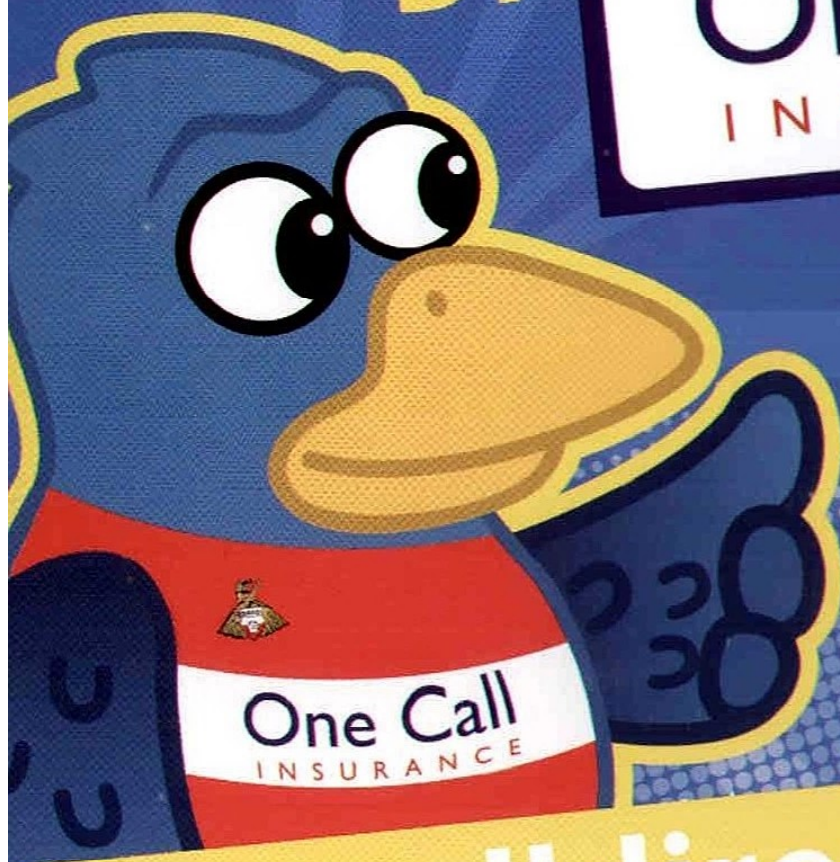

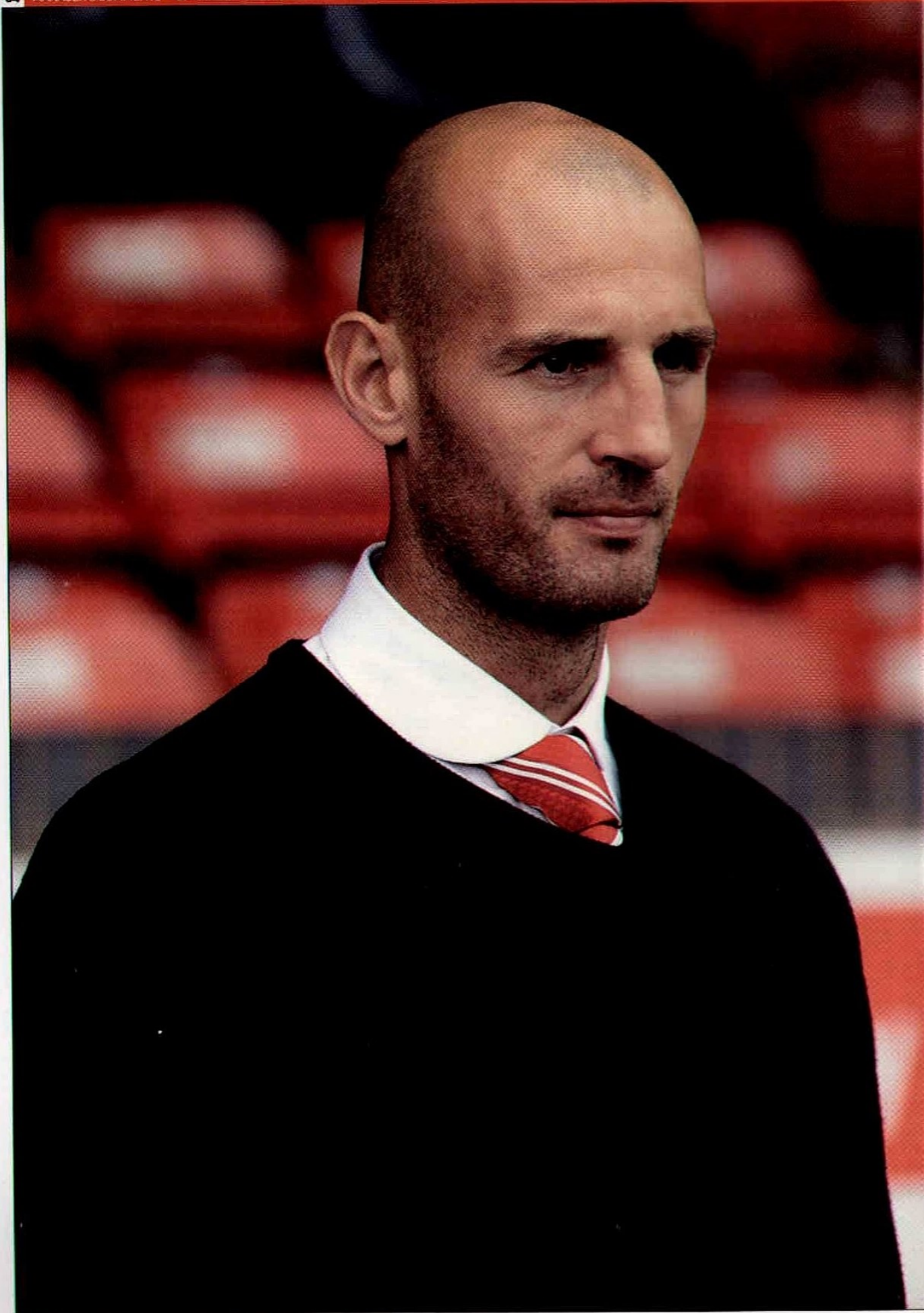

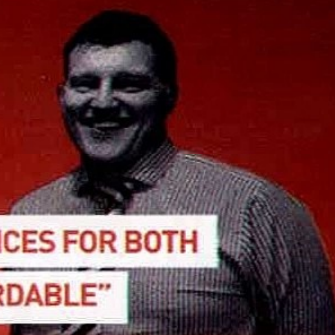

We had a disappointing result at Bramall Lane over the weekend against our Sheffield neighbours but we have a great chance to put things right this evening.

Rob was very open last week about his desire to take on the first team manager role on a permanent basis. As we have communicated, we will give Rob the full backing until a manager is appointed on a full time basis. That shows in our recent loan signing of Keshi Anderson (from Crystal Palace) and we are actively looking at others coming in with Rob. The application deadline has now passed and we will now invest our time over the next couple of weeks shortlisting and conducting interviews.

Myself, Rob Jones and Ryan Murrant (Marketing and Communications Manager) recently attended the Retford Branch of Doncaster Rovers Supporters' AGM. We would like to thank them for their hospitality and for the very kind donations that they made to the club and to the Club

Doncaster Foundation. An incredible total of £3,310 was presented to us, all of which will be invested in to gym and rehabilitation equipment at Cantley Park and in to attracting young children as fans of the future through the Club Doncaster Foundation.

On Saturday we face local rivals Barnsley here at Keepmoat Stadium. As you will have seen we have reduced the prices for both sets of fans to make the game even more affordable. The idea of reducing prices for this game and the Bradford game is to encourage more supporters here primarily, but also to make our big games bigger.

We work closely with the Football League and other Clubs and we collectively agree that it is better to try and grow a 8,000 - 9,000 gate to 10,000 - 11,000 rather than to incentivise games where the gate may not be so high. We look forward to you joining us.

Doncaster Rovers are delighted to welcome Keshi Anderson to the football club on a 28 day loan.

The highly rated 20 year old striker joined last week from Premier League side Crystal Palace with Doncaster having fended off stiff competition from a list of would be suitors. The Eagles striker arrived at Selhurst Park in February from non league Barton Rovers - having scored a hat-trick against Alan Pardew's side in a trial game.

