# Help Ellis' Daddy raise £100,000 to find a cure for Ellis

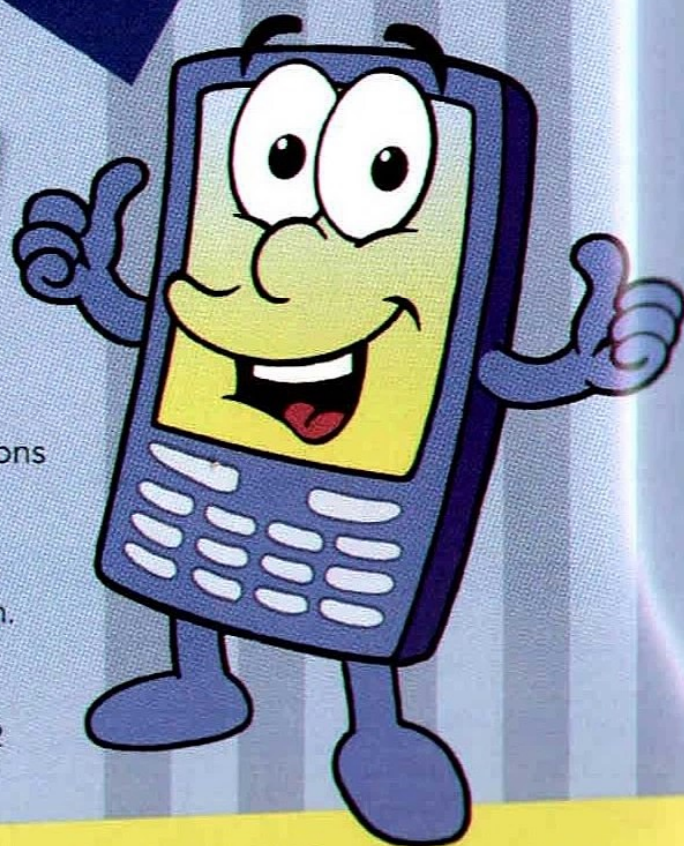

# The Manager

**G**ood afternoon ladies and gentlemen, and welcome back to Ashton Gate for today's Sky Bet League One match against Swindon Town.

I extend that welcome to Mark Cooper, his Swindon staff and players for their visit to Bristol this afternoon.

It's great to be going into the match on the back of three straight wins, including back-to-back victories on the road, but it all starting with the 2-1 home win against Gillingham secured through superb goals from Sam Baldock and Simon Gillett.

That took us out of the relegation zone and we've moved away from the bottom four steadily ever since.

We showed real character and resilience at Shrewsbury and Peterborough – but for very different reasons.

At Shrewsbury we dominated for much of the first half and were unlucky to be pegged

back just before half-time.

We knew it would be a tough game and, after getting our noses in front again through an own goal, Shrewsbury hit back once more.

But Joe Bryan's headed goal sealed the victory as, this time, we kept them at bay for all three points.

Our start at Peterborough was tremendous and we could have scored four goals in the opening 15 minutes. Instead we had two goals – both scored by Sam, to take him to 20 for the campaign.

I'm delighted for him because that's the milestone which strikers are often acclaimed for. His next goalscoring target must be to go on and win the Golden Boot in League One, which he is certainly capable of achieving.

Unfortunately we were then reduced to ten men and had to play the next 70 minutes with our backs to the wall.

But, to a man, the team defended with discipline and remained organised under a great deal of pressure at times.

Behind the outfield players, Frank Fielding had a good game, making two great saves towards the end of the game.

I'm delighted for Frank; since I've been here we haven't had a goalkeeping performance that has won us a game. He didn't quite win it on his own, because everyone worked their socks off, but when he pulls one out of the top corner it gives everyone a lift.

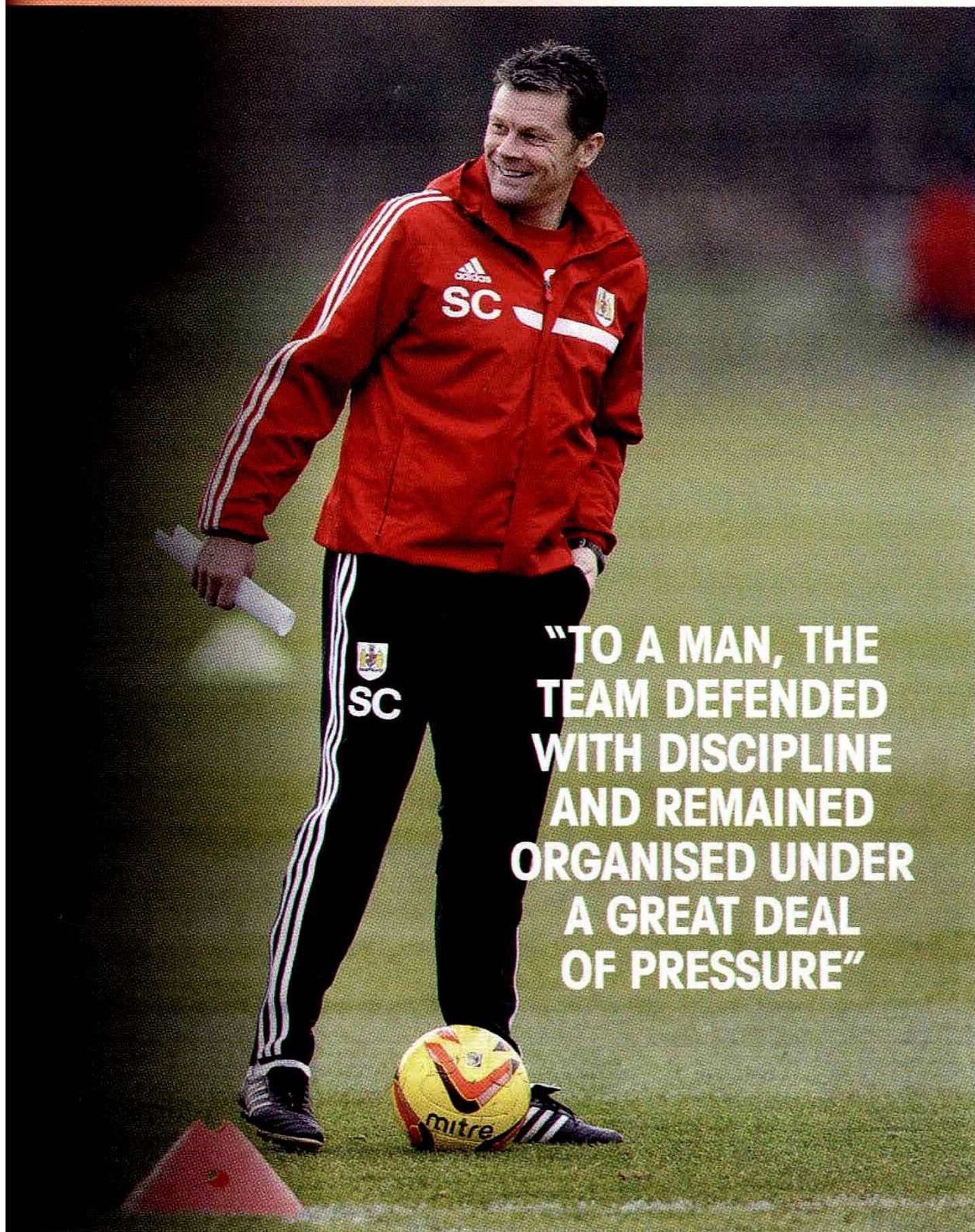
It's important now that we don't rest on our laurels and instead build on the terrific start we've had to March so far.

