Good afternoon and welcome to Deepdale for our final Sky Bet League One home game of the 2014/15 season. When we started 22 games ago, back in August, if someone had told us we would arrive at today's game knowing that our destiny was in our own hands in terms of automatic promotion with two games to go, we would have snapped their hand off and that's the reality of our situation.

It is a two game season where we know that if we get two wins we will have achieved the goal we set ourselves at the start of the season, to gain promotion to the Championship.

We extended our fantastic unbeaten run to 17 league games with Tuesday night's victory at Notts County. It was another important win and vitally we showed real character and strength to earn the three points. After the two previous games the pressure was on us to show some steel and we did what was required and scored some fantastic goals in doing so.

When we signed Jermaine Beckford, Snods and myself knew exactly what we were getting, from our previous working relationship with him, and he has certainly showed what he is capable of in recent weeks. His goals the other night were a further illustration of why he has played at the highest level and he has come back from, what he admitted, was an illness he felt could end his career, with a real fire inside him and he has the same ambition as the rest of us, to finish the season with another promotion.

His strike partner, Joe Garner, was rewarded for another fine season for him with the League One player of the year award at the Football League Awards last Sunday night and to put the icing on the cake he also received the goal of the year award for his fantastic strike against Rotherham United last May.

To receive the player of the year award having spent ten weeks of the season on the sidelines, shows how Joe is thought of in the game. This award was voted for by all the League One managers. We were asked to give our top five players from around the league and obviously Joe came out on top and that is a superb achievement and one he celebrated with yet another goal on Tuesday night – he was quick to admit, however, that he'd swap his awards for promotion.

I would like to welcome Mark, his staff, the players and fans of Swindon Town to Deepdale this afternoon. Mark's team have performed to a very high standard all season, with some very exciting young players. Today's game will be a test of patience as Swindon have a lot of possession in all the games they are involved in, we will need to be focused, have energy and a tempo, with and without the ball.

As this is the last programme of the season I would like to take the opportunity to thank everyone for their support this season. Firstly internally, from the owner and those above me, to the staff who work alongside, the administrative support and of course the players themselves – it has truly been a team effort to get us to where we currently are and any success we might achieve will be celebrated collectively because everyone has played their part.

You, our fantastic supporters, are the other big part of that team. We had another superb following at Meadow Lane on Tuesday night and that was just a mirror of every other game this season. There have been plenty of nerves over the past couple of weeks, but your support has been unerring and we need another final big push from you this afternoon and then again next Sunday to really raise the roof and make Deepdale the difficult place to come it has proved to be so far this season.

Whilst this is the last league game at Deepdale, I hope many of you take the opportunity to come and watch our special legends game on Wednesday night, 7pm. The Invincibles Pavilion will be open for fans from 6.30pm and entry is via a donation at the turnstile to Prostate Cancer UK. We have already made £4,500 from the game and thank you to each of those who have bid to play. It should be a fantastic night and I hope to see you there.

Thank you once again for your backing in 2014/15, it means a huge amount to the players, the staff and myself and with a combined effort from all parties again today, hopefully we can get the right result and finish the season with something to savour.

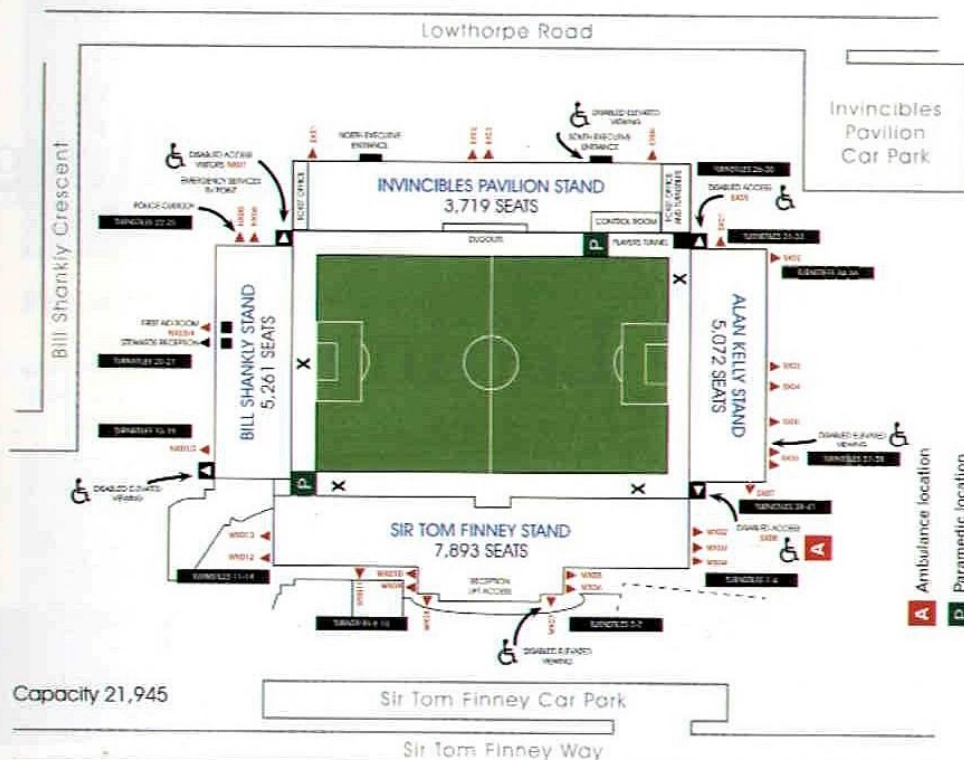

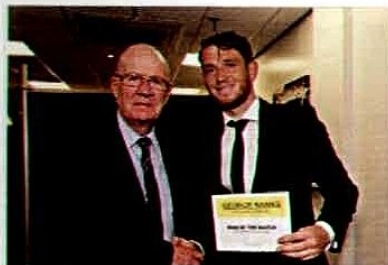

Double Award Winner Would Swap Trophies For Promotion

Joe Garner is the Sky Bet Football League One player of the year; and he also scored the Football League goal of the year for 2014, but whilst he is delighted to have two trophies under his belt, he would happily trade them in now for promotion to the Championship.

