





AMARI MORGAN-SMITH IN CONVERSATION

Summer signing **Amari Morgan-Smith** must be the most unlucky player at SportsDirect.com Park, writes Tony Bugby.

The 25-year-old striker is hoping that troubles only come in threes after suffering his third injury lay off in little over half of his debut season.

"I have been unlucky because, but for injuries, I am sure I would have featured much more in what has been a stop-start season," he explained.

"The latest injury has been especially frustrating as I had just got back in the side and got possession of the shirt."

Morgan-Smith, who signed from Conference club Kidderminster Harriers, limped out of the 3-0 home league win against Notts County with a hamstring injury having not long before scored his second goal for the club.

"It is a grade two tear and I should imagine I will be out for between three and four weeks," he lamented. Morgan-Smith had earlier in the season sustained a freak knee injury in training with nobody around him and that was followed by surgery for a hernia."

Once he has regained fitness, Morgan-Smith is looking for a clean bill of health and extended run of games in the remainder of the season as he bids to extend his stay with Latics.

"My contract expires at the end of June, but there is an option for a second year which is what I am striving to achieve," he continued.

Morgan-Smith, who has made four starts and 11 substitute appearances, acknowledges he will have a battle on his hands to regain his place, more so after strikers Conor Wilkinson and Rhys Murphy were signed on transfer deadline day.

Latics also have 14-goal top scorer Jonathan Forte, Dominic Poleon and Danny Philliskirk who can operate up front providing manager Lee Johnson with plentiful strike options.

Morgan-Smith, a lifelong Manchester United fan, said: "I personally view it as a challenge, a plus and not a minus. "We have five or six strikers which can only be healthy for the squad rather than the team automatically picking itself.

"The more players we have, the greater the headache for the gaffer to pick his best team. At least he always has options to change things."

Morgan-Smith, who lists Andy Cole, Ian Wright and Thierry Henry as the strikers he admired most growing up, enjoyed playing up front alongside Dominic Poleon in the games before his latest injury.

He continued: "I think we worked well together. The gaffer asked up to press high up the pitch, work the channels and turn defenders.

"There are a few centre halves in League One who are getting towards the end of their careers and don't like turning back.

"We tried to get Mike Jones and Carl Winchester to get the ball down in midfield and play it into the front two." Morgan-Smith has been impressed with Forte's contribution explaining Latics did well to hold on to him

during the transfer window as he had been the subject of interest from clubs.

"Jonathan has played very well and is a very good player as you can see as he has come from Southampton, a Premier League club. And I am sure he looks at it as a stepping stone for himself to get back to a high level," he went on.

Morgan-Smith can see no reason why Latics won't qualify for the promotion play offs continuing: "We have a very good squad and some talented players and I believe we can finish in the top six.

"We have been inconsistent of late, and we need to get a run going like we did earlier in the season. It is still far better than last season when the team was battling relegation."

Morgan-Smith is also pleased with the way he has acclimatised to League One having played most of his football in the Conference.

"I have enjoyed working with the gaffer, Tommy Wright and Dean Holden, and I believe I am a better player than when I arrived.

"I have moved up two divisions, but this level has not been too much of a big surprise. Now I want to kick on and play at the highest level possible, hopefully with Oldham."

Morgan's footballing journey to Latics has certainly been an eventful one which has featured numerous twists and turns.

He kicked off his playing days at Wolves, his home city club, who spotted his potential at the age of nine, though in those days he also played wide left or midfield as well as up top.

After being released by Wolves aged 14, Morgan-Smith continued his football education at Crewe Alexandra's much-acclaimed Academy where he spent four fruitful years as a schoolboy and then a scholar.

And it was while at Crewe that Morgan-Smith received a call up to the England under-17 squad, ironically as a central midfielder. Sadly he didn't get to play for his country, though he admitted it was still proud to be selected.


He said: "Crewe has always been renowned for producing good youth players, the list of those who have gone on to greater things is endless.

"We always had England scouts at our games, and that is how I was spotted.


"I was at Crewe between the ages of 14/18 and it was a very good place to learn your trade. I was coached by Steve Holland who is now assistant manager to Steve Davis."

After being released by Crewe, Morgan-Smith had one season at Stockport County who were then in League One, though his opportunities were limited.

AMARI MORGAN-SMITH IN CONVERSATION

It was after being released that he decided to rebuild his career at non-league Ilkeston Town who were managed by well-known former League players Darren Caskey and Kevin Wilson.

