WELCOME back to The County Ground and a warm welcome to all the Directors, Management, Players and Supporters of Bristol City this afternoon.





we will remember them...



LAST week, Swindon Town paid tribute to the former players and all armed forces personnel who made the ultimate sacrifice in defence of their country.

Six players with connections to Swindon Town were lost during the Great War - Albert Milton and Freddy Wheatcroft were still on the club's payroll at the time. Milton died in Belgium in October 1917 and Wheatcroft was killed in France in November 1917.

Arthur Beadsworth, Jim Chalmers, Billy Kirby and William Brewer were the other Town connections that tragically lost their lives during World War One.

1930s goal-scoring hero Alan Fowler was one of the victims of World War Two. The forward was killed in action in July 1944. Jim Olney, Bill Bryan, Albert Powell and Bill Imrie are also remembered by the club during this time of reflection and remembrance.

TOWN'S Under-18s will face Oxford United in the Second Round of the FA Youth Cup on 18th November with kick-off at 7.30pm.




The tie will be played at the Kassam Stadium and tickets for this game will be just £5 for adults and £3 for under-18s and over-65s.

CAPTAIN'S NOTES

ON behalf of the players, good afternoon and welcome to Derby Day at The County Ground. Today's fixture will always have a special place in my heart as Ashton Gate was the first time I walked out as Captain of this team.

SINCE then, I look back with satisfaction on how we've acquired 45 points over 22 league games – a record I'm proud to be a part of for Swindon. Local derbies always have extra spice and having both of today's teams in the top three adds an exciting dynamic to the game. It's sure to be competitive but we will not be bowled over and will look to dominate possession early on.

Yes, it's true that Bristol City are the only team outside of top flight football not to have lost this season – and I admire them for that – but a statistic that means more to me is how they haven't won at The County Ground since 13th January 2002. Or, in other words, before I had even started at Swindon and we're not about to let that change today.

We've been fortunate in having a full week to prepare for today's game, something which hasn't happened since the start of October. The difference this makes cannot be understated – it's no coincidence that we've won every weekend fixture after not having a midweek game in the preceding week.

Meanwhile, Bristol have had a game this week and, looking at their stats, the demand of a midweek game, it seems, affects their weekend results too. This season, Steve Cotterill's side have only acquired three points after a midweek fixture once

since the second weekend of this campaign. Combine that with the fact that they haven't won at The County Ground since 2002 and I'm quietly confident that we can churn out a result today.

Of course, we are tasked with

facing one of our biggest rivals without two of our key players: Massimo and Yaser. As they embark on their international duties, I'm positive that, with the talent in this squad, their replacements will be more than capable of contributing towards a successful result today.

Addressing last weekend and, even though we could argue that we were unfairly disadvantaged against Cheltenham, there are still key learnings this young team needs to take. Our performance was beyond unacceptable and we promise to use the defeat constructively so that we do not disappoint our fans like that again.

Now we turn to you, our fans, to play your important part in today's game too. With the absence of Mass and Yas – and against formidable opposition – today's the day that your players need an electric atmosphere more than ever. If the atmosphere can match that of our away fans, I'm positive it should be a successful afternoon.

INTRODUCING THE ROBINS



AFTER a stabilising campaign last time out, the Robins will be looking to extend their runaway lead at the top of the League 1 table with a share of the derby spoils today...

AFTER relegation to the third tier the previous season, much was expected of the Bristol outfit going into 2013/14. A poor start saw them winless in League 1 until the tail end of October, when a 4-2 win at Carlisle ended the lengthy drought at the thirteenth attempt. Meanwhile, a welcome escape from their league form was found in the domestic cups, with wins over Gillingham and Premier League side, Crystal Palace securing a third round trip to Southampton in the Capital One Cup. A 2-1 victory over arch-rivals, Bristol Rovers also saw progress in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy.

Although the beginning of November saw the West Country side pick up, one defeat in seven failed to prevent Sean O'Driscoll from losing his job at the end of the month after a 2-2 draw at home to high-flyers, Leyton Orient. A change of manager appeared to transform their ailing

fortunes, with three wins from five in December kick-starting their push towards safety. After taking Watford to a replay in the FA Cup Third Round, sole focus on their league form saw Steve Cotterill's men earn vital wins against strugglers Carlisle, Shrewsbury and Stevenage to finish the season in a creditable eleventh place.

