GOOD evening and welcome back to The County Ground for this long-awaited league home fixture against Rochdale...

THE break gave us a chance to clear up injuries, which is the main thing. It gave the players a chance to have a bit of a rest, whether they needed one or not. We were in a good run of form going into it so hopefully that means that (at the time of writing these notes) they're rested and ready to start come 3pm on Saturday, I could sense one or two were maybe a bit fired so it gave us the opportunity to rest them up - the likes of Jordan Tumbull have played every game and they're still young lads. I know there's a debate about Raheem Sterling at the moment but every player is different and we try to treat every player differently. We know what each player needs in terms of rest and we act on that accordingly. The boys are ready to play, they're desperate to get back on the bike and get going again. They're also desperate to play at home again so hopefully we can give the fans something to talk about tonight. Keith Hill has done a brilliant job at Rochdale. To leave Barnsley then go straight to Rochdale and get them promoted again on a small budget, plaving good football. I really like watching his teams play. They play really good football, he gives young players a chance in the team and promotes from the Academy similarly to what we do - so he's done an outstanding job so far. I think there are now more young managers in this league who are willing to play without any fear and give young players a chance but I

think it's more by circumstance that a lot of teams are going down this route. Budgets are being cut and if you look at our league there are probably 10 or 12 teams on big budgets then the rest are all much of a muchness. We all have to do something different and Rochdale try and play. I've not really come across Keith before as a manager. I played against him a couple of times at Plymouth where he was an uncompromising centre-half but

he's carving out a real reputation for himself as a manager. We've got a few home games coming up now and hopefully you can get behind the boys like you have done every game. You've been outstanding and hopefully, we can give you something to shout about and keep this run going. I'll keep saying it but we're just taking it one game at a time. There are 36 to go and if we're still there at Christmas then we can start to get excited. Keep behind the boys.

of the game. The structure we have in place has enabled me to do that and I thought it was a perfect opportunity in order to keep me developing. I'm thankful to Lee for the opportunity."


He continued: "If we listen to the people above us, do things right and keep the standards high then the opportunities are endless."





THIS evening's visitors are back in the third tier of English football this season for only the third time since 1974...


LAST term, the Dale opened their League 2 campaign with just one win from their opening six games, losing three of those half-dozen. Their form exploded into life at the start of September thanks to a 1-0 win over nearneighbours, Bury. Those three points sparked a run of seven wins from eight games, with the only blot on their copybook coming in a 3-0 reverse at Portsmouth, A mixed spell of results from the end of October until Christmas saw Kelth HIII's men keep in touch with the leading pack at the top of the division and an impressive run over the New Year period saw the Dale register five wins in six games, including an impressive 2-0 win over Leeds United in

the FA Cup. They clinched promotion on the penultimate weekend of the season thanks to a 2-0 win at Spotland over Cheltenham Town, The Dale started this season with three successive defeats, including an exit from the Capital One Cup. Reaistered their first three points of the campaign with a thumpina 5-2 win at Crewe Alexandra at the end of August. They enjoyed a fruitful September, losing just once and winning their other five fixtures, including 4-0 wins over Crawley and Walsall, as well as an impressive 3-2 win at Leyton Orient. At the time of writing, Dale were preparing to host Gillingham after two consecutive defeats.



THIS season, the Dale have been lining up in a 4-2-1-3 formation. Keith Hill will want his side to pass the ball and utilise the whole width of the pitch. They have pace and strength in the wide areas, which are anchored by a midfield three that sees two midfielders sitting in front of the back four and one in an advanced role playing off the front three. The most likely, three-pronaed attack of Peter Vincenti (pictured

right), Matty Done and Ian Henderson has, at the time of writing, yielded 16 goals in League 1, with at least one of the trio finding the net in all of the Dale's victories this campaign. Converted midfielder, Done, leads the way in the scoring charts with eight goals in all competitions. Expect a side that will want to come to The County Ground and play football the right way.

THE GAFFER



Keith Hill

AS a player, Hill represented Blackburn, Plymouth, Cheltenham, Wrexham and Morecambe as well as a fouryear spell at Spotland. Cut his coaching teeth with the Dale, initially working with the club's youth players before taking the reins in a caretakermanager role in December 2006. He managed to guide Rochdale away from the relegation zone to a top-half finish that season. After tasting defeat at Wembley in 2008, he guided Dale to promotion to League 1 in 2010. Hill's success at Spotland did not go unnoticed and he was appointed Barnsley manager at the end of the 2010/11 campaign. Returned to Spotland in 2013 just weeks after losing his job at Oakwell and guided the Dale back to League 1 last term.

