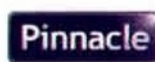

We've won four in a row now here at Meadow Lane and we want make it five this afternoon.

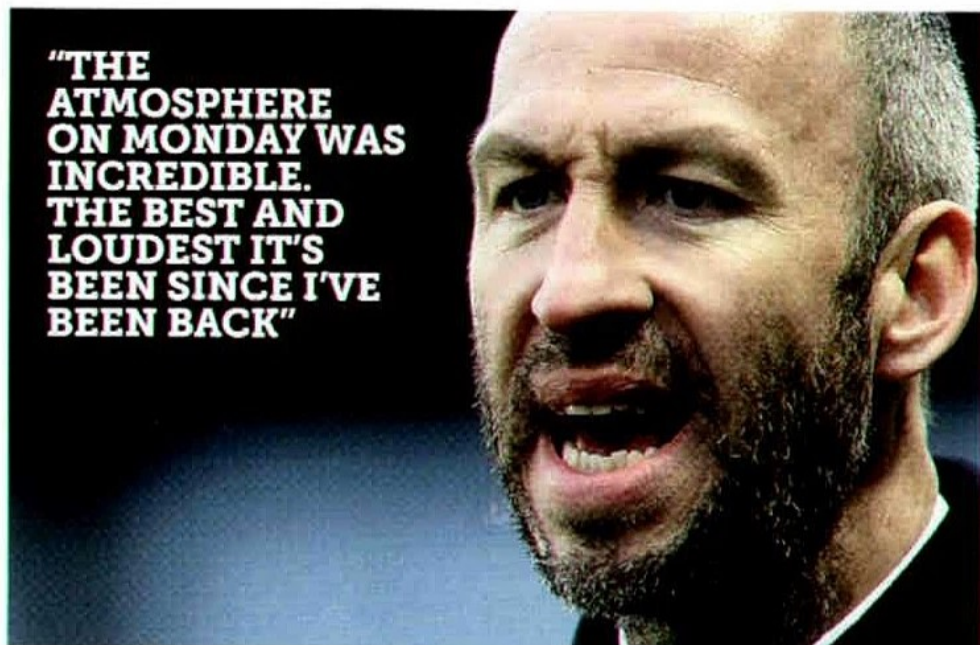
With that same belief, togetherness and body on the line attitude I believe we can reach that target.

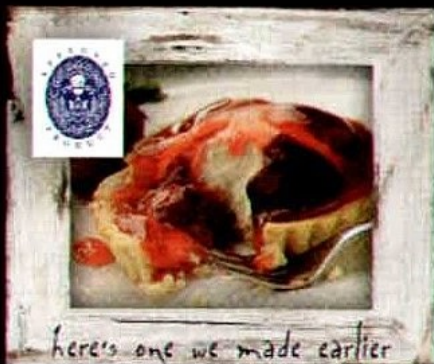

PAST GAMES

Notts will be looking for revenge following a defeat to the Robins back in October. The Magpies lost 2-0 on a wintry Friday night as strikers Nile Ranger and Dany N'Guessan scored in the first-half.

However, the last time Swindon came to Meadow Lane it was Notts taking all three points. Debutant Chris Iwelumo knocked down a shot for Alan Judge to strike home the winner from distance.

The Magpies have a decent record at Meadow Lane against the Robins in recent years, only losing on two occasions since 1995. The biggest win during that period came in 2001 when on-loan forward James Quinn and Darren Caskey cancelled out David Duke's opener. Both teams were reduced to men with Danny Allsopp and Neil 'Razor' Ruddock being given their marching orders, before flying Dutchman Marcel Cas swept in a third to wrap up the win.

THE LINK

Notts' in-form striker Ronan Murray spent time at the County Ground on loan from Ipswich in 2011-12. The Irishman had previously been sent out to Torquay where he played seven times, scoring once against Cheltenham Town.

He joined Paolo Di Canio's men and went on to score four times in 27 games, as the Robins gained promotion from League Two.

The following year he was back down south to Plymouth, again on loan, scoring once, before being released and snapped up by former boss Chris Kiwomya in the East Midlands.

