WELCOME back to The County Ground for this first league meeting between the two sides. I'd like to welcome Graham Alexander, his staff and his players.

IT has been a good month apart from MK Dons and Cheltenham (obviously) but we've bounced back which is the main thing so full credit to the players - they've worked very hard in training, they have put in some long hours and, hopefully, we're getting the benefit of that. It was a great occasion against Bristol City the last time we were at The County Ground: it was a good atmosphere, an electric atmosphere and I really enjoyed the whole occasion. The fans were outstanding and if we could recreate that or get somewhere near it every week then we will be really difficult to play against at home. Our visitors today got promoted last year. They've got some good players and they play good football. They had a good start but lost at home for the first time in nine months last week so I'm sure they will be trying to put that right this afternoon. Graham Alexander has done really well. He got the opportunity at Fleetwood and got them promoted via the Play-Off Final - which I watched. They play some lovely football and they've got some good players there. I played against him a couple of times during my career and I know that he's good friends with Scott Lindsey, our Under-18s Manager. I've watched Graham's team a few times and they always come across as a good football team. You

only have to look at people like Stephen Dobbie, Martin Paterson and Mark Roberts - they have got some experience in there so we'll have to be at full tilt and make our players fully aware of everywhere they can hurt us in order for us to get a result. Next week we have no game

because we are out of the FA Cup but we'd really like to be playing. However, what it does do is give us the chance to get more work into the players tactically and technically, which is important to us. It seems that when we get the chance to prepare properly for games we respond better. The players will be looking forward to a break - they won't actually get much of a break in terms of days off because we see it as a chance to get some proper training into them - not necessarily physically but tactically and that's important to us.

It's brilliant that we will have around 3,500 local schoolchildren and their parents in attendance this afternoon. It's great for the players and I know they really appreciate it. When we get a good crowd the atmosphere goes up a notch and their performance tends to do so too. The more people we can get in the stadium, the better and even if we can get a couple of hundred people longterm to come back then that will really help us.

As always, keep the faith and keep believing.

winter all wrapped up...





GOOD afternoon and welcome to The County Ground for our final game in November – a month of mixed emotions and one of success overall.

HAVING been faced with five of the top 10 teams, our performances have indicated how we can shape up against the 'big hitters' of this division and I'm quietly confident we've placed a stake in terms of where we could be 'come what Mav'. In order to get promoted from this league, it's hugely important that we're consistent in our results. Reflecting on our 2013/2014 campaign, we regularly picked up points against top teams but dropped points against lower teams - and this caused us to slip away from promotion. Turning our attention to results so far this year and our record tells a different story: from top half opposition, we've taken 19 points from a possible 27. From bottom half opposition, we've taken 16 from a possible 27. The gap is much smaller and this will certainly help us on our journey to promotion.


To add to the consistency, it's imperative that we steal points from our closest competitors. Comparing the top four teams' points against top-ten competitors, we have the best return on points so far:

Bristol City:

While our M4 rivals may have had their best start to a season in 109 years, they've only picked up 10 out of 21 points available.

Preston North End:

The team with the noisy fans have amassed 11 out of 21 points available.

MK Dons:

A similar story here too, with only 7 out of 18 points available;

The mighty Swindon Town:

Saving the best 'til last and we've stolen 13 out of 21 points available.

While we may only be 18

games into the season, these statistics bode extremely well for us and if we can continue, we should be able to pull away from the pack and be pushing for Championship football next year.

Turning to our recent performances and it's been a rollercoaster ride. Last week's performance against Peterborough was a scrappy affair and one we would never want to repeat stylistically but it was three points, nevertheless. The last time we were at The County Ground was our win against Bristol - a euphoric day that will give us the psychological advantage before travelling to Ashton Gate later this season. Hopefully, today will not be as dramatic but our opponents, Fleetwood, come here following a defeat and looking to make amends.

Having watched them play numerous times. Graham Alexander will have his team playing football the right way but they seem to struggle on the road, so we'll look to exploit that today. If we dominate the game from the first whistle until the last, we will finish November in fantastic style.



LAST TIME OUT....

WALSALL'S Romaine Sawyers' first half strike brought an end to the Cod Army's impressive sixteen-match unbeaten home league run at Highbury, last weekend.



INTRODUCING THE COD ARMY



AFTER an incredible six promotions in ten years, the Fylde outfit arrive in Wiltshire for the first-ever competitive meeting between the two sides...