YOU KNOW?

HILL masterminded last season's FA Cup success over Leeds United, taking the Dale into Round Four of the FA Cup for only the fourth time in their history.

MEN...


Peter Vincenti MF

THE right-sided midfielder made his league bow with Millwall before joining Stevenage. He helped Boro to FA Trophy success in 2009 then was part of the side that won the Blue Sauare Premier title. Had the honour of scoring Stevenage's first ever Football League goal on the opening day of the 2010/11 campaign. After a spell on loan at Mansfield, Vincenti made the move to Aldershot in January 2011. Joined Rochdale in July 2013 and helped the Dale win promotion to League 1 last term.



Matty Done MF

THE Welshman started his career with Wrexham in 2004, spending four years at The Racecourse Ground before moving to Hereford in the summer of 2008. Spent the 2010/11 campaign on loan at Spotland then secured a move to Barnslev in June 2011. Also had a stint on loan at Hibernian, north of the border, before linking up with Rochdale on a permanent basis in July 2013. Has been a regular amongst the goals this season, netting an impressive hat-trick at Crewe in August.



Ian Henderson FW

FORMERLY a trainee with Norwich City, Henderson spent nearly six years at Carrow Road before moving to Northampton Town in June 2007. Went on to play for Luton Town and Turkish side, Ankaragücü, then joined Colchester in 2010 where he racked up 130 appearances. A loan spell at Rochdale in 2013 preceded a permanent move to Spotland in July 2013. Netted 12 goals in all competitions last term as Dale clinched promotion to League 1.

began his career at Blackburn Rovers, graduating from the youth ranks at Ewood Park. Enjoyed loan spells at Rotherham

and York before spending last term on loan at Spotland. Re-joined Dale on a temporary basis in September.

06 Olly Lancashire DF



LANCASHIRE made 17 appearances for Southampton after graduating from the vouth Academy at St. Mary's and spent time on loan at Grimsby

before moving to Walsall in 2010. Was at Aldershot for just one season, then joined Dale in June 2013.

24 Jamie Allen MF



A former youth team captain at Spotland, Allen enjoyed a first season as a professional with Dale last term. Made his bow last October

and netted his first goal against AFC Wimbledon, Was named League Two Player of the Month last March.

27 Andy Cannon MF



THE 18-year-old has recently signed his first professional contract with the club after impressing for Dale's youth sides in recent seasons. Made his

senior debut as a substitute in Rochdale's 3-2 win at Leyton Orient last month.

heart of defence and in midfield, Rafferty has now made over 60 appearances for Dale.

move to Leicester, he spent time at Peterborough and Barnsley before returning to Spotland in August.

A product of the youth ranks at Spotland, Tanser is in his second season as a professional. Made his debut on the final day of the 2012/13 season

ALAN McLOUGHLIN

I first met Kevin in early July 1986. I was 170 miles from home, I was nervous, anxious

and unsure of my future football career. Lou Macari had given me a one-month trial after leaving Manchester United and Swindon Town was my lifeline to kick-start my football career. One of the first people to greet me in Swindon that Monday morning was Kevin, emerging from his physio room with his long white coat to match his immaculate white hair and trademark pipe perched from his mouth. Kevin introduced himself to me and said: "Welcome. Little Al. Make sure you don't visit me too many times while you're here. Lou said you were a good lad, I hope he is right." Thereafter I had the pleasure of signing for Swindon Town and I had four glorious seasons in Kevin's company on and off the pitch. He was always immaculately dressed, he was full of life and loved the day-to-day involvement of mixing with the coaching staff and players who, to a man, thought the world of him even if their stay at Swindon was short or for many years as mine was. Kevin, for me, was the focal point of the dressing room and was the heartbeat of the club whilst being the glue which kept us going when results or morale was low. I could tell you a hundred stories which would make you smile and belly laugh about Kevin but what you all need to know is that he was funny, thoughtful, sincere and genuinely cared for me and all the players and staff who worked and played for Swindon Town over his many years of loyal service to the Town. It is with great pleasure that I have donated a new Portsmouth FC first team shirt signed by myself, the staff and the current players. We had a game today and are in training in the morning so I am unable to attend this evening. I know Sarah is very proud of her Dad as I am to have known him for those four glorious seasons and beyond. Please give as generously as you can to this worthy cause.

which was the centre of the club during the week. My memories of Kev include him playing the spoons when we were on preseason tours or staying overnight on away trips! Then, of course, there was his pipel I'm sure he treated me with his pipe instead of the ultrasound machine one day...



