Premier League and I have no doubt that he'll do well at this level. It's great that managers like John, having been in the top flight and done well, are still prepared to get their hands dirty in League 1.






THE Red Devils come to Wiltshire after no fixtures in any competition for nearly a month...

crawley's fixture schedule over the past four weeks has been decimated by the recent spell of stormy, wet weather. Since the New Year's Day clash here at SN1 was postponed, the Sussex side have only played three matches in total, with John Gregory's men due to have faced Walsall last weekend. After exiting the FA Cup at the hands of Bristol Rovers, they played out successive 2-2 draws away from home at Coventry and Rotherham respectively.

Against the Sky Blues, they battled back from two goals down to draw level inside the final ten minutes whilst at the New York Stadium, they were denied all three points by an equaliser deep into stoppage time. Despite the lack of match action, Manager John Gregory has been busy off the field, strengthening his squad with a number of ins and outs. Hiram Boateng and Sullay Kaikai have joined on loan from Crystal Palace while experienced

defender Paul Connolly has also penned a deal until the end of the season. Of those who have recently joined Crawley, perhaps the most familiar face to Town fans will be that of striker Rory Fallon who agreed a deal with Reds after his departure from St. Johnstone north of the border. As a result of the recent postponements and, after tonight's encounter, Crawley face an incredible run of nine fixtures during the month of March.


MAN OF THE MATCH




NOW under new management, Crawley will be hoping to push on from their mid-table position this term...

THE 2012/13 campaign saw the Reds in contention for a Play-Off place right up until the final week, eventually finishing in 10th place in the table. A relatively quiet summer on the transfer front was followed up by a 3-2 victory over Coventry City at the Broadfield Stadium on the opening day of the season. A Friday night fixture at Wolves saw the Reds snatch a 90th minute equaliser courtesy of Billy Clarke, before conceding

from a penalty moments later. At the end of August, a brace from Gary Alexander secured an impressive 2-0 win at promotion-chasing Peterborough United. Those three points sparked an unbeaten September, a run in the league that was ended by Port Vale towards the end of October, after two wins and two draws. A run of seven league games without a win was punctuated by an FA Cup win at Hednesford, their first

since a 1-0 win over Bradford in mid-October, before manager Richie Barker was sacked the day after Town's 0-0 draw with the Reds at the end of November. John Gregory took charge at the beginning of December and earned his first point as manager after Gary Alexander's 90th minute strike earned the Reds a point at Preston. Before Christmas, he guided Crawley to a 3-2 victory at high-flying Leyton Orient.

THE stopper started his career at Leyton Orient before joining Exeter City. He became the first goalkeeper to save a penalty at the new Wembley Stadium in the 2007 Conference Play-Off Final before helping the Grecians into the Football League. Jones made 158 appearances for Exeter then joined Peterborough United in January 2011. 
COYR takes a closer look at the boyhood Blade who will be looking to blunt Town's attack this afternoon...




HOLLYWOOD'S finest scriptwriters would struggle to concoct the kind of plot Swindon fans have witnessed this year. Here's a reminder of the ups and downs...

JANUARY

SWINDON started the New Year so strongly that, at one stage, they were the form team in Europe, ahead of Barcelona. Of all the teams across the continent, Town's record of four wins and 16 goals scored, none conceded, was unmatched. The highlight was the 5-0 home drubbing of beleaguered Pompey on New

Year's Day. With Town in the top six, a four-goal salvo for James Collins ensured the Reds stayed in the hunt. Paolo Di Canio, sensing a top-two finish, urged the board to back him in the transfer window. The futures of Chris Martin, Danny Hollands, Oliver Risser and Lee Cox were all unclear, but Darren Ward put pen to paper on a permanent deal. Then the fun began: first,




a 1-1 draw away at Bournemouth and the away dugout smashed, then the club being put up for sale by owner Andrew Black.
When snow hit Witshire, Di Canio did his bit to help clear the pitch, but his future became unclear when Matt Ritchie was sold to promotion rivals, Bournemouth. As January made way for February, a takeover was agreed.

A new era-begins...

FEBRUARY

THE relationship between the new Board and Di Canio is tested early as the Italian sets his sights on three loan players, including midfielders Marlon Pack and Danny Green as well as striker Bradley Wright-Phillips. A deal is believed to have taken place to bring all three to The County Ground. When they don't arrive, the Italian admits he's

considering his future. Deadline day passes and it transpires that the club is under a transfer embargo. Aaron Oakley makes his Wales U21 debut, but, after a 1-1 draw against Hartiepool United, after which Di Canio labels his players 'donkeys', he resigns citing 'broken promises' the day before Town's rescheduled match against Tranmere. Fabrizio Piccareta



takes charge for the game, which Town win 3-1. Despite having no manager, and the takeover still ongoing, Swindon go top of the league. Di Canio returns for some belongings before the club's takeover is complete. New chairman Jed McCrorv's first move is to let Darren Ward and Tommy Miller take temporary charge of the team. "We've been asked to do a job and we will as best we can" says Miller. The new Board are unveiled and Kevin MacDonald is announced as Town's new manager.