Today's West Country derby with Swindon will offer us another test, and I'm sure the atmosphere inside Ashton Gate will be cranked right up. If it's anything like the support we've enjoyed on the road recently, it can only inspire the players to maintain their recent levels of performance.

The victories on the road at Shrewsbury Town and Peterborough United were impressive in equal measure.

The players showed real battling characters to keep getting their noses in front at Shrewsbury to record a much-needed 3-2 win.

They were required to dig in again days later in Peterborough, playing for the majority of the game with ten men.

It sets up this afternoon's game with Swindon rather nicely, and we're anticipating a big crowd inside Ashton Gate.

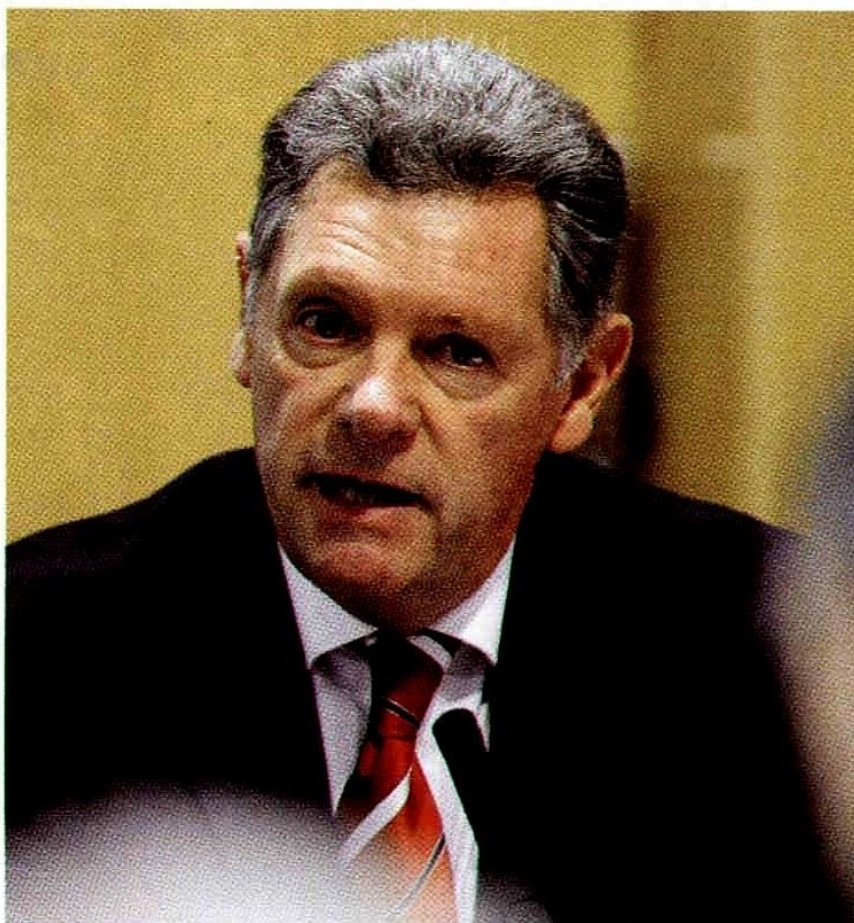
More than 2,000 away fans will provide a noisy backdrop in the Wedlock Stand, but I'm sure our supporters will respond in kind.

As I mentioned in my last programme notes, a lot of work is being put into the planning for 2014/15 season tickets, given all the redevelopment work that will impact upon supporters in all four stands.

In the meantime, please get behind the players once more this afternoon. The number of away supporters in recent weeks has been tremendous and another great atmosphere is sure to help again today.