Dele Alli of Milton Keynes Dons and Luke Freeman of Bristol City were his competitors last Sunday night, but Joe Garner wasn't able to join them for the battle!

The League One's top marksman was tucked up in bed at home preparing for the big game at Notts County on Tuesday night when the announcement was made that he had pipped the other two to the accolade of best player in the division in the 2014/15 season.

So it wasn't until he attended training at Springfields on Monday morning that he got his hands not only on that trophy, but the one he had been awarded for scoring the best goal of 2014 in a Football League competition, his memorable Play Off semi-final goal against Rotherham United last May.

The One And Only was down at the North End training ground to assist with the handing over of his trophies by manager Simon Grayson, with the Sky cameras and other media present for the informal ceremony, far removed from the glitz and glamour of the awards that took place at The

Brewery in Central London the previous evening.

Garner's last 18 months - from November 2013 to the present have been nothing short of extraordinary.

He will be the first to admit that he could hardly find the back of the net in his first 11 months at the Club; in and out of the side and the luck not going in his direction, but after scoring a late equaliser against Tranmere Rovers seven weeks out from Christmas, he started a phenomenal run that has led to the dual accolade.

2014 saw him score 28 goals and pick up the North West Football Awards' League One player of the year and if it hadn't have been for

his injury suffered at Bristol City's Ashton Gate on 22nd November, he would no doubt have surpassed 30 goals in the calendar year.

He had to work extremely hard to recover from what was a freak injury, one the surgeon said he had never seen before in a footballer, but he returned at the beginning of February, a return that coincided with the Lilywhites' unbeaten run and when the matchday programme spoke to him on Monday morning he was delighted to be honoured with the trophies.

"I am very proud and I am very happy with the awards and I am now hoping to gain promotion," he said.

"I want to make it a hat-trick. That's what we set out to do at the start of the season and now we want to finish the job.

"It is nice to win any award and I am happy with them, but now I want to finish the job off.

"I was up against two players who have had very good seasons, but my aim now is to get Preston out of this league and back into the Championship.





"It is a nice achievement for myself to get the goal of the year. At the time it all went so quickly really and was a bit of a whirlwind, but seeing it back it was a nice goal and I am really honoured that it has been given this award.

"The player of the year is voted for by the managers in our division, so it is a nice award to win. I am very happy with it, but I want to carry on with the form I have had in the last year or so and get us over the line.

"I got injured and was out for a little while, but I worked really hard in the gym and with the staff here, particularly Matt Jackson [the physio]. I did a lot of swimming and kept fit and hopefully I came back a better from it.

"I was never worried by it too much. I have had bad injuries before and that helped me come to terms with it. I knew after a couple of weeks that my leg felt fine and I got out of the brace and worked hard.

"In both games we were on the front foot and maybe a little bit of naivety was shown towards the end of the games, but we are the only people who can put things right."

"I felt I could have come back a little bit quicker, but I was held back a little bit and maybe the rewards from that are paying off now.

"I felt stronger and quicker as soon as I came back and to get a couple of goals in the first game back was a nice feeling and we have picked up a lot of points since.

"We are now in a really nice position with a couple of cup finals left to finish the season. It is nice to have everything in our own control."

Speaking to Joe before the Notts County game, he had just ended what, for him, had been a goal drought, five games without scoring and there was no doubt once the penalty was awarded at Vale Park, that he would be taking it.

"I had a word with Gally and made sure it was mine," he continued.

