LAST TIME OUT...

INTRODUCING THE O'S



ORIENT make the trip down the M4 knowing their fate is out of their hands, as they hope for final day drama at the foot of the League 1 table...

2013/14 brought about a fresh optimism for the East London outfit, as the division's recent 'nearly men' hit the ground running; winning ten of their first twelve in all competitions, including an opening day 5-1 mauling away to Carlisle and a priceless three points at Griffin Park which maintained their five-point advantage at the top of the pile going into October.

The early rounds of the League Cup were full of drama for Orient, by way of a 90th-minute Kevin Lisbie header against Coventry that handed them a tie away to Premier League, Hull in which they were beaten by an extra time Robbie Brady strike.

Russell Slade's men suffered their first league reverse of the season at Coventry, thirteen games in, before bouncing back with victories over promotion-chasing Rotherham and Peterborough. In addition to securing FA Cup progress against non-league Southport, they tasted the other side of cup football with a 3-2 loss at Stevenage in the third round of the JPT.

A 3-1 win here at The County Ground was the O's first of only two

in the league through December and, whilst the New Year kicked off with an FA Cup Third Round humiliation at Yeovil, the club returned to winning ways in the league as they battled on in search of automatic promotion. The form of Wolves and Brentford, coupled with Orient's unspectacular sequence of six wins from their last fourteen, ultimately saw them settle for 3rd place; their highest position in 40 years. After dispatching Peterborough over two legs, Play-Off Final heartbreak saw Rotherham come from 2-0 down to claim a place in England's second tier at Orient's expense.

This season could barely have contrasted more alongside the last campaign for the O's. Following Russell Slade's resignation in September, they have won just ten league games- remaining winless in their last six- with an Area Semi-Final appearance in the JPT and an impressive win at Aston Villa in the League Cup being the only noteworthy moments to savour for O's fans, who are on the brink of fourth tier football for the first time in ten years.

SCOUTING REPORT



ORIENT are a team who like to play a direct style, with the two strikers tasked to win the ball in the opposition's final third which then allows the midfield to join in attacking build-up play from winning the second ball. With long-serving winger Dean Cox in the side, the Londoners pose a threat from wide positions as his 13 assists put him only rationally behind Luke Freeman and Paul Gallagher.


The 12 goals of former Rochdale hitman, Chris Dagnall, lead the way for Leyton Orient this term, with his ability to play off of the shoulder of defenders earning him the

space to carry out a forward's work.


The O's added experience in the summer with the signings of Jobi McAnuff and ex-Town loanee Darius Henderson and also have plenty of Football League experience in their backline, having played together for the past three years. However, the back four have shown to be a little static at playing the high line that manager, Fabio Liverani employs and if Town can overcrowd the box with their neat build-up play and up the tempo during the right moments, they can get

some joy out of this defence. Liverani's men can take some hope from the fact that they have a better record away from Brisbane Road this season and playing away from home crowd pressures with everything to play for may yet curtail Town's winning ambitions.

History also proves it won't be easy at all for Swindon, as the O's have dominated this particular fixture in recent years, winning four out of their last seven visits to Wiltshire, with the last Swindon victory coming in 2009/10, when a Charlie Austin double eased the Robins to a 3-2 win.



MEET THE GAFFER



Fabio Liverani

AFTER a distinguished career as a midfielder in Italy's Serie A, Liverani would spend a large part of his career with Lazio, racking up over 120 appearances. He would also serve Fiorentina and Palermo in the latter part of his career before moving into coaching with Genoa. After a brief spell in charge of at the Stadio Luigi Ferraris, he was relieved of his duties in 2013. Was appointed manager of Leyton Orient in December 2014.

DID YOU KNOW?

AN Italian international, Liverani became the first Italian of Somali descent to play for the Azzuri.

KEY MEN...

05 Scott Cuthbert DF

AFTER graduating from the youth ranks at Celtic, the defender would skipper the Glasgow giants' youth teams and represent Scotland up to Under-21 level before Danny Wilson brought him to Swindon in 2009. Alongside Gordon Greer, Cuthbert was a virtual ever-present as Town made the Play-Off Final at Wembley. The following season saw Swindon relegated from League 1 with the central defender opting to join Orient. Last term, he was a key member of the side that would reach the Play-Off Final.