In complete contrast to last season, the Robins have laid waste to all before them in the division, sitting atop the summit whilst remaining unbeaten thus far. Sixteen league games have seen them fail to pick up maximum points on just six occasions, in addition to a single defeat in all competitions so far (to League 2 Oxford United in the League Cup). A club record of twenty-four league games without defeat was set over the course of the 1905/06 season, when the club were crowned Division Two champions.

SCOUTING REPORT



IN a similar vein to Town, Bristol City primarily line up in a 3-5-2 formation, with the versatility of the wing-backs (Mark Little and Academy product, Joe Bryan) key to giving the team a balance between attack and defence. There is an experienced spine running through the team, with veterans, Wade Elliott and Aaron Wilbraham having played at both the highest and lowest levels of English League football; both of whom know how to enact a style of game management and be on hand to marshal

the troops and keep them disciplined, if need be.

Although Town fans will know all about what Aden Flint offers, City's defence have only kept one clean sheet in their previous eight league fixtures (in their most recent fixture with Oldham). There have been no problems at the other end of the pitch, however, with the club failing to score in all competitions just once this season, in August's league clash with Leyton Orient. The partnership in attack for the Robins will be one of the toughest the Town defence

will face all season, with 18 goals shared between the 'little and large' combination of Kieran Agard and Wilbraham. Supplying the front two from the centre of the park will be left primarily to the creative talents of Luke Freeman, a summer acquisition from Stevenage and Korey Smith, with Elliott tasked with ticking the play over for the League 1 leaders. A high percentage of City's goals this campaign have come from set pieces, so the Town will have to do their homework and be alert and alive from dead-ball situations.

Steve Cotterill

COTTERILL made his name as a manager with Cheltenham Town, guiding the Robins to the FA Trophy, and promotion to the Football League, steering them into League One. In 2002, he took the reins at Stoke City and went on to become assistant manager at Sunderland. Has also been in charge at Burnley, Notts County – guiding the Magpies to the League Two title – Portsmouth and Nottingham Forest. Was installed as manager at Ashton Gate in December 2013 and steered City to safety last term.




04 Aden Flint DF

TOP CAT

AS one of the seasoned campaigners in Mark Cooper's squad, the Town stopper says that he is enjoying his role as the anchor for Swindon's attacking play this term...



Recently, you passed the 150-appearance mark for Swindon – that puts you inside the top 100 appearance-makers for the Town. That's quite an achievement...

Yes, it's good. Obviously, I've been here for just over three years now and those games have all come in a relatively short period of time. At my age, to play that many games is a great achievement.

Things have changed so much since the day you first walked through the door here. Can you remember what it was like during your first week here?

Yes, I do! Di Canio was manager and there was a

different Board. The squad was really big – there were the Italian boys who were brought in from overseas and loan players too – I just remember the squad being really big.

If you were writing a half-term progress report for Swindon Town, how would you sum up the season so far?

It's been a very good start. We have picked up some good results but we have also had a few bad defeats as well but that's expected - we are not going to win every game at this level. All things considered, it's a great start for us to be third in the table at this stage.

What do you put that start down to?

We've kept the nucleus of players from last season and there haven't been that many changes. There have been a few additions, some good quality players and we've built on what we had last season. I also think that it's helped that the boys have had a season of games under their belt and that's been proved because it's taking the team onto a new level.

You've had an enhanced role this season at the back as a "sweeper-keeper" of course...

It's a role that I enjoy. I'm

expected to be involved in starting attacks from the back and play higher up out of my goal sweeping up the balls over the top. I've enjoyed it – obviously I have been a lot busier and the way we're set up sometimes leaves us vulnerable but, so far, it's worked well for us.

Do you take any inspiration from the likes of Manuel Neuer, who seems to have set the curve for that style of goalkeeping?

I look at all 'keepers at the top level. There are a lot of them out there and there are a lot of different styles of goalkeeping. People that aren't specialised in goalkeepers might not realise that there are different types. Obviously, Neuer is a different type of goalkeeper and he is regarded as the best in the world.