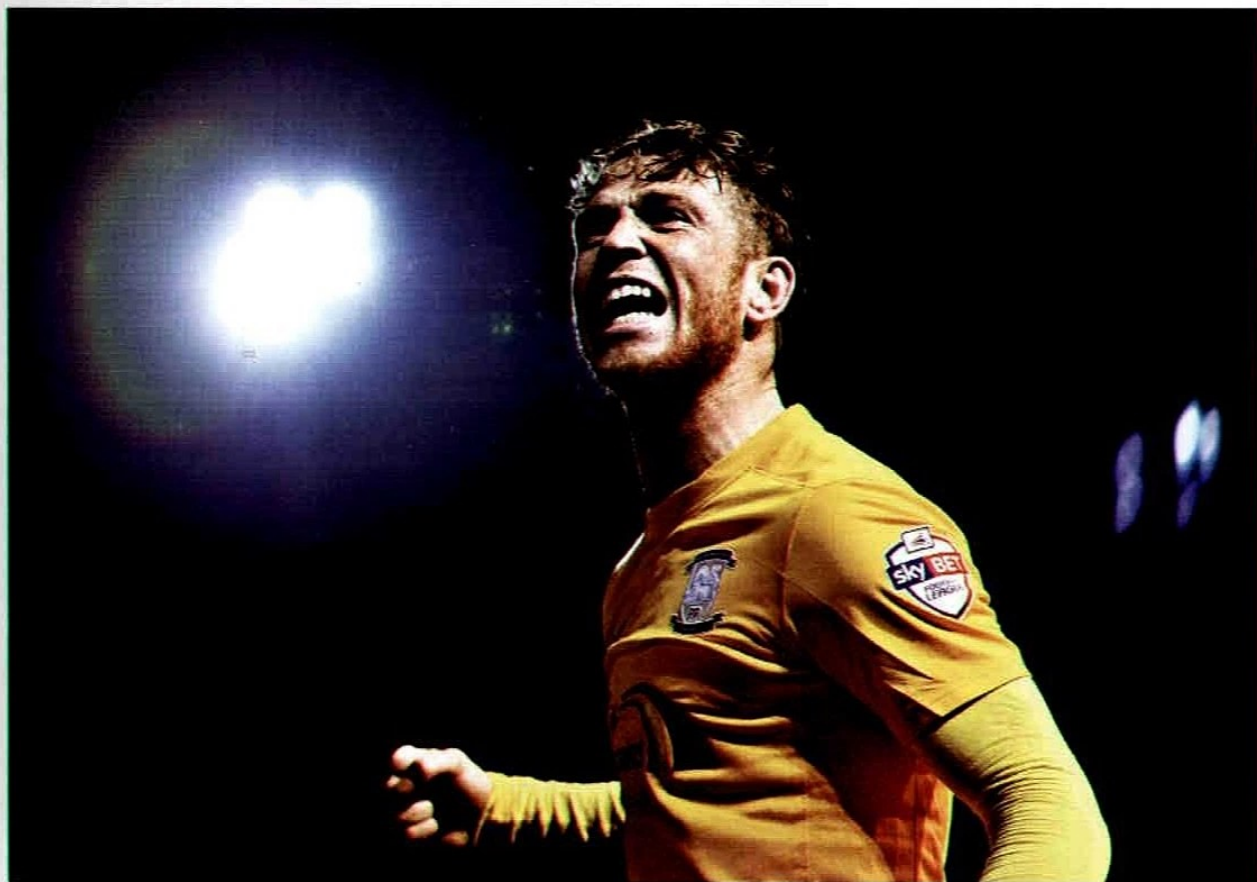

"It is a massive week for myself; I will hopefully be sat here in a couple of weeks' time with the job done, looking forward to next year in the Championship."

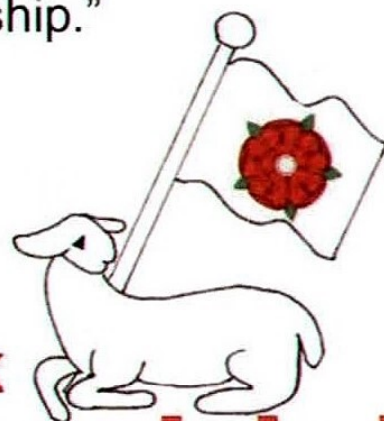

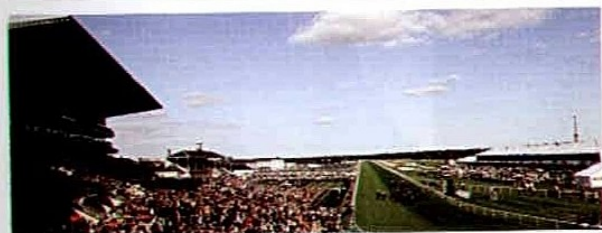

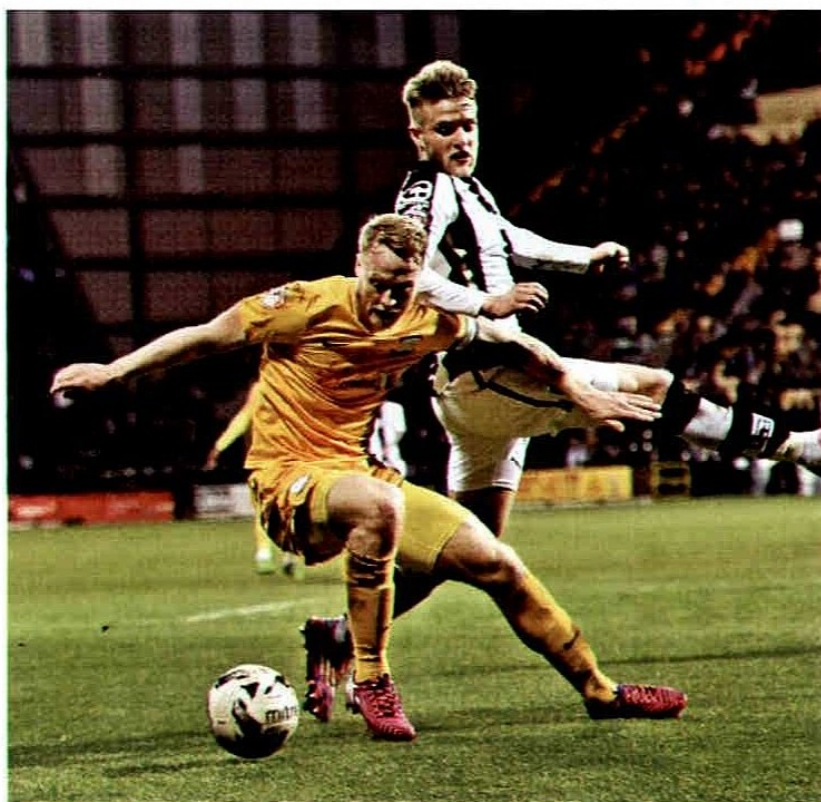
Although I wear the armband, there are a lot of leaders out on that pitch and I think that is what you need as a team; even from the guys on the bench and in the stands.

