
MAN OF THE MATCH

TOWN'S Number One picked up the Man of the Match award for his performance in the recent League 1 clash against Walsall. His display earned him the post-match accolade and he was whisked up to the Sponsors' Suite after the game to recieve his bottle of champagne, presented by Main Match Sponsors, Excalibur.





NOW under the guidance of a firm fans' favourite, Wycombe will be hoping to build on a solid start to 2013/14...

LAST season began with a disappointing tally of four points from their opening seven games having been relegated the previous campaign. After three successive defeats, manager Gary Waddock was relieved of his duties in September of last year and was replaced by Club Captain Gareth Ainsworth, who took the job in a caretaker capacity. The reaction to the change appeared to have the desired effect with three wins coming from the next five

fixtures. In early November,
Alnsworth was handed the
job of player/manager on a
permanent basis despite the
Chairboys' position just outside
the League Two drop zone on
goal difference. A run of five
wins from eight games in the
build-up to the New Year pulled
Wycombe clear of the relegation
places. This continued into 2013
with a further four wins arriving
in January and February, the
latter of which, a 4-0 win over
York City at Adams Park, took the

Chairboys up to 11th in the table. Ainsworth guided Wycombe to just five more wins last term, three of which were away from home, as they finished 15th in the final League Two table. This season has seen the Buckinghamshire side win six of their first 14 league games as well as registering five defeats and three draws. They beat Exeter City 2-0 in the opening round of the JPT and dispatched Bristol City 2-1 at Adams Park to seal their place in the Area Quarter-Final.



AINSWORTH is currently in his first full-time managerial role after a playing career that lasted over 20 years. He started out with Blackburn Rovers and had spells at Preston, Cambridge, Northwich Victoria and Lincoln before moving to Port Vale for a club record fee. After just one season at Vale Park, Wimbledon parted with £2,000,000 for his services in 1998. He had further Ioan spells at Preston and Walsall in addition to a short time at Cardiff City before signing for

Queens Park Rangers in 2003. He would make close to 150 league appearances for the Loftus Road outfit and was twice caretaker manager during his time with the Rs. Ainsworth's next destination was Adams Park in November 2009, Initially on loan. Put pen to paper on a permanent deal with the Chairbovs and last term, was handed the reins on a caretaker basis. Called time on his playing career in April of this year and signed a two-year deal to manage Wycombe.




THE stopper is a product of the club's youth academy and signed his first professional deal in the summer of 2012. The 19-year-old had earlier appeared on the bench for the Chairboys and was called up to an England goalkeeper training camp in January 2011, Had a stint at Oxford City last season before being recalled in March and made his Wycombe bow against Accrington. Ingram has been Gareth Ainsworth's Number One this term.




McCOY started out with Watford's Academy before moving to Wealdstone. During his time in the nonleagues, he picked up Wealdstone's Players' and Supporters' Player of the Year awards, all whilst holding down a part-time job. The right full-back made the step up into the professional game with the Chairbovs after a successful trial, penning a deal in the summer of 2011. He has also earned international honours with Antigua and Barbuda.




THE left full-back is a graduate of Wycombe's youth ranks and put pen to paper on his first professional deal in September 2011. Made his first team debut towards the end of the 2011/12 campaign and went on to cement his place in the side. His performances drew the attention of Championship side Blackpool, who secured his services in the summer before loaning him back to Wycombe for the 2013/14 campaign.



WOOD started his career with Brentford, clocking up over 100 appearances in four years with the Bees. He also had a loan stint with Rotherham during the 2011/12 season before joining Wycombe in the summer of 2012. The versattle left-winger, who can also operate at left full-back, recovered from an early season injury last term to claim the Supporters Club's Player of the Season award with a string of all-action performances.




THE Academy product penned his first professional deal towards the end of 2011/12. After some impressive performances this pre-season, he was handed his senior bow as a substitute on the opening day against Morecambe. The attacking midfielder made his first start in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy win over Exeter City. Scored a brace against Hartlepool to help Wycombe to victory and notched the winner in a recent win at Bristol Rovers.