Anderson who scored on his U21's debut for Palace, has recently hit two hat-tricks in five matches for the U21's. "Keshi has had a vast and quick rise to the top," said Rob Jones. "A lot of people were discussing him and whether to have a look but I liked what I saw so I've taken him. SWINDON TOWN

Swindon Town are one of the 47 clubs that have played in the Premier League at some stage since it began back in 1992. The Robins did not enter the competition until the season after, where they unfortunately did not have the best of campaigns.

They were relegated alongside Oldham Athletic and Sheffield United at the end of the 1993-94 season, finishing bottom of the table, only won five games and conceded a record amount of goals (100) in their debut season.

However, Swindon are a club with a considerable amount of history, they won the Football League Cup in 1969 beating Bertie Mee's Arsenal 3-1 at Wembley, thanks to a Don Rogers brace in extra-time in front of 98,189 keen football fans.

The Robins have had some well-known ex-footballers take charge at the County Ground, players such as; Dave Mackay, Lou Macari, Ossie Ardiles, Glenn Hoddle, Colin Todd and many more.

Swindon Town achieved promotion to League One at the end of the 2011-12 season under Italian manager Paolo Di Canio. They have been desperately unlucky not to take the step up into the Championship in the past few seasons, they were beaten on penalties against Brentford in the semi-finals in 2013.

They were then beaten 4-0 by Preston North End at Wembley in the play-off final the season after, Jermaine Beckford formally of Leeds United stole the show that day after netting a hat-trick to become the third player ever to score three goals in a play-off final.

Manager Mark Cooper will be looking to put the clubs previous misfortunes behind them and make that all important leap into the Championship.

THE GAFFER MARK COOPER

Mark Cooper was installed as Swindon boss in August 2013 after Kevin McDonald resigned from the post. Cooper who was a well travelled footballer during his playing days is now looking to bolster his managerial CV, as he looks to take the Robins to the next level.

The Yorkshire man who was born in Wakefield, was desperately unlucky not to achieve promotion last season as he guided his team to a 4th place finish in League One. They performed superbly in the semi-final of the playoffs beating Sheffield United 7-6 on aggregate over two legs, including a blockbuster 5-5 score line at the County Ground. It was Jermaine Beckford (Preston North End) who stole the show in the final after he scored a hat-trick to kill the Robins' Championship dream.

Cooper started his professional footballing career with Bristol City but failed to make a single appearance while he was at Ashton Gate, he moved to Exeter City in 1989 but only stayed there for a total of two seasons before moving on once again.

He played for a total of 17 clubs during his career. Some of those include; Huddersfield Town, Birmingham City, Leyton Orient and Fulham. Cooper started management in 2004, taking charge of Tamworth while he was still playing, he did the same with Kettering Town a few years later.

After hanging up his boots in 2009 with Kettering, he took over Peterborough United a few seasons later but he was given his marching orders after just 13 games in charge. The 46 year-old has also been the gaffer at Darlington, AFC Telford United and now Swindon Town.



NICKY AJOSE

Age: 23

The 23 year-old from Bury in Greater Manchester started his professional footballing career with Premier League giants Manchester United, the forward failed to register a single league appearance during his two years with the club. Ajose signed for Darren Ferguson's Peterborough United in 2011 on a four-year deal, he made his debut for the Posh against now-Premier League side Crystal Palace on the opening day of the 2011/12 season. The striker was loaned out to five clubs (Scunthorpe United, Chesterfield, Crawley Town, Bury and Swindon Town) during his three year tender at London Road. Leeds United was his next preferred destination but it was a sense of déjà vu as he was swiftly loaned out to Crewe Alexandra. Ajose was not assigned a squad number under new Leeds manager Uwe Rosler at the start of the 2015/16 season which saw him leave the club, he was not out options as he signed for Swindon Town a few hours later.