"Sometimes in life you have to step down before you can step back up again which is what I did at Ilkeston where I had two good seasons and scored a hatful of goals," he explained.

Morgan-Smith, who netted 34 goals in 77 games for Ilkeston, then stepped back up to Conference level when he signed for Luton Town.

"Ilkeston went bust at the time I was leaving. I wanted to get as much money as possible for them to save the club, but in the end I went on a free," he recalled. Morgan-Smith helped Luton reach the play-off final in each of his two seasons at Kenilworth Road, but they were pipped by York and Wimbledon who won back their League status.

"We were unlucky to get so close. It is difficult to get back into the Football League with only one team going up automatically," he remarked.

He was also selected at this time for play for England C, the national team for non-league football.

When Luton offered Morgan-Smith a "downgraded deal" he decided to move on and, after training pre-season with Dean Saunders at Doncaster Rovers, he joined Macclesfield Town.

It wasn't an especially happy time as the Silkmen used 40 players during the 2012/13 season. And towards the end of the season he moved to Kidderminster Harriers on loan.

That materialised into a permanent transfer at the end of the campaign and last season was spent at Aggborough, scoring 11 goals for the club.

His performances attracted attention and last summer Latics made a move as did Newport County and a couple of other Conference clubs.

"I wanted to play at a level as high as possible which is why I chose Oldham, and I am glad I made the move here," he declared. ●

Athletic recorded their first home victory since November with an emphatic 3-0 win over Notts County.

George Elokobi gave Latics the lead on the half hour mark and two minutes later, Amari Morgan-Smith doubled the lead with a neat finish past the goalkeeper.

First half substitute Jonathan Forte wrapped up the game in the second half as he headed home his 14th goal of the season to seal a superb victory.

Latics started the game brightly, dominated possession and maybe should have been ahead on five minutes.

Dominic Poleon, who was starting his third game in succession, smashed over the bar after being presented with a chance from eight yards.

Liam Kelly and Mike Jones received a lot of the ball early on and looked to split open the Notts County defence.

The game started to get scrappy and County took a foothold on the game on 20 minutes.

Debutant Jake Kean was forced to tip over a Will Hayhurst free kick mid-way through the half as the Magpies knocked on the door of the opening goal.

The visitors almost profited just before the half hour mark as Brian Wilson misread a pass back to him but the defence managed to recover and clear the danger.

Minutes later, Latics took the lead * through the head of birthday boy, George Elokobi.

Morgan-Smith's shot was blocked as far Kelly who crossed perfectly onto the head of Elokobi and he wrong-footed the goalkeeper to give Latics a one goal advantage.

The Magpies goalkeeper made himself unpopular with the home supporters and was booked by the referee for dissent after the first goal.

The home side were rocking and two minutes later, they extended their lead courtesy of Morgan Smith.

The striker latched onto a perfectly weighted through ball over the top by Carl Winchester and finished confidently past Carroll to extend the home side's lead.

Athletic were in the ascendancy and Jones almost released Poleon through

on goal five minutes before the break but the striker could not latch on to it.

Morgan-Smith was forced off with injury on 42 minutes and received a standing ovation for his efforts.

Latics had to be aware just before the break as County led siege on the home side's goal. An in swinging corner was almost put away at the back post but between Connor Brown and Kean, Latics managed to clear.

County started the second half strongly and could have pulled back on 50 minutes. Haydn Hollis rose highest from a corner but could not direct his header on target.

Latics did have the chance five minutes later to extend their lead. Winchester won the ball on the edge of the Magpies box and the ball ricocheted into the path of Forte.

The forward fed Poleon who was in acres of space in the box but shot straight at Carroll and the chance went begging.

Five minutes later, Poleon was presented with an even better chance to open his account for the afternoon but again he was denied by Carroll.

From that resulting shot, the ball was cleared into the path of Winchester who shot from the edge of the box but Carroll pulled off a wonderful save to deny his Northern-Ireland teammate.

Jonathan Forte, who was brought on to replace Morgan-Smith, almost scored an acrobatic effort from the resulting corner but the crossbar denied the forward of his 14th goal of the season.

Latics started to dominate proceedings and looked the most likely to extend their lead.



Danny Philliskirk forced a smart save from Carroll on 67 minutes and Forte volleyed wide on 70 as the home side were threatening.

On 73 minutes, they did make that pressure count as they went three goals ahead.