KNOTT is a graduate of the Academy at Sunderland and made his Black Cats bow on the final day of last season. During his fledgling career to date, he has enjoyed loan spells at Woking and AFC Wimbledon, winning the Young Player of the Season Award whilst with the latter. Is currently on loan at Adams Park until the end of November and netted in Wycombe's 2-1 win at Bristol City in the last round.

COYR looks at some of the players that could feature this evening...



THE centre-half guided Wycombe's Under-18s to Youth Alliance Cup success before signing his first professional deal in 2011. Stewart made his senior debut in January 2012 and last term, saw his progress halted by an injury. After returning to action, he went on to net his first senior goal in March and made a total of 22 appearances. A goal-scoring threat, he has (at the time of writing) found the net three times from 12 outlings this season.



HAUSE joined Wycombe as a trainee from Birmingham City in 2012 before earning his first professional deal later that summer. The centre-half made his debut in an FA Cup defeat at Crewe Alexandra in November of last year. In January, he went on to notch his first career goal against Chesterfield. After eleven outings last term, he has been a key component for Gareth Ainsworth's side this season.



ANOTHER product of the Wycombe Academy, the midfielder was a key part of the club's Under-18 and reserve sides before signing a professional deal in 2011. After making his senior bow, he spent time on loan at Eastbourne Borough last term, then went on to establish himself in the heart of the Chairboys' midfield. His performances earned him the Young Player of the Year and the Supporters' Player of the Year awards.



THE striker has played for no fewer than 12 clubs in a career that has spanned 13 years after starting out at Colchester. Morgan has since represented the likes of Reading, Luton, Leyton Orlent, Chesterfield and Oxford before signing a short-term deal with Wycombe in July of 2012. His form in front of goal earned him a new contract and, at the time of writing, is the Chairboys' top scorer this term.



THE striker is a product of the Academy at Portsmouth and had spells with Grimsby, Scunthorpe, Rushden & Diamonds and Woking before joining Plymouth ahead of the 2012/13 season. The 22-year-old found the net five times in 45 appearances for the Pligrims and signed for Wycombe in June of this year. Comfortable operating on either wing as well as up front, he has scored three times already this campaign.



McCLURE earned his chance in the Wycombe first team after a string of fine performances with the club's reserve and youth teams, as well as fruitful stints in front of goal for Wealdstone and Burnham. Made his debut in the 2010/11 season but had to wait until March 2012 to score his first senior goal against Scunthorpe. Last season, he made 28 appearances and plundered eleven goals to finish as the Chairboys' joint-top-scorer.




COYR takes a closer look at Wycombe's skipper who will be looking to lead from the front at SN1 this evening...


THE midfielder learned his trade with Premier League giants Arsenal after joining from Norwich City and went on to captain a number of the Gunners' youth teams. He then moved across north London to Tottenham where he was a regular for the Under-18s and the reserves before taking his first steps in the professional game with Barnet. Lewis then made 34 appearances for Stevenage between March 2007 and January of 2008, when he was snapped up by Gillingham. In his time at Stevenage, he represented England's C team. He registered over 50 appearances for the Gills and played 90 minutes in the 2009 League Two Play-Off Final as the Kent side clinched promotion to the third fier of English football In the summer of 2010, he swapped the Priestfield Stadium for Dagenham & Redbridge However, with opportunities limited during his only season in east London, Lewis's next destination was Adams Park and a two-month loan stint with

the Chairboys in November 2010. An impressive temporary spell earned him a permanent switch to Wycombe and the midfielder went on to star in the promotion-winning side of 2010/11, making 27 appearances in the midfield engine room. He netted his first goals for his new employers in a 4-1 win over Burton Albion that season and featured regularly for the Chairboys on their return to League 1. He would only score once in 2011/12: a 90th minute strike to help rescue a point against Carlisle United. Last campaign, he made 45 appearances for Wcombe in all competitions and found the net twice, including the only goal in a 1-0 win at Morecambe, At the club's End of Season dinner, his displays earned him the Players' Player of the Year accolade. Lewis has played every minute of the Chairboys' Johnstone's Paint Trophy campaign so far, helping them to beat Exeter City and Bristol City en route to

the Area Quarter-Finals.