"This is a hugely important appointment at a significant moment in Swindon's recent history and we are delighted to appoint a football man of Kevin's calibre as our new manager," says McCrory.

MARCH

MARK Cooper is announced as KMac's new assistant and the pair enjoy a pivotal moment away at Coventry, when a dramatic late Darren Ward winner ensures three points in front of an away following of 3,000. "The way the players reacted was a testimony to how [caretaker-managers] Tommy Miller and Darren Ward had done for them. I thought the two of them were outstanding, as the whole team were," said MacDonald.

Nick Watkins, the club's Chief Executive, stands down. On the pitch, a disappointing draw against Walsall is followed by a defeat at Brentford, despite Town dominating for 70 minutes. The Reds bounce back in front of the Sky cameras away at Yeovil, but are denied a second successive win when Notts County goalkeeper Bartosz Bialkowski has the game of his life. Club legend Fraser Digby returns to the club as goalkeeping coach

and he's followed by incoming loan signings; Massimo Luongo, Nathan Byrne and Dean Parrett join, all from Spurs. However, the new arrivals can't help Town beat Oldham.

APRIL


PROMOTION rivals Doncaster beat Town 1-0 as they continue to stumble towards the Play-Offs. A series of music concerts are announced.

The disappointment on the field continues with successive 2-0 defeats, against MK Dons and Sheffield United but Town return to form against Crewe. After a rousing 4-1 win, it is announced that Lee Power is joining the club. Town then hit three past Stevenage, Aden Flint scoring twice.

On the last day of the season Swindon lose to Scunthorpe, who are relegated. The Robins will face Brentford in the Play-Offs, who, despite earning a penalty in injury time against Doncaster, subsequently miss from the spot and concede at the other end. Game on!

MAY

YOUNG Robins Alex Ferguson, Mark Francis, Aaron Oakley, Louis Thempson and Connor Waldon are all given first-team contracts before the first lea against Brentford, Swindon dominate and take a 1-0 lead through Massimo Luongo. Unfortunately, the same player is involved when the Bees are awarded a late penalty. Brentford convert and celebrate in their dressing room after the final whistle. "We're disappointed but this now makes it a one-off tie come Monday," savs MacDonald, "We're very disappointed to concede a penalty so late on in the game when we felt we maybe had a couple of good shouts for a penalty at the other end. They

(Brentford) will be delighted but we're still in the game and that's the most important thing. We've got to get ourselves re-set and come out fighting on Monday."

And come out fighting we did. An enthralling game at Griffin Park finds Town down to ten men and 3-1 down, but Aden Flint scores a dramatic equaliser to send the travelling Town army into delirium. Unfortunately Miles Storey misses his spot-kick to ensure Brentford make it through to Wembley after a tense shoot out. "Miles showed a lot of character to step up there," said MacDonald. "I am proud of him, but someone had to miss."

Marcus Cassidy wins the award for the League's Groundsman of the Year, but his pitch won't be seeing the likes of Simon Ferry and Tommy Miller again; the duo are among several players to be released by the club. The Thompson brothers extend their Swindon futures.

JUNE

THERE are changes on and off the pitch as Alan McCormack, Gary Hooper and Callum Rice all depart for pastures new, with McCormack joining Brentford, who are quick to react following defeat to Yeovil at Wembley. Aden Flint joins Bristol City.

Town are drawn to face
Torquay in the League Cup
before Wes Foderingham
pens a new deal. "There was
interest in the summer but my
main intention was to sign and
prolong my stay here," said the
stopper. "My priority is to be
playing games and there's no
substitute for that. I'm looking
forward to seeing what the
season holds for us."

Gary Roberts and Paul Bodin both depart, but a glut of incomings begins with the arrivals of Alex Smith and Jack Barthram.

JULY

THE disappointment of the Play-Offs further dissipates with the return of Luongo, which coincides with the arrival of defender Grant Hall, also from Spurs. Winger Tijane Reis also joins, despite interest from a host of admirers.

The annual pre-season win at Swindon Supermarine is followed by further arrivals: Nathan Byrne confirms his permanent switch and club mate Alex Pritchard joins him.

Sangita Shah and Lee Power are confirmed as new Board members.

A 0-0 draw at Devizes is followed by incredible drama at Forest Green, when news filters through of MacDonald's departure as Manager.