Winchester dummied the ball into the path of Brown; he crossed perfectly on to the head of Forte who powered home his 14th of the season past Carroll.

Latics were not settling for three and went in search of the fourth goal but had to be aware as County looked to threaten on the break.

Crosses and corners were coming into the Athletic box but Kean demanded his area and thwarted the danger.

Latics kept possession well and saw out the game professionally and the result puts Latics up to 9th position, two points outside the Sky Bet League One play off places.


CURRENT PLAYER ADAM LOCKWOOD

Centre back Adam arrived at SportsDirect.com Park on a free transfer in January 2014 following a brief spell in non-league at Guiseley. He made his debut as a second half substitute in the game against Wolves on 28th January before scoring his first goal in Oldham colours against MK Dons in February. At the end of the 2013/14 season Adam's contract was extended by a year until the end of the 2014/15 season. Manager Lee Johnson appointed Lockwood as club captain at the start of the current season but he has yet to feature so far due to various injuries. Adam began his career at Reading, signing a professional deal in August 1999 after leaving Leeds United as a youth player. He spent time on loan at Maidenhead United and Forest Green Rovers before making the switch to Yeovil in September 2001, initially on loan. The deal was turned into a permanent one a month later and he remained at Huish Park for five years. In the summer of 2006 Doncaster Rovers came calling and Lockwood remained with them until July 2012, amassing 179 appearances during that time. His next career move was to Bury but his spell was cut short in September 2013 after just 14 months at the JD Stadium. A brief spell at Guiseley followed before making the switch to Oldham after impressing in the small numbers of games he played in non-league.



PAST PLAYER CHRIS TAYLOR

Also played for: Millwall, Blackburn Rovers.

28 year old Chris Taylor was a product of the Oldham youth system and he signed a professional deal with the Latics ahead of the 2005/06 season. He made his debut in the 3-0 win over Nottingham Forest at SportsDirect.com Park in February 2006 but it wasn't until March 2007 against Carlisle when he scored his first goal in Oldham colours. Taylor's spell as a professional at Oldham lasted seven years, during which he made just under 300 appearances. A move to Millwall came about in the summer of 2012 with Chris signing a one year deal. His spell didn't last very long down South as it was revealed in May 2013 that he would be signing for Blackburn Rovers after his contract expired. His debut came in the 1-1 draw against Derby in August 2013 with his first goal for the club coming three days later in the Capital One Cup game against Carlisle. Taylor has so far made 48 appearances for the Ewood Park club, scoring three goals - all in cup competitions.





Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles ten winners of Swindon Town's 'Player of the Year' award.


MIKE SUMMERBEE

Brilliant winger Mike Summerbee was capped eight times by England after leaving Swindon Town. Initially with Cheltenham Town, he moved to the County Ground in March 1960 and was an important figure in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion success. He netted 39 goals in 218 League games prior to joining Manchester City for £35,000 in August 1965, amassing a vast collection of honours under the Joe Mercer and Malcolm Allison partnership at Maine Road. Later playing for Burnley, Blackpool and Stockport County, where player-manager, he has since been a successful businessman and his son Nicky also starred for Swindon Town.



JOE BUTLER

Versatile midfielder Joe Butler was Swindon Town's 'Player of the Year' in 1969-70 and 1972-73. He turned professional with hometown Newcastle United in September 1960, given his League debut against Manchester City in April 1964, but failed to secure a regular first-team slot and joined Swindon in August 1965. Starring in their 1968-69 promotion and League Cup 'double' success, he was ever-present in two consecutive seasons and helped the Robins to win the Anglo-Italian Cup in 1970. He netted 18 goals in 342 League games prior to joining Aldershot in March 1976, then played for Witney Town. Settling in Swindon, he has run a taxi firm.



PETER DOWNSBOROUGH

Goalkeeper Peter Downsborough was ever-present 'Player of the Year' in Swindon Town's 1968-69 promotion and League Cup 'double' success. Signing professional for hometown Halifax in September 1960, he moved to the County Ground in exchange for Bill Atkins in August 1965. He was ever-present as Swindon reached the FA Cup sixth round in 1969-70 and made 274 League appearances prior to joining Bradford City in November 1973. Twice ever-present, he starred as they reached the FA Cup sixth round in 1975-76 and won promotion in 1976-77. He had a testimonial match in May 1980 and later worked at a power station, settling in Stainland.