LOU MACARI

WHEN I took over, like all managers, vour first job is to decide who you keep on your backroom staff.

From the moment I met Kevin, I had no other intention than to decide he was going to be part of my team because of his character. He was an incredible character; the life and soul of the place.

It would be fair to say that immediately, we clicked and formed a partnership. He was areat entertainment on any away trips. He loved it as well. He was an entertainer - his main job was physio but it helps when he can entertain like Kevin did. When I used to go and watch games either to watch the opposition or which players to bring to the club, I always used to take Kevin with me. We spent most nights on the road going to watch football matches and having him sat next to you was great entertainment. It's not that easy getting on the road to watch football but I did that and the main reason it was so enjoyable was having Kevin sat next to me on many a long journey. One night, we went to Southampton and we were there quite early so he went and did a bit of shopping. I think he bought a new pair of socks. On the way back, it was a windy road from Southampton to where he lived. We actually ended up in a ditch because it was a bendy road and I misjudged one of the bends. The first thing I did was get out quickly and I got him out. We were standing by the side of the road and he wanted to go back and aet his new socks that he had left behind! He was quite a character and that was a vital part of any football club. Some of you may have seen the documentary "Marvellous" recently - when I went to Stoke City I took on 'Nello'. People don't understand the importance of these people at the football club. If we could do a



similar film at Swindon over those great years when we had giantkillings, promotions and almost promotion into the top flight - all those results and all those things didn't just come about because of the players, it was because

the spirit of the club was fantastic and if you're talking about spirit at Swindon Town, then top of that list was Kevin Morris.



GLENN HODDLE

The first word evervone would say about Kevin is what a character he was. He knew his job, he was a

very funny man with a dry sense of humour. I remember trips away in the hotel he would have his spoons out after dinner and have everyone in hysterics. He was great for the team spirit. I remember one day he ran on to treat Shaun Close who had gone down injured. He ran on and he was so eager to see if Shaun was alright that he forgot his bag! It was on the far side of The County Ground and he couldn't see Shaun Iving there because of the camber of the pitch. We said to him "Kevin, Shaun's down." So, he's got over there and Shaun is in agony with

his ankle. Kevin has realised that he forgot his bag, looked at him, got his hanky out, wiped his brow and said to him: "You'll be alright." Shaun looked up at the bench and we said to him: "get on with it"! He was a very good physio and he loved the club, really adored the club. He was in early in the morning and left late at night. The whole club revolved around his life and he was a great servant. Sometimes I used to ao and see him late in the afternoon to have a cup of tea with him and get some stories off him to cheer myself up. On the professional side, he was a very good physio. He cared for the players; they were like an extension of his family in many ways and that's how he felt about them. He would be up front and honest with them in the way he dealt with them but always with a great sense of humour. On trips away and on pre-season tours, I would sometimes call him and Eddie Buckley: 'Abbott and Costello'!



THE 'phys' takes his turn in the Treatment Room after a busy last couple of weeks on the road...



BEN Gladwin has now made a full recovery. The surgeon was pleased with the speed of his recovery which was well ahead of schedule but, the way Ben's ankle is made meant that he was able to come back sooner than you would have expected having looked at the damage on the scan. Jon Obika was very similar - there was extensive damage to the shoulder and we got a surgical opinion but by the time he saw the surgeon, he'd started to heal very quickly. Some of the early intervention he had - I strapped his shoulder heavily on the day and he was in that for two days - really helped to get the healing process underway but Jon's own healing capacity has kicked in from there, so much so that the surgeon decided that he didn't want to operate and felt



that once the joint had started to heal, he would be able to play. I'm still strapping his shoulder but he should be back and available to play soon. Rapha Branco's injury is taking longer than first anticipated. We had two conflicting opinions on the scan but Rapha has proved that it was more on the severe side. I would anticipate him doing some end-stage rehab at the training

ground next week and I would hope he would be back in training shortly after that. There haven't been any delays to his healing and he has made steady progress it's just that the injury was more extensive than first thought. Over the recent break, myself and the backroom staff try and give them the right message that, although they've had three days off, they still sleep properly and eat properly. You have to be reasonable but I think they come back physically rested, mentally re-charged and training has been very good. Whether these breaks have had a massive effect on performance, we'll know come the end of the season.