WYCOMBE were the visitors to SN1 on Boxing Day in 2006 for a clash between two sides aiming for promotion come the end of the season. Lukas Jutkiewicz headed home the opener on the stroke of halftime. Just the other side of the break, a glancing header from Lee Peacock put Town 2-0 up. Despite Jermaine Easter's 81st minute effort, Paul Sturrock's men held on to register a vital three points that took them closer to the automatic promotion places in League Two.

A former Town favourite and Hall of Fame member has been back at The CG...

TOWN legend Ray McHale was at SN1 recently to pick up his Hall of Fame tie. The midfielder, who played over 200 times for Swindon and scored 42 goals between 1976 and 1980, was delighted to have been awarded such an accolade.

"It's great," he said. "I was contacted by Mark Isaacs about 12 months ago and, now that I'm retired and in and out of the country, this was the first possible chance I got to come here."

"The highlight of my career with Swindon would probably have to be the League Cup run when we played Arsenal (in 1979)," he recalled. "I remember we were 3-1 up then they scored two in the last five minutes to make it three-all. I remember Bobby

(Smith) the manager sitting us down in the middle and we were all a bit frustrated. Then we were fortunate enough to score later on in extra-time - I think it was Andy Rowland who got us to 4-3, it was a great night."

He continued: "We then had a good run in the FA Cup and played a Fulham side with (George) Best, (Rodney) Marsh and Bobby Moore playing. We drew at Fulham then we had a packed house here - 30,000 - and we beat them 5-0. To do that with 'Bestie' and everyone here - I can still remember trying to push it through his legs and he just rubbed my hair. It was a great club and a great time in my career."



WITH Remembrance Sunday still fresh in the memory, Swindon Town would like to pay tribute to the former players who made the ultimate sacrifice in defence of their country.

Six players with connections to Swindon Town were lost during the Great War. Albert Mitton died in Belgium in October 1917, while Freddy Wheatcroft was killed in France in November 1917. Arthur Beadsworth, Jim Chalmers, Billy Kirby and William Brewer were the others who lost their lives during World War One.

KEITH SCOTT

THE giant striker experienced highs at Wycombe and relegation at Swindon, but he recalls spells at both clubs with fond memories...

Keith, can you believe it's 20 years since you were playing football in the Premier League with Swindon Town?

It's scary and amazing how things change, particularly when you consider how it's covered. Sky came to watch us train ahead of a televised game against Sheffield Wednesday and did a little piece on us with a couple of interviews. New football is 24/7, it's a huge product. Being a footballer now at any professional level is fantastic. The rewards are incredible, life-changing, and you don't even have to be a good player to earn phenomenal amounts.


I suppose when you consider what sort of season we had, it's probably a good thing football coverage wasn't so widespread, isn't it?


It was a tough season. When you look at it though there were a lot of teams who scored less than our 47 goals. The problem was we conceded 1001 Walkers naive, though. We were good value whether you went to watch us home or away because we played great (cotball it was attacking football that was great on the eye, but it meant that

when you came up against strikers such as Shearer and Sutton we got punished. I would imagine if we were around now there would be a few pundits who would be having a good time at our expense.

John Gorman always used to say we made a lot of friends that season, but it must have been a frustrating campaign for him and the players?

It was, but don't forget we had some great results, too. We were 2-1 up at Antield only to concede a late equaliser. We went to Sheffield Wednesday on a Monday night, and they were a good side back then, and drew 3-3. We drew 1-1 at Highbury, drew 2-2 at home to Manchester United. In saying that, we also had a run where we lost O at Villa, 6-2 at Everton and away at Newcastle. We had ome fantastic results but our naivety and inexperience was our undoing, it was our Achilles heel. But that was the way the gaffer wanted to play. We'd go to places and attack in numbers, ent would concede goals as a sees an ence. It was crazy, but may were good times.