We have got tons of experience with the likes of John Welsh, Jermaine Beckford, Kevin Davies, Sylvan Ebanks-Blake; players who have been there and done it and that is a massive help.

My natural instinct is to try and be a leader when I am on the pitch anyway, but it is slightly different when you are the captain and are given that role, something that I have enjoyed. I have always been that way as a player, even before I started working with the gaffer.

I give 100 per cent, everything I have got, and I try to show that on

In our hands

If you said that we would be second in the league with two games to go and with everything in our own hands I would have snapped your hand off. We are all working hard behind the scenes,

in training and we are looking forward to the games. We are just raring to go again and we can't wait.

The crowd will be out in numbers for our final home match of the season and with everything to play for, that's what you want if you are a player or as a fan; you want to be involved in the big important games. That's what we all work hard for.

If we get to the end of the season and we are 19 games unbeaten and don't get promoted





automatically then you have got to take your hat off to MK Dons. They are getting some good results, but we are also playing well, obviously we are disappointed at dropping a few points with the draws, but it is still in our own hands and we look forward to the Swindon Town match, we just need to keep on going.

Difficult matches

The last few matches have been difficult. We have drawn games when we have been in front and you would have hoped we would have been able to see them out. It has been a difficult few games, but it is one of those things.

Games have been coming thick and fast so we haven't been able to dwell on them and although we were disappointed we are still unbeaten and playing well, albeit it in the first half. We have been

trying to take that into the second half and against Notts County I think we did that.

In terms of the two draws against Gillingham and Port Vale, in the first one we should have been out of sight in the first half and you need to finish off teams like that. We had something like 17 shots on target and you need to be putting them in the back of the net.

"My natural instinct is to try and be a leader when I am on the pitch anyway, but it is slightly different when you are the captain and are given that role, something that I have enjoyed."

Against Notts County we really dug in and pulled it out the bag. Our first half performances have been up there with the best and we would probably beat any team in the league with the way we are starting games.

We were pleased with the two goal lead and that aspect of the game and we always knew they were going to come out and press as they are in a relegation battle.

They worked hard and fortunately this time we killed them off and Beckford's two goals were brilliant. That is something we are going to need and he is a big, important player for us.

We spoke at half-time as we were obviously very aware of the last two games and we addressed that at the break. Unfortunately, they got a goal, but we still dictated it and got on the ball and kept playing our game.

Like I say, we will always get a chance and thankfully we put one away and saw the game out. It was a massive three points and now it is a two game season we are looking at and we are all buzzing, excited and can't wait for 3pm on Saturday.

As captain, it would be unbelievable to be the man who leads the boys to promotion. It is something I have wanted and dreamt about, to get to that next level. It is something that is achievable.

We have a great squad and to get promoted would be unbelievable. This club's rightful place is the Championship.

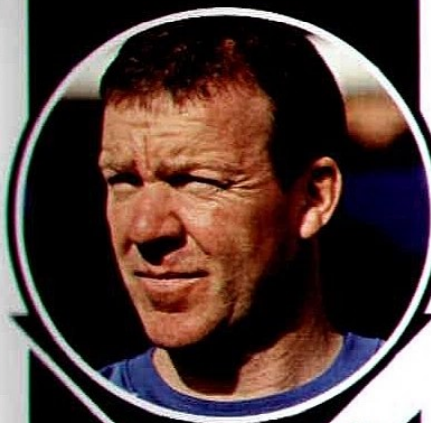

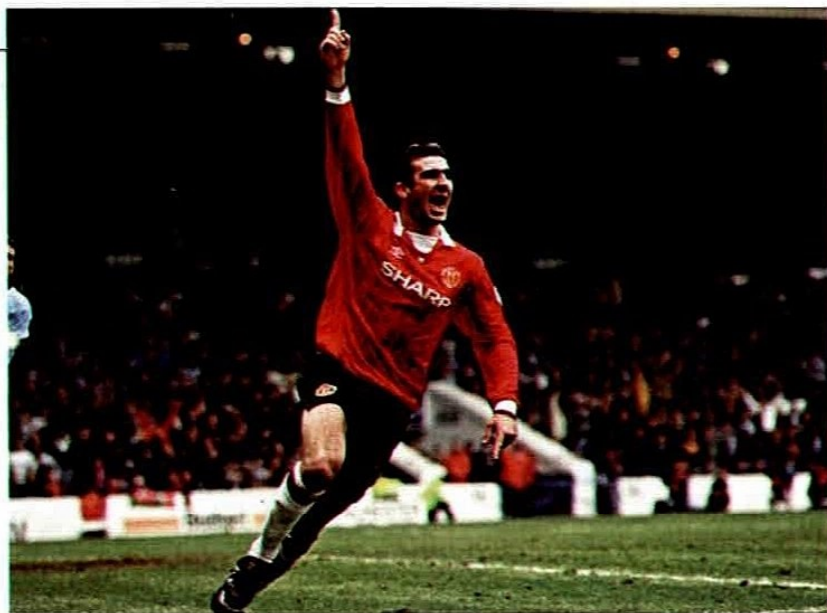

1954

Roger Bannister Breaks The Four Minute Mile Record

Roger Bannister, a 25-year-old British medical student, became the first man to run a mile in less than four minutes. His time was three minutes 59.4 seconds, achieved at the Iffley Road track in Oxford and watched by about 3,000 spectators. The race was carefully planned and he was aided by two pacemakers, Chris Brasher and Chris Chataway. Just over 200 yards from the finish, Bannister took the lead with a final burst of energy. He sprinted to the line in record time and fell exhausted into the arms of a friend, the Rev Nicholas Stacey.