So does that mean we won't see you charging out of your box and nutmegging the striker before playing the ball into midfield....?

I don't know about charging out but I like to think of myself as a positive goalkeeper who makes positive decisions and I am decisive in my play, if necessary. I won't be doing any fancy tricks and flicks though! Nothing too risky - I'll just be sticking to what I know.

Looking back at your Town career, you're no stranger to big derby games against the likes of Bristol City and Oxford...

I know how much these games mean to the fans and the town in general. I've been involved in a few and have been on the winning side and on the losing side in those derbies so I know what it feels like on both sides of the coin. Hopefully we can put in a performance that the town can be proud of and pick up all three points.

What are your memories of the games against City last season? A win at home and a draw away, of course...

They were both very good performances and results, really. We did well at home - after conceding the goals it was difficult but we did well to come back into the game and win it. The game away from home was under different circumstances with Alex Pritchard getting sent off. It was 'backs against the wall' but the boys stood up well to the test of character and got a point.

Are you anticipating this afternoon's game to be more highly-charged than usual given both sides' respective positions in the table?






After what happened last week at Cheltenham, the squad must be itching to put things right this afternoon...






IT'S common knowledge we have a very young squad and this includes the goalkeepers...

WES is currently 23 years old and Tyrell is only 20. If you compare Wes to other goalkeepers of his age he's in a good position in terms of having played over 150 league and cup games. You will struggle to find any other goalkeeper in the Football League with that many games under his belt at that age.

We are very fortunate to have a goalkeeper of Tyrell's ability as backup to Wes but we must remember, in terms of his actual development, he is 3-4 years behind at 20 years of age with just 11 first team appearances. That is a vast difference in terms of game experience and so we shouldn't try to compare the two as they are at different stages of their career.

We are not in a position to have three professional goalkeepers within the squad so whereby the ideal scenario would be to get Tyrell out on loan so that he can gain experience from playing games, we need him here as cover/competition for Wes.

Therefore every week Tyrell works really hard in training and prepares professionally and properly then takes his place on the bench which I'm sure must be frustrating for him. However he has a great personality, supports Wes and the scholar goalkeepers and gets on with it in a good manner. So far, we have only managed - due to our heavy schedule - to get two development team games in and he has played in the two JPT Cup games so he's had limited playing time so far this season. Training every day simply doesn't replicate

what you get from playing in games, the decision-making element of dealing with crosses, coming for through balls, judging passes playing out and generally being under pressure in front of a crowd with 3 points at stake.

Tyrell needs the support of us as staff and you as fans (Tyrell always gives his time for the fans at games home and away)

through his development. He is an excellent, positive young goalkeeper who suits our passing style perfectly and I'm sure he will develop into a regular first team goalkeeper throughout his career.

In terms of the scholar goalkeepers we have two second year scholars - Aaron Moody and Claude Da Costa - and one first year scholar Connor Johns. With their development I arranged for Claude to start the season playing the Youth Team games and a three-month loan deal for Aaron in senior non-league football at Hellenic Premier side, Shrivenham. Despite their poor results the feedback we got on Aaron was very good. I then, recently, arranged a similar senior non-league loan spell for Connor Johns who has gone to Chippenham Park in the Toolstation League. Sadly he has just picked up an injury but again was doing well up to that point. Aaron has just returned and will now play in the Youth Team and Claude is due to go out on a similar loan.

The purpose for these loans is so that they all get a good amount of game time but also experience senior football, league football with points at stake and handling playing in front of a crowd. This takes them out of their comfort zone meeting new players; different coaches/managers and is, therefore, good for their experience and development.

FANATIC'S ATTIC

AS fans, hands up who thinks they are well looked after by the Football League. Who amongst us think the authorities communicate with us supporters sufficiently?

ONCE upon a time the Football League made a point of engaging us on a match by match basis, to tell us of developments, seek our views and generally make us feel as though we were all part of football together, rather (perhaps) than to ignore us and assume our inclusion didn't matter.

And a Fanatic's Attic will have the evidence to support this.