OPPOSITION PROFILE: SWINDON TOWN

THE POWER OF GOOD

SWINDON TOWN CHAIRMAN LEE POWER SHOULD CONSIDER PUBLICLY BACKING HIS MANAGER MORE OFTEN, SUCH HAS BEEN THE UP-TURN IN RESULTS SINCE HIS MARCH APPRAISAL.

The Robins' play-off dreams began to unravel in the space of 15 days last month, after dropped points to Crewe (1-1), MK Dons (1-2), Wolves (1-4) and Bristol City (0-0), left them ten points adrift of sixth spot. It led to criticism of manager Mark Cooper, who stepped up from his assistant manager role last summer following Kevin MacDonald's hasty departure.

Nevertheless, Power gave the Town boss his full backing, telling BBC Radio Wiltshire now was the time for a macro outlook, not knee-jerk reactions.

"There's no point in trying to build something and changing your manager every two minutes. I don't think that's the right way to do things," he explained.

"I think a lot of the criticism Mark gets is unfair. We've had to tear one team up and start again, and it's the same from top to bottom in the club. Most of the supporters thought we were going to be in a relegation battle. That hasn't been the case."

The public slap on the back paid dividends. Town have won six of their last seven games to close the gap on Peterborough to just four points with two games remaining, keeping their hopes of gatecrashing the play-offs alive.

A Michael Smith penalty saw off Preston (1-0) to begin the fightback, Miles Storey produced the winner at Tranmere (1-2), before Louis Thompson's last-minute strike added a third straight success over Sheffield United (2-1).

Although April began with a shock setback at Carlisle, a reinvigorated Swindon bounced back with three more maximum

yields. Thompson hit the only goal of the game in beating Brentford (1-0), before the well-oiled, well drilled and remarkably fluid Robins maintained momentum over Easter. Smith's late winner stole all three points at Coventry (2-1), before Lee Cox's opportune first goal for the club proved decisive over Bradford (1-0).

An expansive, high-tempo approach has helped the Wiltshire outfit break down opposition defences, while a seemingly

impregnable back-line - conceding just four times in their last eight games - has been the perfect springboard on which to launch counter attacks.

Understandably Cooper has been thrilled with his side's run-in, telling the club's official website: "They've won another game and whatever happens we've finished the season in great fashion. We want to keep going and finish with two more wins."

On a backdrop of austerity, summer squad restructuring and boardroom power struggles, getting within touching distance of replicating last term's success - where Town went out to Brentford in the play-off semi-finals on penalties - has been phenomenal. The playing budget was halved to

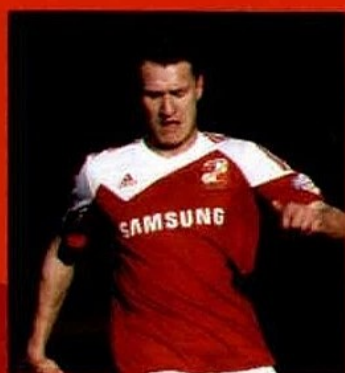

A defensive mix up late on in the County defence allowed Baldock to steal in for his second of the game and all three points for the hosts.

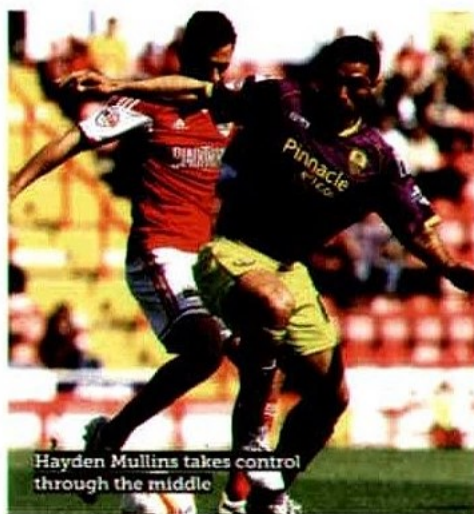

As a player, Derry always set himself the highest possible standards and it is a quality that he has carried over into management. High demands have been made of his players and the results are now showing on the pitch at an important stage of the campaign.

"You try to implement your style and your character on the boys to represent you as a football team," says the gaffer. "That's been a big challenge, because when you're changing mindsets that's where you can really struggle.

