



I'VE tried to enjoy the recent break to be honest and I think the players have too because the lads here have played a lot of football and have trained a lot. After having a string of tough games, sometimes it's good to have time off to mentally refresh and look forward to a very busy few months coming up. good side.



This could work in our favour or they could be slipping into top gear, so we have to have our wits about us and be on our game because we're not going to forget what they've done and the quality they have. After the game on the opening day of the season we were very disappointed that we didn't come away with a point, considering how early it was in the season and how we

had to put a team together. I remember we were sitting in the changing room afterwards and we were gutted not to have got anything, which was a good sign: we knew that, as we go along, we'll progress. A lot of the players there will be the same and we've got to focus on getting the three points. Over the next couple of months there are going to be some really defining games and this is now the period where we've all got to really pull together and drive forward. At times you think to yourself 'we've still got half a season' but it really does fly by now. Once January is out the way, in the blink of an eve, the season will be gone. All of us have to try and be conscious of the fact that there are going to be a lot of hard games and we will need all the support we can get for the players. We need to keep working hard as a club and as fans and pull together to give us a chance to make something of this season.


BOARDROOM UPDATE

MAN OF THE MATCH



Yaser Kasim

THE midfield maestro stepped off the bench to set Town on their way to victory against Coventry City before Christmas, earning him the Man of the Match award. Kasim's stunning, secondhalf volley from the edge of the area brought Swindon level on the day and laid the foundations for Miles Storey to net the winner against the Sky Blues at SN1. Main Match Sponsors, Rug Shack, had the pleasure of presenting Yaser with his bottle of champagne in the Sponsors' Suite post-match.





AFTER their relegation from the Championship last term, Posh are hotly-tipped to make an immediate return to the second tier...

PETERBOROUGH kicked-off 2013/14 at home against the Town, with new signing Britt Assombalonga netting the only goal in a 1-0 win. The victory sparked a run of six straight wins in all competitions which saw them score 23 goals as well as progressing in both the Capital One Cup and the Johnstone's Paint Trophy. Crawley burst the bubble at the end of August, coming away from London Road with a 2-0 success. Posh stayed unbeaten in the league

until the end of October when they went down by a single goal at Colchester United. In the meantime, progress came in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy while a 2-0 defeat at the hands of Premier League side Sunderland ended their run in the Capital One Cup. November saw Darren Ferguson's men lose three consecutive games including a home loss to Stevenage and defeat at fellow promotion-chasers, Brentford. A 3-0 win at

Newport County booked their place in the Area Final of the JPT against Swindon in February while the pre-Christmas win at Bradford remains the last time they have picked up all three points in the league.

They were held to a draw at Kidderminster in the FA Cup Third Round last weekend and were beaten 3-1 at home by Brentford on New Year's Day having lost all three of their league fixtures between Christmas and New Year.

THE PLAYERS PETERBOROUGH UNITED



THE stopper started his career at Aston Villa, graduating from the youth ranks. After a brief loan spell at Lincoln, he made the move to Falkirk. In a four-year stay north of the border, Olejnik would make over 100 league appearances before sealing a switch to Torquay United. After just one season in Devon, he was snapped up by Peterborough in the summer of 2012 and is closing in on 90 appearances for Posh.



THE left full-back is a product of the Centre of Excellence at London Road and penned his first professional deal in 2011. Made his Posh debut towards the end of the 2011/12 campaian in a 2-2 draw with Watford and netted his first senior goal last term. Has featured reaularly in 2013/14 and is now nearing a half-century of appearances for Peterborough. The 19-year old has also earned international honours representing South Africa.



THE commanding centre-half took his first steps in football with Macclesfield Town, graduating into the first team after joining as a trainee. Four-and-ahalf years and over 140 appearances later, he joined Posh on loan at the end of January 2012. After impressing in his loan spell. Brisley made the move to London Road permanent later that summer. Was a regular for Posh in the Championship last term and has 14 appearances to his name this season.



PAYNE araduated from the youth ranks at Gillingham to become a regular at the Priestfield Stadium, making his Gills debut in October 2008. Over 100 league appearances later, he joined Peterborough on loan in January 2013. After impressing during his temporary stint at London Road, Darren Ferguson made the creative midfielder a major transfer target, snapping him up in the summer. Has two league goals to his name this term, both scored against Brentford.