Back in 1965 production began of something called 'Soccer Review', which became 'Football League Review' and finally 'League Football' before dying a death ten years later.

And every time you bought a programme at the match, you'd find the latest offering inserted into it.

Articles might include speculative insight of whether football would be better served if the points system was scrapped (personally I've always wondered that it might), a focus on a particular player (ex-Town man Frank Large was one of them) and any manner of assorted views or justifications of Football League rules, regulations or behaviour.

Amongst the quirks of such a venture was that if you went to an away game, you'd invariably find the same issue in the

programme that you had picked up at your home match the week before.


And in order for it to be inserted into the regular programme, each club's publication had to be the right size to accept it. The once favoured 'pocket sized' programme would be too small to fit the 'Review' into.

While the magazine was free to the supporter, each club had to pay the FL to use it, so it was perhaps inevitable that questions were eventually asked regarding value for money.


That, and perhaps the suspicion that it was a propaganda tool for the Football League. There were surely occasions when clubs ended up circulating views which they didn't necessarily agree with.

After its demise, regional alternatives sprang up that bolstered club programmes without the potential of Big Brother's interference. Our own was called Programme Plus, while other regional alternatives could be found.

They covered football in general, rather than just

specifically the teams you were about to watch, and also contained topics other than football, such as music and car reviews.

Identical issues could be found at geographically local clubs, so they needed to feature articles relating to each. Oxford shared with Reading, so if Town happened to play away at both in quick succession, a large proportion of the two programmes could be identical.

Advertising also helped keep the cost to the club under control.

The Football League Review seemed like a good idea at the time, and the fact it lasted a decade supports that view.

50s In focus

R&W turns the clock back 60 years as we continue our new feature in the 2014/15 edition of the programme...

SEPTEMBER 1953 was a busy month for Swindon, with no fewer than nine League fixtures in the Third Division South.

They had faltered in the last three, going down to Palace and Exeter (twice), but were still tenth in the table having registered six wins so far. The opening game of October saw Bristol City - sitting fifth - make the short trip to The County Ground.

Responding to Town's defence conceding ten goals in those three defeats, manager Maurice

Lindley made changes at left-back - where Peter Hilton came in for his debut - and at centre-half and goalkeeper, where 'Garth' Hudson and Sam Burton were both recalled. For City, neither 11-goal top scorer Arnold Rodgers nor former Wiltshire and England youth John Atyeo were available due to injury.

In bright sunshine a 15,481 crowd saw play flow from end to end in the first half hour, with Harry Lunn coming closest to opening the scoring. His header

from a Jimmy Johnston free-kick was destined for the top corner before Tony Cook managed to tip the ball away.

The breakthrough came on 26 minutes when another free-kick, this time by Hudson, was launched into the area from just inside the visitors' half. As the keeper advanced to collect, he was beaten by a back-header from Maurice Owen. Seven minutes before the break, the number nine beat the keeper



remains the biggest margin of victory for Town against City in 115 meetings.




Left: Jimmy Kelly scorer of the 5th goal vs Aldershot.

the Trust to play a greater role in supporting the football club.






STRIKE FORCE...

AFTER a busy half-term, the Day Release Programme has just changed from a Monday to a Tuesday and that's going really well...

EVERY two weeks they have a game against Category One Academy teams: next week we are playing Aston Villa. Ex-Swindon striker Tommy Mooney - who I know really well - works at Aston Villa now and looks after the Under-13s upwards. It's a fantastic journey and I've been proud and pleased that I've got them through to a lot of the further rounds down the years and have come across the likes



of Andy Carroll scoring the winner out here at The County Ground, then going on to Charlton and seeing Jonjo Shelvey destroy us as a 15 year old. Then we played Crystal Palace with Victor Moses and Nathaniel Clyne. The names are there and it's interesting to see where those boys are now that have played here. We faced Liverpool a couple of years ago and that was an interesting one with the likes of Jordon Ibe and Jerome Sinclair playing who are doing really well now. It's a great stage for our players and it's a completely different experience playing in mid-week under lights. We don't do enough of it and we would love to do more of it. We're trying to do different things within the younger age groups; they've got the facilities up at the training ground at Lydiard to do that but the first team pitches are what the players want to play on and they have to earn their right to

do that. Hopefully we can get a good run - we just have to make sure the boys are focused and prepared properly and we will make sure they do that.