"There's been players who have, for one reason or another, decided to not get involved and there's others who have absolutely jumped on the bandwagon. I'm grateful now that we have 18-20 players that definitely want to be involved in what myself and Greg are trying to bring to the football club."

He adds: "I've always thought of myself as a good judge of character.

DERRY GIVES THE MAGPIES LIFT OFF

SHAUN DERRY'S APPOINTMENT AS MANAGER BACK IN NOVEMBER WAS JUST THE SHOT IN THE ARM THAT NOTTS COUNTY FOOTBALL CLUB NEEDED.

I've always kind of understood and realised when players are really wanting to be involved and when they're winging it.

"The proof's been in the pudding and I'm clearly delighted with the way that the boys are playing at the minute. I've got to say fair play to them because this last run of results has really put us in a position where our future's in our own hands."

Through thick and thin, Notts fans have never relented in their backing of the team this term - something that has really hit home with the management staff. The Black & White Army have played a big part in the club's revival and still have a role to play in the remaining two games.

"I find it hard to put into words what the fans here mean to me," Derry reveals. "For however long I'm here at this football club - and I hope it's a long time - these five months that I've been in charge will be forever engrained in the relationship that I've got with Notts County."

"There's been some tough, tough times that we've been through together in this short time and there's been some great games



as well. Through both feelings of euphoria and devastation, I just know that they've been right behind me and Greg and, as a pair, we're absolutely grateful for the support that they've given us.

"Not just us but for the players as well, as they've made it easier for them to go out onto the pitch and put in performances. I say to the lads before every speech that they're representing the football club and at the very, very core of this football club is the Notts County fans."

"They've been absolutely unbelievable from when we walked through the gates. I remember the first game away at Hartlepool, the support was there and it's just grown and grown and grown."

Change is imminent during the summer and Derry is eager to build a squad that can make the County faithful proud. Decisions are still to be made on the club's current players but preparations are already underway for 2014-15.

Derry says: "When it comes to crossing that white line, you're looking for leaders and people that are going to drive their team-mates on. As time's gone on, from November to now, there seems to be more and more lads embracing that role, which is great because in the good teams that I've played in, there's been five, six or seven leaders of men."

"I feel that's going to be required in the last two games but I hope that it's going to be the formula of what's hopefully going to be a highly impressive next year. I always say to the boys: 'Can I rely on you? Are you a reliable person?' If they are then that goes right to the top of the agenda of what we're looking for in future Notts County players."

"Myself and Greg have had long careers in the game and been able to forge some strong relationships with people. Whenever you're talking about signing a new player, I'm definitely one that's going

to be doing my homework and making sure that behind-the-scenes everything's stable for the right type of person coming into the football club.

"If you're not, you're going onto the field and kind of hoping, which, sometimes, is not the best way to approach the game. It's always better when you know that they're going to give everything on a Saturday afternoon and a Tuesday night, and you can sit back knowing that we've done our work throughout the week and that we can let the ability take over."

For now, the focus is very much on the short term, as Notts have six more points to play for in the battle against the drop - against Swindon Town and Oldham Athletic. Getting the Magpies above the dotted line by 5pm on 3rd May would go down as Derry's biggest accomplishment.

He explains: "It would be, without doubt, the biggest achievement I



could wish to have. Management can sometimes be a very short and cruel game and I want to be in this game for a long time.

"I want us to achieve better things and I never want to be happy with what's happening now - I never have been that type of person. When one achievement's been completed, whether it's a promotion season or an individual season where I've done well, I put it to the back of my mind and look forward to the next season.

"That's how I'm going to approach what's happening in the short term

here at Notts County, because I desperately, desperately want us to stay up this year. If and when that happens, I'll be looking forward because that's the only way I can work.

"I want this club to go and be the club that I think it can be. It's not going to be one that's going to be lingering around the bottom end of League One, that's for sure. I look at where we are, where we have been and where we can go, and I feel that we are very much underachieving here. With the right backing from the chairman and the board of directors, I'm sure that we can achieve those goals of trying to get into the Championship at some stage.

"Small steps need to be made for the moment and we can't look too far ahead, because as soon as you look too far ahead you take your eye off the ball. The ball for us at the minute is making sure that we do this job today and next weekend, too."

FANS' QUESTIONS:

Jake Gunton @JaKeGuNtOn:

How difficult was it adapting to management?