THE experienced midfielder started his career at West Ham United but made his senior bow during a loan spell at Scottish side, Livingston, in August 1999. McCann then had loan spells at Notts County and Cheltenham before moving to Gloucestershire on a permanent deal in 2003. Since then he has played for Barnsley and Scunthorpe before moving to Peterborough in May 2010. The midfielder has also featured regularly for Northern Ireland at international level.



CONVERTED from a winger into a central midfielder, Newell is a product of the youth system at London Road. Made his Posh bow in April 2011 in a home draw with Yeovil Town and has gone on to make nearly 60 appearances for Peterborough in all competitions. After one goal in 33 outings last term, Newell is yet to register from nine appearances this season after recovering from an injury at the start of the campaian.

LITTLE is a graduate of the Academy at Wolverhampton Wanders and would make 32 appearances in the famous Old Gold. In the early part of his career, he had two separate loan stints at Northampton Town, as well as a brief stay at Chesterfield. He then spent time on loan at London Road towards the end of the 2009/10 campaign before making the move permanent that summer and has since racked up over 150 appearances for Posh.



THE 25-year old began his career with Millwall and had loan spells at Crawley and Rushden before making a permanent move to Ebbsfleet in 2007. After just one season he made the switch to Stevenage. During his time with 'Boro, he would form an integral part of the side that won successive promotions before joining Posh at the start of the 2012/13 campaign. A midfielder by trade, Bostwick can also operate at centre-half.




THE attack-minded midfielder started his football life with Berwick before moving to the Scottish Premier League and Dundee United in January 2008. Swanson would go on to make over a century of appearances for the Arabs during his four year spell at Tannadice, with 60 of those coming from the substitutes' bench. Snapped up by Peterborough in the summer of 2012, he is now closing in on 50 league appearances for the Posh.



THE 25-year old began his career at Stockport County, where he graduated from the youth ranks into the first team. He racked up 75 league appearances for the Hatters before moving to Peterborough in the summer of 2009. Now one of the longest-serving members of the current squad, the midfielder has won multiple Player of the Year awards at London Road. He could feature for Posh this afternoon after an injury lay-off.



TOMLIN started out with Rushden and Diamonds, making his senior debut in October 2005. He would score 27 league goals for Rushden, prompting a move to Peterborough in the summer of 2010. Since his move to London Road, the striker has found the net over 30 times in the league including the opening goal at The County Ground when the sides met in December 2010. Has nine goals to his name this term.



A well-known face to Town fans following a successful loan spell in the first half of this season, Ajose is still Swindon's leading scorer this term with ten goals to his name in all competitions including a brace in the derby win over Bristol City. Following his recall to London Road, the former Manchester United trainee started and played nearly an hour of Posh's New Year's Day defeat at the hands of Brentford.

COYR profiles Posh's million-pound man who will be looking to plunder more goals at SN1 this afternoon...

ASSOMBALONGA was born in Zaire, now known as the Democratic Republic of Congo, and moved to London when he was just eight months old. ils journey into professional football began with Watford where he learned his trade I the Academy before making his senior bow in the Hornets' 0-0 draw with Coventry in March 2012. However, just one month beforehand, the striker had spent time on loan at Braintree in the Blue Square Bet Premier, where he had made a memorable debut: a goal and a red card in a 3-3 draw at Luton. He would find the net on a further four occasions in the remaining four matches of his loan spell before he returned to Vicarage Road, Last season, he enjoyed a prolific season

on loan at Southend United. Assombalonga nefted five goals in his opening six games for the Shrimpers. A further seven goals arrived before Christmas where progress was also made in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy; the 21-year old contributed a strike to help see off Dagenham and Redbridge. After a run of 12 goals in 20 matches and, after notching in a league win over Rochdale in November, the frontman would not find the net again until February 2013 when he netted a late winner at Wycombe. He finished the campaign with 16 goals to his name in all competitions with his final goal of the campaign helping the Shrimpers to a 2-0 victory at Aldershot. This prompted Peterborough to part with £1.5 million in the summer to secure his services – a club record fee. It took him just nine minutes to open his account. on the opening day defeat of Swindon back in August and secure a 1-0 win for Posh. He had scored four more goals before the month was over.