The players head to Portugal under Mark Cooper's watchful eye. He's joined by another loan signing, Ryan Mason, before an impressive 1-1 draw with Spurs. Gareth Bale is the star of the show and the Welshman scores on his birthday before later joining Real Madrid. Town lose 3-0 to

Birmingham but Yaser Kasim joins. James Collins signs for Hibernian in Scotland, Simon Ferry moves to Pompey on the south coast. Ryan Harley moves in the other direction and goalkeeper Tyrell Belford joins him. Darren Ward announces his decision to stay.

AUGUST

A long-running saga comes to an end when striker Adam Rooney leaves the club to join Oldham. Swindon's squad has an unknown feel to it, but the team – still led by Cooper – impresses in the opening day despite defeat at promotion-favourites Peterborough.

Swindon register their first win against Torquay and earn their first league points with a 1-0 win against Stevenage before Nile Ranger signs for the club. "I feel that Swindon Town will give me a solid platform to realise my potential and help me from going off the rails," says the striker.


Swindon's passing game comes unstuck at Shrewsbury in a 2-0 defeat but better news follows: Mark Cooper's permanent appointment as manager, as Town pull off an incredible win away at QPR in the League Cup. Ranger bags his first goal. "It's a good result for the club and gives us a chance to earn some money," says a delighted Cooper.



SEPTEMBER

HOT on Ajose's heels is Dany N'Guessan, who joins from Millwall. Paul Caddis leaves for Birmingham. Luongo then joins on a permanent basis. "It's a fantastic statement by the Board," says Cooper.

The players celebrate with a display of total football against Crewe. The visitors are simply demolished. Ryan Mason scores





three and misses a penalty to make it four. "The players, the staff, the supporters were fantastic - hopefully we continue to win people over," says Cooper. "From start to finish they were top-drawer."

Mohamed Elgabas joins. Town show a steelier side away at MK Dons, when they salvage a point despite Byrne receiving a red card. Miles Storey is offered a new deal and Town impress at Molineux but fall to a 3-2 defeat. The same scoreline follows against Bristol City, this time Swindon on the winning side. Ranger nets the winner.

Cooper's men impress again when Chelsea visit in the League Cup. Town miss Ranger's attacking prowess and Chelsea's Premiership class proves too strong. Defeat at Preston follows.

OCTOBER

A month of two halves got off to the best possible start when Kasim put pen to paper on a new deal. A 1-0 win over Tranmere followed and Plymouth were dispatched in the JPT. The highlight, though, came in a 4-0 win over Steve Evans' Rotherham. "I thought we were very, very good today," admitted Cooper. "Some of the football was outstanding again."

Unfortunately, Town were brought back down to earth by Walsall, who were impressive winners at The County Ground and ended Town's unbeaten home league record.

NOVEMBER

MARK Cooper was later nominated for Manager of the Month for his work in November. His side scored 11 goals and won ten points in five games, with wins over Port Vale, Colchester and Carlisle helping Town into seventh place. The 5-2 win over Port Vale had it all, from scintillating play to slapstick defending (from both sides) and even Lee Hughes playing the part of pantomime villain to perfection.

Seven days later, Town were knocked out of the FA Cup by Macclesfield.

In the JPT, Town beat Wycombe while an away win in the league followed at Colchester's expense before Ben Gladwin became Cooper's latest signing.

"I'm delighted that the gaffer's taken a punt on me. I've given up my job now and can start training every day," he said.

The Robins enjoy their first clean sheet in eight games with a gritty performance at Crawley.

DECEMBER


NO sooner had Town beaten

After a disappointing performance in a 1-0 defeat at Sheffield United, Swindon appoint Steve Anderson as the new General Manager before an impressive performance sees off Coventry at the County Ground: Miles Storey notches the winning goal.

After Christmas, an entertaining 3-2 defeat at Brentford sees Town twice take the lead at Griffin Park. A trip to Bradford City draws an action-packed 2013 to a close.














Onnual...

carried well on into today's world.


Back in the 1980s, football

Football fans in the 80s were also


treated to a Roy of the Rovers

ACADEMY Manager Jeremy Newton reviews the latest news from the youth set-up at The County Ground...



WE'RE only halfway through the season but a lot of work has gone on. We've got our Category Three audit in March so all the part-time and full-time staff are working tirelessly in order to make sure we achieve that status. This is something that we all want from the owner and the manager all the way down so we're working had to achieve that. It's a huge requirement. Some parts are good and some parts are not necessary, just in my opinion but it brings good practice and good plus points. All the staff have to evaluate, review, plan and prepare but they've already been doing that for years now, it's just a case of documenting it. A lot of this documentation is repetition but there are some good parts: the reviews every six and twelve

weeks, we've also introduced player packs so each individual player has their own unique pack, which not a lot of other clubs have got. Looking back on 2013, the highlights have been players getting into the First Team. It's been good seeing Louis and Nathan Thompson both starting games. They've been here a long time and Louis has been here since he was 8 so I've seen him come all the way through. Hopefully, 2014 is about the other lads trying to grasp opportunities and trying to force their way into the boss's plans. It's going to be difficult with the competition for places. There are a lot of experienced players in the team as well as some good quality youngsters so it will be difficult to get past them but that's the

challenge for those players. The likes of Matty Jones who is a Second Year and Will Randall, who is still just a First Year, have already been involved. It will be an important time for the Second Years when they come back. They've got three or four months to try and secure that first professional contract and the First Years have to push on as well.