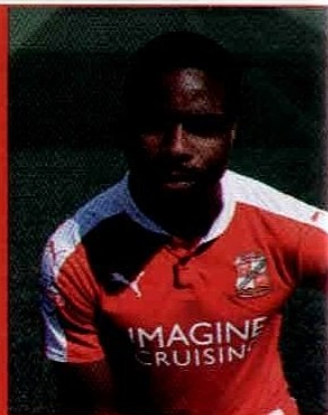
**JONATHAN OBIKA**

Age: 25

Born in Enfield, London, Obika is a product of the Tottenham Hotspur youth system and he was also the top scorer for the academy side in the 2007/08 season. He was awarded with a professional contract with Spurs the season after, the youngster unfortunately failed to make any league appearances during his six-year stay at the club. He did however make two European appearances for Tottenham in the 2008/09 season, he made his debut in the UEFA Cup against NEC Nijmegen from Holland and a few months later he made his home debut for Spurs in the latter stages of the competition at White Hart Lane against Ukrainian side Shakhtar Donetsk. Obika has been on loan with seven different clubs during his time at Spurs including his current side Swindon Town back in 2011. He signed for the Robins on deadline day in 2014, the forward scored a brace on his debut for the club beating Yorkshire side Bradford City 2-1 at Valley Parade.

**FABIEN ROBERT**

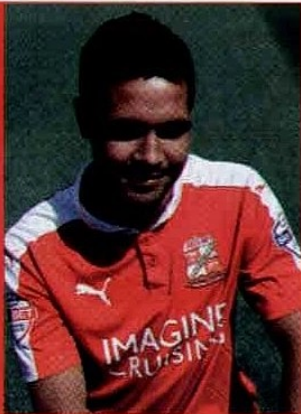

Rovers fans might recognise the Frenchman due to the short time he spent on loan at the Keepmoat in 2012. Robert joined in the January transfer window from FC Lorient when

Rovers were in the Championship, he made his debut in one of the biggest games that season, the Yorkshire derby against Leeds United at Elland Road. The midfielder went onto make 13 league appearances and even managed to score two goals in the Championship against Portsmouth and Ipswich Town respectively. While at FC Lorient, Robert was also loaned out to U.S. Boulogne, the 26-year old made a combined total of 83 appearances during his time at Lorient, which also saw him play for their B team. He joined Swindon Town on a one-year contract at the start of the 2015/16 season, he has already scored three goals for the Robins in his debut season.

**NATHAN THOMPSON**

Age: 24

League appearances: 115

League goals: 1

A product of Swindon's youth academy, the Chester-born defender has become one of the clubs stand out players over the past few seasons.

Thompson signed his professional contract with the Robins in 2008 but did not make his debut until 2010 against Charlton Athletic in League One. He was also on the radar of some Premier League clubs such as; Arsenal, Tottenham Hotspur, Everton and Newcastle United but no formal bids were submitted to the Robins. On Saturday 20 April 2013, Thompson was awarded the 2012/2013 Swindon Advertiser 'Player of the Year' after winning by more than 60 per cent of the fans' votes and Thompson won it again at the end of the 2013/2014 season. Thompson was appointed Swindon Town skipper at the start of the 2014/15 season and is definitely one of the league's most exciting defenders.

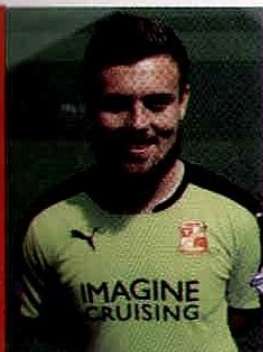

CLUB LEGEND**COLIN CALDERWOOD**

Recognised as a Swindon great – and listed in the Robins all time XI – the Stranraer born defender amassed over 400 appearances in Wiltshire and his time at the club coincided with a boom period at the County Ground. A £27,000 buy from Mansfield Town when aged just 21, Calderwood was made captain and was an ever present over the next eight years as the club won promotion **FOUR** times!

An internationally recognised defender, Calderwood – whilst with Tottenham Hotspur – went to both Euro 96 and France 98 as part of the Scotland squads and would win 36 caps in total for his country.

QPR was my life until 12 or 13 and I used to go to see them and then Fulham the next weekend as I was engulfed in football. You probably don't realise that you're going to have a lasting affiliation because sometimes when you leave it can be difficult but with the people of Swindon, that's not been the case. I think they always looked at me as one of their own. It's remained the place that I'm best known for and the people down here don't remember when I was injured or struggling, they remember the happier times.

