


PLANNING APPLICATION SUBMITTED FOR NEW TRAINING FACILITY AT SQUIRES GATE

NEW PURPOSE BUILT SET OF FACILITIES TO BE ERECTED

The club has submitted a planning application to Fylde Borough Council to build a new training facility at Squires Gate.

The application seeks full planning permission for the replacement of the existing training facilities with a new purpose-built set of facilities, located broadly on the same footprint as the existing building.

The new facility the club plans to erect will include changing rooms, a classroom, offices, a hospitality area/players' canteen, rehabilitation gym, physiotherapists' room and associated facilities. The facility will also allow the club's Category Three Academy to be housed at Squires Gate.

The building will be of single storey with a mono pitch roof, sloping northwards away from the playing pitches which will be retained in their existing layout.

The club will keep supporters informed regarding the process by providing further updates in due course.

THE MATCH




Neil McDonald will hope Tuesday's long-awaited first home victory of the season will open the floodgates and Blackpool can register back-to-back wins at Bloomfield Road. The Seasiders deservedly chalked up three points against Chesterfield, and seeing off Swindon Town is their next task in hand.

Mark Cullen and Brad Potts struck on Tuesday night, as Pool played with the confidence and consistency that McDonald has been pleading for. This afternoon Swindon arrive on the Fylde Coast on the back of a morale-boosting result of their own.

An injury-time equaliser at Doncaster Rovers in the week ended a run of three consecutive defeats for The Robins, who sit four points ahead of Blackpool in 14th.

This afternoon Pool may be forced to make at least one change to their side, with Lloyd Jones limping out of Tuesday's game with an ankle injury. Tom Aldred could come in to replace the Liverpool loanee, after missing the Chesterfield clash with concussion.

As for Swindon, former Blackpool loanee Wes Thomas is likely to miss out on a return to Bloomfield Road with a hamstring injury, while skipper Nathan Thompson remains sidelined. This afternoon will be Town's first visit to Bloomfield Road since 2005, when they drew 0-0.





What is your favourite piece of football memorabilia that you own?



INSPIRING OTHERS

BOYCE DETERMINED TO HELP PEOPLE DREAM BIG

A selfless individual, Emmerson Boyce continues to highlight all that is good in the game with his unwavering commitment to several causes – on-and-off the pitch.

The right-back has spent the last 19 years living his dream as a professional footballer and is determined to help others achieve their ultimate goals.

Full of wisdom, the former Luton Town, Crystal Palace and Wigan man has amassed more than 550 appearances in his career to date and is already proving an invaluable asset to a young Blackpool side.

"It's great to be inspired but to inspire other people is fantastic," he told *Up The Pool*. "I always look to try and give advice to the younger players. Whether they want to learn or not is up to them, but I've always been around senior players in my career and learnt

from them, picking up certain habits and doing things they do. Hopefully I can be a good role model to the players that are here and the younger players coming through."

Boyce's commitment to a team ethic is summed up by his attitude to playing in different positions. He's been utilised as a left-back, centre-back, right-back and wing-back during his career and given the same effort and concentration to each role.

"The modern day footballer has to be able to adapt to different positions. Wherever the manager wants you to play, you go and play," he said. "That's always been my attitude. If you play with the right attitude then you can go a long way in the game."

"Part of football in general is about enjoying yourself and playing with a smile. There's a lot of things going on in the world and we've got to take what we do as a blessing."

Used to the role of underdog at Wigan Athletic, Boyce has always believed in aiming high to make your dreams a reality. He holds the record for the most Premier League appearances for The Latics, captained the side to the FA Cup in 2013 and also played in the Europa League.

"I started off with Luton in League One, League Two and I never even dreamed I'd play in the Premier League, even though you want to be there," he admitted. "It was such a big gap that I never thought I'd get there, but I was lucky enough to get my break at Crystal Palace. I was lucky enough to spend a lot of time with Wigan in the Premier League and play at some fantastic grounds and against some fantastic players."