THERE was a faint aroma of change blowing around The County Ground in early October 1985...

LOU Macari had been axed and reinstated as manager the previous Easter as campaigners had successfully argued for his reprieve and there was a feeling that this season had to be the one that turned Fourth Division Town's fortunes around.

Without that, impetus would be lost and the confidence felt in Macari by Town supporters, watching their club in the basement division for the fourth consecutive season, might be feared to have been misplaced.

But the League campaign had started with five defeats in eight matches and we began the autumn precariously placed in the re-election zone.

So, when we had travelled to Roker Park to take on Second Division Sunderland in the League Cup in September and lost by three goals to two, it left much at stake in the second leg.

On Tuesday 8th October 1985, we were hoping for a quick response to bring the aggregate score level against the team who had been beaten in the final the previous season. Instead, with half time approaching, Clive Walker netted to give the visitors what looked like an unassailable 4-2 margin.

And that's the way it stayed until two thirds of the way through the match.

Then, legendary Town striker
Andy Rowland grabbed the goal
that gave us hope, perhaps

re-ignited our campaign and brought what might be considered a turning point for that season and many of those to follow.

Even then, there was a long way to go and, after half an hour of trying, we still trailed the Roker Men (as they were then known) by four goals to three on aggregate.

But with the game in the 94th minute, five foot eight inch, Bath-born Bryan Wade scored the goal that took the tie to extra time, something that the Macaritrained Town players

Even so, having not been in front for well over 180 minutes of the tie, there was plenty of the game left to play when Wade popped up again nine minutes into extra time to finally put us in the



By the end of the evening Town





Certainly the season had been turned around and the foundation was laid for at least five years of unbridled success for our club.

THE Town attack had averaged three goals a game over the first nine Third Division South fixtures seen at The County Ground in 1953/54. And they again kept the fans happy when Turkish champions Fenerbahce - whose squad included ten internationals - came for a Monday evening floodlit friendly on 19 October.

It was the fifth of a six-game tour for the Turks, who had a busy schedule visiting Hull, Luton, Bristol City and Queens Park Rangers before finishing their programme at Maine Road - all in the space of a fortnight.

Swindon had conceded six at Millwall on the Saturday, but manager Maurice Lindley made just one change to his line-up - although, as it was not a competitive fixture, he was able to call on substitutes during the game.

He saw his side get off to the perfect start when Ken Lambert's centre found Mick Betteridge, whose effort went in off left-half Kacmaz Akgun in the third minute. That lead was doubled just three minutes later, when keeper Candil Ismail misjudged a 20-yard strike by the impressive Lambert - a close season signing from Gillingham.

On the quarter-hour, Kirkan Fikret saw his free-kick come back off a post with Sam Burton helpless and it was he who obtained the visitors' only success in the 73rd minute.

At the interval, Lindley had replaced Jimmy Cross with Stew Williamson and sent on 18 year old local lad Ray Sampson for the part-time professional Betteridge, who had to drive back to Derbyshire where he was a schoolmaster.

Sampson, yet to make his League debut, extended the hosts' lead with five minutes to go. But Town still found time to register twice more - through

The gate was just short of 7,000 with receipts of £727, which covered the £500 guarantee that had been made to the visitors. And the club was able to attract further European opposition to Wiltshire four months later, in Austrian side Admira Wien.

Unfortunately, the victory over Fenerbahce did not trigger success for Town when they returned to League action. They were to go seven games without a win until Shrewsbury were defeated 2-1 on Christmas Day.






AFTER a fixture break that saw Swindon go without a game for ten days, the defender says that the Town squad have made good use of their weekend off.

WE lost our first game of the season recently but performance-wise it has been good and possession percentages are as high as they have been.