THE Cod Army's rise up through the leagues has been the stuff of footballing fairy-tale, with their debut season in the Football League- encompassing the club's previous two incarnations-coming just two seasons previous to this.

The club's 2013/14 campaign began with seven wins from ten in the league, including an impressive 1-0 victory over Portsmouth at Fratton Park, After narrowly bowing out of the League Cup to Notts County, the Fishermen proved they were more than capable of mixing it with higher-league opposition as a further four League 1 sides, including high-flying Rotherham, were all seen off in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy to bring about a two-legged showdown with fellow League 2 promotion hopefuls, Chesterfield.

Three defeats in eleven over the Christmas and New Year period boosted their push for promotion, with an unbeaten January also seeing Graham Alexander's men gain revenge over Burton Albion for an FA Cup Second Round defeat.

The initial setback of losing out on a cup final place at Wembley saw the Lancashire side register back-to-back league defeats against Mansfield and Plymouth at the end of February before they embarked on a run which would see them lose just twice in the crucial run-in; picking up twenty-four points from a possible forty-two that saw them clinch fourth spot. A 1-0 aggregate scoreline over York City was enough to see them through to a Wembley appearance, where they repeated the trick courtesy of an Antoni Sarcevic free-kick.

Fleetwood's meteoric rise has shown few signs of slowing down this season, with the club sitting 10th in the League 1 table after eighteen games. An undefeated league start to August, including a first win at this level over Crewe on the opening day, was contrasted by a winless September. With four wins and four defeats from their previous eight league fixtures, the coastal outfit are more than holding their own amongst the division's big-hitters.





IT is difficult to pin down a consistent formation for the Cod Army this season as manager, Graham Alexander tends to chop and change the system to combat the opposition's style of play. A 4-4-2 seems on the cards, based on the same line-up that drew 3-3 with Bristol City in September, a team with a comparable formation to Swindon's. The club have invested in plenty of Football League experience throughout the side, with no fewer than five players having played top flight football

and midfielders, Steven Schumacher and Jeff Hughes well versed in the rough and tumble of the lower-league game. Club Captain, Mark Roberts and ex-Blackpool man, Stephen Crainey will look to shepherd this side through pastures new, from the back, with nearly 600 league appearances between them.

Going forward, Fleetwood are strongest whilst operating in the wide areas, looking to aet neat passing triangles going and urging their fullbacks to get in behind and deliver balls into the box,


where the quick feet and reactions of their frontline can do the business. In addition, the men from the Fylde Coast are more than capable of springing a quick counter-attack with a long ball forward, meaning they are equipped to hurt the opposition through a variety of methods. Although, with just 22 goals scored this term, four out of ten 1-0 scorelines have decided ties in their favour in all competitions so there has, perhaps, been a bigger emphasis on keeping the opposition out this season.

ON-LOAN Palace man, Stephen Dobble will be one to watch as he is a real livewire in situations around the 18-yard box and has an accurate, long-range 'screamer' in his locker.

THE GAFFER



Graham Alexander

ALEXANDER enjoyed a playing career that spanned over two decades, representing the likes of Scunthorpe, Luton and Burnley but it is at Preston North End where he is perhaps best remembered, racking up more than 1,000 appearances for the Lilywhites. As a right-back he played in the Premier League and earned 40 international caps for Scotland. He was appointed as manager at Fleetwood in December 2012 after carving out a name for himself as a coach with Preston. In his first full season in charge, he guided the Cod Army to promotion via the Play-Offs last term.

KEY MEN...

33 Stephen Crainey DF

THE experienced defender began his career with Cettic, making over 50 appearances for Glasgow's 'Green and White' and helpina them win the SPL and League Cup as well as being a part of the sauad that finished runners-up in the 2003 UEFA Cup Final. His next moves were to Southampton and Leeds United before he joined Blackpool, Was part of the Seasiders team that played in the Premier League then joined Wigan Athletic in 2013. Signed for Fleetwood in the summer.




OB Steven Schumacher MF

FORMERLY an England Under-19 skipper. Schumacher came through the ranks at Everton but never managed to break into the first team at Goodison Park. After spells on loan at Carlisie and Oldham, he made the move east to join Bradford in 2004. Three years later, he signed for Crewe but, after an injury-hit spell with the Alex, the midfielder joined Bury in 2010, Captained the Shakers to promotion from League 2, repeating the feat with Fleetwood last term.