I had to learn quickly and I was obviously helped massively by Greg with his experience in management. I needed to quickly take myself out of the dressing room and ensure that I was comfortable with the decisions that I was making. I've found the crossover difficult at times but I would say the majority of times, it was quite a natural progression really.

Joe Crabtree:

What's your best memory as a Notts player?

My best memory was spending time as a youth team player, from the age of 16 to 18. I always look back on those times as probably the happiest of being a footballer. Actually coming out of school and being a footballer full-time, as well as being given the opportunity to develop, is something that I'm very proud to have done. Those two years especially just bring great memories, because we had so much fun as a group.

Robert J Kent @Robertnotts:

Do you plan to play next year? Also, did you like Joey Barton?

I'm planning on starting pre-season but, like I said when I took the job, I'm hoping I won't have to play. I'm hoping the players here next season will keep me out of the team, as I do want to concentrate on hopefully a long managerial career. As for Joey, he's obviously got a public perception but when you get to know him on a one-to-one level, he brings a lot to the game - both good and bad - and you have to accept his downs as well as his ups. In the short time that I played with Joey, we got on very well and we still keep in contact.

Robert Holland:

What's the funniest thing to have happened at Notts since you returned?

I've got to say there haven't been many light moments because it's been quite a stressful few months. If I could pick a few, it would be the outfits that the boys turn up in on a

matchday. When I stipulate a shirt and tie combination, you very rarely find them sticking within those guidelines - a yellow cardigan springs to mind and perhaps the odd pair of trainers, which don't go well with a suit at the best of times.

Mark Mugaseth:

If you could sign any player in the world who would it be?

I'd probably stay close to home if you're looking at out-and-out leaders. You can't look too far away than Liverpool with Steven Gerrard, who epitomises what it means to play for his hometown club. He replicates it when he pulls on an England shirt as well. If you need leaders to go into a battle, there's none bigger than Steven Gerrard.

James Schweinsteiger Edwards:

Have you always wanted to manage, or was it a 'snap' decision to come to Notts?

This is something that I'd been thinking about long and hard. When you're a player and you get to the age of 30, you

realise that your playing days are limited. I was very fortunate to have a long and enjoyable career but when I reached that age I realised I wanted to stay in football. Why do we water the pitch before each home game?

The surface is not ideal to play the football everyone would like to see. You have to make the best of it and I look at our pitch and how dry it gets. The drier it becomes, there's less scope for a natural bounce. That's why we water it, because I want the ball to run quickly with a truer bounce in the final third so we can pass it quicker in that area. The groundsmen Greg and Trevor work unbelievably hard, considering there's us, rugby and the ladies playing on it.

Notts were harshly defeated at Ashton Gate, after a dominant performance failed to deliver the precious points it deserved.

Nevertheless, after bouncing back to winning ways on Easter Monday against Crawley Town at Meadow Lane, the Magpies head into the remaining two fixtures just one point adrift of the sides outside the bottom four. Yet Liddle is fully aware of what it will take to achieve 'The Great Escape'.

He said: "We always knew that it would go down to the final game and the lads will be prepared for that.

"There's two huge games to come and one win and a draw will at least be needed to get out of the situation that we're in.

"We know what we've got to do and I'm pretty confident that if we can reproduce the performances we have put in recently we'll be alright."

The tenacious midfielder has also called for fans to get down to Meadow Lane for this massive fixture against Swindon Town to roar them to victory.

He continued: "The fans have been terrific all season and I'll speak on behalf of the lads that we can't thank them enough for the support they've shown us both home and away.

"They are that 12th man for us and we hope that they'll come out in numbers for the final two because we'll certainly need them. League One survival depends on it and we know what we've got to do."

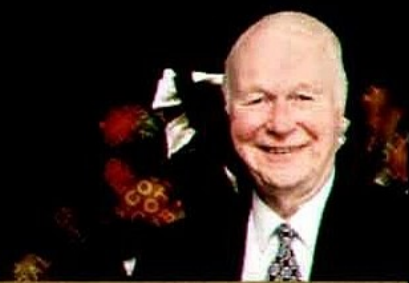

COLIN SLATER'S MAGPIE MEMORIES



BBC RADIO NOTTINGHAM COMMENTATOR, THE VOICE OF NOTTS COUNTY, COLIN SLATER, TAKES A WALK DOWN MEMORY LANE...