Tell us what you remember about joining the club, because you jumped straight from the fourth tier to the top flight...

The funny thing was that I played against Swindon for Wycombe in pre-season and we drew 2-2. I scored that day. At that stage I think was on about 15 goals in 21 games for Wycombe and I remember, after a league game away at Bristol Rovers, a guy approached me after the match and told me that Swindon were interested in me. He asked me if he could call me, and did so the following Monday to ask if he could represent me. He wanted 20 percent. I told him that if Swindon wanted to sign me, they'd sign me. I told him he could represent me but I wasn't giving him any of my contract. I told him he could have 20 percent of any endorsements, but he wasn't interested. Anyway, on the Monday, Martin O'Neill pulled me into his office and told me about Swindon's interest. I remember him telling me: 'Listen, before you make a decision, consider the fact that you could either be playing against Rochdale on Saturday or Ipswich Town in the Premier League."

I met John Gorman and the rest was history. I only found out afterwards that Swindon watched me from that pre-season game and for the next two/three months. Luckily, every time John's assistant came to watch me I scored. So, I went from Twerton Park on the Saturday, playing against Bristol Rovers, to training ahead of a Premier League game a couple of days later.

It was obviously a big step up, so how did you feel about it?

Where football was concerned, I never actually had any ambitions to play at a professional level. I worked in a bank and my aim was to carve out a career in the banking world and play nonleague football, albeit at the highest non-league level. That was my mindset. Then things took off!

I knew my strengths and weaknesses. I knew I wasn't the best player technically, but I had good physical strength and I could do a job holding up the ball or playing alongside a smaller striker. I also knew this was a one-off opportunity, but I auess I worried about how I would cope technically at that level. I had great faith in my ability and I just tried to play to my strengths and tried not to isolate my weaknesses. I was nervous, but it was an opportunity most people only dream of.

And in a way you had nothing to lose because the team was struggling and no one expected too much. Did that help?

Jan (Aage Fjortoff) was the big money signing, from Lillestrom, and he had struggled initially. For a lad of 6' 4", Jan was a different class when it came to his technical ability but what he wasn't so good at was fighting and battling with centre-halves. He wasn't a target man, so we complimented each other well. That's what I could do, so I think I helped him in a way. I remember Jan was actually contemplating going back to Lillestrom because he wanted to secure his place in Norway's World Cup squad in 1994, but he never looked back after scoring his first Swindon goal. He was tremendous; a really talented footballer.

You scored four in total yourself that season, so, which one was your favourite?

I suppose the two that stand out are the ones against QPR that gave us our first win in the Premier League and the goal at Anfield, I got the second and we were very close to getting a shock result against Liverpool at their place.

On one hand I'm disappointed I didn't score more that season, but on the other, I got four goals in the top flight, and that's not something many people can say.


Can you tell us what it was like in the dressing room after our first win in the league, against QPR in November?

I remember before the game, on the Monday [the match was on the Wednesday night] we couldn't train because our pitch was frozen. So, instead, we just went for a run round Swindon—that was our preparation! At the time QPR were probably the top London team at the time. They had players like Les Ferdinand, but the thing was, despite our run, we always believed we could win games because we actually had some good players.


Unfortunately, about 25 minutes into the game, Luc Nijholt got sent off. It was 0-0 at the time and we were down to ten men and you're thinking 'here we go', but we got a goal and managed to hang on until the end. It was such an amazing feeling and we just felt so happy for each other. We worked so hard for each other, with ten men, and we just believed then that we would stay up. Even towards the end of the season we believed we would stay up.

Unfortunately it wasn't to be, and the following season there was a change in the dugout, with Steve McMahon taking over from John...

I remember Jan and I started the following season up front and we might have been the top strike partnership in the country outside of the Premier League. Unfortunately, for whatever reason, we just kept losing games.