07 Dean Cox MF

THE tricky winger is a product of the academy at Brighton and Hove Albion. After making his debut in August 2005, he would go on to make 179 appearances for the Seagulls before being released in the summer of 2010. Moved to Orient shortly afterwards and is currently the O's longest-serving player. After netting 17 times last term, Cox also found the net in the Play-Off Final defeat at the hands of Rotherham at Wembley.



23 Chris Dagnall FW

DAGNALL started his career at Tranmere before joining Rochdale after an initial loan stint. He would go on to net 54 times in 140 appearances at Spotland which earned him a move to Scunthorpe in 2010. Two years later, he would make the move to Barnsley. After loan spells at Bradford and Coventry, he agreed a mutual termination of his contract at Oakwell before signing a deal with Orient in January 2014. He ended last season with six goals and is the O's leading scorer this term.



MEET THE REST...

40 Alex Cisak GK



CURRENTLY on loan at Brisbane Road from Burnley, the stopper began his career with Leicester. Had a spell at Accrington before signing for Oldham in 2011. Since signing for the Clarets, Cisak has enjoyed loan stints at York City before moving to London.

15 Nathan Clarke DF



A graduate of the academy at Huddersfield, Clarke spent eleven years with the Yorkshire side, playing over 300 games. Moved to Orient in the summer of 2012 and was immediately given the captain's armband. Ever-present last term.

20 Marvin Bartley MF










LOUIS THOMPSON

FLYING THE NEST...

AS one of Town's own prepares to fly the nest, he reflects on an emotional career at SN1 and vows to return one day...




Cast your mind back to Leicester away in the FA Cup where you made your debut. Can you imagine the journey that you've been on since that moment?

No, I couldn't if I'm honest with you. I thought that season (2011/12) was up and down for me: I wasn't playing a lot of games, I'd been drafted into the first team but I wasn't playing in the youth team either at the time. I was plagued by injury as well but fortunately for me Di Canio did give me my chance. I came on and loved every minute, it was a great stadium to make my debut at and the boys around me were very supportive. From that day forward it's been a rollercoaster but it's been mostly highs for me and I think that that's been the story of my Swindon career to date. I was quite lucky and fortunate to have played with that team that won League 2. If I'm honest with you, I didn't expect to be where I am now when I made that debut.

Of course, you've been here since the age of seven...

I had just moved over from Germany and Nathan had signed here before me. I was down at Southampton at the time and I was going to sign

with them but I thought I'd rather stick with my brother and come through here. I think, in hindsight I think I made a good decision there. It's funny because I had Jeremy Newton - who's now the Academy Manager - as my coach then and he's brought me right the way through. It's been eventful - I've seen the club at its highest points

and its lowest points but it's been very enjoyable for me and to progress with this club and play 75 games it's just a little bit of payback to the coaches and even the fans that have looked after me and supported me throughout. Not many of the coaches are still around if I'm honest with you, at the time I had Mark Collier and Sam Collier and a couple of others. 'Nuttie', of course and, as I got a little bit older, Ian Palmer - he was Nathan's

manager when he first started - he's still here, Dave Warren too, they're the sort of coaches that taught me the ropes and I was lucky enough to learn under some of them and then to come under a couple of great managers: Paul Bodin who bought me from the youth team, then obviously Di Canio who taught me a lot about my mental strength and a few valuable, not only football lessons but life lessons. Then moving on to Luke and the Gaffer now, they've propelled me to where I am at the moment and given me my real chance which I can only be grateful for.

Does it make it even more special that you're playing alongside Nathan?

I never expected myself to be playing under him as my captain with him only being four years older than me but I think that's just the icing on the cake for our Swindon careers so far. For him to be leading this team into the Play-Offs, I couldn't ask for anything more and I'm desperate to be back there and helping him kick on and



get this club promoted because it's something that everybody deserves here. The amount of hard work everyone has put in over the past few years to recover from the well-documented turmoil deserves a day of happiness and I think promotion will do just fine.

One memory that will no doubt stick with you will be that first career goal against Sheffield United...

I'd say that's been the highest point in my career if I'm honest with you. The game was kind of irrelevant even though we still had a faint hope of making the Play-Offs. The feeling that I got there - I think you can tell by the facial expressions of my celebration - I was ecstatic and to have Nathan join me over there as well, it will be something that I'll never forget. I had my girlfriend and parents in the crowd who got a little bit fearful. Hopefully I can create many more of those moments but to be realistic I'm on to a new challenge next season and Nathan won't be joining me there so we've got to try and make the most of these moments that we're creating here and now.

It's been a season of tremendous progress for this football club. Would you agree?