DON ROGERS

England U-23 winger Don Rogers scored twice in Swindon Town's 1969 League Cup final success. Signing professional at the County Ground in October 1962, he featured in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion campaign and was ever-present in four successive seasons. He starred as the Robins won promotion again in 1968-69 and the Anglo-Italian Cup in 1970, reuniting with Bert Head at Crystal Palace in November 1972. Moving to QPR in September 1974, he rejoined Swindon in March 1976 and netted 148 goals in 412 League games overall before reuniting with Stan Harland at Yeovil Town in March 1977. He has since run his own sports shop in Swindon.


JOHN TROLLOPE

Long-serving left-back John Trollope holds Swindon Town's appearance record. Signing professional at the County Ground in July 1960, he made his League debut in Swindon's 1-1 draw at home to Halifax Town a month later and was ever-present in seven consecutive seasons including the 1962-63 promotion success. He featured in Swindon's 1968-69 promotion and League Cup 'double' campaign as well as their 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup final triumph. Scoring 21 goals in 770 League games for Swindon, he was their coach, then manager between November 1980 and March 1983. Later Swindon's youth team boss, he was awarded the MBE.




COLIN CALDERWOOD

Central defender Colin Calderwood was capped 36 times by Scotland after leaving Swindon Town. Signing professional for Mansfield Town in March 1982, he moved to the County Ground in July 1985 and was 'Player of the Year' as Swindon stormed to the Fourth Division title in 1985-86. He also starred as they won promotion in 1986-87, then featured in two further play-off finals including the 1993 Wembley triumph. Scoring 20 times in 330 League games, he moved to Tottenham Hotspur in July 1993, then Aston Villa and Nottingham Forest. He later managed Northampton Town, Forest and Hibernian, since assisting Chris Hughton at various clubs.



SHAUN TAYLOR

Influential central defender Shaun Taylor captained Swindon Town to the Second Division title and FA Cup fifth round in 1995-96. He impressed with Bideford before moving to Exeter City in December 1986 and skippered their 1989-90 Fourth Division title triumph. Joining Swindon in July 1991, he was ever-present as the Robins won promotion to the Premier League in 1992-93. He was their 'Player of the Year' three times and netted 30 goals in 212 League games while at the County Ground. Moving to Bristol City in September 1996, he captained them to promotion glory in 1997-98. He has since coached at Exeter City and Torquay United.



FRASER DIGBY

England U-21 goalkeeper Fraser Digby was Swindon Town's 'Player of the Year' on three occasions. Initially with Manchester United, he reunited with Lou Macari at Swindon in September 1986, appearing in their 1986-87 promotion campaign. He was ever-present in 1988-89, starring as the Robins qualified for the play-offs in consecutive seasons including their 1993 Wembley triumph and were League Cup semi-finalists in 1994-95. Also featuring in the 1995-96 Second Division title success, he had a testimonial match in July 1997 and played 417 League games, joining Crystal Palace in August 1998, then Barry Town, QPR and Kidderminster Harriers.

ALAN McLOUGHLIN

Republic of Ireland international midfielder Alan McLoughlin was 'Player of the Year' when Swindon Town reached the Second Division play-off final in 1989-90. Starting with Manchester United, he reunited with Lou Macari at Swindon in August 1986 and helped qualify for the play-offs in successive years. He scored 19 times in 106 League games before sold to Southampton for £1,000,000 in December 1990. Moving to Portsmouth in February 1992, he was ever-present as they reached the First Division play-offs in 1992-93. He joined Wigan Athletic in November 1999, then played for Rochdale and Forest Green Rovers, since holding coaching posts.

LEE PEACOCK

Former Scotland U-21 striker Lee Peacock was 'Player of the Year' when Swindon Town won promotion in 2006-07. Initially with Carlisle United, he helped them to win the Auto Windscreens Shield and promotion in 1996-97. He joined Mansfield Town in October 1997 and moved via Manchester City to Bristol City in August 2000. Starring as they won the LDV Vans Trophy and reached the Second Division play-offs in 2002-03, he joined Sheffield Wednesday in July 2004. He moved to Swindon in January 2006 and netted 20 goals in 125 League games before joining Grimsby Town in January 2010, then Havant & Waterlooville and Eastleigh.


Goals from Chris Taylor and Dale Stephens secured victory for Oldham against Swindon.