"Winning the FA Cup at Wembley was a






dream come true. It brought back the childhood memories of playing in the park and putting your jumpers down as goals to pretend you're playing at Wembley and lifting the cup.

"I'm still fulfilling my career now because I want to get promoted. It's going to be a hard task but you've still got to believe that we can get close to the play-offs if we start moving up the table."

The defender embraced the community of Wigan during his time at the DW Stadium and became an ambassador for Joseph's Goal, a charity set up to increase awareness of, and funds for research into, Non-Ketotic Hyperglycinemia, a very rare life-limiting genetic disorder that severely affects the development of five-year-old Joseph Kendrick.

Boyce is also an ambassador for Street Soccer USA, an organisation that looks to bring social change by improving health, education and employment outcomes for the most disadvantaged in America through sport.

"I find joy out of putting a smile on people's faces because I'm in a position where I can do that. I'm lucky enough to be an ambassador for Joseph's Goal and Street Soccer USA, while my wife has done domestic violence work. It's important to raise awareness and help out where I can. That's something I'll always do."

Based down south until 2006, the defender has settled well to life in the north-west and was pleased to stay local when leaving Wigan.

"The manager told me his visions for the football team and it was also a great opportunity for me to stay up north with my family," he said. "My family is settled and I like it up here. At the moment we have no real desire to move back down south and this opportunity has been great for me, personally."

Boyce hails from a family with a sporting gene, whether it be in football or cricket. Former Blackpool winger Matty Phillips is one of his cousins, as is West Indian batsman Omar Phillips.

"My dad was a keen cricketer and both my brothers played football but not at a professional level," he revealed. "My cousin in Barbados has played for the West Indies and Matty Phillips did well for Blackpool and is now with QPR. Hopefully my boys will be the next generation coming through."

Although renowned for being a versatile defender, Boyce initially started out as a striker in his junior years and has been quick to spring that on Blackpool's two goalkeepers.

"I've been telling Doyley some of my stories," he said with a huge smile. "As a defender you want to keep a clean sheet, but in training I will take a wander up front now and then and score a few past Doyley and Kyle."

Captain of the Barbados international team, Boyce is determined to create a legacy for football in what is primarily a cricket-loving country. His experience could well prove invaluable to establishing the right setup.



"Barbados is a long, long way from being on the map of football but we are getting there, slowly but surely," he admitted. "I've been trying to help the structure of it for the last five or six years, trying to make it more professional and get more publicity."

"It's a shame that we didn't do so well in the last World Cup qualifier because we beat Aruba 2-0 away – I scored both goals – and then 1-0 in Barbados. One of our players had two yellow cards and he shouldn't have played in the second game so we got kicked out. It was a real shame because at the time the country was talking about football, and it's a cricket country."

"I still wear the armband because I don't want to give up. I'm still loyal to the cause and I'm representing Barbados and my friends. The same as Honduras and Trinidad and Tobago, Barbados can be the next country that people know about."

Now 36, Boyce is keen to extend his playing career as long as possible. His recent playing record shows no sign of slowing down as he adapts to the demands of the modern game by embracing new methods.

"Since I was about 32, 33 Roberto Martinez told me that I have to look after my body. Ryan Giggs took to Yoga, and I've done a bit of that, as well as Pilates. Sometimes you're envious of the young boys running around every day and you're a bit stiff, but it's all about looking after yourself. I was 34 when I played the most games for Wigan in a season so it shows it can be done. Hopefully I've still got a couple of years left in me."

Boyce has started every league game since joining the club in the summer and today he'll be part of a side looking to back-up Tuesday's victory against Chesterfield.


"We haven't really done ourselves justice in some of the games, but we had our best performance of the season against Chesterfield. Games in quick succession can make a big difference in the table so we'll be looking for another good result this afternoon. There's a hunger to be successful and it will come together."