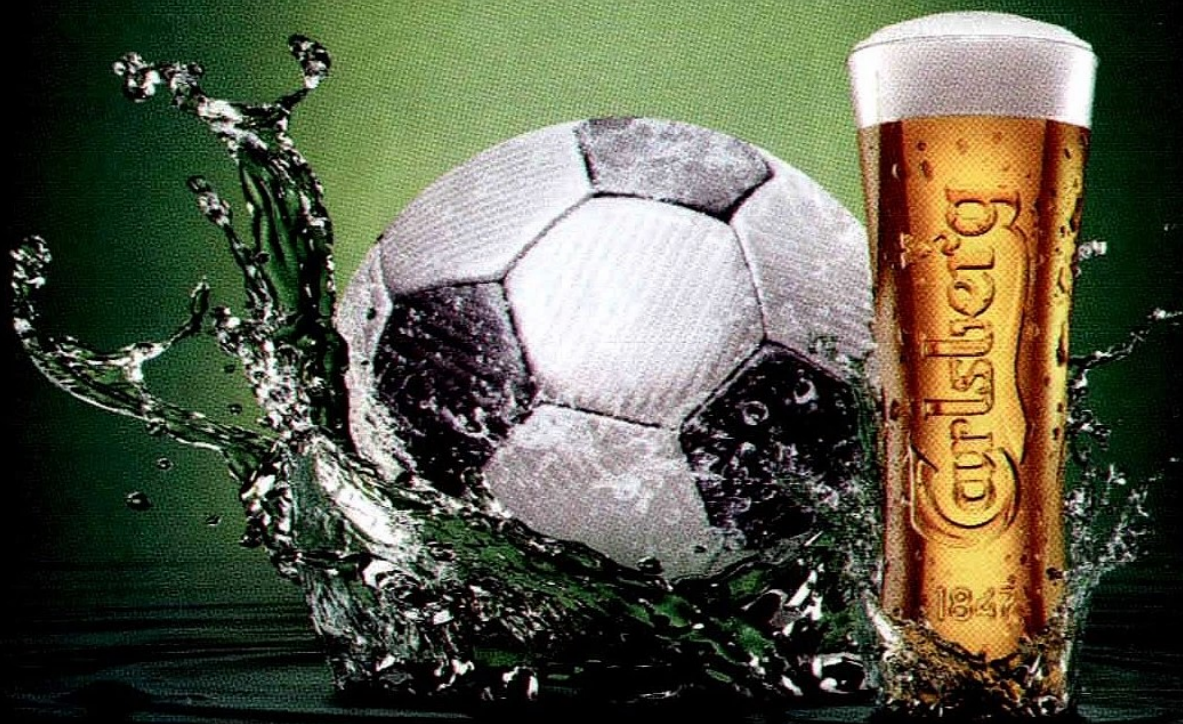

Former Swindon centre-half Flint will be denied a reunion with his former club due to a knee injury, sustained in the 3-2 win over Shrewsbury Town.

Flint dislocated his kneecap and will be further assessed in the next fortnight when the swelling subsides.

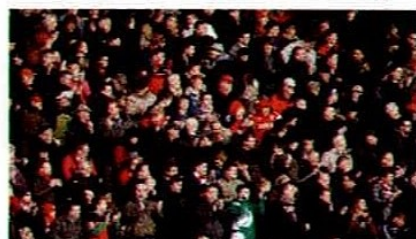
El-Abd is ruled out through

suspension after being red-carded in the midweek 2-1 win at Peterborough United.

The former Brighton & Hove Albion defender is beginning a three-match ban after being dismissed for an off-the-ball incident involving Britt Assombalonga.

El-Abd will also miss the away trip to Colchester United (March 22nd) and the home game with Port Vale on March 25th.

# BRISTOL RUGBY WELCOME NEW FACES

**L**eeds Carnegie scrum half Craig Hampson, Hurricanes back-rower Jack Lam and talented Ospreys fly half Matthew Morgan were among seven new faces who signed deals for Bristol Rugby in March.

Andy Robinson bolstered his squad ahead of the 2014/15 campaign with a host of fresh recruits as planning for the first season at Ashton Gate Stadium begins to take shape.

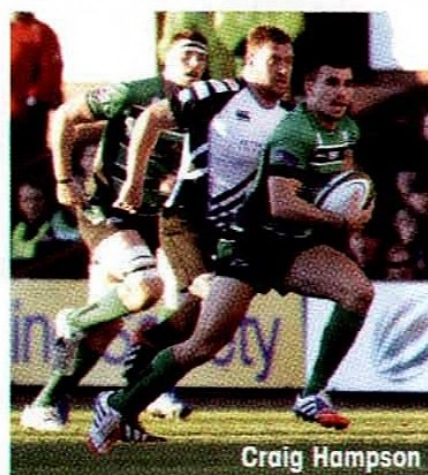
Carnegie's Hampson, one of the most consistent players in the Greene King IPA Championship, is the second scrum half signing, following the announcement of Wales international Dwayne Peel.

Lam – a bulldozing Samoan international with a wealth of Super Rugby experience – can play at either openside or blindside and promises to be a formidable addition to the back row.

Touted as a future Wales fly half, 21-year-old Morgan will link up with his former mentor and current Bristol first team coach, Sean Holley, when the Ospreys man makes the switch to the West Country in the summer.

Leinster duo Darren Hudson and Jack O'Connell, a winger and prop respectively, have put pen to paper on two-year deals. The pair, who graduated through the Dublin province's esteemed Academy, are highly rated and have progressed through the international youth ranks.

Max Crumpton – a 20-year-old hooker from Harlequins – will provide competition for Ross Johnston. A former Plymouth Albion man,

Crumpton has represented England at Under-18 and Under-20 level.

Nick Koster agreed a two-year permanent deal having been on loan at the club from Bath for the duration of the 2013/14 campaign. In a superb run of form, the South African has scored three tries in his last three outings for the club.

Director of Rugby Andy Robinson commented on his new arrivals: "We're continuing to build our squad ahead of the 2014/15 campaign. The signings that the club announced are the right blend of youth and experience – we're striving to find the balance that benefits Bristol Rugby going forward."

"Of course, our immediate focus is on the remainder of the season and achieving a place in the Championship top four. Our players and coaching staff are working hard to secure that goal and we'll keep developing our game and improving, both individually and as a collective."

**3** City fly out of the blocks and take an early lead against hosts chasing automatic promotion. Jay Emmanuel-Thomas' diagonal pass finds **Sam Baldock** wide on the right, who runs at Gary Sawyer before dispatching a low shot inside the near post.

**12** Orient leave themselves a mountain to climb as **Tyrone Barnett's** first City goal doubles the lead inside 12 minutes, climbing highest to power home Marlon Pack's inswinging corner.

**25** Confidence is flowing through the visiting team, who threaten a third goal when Greg Cunningham surges into the box and looks like converting Baldock's first-time pass at the end of a fine move only to mistime his shot.

**44** The Londoners outline their promotion credentials with a timely response just before the break, as Dean Cox's powerful 25-yard drive is spilled by Simon Moore and **Kevin Lisbie** pounces to halve the deficit.

**70** Pushing hard for an equaliser, Lisbie somehow smashes his shot against the post from close range after Moore is put under pressure and drops a high ball at the striker's feet.

**76** Having stayed resilient at the other end, City strike gold with the killer third goal. **Aden Flint** stays forward following a set-piece and duly outjumps Orient keeper Shwan Jalal to meet Cunningham's floated cross with a lowering header.

**85** Desperate to set up a dramatic finish, the hosts throw caution to the wind. The lively Cox drags one wide before connecting sweetly with a curling effort which just eludes the angle of post and bar.

**13** City might be a little sluggish coming out of the blocks, playing their seventh game in 22 days, but still take an early lead. Marion Pack's raking pass out to the wing finds **Sam Baldock**, whose cross from a seemingly impossible angle somehow finds the net via the far post.

**19** A well-taken equaliser soon has the visitors back on level terms, as James Wallace's low cross is taken in his stride by **Jake Cassidy**, whose first touch takes him away from Aden Flint and second finds the roof of the net from a tight angle.