OP Stephen Dobbie FW

DOBBIE started his career with Rangers before spells with Hibernian, St. Johnstone and Queen of the South. The striker then swapped Scotland for Wales and Swansea City, Helped Blackpool clinch promotion to the top flight during a loan spell in 2010 before doing likewise with his parent club 12 months later, scoring as the Swans beat Reading at Wembley. Had further experience of the Championship Play-Offs before moving to the Fylde coast on a season-long loan.

THE stopper started his career at Wrexham. Signed by Fleetwood in May 2012 before spending time back on loan at The Racecourse

Ground. The former Wales Under-21 international has also spent time on loan at Cambridge.

THE full-back began his career with Peterborough before establishing himself in the professional game with Cheltenham Town, After three

12 years old - I was playing a year up so I was an Under-13 playing in the Under-14s. Then, Norwich wanted to come and have a look and brought me up for a trial and the rest is history. I signed for them on a two-year deal then

whole of Norwich was rocking. That spurred the first team on to bigger things that season but it was all positive and it's one thing I'll definitely remember for the rest of my life.

You've also represented England at youth level...

Yes, I played one game against

Belgium for the Under-18s and I still say the right winger I played against that day is the best I've ever played against - I can't remember his name, though.

So, 'Mr Gruffalo', it looks like that nickname is here to stay now...

Yes, definitely, from the looks of it. I went onto Twitter after the Bristol City game and everyone was calling me 'Gruffalo' and I was wondering: "what's going on here?" I saw the clip of lain Dowie calling me 'Gruffalo', 'Ruffalo' and all sorts so that's sticking for the time being.

Your parents have even jumped on that bandwagon

As soon as I walked through the door, my mum said "I've got you these" - I had a look and there was a Gruffalo advent calendar and a massive Thornton's chocolate with the Gruffalo on it so they seem to find it very amusing.

Talk us through your career: where you played as a youngster and how you came to Norwich...

I started playing at the Stevenage Centre of Excellence and playing Sunday League with my mates. Then, my parents saw that I could do more than that so I worked my way up at Stevenage and got all the way to the elite stage when I was

got offered another one to be a scholar. Then the scholarship was the Youth Cup year. It's a huge club, they're really good with their players and everyone involved, especially the fans - before and after the Youth Cup - were very supportive throughout and tweeting you which is unheard of but it's good for young players to get that sort of exposure.

You mentioned the FA Youth Cup - there aren't too many players that can claim to have won it. That must have been an amazing experience?

It was incredible - a massive team achievement from everyone involved. It was good for the club because it was a tough time but we had about 20,000 people turn up and the

For the Under-19s I got three caps and played in a friendly against Estonia and then we played in the European Championship qualifiers - I got two 90 minutes out of that.

You've come to Swindon on loan and it appears as though you've settled in really well...

Definitely - it's like you're with all your mates. It's a young squad, all around 21. I think the oldest is 'Willo' at 28 and that just speaks volumes. Then, all the way down to me as the youngest, 'Willo' has been very supportive. Also, the management are always working with me and telling me things to do. They've got bags of experience and those are the people to listen to and help me in my career.

You made your first senior appearance against Colchester. Describe that feeling of running onto the pitch...

Nerve-wracking but good to come in. I wanted to impress straight away and get on the ball and, once I had my first touch, I relaxed. Once I got the first taste of it I wanted to carry on and didn't want it to stop especially with the fans. The reception I got was good and I'm pleased I've managed to get as many appearances as I have done so far.

Then your full debut against Preston - a good result to go with that landmark occasion for you, personally?

I always thought to myself, when I was sitting on the bench: "I wonder what it's like to walk out with the boys?" We (the substitutes) go back in before they come out so you can hear the fans and your stomach's churning. When I got the experience to do it, at the time I was thinking "this is amazing" – there were quite a few people at the game as well and the team performance was impeccable.

What about Bristol City have you experienced anything like that before?

No! That was probably some of the best moments and scariest moments of my life in football. In the first minute someone got sent off and I thought 'whoah' I'm used to playing 21s games where everyone's like: "do you want a cup of tea?" and things like that. Someone got sent off then, two minutes later, I got absolutely nailed and I thought "we're in a game here - this is a derby game!" I knew it was big but didn't realise it was that big. Then smoke

bombs came on to the pitch and I'm thinking: "this is getting out of hand now" but, to get a result out of that is amazing and the players, again, were superb and the fans, with the massive turnout, it was incredible.