However nerve-wracking this season has proved to be for every true Notts fan it's been nothing like as anguishing as what happened just 50 years ago.

At the end of 1963-64 Notts were relegated from the third tier to the fourth after, in truth, not putting up much of a fight - so much so that the club's fate was sealed long before the last match, a 2-2 draw at home to QPR.

The gates tell their own story of the fans' reaction. The first home game (against destined-to-be-promoted Coventry City) drew a crowd of over 18,000.

For the visit of QPR it had slumped to under 3,000.

Such a downright abysmal campaign had not been anticipated, yet could be attributed to some fateful moves in the previous summer.

Notts finished a respectable seventh in 1962-63, only seven points behind the second-

placed club, which just happened to be Swindon Town.

But at the beginning of July and, out of the blue, the directors announced a change of manager with the former England player, Eddie Lowe, who had no managerial experience, replacing Tim Coleman who had served the club in various capacities over many years.

Lowe's first decisive act was to agree to the transfer to Aston Villa of centre forward Tony Hateley,

who in the season just ended was top scorer with 22 goals.

The decision amazed former manager Frank Hill who called me and wondered aloud: "Doesn't Eddie realise that it's the big fella's goals that will keep him in work?"

Three players were brought in, the biggest name among them being another centre forward, Terry Bly, who had been a free-scoring striker, bagging 137 goals with three previous clubs.

Sadly, for player and club alike, a persistent knee injury prevented Bly from reproducing anything like the same form and, for Notts, he found the net only four times in 29 starts.

Other players coming in were widemen Vic Povey, from Wolves, and Mike Barber, from QPR. Barber's career was virtually finished with a bad injury sustained at Watford in mid-February, a personal tragedy. And it's not too dramatic to say that with it any slender hope of avoiding the dreaded drop disappeared.



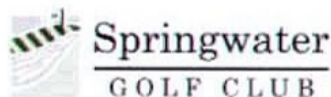
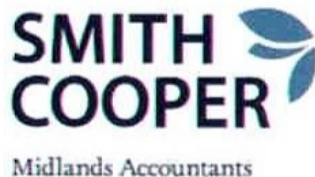

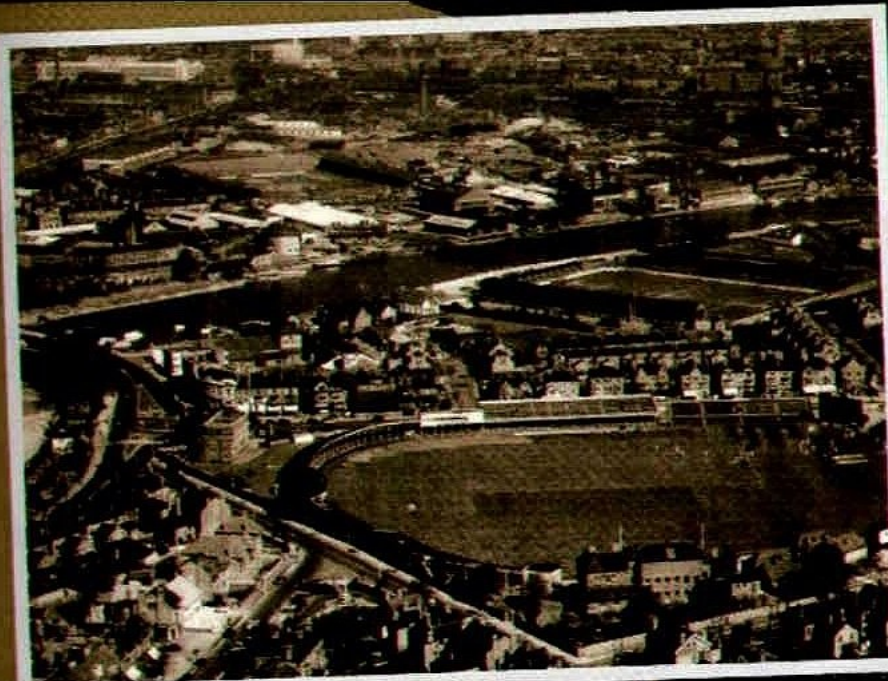

RICCO FACES THE INJURY THAT ENDED HIS CAREER

Ian Richardson appeared nearly 300 times for Notts County over nine years, scoring 26 goals. He was in Sam Allardyce's record-breaking team that achieved Division Three glory in 1998 and went on to become caretaker player-manager, bringing the Magpies back from relegation in 2004.

