's all done by a plan that has been put in place into how training is structured and then making sure they're in top shape for Saturday.

RON Atkinson brought his Aston Villa side to SN1 as Town continued to search for their first top-flight win.

AFTER successive Premier League draws, Town had been knocked out of the Coca-Cola Cup at Portsmouth in midweek before Aston Villa came to The County Ground. Just after the half-hour mark. Swindon were awarded a penalty when Andy Mutch was shoved over in the 18-yard box. Having netted the equaliser from the spot against Tottenham a week earlier, Paul Bodin stepped up and drove the ball high in to the net to give John Gorman's men the lead. With just two minutes to go before half time, a free-kick from the Villa left came through to Shaun Teale who stretched to volley home the equaliser. On 68 minutes, Andy Townsend made progress down the right flank before cutting the ball back for the waiting Dalian Atkinson who fired home the winning goal past Fraser Digby.

Manager John Gorman could not fault his players post-match. "We've committed today and the lads gave everything," he said. "I couldn't ask for anything more. We didn't always play pretty today because it was a physical game and a tight game. I would say that we had the majority of the play even though Villa started brightly." Town's defending was even put under the microscope by Alan Hansen on Match of the Day. "They cannot defend," he proclaimed. "You cannot fault them for effort, attitude and spirit...Swindon will have a long, hard winter I'm afraid."




How does that make you feel? Have your expectations for the season changed? Were you worried about a relegation fight this season or, like me, were you happy to accept a midtable belly-flop and a campaign of consolidation?

I know one man whose opinions haven't changed since the first day of pre-season. Chairman Jed McCrory has been telling me every week since the sun started shining that he would put together a side that would win promotion in 2013/14.

I didn't believe him and to be honest I still don't, but it's remarkable how quickly it's all come together at The County Ground.

There can't be anyone who would have predicted how smoothly this bunch of ubertalented upstarts have become a team. Not even McCrory. What a refreshing change it is to experience.

Fifty years ago this month a



documentary maker by the name of John Boorman made a short film about a week in the life of Swindon Town. The narration spoke of a young group of players defying the odds, joined by a common kinship and simply loving playing football.

The parallels are as striking as the discrepancies - you can hardly imagine Nile Ranger cutting Mark Cooper's hair after training, as Ernie Hunt did for Bert Head back in 1963, while you're more likely to see the Spurs loanees clustered around a PS3 playing FIFA14 rather than kicking a ball about in the street with the local kids, a la Mike Summerbee.

Comparing and contrasting the then and now is an entertaining task. It's amazing to see how

much has changed and how little has changed at the same time.

Furthermore, looking at Boorman's film and relating it to the modern day established in my mind how much Swindon Town has become a community club over the course of the past six months - the eradication of cliques, one unified goal, association to the town on various levels.

This is the strongest parallel to 1963 and the reward tonight could be a place in the top six. Now wouldn't that be worth two hours round the in-laws?