And an assist at Peterborough last week. Is that something you want to do a bit more of?

Definitely. I'm getting more used to the role and I feel more comfortable in it. I played leftback at Norwich and they did get forward a lot but it's an entirely different role to that one - vou're a left wing-back so you're getting forward but you also have to get back as well. The more times I play that role and work on it in training with the Gaffer and Luke, it's going to help me. One thing I've wanted to do is bring more assists into my game and possibly goals


too. Getting into that advanced position, I don't see why not.


How pleased were you to see your loan extended to the end of the season?




A lack of sleep naturally results in an individual feeling tired but the effects of sleep deprivation run much deeper than this. A reduction in speed, power and

"...the players must make sure they get eight hours of sleep a day and allow their bodies the time to perform its natural processes!"

the ability to effectively use energy stores can all affect a player's performance. In addition to this, a loss of sleep can reduce the performance of mental functions such as focus, concentration, coordination, decision-making and information processing. These are, of course, all absolutely vital when playing football.

We communicate ways in which the players can improve their sleep patterns. Firstly, we encourage them to have a regular wake-up and bed time each day. It is important to avoid caffeine, fizzy drinks, sugary foods and other stimulants before going to bed. Quiet time before sleeping is also key: the lads must allow themselves to relax property before going to sleep. This means limiting exposure to loud music, bright lights and computers just before bed. After training, some of the players might take a nap in the afternoon. This improves alertness, memory and can heighten the senses. Finally - and perhaps most importantly - the players must make sure they get eight hours of sleep a day and allow their bodies the time to perform its natural processes!

EX-TOWN striker Paul Rideout is 50 years and 107 days old today. Now there's a statistic I bet you weren't expecting...

MENTAL gymnastics can be reduced by reaching this conclusion because of what happened on this day in 1980, when Paul became our youngest ever League debutant at the age of 16 years and 107 days.

Bournemouth-born Rideout was a product of our youth system and it was as one of John Trollope's youngsters that he first came to the public's attention. Representing England at schoolboy level, Paul struck a hat-trick against Scotland at Wembley in a match that was televised live.

With Trollope replacing Bob
Smith as Town manager, the new
boss showed faith in his young
striker, handing him his debut in a
Division Three home match with
Hull City. Rideout, still on a youth
contract, immediately set about
justifying his manager's belief in
him.

Future Town player Brian
Marwood had equalised a Kenny
Stroud opener inside the first
twenty minutes but the biggest
talking point was a 35-yard effort
from Rideout that cannoned into
the net off the woodwork before
the referee disallowed it because
David Peach was standing in an
offside position.

With ten minutes to go things were all-square before defender Russell Lewis regained the lead. Then, Rideout crowned his day with a last-gasp header to bring about a 3-1 win.

So, not content with being our youngest-ever player, Paul became our youngest-ever goalscorer on the same day.

Over the course of almost 100 Town starts, Rideout collected 41 goals and that sort of strikerate was always going to attract attention.

In May 1983, after being named in the PFA Team of the Year and with Town now in Division Four, a deal worth £250,000 proved too tempting and Paul made a move to Division One side Aston Villa.

Two years later he was off to somewhere even more exotic than the Midlands!

Almost 100 games at Bari in Italy gave Paul international exposure before a return to Southampton. Goals followed everywhere he went.

A nine-match loan spell back at The County Ground saw Paul add a further strike to his Town tally then, in September 1991, he joined Notts County, then in Division One.

A £500,000 move north
to Glasgow Rangers ended
with a League and SFA Cup
double but strikers Mark
Hateley and Ally McCoist
proved difficult to displace
so, in August 1992, a similar sum
took Rideout to Everton where



he settled longer than anywhere previously.


In 1994/95 he returned 14 goals from 29 Premier League matches and scored the only goal of the FA Cup Final to win the trophy for the Toffees.

Two separate spells in China sandwiched a period at Kansas City Wizards before he wound down his playing career at Tranmere Rovers in 2002.

Almost 150 goals from just short of 600 matches had been supplemented with six England Under-21 caps by the time Paul's boots hung on the peg for the last time.





R&W turns the clock back 60 years as we continue our new feature in the 2014/15 edition of the programme...

