





The Manager's matchday notes...



Good afternoon and welcome to Oakwell. It's always said that when you're not having a particularly good time, the one thing to up, more than anything, is your work ethic. That's what we've got to do. We've got to work far harder than we did at Port Vale. I thought the first 45 minutes were poor in terms of our work ethic and commitment to pressing the ball and getting round the opposition. We were miles off that so we have to rectify that straight away. That's a prerequisite in terms of approaching a game; you can never neglect that side of the game.

We need to quicken up our play and sharpen our passing. It's been good in some parts of our game and it's about getting more consistent in that. The biggest area I'd like us to address more than anything is up-front. It's about being able to get hold of

the ball and link play better. So there are lots of areas we can always get better at. We should never ever be satisfied, but I'd say the performance at Port Vale was far from satisfactory. The players know that and they don't need anybody to keep ramming it down their throats. They're more aware of that than anybody else.

Training's always been good, but when it comes to matchdays that's when we'll see a reaction. Today, against a very good Swindon side, we've got to be at our very best against a very good footballing side. I think from that point of view we have to be at the top of the tree in terms of our work ethic more than anything. We've got the players and the ability when we're on the ball and we know we can hurt teams.

In hindsight, it's on your wish-list to keep your team together for as long as possible for it to get better. It'll hopefully grow together and get better. I very much doubt any team has perfection but I'd like to think as these lads grow together, work together and play more often together, they will get a better understanding. As far as our 'jigsaw' is concerned, it's

never finished. There are always pieces we want to put in or tweak for it to get better and better.

We're eight games into the season and if people start to think there's going to be a panic at this stage, they're talking to the wrong person in me - that is one thing we won't do. We'll go through the process we've gone through so far in terms of recruitment. The player that's out there will be the best fit for us at this time. There'll be no panic or knee-jerk reaction. If somebody comes along that we think will do us a job, we'll certainly go down that pathway to try and bring them in. At this moment in time, there's always concern when you're not winning games - and I'm concerned - but, at the same time, I've got quite a level head and I know we're only as good as our next game.

Finally, I'd like to welcome Mark Cooper, his Coaching Staff, players and supporters from Swindon Town.

Enjoy the match.







THE SAME WINNALL INTERVIEW

Reds striker Sam Winnall takes a philosophical view on his football and life as he settles into Oakwell surroundings.

Despite facing the pressures of being Barnsley's number nine – where goals are expected left, right and centre – Winnall is relishing the challenge of providing both the goods in front of goal and performances.





It's not so much a pressure from here, wherever you go that's why you earn your money because you have to score goals," said Winnall, speaking exclusively to Be Red.

"I've always been a bit of a realist really. I take each day as it comes and don't look too far ahead or too far back. I take each day as it comes because it really is a blessing to be a footballer. It's not a long career, you've got to make the most if it when you're playing."

"There will always be pressure for strikers to put the ball in the net but I've grown up with it and I've grown accustomed to it. It's not something that plays on my mind too much. I just try to play as well as I can in

every game and do my best for the team."

A summer signing from Scunthorpe United, the 23-year-old netted 23 times for the Iron last season. The



start of this campaign saw the striker do everything but score, up until the 4-1 defeat of Gillingham at Oakwell.

"It was a massive relief to have got that first goal and to get off the mark, in front of the home fans as well," he continued.

"It was a special moment for me because all my family were there as well which was nice. Then we went on to win 4-1 which was great, so we're hoping for a repeat performance and score-line this weekend.

"It's just one of those things. The hardest thing to do in football is put the ball in the net but, hopefully, my luck will change in the next few weeks.

try to work hard and do as well for the team and myself as I can."

Scunthorpe was where Winnall had finally settled after several loan moves away from his first club, Wolves. But Barnsley is now where he wants to make his mark.

"I'm really enjoying it," he said. "Obviously I wish I could have had a few more goals but I feel as though I'm getting in the right positions and the chances are coming. I feel as though it's just a matter of time before they start going in the back of the net on a regular basis.