"It's a project in progress and we will start moving up the table," he added.




TOWN TURNING POINT

LATE STRIKE PROVIDES IMPETUS

When looking for season-defining moments come next May, Swindon Town may well refer back to the 90th minute of Tuesday's clash with Doncaster Rovers, when a poor run of form was in danger of escalating until Jonathan Obika intervened at the death.

The club's top scorer halted a run of three consecutive defeats by heading home a late equaliser at the Keepmoat Stadium. Good value for their point, according to manager Mark Cooper, but it could have been all three after Nicky Ajose had the visitors in front.

Injuries to captain Nathan Thompson and focal point Wes Thomas have hit The Robins hard, with Barnsley, Burton and Colchester taking maximum points off them in recent weeks, but they've still lost just one away game going into today's game.

Recovering from play-off final heartbreak at the hands of Preston last season, Cooper had a job on his hands to rebuild his squad, and again called in favours from



the Premier League, with six hot prospects coming in on loan.

Known for playing expansive, eye-catching football, The Robins have stuck to their morals this season and when they've got it right have been too hot for their opposition to handle, as Bradford and Crewe will testify.

And boss Cooper has been handed the boost

of Lawrence Vigouroux's return to the camp this week, following clear-the-air talks due to the topical coin incident, and he'll battle with Tyrell Belford for the number one jersey.

Currently sat in 14th on 12 points, victory over Blackpool this afternoon could move Swindon into the top half. Today is their first visit to Bloomfield Road since 2005, when the likes of Rory Fallon, Jamie Cureton and Cristian Roberts were lining up in red.

STADIUM

The County Ground

Home to Swindon Town since its opening in 1896, The County Ground can house up to 15,728 supporters. It's known as the only stadium in the world with a large Rolex watch providing the time, which is situated next to the scoreboard in the Stratton Bank Stand. Running alongside the pitch on either side is a two-tiered stand, which tower above the two smaller stands behind each goal. Pool's last visit in 2005 finished 0-0.

TRADITIONS

In 1902 Swindon wore their traditional red kit for the first time, leading to their nickname of The Robins. Previously known for wearing white, black and then green, their kit has remained the same colour ever since. The club share their nickname with Bristol City and Cheltenham Town. Their current badge has been in use since 2007, replacing their previous diamond shaped logo which had been active since 1991.

Under the stewardship of the outspoken former West Ham striker Paolo Di Canio, Swindon enjoyed an immediate return to League One by lifting the title in 2012. The Robins amassed 93 League Two points and finished as runners up in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy at Wembley. Paul Benson and Alan Connell both hit double figures to aid Town's cause, while the likes of Paul Caddis and Matt Ritchie were key men.

FAMOUS ALUMNUS

Charlie Austin

Plucked from the depths of non-league football with Poole Town, Charlie Austin, who received an England call-up in the summer, was signed by The Robins in 2009. The striker fired 37 goals in 65 Swindon appearances and played an integral role in their run to the play-off final in 2010. He went on to sign for Burnley and now turns out for QPR, who managed to fend off interest from the Premier League in the summer.

SUNDAY 15 MARCH 1969

The only time Swindon Town have won a domestic trophy in their history was in 1969 when they defeated Arsenal to lift the League Cup.

A flying start from The Robins saw Roger Smart open the scoring and it looked as though his goal would be enough to see them home.

It wasn't to be however and extra-time loomed large after Bobby Gould's equaliser five minutes from time gave Arsenal the momentum.



Swindon dug deep however and secured a famous win during the extra period thanks to a brace from Don Rogers, which gave

Swindon Town completed an unlikely promotion to the Premier League in 1993 after defeating Leicester City at Wembley in the play-off final.

Player-Manager Glenn Hoddle opened the scoring on 42 minutes, but the Wiltshire-based club were soon pegged back by Julian Joachim.