THE CLUB

- Swindon Town Football Club has spent 32 of its 87 League seasons in League one (third tier), with a further 30 in the former Division 3 South. The club's home ground, where it has played for 120 years since 1896, is the County Ground overlooking the famous Magic Roundabout, the stadium has a capacity of 15,728.
- The club was founded in 1879, became professional in 1894 and entered the Football League in 1920. It has enjoyed periods of success, most notably during 1968–70, winning the 1969 League Cup by defeating Arsenal at Wembley Stadium and securing promotion to the Second Division. League Cup success earned the club its first invitations to European competitions, but they were not eligible to participate because they played in the then Third Division. So as compensation they were entered into the 1969 Anglo-Italian League Cup and the 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup, with Swindon winning both the competitions. These wins were led by the club's talisman winger Don Rogers. The South Stand at the County Ground was deservedly named after him from the 2007–08 season.
- Swindon Town won promotion to the Premier League in 1992 along side Luton (who were founder members) the only time the club has played in the top level of English football. Swindon was the second team to win promotion to the Premier League via the play-offs, beating Leicester City. This proved to be Swindon's only season in the top flight to date, in which they conceded 100 goals. However, based on all results during their time in the Premier League and Football League Swindon are ranked as the all-time 47th most successful English football club domestically.
- John Trollope holds the record for Swindon Town appearances, having played 889 first-team matches between 1960 and 1980. Trollope also holds the English Football League Record of most appearances by a player at one club, having played in 770 League games.
- Harry Morris holds all of Swindon's goal records, having scored 229 goals for the club between 1926 and 1933. The highest attendance at the County Ground of 32,000 was recorded on 15 January 1972 in for a FA Cup tie against Arsenal. The capacity of the ground is now 15,728 so it is unlikely that this record will be broken in the foreseeable future.





MARK COOPER

Mark Cooper was confirmed as the manager of Swindon Town on August 20, 2013. He was initially serving as caretaker manager following the departure of Kevin MacDonald.

Cooper began his managerial career with Tamworth at the start of the 2003/04 season as player/assistant manager. Following the departure of Darron Gee he was then appointed manager.

As manager of Tamworth, Cooper guided the club into the third round of the FA Cup in two consecutive seasons.

Cooper and Tamworth parted company in January 2007 and on 16 May 2007, Cooper was confirmed as the manager of Kettering Town.

His first season in charge proved very successful as the club won the Conference North title with a margin of 17 points. Before joining Peterborough in the 2008-09 season, he led Kettering to the FA Cup fourth round, matching the club record for the furthest the club have been in the competition, where they faced Premier League team Fulham.

Cooper was then appointed manager of Peterborough United on November 14, 2009.

Cooper joined The Posh from Kettering Town with the side lying in third place in the Blue Square Premier. Peterborough and Cooper then parted company in February 2010.

He was confirmed as the new manager of Darlington on June 29, 2010. Following his appointment, the club went on to win The FA trophy in his first season at Wembley. Remarkably substitute Chris Senior scored in the last minute of extra time to seal the victory. Mark remained with the club until October 2011.

In his first season in charge at Swindon Town, Cooper led the Club to a 8th place finish in Sky Bet League One.

As a player, Cooper had spells Bristol City, Exeter City, Southend United, Birmingham City, Fulham, Huddersfield Town, Wycombe Wanderers, Hartlepool United, Macclesfield Town, Leyton Orient, Rushden & Diamonds and Hednesford Town.

Mark is also a graduate of the LMA's Certificate in Applied Management at Warwick University.

Born in Enfield, London, Obika is a product of the Spurs youth system and was the top scorer for the academy side in the 2007-2008 season.

He made his first team debut in the UEFA Cup on 27 November 2008 against NEC Nijmegen. On 19 March 2009 he signed with League One Yeovil Town, in his two-month loan spell he played 10 games scoring 4 goals.


Obika was then loaned out to Millwall before he returned to south London to join Crystal Palace on a season-long loan deal. However this was cut short in early January and he went on loan to Peterborough United. He then joined the Robins until the end of the season.

Obika then rejoined Yeovil on loan at the start of the 2011-12 season. In February 2013, Obika signed on loan with Championship side Charlton Athletic for the remainder of the 2012-13 season and also signed a one year contract extension with Spurs until 2014.

Further loan spells with Brighton and Charlton resulted in Swindon making a reported £200,000 offer the Spurs starlet and he joined the Robins on a 2-year contract in September 2014.