"When I first came in I thought that the surrounding and facilities were brilliant. I'm lucky that I'm only over in Doncaster so I share my trip in with Brad Abbott most mornings. It's been a really easy transition for me moving from Scunthorpe to Barnsley. All the staff, players and fans have made me feel really welcome and I just want to repay that with performances and goals – and I'll keep striving to do that.

"It's a step up from League Two and competition is hard. It's a tough league because there aren't many sides where you think 'Yeah we can go there and win'. It's a very competitive league and I think we're still finding our feet in the league but I feel once we find our best form we can really challenge.

"You just have to look at how many new faces there have been

"Of course there are a lot of other aspects to a striker's game that you have to put into work. When you're a striker, a lot of people do tend to just look at goal records and not what else you do for the team. I just



this year. Everyone hopes and expects it to just click straight away. Sometimes you need to learn each other's games and what our best style of play is. We're a young team as well and still getting to know each other and our best way to play. I think we can be a real force in this league and it's just a matter of time until we get there.

"The squad's fantastic. They're a great bunch of lads and we all get on really well both on and off the pitch. Because there is a tight connection, once we start to find our feet I think we can really challenge.



"There are no egos and everyone just wants to improve and get better. That's the right attitude that you have to have as a footballer. All of us have got that and we all want to improve and do well for the team."

Turning his attention to this afternoon's clash, the striker is determined to put things right after the last home performance against MK Dons, which was hard to swallow for players and fans alike.

"They've backed us so well all season both at home and away," said Winnall of the supporters.

"They've never stopped singing all the time. We really appreciate that as players more than they probably realise. I think it's time for us to put on a performance for them and send them home smiling.

"I felt I had a bit of an impact against MK Dons. We were 4-0 down at the time then got three goals back. I'm just working hard to get my starting place back in the team, and hopefully I'll be back in on Saturday. I'll just continue to work hard.

"In football you don't have time. In every league, if you don't perform,



that's it. You need to perform in every game. It's not an excuse, it's the truth – it's just a fact that it takes time. We know we should have been better in the last few games and we're striving to improve. We were really disappointed with the late goal at Port Vale but we've got to put it behind us now and go again against Swindon where we can hopefully put things right."

The forward is willing to put the success of the team ahead of any personal glory in front of goal but, most importantly, Winnall is enjoying playing in the Red of Barnsley.

"Of course I'm enjoying it here," he added. "This club's a really good club and they're trying to do things the right way. That's all the players can ask for. The fans are being great and sticking with us. It'd be nice to have scored more goals but you can't look at that too negatively. There are a lot more positives than negatives at the moment and I just want to carry on enjoying it."

Swindon on the up...

Last season for Swindon ended with the club finishing 8th in League One under the guidance of manager Mark Cooper.

Cooper took over from previous manager Kevin MacDonald following MacDonald's resignation in July 2013.

Reaching the third round of the League Cup and the area finals of the Johnstone's Paint Trophy, the Robins had a reasonably successful time in the cup competitions last year.

Kicking off the new season, Swindon faced Scunthorpe on the opening day, winning 3-1 at the County Ground.

Since then, Cooper's side have gone on to pick up wins against Crewe and Bradford as they now find themselves sitting comfortably in the play-off places.

Last season's top goal scorers Nicky Ajose and Nile Ranger have both now moved on to new clubs but the Robins' players have stepped up to fill the gap.

The likes of Jonathan Obika, Yaser Kasim and Andy Williams have all notched a handful of goals so far in this campaign as the Robins haven't struggled to find a source of goals.

Last time out, Swindon hosted Nigel Clough's Sheffield United at the County Ground and put five

past their Yorkshire opponents.

Two goals from Michael Smith as well as contributions from Obika, Williams and Louis Thompson saw Swindon climb up to fourth following the 5-2 victory.

Smith's two goals against the Blades mean that his tally for the season is already up to four with only eight games played.

Following this latest result against a side who many would consider to be one of the league's best, Cooper's team looks to be in good stead as the new season is now fully underway.