1960

Princess Margaret Weds Anthony Armstrong-Jones

Princess Margaret and Anthony Armstrong Jones married on this date 1960 at Westminster Abbey. More than 20 million viewers tuned in to watch the first ever televised royal wedding service. The Queen's younger sister get married, 29, arrived on time, after making the journey from Clarence House in the Glass Coach with the Duke of Edinburgh. Inside the church, 2,000 guests watched the Princess, dressed in white silk and a diamond tiara, make her procession up the blue carpeted aisle. She was followed by her eight bridesmaids, with the Queen's eldest daughter, Princess Anne taking the lead.



1994

French President And Queen Open Chunnel

The Queen and France's President Francois Mitterrand formally opened the Channel Tunnel during two elaborate ceremonies in France and Britain 21 years ago on this date. After travelling through the tunnel, which took eight years and billions of pounds to build, the Queen said it was one of the world's great technological achievements. The tunnel was the first land link between Britain and Europe since the last Ice Age about 8,000 years ago. The first leg of the Queen's journey took her from London's Waterloo station and she arrived at Calais at the same time as the President Mitterrand's train which had travelled from Paris' Gard du Nord via Lille.

1966

Moors Murderers Jailed For Life

Ian Brady and his lover Myra Hindley were sentenced to life imprisonment for the so-called 'Moors Murders' at Chester Assizes on this date 1966. Judge Fenton Atkinson imposed three concurrent life sentences on Ian Brady, aged 28, for what he called 'three calculated, cruel, cold-blooded murders'. The couple were tried for the killing of Edward Evans, 17, Lesley Ann Downey, aged ten, and 12-year-old John Kilbride - a case that shocked the nation. Hindley, 23, was sentenced to two concurrent life sentences. The bodies of the three children were found on Saddleworth Moor.

Level Playing Field 'Weeks of Action'



Between 18th April and 3rd May, Level Playing Field are running their 'Weeks of Action' initiative for football clubs to showcase the positive work that they do in partnership with their disabled supporters.

This year, the focus is access and inclusion and we at North End are happy to celebrate the fantastic relationship we have with our disabled fans.

At Preston North End, it is important for us to make sure all of our supporters have an enjoyable experience when they come to Deepdale.

We provide a wide range of disabled facilities that allow all of our supporters to make the most of a matchday watching the Lilywhites with as little stress as possible for all involved.

We offer a wide range of specialist facilities for wheelchair users,

ambulant disabled requiring the help of an assistant, and those with a hearing impediment.

Our facilities include:

- Pitch level entry and seating for wheelchair users
- Elevated seating for wheelchair users in three stands with step-free access
- Hearing looped equipment seating in the Invincibles Pavilion (home supporters) and Bill Shankly Kop (away supporters)
- Toilet facilities and catering accessible to wheelchair users/ ambulant disabled in all stands
- A lowered window outside the ticket office for easier and quicker access on a matchday for ticket collection

One disabled supporter, Sally Wallace, 42, is a wheelchair user who is a season ticket holder in the Invincible Pavilion and believes

that coming to the football is one of the few times she doesn't actually feel disabled.

"I can say that going to the football is one of the few experiences where I don't actually feel disabled. Without getting too complex talking social models etc. if everywhere was adapted so that I could function like everybody else then I wouldn't be disabled. It is actually like society that disables me.

"So when I go to the football at Deepdale it's not the same. I can buy a parking space and so I don't have to rush through the streets of Preston to try and get to the match. The space really helps because they have numbers on so whatever time you get there you are guaranteed a space.

"There are all dropped curbs, there are automatics doors and the lift up to the disabled balcony and so it is easy to get around.

"The stewards are brilliant, they always make sure that we are okay and if there's anything specific that you want or need they will always help you out.

"There's a ramp up to the balcony area so basically I am just like any other North End fan when I come to Deepdale.

"It is great and because you are up in with the crowd you do really feel a part of it. I know you have to have special facilities and sit in a special area but because you are amongst it, you don't feel like you are disabled or segregated.

"There is a disabled toilet right next to the balcony which has everything you would need other than a mirror!"

It can be different as an away fan because sometimes you are put with the home fans in the disabled area. Then you really do feel segregated because you feel like this is just a special place for special people. Other than that the stewards were absolutely brilliant and facility wise there is everything there that you need.

"In most areas of society it can be crazy, very often you do feel disabled because you can't do what everybody else does, but that isn't the case when I come to North End." Aside from disabled facilities in the stands, we make sure that fans in all areas are given the same access, and Keith Webster, who is a season ticket holder in the Guild Lounge at Deepdale can't speak highly enough of his experiences at Deepdale.

"I'm a Guild Lounge member so I'm in hospitality and it's fantastic. All the staff are very friendly and very welcoming and they know me by name.

"On the whole I think the Club looks after disabled supporters very well. Before I was in hospitality I was in the Sir Tom Finney Stand in the disabled section as a disabled supporter season ticket holder. The stewards there were very friendly and welcoming as well so for me it's been great, but I can't really talk for others.



"I have been to quite a few away games this season, the facilities have been very good. I call up Olivia in the ticket office and she sorts out my tickets for me for away games because I get nervous talking to people I don't know on the phone and so that is a big help for me.

"In fairness I think North End is the very highest standard to follow, the away games are good, but some of the older grounds aren't as good.

"I use the Guild Lounge so I come early, sit in the lounge, have my meal and watch one of the other live games in there and it's a really

good atmosphere and you really feel a part of it."

Disabled supporters can book tickets on a season ticket or match-by-match basis. Please note that supporters requiring disabled seating are required to register with the club's disabled membership scheme before purchasing any tickets.