Yeah, absolutely. I've been pleasantly surprised from pre-season to now how this club has progressed, both on and off the pitch. I think that the players we have now are the most talented bunch. Obviously I haven't played much first team football and I haven't been anywhere other than Swindon but we've had some great sides here in my time and I think this is up there with the best, if not the best. Some of the players from here will go on to much higher things. If you look at Ryan Mason for example, he was here last year and he's an

English international now. That's the thing here - the ethos at this club is turning heads. You only have to be here on a Saturday when you're not involved to see the amount of scouts that are watching. This is an enjoyable place to be and I think that's so important for how we've played this season. We're all friends and I really do mean that. That camaraderie will

be vital coming into the Play-Offs.

You've touched on Norwich already. You must be relishing a new challenge?

Absolutely yeah, it's another good club. I wanted to challenge myself again. I would have liked to have made 100 games for Swindon but when Norwich come knocking I don't think you can turn them down. I have unfinished business with Swindon though and I will be the happiest guy on earth if Swindon and Norwich get promoted this year. My main concern at the moment is just getting back fit and helping the boys over the line but I know they're capable of it and, if we turn up, I don't think there are many teams that can stop us, in the Play-Off semis or even in the final. Norwich will be a different challenge for me so that's what I'm going to have to focus on this summer: work hard and hopefully make the grade up there.

And a whole new group of people to teach that it's pronounced 'Lewis' and not 'Louis'...

Laughs Yeah, it's going to be

another year of just sorting that one out! I think I'm going to have to be stern early on and hopefully they hear me! I don't really mind either if I'm honest with you.

Finally, what would you like to say directly to the Town supporters?

I would just like to thank all the fans for the support they've provided me with through my career at Swindon. I've come right through the youth team where fans used to come and watch the FA Youth Cup games and I don't think that I've heard a bad word said about me from anyone since I've been here. I would like to repay them with getting promoted this year as a massive thank you to them. I don't think this will be my last ever Swindon game, I certainly



hope it's not. I think these fans can really get behind these boys this year. In the Play-Offs we'll make our own luck and hopefully we'll have that success come May 24th but, on a personal level, I want to thank the players, staff and coaches that I've worked with in my time here and the fans for supporting me. Like I say, I will be back at Swindon. I will be.

WE picked up a few knocks at Colchester on Tuesday night - so much for trying to rest players at Preston to ultimately get them ready going into the Play-Offs.

DURING any football match you can pick up an injury and Tuesday night was no exception. Wes Foderingham picked up a knee injury that is undergoing assessment at the moment, Harry Toffolo picked up a very nasty dead leg, Massimo turned his ankle and Jon Obika has tweaked his back, so at the moment - at the time of going to print it's a bit early to tell ahead of today's game - you've got players there that have picked up injuries and may well be doubtful, so the race now will be to try and get them fit for the first leg of the Play-Offs. At the moment I couldn't tell you who will be available and who won't. The next couple of days will be the timeframe needed to assess those accurately but at the moment they're all going to be doubtful.

The team selection over the past few days has been all about trying to freshen things up and making sure the lads were both mentally and physically prepared for the first leg of the Play-Offs. It's been a long, hard drawn-out season and unfortunately ours is not going to finish off at 3rd May. We've got potentially another month's worth of training and games ahead of us and we've got to make sure that the players are as fit - both mentally and physically - as possible and that was the game plan. The manager wanted to play what he was perhaps considering to

Ours has sort of stuttered a little bit and it hasn't quite worked out and obviously if these players that we have injured at the moment are not available to the gaffer today, hopefully they will be fit for the first leg of the Play-Offs but they won't have had much game time. It won't affect them fitness-wise but it's what effect that will have tactically and technically, remains to be seen.

WHO'S the biggest club in football that Town have ever beaten?

THE 2-0, 1970 League Cup win over Liverpool? The 1967 3-1 victory over West Ham in the FA Cup, against the side that contained all the key England players of the 1966 World Cup win?

Our 2-1 win over Tottenham in the Premier League in January 1994 perhaps? Ahh, how about Arsenal at Wembley in the League Cup in 1969 of course, or even the 4-3 win over the same opposition in the same competition in 1979?

Now, who do you reckon is the biggest team we have ever stuck four goals past for no return?

Swindon 4 Chelsea 0 in the 1988 Simod Cup?

How about both answers being this season's Champions League contenders Juventus?