Scored against Latics at the County Ground in the 2-2 draw in September and has gone on to make 17 appearances scoring 8 goals for Swindon to date this season.

Obika has made 86 league appearances in total scoring 33 goals..and is certainly hot property in Sky Bet League One.

NATHAN THOMPSON

A product of the Swindon Town Academy, Thompson made his breakthrough into the first team during 2012/13 campaign. The tough-tackling defender was a regular as Swindon made the League One Play-Offs.

A permanent fixture in the starting XI and a firm fans' favourite ever since, the two-time Player of the Year winner ended last term with the captain's armband and the skipper of Swindon Town this season.

WES FODERINGHAM

The shot-stopper came through the ranks with Fulham's Academy before moving to Crystal Palace.

Initially joined Swindon on loan in 2012 and enjoyed a prolific start to his Town career where he didn't concede a goal in his first five games. A string of fine performances saw him earn a permanent contract in January 2012 and went on to help Town claim the League Two championship at the end of the season in addition to making an appearance at Wembley in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final.

He was virtually ever-present as Swindon made the League One play-offs in 2012/13. Penned a new contract in the summer of 2013.

Consistency is Wes' key, always reliable and a good influence on his defenders.

ANDY WILLIAMS

Formerly with Bristol Rovers and Hereford United, Williams joined Town on a two-year deal in the summer of 2012 after an impressive campaign in front of goal with Yeovil Town in 2011/12. In his first season in red, Williams notched 11 league goals. Last term, he spent time on loan at Yeovil before an injury cut his season short. Returned to the County Ground and is now a key figure in the Robins success this season. One to watch for sure, his finishing can be lethal and 19 goals this season to date proves that!



THE ONE AND ONLY ADEL GAFAITI



Adel Gafaiti's one and only appearance for Latics must be one of the shortest on record, writes Tony Bugby.

The 20-year-old central defender's appearance in the home game against Crawley Town late last season was brief to say the least.

Officials records state that Gafaiti, signed on loan from Norwich City, was an 89th minute substitute for Jonson Clarke-Harris.

Here the French-born Gafaiti, who has pledged his international allegiance to Algeria, recalls his one appearance for Latics which was also his debut in League football.

THE GAME

Latics were winning 1-0 and there was not long to go when manager Lee Johnson told me to warm up. It was a big moment when I came on as it was my League debut as I had never played in the first team at my previous club Glasgow Rangers and Norwich where I am now.

It was strange as, though I am a central defender, the manager told me to play up front and to try and score a goal. I had never done that before so it was a novel experience.

I shouldn't imagine I was on the pitch for much more than five minutes, but it was a game I shall never forget, especially as we won and picked up three points which we needed as we were battling relegation.

LOAN SPELL

The idea behind the loan spell was to come to Latics and to play games but it didn't turn out as I had hoped. When I signed, I hadn't even trained with the team and the manager told me I was on the bench against Crewe and I would be playing the next week.

But from that day the team started to defend well and pick up wins and draws and the manager didn't want to make changes as I fully understood the situation as the team was still battling relegation and needed to pick up points. (The match against Crewe was the start of the 10 game

unbeaten run that ended the season and lifted the team from battling relegation to finishing 15th).

From what I saw in my short time at the club, the manager is doing a great job and he certainly knew how to manage the team, and I was impressed by his honesty in explaining to me what he did.

WHAT I LEARNT AT LATICS

It was a great experience, the first time I had been away from Norwich and I loved my time at Latics where everybody was very kind to me.

I would describe it as a real football and far different to playing with the under-21 development squad at Norwich where no points are at stake.

League One is far different to the Premier League and Championship, where Norwich have been, but this is where I need to be playing to get the experience if I am to play at the highest level.

WHAT HAPPENED NEXT?

I returned to Norwich in late April and trained with the first team throughout pre-season which was really good.

I started this season playing for Norwich under-21's only to injure my knee in September and that kept me out for a couple of months.

Since I returned, I have been back in the under-21's and, now the transfer window has reopened, I am looking for another loan move.

At this stage of my career I definitely need to go out and play games in League One or Two and get the experience I lack if I am to play for Norwich in the Championship or hopefully the Premier League.

PLAYING IN ENGLAND

I have been in England almost five years - two at Glasgow Rangers and this is my third season at Norwich - and that is why I came here because I love the football and the way it is played.

I am sure if I continue to work hard that one day I will play in the Premier League.