To register, please visit the ticket office with proof of disability living allowance and two passport photos (this applies to both season tickets and matchday tickets).

Supporters can then purchase matchday tickets at the disabled and helper rate upon production of their membership card.

Please note that tickets sold at this rate are only valid for designated sections of the ground, as advised by the ticket office.

The final score was an impressive 8-0 win which is a fifth clean sheet this season for the C team and leaves them a point behind league leaders Sheffield United with three games to go.

Ray Treacy Passes Away

Ray Treacy, the former Preston North End and Ireland international forward, sadly died on Friday night 10th April, in Dublin, after a short illness.

He had an excellent pedigree when Bobby Charlton signed him from Swindon Town in December 1973 for just £35,000. In the remaining 21 games of that particular season, poor Ray could not buy a goal, no matter how hard he tried. The former West Bromwich Albion and Charlton Athletic player made his North End debut away at Middlesbrough in a forward line that read; Lamb, Treacy, Bruce, Burns and Young.

Ironically, North End were relegated that season along with Ray's former club, Swindon Town. The following season Ray picked up injuries and, along with loss of confidence, he never scored in his ten appearances. North End kept faith with the Irishman and he turned things around during the 1975/1976 season, playing regularly with the likes of Mike Elwiss, Alex Bruce and Tony Morley.

His touch returned and he bagged 13 goals for the team, scoring seven goals in the opening eight games. However, he didn't seem to fit in with the new managers' plans. The new manager being Harry Catterick after Bobby Charlton had resigned. He left on a



free transfer in the summer of 1976 to re-join West Brom where he had served his apprenticeship.

Ray was a busy, cheerful player who, despite his lack of inches (5'9"), gave as good as he got with visiting defenders. From West Brom he moved back to Dublin where he re-found his goal touch again with Shamrock Rovers and it was with Shamrock that he ended his ties with football, becoming their manager.

He ran a very successful travel agency in Dublin and was involved with the Republic of Ireland team on their European travels. His death was a shock to the football world and the condolences of the Club and the PNEFPA go out to his family and friends.

Highly-rated goalkeeper Wes Foderingham has been a virtual ever-present for Swindon this season. The 24-year-old came through Fulham's youth ranks, but was unable to make a first team appearance for the Cottagers and was sold to Crystal Palace in July 2010. However, the Shepherd's Bush-born stopper failed to feature for the Eagles, instead being loaned out to non-league sides Bromley, Boreham Wood and Histon. Foderingham moved to Swindon, initially on loan, in October 2011 and helped the Robins win the League Two title in his maiden year at the County Ground. He has accumulated over 170 appearances for the Wiltshire club.

Nathan Thompson

Signed from Youth team graduate Age 24
Career appearances 121 Goals 1

Fans' favourite Nathan Thompson is the Robins' club captain. A product of Swindon's Academy, the tough-tackling defender made his professional debut for Town in a 2-0 JPT victory over Torquay in October 2010. The 24-year-old, who can play at right back or centre half, soon became a permanent fixture in the Robins' starting XI and was named their player of the year in 2012/13, and again the following season. Thompson, who scored his only Swindon goal in a 2-2 draw with Gillingham in August 2013, has featured regularly this term, although he has received three red cards.

Massimo Luongo

Signed from Tottenham Hotspur Age 22
Career appearances 109 Goals 15

Australian international Massimo Luongo joined Swindon for £400,000 in September 2013. The 22-year-old began his career as a trainee at Tottenham, and made his one and only Spurs appearance in a goalless draw with Stoke in September 2011. Capped 12 times by his country, the Sydney-born midfielder was loaned out to Ipswich, where he scored one goal in 11 games during the first half of the 2012/13 season. After two impressive loan spells with Swindon, Luongo penned a permanent deal with the club in September 2013. He made 53 appearances for the Robins last term, scoring six goals – including a brace in 5-2 annihilation of Port Vale. Luongo, an unused member of the Socceroos' squad at the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil, scored Swindon's first goal of the 2014/15 campaign with the opener in a 3-1 victory against Scunthorpe. He has scored a further five times in 34 matches.



The cutting edge

Michael Smith

Signed from Charlton Athletic Age 23
Career appearances 149 Goals 49

Predatory striker Michael Smith has been in a rich vein of goalscoring form this season. After learning his trade with Wallsend Boys Club, the towering 6'4" frontman linked up with Darlington, making his Football League debut in a 1-0 defeat against Hereford in April 2010. The 23-year-old scored six goals in 37 matches for the Quakers, prior to joining Charlton in the summer of 2011. He only started once for the Addicks – in a League Cup tie with Leyton Orient in August 2012 – and was loaned out to Accrington, Newport County and Colchester. Smith completed a temporary move to AFC Wimbledon the following year and scored a respectable ten goals in 25 games for the club. In January 2014, he transferred to Swindon and netted a match-winning double on his debut against Shrewsbury. At the time of writing, he is Swindon's second top scorer this season with 16 goals in all competitions.

Swindon striker Andy Williams is one of the most prolific marksmen in League One.

The 28-year-old progressed through the youth system of his home-town club Hereford United, where he made his senior debut in a 4-0 triumph over Northwich in March 2005.

The following season, the feared frontman scored ten goals in 30 matches as the Bulls won promotion to the Football League via the Conference Play-Offs.

In July 2007, he moved to Bristol Rovers on a free transfer, but he struggled to find his feet at the Memorial Stadium, netting only ten times in three years.

Williams, who was loaned back to Hereford for their ill-fated 2008/09 League One campaign, later transferred to Yeovil, for whom he plundered 25 goals in 79 matches.