On 2nd May 1970 we took on the Italian giants in the Anglo-Italian Cup at The County Ground, a competition that had been inaugurated as a result of Town being denied entry to the European Fairs Cup after that afore-mentioned win over Arsenal.

On the hour Peter Noble gave us the lead before Arthur Horsfield struck twice. Then, in the final minute, skipper Stan Harland sealed the emphatic 4-0 win in style.

I know what you're thinking. The 'Old Lady' fielded a weakened side for such a new competition.

Well, 'keeper Roberto Anzolin had been part of the Italian World Cup squad in 1966, while Francesco Morini would be off to the World Cup in Germany in 1974.

Libero Sandro Salvatore would win 36 full Italian caps during his career. Defender Antonello Cuccureddu would score the goal against AS Roma that claimed Juve's 15th league title in 1973.

Christian Vieri's dad Roberto also featured.

Juve didn't take the competition seriously? Winger Erminio Favalli went on to win the tournament himself as manager of Cremonese in 1993.

Yes but we had home advantage - a win at Fortress County Ground was one thing but what if we'd played them in Italy?

Well, we did, two weeks later. Peter Noble scored the only goal of the game in the 23rd minute to beat Juve there as well, as we went on to win the trophy that had been set up as a direct result of our Wembley win the previous season.

Forty five years ago Town were making an impact in Europe, humbling the biggest names.


And to think the FA denied us the chance to play in the Fairs Cup (what transmuted into the Europa League) because they thought we'd be an embarrassment to our country...









50s In focus

R&W turns the clock back 60 years as we continue our new feature in the 2014/15 edition of the programme...

AFTER suffering a five-goal hammering at home to Nottingham Forest in the opening game of the 1950's, things could only get better for Town. A week later they won at Northampton - only the second all season on their travels.

But, after starting their February programme with a draw against Norwich, they now faced three successive away games.

The first was at Leyton, where they had not lost in three previous encounters. The weather was awful, with driving rain and wind and the Brisbane Road pitch came under criticism from the Football Pink reporter 'RCE' who commented '...it had been rolled but the

surface was almost devoid of grass and was soft and sticky - almost resembling mud flats after the tide had gone out...'


Orient, who in those days wore blue shirts and white shorts, paraded two new signings from Queens Park Rangers in wingers Johnny Pattison and Billy McEwan. Town were able to welcome back nine-goal joint leading scorer Morris Jones for his first outing since Christmas Eve.

And it was he who set Swindon

on the way to victory with the only goal of the first period, following a 'route one' pass out of defence by big 'Garth' Hudson. Jones dashed into the centre to convert a Jimmy Bain cross from the left.

Bain set up a second for Jones, who headed past Syd Hobbins from a corner twenty minutes from time. It was the second in three seasons that the burly inside-left had hit a brace in a Town win at the east London venue.

put the hosts back in the game with four minutes left, but Town reaffirmed their authority with a third goal from Maurice Owen two minutes from time.

Subsequent trips to Newport and Watford on successive Saturdays both resulted in 2-1 victories for Town, seeing them climb the Division Three South table from 16th following the Forest debacle to twelfth.

But Owen missed the last month of the season through injury and Jones failed to add to his goal tally after 4 March as Swindon's season petered out - just one goal and one point coming from the final four games.

It would be a long time before victory at Orient was celebrated again, Town going seven games without a win before Dennis Brown hit a hat-trick there in 1964.







I'M obviously delighted for the boys that played for the first team last weekend at Preston...

It just shows you the hard work that the players have done this season, the hard work that Scott's done with the boys on the field and all the other coaches who've had some sort of input in those players' development throughout the academy. It's great for the boss to show trust in the players, trust in the academy and in what we're doing here and there's lots more to come from our academy. Now it's a case of working with Scott and the boss to make sure that they're ready.

A lot of work goes on behind the scenes to get the boys to this stage - when you work within the academy structure, you understand the level of commitment that the players have to adhere to, the commitment of their parents and the commitment of all the academy staff. There aren't many of us that are full-time; we rely on a lot of part-time staff and that's including our analyst, our psychologist, our sports scientist, our physios and medical provisions. There is a big demand on our part-time staff to ensure that we run an ambitious academy and, on top of that, make sure that we try and produce as many players as we can because, ultimately, that's what it is really: producing players for the first team. We've got a very good structure in place within our own academy, we've just got to keep churning them out and, as long as the boss is willing to give these players an opportunity, then we'll always be there providing him with players.