Only six points ahead of Barnsley, that translates into 15 places as



the Reds sit 19th ahead of today's game following last weekend's loss to Port Vale.

In midweek Swindon finally played their first round Johnstone's Paint Trophy against Newport County and enjoyed a 2-1 victory with goals from Jon Obika and Andy Williams.

Team News

Massimo Luongo missed Swindon's JPT match having had stitches for the wound he received earning the penalty against Sheffield United on Saturday and Yaser Kasim was forced to sit out the tie after accrued five yellow cards for the season already. Both are likely to return for this afternoon.

Danny Wilson has virtually a fully fit squad to select from with Ross Turnbull, Keith Treacy and James Bailey all returning to action.

Previously

The Reds welcome Swindon Town to Oakwell for the first time since

August 2005 for what will be the 49th meeting between the two sides.

The last time Barnsley played host to Swindon was the curtain-raiser for the 2005/06 season, which saw Paul Hayes and Chris Shuker send Andy Ritchie's men on their way to all the points in what was an exciting match. Two penalties were saved at either end and Robbie Williams was sent off for Barnsley although Nick Colgan managed a clean sheet for the Reds.

Here's how the two sides lined up the last time they met at Oakwell in front of 9358 spectators:

The Robins' last taste of victory on Barnsley soil was back in December 1998, when an Iffy

Onuora brace along with a strike from Chris Hay – all in the space of 13 first-half minutes – was enough defeat John Hendrie's side 3-1.

The first ever league meeting between the Reds and the Robins wasn't until August 1959, with the four previous encounters all coming in the FA Cup of 1912 and 1923.

Supporters will be pleased to know that there has never been a goalless draw between Barnsley and Swindon at Oakwell...yet!

Following his father Terry into the sport, Mark Cooper started his career with Bristol City in 1987. Staying with Bristol for two years as a trainee, Cooper didn't make an appearance for the side before moving to Exeter in 1989.

As well as spending a short period on loan at Southend United, Cooper made 50 appearances for the Grecians and scored 12 goals whilst under the management of his father at Exeter.

Leaving Exeter for Birmingham in 1991, Cooper stayed with the Blues for a year making one short of forty appearances for the side.

In 1992, Fulham paid £40,000 for Cooper's services but during a two year stay in London he only managed 14 appearances for the side as part of his time there was spent away on loan with Huddersfield.

After leaving Fulham, Cooper spent time with Wycombe before returning to Exeter for his second spell with the team.

From 1994-96, Cooper made 88 appearances and scored 20 times for Exeter, improving on his first spell with the side.

Leaving Exeter for the second time, he moved to Hartlepool where he spent a year, some of which was out on loan with Macclesfield Town.

Joining Leyton Orient in 1997 on a non-contract basis, he only made one appearance for the side before moving to Rushden and Diamonds.

After two years with the Diamonds, Cooper moved to Hednesford in 2000 and a year later he joined Forest Green Rovers.

Arriving at non-league Tamworth in 2002, Cooper made more than 100 appearances for the side over a five year stay, the longest time he had spent at any club.

Two years into his tenure at Tamworth, Cooper was appointed player manager after Darron Gee left the club at the start of the 04/05 season.

Taking Tamworth to the third round of the FA Cup twice in two years, Cooper had a successful time with the Lambs before leaving in 2007.

Becoming Kettering manager not long after, Cooper claimed the Conference North title by a huge margin of 17 points in his first season in charge.

His success with Kettering saw him become manager of

Peterborough in 2009 following the departure of Darren Ferguson but after only one win in 13 games he was sacked not long after taking over.


Returning as Darlington manager in 2010, he spent one successful year with the Quakers before being dismissed towards the end of 2011.

His next job came at the start of 2012 as caretaker manager of Kettering, however after only one game in charge, Cooper stepped down from his role citing off-field problems as the reason.

A year later, Cooper returned to management with AFC Telford, after only five games in charge of his new side, Cooper left Telford to become Kevin MacDonald's assistant at current club Swindon.