His career highlights include winning the League in 1998, being crowned Player of the Year three times, playing at Wembley, scoring at West Ham and playing in the Coca Cola Cup while at Birmingham.

However, since retiring from a knee injury in 2005 Ricco joined the team at Football in the Community and is now enjoying even more equally rewarding success. After several years of working with children, young people, adults and

seniors Ian is now going to face the injury that ended his playing career and run four miles to raise money for this year's sponsorship programme in Cape Town, South Africa.

Ian has dedicated the last nine years to working with adults and children across Nottingham. One of his main projects is 'On the Ball' for men who suffer with mental health problems, helping them find a way to express themselves and learn how to communicate their feelings through the medium of football.

This project won awards in the past and is a model of best practise when it comes to running mental health projects. He also heads up

various other diversionary projects for teenagers all over Nottingham. These football-based sessions give young people between the ages of eight and 19 somewhere safe to go where they can get involved in a positive activity.

Another popular project managed by Ricco is 'School's Out', providing school holiday multi-sport activities to eight to 15-year-olds for just £1 per day for seven hours.

The run!

Today Ian will be running from current training ground at High Fields in Beeston. He'll then head through the city, dodging road works to make it to Nottingham Castle, the previous home of Park Hollow where Notts County played when they were founded in 1862.

Richardson will then run back to Meadow Lane and plans to arrive just before kick-off to do a couple of laps around the Meadow Lane pitch.

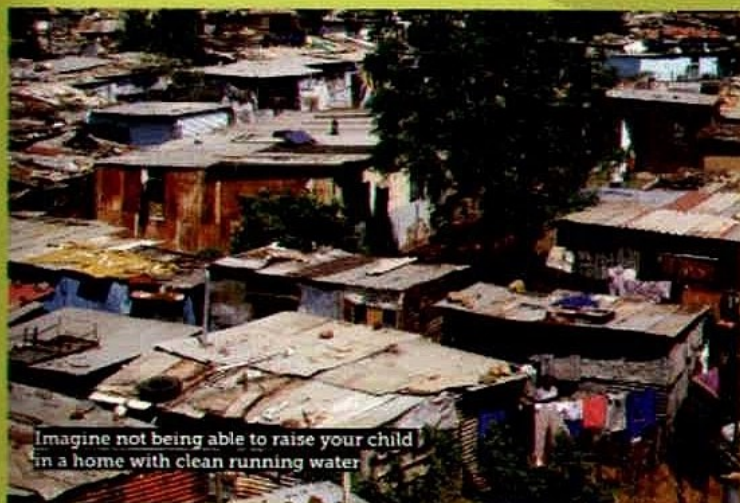

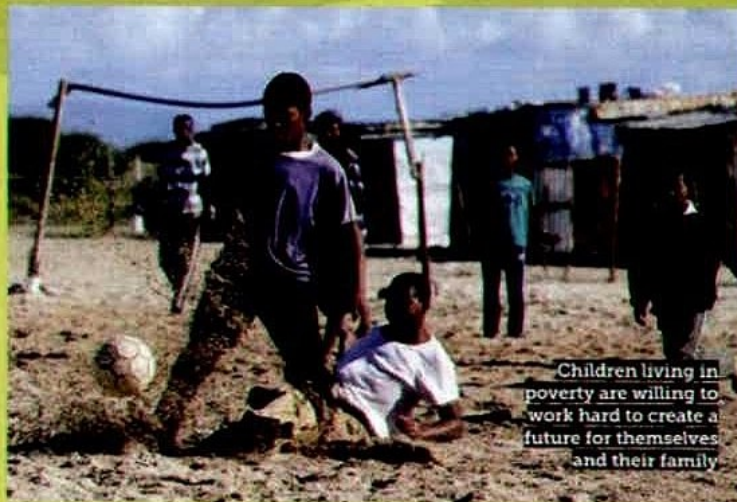

the knee, Ian had to face the fact that he'd never play professional football again. So today's challenge will really prove how strong his knee is almost 10 years later.