When Rugby meets Football...

Mike Brown (England full back) is engaged to Tony Woodcock's daughter so we were previewing his comeback from concussion with England, what with the Rugby World Cup taking place. It was good to get a take on top level sport and the dynamic in their family. Tony, like me, wasn't too fond of rugby but the progression with that sport we were really intrigued by his future son-in-law's career.

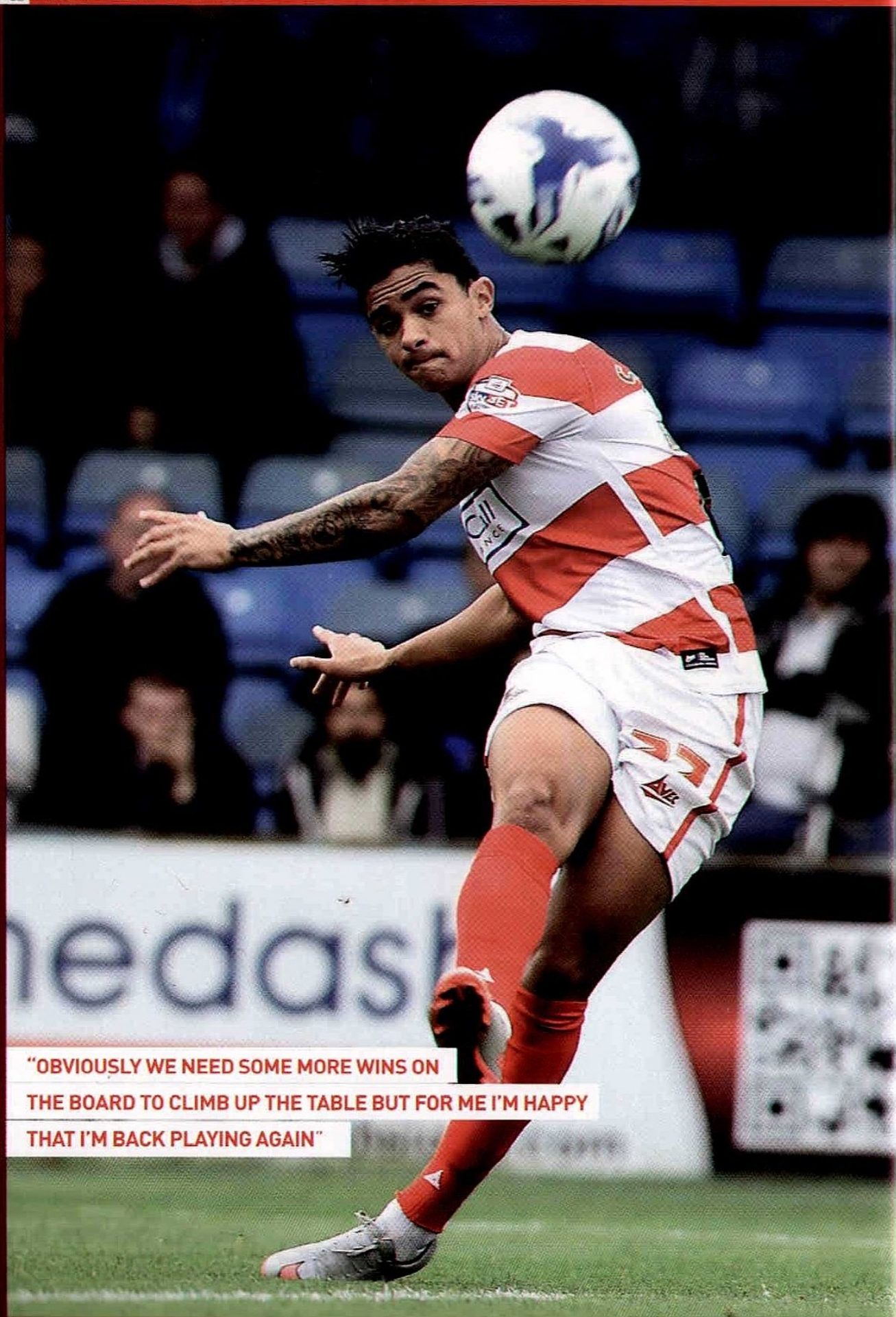

What's it like to be back up and running?