Goals from Craig Maskell and Shaun Taylor meant that Swindon had one foot firmly placed in the top flight. Leicester weren't finished though and goals from defender Steve Walsh and an equaliser from Steve Thompson set up a nervy finale.

It would be left-back Paul Bodin who'd write his name into Swindon folklore and his penalty six minutes from time meant that it was The Robins who would rub shoulders with the likes of Chelsea, Manchester United and Arsenal during the 1993/94 campaign.

Despite losing out to Gillingham, Saturday 21 April goes down as the day when Swindon Town were promoted back to the third tier under boss Paolo Di Canio's guidance.


Swindon went on to progress and reach the League One play-offs the following season, before narrowly missing out to Brentford who would go onto the final instead.

THE HOT SEAT

THE GAFFER MARK COOPER



Now in his third season with Swindon Town, Mark Cooper is rebuilding for another assault on the division after reaching the play-off final in May.

The 46-year-old, son of former Leeds United and England full-back Terry Cooper, has overseen plenty of transition at the club and has continually identified young, hungry players to take his side forward and be successful.

Keen for his players to express themselves, Cooper has had to replace a number of key players such as Nathan Byrne, Massimo Luongo and Ben Gladwin in the summer following the club's exploits last season.

Prior to Swindon, Cooper had spent time in charge of Tamworth, Kettering Town, Peterborough United and Darlington.

THREE FROM THE PAST




LOU MACARI

Former Manchester United star Lou Macari achieved two promotions during a five-year spell with Swindon Town.

Initially dismissed a year after taking the job in 1985 following disagreements with his assistant manager over playing style, he was quickly reinstated to the position on the back of a fan-led protest.

Macari guided the club to a record breaking 102-point promotion from Division Four in 1986 and Third Division play-off success a year later.

His exploits attracted the attention of West Ham United and Macari was subsequently appointed manager at Upton Park in 1989.



GLENN HODDLE

Ex-England international Glenn Hoddle stepped into a player-manager role at Swindon Town in 1991 and was a big success.

Inheriting a side stripped of promotion in 1990 and forced to sell several key players, Hoddle kept the club in Division Three and then saw his side just miss out on the play-offs.

His side finally reached the play-offs in 1993 and beat Leicester City 4-3 in a classic final at Wembley, with Hoddle scoring the first for his side.

Days after promotion he was head hunted by Chelsea and confirmed as their new manager.



PAOLO DI CANIO

Although his time at Swindon was somewhat controversial, Paolo Di Canio guided the club back to League One in his first season in charge and reached a Football League Trophy final.

The maverick Italian led his side to a 93-point haul in League Two but resigned in the following season during a time of financial difficulty.

His stint in charge was marred by player bust-ups, but his appointment and success attracted plenty of media attention and the board at Sunderland, who went on to appoint him as manager two months later.

SPREADING WINGS WITH THE ROBINS

SWINDON UTILISING CONTACTS IN THE GAME

Goalkeeper Tyrell Belford is pleased Swindon Town are taking advantage of their strong link with Liverpool, which has formed due to the similarities between both clubs' style of play.

Belford, who progressed through the Anfield academy before moving south in 2013, is one of a host of connections between the Premier League side and The Robins.

Jordan Williams and Kevin Stewart are currently on loan from Merseyside, while Anton Rodgers, son of Reds' boss Brendan, is now part of the Swindon set-up.

The link can only be a positive thing, according to Belford, who has returned to the fore in recent weeks and started the last two games.

Tyrell, having arrived from Anfield yourself, how important is Swindon's link with Liverpool?

It's good to have that link and we're grateful to Liverpool for helping us out. Style of play is where the link has formed. Brendan Rodgers

has a specific style of play and so have we. We have a unique way of playing, there's not many teams in this league who will do what we do and play the way we play. A lot of teams in this league are quite direct, we play out from the back and we're good at playing under pressure. We have a lot of technical players in the team and it's what we thrive on.

You returned to the side for recent games with Colchester and Doncaster, how much is that a reward for patience?