Elsewhere, we're winding down

the games programme. We've got three games left and then the boys will finish on 13th May. The older ones will have their own individual plans and then it's about reflection and review. All the players will undergo their release interviews with myself, the coaching staff and their parents. On the negative side, some players will be released and some players will be retained. That's part of the job; all the players that have gone on to play in the first team have gone through this process. Some of them have gone through it since they were seven - Louis Thompson has been through that since the age of seven and it was no different to the boys that are

playing now. It is hard, there are a lot of sacrifices to be made and a lot of dedication and commitment needed by all parties but, ultimately, seeing those boys with their name on the back of the shirt is an immensely proud moment for everyone in the academy and it has a knock-on effect for all the other academy players: they can see that if you are good enough then they'll get an opportunity because the boss is always down at the academy. They've just got to keep working hard and making sure they're ready, should (and hopefully when) the time comes.

I'M very proud of all my boys that were part of the first team squad at Preston last weekend.

IT'S not every day that a youth coach has three players make their debut in one game and the fact that they have gone in and made it look comfortable as well was more pleasing than anything else. Swindon Town is probably one club where the transition between the youth team and the first team will be a lot smoother than most because of the style of football that we play throughout – that's the younger age groups in the academy through to the youth team and right the way into the first team. We play a certain way which is possession-based, where players are very comfortable on the ball. Results don't matter in some ways in the youth team; we just go and dominate the ball and I think that those of you who were at Preston saw for yourself how Lee Marshall was so comfortable in possession. For his first game in league football I think he looked outstanding to be honest with you and I think it's probably due to the style of play that we play throughout the football club.

Effectively, we coach the young players so they're ready to play in the first team and there's no real reason behind playing a different way than the first team. We've got to play exactly the same way which we always have done - we dominate the ball, we want players to be comfortable and we want them to receive the ball in tight areas under pressure and we do that regardless

of what the opposition do, regardless of the result or the time or state of the game. We just keep playing and we pass the ball and try and produce players that way. We feel that it's obviously working. We play against other youth teams that feel that winning games is more important to them and they'll play a little more direct but I'm not sure that they're producing players on the same scale that

we are. We've just scratched the surface on Saturday in terms of what we've got at the club because we've got others as well. Certainly with next year's scholars coming up there's some real bright talent in that group. We're really proud of them and, like the gaffer has said, we think a lot of them.





WE welcome Leyton Orient to The County Ground this afternoon for the final match of this season which started with hope and not expectation that we could attain a top six position to compete in the end of season Play-Offs.

NOW that goal has been achieved, naturally we all want more and the possibility of reaching another Wembley final is uppermost in all our minds. Orient have endured a very difficult campaign, now occupying 23rd spot in the table but still with a chance of escaping the drop if they can win today and five other results go in their favour at the bottom of the league. Italian manager Fabio Liverani was appointed back in December 2014 having previously managed for a brief three-month period at Genoa and with an impressive playing career including spells at Lazio, Fiorentina and Napoli not to mention his caps for the Italian national team. Our midweek trip to Essex yielded another point in what was a must-win game for Colchester in their quest to avoid relegation. We again conceded an early goal - timed at 34 seconds after kick-off - to give the team an uphill battle against opponents literally fighting for their lives to avoid the drop. After the break another impressive substitute's performance from Jermaine Hytton helped to drag the team back into contention and Ben Gladwin added to his already impressive goals tally with a glancing header into the opposite corner from Yaser Kasim's free-kick. Last weekend's trip to Preston, when manager Mark Cooper made wholesale changes to the team giving starts and debuts to a number of



our promising youngsters, drew criticism from a few of our travelling supporters whose comments I received on BBC Wiltshire after the match. MK Dons manager Karl Robinson also waded into the argument with his comment that "Mark Cooper will say that he had to do it for the right reasons but when you see the team he selected before the game it was difficult for us to take". First and foremost from my perspective, I have to say that Mark made absolutely, without any question, the right decision for Swindon Town Football Club. Every other manager, including Karl Robinson, would have made the same decision given our circumstances where our small squad of players faced nine matches in 30 days during April after (through no fault of our own) matches had been previously rearranged because of

international call ups and being unable to play against Walsall due to the JPT Final. No other club faced that schedule! I fully understand that the supporters paid good money to travel away from home but every member of Swindon's small squad can play a part this season and the emergence of Jermaine Hytton, whose performance was one of guts, skill and determination for 90 minutes was a big plus for us. Despite having more than 50% ball possession we were beaten by the deadly finishing of 25-goal top scorer, Joe Garner. 