It feels good to be back playing regularly. I've had a few frustrating months of training all week and then at the end of it not having a game to play. Obviously we need some more wins on the board to climb up the table but for me I'm happy that I'm back playing again.

Physically how have you found it?

It's not been too bad to be honest. Obviously the first game I got 60 minutes or so which was tough away from home and even though I played in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy it wasn't as intense. I played at Walsall and then ninety minutes since that. It's not like I've been beaten up but the Saturday – Tuesday routine is about to kick in so we'll see how it goes.

How would you describe the managerial circumstance?

For me, I know I came under Paul Dickov and I thank him for bringing me in and I never got a chance to work under him but it's about me trying to get some regular football and myself going again and enjoying myself. Even though it was a big shock to me what happened, it's happened before and personally I need to keep my head down and not let it worry me. It's about me playing football and whether that's Paul Dickov or the gaffer now I want to be picked.

What have you made to the gaffer, Rob Jones?

I'm enjoying it. It's been a bit different. It always happens when a new manager comes in and you get a reaction, things are more intense in training and we've done a lot more as a team. It feels a bit better at the moment and there's nothing bad to say about him – or Paul – as I've not had a lot of time to work under either and I'm confident we will get results under the gaffer and hopefully that starts on Saturday, going in to Tuesday.

You're only 24; you seem to have been around forever...

I know I've been around for a long time! I've had a fair few clubs. Obviously on my CV it doesn't look great and people would question why I've had so many clubs but the good thing that I'll say is I'm not one to sit there and not play.

People can say I've given up and I'm not prepared to fight for my spot but you know when you're not playing and you're not in someone's plans so I'd rather go somewhere on loan and try and enjoy myself because I don't enjoy training all week and not playing on a Saturday. I enjoy the Saturday feeling – before and after the game – getting three points whereas training with nothing the end of the week has never suited me.

Were you a victim of your own success at Hull City?

When I left Manchester United where everything is rosy and in a bubble, you don't really see what it's like out there. I went to Hull and even playing regular – despite a lengthy knee injury – things started to change once we got a new manager. That's when you realise football is opinions and some will like you and some won't. Since then I've been chasing and now I'm more experienced I concentrate on me and not others. A lot of things that have happened have helped; even though I feel old I've got time to go and create myself.

What's the situation at Ipswich? It doesn't seem to have clicked?

It's not happened and the gaffer has his own opinions and I have mine. I think he (Mick McCarthy) is a great manager and look at what he's done there – they'll be pushing for the play offs again this season no doubt. I signed a three year deal and haven't played in the league; it's only been the FA Cup or reserves. It came to the stage where I can see that he doesn't fancy me, I wasn't enjoying it and I was a long way from home so I needed to move on and find some football and happiness. There was no point in me fighting there and everyone getting frustrated. I had to do whatever to get games. There were opportunities to go to other Championship clubs but I didn't want the same scenario. Everyone says "You're a footballer, get on with it" but when there's nothing enjoyable about it and when your

job is to be a footballer and you're not doing that you get annoyed.

What's your best or preferred position?

Left wing, that's where I feel more comfortable to go both ways, it gives me options but I'll play left, right or down the middle.

What do you hope to have achieved by the time your current loan deal expires in January?