BACK in 1954, a three-bedroomed 'semi' in Swindon could be purchased for about £2,000. Two such houses owned by Swindon Town - for renting out to players - were sold by the club in May of that year. Manager Maurice Lindley was handed £3,000 of the proceeds for team strengthening. He decided to invest two-thirds of this on one player - Matthew Gemmell - a reserve insideforward with top flight club Portsmouth, who had made just

three League appearances.

Town agreed to pay £1,000 up front and the other £1,000 four months later and, should Gemmell make 20 League appearances, a further £250 would be due. But he made just eight.

Despite the house sales, the club was still in serious financial straits and when the second instalment became due, Portsmouth were asked if it could be delayed. But by this time, April 1955, Gemmell had been

struggling for form in the reserves and had asked for a transfer home to Scotland.

After refusing terms for 1955/56, he was told that he would only be granted a transfer if his new club paid the full £2,000 that Town owed for him. The board, realising that they now had a player they were unlikely to recoup anywhere near that sum on, cheekily asked Portsmouth if the second £1,000 could be reduced - or

waived altogether!

But having been unsuccessful with that ploy, two further requests to delay payment followed until, in November 1955, Portsmouth drew up an 'easy payment' plan requesting four £250 cheques. If the first three were received on time, the fourth would be written off. But Town were still unable to

find sufficient funds for the initial sum and asked the Supporters Club to bail them out, which they did.

Meanwhile, between August and December 1955, no fewer than five attempts had been made to offload Gemmell to Scottish clubs. In July 1956 there was a glimmer of hope that he would depart, when he played for Berwick Rangers in a preseason friendly. But they decided not to make an offer for him.

After an unsuccessful plea to the board for a free transfer. Gemmell asked if he could return to the club on a part-time contract, to which they agreed and even paid for his furniture to be transported back from Scotland!

But he failed to make another League appearance and scored just twice in 25 reserve games. He eventually signed for Yeovil in July 1957 - on a 'free'l




This week in 1959

ON 27 November, former Town and Wales insideforward Grenville Morris died at the age of 82. With the club for just 21 months, he netted 41 goals in only 48 games before being sold to Nottingham Forest for a big fee (£200) in November 1898.

On this day in 1952

THE home Third Division South fixture with Levton Orient was called off at lunchtime due to a heavy downfall of snow. The game was eventually played on a Wednesday afternoon in March, when only 2,980 were present - Town's lowest home League gate for 15 years. It ended all square at 1-1.




THE on-loan Southampton man admitted to R&W this week that the month of November had vielded a fruitful points return for Swindon Town. "It's definitely been a good month for us", he said. "We had MK Dons away before the Preston game and we were disappointed to lose that but to come away with nine points from those three games we're delighted because, on paper, they are three really tough games. Obviously, we've put ourselves in a good position now and we need to push on.

"We look forward to every game but it's nice at the moment not having Tuesday games so we can get fully recovered for the Saturday. It's important to keep the momentum up."

Stephens' first taste of a West Country derby with Bristol City came last season when he made his first Swindon appearance at Ashton Gate where both sides played out a 0-0 draw. After victory over City a fortnight ago, the defender says that he enjoyed the experience of a derby at SN1.

He explained: "It was quite tasty from the first couple of minutes but I thought it was brilliant. The atmosphere was brilliant, the fans were really good and it was a positive atmosphere which is what you want at a football match."

The 1-0 win over City saw

Stephens take up a position as a holding midfielder, a role which is not unfamiliar to the Southampton youngster.

Playing with two sitting midfielders instead of one makes it a bit more solid which helps out the back three too. Playing in the back three usually, I know what they need in front of them.

In his advanced position, the defender at times finds himself driving at the heart of the opposition back-line. "I nearly got a nosebleed up there," he joked. "I don't think the Gaffer would be too happy if he sees me standing up there regularly. I've just got to enjoy it and keep getting in the right positions. I think I need to calm down a bit (with my shooting) because I haven't hit the target yet!"

Turning his attention to this afternoon's League 1 clash, Stephens declared that Town must maintain their performance levels, starting with a positive result against the Cod Army today.

He continued: "We just need to keep the performances up and the results will stay as they are, then we'll keep climbing the league. They (Fleetwood) have had a few good results recently but they lost their last game. They look like a good side and like to play out from the back so, hopefully, it will be a good football match."