Well, it's been difficult because I started the season thinking I was coming in. I've been working hard and waiting for my chance, I've had to be patient. I had to bide my time when Wes (Foderingham) was here and took my chances when I had it. It's difficult when you have spells in and out, obviously now I want to cement a place and get a run of games going. I'm only going to better because I'm still young, I've only just turned 21.

Tuesday was your ninth league appearance for Town and now into your third season you must be targeting a long run in the team?

Since I've been here the only run of games I've

had was in my first season, I was only 19 at the time, Wes got injured and I played four or five games. We were under a bit of a bad spell so it was a lot of pressure on me as a young kid. Now we're in another tricky spell at the moment but we're looking to turn it around. I've got to put the performances in and hopefully I'll stay in the team, then the Gaffer can see that I'm doing well.

Without a victory in four matches, how confident are you that this dressing room can turn the form around?

We've got enough in the dressing room to start winning games. We should have won the game last Saturday, we have enough in the squad to have done so, but it was disappointing. The chances have been there as of late, but we've got a new team and it's got to click.

After defeat in the play-off final there was a major overhaul of players, to what extent has that affected Swindon's start to the new campaign?

It's a whole new group of lads from last season's play-off team and we're all adjusting to each other. Once we start firing and get results under our belts I think we'll be up there for the rest of the season. At the minute we're getting a lot of injuries, the skipper and Wes Thomas being key, but I'm hoping we click sooner rather than later.

Finally, Swindon take on Blackpool at Bloomfield Road this afternoon, what has been your take on The Robins' away form?

A couple of years ago we were terrible away from home, we obviously sorted that out, but against Barnsley recently we just weren't ourselves. Obviously we've got to make our home a fortress and be difficult to beat at home because we've had a couple of sloppy results. I've not played at Blackpool before and always look forward to going to new grounds, hopefully we'll have a good turnout and can put things right.







GOALKEEPER BALANCING RESPONSIBILITIES

A devoted family man as well a dedicated goalkeeper, Colin Doyle reveals after more than 13 years at Birmingham City it was the upturn in his son's health which provided the green light for the Irishman to seek pastures new at Bloomfield Road in the summer.

Doyle's loyalty to The Blues could never come into question, but his six Blackpool appearances to date already better his total for the whole of last season, justifying his move to Bloomfield Road, where he has since been named club captain.

With his son five-year-old son, Liam, on the mend after battles with meningitis and septicaemia, Doyle is enjoying a new lease of life playing regular football and being able to rest assured that it was the best move for both his career and young family.

"I thought about moving from Birmingham in the past, but with my little lad being ill it never felt like the right time," Doyle explained to Up The Pool. "My family are based in Birmingham, so I didn't want to be miles away when he wasn't in a great condition.

"Thankfully he's much better these days and that gave me peace of mind when I decided to leave and join Blackpool. Now he's starting to understand what I do, previously he thought I was a golfer because it's what I did on my days off.

"He realises that I've left Birmingham and his first real memories of watching me play will be at Blackpool. All my kids come to



the games, they've got the jerseys and are enjoying coming up north."

A popular figure during his time at St Andrew's, where he played second fiddle to a number of big names in the game, but being overlooked for an FA Cup tie last season sparked the beginning of the end in Doyle's mind.

"Over the last year things had gone a bit

stale. Last season we had a cup game with West Brom and I didn't get picked. I wouldn't say I was annoyed, but I'd usually get the nod in the cup if nothing else.

"I'd been there my whole career, so obviously it's a club that means a lot to me, but I'm 30 now and it felt the right time to get out. Now I meet Pato (Martin Paterson) on the way in because he's based in Stoke, and we've got a mini car school to rival the Manchester lads," he joked.

After edging a hotly-contested battle for the number one shirt with Kyle Letheren during pre-season, Doyle was excelling between the sticks on the opening day, only for a dislocated shoulder to halt his afternoon. However, dedicated treatment has seen him regain the gloves for the last five games.