**36** Tranmere spurn a glorious chance to take the lead as Matthew Kennedy's cross from the right is flicked on by Cassidy into the path of top scorer Ryan Lowe, who can only prod the bouncing ball over the bar from two yards.

**78** With chances at a premium, the Robins look to have snatched victory through an unlikely source. Baldock's surge down the right produces an inviting cross to the back post for **Derrick Williams** to head home his first senior goal from close range.

**80** However, City cannot hang on as **Jason Koumas** produces a moment of magic to even things up again. Stepping on to Steve Jennings' lay-off, the midfielder curls an inch-perfect shot into the top corner from 25 yards.

**90** With time running out, Lowe sets his sights on a winner. Picking the ball up on the left flank, the striker runs at Karleigh Osborne and cuts inside before letting fly from the corner of the penalty area with a placed shot which is only just off target.

# FADING SWINDON LOOK HAPPIER ON THE ROAD

Swindon Town boss Mark Cooper may be happier than you would expect to make the short journey to Ashton Gate this afternoon.

His play-off hunting Town side have picked up just one point from a possible nine on offer in their previous three home games.

Wolves thrashed Cooper's men 4-1 on Tuesday night, three days after they slipped to a narrow 2-1 defeat against MK Dons – in which Sam Baldock's brother, George, supplied the winner in stoppage time.

Town have found 2014 hard-going so far, recording just three victories, while surrendering their play-off spot at the same time.

Their form has stuttered, especially at the County Ground, allowing Rotherham United and Preston North End to race clear and consequently cement their place in the top six of League One at their expense.

Former City youngster Ryan Harley was on hand to open the scoring for Town in their last away fixture, at Crewe Alexandra, before the

hosts equalised 13 minutes from time to leave each side with a point apiece.

Prior to that, Town lost out to a brace of penalty kicks from Leyton Orient's resident Bristolian Lloyd James.

Midfielders Yasser Kasim and Massimo Luongo both graduated from the Tottenham Hotspur youth setup, while injured striker and nine-goal top scorer Nile Ranger was formerly of Newcastle United.

Striker Ranger has been ruled out until the end of the season with a hamstring tear and Town boss Cooper has since labelled him 'the best number nine in the league' as a measure of his importance to the team.

Town come into the fixture currently in a bit of a rut but they have proved more than capable of coming up with the goods on the road.

They thrashed Rotherham 4-0 back in October and shocked star-studded QPR in the Capital One Cup before losing out to Chelsea in the next round.

## The Manager

**Mark Cooper** made over 450 appearances as a player for an array of clubs in the lower echelons of the Football League.

Whilst at non-league Tamworth in 2004 he was handed a player-manager position and his adventure at the helm began.

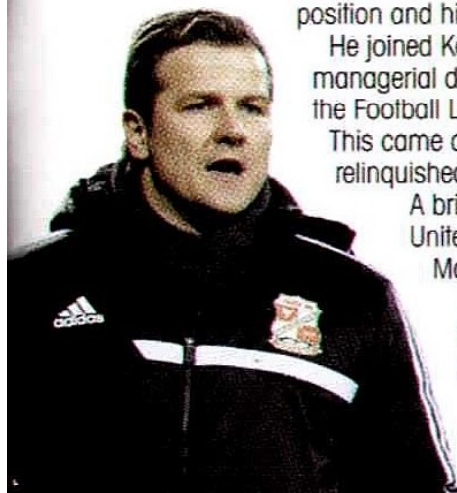
He joined Kettering Town in 2007 and predominantly concentrated on his managerial duties, but in 2009 he gained the chance of plying his trade in the Football League.

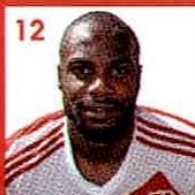

## Ones To Watch

### MASSIMO LUONGO

Australian midfielder Luongo arrived in England as a teenager in 2011, signing for Tottenham Hotspur after impressing on trial. His only appearance in the first team at White Hart Lane proved one to forget, as the youngster missed the decisive spot-kick in an epic penalty shoot-out defeat to Stoke City in the 2011/12 Carling Cup. The following season he agreed a year-long loan deal at Ipswich Town, then managed by Paul Jewell. But a poor start to the campaign saw Jewell replaced by Mick McCarthy, who opted to terminate the arrangement. Last summer saw the 21-year-old complete another loan switch, this time to Swindon. Such was his impact in the opening weeks of the season, the Robins opted to make the deal permanent and Luongo has continued to impress with his all-action style, chipping in with six goals from midfield.

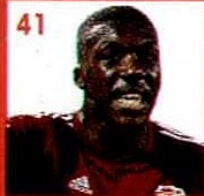

Only recently back from three weeks on the sidelines, it was no surprise to see Swindon's form dip in that time. Pritchard's nominations for best player in his division and best young player across all three levels at the Football League awards are perhaps the finest indicators of his individual promise.

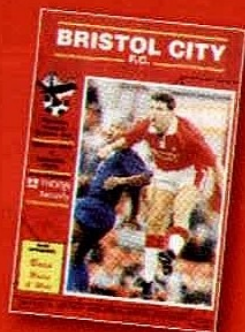

# THINGS LOOKING UP AT THE GATE



Sam Baldock reached 20 goals for the season in all competitions at Peterborough

## ● TOP OF THE SHOP

Sam Baldock's brace of goals at Peterborough United makes him the top scorer in League One this season. The City captain now has 18, one ahead of Posh's Britt Assombalonga, who couldn't add to his total against an inspired Frank Fielding on Tuesday night. League One is proof that you don't need to be in a top team to score goals, with three of the top four scorers (Baldock, Tranmere Rovers' Ryan Lowe and Coventry City's Callum Wilson) at teams in the bottom half of the table.

## ● WHAT A DIFFERENCE A WEEK MAKES...

Wind the clock back seven days and Bristol City had the fewest number of away wins in this division. Six hundred miles and victories at Shrewsbury Town and Peterborough United later, City are now in the top ten teams away from home across the division. Steve Cotterill's men have now collected 19 points on the road, so are some way behind Leyton Orient and Preston North End on 39. Spare a thought for Notts County fans though, who've seen their team gather just eight away points all season.

## ● THE JOY OF 15TH

Bristol City's fantastic week has taken them to their highest league position since August 12th 2013. There had only been two league games played at that point, and City fans were smarting after seeing their side lose 5-4 at Coventry City. Now,

34 league games later, City are back up to 15th, having hit rock bottom on three weekends during the winter.