After MacDonald resigned from his role as Swindon manager in July 2013, the club chose to promote from within and Cooper took over at his 6th club since making the move to management.

Wes Foderingham Goalkeeper

Commanding stopper Foderingham came through the youth academy with Fulham before securing a move to Crystal Palace.

He initially joined the Robins on loan in 2012 and made an emphatic start to his temporary spell where he didn't concede a goal in five games.

In January of 2012 and after a series of sparkling performances the club signed him permanently. He went on to help the club secure the League Two title and the Johnstone's Paint Trophy in his first season at the County Ground producing several top class performances along the way.

He was then ever present as the Robins secured a place in the League One Play-Offs during the 2012/13 season and he was subsequently rewarded with a new contract with the club.

Nathan Thompson Defender



Right-back Thompson is now a first-team regular having come through the youth academy at the County Ground.

He made his debut during the 2012/13 season, and the tough-tackling defender was a regular in the starting XI as the club made the League One Play-Offs.

Since that point he has been a permanent fixture in the Robins' back four and he has won the Player of the Year award on no fewer than two occasions.

The 23-year-old ended last season with the captain's armband and will skipper the club again during the 2014/15 season.

He is the older brother of Louis who is now back at the club on a loan spell having been transferred to Norwich on transfer deadline day.


Massimo Luongo *Midfielder*

Australian midfielder Luongo initially joined the Robins on a season-long loan last summer before making the move permanent.

He spent time on loan at the club during the 2012/13 season and his performances earned him rave reviews and established him as a firm fan favourite.

One of the stylish midfielders many fans is Australian international coach, Ange Postecoglou who decided to include Luongo in his 2014 World Cup Squad in Brazil. In doing so he became the third Swindon Town player in history to represent his country on the biggest stage.

The 21-year-old, who is predicted to have a bright future in the game, also had a loan spell with Ipswich Town earlier on in his career where he played nine times for the Portman Road outfit.



Andy Williams *Striker*

The former Bristol Rovers and Hereford United striker is currently productively rebuilding his career with the Robins after a series of injuries.

He signed on at the County Ground in 2012 after an impressive season in front of goal for Yeovil Town during the 2011/12 season.

In his first season with the Robins he netted 11 times before the first injury struck and he is now in the process of rebuilding a glowing reputation at League One level.

He went on loan to Yeovil at the back end of last season to regain some match fitness and made nine appearances for the club.

Williams has looked sharp in front of goal this season and has netted four times already for the Robins.

Jonathan Obika
Striker

Obika is a product of the Tottenham Hotspur youth academy although the 24-year-old never made a first-team appearance for the club.

Whilst with Spurs he went out on no fewer than ten loan spells in an attempt to gain invaluable senior exposure.

The young striker has been out on loan four times to Yeovil Town, twice to Charlton Athletic and once to Millwall, Crystal Palace, Peterborough and Brighton and Hove Albion.

Obika opted to depart Spurs in the summer and signed permanent terms at the County Ground. He hit the ground running too, scoring four goals so far this season.

The 24-year-old Enfield born Striker has represented England at both Under 19 and U20 level and is thought to be a bright prospect in League One this year.

In a random off field note Obika's cousin is pop star and former Fame Academy contestant Lemar.

Michael Smith Striker

Smith signed for the Robins from Charlton Athletic in January 2014 and made an instant impact by scoring twice on his debut against Shrewsbury Town.

The powerful front man started his career at the renowned Wallsend Boys Club before signing professional terms at nearby Darlington.

At the Quakers he scored six goals in 37 appearances before moving to the Valley in 2011, failing to make a first team appearance.

He was subject to several loan spells whilst on the Addicks books, most notably at AFC Wimbledon where he netted nine times in 23 appearances.

Since moving to the Robins at the back end of last season he has scored 12 goals and netted twice in last Saturday's impressive 5-2 win over Sheffield United.