He signed for Swindon in the summer of 2012 and registered a respectable 12 goals in his maiden campaign with the Wiltshire side.

"I think a hunger came back when I was away from the game."

Williams joined Championship newcomers Yeovil on loan last season, but was restricted to only 13 appearances after suffering a cruciate knee ligament injury.

Since returning to the Swindon starting XI this term, Williams has been in prolific goalscoring form and is, at the time of writing, League One's joint top scorer with 20 goals.

And Williams, who is the oldest players in the Robins' squad, says



he is relishing being back among goals: "Last season was the worst I've had as a professional football player," he admitted.

"I was in the tenth year of my career and, as soon as you're away from it, you realise how much you miss it.

"I think a hunger came back when I was away from the game. I'm now playing in by far and away the best team I've ever played for in my career, which has massively helped.

"So it's gone from the worst season I've ever had to, at the moment, probably one of the best I've had, certainly goal-wise and hopefully in terms of team achievement at the end of it."

Mark Cooper

With three matches of Swindon Town's regular season to go, the 2014/15 season has turned into a bitter sweet time for the players, management, staff and fans of the Robins at the County Ground.

Ahead of the, in some cases, season defining Easter weekend, Mark Cooper's men had their guns pointing directly at Preston North End, knowing that one flinch by Simon Grayson's men would lead to a 'big game hunting' season opening on the Lilywhites.

But unfortunately for Swindon, their powder ammunition got wet, which means the Play-Offs look likely for Cooper's men.

Would Swindon Town fans have taken fourth place in League One with three games to go at the start of the season? Probably.

But having been in the automatic race for so long, naturally, there can only be a tinge of disappointment around the home of the 'Magic Roundabout'.

And like any good commander, when Plan A fails, Plan B goes into operation, 'Operation Play-Off Preparation' in this instance.

"What it's done is given me the opportunity to put a plan in place for May and the first Play-Off game," Cooper told the Western Daily Press.

"We'll be preparing fully now to get a team consistent enough for a three game season.

"I have to make sure the team is given every possibility in the home and away legs to get to Wembley and make sure the team can then go to Wembley and win a game.



"We have four games left [prior to Swindon versus Walsall] and there'll be an opportunity for people to play one or two of those games and make sure we're right going into May 7th.

"The most important thing is we have a team that's fresh and ready to go on May 7th.

"I'm not saying anybody's not going to play and I'm not saying they're all going to play every game.

"We're going to try to give it everything we've got to make sure we're spot on for May 7th."

The above is open to interpretation, can Swindon realistically do the above and win games? And if they can't, do they risk entering the Play-Offs in poor form? That's the difficult juggling act Cooper is now faced with.

He continued: "Ideally we want to marry the two together and have a little bit of good form going into the Play-Offs and making sure everyone

is in mentally and physically top condition.

"We haven't limped across the line. Whatever happens, we've been in there with five games to go.

"In my opinion, it's more important to go in there with everybody fresh.

"We can work and prepare on how we're going to play and maybe have a couple of games to prepare."

That mix and match formula has already been installed at Swindon ahead of the Robins' long trip north today.

PNE defender Bailey Wright's Socceroo team-mate Massimo Luongo is the first set to be given rest and relaxation time with Jack Stephens and Michael Smith also likely contenders, allowing the likes of Jermaine Hylton the chance to stake a claim for their Play-Off tilt.

Changes that Cooper is comfortable with: "It doesn't mean we can't win the games, but I think we have to be realistic.

"I want to make sure that we don't go into the first Play-Off game with no energy, legs hanging off and not giving ourselves every opportunity.

"If every player that I think is going to play in that first leg plays every game between now and then, I don't think they'd be in the right state physically or mentally.

"We're going to try to put something in place whereby on May 7th we're really ready to go."

Defining Moment

After the problems of the start of the 90's Swindon were

like the proverbial phoenix from the flames in 1993 with one of the greatest play-off games of all time.

After a fairly quiet first half, Swindon Town led 1-0 thanks to a goal from player-manager

Glenn Hoddle. The match then took off with an exciting second half. Just two minutes after the restart Craig Maskell put Swindon 2-0 to the good after he finished off a pass from John Moncur, then a header by Shaun Taylor gave Swindon a three goal advantage six minutes later.

At 3-0 Swindon should have been comfortable, but Julian Joachim pulled one back for Leicester to give them hope. It got better for the Foxes as Steve Walsh scored a header to make it 3-2, and just a minute after that Steve Thompson equalised wrapping up an astonishing comeback by Leicester, scoring three goals in 12 minutes.

However, it turned out to be in vain, when Swindon were awarded a contentious penalty six minutes from time after Kevin Poole was alleged to have brought down Steve White in the area. Paul Bodin converted the penalty to finish the game at 4-3 and sent Swindon to the Premier League.

The Robins' Favourites



Swindon Town's greatest ever list - the final team of our look back at the Football League's survey - sees a familiar name top one category and a not so familiar name in the other; we delve a little deeper.

Who is Swindon Town's best ever manager?

Rank	Answer	Percentage

What did Hoddle do at Swindon?

Hoddle arrived at a troubled club with the Robins badly affected by a financial scandal which had seen them stripped of promotion to the first division at the end of the 1989/90 season, a

controversy which had negatively impacted the team's league form as they had been forced to sell several key players including midfielder Alan McLoughlin.

Hoddle prevented Swindon from slipping into the third division and further improvement throughout the 1991/92 season saw the Wiltshire club finish ninth, just missing out on a Play-Off place. They had briefly led the table in October.