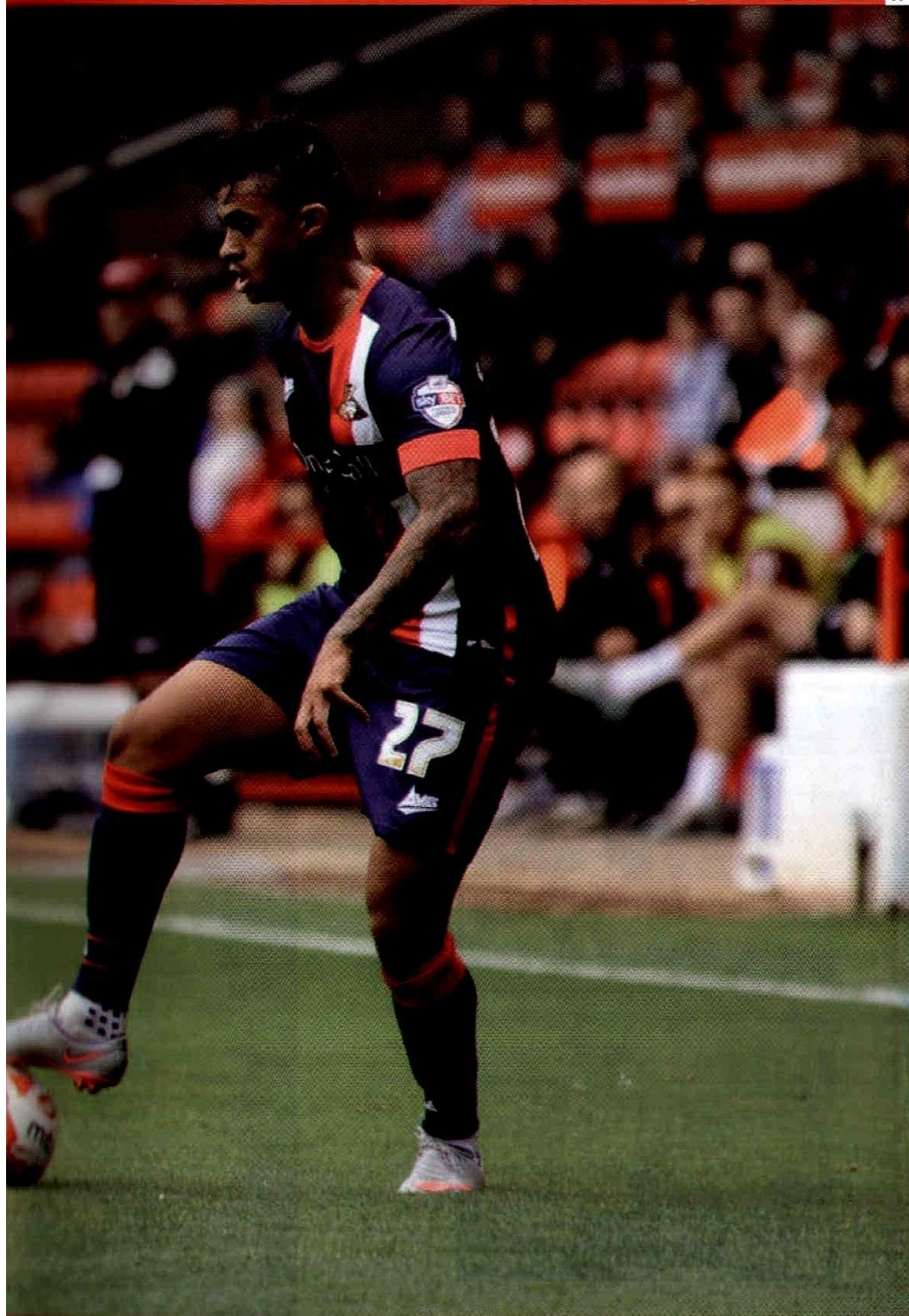
My aim is to play in as many games as possible and get assists and goals. If the opportunity is to stay here with the gaffer now or whoever then that'd be a consideration or even to move on. I've still got another year at Ipswich after this and if I'm honest with myself I'd love to go back there and fight back and get in to the side.

Will it happen?

I don't know. It's a conversation I could have in January or at the end of the season. I want to enjoy playing the games. I don't want to be in the bottom three and nor does anyone else here! I want to fight to get back up the table.

Is there anyone you look up to in football?

It was mainly my dad – he wasn't a bad player to be fair! The obvious ones were Andy Cole because we used to see him around Manchester. Once I got older and played out wide, we had players like Cristiano Ronaldo and Nani at the club and people would naturally look at them, but at a club like United you're going to have more than one role model!

