WELCOME back to The County Ground for this League 1 meeting with Chesterfield. I'd like to welcome Paul Cook, his staff and his players.

FROM a greedy point of view, we should have picked up six points from our last two games but we'll take four points from two away games. We had two good performances, two mainly dominant performances and, I must say, the travelling support was fantastic for both games. I didn't think Coventry was as dominant a performance as Fleetwood, though. In the first half at Coventry, obviously, to go in 2-0 up at half time - it's always a dangerous scoreline but we came out and we controlled the game in the second half and made it an enjoyable evening. 


REFLECTING on the Christmas schedule and you know what? We can be very pleased indeed. By picking up seven from a possible nine points, we've set ourselves up nicely for January.



THE Spireites needed extra time to overcome Scunthorpe United and tee up a trip to Derby County in the FA Cup Fourth Round on Tuesday night. Sam Clucas struck twice in extra time to seal victory.



INTRODUCING THE SPIREITES



HAVING returned to England's third tier with a record fourth 'Fourth Division' title in the trophy cabinet, the Derbyshire outfit are looking upwards in the bid for successive promotions...

AN undefeated start, through to the end of September saw Chesterfield drop just two points in their opening eight league fixtures in 2013/14. A first meeting with Leeds for sixty-three years saw them bow out of the Capital One Cup, with two goals in two minutes cancelling out Eoin Doyle's eventual Goal of the Season effort. After their first league loss of the season, to Mansfield, the club endured a tricky October, winning just once against the same opponents in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy. A competition that the club has prospered in during recent seasons, the carrot of a Wemblev appearance loomed large once more, as Rochdale and Oldham were dispatched before the turn of the year to set up a Northern Area Final showdown with fellow promotion hopefuls, Fleetwood.

Progression over non-league Daventry Town in the FA Cup included a run of four straight victories that ensured the Spireites maintained a challenge on three fronts going into the second portion of the campaian. A heavy defeat away to their FA Cup conquerors, Southend, in January saw Paul Cook's men suffer just two further league defeats; both coming away from the Proact Stadium. A 3-1 loss to Town's conquerors, Peterborough, in the JPT showpiece failed to take the aloss off a successful season however as, come the encounter with Fleetwood in May. the club's magnificent home form had secured them a record championship.

With just four home defeats in all competitions this season and their previous league reverse occurring back in October of 2013, to Burton Albion (prior to August's clash with MK Dons), the club are embarking on a run to the second tier for the first time in the post-war era, as they sit firmly in the Play-Off mix and face a trip to near-neighbours, Derby County in the FA Cup Fourth Round.



WE have recently seen how a counter-attacking 4-4-2 can unsettle Town at home and, similarly to Doncaster, Chesterfield are no different in preferring the long ball up to the physical front two in order to initiate fast, sweeping attacks on the opposition's 18-vard box. What makes the ploy so successful is the amount of bodies they commit forward from midfield positions as, often, both central midfielders oblige in snaffling an opportunity to run past the forward line. A comparable pattern is found in their wing-play whereby the crossing ability of ex-Robin, Gary Roberts ensures the team can afford to send three men

into the area, pressurising the box with bodies and causing uncertainty among defenders in the process.

Perhaps the biggest attacking threat to Town today will be the presence of English League top-scorer, Eoin Doyle. With 23 goals to his name so far, the striker has the traits of being able to sniff out a poacher's chance and go it alone if need be; things that come more naturally to a player with boundless off-the-ball movement. The club will need to keep their star player fit and firing if their hopes for successive promotions are to materialise this season.

At the back, the return of experienced head, lan Evatt has no doubt helped the Spireites maintain their fine solidity from last season: since three setbacks in October, the club are currently unbeaten on the road in eight fixtures in all competitions and have conceded in just three games out of eight away from the Proact, going back to Town's win there in that same month. However, the manner in which Chesterfield concede goals should encourage Swindonplaying a flat back-four with a high line has meant that spaces appear more readily between full-back and centre-half, giving licence for wide-players and midfield runners to attack the space beyond.

MEET THE GAFFER



Paul Cook

IN a career spanning over 20 years as a player, Cook represented the likes of Wigan, Norwich, Wolves and Coventry before finishing his career with Accrington Stanley. Took his first steps in coaching with Stanley then went on to manage Sligo Rovers, taking the Irish side into European competition. Was appointed boss at Chesterfield in October 2012 and, in his first full season at the Proact Stadium, guided the Spireites to the League 2 title last term.

DURING his time in Ireland with Sligo Rovers, Cook helped with the development of a number of young players, including Everton's current international full-back. Seamus Coleman.