## ● WINNING STREAK

November 2011 was the last time City managed three wins on the trot, until now. The early days of Derek McInnes' reign saw victories against Burnley, Millwall and Southampton. Now, after Gillingham, Shrewsbury Town and Peterborough United, Bristol City are at least in the majority in League One: 14 of the 24 teams have won three league games on the spin this season. Wolverhampton Wanderers are currently on the best run of all – they'll make it ten in a row if they pick up all three points against Shrewsbury today.

## ● SAFETY IN NUMBERS

No matter what results are like on the pitch, City fans can certainly give themselves a pat on the back for their performance off it. More than 208,000 have attended games here at Ashton Gate this season, that's an average of just over 11,500. It puts the club fourth in League One, behind Bradford City, Sheffield United and Wolverhampton Wanderers. The unfortunate situation at Coventry City is illustrated by their position – bottom, with an average home attendance of around 2,300.

# FAN POWER IS KEY FOR FLINT

Conspicuous by his absence this afternoon, Aden Flint is no stranger to a frosty reception having returned to the County Ground six months ago. Now the defender is hoping a bumper home crowd can turn the tables on his former club and inspire City to a fourth straight win on derby day...

**H**ow does the mood in the camp now compare to a fortnight ago?

Obviously the three wins have made a big difference and given everyone confidence going into today's game. Hopefully it can spur us on to get three more important points.

**How are you finding working with Steve Cotterill?**

I'm enjoying it. He's fully committed in what he does on the training ground and you can tell he loves football. He can be level headed and calm but at the same time when the boys need a rollicking, he's not afraid to do that – but that's part and parcel of it.

**Is he a bit more involved in and around the players as well?**

Yes, that's probably fair. He likes to get involved in the banter with the lads, so he likes a laugh and a joke at the right time, but on the training ground it's down to business and he's big on the organisation of the team.

**Has that been the big change in training?**

We've worked a lot on what we're going to do with the ball and what we intend to do in each match in terms of a game plan and formation. Obviously there are set-pieces as well, so we work pretty hard every day trying to rectify the problems we get and I enjoy that.

**How would you assess your own game since joining the club?**

I think my standards have picked up. I've got a bit more confidence than at the beginning of the season when I wasn't playing my best football, but the gaffer has been encouraging and had a few quiet words in my ear. He's filled me with the confidence I need.

**Does that confidence come with time as well? It can often be the case with new signings...**

Yes, I think so. When I first came in it was difficult because I didn't know anyone, whereas now I'm getting used to other people's style of play and I can read their body language a bit easier. It's taken a bit too long for my liking – it should've happened a couple of months ago and that could've helped us in the long run. But I feel like I'm getting there now at least.

**For much of this season you have been the senior figure at the back – how has that changed with the arrival of Adam El-Abd alongside you?**

It has changed things, but not in terms of seniority because we all have to share that role of organising each other as a defensive unit. We all like to be vocal and that's how it needs to be. It doesn't matter how old you are, it's about sharing the right information and advice.

Aden was signed for Swindon back in 2011 by ex-Bristol City manager Danny Wilson.

**But you can't put a price on his experience given the position the team have been in for so long...**

It's always nice playing with people who have plenty of experience in your team. I don't know how many games he's played exactly but I know it's a lot! Then there's people like Wade Elliott, who has played over 700 games, which is a help to all of the boys because he brings a calming influence – maybe that's what we've needed given the position we're in.

**It's only one defeat in the last eight at Ashton Gate. How important is the home form now?**

It's a key factor. If we can keep winning games with the fans behind us, it makes it very difficult for teams to come and beat us. We're pleased that form has picked up but we need it to continue.

**The manager speaks a lot in the media about the influence of the home support. Is that something he discusses with the players as well?**

He has spoken to us about the fans. They're so passionate about football around here and they love coming to watch us. Obviously if the results are not going our way then they're going to be unhappy about it, and they've got every right. But when they do get behind us it's a massive bonus that can spur us on like a twelfth man, and we really need that right now.

**Do you feel like you are getting them more and more on side? It all comes with results I suppose...**

Definitely. As you say, the form has picked up at home and we've just got to keep that going to keep them behind us for the rest of the season. We need them.

**What are your memories of going back to Swindon earlier in the season?**

Obviously the result was not what we wanted. My reception was hostile because of what happened in the summer, which is part and parcel of leaving a club to join their local rivals. It was always going to happen, but I will always be thankful to Swindon for giving me my chance in the Football League. At least I managed to score, which softened the blow of the defeat a little bit, but it would be nice to turn the result in our favour this time.

**Is the rivalry bigger than you thought it was?**

I didn't realise it was this big. When I was at Swindon I played against Bristol City in the Capital One Cup and I didn't realise it was such a rivalry then, but obviously it was a near sell-out at the County Ground in September and you could tell what it meant to everyone, so I'm looking forward to the game today.

**Looking back, would you react in the same way after your goal, not celebrating?**

Probably, yes. It's just a mark of respect. I'm thankful to them for believing in me when I was still playing non-league so it's the least I can do. I'm happier that I've scored a couple more since, of course, but I'd rather not score any goals and for us to be winning. I'd rather keep a clean sheet and we've not had enough of those this season.

**Is that the team's next big target?**

Yes, of course. We need clean sheets. We're always going to score goals with the strike force we've got and the midfielders working with them. It's just down to everyone to be more solid as a unit and more compact to keep more clean sheets.

**One recent feature of your game, before the injury, was being given the licence to stay forward after set-pieces with a view to getting on the end of a possible second phase. Does that increase your threat?**

I think so, but it's always something I've tried to do when I've seen the chance. If you take my goal at Leyton Orient, I've probably outjumped the keeper by a couple of feet and he's had his arms outstretched as well. I enjoy getting myself in the box from corners and free kicks so hopefully I can get a few more goals, but clean sheets are the priority right now. It would be disappointing if I didn't get half a chance every game given my size, but it's about getting in the right place at the right time. Like I said, I'd rather other people were getting the goals and we were winning games.

**Are set-pieces at the other end something the team has been working on really hard to put right at the moment?**

We work on them two times a week and it's something we need to address. The last home game against Gillingham was another one conceded from a set-piece,

which disappointed us all. We're working really hard to eradicate all the issues and problems in that department because we want to make it as difficult as we can for teams to score.