After such a magnificent starf.
Assombalonga then endured a rather dry spell, failing to find the net in nine matches as the season moved from September into October. A goal at Exeter in the FA Cup at the start of November sparked another goal glut: nine in his next eight games including a treble against Tranmere in the FA Cup. His last goal came against Bradford before Christmas and he currently leads the Posh scoring charts with 17 goals in all competitions this term.



TOWN headed to London Road on the final day of the 2008/09 campaign with both sides knowing their fate for next season. Swindon however, were not just there to make up the numbers and took the lead through the prolific Simon Cox with 17 minutes played. Peterborough's own goal-machine, Craig Mackail-Smith netted the equaliser five minutes before the break. Town's latest signing spoke to STFC Player shortly after putting pen to paper on his 18-month deal and stated that he will give it his best shot whilst in Wiltshire.

They're all going to be tough


games, but they're all games both sides need to win. I'm sure we'll be working each other out in the first game. It might be quite tense, like a game of chess, and the games might become more hostile as we go along and as we get to know each other, but hopefully we will get the results.


Do you think the league and cup games will be different at all?

Not really. I just think both teams will be desperate to win each time. I don't think either of us will be looking too far ahead, it will be about focusing on each 90 minutes. I think both teams will set up similarly each time, too. We know Peterborough's strengths already and I'm sure they're aware of how we play, so it'll be a case of figuring it out on the day.

Can we read anything into their recent form? They've won just one of their last six games in all competitions...

I'm not so sure. They have strength in depth and it's not worth looking into what they've been





doing, It's all about this particular 90 minutes and what we can do.

It must be nice to return to action at home after two away games over Christmas and the postponement of the Crawley game?

Definitely. The lads have been doing a lot of travelling over the festive period, so let's just hope the rain has died down this week and the game isn't called off again!

The postponement last week must have been frustrating...

Some of the lads were a bit disappointed because it meant we weren't able to make more of New Year's Eve, but that's just part and parcel of life as a footballer. Like you say, if we'd known before the day of the game we might have done New Year a bit differently, but these things happen. You make sacrifices as a footballer and you won't find any of us complaining about it.

So, your season so far: you returned to the side after your initial suspension and have played in a variety of positions since. Mr. Adaptable!

I've played in five positions this season! I'm enjoying it and I'm happy with the way I'm playing. The manager seems to be fairly happy as well, so I'm just looking to take that on into 2014 and keep trying to get better with every game.

You're now a full-time pro at Swindon as opposed to a loanee: do you feel more settled?

Definitely. I've got a place up here now and I feel really happy. I have a contract, which means I know where I'm going to be, which I haven't had in the past. It enables me to simply focus on football. Previously, when I was at Tottenham, I went on loan a couple of times and most of my contracts were short, which makes it difficult to get settled and plan for the future. I spent loan spells at Brentford, Bournemouth and Crawley and it's hard movina from club to club as a youngster. Just when you get to know the lads you're off again back to your parent club or a new club on loan. This time has been different. because obviously I knew some of the lads from last season and most of the others I knew from Tottenham.

When you returned to Tottenham after the end of last season, did you know you'd be coming back?

I didn't know. I went back to Tottenham for a week before the summer break and I just assumed I'd be returning to Spurs for the new season. I didn't have a clue until three days before I signed with Swindon.

Were you happy to return?

Yes, definitely, I like the staff here and I like the way we try to play, so I was delighted to come back.

Did you think about the Play-Offs at all in the summer?

We knew those games were going to be hard and I didn't want the season to end that way, but I get over things pretty quickly. Once it's happened, it's happened, it's happened, there's nothing you can do. You have to move on. Losing on penalties is such a tough way to lose, though, particularly after the lads had done so well to come back into it.

Brentford are up there again and we're lurking behind those play-off spots; how do you see the top six shaping up?

I've been with five or six of these lads for a while now and we've played together for so long we know how we all play. We're a tight unit together; the whole squad is, and that really helps.