RETRO RED

DAVE Wallis tells the tale of a New Year's Day game from the 1970s that deflated Town's feeling of festive cheer...

IT'S New Year's Day 1977 and we are playing our football in Division Three, which some might need to be reminded, means League 1 today.

The weather's not too good and the match with Brighton at The County Ground looks a bit doubtful. Three pitch inspections take place but match referee Alan Robinson declares the pitch playable and 12,369 take their places to see eleventh-placed Town take on the team one point off the top.

From the moment skipper Colin Prophett skimmed the woodwork in the eighth minute, it was pretty much one-way traffic.

Three minutes later, Kenny Stroud latched onto a cleared John Trollope free-kick to send a 25-yard screamer past Albion 'keeper Peter Grummitt into the roof of the net.

Eight minutes before half time, a Trevor Anderson shot was deflected into the path of Dave Syrett who made no mistake to take us into the break with a two-goal lead.

Town's defence, which partnered Steve Aizlewood alongside Prophett and saw Will Dixon at right-back, was easily coping with whatever Brighton could throw at it

Then, in the 56th minute, an Anderson foray was unceremoniously ended with a challenge that looked inside the box. Instead of awarding a penalty, Robinson indicated a free-kick outside the area, but it made little difference.

Ray McHale, who later joined the Seaguils, stepped up to curl the ball around the wall to give us a three goal lead. Eight minutes after that, McHale stabbed home from far closer range after the ball had been cleared off the Brighton goal-line. 4-0. Then came the moment that defined the afternoon.

With rain and sleet falling incessantly, and with the Town End chanting 'We want five', referee Robinson made the decision that made everything that preceded it, irrelevant.

After Brighton skipper Brian Horton pleaded with the ref, the whistle was blown and the game was abandoned.

"I told Swindon if there were any further rain I would be forced to call it off" explained Waterlooville-based Robinson afterwards.

Town manager Danny Williams was less than impressed: "It was a ridiculous decision. There was still plenty of flow to the game, and at no time did play become dangerous."

Chairman Cecil Green called the decision 'astonishing' and even Brighton manager Alan Mullery described it as a huge slice of luck and admitted he would have been furious if he had been Williams.

The Adver wrote: "If Brighton failed to adapt to the pitch, Swindon mastered if to produce some of their most skilful football of the season."


While us Town supporters rued the start of 1977, Brighton went back to the south coast relieved but, ultimately, it made little difference.

Albion returned for the rearranged match just two games from the end of the season and again we won, this time by two goals to one. Again, McHale scored but by this time, Brighton had already clinched promotion and would finish in second place.

As for Town, we ended where we had been in January: eleventh in the table.

AS the season moves into 2014, First Team Coach Luke Williams looks back on the first half of the 2013/14 campaign...

THERE have obviously been ups and downs so far this season but I think we've learnt a lot and the players have learnt a lot. We're trying to fine-tune what's the best way for us to play and be successful. The highlights have to be QPR in the League Cup - that was fantastic. 
at doing certain things."

TOWN'S final match of an historic 1993 would see them earn a point in South Yorkshire...

THE visitors made the perfect start: John Moncur's cross was flicked across goal where Andy Mutch arrived to prod home the opening goal and give Swindon the lead. Wednesday levelled just two minutes later when Chris Waddle's neat pass was volleyed across the six-yard box for Mark Bright to tuck home from close range. Town regained the lead when Terry Fenwick picked up the ball inside his own half and played an inchperfect ball over the top for Craia Maskell. The striker raced onto the pass and brought it under his spell before drilling an effort into the far corner of the net. The home side eaualised in controversial fashion. Gordon Watson's challenge on Fraser Digby left the Town 'keeper clutching his shoulder on the turf. Play was allowed to continue and, after blocking an initial effort, the Swindon back line were powerless to stop Watson turning home from six yards. Digby trudged from the field with physic Kevin Morris bracing his shoulder and his replacement Nicky Hammond was soon picking the ball out of the net. Town couldn't clear the danger property and, when the ball was recycled, Watson was on hand to sweep Wednesday in front. In the 90th minute, Martin Ling's driving run from midfield picked out Mutch on the left. The striker's ball in was met by Maskell who snatched a point for Swindon with a diving header.


A new year means a new start and I'm sure 2014 will prove quieter for all involved with Swindon Town than its predecessor.