Classic Campaigns



1962/63

Swindon Town won promotion to the Second Division for the first time in 1962/63. Bert Head's young side won just one of their first six games, then top scorer Ernie Hunt netted a hat-trick in a 5-1 victory over Brighton. Cliff Jackson scored three times in a 4-3 win at Millwall and Jack Smith did likewise in a 5-0 victory over QPR as Swindon overcame the 'Big Freeze' to maintain their promotion challenge. They hammered Colchester 6-1 and clinched promotion with a 1-0 win at home to Shrewsbury. Keith Morgan and John Trollope were ever-present, while other stars included Mike Summerbee and Bobby Woodruff.

1968/69

Don Rogers starred as Swindon Town achieved an epic League Cup and promotion 'double' in 1968/69. Early pace-setters in the Third Division, they lost 1-0 at home to Watford in the title 'decider' watched by 28,898 and finished runners-up on goal average. Swindon defeated

Torquay 2-1, Bradford City 4-3, Blackburn 1-0, Coventry 3-0, Derby 1-0 and Burnley 3-2 in the League Cup before beating Arsenal 3-1 after extra-time in the Wembley final: Peter Downsborough, Rod Thomas, John Trollope, Joe Butler, Frank Burrows, Stan Harland, Don Heath, Roger Smart, John Smith (Willie Penman), Peter Noble, Don Rogers.

1969/70

Swindon Town challenged strongly for promotion to the top-flight in 1969/70. Fred Ford replaced Danny Williams as manager and Arthur Horsfield was signed from Newcastle, starting as Swindon were among the early leaders. Peter Noble grabbed a hat-trick as they beat Charlton 5-0 and maintained their promotion challenge with a 14 match unbeaten run. Swindon finished fifth in the Second Division, their highest position at the time. They also defeated Blackburn 4-0, Chester 4-2 and Scunthorpe 3-1 in the FA Cup before losing 2-0 to Leeds United in the sixth round, then beat Napoli 3-0 in the Anglo-Italian Cup final.

1979/80

Bobby Smith guided Swindon Town to the League Cup semi-finals in 1979/80. Swindon had narrowly missed promotion the previous season and Alan Mayes scored twice in an early 4-0 win over Brentford. They defeated Portsmouth 3-1, Chester 2-1, Stoke City 2-1, Wimbledon 2-1 and Arsenal 4-3 in the League Cup before losing 4-3 to Wolves in the semi-finals. Andy Rowland and Alan Mayes formed an exciting partnership as Swindon gained four successive wins, then trounced Bury 8-0. They took Spurs to an FA Cup fourth round replay but finished mid-table despite signing David Peach and Glenn Cockerill.

1985/86

Swindon Town stormed to the Fourth Division title with a record 102 points in 1985/86. Lou Macari's side made a poor start in the League but defeated Sunderland and Sheffield Wednesday en route to the Milk Cup fourth round. Kenny Allen arrived from Torquay and Dave Bamber from Portsmouth as Swindon soared to the top of the table with 14 wins in 16 matches. They set a club record of 13 consecutive home victories with a 3-1 win over Burnley and clinched the title with a 1-1 draw at Mansfield. Charlie Henry and Colin Gordon scored 35 goals between them, while skipper Colin Calderwood was ever-present.

1986/87

Lou Macari plotted Swindon Town's 1986/87 Third Division play-off final triumph. Colin Gordon was sold to Wimbledon, while newcomers included Jimmy Gilligan, Mark Jones, Fraser Digby and Bristol Rovers pair Tim Parkin and Steve White. Six victories in eight games catapulted Swindon into the promotion race, then Jimmy Quinn returned from Blackburn and Phil King arrived from Torquay. They starred as Swindon gained seven straight wins and qualified for the play-offs in third position after remaining undefeated in their last 11 matches. Swindon beat Gillingham 2-0 in the play-off final replay after a 2-2 aggregate draw.

1989/90

Swindon Town won the 1989/90 Second Division play-off final but were denied top-flight status after an illegal payments scandal. Swindon had qualified for the play-offs the previous season and Ossie Ardiles replaced Lou Macari as manager. They soared into the promotion

frame with seven wins in nine games including a 6-0 victory over Stoke and signed David Kerlake from QPR in November. Alan McLoughlin, Duncan Shearer and Steve White starred as Swindon maintained their challenge with just one defeat in 13 matches and finished in fourth position. They defeated Sunderland 1-0 in the play-off final at Wembley.