WE have now experienced one loss and one draw in the nine games we've played so seven of those have been wins but the performances have been good throughout. Because of the style of play and because we sometimes risk a bit at the back we are going to give the opposition chances and that's exactly what has happened of late. On Thursday, the players had their six-weekly reviews - we work in a six-weekly cycle. We trained in the morning and we worked on team shape for last Saturday's match. We have a few injuries which means a few personnel changes in different positions and then in the afternoon we

had reviews. All that means is I sit down with them, tell them how well they're doing and what they can improve on and they take that away and have a look at it. We actually film it to so it's evidence that we've done it which can then be cross-referenced with their NVQ work. Thursday was quite a busy day but the good news is that the players are doing well. They're all progressing nicely, some faster than others which you would expect but mainly, the feedback is quite positive. We touch upon areas they can improve on - all players can improve - so there are some bits for them to take away and think about. Hopefully they'll look at them and take them very seriously. Obviously it's important they do these things to improve their game otherwise they're not going to be in a position to make it so it's really important they take on the points we speak to them about. On Saturday we played Bournemouth, We're still top of the league and they're second. They are possibly one of the better sides we've played so far this season so it will be a good test for us to go down there and try and perform to the same level we've been at and hopefully come away with the three points.

WE welcome Rochdale to The County Ground this evening for a match where the club will pay tribute to our former physiotherapist, Kevin Morris.

TONIGHT'S game is our first home fixture in four weeks, since the 5-2 victory over Sheffield United and I'm sure that Rochdale will prove tough opponents having been promoted from League 2 last season with the wily old campaigner, Keith Hill at the helm.

The team have visited Newport, Barnsley and Orient, recording three great victories on the road before the 3-2 defeat in the JPT at Plymouth where we gave our worst first-half performance of the season, finding ourselves 3-0 down before we were able to make a second-half comeback with Jack Stephens almost saving the day in injury time.

These notes were written before our match at Yeovil where we hoped to have continued the fantastic run of form that had taken us to the heady heights of second in the table with just ten games played. We must hope that our three international players have returned to Swindon in good shape, with the run of games up to Christmas now likely to define our season, with fixtures against three of the top four teams in November alone. The balance between work and rest periods is now crucial for the players, especially those internationals clocking up many thousands of air miles. Their recovery will include as much rest as training. The club will be delighted to get Captain, Nathan Thompson, under contract until 2017 and I am sure that other signatures will follow. There have



been many outstanding individual performers to date.

I must pay a special tribute to our former physio, Kevin Morris, whom I had the pleasure of working alongside during my time here as a player. There were not many days when I did not pay a visit to his treatment room and his brand of humour was something to behold - he kept the players entertained and would often rib individuals if he thought they had been sat on his treatment table for too many days. He was actually instrumental in helping with team spirit - although we may not have realised it at the time. The players knew they could always have a laugh with him. He could take stick and dish it out and was affectionately known as 'Popeye' because he reputedly

had one glass eye, although nobody was sure about that because he did not miss a trick! He would know immediately if you had been in his drawer to nick a bandage or some Deep Heat. During lunch breaks, he would often be sat in his corner chair, puffing on his pipe, reading the latest book on the Second World War or the Israel-Palestine conflict - we all had chapter and verse on that subject. It was a sort of religious history lesson for the lads and no one was auite sure of his nationality! His most famous trick was to write down the name of the next player to visit his treatment room - prior to that player being injured - seal it in an envelope and then get one of the other lads to open the envelope and reveal the player's name, who would, of course, be sat on the treatment table - he was a great judge of character!

In 1993, during his last year at the club, I had badly forn my ankle ligaments just ten days before our Wembley final against Leicester City but Kevin treated me around the clock, three times a day and, somehow, I was fit to play. I will always be grateful for that. God bless Kevin Morris: he was a great character and a true legend of Swindon Town.

Enjoy the game and give the team your support as always.

R&W looks ahead to Swindon's trip to the Proact Stadium.

SWINDON make their first ever visit to the Proact Stadium when they take on Chesterfield in their next away outing - a fixture that was rearranged due to international call-ups. The Spireites were promoted as champions from League 2 last season and have made a flying start to the new campaign in a higher division. The last meeting between the two sides was at Wemblev Stadium in the final of the Johnstone's Paint Trophy; the Derbyshire side coming out on top by two goals to nil on that occasion to lift the trophy. Nearly nine years have passed since Swindon have visited Chesterfield in a league game. In December 2005, it was Hameur Bouzza who earned Swindon a point in a 1-1 draw at Sattergate. Town fans will recognise a familiar face in the Spireites' ranks in the form of Gary Roberts who spent the 2012/13 campaign with Swindon at The County Ground. During his time in Wittshire, the winger made over 40 appearances in the famous red and white and bagged four goals including two stunning efforts at Tranmere that took Town top of League 1.


PRESSING