So, you mentioned you've played in five positions - we know you like to get forward and have a shot on goal, so will we be seeing more than the two you've registered already?

elements of football which has changed for the better since the 1980s is the condition of pitches on which games are played.

IT would not have been uncommon around this time of year when you took your place on the terraces to look out onto a pitch which resembled a ploughed field marked with distinct white lines.

Even Fraser Digby, in today's Coaches' Corner on page 73, remembers how players had to go to extreme lengths at times to adapt to adverse weather conditions; be it heavy rain, sleet, snow or frozen pitches.

Even First Division clubs like
Newcastle and Arsenal playing in
well-known arenas like St. James's
Park and Highbury were not exempt
from mud-bath pitches and
heavy snow.

With the game and everything around it evolving to an almost unrecognisable stage, STFC's Head Groundsman, Marcus Cassidy, explains how his job role has changed from that of his predecessors 25 years ago.

"The technology, the equipment and even the education is a massive contributing factor to looking after a pitch these days," he said. "I'm still learning everyday now and you have to keep learning because things change so much.

"Working practices have changed


massively. Gone are the days when groundsmen could just go out and roll the pitch non-stop; you have to approach it in a completely different manner."

He continued: "The game is now a lot faster and players are a lot fitter. The value of players has gone up to such an extent now that referees have to worry about player protection which is why a lot of games get called off now - even if they're the same state as they would have been in the 80s."

AS mentioned in Jeremy Newton's last set of programme notes, the Academy shut down from the 21st December. Obviously our Under-18s are still young lads and some of them are living away from home so they got about eight or nine days off over the Christmas period. Fortunately, we've been able to invest (thanks to some money from the LFE) in a heartrate monitor system. We gave all the players a fitness plan to go away with and they have to obviously stick to those fitness plans. We had a look at them when they got back so it's been a break where they could have

a bit of a breather, but also a break where they've still had to do some physical work. Having a bit of equipment like the heart-rate monitors is hugely beneficial for us. Not only is it a great way to make sure that the players work to certain limits, it's a great educational tool for them as well so they can understand what constitutes hard work and what is not so hard - if that makes any sense!" They are also now more aware of what's required of them in certain sessions so it's a great learning curve for everybody.

For us coaching staff, we're in the middle of a very busy

period at the moment because of the audit that will be coming up in March, so there's plenty of paperwork to sift through and plenty of different things to organise. We've had a bit of a break but in that break we've all been getting up to speed on our paperwork and everything that is required from each individual coach for the audit so it's still been a busy period in that respect.

The lads were back in on New Year's Day and we've continued to do our fitness work and training sessions but it's been very difficult with the weather. We've been fortunate that the Next Generation Gym have been able to accommodate us and we've still been able to do some physical work and some football work at the same time without the effects of the weather.

Our next scheduled fixture was at Exeter today but, obviously, that depends on the state of the pitches up at the training ground and the weather over the next few days but fingers crossed the game has gone ahead. Now we're into the New Year the lads have to start recognising that they have to start performing and winning games. Hopefully against a decent footballing side in Exeter, we'll start to turn the corner.



RETRORID

DAVE Wallis takes us back to the 1930s in this edition of Retro Red and two memorable FA Cup encounters...

IN January 1930, we travelled for an away fixture in round three of the FA Cup to face a club two divisions higher than our Division Three (South) status, and before the month of January was out, the cup saw Town play in front of an astounding number of spectators, conjure up an unexpected result and produce an entry into the club record books that still stands today.


Town were paired with an outfit from Old Trafford 84 years ago today.

Manchester United lay 14th in Division One while Town stood 12th in the regionalised Division Three, and the Alan Hansens of the day would no doubt have given us little chance.

But with just under half an hour played, 5ft 5in inside forward Joe Eddleston gave us the lead, a half-time advantage that was doubled by fellow forward Les Roberts in the second period.

And that's the way it stayed.
United might not have been
the global brand they are today
but they were no slouches, and
just maybe the defeat inflicted
by their lowly Wiltshire guests
helped galvanise them into
becoming European champions
and monopolisers of the
footballing world.