"It wasn't what I wanted when I started playing in the first game to get that injury, it set me back a bit but I'm back in now. Obviously coming to a new club you want to make a good impression and I was doing alright until my shoulder popped.

"I strengthened it properly and it didn't take me too long to be back playing. I'm enjoying training and playing, we just need to continue to pick up a few points, like we



did on Tuesday, and hopefully things will get ever sweeter."

With both stoppers enjoying periods in the side this season, the public backing Letheren and Doyle have provided each other speaks volumes for the goalkeepers' union in place at Bloomfield Road.

"It's always nice to have a strong goalkeepers' union and we have that here. Me and Kyle (Letheren) have already seen off two goalkeeping coaches and we're on our third with Banksy (Steve Banks)," he delivered with typical Irish wit.

"We take it in turns to drive to and from training and have a good relationship going. Banksy is great to work with, he is a really good coach who is constantly testing us in training and the warm-ups."

Doyle is used to healthy competition, having battled with the likes of Maik Taylor, Joe Hart and Ben Forster while at Birmingham and unsurprisingly the Irishman believes it's the ideal way to get the best from both goalkeepers.

"Joe Hart is obviously the stand-out from the goalkeepers I've worked with, but they've all been very good. Working with the top goalkeepers kept me on my toes constantly. Obviously I knew I was always second choice, but you've always got to be ready and I was.

"Like in the first game this season, once I got the nod at Colchester Kyle will have been disappointed and won't have expected to come on in the 74th minute, but these things



happen to a goalkeeper and he then went on to play the next five games."

Handed the club captaincy by manager Neil McDonald in pre-season, Doyle's role developed into the on-pitch leader at Shrewsbury a week ago, a notable occasion for the 30-year-old, despite the 2-0 defeat.


"The Gaffer said to me at the start of the season if Fergie (David Ferguson) doesn't play I'll be his captain, so it was an honour but not the right result which was a shame. It was the first time I'd done it at first-team level, I'd only done it at reserve and academy level.

"I went into the referee's room and he asked who I wanted to nominate to speak on the pitch so I said David Norris at the time. I was still able to speak to the lads at the times, but when it's at the other end of the pitch it can be difficult," he explained.

On Tuesday evening Doyle registered his second clean sheet in Pool's yellow goalkeeping jersey and with three points coming as part of the package it was relief all-round, with the Irishman knowing the importance of strong home form.

"It was a relief to get that home win on Tuesday because you don't want to make a habit of losing on your own patch. At Birmingham we had similar troubles at St Andrew's, and it was only when Gary Rowett came in that it changed.

"We've got enough experience and talkers in the side to be seeing out games. It's important to be picking up wins at home and after Tuesday this is a great chance to kick on and get back-to-back victories, which is definitely the aim," he added.






I remember being really nervous before the game after coming from the non-league. To make my professional debut under Sam Allardyce will always stick out and to win made it extra special. Coming from Boston to The Reebok was a massive change.



GET THE BALL ROLLING

I chose this because it's the game that really got me on my way. I'd been in and out at Bolton, so this was my first chance to play regular first-team football. To score the goal in a 1-0 win on my debut set me on my way. It was the start I needed and I didn't really look back from there and stayed for five-and-a-half years. I'd travelled with the ball from the centre circle and it went in off the post, another left foot swinger!

To win promotion with an unfancied group of lads was great, we had a brilliant team spirit. It's the only professional promotion of my career so it sticks out.

This was a goal that people wouldn't associate with me. We'd started the season well and I scored a back-heel through the keeper's legs. Skill wise it was one I was pleased to see go in, and it should have won us the game. I scored quite a few that season, but it sticks out because it was something a bit different.