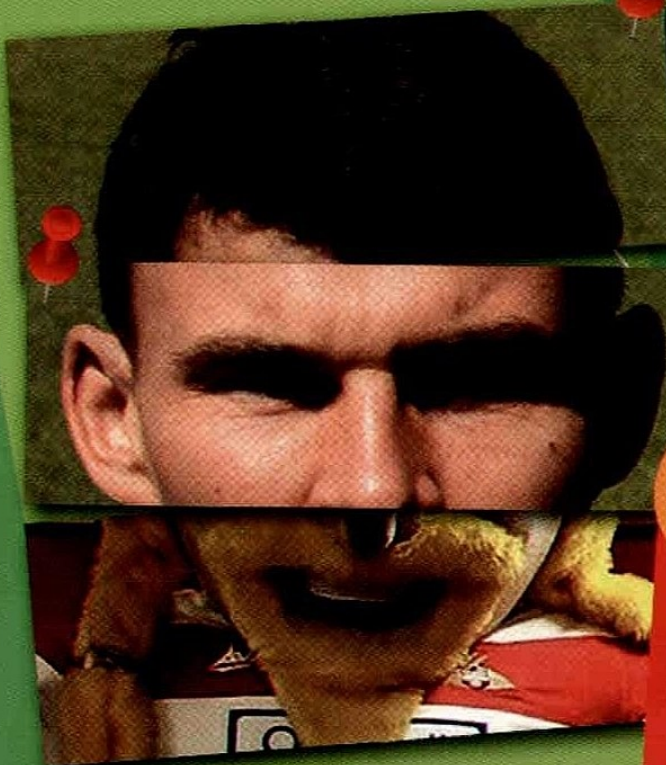

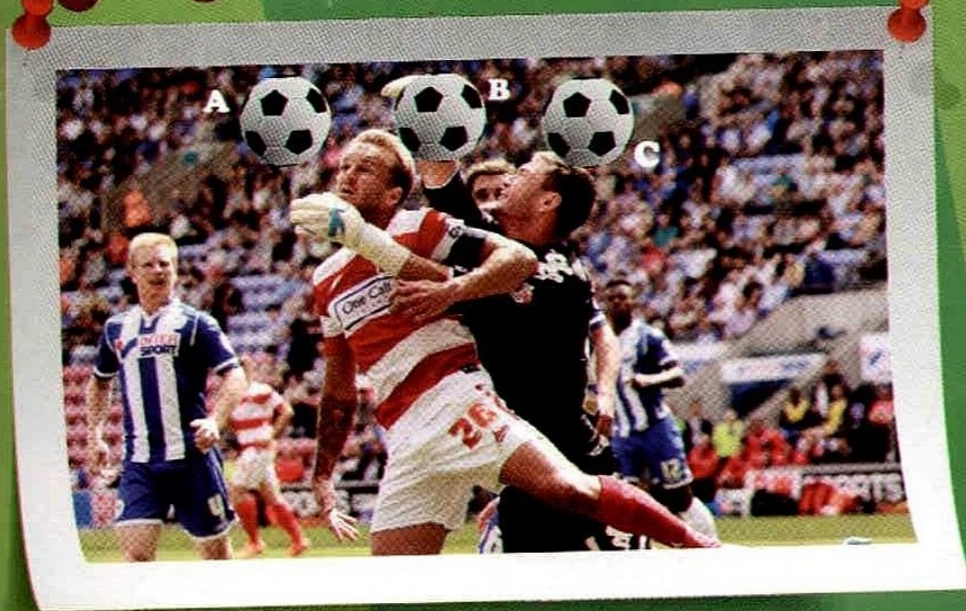

5. Cruyff Turn

The Cruyff turn named after the Johan Cruyff is one of the first turns you will be taught when learning to play football.

When Johan Cruyff sold Jan Olsson the mother of all dummies with the subtlety of swerves, the Dutch captain's signature move became world-famous as the symbol of Total Football.

It is a fairly simple turn that is used most commonly to defeat an opposing side's defender by making him think you will do something, but then you will do something else.



- 1) Approach the ball and plant your non-kicking foot next to it, just as if you were going to kick it.

- 2) Swing your kicking leg toward the ball.



- 3) Use the inside of your kicking foot to drag the ball back behind your planted leg and into the open space opposite the direction in which you would have kicked it.



- 4) Take one or two touches to settle the ball and begin dribbling in a new direction.