When I was living in France and playing as a junior at Nancy, I watched the Premier League and Champions League and loved seeing Cristiano Ronaldo and Paul Scholes playing for Manchester United, though Real Madrid has always been my favourite team.

INTERNATIONAL FOOTBALL

I was born in Paris, but chose to play for Algeria because my father came from that country before moving to France.

I have won six caps for the under-20's and hopefully I will get the opportunity to play for the under-21's and may be one day for the full international team.

If I am playing regularly in League One or Two, it will hopefully help my chances so I will have to wait and see what happens.





The Sky cameras may have spent **deadline day** feeding on Premier League scraps, but down in the lower divisions there was **plenty going on**. Apart from Latics picking up **Conor Wilkinson** for a second time and the signing of **Rhys Murphy** from the Daggers League Two Cheltenham had the **busiest day**, signing five new players - including four strikers.

Cardiff, too, kept the FA registration department busy with three signing in the space of eight minutes, the best surely the permanent acquisition of Chesterfield's free-scoring striker Eoin Doyle. But for out-and-out impact, we at the FLP reckon you can't beat this lot as the best deadline day signings.

TOM INCE, Hull - Derby (loan)

All that talk of Inter Milan must seem a long way off for Ince. Supposedly in talks with the Italian giants this summer, the winger eventually signed for Hull, never played, and now, after an aborted loan spell at Nottingham Forest, finds himself at Pride Park. It's a baffling state of affairs because anyone who has watched Ince over the past three years knows he's a) quick, b) talented and c) in possession of a very decent attitude.

Still, Derby's three-man forward line should suit the 23-year-old perfectly and if he can recapture the form that propelled Blackpool to the play-offs in 2012, the Rams won't miss Jordan Ibe at all.

LEE FOWLER, Nuneaton Town - Crawley (loan)

At the start of the season, 31-year-old Fowler was coaching a kids' team and playing part-time for Cefn Druids. Just last week he was turning out for Conference strugglers Nuneaton.

Now, after being signed by his old mate Dean Saunders, the midfielder is plying his trade in League One with Crawley and got off to a flier by volleying a spectacular winner on his debut last weekend.

Hailed by Saunders - who managed him at Forest Green, Wrexham and Doncaster - as the most talented player in League One, it's fair to say Fowler hasn't always made the most of his ability. But if he can strut his stuff for the next four months, he may be the man who keeps Crawley out of League Two.

CALLUM ROBINSON, Aston Villa - Preston (loan)

A sensation in his first stint at Deepdale, the England Under-20 striker hit five goals in 16 games and was just hitting his straps when Villa pointlessly terminated his loan in late November. Things then got even worse for Preston when top-scorer Joe Garner was ruled out for three months.

Since then, Preston's push for automatic promotion has hit the skids with a five-game winless run leaving Simon Grayson's men eight points off the pace.

But with 20-year-old Robinson now back on board until the end of the season, the Lilywhites once again have the pace to hurt teams... and a player who won't need any time to bed in.

Caolan Lavery, Sheff Wed - Chesterfield (loan)

It's fair to say Lavery hasn't set Hillsborough alight this season. There again, who has? The Owls routinely struggle to create chances and are amongst the lowest scorers in the Championship. It's a difficult place for anyone to learn their trade.

And even if the 22-year-old isn't quite Championship standard, he did enough on loan at Plymouth in 2013-14 to suggest he's more than capable lower down.

The Canadian striker hit three goals in four starts for the Pilgrims before being recalled and - truth be told - probably needed another 12 months at that level. A stint in League One could be the perfect next step.





If you could spend 15 minutes anywhere in the world, where you would pick?


I'd probably go back to Dubai on Nasimi beach. That's been my favourite place to visit so far.





Paul Smith joined Latics on loan from Burnley in September 2000.

Paul made just four appearances for Latics before injuring himself in the most unusual of circumstances.

Returning back to Boundary Park from a night game at Port Vale, Paul fell down an open manhole outside the stadium which was unlit. The injury needed 12 stitches at the Royal Oldham Hospital and his loan was cut short as Paul returned to Turf Moor for treatment. Later that season Paul was released by Burnley after over 100 appearances and joined Sheffield Wednesday.

Not many fans remember Paul's stint with Athletic... But Paul remembers Boundary Park well for all the wrong reasons. "I would not mind," said Paul. "The hole was 6 foot by 10 foot wide and fell nose first into void, it was the most embarrassing moment of my career"