Fixture: Huddersfield 2
Leeds 4
Date: 1 December 2012

I had to get a Leeds one in there. The Leeds fans are fanatical for any game, but for the derby it means even more. It was a really good game, we'd gone behind and equalised and I got our third, which was essentially the winner. It was a big game for us at the time and it was in front of the away fans. I was six or seven yards out, I controlled it with my right and swung it with my left. The importance of the goal made it the best moment of my time at Leeds.







PLAYER PROFILE TONY DINNING

With regulars Richie Wellens and Keith Southern missing through suspension and injury, the man who cost Wigan a cool £1million went straight into the thick of things against the North West's other Latics Oldham.

Having been a regular in Wigan's promotion side last term, Dinning jumped at the chance to resurrect his career at the seaside.

"They've asked me here for a month so it's a good chance for me to get five or six games under my belt." Dinning told the official website. "I'm not sure how the move came about. I think assistant manager Mark Seagraves came to watch me play in Wigan's reserves at Wrexham on the Wednesday. I got a phone call the following day asking if I would be interested in coming to Blackpool and I jumped at the chance."

"I know the likes of Mike Flynn and Lee Jones from my time at Stockport and from the games we played last season I know the team play good football which suits me."

Dinning enjoyed his debut but couldn't repeat what he did last



time he appeared at Bloomfield Road – in November 2002 when he scored Wigan's first goal in front of the Sky cameras. "I was hoping to get another goal but unfortunately I didn't get anywhere near the goal," Dinning joked after the game.

Manager Steve McMahon was also impressed with his latest recruit, "I thought he had an excellent game. He was steady without being special – which is what we want, he's got a great physique and a good footballing brain and if you add his height to

the equation he will be a good asset to this club."

Dinning who spent December on loan at Walsall will be eligible to face Sheffield Wednesday in the area-final of the LDV Vans Trophy and the midfielder is eager for the Seasiders to progress to the final, "The lads have done well to get to the final and there's no point getting to the final if you're not going to go on and win the trophy, so fingers crossed we'll beat Sheffield Wednesday and get to the final."

ROBINS STARMAN

Young and very promising forward who joined the club from Chelsea in 2002. The transfer followed a mass of speculation, with Andy King, a huge fan of the player, tracking him for several months.

Parkin joined the club from Stamford Bridge where his development was hindered by a glut of international stars. However, whilst at the club he joined several other clubs on loan and it is with them that he built up a reputation as a lethal striker.

He joined Millwall in September 2000 and made his Football League debut for the Lions in a 5-0 demolition of Oxford United. He then went on loan to Wycombe Wanderers in November 2000 after having a trial with Queens Park Rangers. Scored twice in 13 games for the Chairboys, but eventually went on loan once again to Oldham Athletic before joining Northampton, again on loan, in 2001.

'Super Sammy Parkin' more than repaid Andy King's faith in his ability by netting 26 goals during the 2002-03 campaign, including a devastating hat-trick against Barnsley on the opening day of the season. Strong on the ball and devastating in the box, he then went on to finish third in the Division's goal charts.

Understandably, he romped away with the majority of trophies when the club's 'Player of the Year' awards were handed out. So far this season, the striker has picked up where he left off last term and in tandem with Tommy Mooney, has begun to terrorise defences and fire the Town further up the league.

A true legend already, Town fans will be hoping the club can hang on to their hero before he attracts any major interest.

Veteran striker Darius Henderson has carved out a solid career in the game, spent predominantly in the second tier, but was just a youngster when scoring against Blackpool in 2004. The striker was on loan from Gillingham at the time and this was one of the five goals he hit for The Robins in six appearances. He went on to reach the Premier League with Watford and now turns out for Scunthorpe United.

DANNY COID

Danny Coid progressed through the Blackpool youth system and made 281 first-team appearances across 12 professional seasons with The Seasiders. The defender remained on the club's books until the Premier League season of 2011, when he was loaned out to Rotherham United. The following summer he joined Accrington Stanley and now plays non-league football with Ashton Town.



wins against Lancashire rivals Preston North End and Burnley.