A warm welcome to Steve Cotterill who brings his table-topping Bristol City team to Swindon this afternoon in what will be our third encounter against a top of the table rival in the last two weeks...

BRISTOL City have yet to lose a league match this season with an impressive 10 wins and six draws to date and we can be sure that our friends from along the M4 will provide us with a stern test today. Aden Flint, our former central defender, has been a regular for Bristol City this season and part of a defence that have conceded few goals to date and it will be interesting to see how they set up their defensive formation in a bid to stop our free-scoring forward players this afternoon. Steve Cotterill is renowned for his ability to organise his team at set pieces and we must be on our toes today in order to combat this threat - total concentration will be the key.

Our last two results have demonstrated, in case we needed reminding, just how unpredictable a football match can be. In the previous midweek, after a magnificent 1-0 victory against many pundits' promotion favourites, Preston North End, where our young players stood up to the challenge of a very physical side in what was a pulsating encounter, who would have thought that we would be on the end of a 5-0 FA Cup drubbing against our lower league neighbours, Cheltenham Town? An FA Cup run could have brought much needed extra revenue into the club so we must hope that our home gates will improve if we can maintain our form at the top end of the table going into the Christmas period.



We have been boosted by the news that captain, Nathan Thompson has had his red card against Cheltenham rescinded on appeal and will be available to face City this afternoon but it somehow does not seem fair that you should have to play the league leaders without Massimo Luongo and Yaser Kasim (who are away on international duty) but, unfortunately, the rules are set and we have to get on with it. Our squad will be stretched to the limit but this gives an opportunity for the fringe players to stake a claim for a regular start.

But let's not forget the unpredictable nature of a football match - can Bristol City go through a whole season unbeaten in this league? Their players will begin to think that they can but questions are going to be asked of them each and every week from now on in. How will they deal with that pressure? Can we become the first team to topple them?

It was good to see the vote for the restoration of artificial pitches failing to gain approval this week. What was disconcerting though, is the fact that 34 of 72 league clubs voted in favour of the proposals and 34 voted against it with four abstaining. I stand right alongside Mark Cooper when he says "1 million percent no" to the reintroduction of the 3G surfaces. It is, of course, a way of maximising income streams for the clubs but the game can never be played at the same pace as it is on grass, the spectacle can never be as exciting for the supporters and the players are never able to feel confident that they can go 100% into a full-blooded challenge without the risk of being injured by the pitch. It had to be a 'no' but, by the look of the voting, we've not heard the last of it.

Whilst at Luton Town back in September 1981 I played in the very first match on artificial (Omni) turf in this country at Loftus Road, the home of QPR. Although we won the game 3-2, the players disapproved with most of the lads coming off with leg burns where they had slid across the surface. Oldham and Preston also had artificial surfaces in those days but their pitches were horrible - just like playing on concrete!

Enjoy the game and keep supporting the team.

R&W looks ahead to Swindon's trip to London Road in League 1.



NEXT up for Mark Cooper's charges is a trip north east of Swindon to Peterborough United next weekend. The Town have endured a lean spell in terms of victories at London Road: in their last twenty visits, Swindon have only won three times. Last term, they were beaten 1-0 on the opening day of the season thanks to Britt Assombalonga's first-half strike. The two clubs were also drawn together in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy Southern Area Final. In the first leg at London Road, an own goal coupled with a smart finish from Nile Ranger saw the Town, who had been reduced to ten men, claw back a two-goal deficit to draw 2-2. Only a penalty shoot-out denied Mark Cooper's side a place in the Wembley final after the tie ended all-square in the return leg at The County Ground. Swindon fans have to look back almost a decade to Boxing Day 2004 for the last time a Town team claimed all three points from a trip to Peterborough. On that occasion, second-half strikes from Sammy Igoe and Sam Parkin sealed a 2-0 win for the visitors.

Mick is a super Spirerites supporter with a difference - as well as following Chesterfield's first team -he also travels to all of the youth team fixtures with the staff and players.