KEY MEN...

04 Sam Hird DF

THE centre-half was a schoolboy at Aston Villa before joining the academy at Leeds United. Hird then joined Doncaster Rovers in 2007 and would help his hometown side into the Championship, starting the Play-Off Final win over Leeds at Wembley. He was a regular fixture at the Keepmoat Stadium before joining Chesterfield in 2012. Also comfortable operating as a holding midfielder, Hird scored in the game that clinched the League 2 title last term.



11 Gary Roberts MF

A familiar face to Town supporters, having played a part in Swindon's ultimately unsuccessful Play-Off campaian in 2012/13. The winger was at Liverpool as a vounaster and went on to play in the Welsh leagues before helping Accrington Stanley gain Football League status. Then went on to play for loswich and Huddersfield ahead of his switch to Wiltshire, Last term, he was named in the PFA Team of the Year and was voted the League 2 Player of the Year.



17 Eoin Doyle FW

ONE of the hottest properties in League 1 at the moment, the Irishman has already plundered over 20 goals in all competitions this term. Made his name in Irish football where he worked under current boss. Paul Cook, at Sligo Rovers. After a brief spell with Hibernian north of the border, he signed for Chesterfield last summer and finished as the Spireites' top scorer last term. This season, he became the first Chesterfield player to score back-to-back hat-tricks in successive league games.




You've got another game under your belt now and it seems as if you've settled in already...

Then I went to Portsmouth, got signed for a year then got released again. I then played Sunday League again in Southampton for about a vear. I just worked hard and got another chance at Chelsea and ended up signing. It's the best

Then not long after that, England honours followed where you met some of the squad here at Swindon for the first time...

My first involvement with Enaland was in the Victory Shield - I came on against Wales and I think we lost 4-0 in the end. A few years later I got into the Under-18s or Under-19s with Jack Stephens and Jordan Turnbull and I really enjoyed it there. Knowing those players from England to then come to Swindon, it was a lot easier to make friends in the team and get into training. Having them there made it a lot more comfortable.

2012 must have been a special year for you. An FA Youth Cup win and a pro contract offer too ...

Winning the Youth Cup was amazing. Everyone takes it seriously at Chelsea - it was a weird run we took but we had a great team and it was an amazing experience playing at different stadiums and even playing a two-legged final was a weird experience. To top it off with a new contract was amazing for me and my family to know I was going to stay a bit longer.

Some people have already made comparisons with Frank Lampard. That must be extremely flattering?

Yeah, definitely. To be compared to a world class player like Frank is amazing. I was actually lucky enough to get a meeting with him to talk about my game and help me with that.

I had a meeting with my Under-21s manager and he said if any of you players want to talk to the first team and ask them about your game you're free to do it. I had a talk with my agent and we thought it would be a great experience

to talk to a player like Frank. I rana my manager and said I'd like to do that and he was great with it - he said yes straight away. I had a 20 minute chat with him and it felt surreal really to be sat there with a player like him getting his thoughts on how to get better and what he did to get better.

Think back to Cardiff at the end of last season. How special was it to make your senior debut?


I got told about two or three days before that I'd be travelling. I was already training with them and then it was the day before they said I was definitely going to be on the bench. I was delighted with that - just to be told I was travelling was amazing then to finally come on: my family and everyone was there and I think my mum was crying. It was an amazing moment for me and my family after all that hard work it was good to get a reward.

Well, you're in Wiltshire for the rest of the season. The games can't seem to come quickly enough at the moment can they?

The players have been great with me from the get-go, training has been great and the fact that Swindon want to play football and keep passing through teams - I can adapt really well to it. I know I need to get better, keep going, do my best and hopefully get some more goals and more assists and help Swindon towards winning the league. I've got a lot more to give but I'm really excited. I'm looking forward making my home debut - I can't wait for it to be honest. I'll do my best for the team and hopefully, if we play as well as we did at Coventry and get a few goals, we can win the game – that's the most important thing.

UNDERTAKING a 90 minute game of football is an extremely taxing task for the human body. Therefore, on its completion, there are numerous ways to aid in the body's recovery.

R&W turns the clock back 60 years as we continue our new feature in the 2014/15 edition of the programme...

AMONGST a batch of 14 lads signed by Town straight from school in June 1956 was Highworth-born Bobby Woodruff, the only one to reach the League side.


Two years later he helped the club's 'B' side lift three trophies in the space of eight days, earning himself a first outing for the reserve side in the final fixture of 1957/58. It was away at Fulham and Bobby scored the only goal.