1992/93

Player-manager Glenn Hoddle was a key figure in Swindon Town's 1992/93 First Division play-off final success. Swindon were early pace-setters and new signing Craig Maskell grabbed a hat-trick in a 4-1 win over Cambridge United. They went second after a 5-1 demolition of Notts County, then overcame a lean spell with Ross MacLaren's return inspiring a run of seven victories in nine games. Dave Mitchell netted three times in a 6-4 win at Birmingham and Swindon qualified for the play-offs in fifth position. They defeated Tranmere 5-4 on aggregate, then gained a thrilling 4-3 win over Leicester in the Wembley final.

1995/96

Swindon Town stormed to the Second Division title under player-boss Steve McMahon in 1995/96.

They had plummeted from the Premiership to Second Division and newcomers included Wayne Allison, Steve Finney and Mark Seagraves. Swindon were early leaders, winning seven of their first nine games, and Kevin Horlock netted a hat-trick in a 4-1 victory at Bristol Rovers. They remained in pole position and took Southampton to an FA Cup fifth round replay. Ian Culverhouse and Mark Robinson were ever-present, while leading scorer Wayne Allison and Shaun Taylor also starred as they won the title by nine points.

2011/12

Paolo Di Canio managed Swindon Town to the League Two title in 2011/12. The Robins kicked off with a 3-0 win at home to Crewe but lost their next four games before just one defeat in 21 matches, including a club record ten successive wins, catapulted them to the top. They beat top-flight Wigan Athletic 2-1 in the FA Cup third round and reached the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final but lost 2-0 to Chesterfield at Wembley Stadium. Swindon clinched the League Two title in their penultimate match as two goals by Paul Benson plus others from Matt Ritchie, Aden Flint and Alan Connell defeated Port Vale 5-0 at the County Ground.



The Bard of Barnsley, Ian McMillan, provides us with his unique commentary on life and supporting Barnsley Football Club. This is...



I was working up in Scotland recently and, with an afternoon off, I went to watch Ayr United against Stranraer, a local derby of sorts, if the whole of the South-West of Scotland can be considered local. At the game I learned something I didn't know, that the nickname of Ayr United is 'The Honest Men'; I found out when a McBloke in a tartan bandanna kept yelling 'Come on, you Honest Men!' and I remarked (in a fake Scottish accent, of course) that all the players on the pitch seemed to be putting in an honest shift and it was their that he filled me in on the nickname, and that got me thinking about our nickname and the things we shout.

So, we shout, 'Come on you Reds' which fits the bill but it's hardly unique. Any number of

teams, including, arguably, the team we're playing today, could shout the same. A man who sits near me shouts 'Come on you Red and White' or 'Come on you Red and White Warriors' or, occasionally, 'Come on you Red and White Trojans' which is fine but a bit wordy. Some people shout 'Come on you Barnsley' which negates the idea of a nickname since a nickname isn't the same as a name, obviously. Football reference books often inform you that our nickname is The Tykes but I've never heard anybody shout 'Come on you Tykes' and one very obscure tome said we were called The Pitmen but everybody knows The Pitmen are Hednesford Town. Anyway, there aren't any pits left so you'd have to shout 'Come on you Call Centre Workers!' or 'Come on you Warehouse Employees!' and


it's not as though the playing staff represent the industry of the town any more. I dare anybody to shout 'Come on you Flash Car Drivers in Designer Leisurewear!' So, what should we shout? Dominik Werling is mobbed by his teammates after smacking home a 30-yard free-kick which doubled the Reds' lead over Plymouth just before the break.



After two stints with lower league clubs in Germany, the now 31-year-old Werling plies his trade in the Swedish Fourth Division for Ånge IF.

Despite the late flurry of goals MK Dons were able to keep a two goal margin and leave Oakwell with all three points.