**Is it something that's actually quite hard to plan for? Surely on the training ground everyone knows what's coming, whereas it's a bit different in a game...**

We try and practice what we think the other teams are going to do on corners, but you can never guarantee what they will do. In your mind you know what they've done in the game before, but you also know they can change it up at any time. You've just got to stay with your man and make sure he doesn't score – if everyone does that, you're always going to clear the ball.

**Overall, if you take the whole season into context, do you feel like things are improving?**

There have been slight improvements. If you ask anyone here, I don't think any of the boys would say we haven't improved since the beginning of the season, but we're still not in the position we want to be in. We've just got to keep working hard and plugging away and hopefully get as far away from the relegation zone as we can. We had a slight setback against Sheffield United – every player was off their game that day for whatever reason – but we bounced back from it quickly and we've just got to keep going now.

**B**ristol City Community Trust offers a wide range of projects and programmes to people of all ages, abilities, races and genders throughout the city of Bristol on a daily basis.

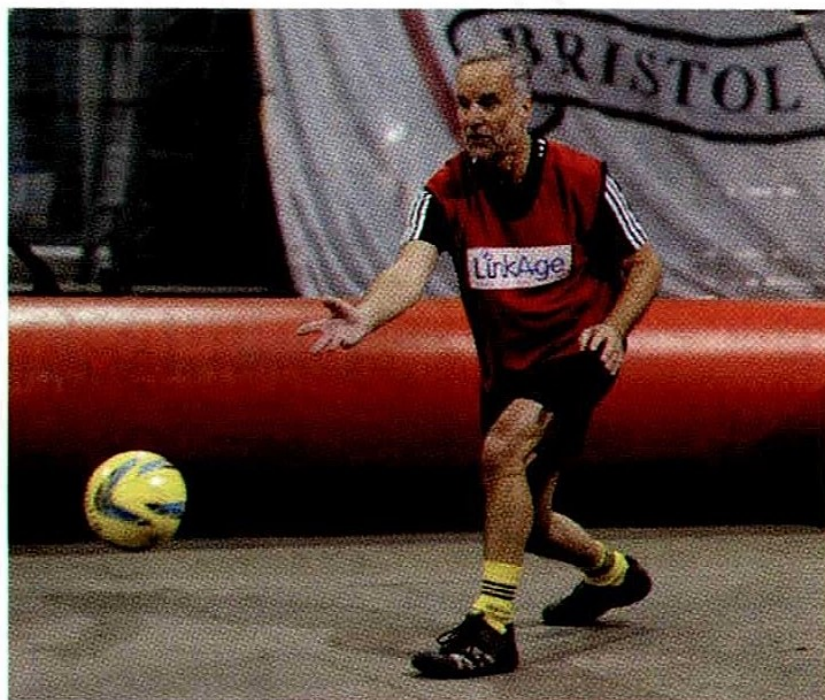
One of the most-expanding and popular programmes we offer is our Over-55s Walking Football sessions.