The win left Town preparing for round four, and we were handed the chance to complete a humbling of the entire city of Manchester when the velvet bag produced Swindon Town and Manchester City in consecutive balls.

This time we were to play at The County Ground and an obliging own goal from City's Phil McCloy took the tie to a Maine Road replay.

The Manc annihilation was still on then as Town took to the pitch on 29th January.

But not for long.

Tommy Johnson and Eric
Brook both scored for the home
side, but they certainly didn't
steal the glory. That's because
Tommy Tait scored a hat trick
while Bobby Marshall notched

So we had had our day in the sun but ultimately the team from the blue half of Manchester, and who sat second in the Division One table, restored the honour that their red

counterparts had been unable to.

Thankfully, the score is still our record cup defeat, and one that we all hope we never see beaten.

But just as small clubs today hope for a money-spinning tie, the silver lining surely came from the payday that came Town's way that January.


With over 33,000 attending the match at Old Trafford, a mightily impressive 23,697 watched our home draw with City before almost twice as many witnessed the massive capitulation at Maine Road.

Gates of in excess of 100,000 had swelled Town's coffers.

In comparison, just 92,499 watched the final as Arsenal beat Huddersfield 2-0, with the spectacle of the German airship Graf Zeppelin hovering over Wembley.




derby match against Oxford.



THE former Town stopper and current Goalkeeping Coach reminisces about playing in adverse weather conditions in this week's column...

IT'S been funny over Christmas because I've had 10 years out of the game, then I've come back into football again, so at Christmas I've been used to a week off, then nothing, whereas now we're back in. The gaffer gave all the lads Christmas Day off this year then we were travelling away to Brentford for Boxing Day so, in your mind, you know that you have that one day at Christmas then, once that's over, you're thinking about the Boxing Day game and getting yourself prepared. Being a coach, it's very similar to being a player, where you're concentrating on the games. Up until we had the game cancelled, we didn't have a day off over Christmas because you're in working every day either playing games, training or going on long trips away like the one we had to Bradford. The weather recently has been absolutely dreadful but, to be honest, I used to love the wet conditions when I was playing. I did a session with the lads a week or so ago where they would make a save then slide a further ten/ fifteen vards. However, it's so wet that we've gone past that now where the conditions are awful to train in and we've had to find alternative ways to train. This can be difficult but we have not really missed a session which has been good. We've used the 3G pitch at Lydiard Academy and it has been great to use a facility like that because we can get some good work in with the players. Looking back at the Crawley


game which was postponed, I've had people say to me 'you would have played in those conditions'. We probably would have done but the pitch would have been wrecked for the rest of the season! I remember when we were in the Premier League and we played at home on New Year's Day. The pitch was absolutely frozen solid and I had to wear trainers with pimples on the bottom and a pair of padded trousers. In this day and age the match would have been called off, full stop. I remember sometimes out here, we'd have to find out which way we were playing before we went out and the lads who were playing on the

wing in front of the Shrivenham Road Stand or what is now the Don Rogers Stand, would have to wear shoes with rubber pimples underneath - it was that firm whereas on the other side, they could get away with small studs. There is a lot more to consider these days and on New Year's Day it was only going to get worse. Turning attention to this afternoon, Peterborough are a good team and they've got some good players. It will be a difficult test for us but one I think we're capable of overcoming.

AFTER successive draws at Anfield and Hillsborough, Town travelled to Highfield Road looking to extend their unbeaten spell away from home...

WHEN Sky Sports' scheduled live game was postponed, the broadcaster's next port of call was Town's fixture with Coventry City. After a goal-less first half, the home side made the breakthrough with just over 15 minutes left to play. The Sky Blues broke from the edge of their own box and Roy Wegetle was sent clear on the right flank, With Kevin Horlock in his wake, the frontman advanced to the corner of the six yard box before smashing the ball high into the roof of the net past Nicky Hammond. The home side could have doubled their advantage when Peter Ndlovu hit the post with an opportunistic effort then Hammond stood up to deny substitute Micky Quinn. The latter then fed the former but Ndlovu's effort was hacked off the line. With minutes left to play, the Sky pictures were lost with the home side still leading.