The game that cost John his job was Bristol City. They beat us 3-2 and he was replaced by Steve McMahon, who at that time was quite an icon having played for England and in that great Liverpool side. He had his own ideas and wanted to be a player-manager. His first game was Southend away and I'm pretty sure he got sent off. That was guite unnerving. Personally, I thought the club should have kept John because Steve's appointment unhinged everyone. I was sold to Stoke, Jan to Middlesbrough and the club went down again. I thought John deserved more time. I'm not saving he would have got us back up, but with Jan and I scoring goals I think we would have climbed the table and perhaps challenged for the play-offs.

Your Swindon stay was sandwiched by two spells at Wycombe, a club close to your heart, and who Swindon face tonight.

I started my career at Lincoln, but it was Wycombe who gave me the springboard to go and play in the Premier League at Swindon. I was fortunate really because Martin O'Neill spotted me while watching another player. He took me to Wycombe on loan initially and then signed me permanently. And yes, Wycombe really is close to my heart. I had a good rapport with the supporters there and I have a lot of time for the people who ran the club at the time.

And you had some good times, winning promotion to the Football League as champions and lifting the FA Trophy twice!

When Martin signed me in 1990/91, he came and picked me up personally because I didn't drive. I was sat in this car with a guy

who had lifted two European Cups and captained his country; it was so surreal! He really sold the club to me and he even predicted we'd win the FA Trophy months before we did it. They were good times, but we had a really good side. No team has won the Conference title and FA Trophy in the same season since.

And last year you were linked with the manager's job. Is management in the Football League something that still interests you?

I'd love to manage at a professional level but it's being given the chance to do so. When managerial jobs become available, boards and chairmen go down the experienced route of managers. To me, those managers work for two or three years, get the sack and then go somewhere else only to do the same again. But chairmen will still take those managers over someone who has never managed in the league.


I've been rejected by clubs who


tell me I haven't got the league experience they're after, but it's hard to get that experience when you don't get the opportunity in the first place. If you know the game and you know how to get the best out of players then you can manage in league football. I just want a chance. I've had success in non-league football and I think I can transfer that to the Football League, but it will take someone brave enough to give me that opportunity.

You've played under some great managers and alongside some good players, so you would be able to draw on those experiences...

Martin O'Neill's career speaks for itself, John Gorman, whatever you think of him, is a fantastic coach and was Glenn Hoddle's assistant with England. Lawrie Sanchez, manager of Northern Ireland, Mike Walker, John Gregory, Lou Macari and Alan Pardew... you learn something from every single one of them. You can never say you'll replicate a manager, but you can look at the way they do things and develop your own style based on the good and the bad. But to be successful, you have to really know the game. You have to be able to look at a player and know what makes them tick.

I remember playing with Steve Guppy and he was the kind of player who, if he didn't play very well he'd be very down on himself. In one particular game, where he'd had a stinker. Martin O'Neill talked him up instead of rollicking him, which got the best out of him. The next match, Steve was out of this world. Martin just knew how to handle the players in his squad and how to get the best out of them. But yes, I consider myself very lucky to have played under and alongside some great people.

DAVE Wallis looks back on an away trip from 2002 that went on slightly longer than anticipated...

SURELY everyone here will be hoping we don't see a repeat of events eleven years ago tonight. That's because, on 12th November 2002, we faced Kidderminster in the LDV Vans Trophy and no-one at Agaborough thought they were going to have such a long night.

In the forerunner to the Johnstone's Paint Trophy, we had already beaten Southend United by the impressive score of 6-1, a result that was somewhat out of keeping with others that season.

That took us to the second round and a game against the Harriers. With kick-off scheduled for 7.45 things took a turn for the worse as the allotted time approached and darkness

proved to be a problem.

A power cut became a stubborn obstacle and it was around 75 minutes later that the game finally kicked off.

Credit has to be given to referee Trevor Parkes for being ready to delay things for so long and to the technical staff for persevering in the candlelight to resolve the issues but, for the travelling Town supporters, a long night was already assured.

The match saw Town's 'keeper Craig Farr make his full debut, deputising for the rested Bart Griemink. The youngster would make only two more appearances before joining Chippenham after being released in August 2003.

> Also turning out for us was Tottenham loanee Johnnie Jackson, one of the scorers in the previous round's demolition of Southend.