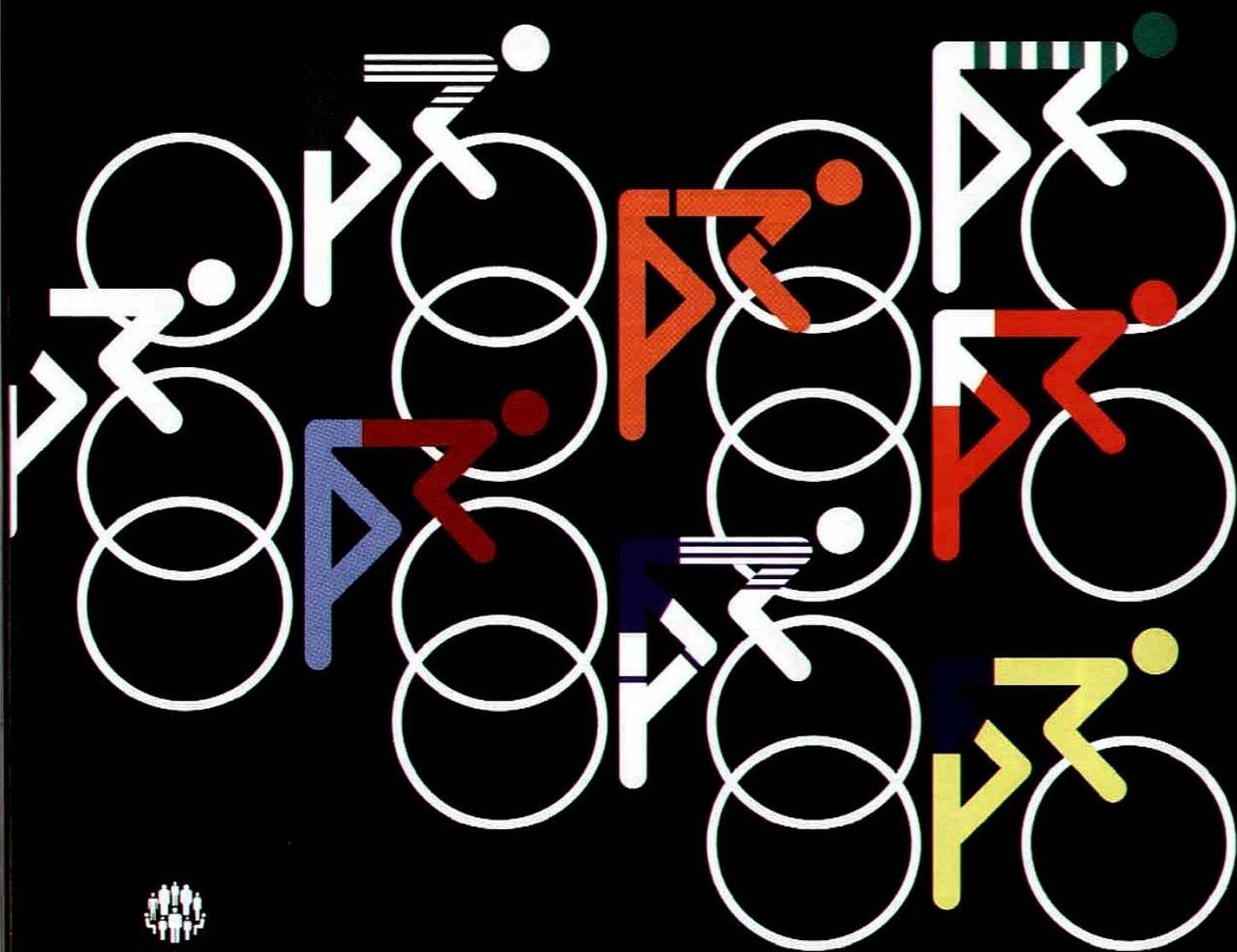

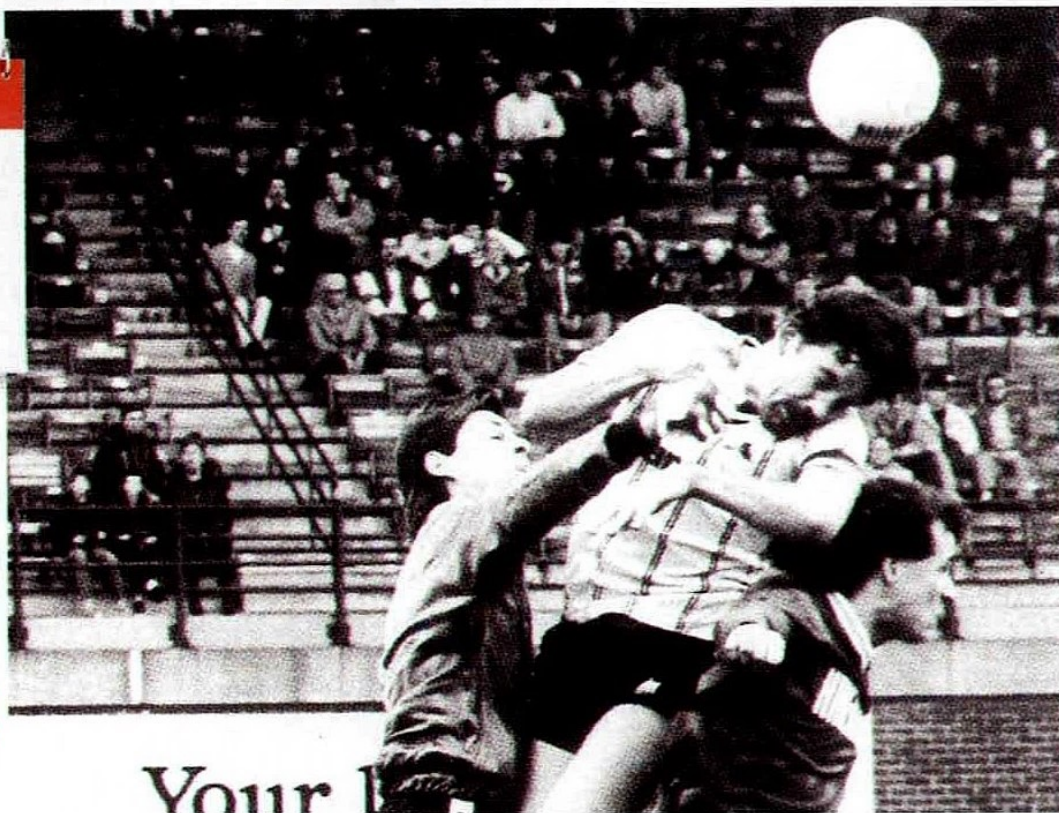

**C**ity Under-21s secured an impressive 5-2 victory over Brighton & Hove Albion at the club's Failand training ground this afternoon.

Mark O'Connor's team went into the break 1-0 ahead after Tyrone Barnett's close-range finish.

Barnett stepped up confidently but his strike was the perfect height for Wray who made amends by getting a strong hand to deny the on-loan Peterborough United striker, before Kelly fired the rebound over the bar.

Not to be denied, Barnett struck the opener just a minute before the interval, tapping in from close range after Bryan's shot was parried.

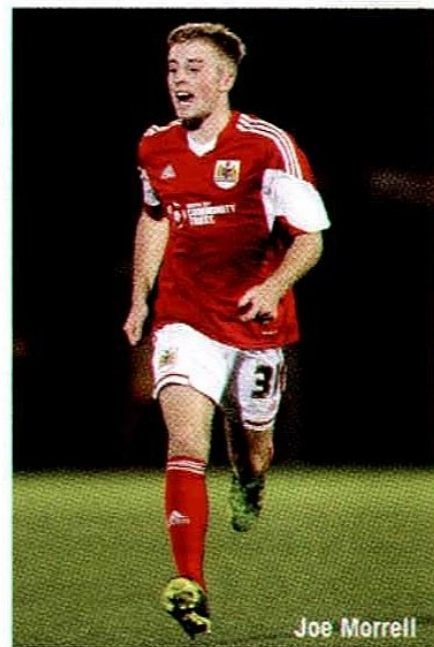
In the 49th minute the Robins' lead was doubled after Morrell saw his low strike from ten yards crash off the inside of the post and over the line.

The Seagulls responded with a goal of their own just two minutes later, as Muitt cut inside from the left wing and saw his right-footed shot nestle into the far corner.

# NO DONKEYS BUT SOME KICK! LEEDS '74 REUNION AND CELEBRATION

**T**he brief highlights which survive of the 1-0 win at Elland Road are a powerful record of a great historic City performance.

The newly-discovered 24 minutes extended highlights of the 1-1 draw at Ashton Gate show us longer periods of play.

City were a balanced team and strong in all departments. The defence conceded just once over the two games – and only to a wonder strike from Billy Bremner.

City bossed much of the midfield and both strikers got on the scoresheet.

At the reunion, defender Brian Drysdale emphasised the great togetherness amongst the players. "We played for one another," he said.

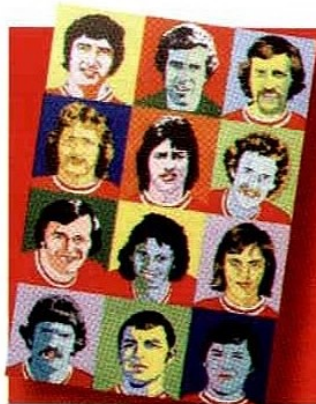
It is striking that five of that team are in the top ten

of all-time City appearances – Trevor Tainton is third after Louis Carey and John Atyeo, Tom Ritchie is fifth, Gerry Sweeney sixth, Gerry Gow eighth and Geoff Merrick ninth.

Ernie Hunt's sole season with us was in 1973/74; he was making a rare return to Ashton Gate.

The audience enjoyed seeing a video of his famous donkey kick goal for Coventry City against Everton three seasons earlier. It was the first official goal-of-the-season but later banned – see <https://tinyurl.com/o2m4n6b>.