His initial taste of life in
the first team came on a
'blank' Saturday, when Town's
League opponents - and Cup
conquerors - Norwich were still
engaged in that competition.
A friendly was arranged at
Headington (now Oxford) United
and, although Bert Head put
out his strongest squad, Bobby
was brought on as a half-time
substitute. Within five minutes of

his introduction, he scored what would prove to be the winning goal following a solo run.

Three weeks later, on 14
February 1959, Bobby made his
League debut, replacing Andy
Micklewright at centre-forward.
Visitors Chesterfield had a
highly-rated 21 year old keeper
making only his twelfth League
appearance - Gordon Banks.
Unfortunately,

Bobby's chances of continuing his scoring habit were inhibited when keeper Sam Burton had to go off with an injured left hand ten minutes after the break. With no substitutes allowed in competitive games, inside-forward Bob Edwards took over in goal and Bobby had less support. Skipper Maurice Owen netted twenty minutes from

time, to cancel out an early Brian Frear goal, but with just six minutes left slack defensive play let in Arthur Bottom and Swindon went down 2-1.



With both Edwards and Micklewright on reserve team duty, Bobby's next first team opportunity came on Good Friday. But 'lady luck' again deserted the youngster - and more so Owen - when the veteran was carried off with a broken leg at Doncaster, forcing Swindon to play 75 minutes with ten men.

As the 1950's drew to a close, Bobby was given his first lengthy run in the League side at lefthalf, scoring a late winner against Grimsby on his first appearance in his new role.

He soon began to develop a technique that he would later become an effective weapon for Town - the long throw - which eventually enabled him to launch the ball over forty yards.

BEFORE Christmas, I took the Under-12s, Under-13s and a couple of Under-11s to St. George's Park which was an unbelievable experience for them.

I'M quite fortunate to spend a lot of time up there but some of the players and the staff have not been there before.

We had a session with James Parsons, our Academy analyst, then we did some work in groups.

These boys have to do presentations and feedback, so they're working on their presentation skills, social skills and general life skills. We get them up at the front

talking about systems and their positives and negatives. We were also fortunate enough to eat in Club England where the England squads dine. Then it was down to the indoor area for training. We finished training at around 9pm and the kids didn't want to come off! Then in the morning, we had a bit of a debrief looking at what we've achieved alongside the objectives and the aims of the trip to then take that back into their own development programme. We had the first team coach as well so it was a fantastic trip and we're looking at doing the same in May.

We've signed six more Under-16s and we've offered nine of our current Under-16s scholarships for 2015/16 so we've got a good group. We've still got decisions to make on the rest of the boys in



the nine to the five current first year scholars, it takes us up to 14

for next season. We still want to fill some more places and we'd like to do that with our current U16s.

We're going to the Cayman Islands in February to compete in the tournament which we won last year. That will be our 1999 aroup so the majority of the team that went to the Milk Cup will go out. We've got the Cayman national team, QPR are coming out this year, along with Houston Dynamo so it's going to be a difficult week we've got three games in three days out there so there is a lot of planning and preparation to do and we're already looking at the logistics. It's another tournament that we're looking forward to and then the U10s-U15s are

back in the **Netherlands** over the two weeks of Easter, Again, it's a very demanding week for

all the players especially for the young ones and the ones that have not gone to the Netherlands before so it's educating them to look after themselves, making sure they prepare right when they're playing games every day. Their aim is, ultimately, to become professional footballers so that's the reason we try and take these players away on tours to get good habits into them. They're understanding more about their body and time management as well as working on their social skills so that's a huge thing for all of the academy staff and all the players that we continue to do that.





R&W looks ahead to Swindon's trip to the red side of Sheffield.



TOWN'S next road trip takes them back up north to Yorkshire and Sheffield United. In the corresponding fixture last term, Mark Cooper's men went down by a single goal to nil. Town have not scored a goal at Bramall Lane since May 2000 when a double from Giuliano Grazioli secured a 2-2 draw. Town fans have to look back as far as 1970 for the last time a Swindon side claimed a victory at the home of the Blades. John Trollope and Arthur Horsfield helped seal a 2-1 win over second-placed United and push the visitors closer to the Division Two promotion places. Swindon's record at Bramall Lane doesn't

make for pretty reading: from the last ten trips, Town have only picked up two points, scoring just seven goals in the process. Former defender Jay McEveley has featured regularly for the Blades this term since signing for United in the summer and played 90 minutes earlier this season as Swindon ran out 5-2 winners at The County Ground.