So why are we raising money for Cape Town?

When you Google "Cape Town", you'll be greeted by websites and images showing you a city full of wealth, sport and leisure, a tropical paradise popular with young people and sun seekers. South Africa has done a very good job of building up Cape Town's image and reputation; it's a place where the rich collect to live an active and enriched lifestyle. Or is it?

If you travel away from the coast, you will come upon the townships, the place where the African population of Cape Town live. People here live in cramped conditions, all packed into blocks of slum-like huts

made of scrap material and whatever they can get their hands on.

Children will probably only have one set of clothes and if they're lucky they will own a pair of flip flops. Nappies are rare and access to clean running water is limited. 81 per cent of township households report insufficient food levels and half of households can't afford to put meat, fruit or vegetables on the table. 64 per cent of the children from these areas live in poverty and only half will receive an education. The rest will go straight to work.

So what are we planning to do to help?

FitC are raising money to fund the education and training for one township resident who will be selected by our partners 'Coaching for Hope', from local projects that work alongside the township community.

The opportunity will provide the individual with a year's worth of accredited training as a sports coach and they will receive a wage to help them and their family get by during this period. The cost of this training is £3,000, which is why many people in the townships never manage to get out and provide for their families. It's a different life and position than we are used to. It's very rare to find families living in these conditions and without a government scheme to fall back on.

This sponsorship will not only change the selected individual's life, but also their family's and local community's. Once qualified, the individual will be able to apply for a job within Cape Town's growing sports industry, which currently consists of eight Virgin Actives and 14 indoor sports centres. They may choose to pursue further education or even go into business for themselves.

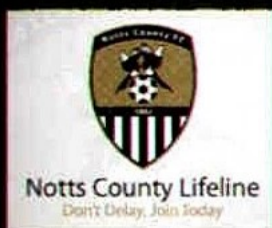

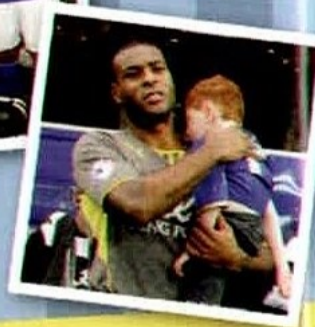

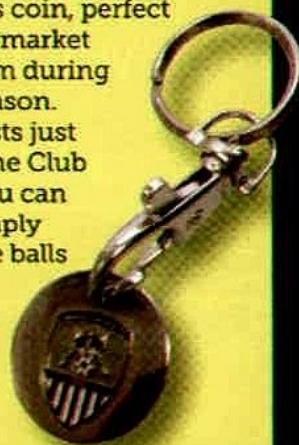

Strikers Paul Heffernan and Danny Allsopp were in white hot form, scoring 14 goals, to set up a nervy last game against Huddersfield Town.

With reduced prices, 15,000 witnessed another nail-biter, but the Magpies were given the perfect start through Danny Allsopp's headed opener.

Full-back Kevin Nicholson then slotted home from 30 yards to calm the Notts faithful's nerves, before Town scored a late consolation.

Notts finished 19th on 50 points, six points clear of the drop zone.

NOTTS MAINTAIN THEIR FOOTBALL LEAGUE STATUS: 2006

A fine start to the campaign meant Notts were sitting pretty at the top of League Two under boss Gudjon Thordason.

However, a mid-season collapse of 11 games without a win, and another sequence of just one win in the final 14 fixtures set-up another humdinger of a finale day.

Notts had lost 2-0 at Cheltenham and sat just above the relegation zone, on the same number of points as four other teams on the season's concluding weekend. If Oxford beat Swindon, the Magpies would have been relegated from the Football League for the first time in the club's history.

Thankfully the U's were defeated, while Notts rallied back from 2-0 down to draw with Bury at Meadow Lane. Goals from Dan Martin and a late penalty from captain Julian Baudet sent the Z-Block streaming onto the turf in jubilation.

Notts finished the season on 52 points, three points clear of the drop in 21st.