We've got Wolverhampton Wanderers next week and then our Under-15s are out as well, playing West Bromwich Albion so that will be another good test to see where we are against the Category One schedule and structure and see if we can compete with them. It's review

time already for the older ones the Under-13s upwards - they're in currently for their six-week reviews. Since Camilla Henderson has been on board with the Sports Psychology side of things it has been going down really well. We think that's an important part of their development so as well as the technical, tactical and social side, the psychological element is a big thing for us within the Academy to make sure that, if there are one or two problems that we can't see. Camilla can sit down with them in workshops. The Sports Scientist looks after all the other aspects as well as using the analyst and individual programmes now. The players have got so much in their development programme and, from my point of view, I've got to make sure everything is possible in order to enhance these players in their development to become a Youth Team player or even a First Team player.

Finally the Academy would like to say a big thank you to the STFC Supporters Club for once again raising some money from the dinners at The Fox in Denchworth.

The money raised at this month's dinner has paid for a new starter motor and alternator for the lawnmower at the Academy training ground, which we are very much grateful for, as without the lawnmower, the Academy games would not be able to go ahead.

FIRSTLY, we were disappointed not to get through in the FA Youth Cup because of the draw that we had been handed in the next round.

WE would have played Manchester City away and it would have been a good place for us to go and showcase what we've been working on and how we've playing but it's not to be. We were very disappointed with the result and also slightly disappointed with the way we performed on the night as well. Playing in the FA Youth Cup is a massive part of the players' development. They're playing at stadiums, under the floodlights and in front of a crowd so, as I say, I think it's a very big part of their development and it's good for me as well because I can look at what sort of characters they are. When we play weekto-week on a park in front of nobody you don't find out as much as you do when there's a little more pressure on. You then find out a little bit more about them as individuals.

Last week, Portsmouth beat us 4-3 but it was a game where I played three of our Under-16s. I am looking to do that more now - with the 16s coming through for next year, we're looking at giving them more game time in the Under-18s. That's important to us that we keep bringing them through. They were very good and performed very well. It showed me that they could cope with playing up a level against a good Portsmouth side. I took the development game at Forest Green Rovers earlier this week and was pleased with



the way my boys performed alongside the professionals. That's the ultimate platform that they want to be striving towards they want to be playing with the first team pros more and they want to be in that environment more and, of course, it's always pleasing that, when they do go and play with the pros, they put the message out that they can cope with it and I think they did more than that. I was very pleased with the way they played, not just the young boys but the professionals as well because these development games can sometimes become games where the tempo is not quite like a proper game. We showed the attitude that we wanted to make it as realistic as possible by making sure the tempo was right and making sure

we passed the ball properly and we made good decisions on the ball. We worked extremely hard and got something out of the 90 minutes so it was good all-round for the professionals and the younger ones.

This week, in particular, we've been working on retaining possession higher up the pitch. We are a possession-based team - very similar to the first team - and we end up playing a lot of possession in our own third because we play out from the back. We want to try and bring the ball up quicker and we want to try and retain it higher up the pitch, for us to get better possession in areas where we can hurt the opposition.

FLETWOOD Town arrive here at The County Ground this afternoon enjoying a first season at this level after being promoted last May by beating Burton Albion 1-0 in the Play-Off Final at Wembley Stadium.

THE club have made a rapid rise through the non-league football pyramid and, after reformation back in 1997, were placed in the North-West Counties League which is now the 10th tier of the English league system, Graham Alexander has been at the helm since December 2012 and must take much of the credit for rebuilding the squad and achieving promotion during only his second season in charge.

Today's game will see top scorer, Michael Smith, fit and available for selection again after his unfortunate shoulder injury during the previous midweek restricted him to a place on the substitutes' bench at Peterborough last Saturday. Last weekend, I had the privilege of being match commentator at London Road and what a great victory it proved to be. Mark Cooper resisted the temptation of putting our two internationals

straight back into the side after our defeat of Bristol City and what another great call that turned out to be, with some quite outstanding individual performances throughout the team for large parts of the game including, for me, a man of the match performance from our young defender, Jack Stephens, whose passing range in the anchor role in front of the back three was quite simply perfection - I can't remember him misplacing a single pass

and he was the focal point of many attacking moves. Harry Toffolo gave another assured display down the left flank his decision-making is good, knowing when to pass and when to run with the ball, providing a number of auality crosses and he gave a beautifully-weighted and accurate final pass for Andy Williams to cooly dispatch a firsttime shot onto the post and in for our opening goal. finally like to draw your attention to the club's Christmas Carol Service. Head to the news page for all the details but the event at Christchurch promises to be a really fun evening so warm up