# A CAUSE TO CELEBRATE

**S**ince the war the Football Association had published its own magazine, The Football Association Bulletin, which kept the soccer supporter abreast of what was going on.

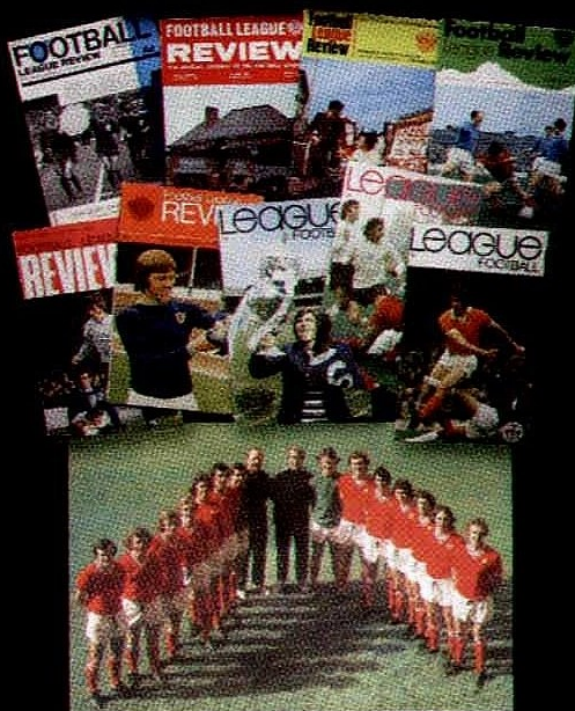
But it wasn't until the national team were crowned World Champions that the Football League could boast a similar product.

From August 1966 until December 1974 **The Football League Review** became a welcomed edition to the plain and staid matchday programme, being inserted into the centre of as many as 73 club programmes at its height. And it was free!

Those early editions were nothing like the polished item it was to become at the turn of the decade but it still remained a topical publication and a vehicle for League secretary Alan Hardaker to get his fervent views across or for League President Len Shipman to assure fans his organisation was on top of all agendas.

Contributors came from names that would soon become synonymous with its eight-and-a-half year run. Editor Harry Brown was the League's first Public Relations Officer; Bob Baldwin (assistant editor) would later take over, while Walter Pilkington was the programme's statistician.

Completing the line-up was the imagination of photographer Peter Robinson. His team pictures broke the mould of the mundane formation of six players at the back and five seated/kneeling at the front. First Division Arsenal's entire first team of 15 players from 1969 stood under the crossbar at the Clock End at Highbury and in the same year Fourth Division Hartlepool United's professionals gathered in a circular group on the terraces of their Victoria Ground being two examples of his imagination.

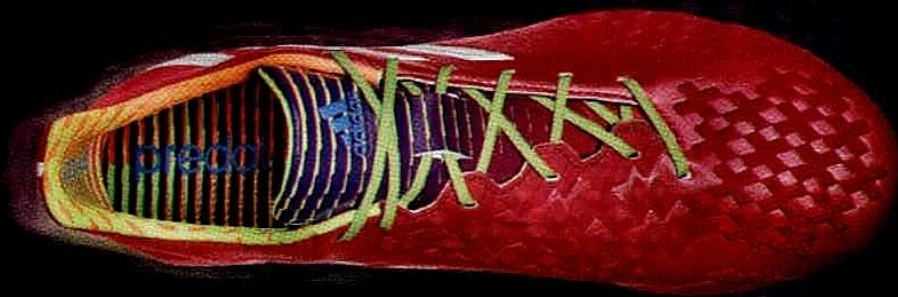


It also illustrates that the publication wasn't a top-flight driven production. Each week through Club Call (a behind the scenes look at how various clubs operate) and Peter's images, it was a journey through English football's top four divisions.

Female fans were also catered for too. A top ten list of "Most attractive and personable League footballer" for 1967/68 was won by over 40,000 women voting for Portsmouth's George Ley, three ahead of runner-up George Best.

The title lost £92,000 in its first year and didn't make profit until 1970. When the publishing company was absorbed by the staff of Lytham St Annes in 1972 it became known as simply **League Football** until the final whistle blew in December 1974.

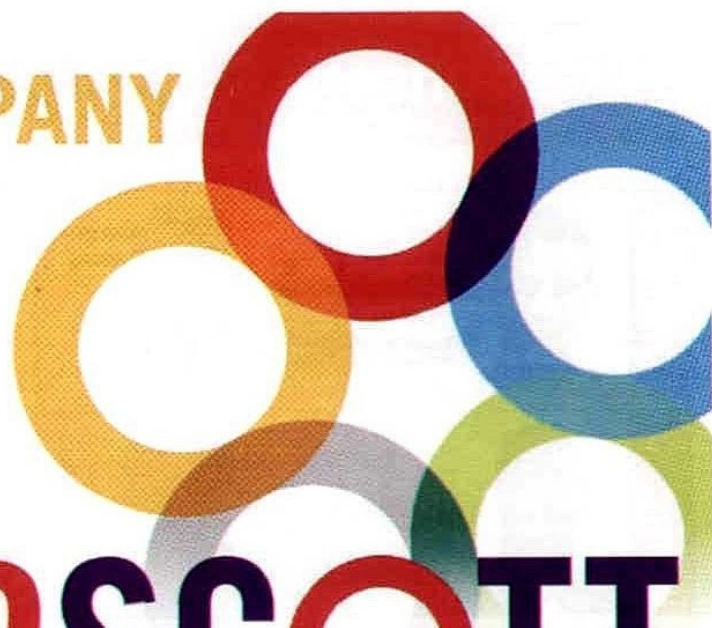

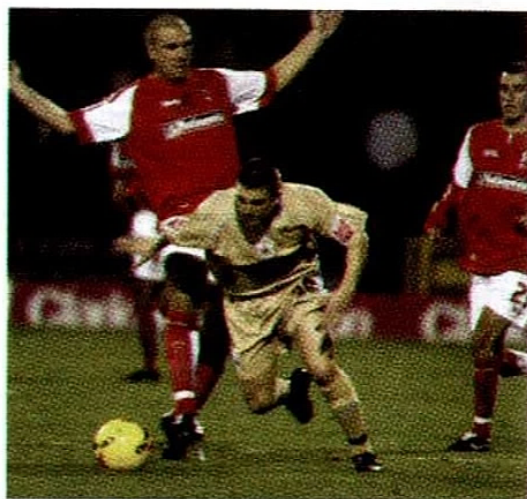
