





THE MANAGER

Mark Cooper was named First Team Manager in August 2013 after a spell in temporary charge. He had previously served as Assistant Manager to former incumbent Kevin MacDonald and left his post as manager of AFC Telford United to link up with Town.

Cooper made over 400 appearances as a player in the 1990s and played for a host of league clubs including Birmingham City and Fulham.

In 2004, he made the jump into management with Tamworth. He enjoyed some memorable runs in the FA Cup whilst in charge of Tamworth before he joined Kettering. He repeated his success in the FA Cup with the Poppies and guided them to the Conference North title. In 2009, he was appointed manager of Peterborough United.

Following his departure from London Road, he took the reins at Darlington and guided them to FA Trophy success at Wembley in 2011.








WES FODERINGHAM





OLIVER 'OLLIE' MARTIN **CONMY** 1939-2014

It was with deep regret I learnt of the sad passing of Oliver Conmy, aged 74 years. Ollie passed away late on Sunday night, the 26th January 2014, after a long illness, at home with his loving family by his side.

Ollie, born in Mulrany on 13th November 1939, of course played for Posh and was signed by Manager Gordon Clark in 1964, from Huddersfield Town. He quickly established himself into the team, becoming very popular with the fans. Playing mainly at inside-forward or on the wing, he formed a great partnership with Derek Dougan and Peter Deakin, helping create many goals, especially laying on the pass to Dougan who scored the equaliser against Arsenal in the FA Cup win in 1965.

Ollie, a player who possessed a 'football brain' was a clever little schemer and also a crowd pleaser. For his creativity Ollie was rewarded with five caps for his beloved Republic of Ireland side whilst still appearing for Posh. After eight great years of serving Posh he finally bowed out in 1972 after playing a total of 292 games (plus 12 sub appearanes) in all competitions, whilst sconng 44 times. Ollie then played briefly for Cambridge City whilst working as a Civil Servant.

All at Peterborough United Football Club send their condolences to his dear wife Rosalie, Daughter Lisa and Son Ben, also his brother Paul and sister Noreen. Ollie's oldest brother Francis, who was Ollie's biggest supporter, sadly passed away a few years ago.

There will be no funeral as Ollie's body will be used for medical research. God Bless you 'Ollie' a lovely man and player alike R.I.P.

LIFE IN THE POSH LANE

After disposing of Ilkeston Town followed by a magnificent victory over Ipswich Town (3-1) at London Road, Posh were drawn away to 3rd Division (South) struggler's Swindon Town in Round Two on 10th December 1955, Posh Manager George Swindin was cautious about the tie, stating this would be the hardest of the three games so far, but nevertheless still quite optimistic of a Posh victory. Like the Ipswich game, Swindin ordered a full week's training preceding the tie. A crowd of 20,000 was anticipated, amongst them nearly 8,000 Posh fans were expected to travel on the nine excursion trains running, however large parties of supporters were left on Huntingdon and Helpston stations. Many supporters also travelled on numerous coaches of which several were hired for the day by many work firms.

The Club left by rail to London on Friday afternoon at 2.25pm. Travelling with the team were three reserves, Ellis Stafford, Jack Lindsay and Fred Martin. When the team left from the train there were photographers from the press anxious to take shots of them. On arrival at their London Hotel they also found there were Directors and players


of the present Cup holders Newcastle United, but they could only observe by taking a back seat as again the press photographers were only interested in non-league Peterborough United.

In the afternoon they enjoyed tea at the House of Commons with Peterborough M.P. Mr Harmar Nicholls, who also escorted them on a short tour. During the evening they were all entertained to a West End show at The Prince of Wales Theatre where they were greeted by star comedian Tommy Cooper.

As kick-off approached, Mr Posh (Tom Keeble) led the marching band around the ground building up a great atmosphere. Swindon kicked off facing a strong wind and bright sunshine. Both teams enjoyed quite a lively start with play switching end to end, Posh though let themselves down with wing halves Bernard Shaw and Des Farrow wasting the ball by unusually booting it aimlessly, whilst the forward line wasted the final pass.

Posh were only a shadow of themselves playing too square instead of their usual style of moving the ball forward quickly. However, after 12 minutes and more like the old Posh, full-back Roy Killin broke up







a Swindon attack and sent a pass forward to the deep lying centre-forward Andy Donaldson, who in turn sent a long hard ball down the middle between Swindon defenders George Hunt and George Hudson to the lurking Peterborough inside-right Dennis Emery. The Swindon pair both went for the ball instead of letting their advancing goalkeeper Sam Burton collect it, instead he could only half catch it but then dropped the ball allowing Emery to pounce and hit the ball into the empty net.