Up front was Alan Young, making one of only nine full appearances for Town before he too departed for nonleague football and Swindon Supermarine

And young Alan Young marked the occasion with a goal. Before that, Danny Invincibile had begun the scoring six minutes before half-time. Then, both Young and JJ

Melligan scored within a minute of each other as the second half started with a bang.

Before the second period was five minutes old, Drewe Broughton levelled the match at 2-2 and that's how it stayed until the 'final' whistle.

Under most circumstances that left the potential for another half-an-hour, then penalties: something that might have threatened to take the game into the next day!

Whoever decided to scotch that idea and implement a 'golden goal' rule for the competition would surely have been congratulated on his foresight that evening, as Harriers defender Abdou Sall netted the deciding goal in the 105th minute.

With the clock now past 11:00 pm, a new British record had been set for the latest ever finish to a match.

Left facing another 72-mile trip back to Swindon, there would have been rueful smiles amongst the travelling faithful that a trip to The Millennium Stadium that season had slipped thorough Town's grasp.


The end of November saw us looking nervously at the drop zone, but by the season's end, we had climbed to a tenth place finish in the Division Two table.

JAY MCESVELE

THE full-back shares his memories of his Swindon debut as Mark Cooper's men target another final appearance...

THE Johnstone' Paint Trophy will always have a certain resonance with Jay McEveley after the defender made his Swindon bow in the final against Chesterfield in 2012.

Speaking to COYR in the build-up to this evening's Quarter-Final clash, the former Blackburn, Derby and Barnsley full-back describes what it was like learning that he was to pull on the famous red shirt for the first time at Wembley Stadium after joining Swindon on loan just days before.

"I came down on the Wednesday or the Thursday and I trained with the lads for a couple of days," he remembers. "I didn't really know the team - Paolo didn't give much away but I wasn't really expecting to play. I was just happy to be part of the squad at Wembley in a cup final, so when I made the team, I was surprised to say the least, but it was a nice way to make my debut.

"It was a bit dounting because you need to know how your team works but I was lucky to have Lee Holmes who played

I played with him at
Derby so I knew what
he was about. I knew
I could just give him
the ball and he would
attack people as he
liked to do. I knew I
didn't want to get round

Town would go on to lose 2-0, conceding at the very start and at the very end of the second half and McEveley believes that the first goal was crucial to the outcome of the tie.






I think I came off and they caught us again on the break.

"It was a disappointing result but it was a good day out. I don't know if I deserved it but I did get a runners-up medal and it would be nice if I could now get a winners medal."










It was the 2008-9 season where, due to financial irregularities, we started with a 30-point deficit in League 2 and ended with the somewhat inevitable relegation out of the Football League. That day at Wembley in April 2009 saw 40,000 Luton fans come out in what was perceived as a sign of defiance against football's authorities. It was very fitting that we managed to lift the trophy after beating Scunthorpe 3-2 after extra time. During that run we saw off three

teams in Walsall, Brighton and Scunthorpe who all competed in a higher tier that season. Swindon will have to be on their mettle tonight against League 2 opposition.

I was impressed with the way Swindon progressed in the last round. This competition allows the manager to shuffle the pack and give a few of the regulars a rest. I think, in that respect, it went very well. I thought the two frontmen who came in, Elaabas and Alose had good games capped by a areat winner from the latter. Each time I've seen Swindon this season they've played some lovely, attacking football. I think the first goal against Plymouth was a fine illustration of this: a patient build-up culminatina in a brilliant cross-field pass from Grant Hall and a great header from Jack Barthram. It's a young squad playing a new way but I think it could prove to be a really successful season and the JPT offers a real chance of silverware.

I have fond memories of my loan spell at Wycombe in the 2000-01 season and particularly the wonderful run to the FA Cup semi-final. I was very close to joining permanently and Adams Park is a ground I have always enjoyed visiting since as an opposition player.

I'm really looking forward to watching two clubs I hold in high regard lock horns tonight. Hopefully both sets of fans get an entertaining game.