Swindon reached the new division one Play-Offs in 1993 and beat



Leicester City 4-3 at Wembley, and were then promoted to the Premier League. Hoddle scored Swindon's first goal of the Final. The 36-year-old Hoddle was one of the most highly-rated young managers in England and many bigger clubs were demanding his services. Just days after guiding Swindon to promotion, he accepted the offer to manage Chelsea and was succeeded at Swindon by his assistant and former Spurs team-mate John Gorman.

Who is Harry Morris?

David Morris, known as Harry or Abe, was best known for his seven-year spell in the Football League with Swindon Town. He holds the club records for goals scored in a league match, season and career. He also played for Fulham, Brentford, Millwall, Swansea Town and Clapton Orient.

Morris dropped down to the division three south to sign for Swindon in June 1926 for a £110 fee. He had a brilliant start to his career at the County Ground,

netting hat-tricks in each of his first two matches. He scored in the following two matches to set a club record of scoring in each of his first four games.

Flourishing under Sam Allen's management, Morris finished the 1926/27 season with 48 goals from 43 league games (a club record), but problems with the defence meant the Robins could only manage a fifth-place finish. He also became the first Swindon player to notch five goals in a single game, which came in a win over Queens Park Rangers. He repeated the feat in a 5-1 demolition of Norwich City in April 1930. He also went on a run of scoring in 11 consecutive games during the season, scoring 19 goals.

Despite failing to win any silverware, Morris was top scorer in each of his seven seasons with Swindon and bagged 18 hat-tricks. In addition, he was top scorer in the division three south in the 1926/27 and 1927/28 seasons and his record for the 1926/27 season stands at the eighth-highest single-season goal tally in Football League history.

Deemed too old by incoming manager Ted Vizard, Morris was released prior to the start of the 1933/34 season.

During his seven years with Swindon, Morris scored an incredible 229 goals in 279 games and is still the club's leading goalscorer.

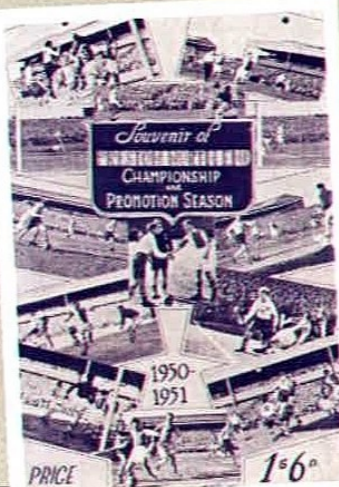

Young Lilywhites Finish Campaign Against Latics

Two goals in the last five minutes saw a youthful Preston North End side defeated by league leaders Wigan at Christopher Park in their final Football League Youth Alliance North West Conference game of the 2014/15 season.

North End controlled the game for large parts, but were undone on the counter attack by Wigan who scored twice late on to claim all three points.

Finishing with a number of U15s and U16s on the pitch, the Lilywhites are already looking forward to next season as their debutants provided room for optimism despite the defeat.

Academy manager Nick Harrison said: "I thought we were excellent, we started the game very young and we finished it even younger.

"I thought the performance was fantastic, obviously we are always disappointed to lose, but I think we've got to lose in the right way and I thought today, how hard the players worked and the type of football we played was outstanding."

While the performance from PNE's youthful side was extremely encouraging, the result for Wigan means that they will become champions if they can avoid defeat away at Rochdale.

Goals from Louis Robles, Callum Lang and Sam Cosgrove secured the points for Wigan, but it was Josh Earl who scored on his debut for North End's Academy side.

Despite PNE looking the more likely to break the deadlock, it was Wigan's top scorer Robles who opened the scoring. The front man scored twice in the reverse fixture and he netted again as Wigan turned defence into attack and although Ross Dalton was able to keep out his first effort, the Latics' captain slotted home the rebound. But North End were rewarded for

their hard work just before half-time as they levelled through Earl. Cutting in from the left hand side Earl fired the ball to the right of Wigan 'keeper Owen Evans' goal as PNE finally had something to show for their efforts.

The U18s went into half-time deservedly level, but it was Wigan who almost regained the lead just five minutes into the second half as Cosgrove rattled the crossbar from three yards out, although it looked easier to score when Robles slid the ball into his path.

The Lilywhites were unable to assert their dominance that they had enjoyed in the first half as Wigan started to play like a side that was going for the league title.

The hosts did eventually retake the lead in what was a classic counter-attacking move as the Latics moved the ball quickly down the left hand side through James Barrigan, whose powerful drive into the area allowed Lang to tap home from close range.

The hosts then made sure of the points just a few moments later with Harrison's men guilty of not clearing their lines, allowing Cosgrove to make up for his earlier miss by sliding the ball past Dalton.

The Wigan forward made no mistake this time around as he put his side within one point of the title. But Preston's performance was a fearless one which bodes well for next season, especially as there are a number of second years who will be moving on.

First year full back Sean Whelan said: "I thought we played well,



we were the better team for long parts of the game, but at the end they just caught us on the counter attack as we were pushing for the win.

"We had a young team out, we had a few U15s and U16s so it's good for next year and obviously a few of the lads won't be with us next year so it's good to send them away on a good performance."

North End had their chances throughout the game and will feel unfortunate that their young side were unable to add to their points tally on the final day.

Harrison added: "We had three U15s players on the pitch to finish with and that's how it should be because we are at a stage of the season now where the second years are looking to find other clubs, so it gives the younger lads an opportunity and that's why I'm delighted with how they've performed, because, for me, it was never a 3-1 game. I thought 1-1 would probably have been a fair result."