Posh continued to surge forward and two minutes later a great shot from right-half Bernard Shaw was tipped round the post by Burton, then Donaldson hit a long shot beating Burton, but Hudson rescued by heading the ball for a corner. George Hair's corner kick was met by Emery whose shot hit the bar.

Swindon too had great chances, first Andy Micklewnght's shot beat Posh keeper Jerry Lowery but left back Killin cleared off his line. Centre-forward Maurice Owen then headed a free kick only inches over the bar, Half-time came with Posh narrowly shading the 45 minutes, but far from their usual cup fighting form.

Swindon came out for the second half on the attack, but without any true conviction and poor finishing, failing to trouble the Posh defenders. Inside-left Bob Gibson came close to increasing the lead but his header struck the bar. Swindon forced more of the attacks, but found difficulty in penetrating a stubborn Posh defence in which Captain Norman Rigby was outstanding as usual.

The onslaught on the Posh goal finally paid dividends for Swindon in the 68th minute, when a through ball from Micklewright found Owen whose shot was deflected by Lowery but he could not prevent the ball going into the net. Posh responded quickly, with Emery almost restoring the lead. Swindon then went all out for the winner but

could not apply the finishing touch as many chances went begging. In the closing minutes, it was Posh who were forcing the issue, but really were fortunate to gain a replay.

This match proved to be one of the most disappointing displays by a Posh team in the FA Cup of the times. This match attracted a crowd of 23,983, the highest gate of the Second Round and even the second highest attendance in the history of Swindon Town.




So the scene was set five days later for the replay on Thursday 15th December 1955, with a 2 p.m. kick-off. Unfortunately for me I missed this game due to school - just not fair! Both teams were unchanged with Donaldson requiring strapping on his badly bruised shoulder and Billy Hails reporting fit from a stye over his eye. Unlike Posh travelling with 8 000 fans to Wilshire, Swindon managed to bring

only 500 supporters, but understandable, after all it was on a Thursday afternoon, but despite the day there was a great crowd of 16.672

The winners of the tie would play at home to Worksop Town. Before the match, the Mayor, Lady Benstead, turned the first sod for the foundations of United's new grandstand. In the official match day programme there was a leaflet containing words of a song for supporters to sing. It was entitled 'The Posh Song' sung to the tune of 'Anchors Aweigh', (not sure who composed it)? Once again, in true tradition, Peterborough United were led onto the pitch by Mr Posh (Tom Keeble).

Straight from the kick-off Posh were constantly on the attack trying to erase the disappointment at Swindon. It took ten minutes for Swindon to mount their first attack, but it led to nothing. Donaldson was unlucky to have a low shot cleared off the line. Posh, with more luck, could have been three goals up, but completely against the run of play, after 21 minutes, Swindon won a free-kick just outside the penalty area. Tony McShane tapped the ball to Micklewright whose shot entered the net through a ruck of players. Posh responded with George Hair twice crossing dangerous balls across the goalmouth, but desperate defending scrambled the ball away. Goalkeeper Burton was in excellent form combined with luck and keeping his side in the cup.

Posh started the second half well on top again and soon forced two comers. After only four minutes, from the second comer, Bernard Shaw pushed the ball forward into the goalmouth and there was deadly Dennis Emery loping in to hit it in the net for the equaliser. The now famous 'London Road Roar' could be heard all around the City — (even from my dassroom desk!) The game was fast and furious in typical cup tie style. Twice Lowery came to our rescue as Swindon came more into the game. Left-back Roy Killin kicked off the line to save a goal from left-winger Roy Johnson.

There were tense moments in both goal mouths as more goals looked likely. Posh had two good appeals for penalties turned down when Hunt appeared to handle, then Hails was floored in the area. Twice Burton brought off great saves from Donaldson's headers. The 90 minutes were up with Posh on top – so extra time now beckoned. With only eight minutes left in extra-time, Swindon won a free kick just outside the box. Right-half Jimmy Cross hit the ball through a growd of players, which then hit the upright of a post only to bounce into the net. Poor Posh

were out of the Cup - what an injustice!

More heartache followed the club, after winning its first Midland League title scoring 137 goals and conceding only 46 with two defeats, once again the club failed to gain Football League membership receiving only eight votes, this after so much optimism.

Oh! Darragh if only we could repay you now with the fantastic following this club once had. A total of 40,655 fans in two Cup ties against Swindon in only the Second Round – and only a non-league club at that!
