
MARTIN LING RESIGNS

I would like to thank Lee Power, the players, staff and supporters of Swindon Town for all the support that they have shown me and I wish them every success for the future."




PORT VALE CLASH REARRANGED



CAPTAIN'S COLUMN



Good afternoon and welcome to the County Ground for our first game of 2016. Last weekend's postponement has allowed us to come to today's fixture against Southend a little more refreshed than our previous two fixtures, so hopefully this will help us pick up three points.

To begin with, on behalf of the squad, I would like to put on record our thanks and best wishes to Martin Ling. In a short space of time he was able to galvanise the lads after suffering numerous defeats, re-instilling a winning mentality. Although I wasn't able to play under him, it was a pleasure getting to know him and I sincerely hope he gets well soon.

Since I last penned these notes, we have suffered two defeats in the league for the first time since October. Our last home game against Gillingham was disappointing as we were dominating the game, however we became content once we scored the opener and were punished instantly. In all honesty, it was a lovely finish by Bradley Dack but while trying to protect the lead, the gaps between midfield and defence became bigger and enabled the goalscorer time and space to pick his spot and equalise. Gillingham played with a high intensity which will continually disrupt teams this season and if they manage to keep hold of Dack, I see them being promoted this year.

46 hours after the Gillingham game finished the team was back in action against the table toppers, who had nine days' rest due to their game on Boxing Day being postponed. This is somewhat unfair in my book, given that sports science tells us it takes 72 hours for the body to recover after a game. This was an extremely tight affair and we were certainly disappointed we left Burton without at least a point. Their 'keeper made two world class saves at 0-0 to keep them in the game and speaking to the lads afterwards, they said they were exhausted and the second half was a real struggle.

Burton were still fresh and I believe their penalty was a direct consequence of this. Scott Beavon continued to chase lost causes, he kept the ball in play and won his team a penalty. If both teams were coming into the match without playing in nine days, I wonder who would have picked up the three points?

If you follow me on Twitter, you'll have seen the festive schedule is something I take issue with. I can appreciate football over this time of year is tradition but year after year, players are picking up serious injuries during this period. Liverpool's Capital One fixture was clear proof of this as three key players picked up hamstring injuries. In addition to this, in the 10 days between 26th December and 5th January, 19 starting players in the Premier League picked up injuries, of which 13 were muscular.

Having picked up a couple of muscular injuries myself, I can assure you there is always a bigger reason behind these injuries. Muscle fatigue plays a huge part and this isn't purely down to a lack of fitness or cardio-minutes on the training pitch. Rather, it's more to do with high-intensity workloads [such as a game] and inadequate recovery time.

I understand the increase in revenue is huge for football clubs during this festive period but surely the success of the team has to come first? If by reducing the amount of games over Christmas and New Year can ensure we keep key players on the pitch, I believe this has to be the priority. It gives us the best chance of promotion and the financial rewards that come with that, I imagine, outweigh the additional ticket sales for a festive game.

And yes, I can hear many fans' contempt: "These games are a part of our culture and the footballing DNA in this country." And I agree - I was a football fan growing up too. I would go as far as saying all footballers in this country accept Boxing Day and New Year's Day games are sacrosanct and not to be tampered with. But it's the game in between that I believe is detrimental to player's welfare and will continue to hinder club and country's success in their retrospective campaigns.

The final point I'd like to make is that losing three points - although still painful - may be easier to stomach at this stage of the season when we have other games to focus on and prepare for. But I hope that when it comes to the end of the season, we're not in a position where we're two points off the Play-Off zone, wondering if only we could have played Burton later on in the fixture list. And for the record, I would be happy to extend the season by a week in order to facilitate this.

On a lighter note, I would like to finish by thanking you all for the well-wishing messages after the recent under U21 fixture I featured in this week. It was the first time in 16 weeks I was able to play a competitive match and while it will take a couple more fixtures to become match-fit, it felt amazing pulling on that shirt again and I can't wait to get back.

Here's to a return to winning ways.

SOUTHEND

Back in the third tier of English football, the Shrimpers have made a solid start to life in League 1 and currently sit just outside the Play-Off places...

Southend won promotion via the Play-Offs after an incredible run of results at the end of the season that saw them finish 5th in the final reckoning. Seven straight wins set up a semi-final clash with Stevenage. The first leg was marred by an horrific clash of heads involving Michael Timlin. The former Town man collided with Bira Dembele and both players were forced to leave the field. Incredibly, Timlin played all 120 minutes of the second leg at Roots Hall just four days later, scoring the goal that rubber-stamped Southend's 4-2 aggregate victory and a place under the arch. At Wembley, the tie also went to extra time. Wycombe took the lead in the 95th minute before Joe Pigott fired home in the 122nd minute to take the match to penalties. It would prove third time

lucky for the Shrimpers, who had lost twice in the Play-Offs over the previous three seasons. Daniel Bentley was the hero, keeping out Sam Wood's spot-kick to seal promotion for Phil Brown's men.

This term, Town's 1-0 win at Roots Hall in August contributed to a winless return to League and the Blues had to wait until early September to register a first three points of the campaign: a 2-1 success over Peterborough. They would then go on to win six of their next matches while making progress in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy. After a 2-0 win at Colchester on Boxing Day, Southend have lost their last two games conceding seven goals and failing to find the net in the process.


THE VISITORS

**DANIEL BENTLEY**

A local lad and a homegrown product of the Southend academy, Bentley made his Shrimpers bow as a substitute against Torquay United in October 2011. Played all but one game of the 2013/14 campaign after establishing himself in the first team and kept 20 clean sheets in all competitions. Having made a name for himself saving penalties earlier in his career, the same skill would make a vital contribution in May's Play-Off final win over Wycombe Wanderers.

**JOHN WHITE**

White is comfortable operating at centre-half and at left-back even though his preferred position is as a right-back. He started his career at Colchester United, rising through the ranks to make the first team and make over 200 appearances for the U's. He also spent time on loan at Stevenage and at Southend before joining the latter on a free transfer in June 2013 - Phil Brown's first signing as manager.

**BEN COKER**


Plucked from the non-leagues by Southend after a spell with Colchester United earlier in his career, Coker started his football journey with Histon and Bury Town before signing for the U's in 2010. He made 45 appearances over three seasons in Essex before having his contract terminated and dropping down the football pyramid. After a successful trial with Southend, he moved to Roots Hall in July 2013.

**ADAM THOMPSON**

A graduate of the youth ranks at Watford, Thompson made a handful of appearances at Vicarage Road during his four-year stay with the Hornets. Spent two separate loan stints with Brentford before further loans with Wycombe Wanderers and Barnet. After a six-month loan spell with Southend at the start of the 2013/14 campaign, he signed a permanent deal at Roots Hall in January 2014. Has been a regular this term since making his first appearance against Bristol Rovers back in November.

**JACK PAYNE**

A graduate of the youth system at Roots Hall, Payne signed his first professional contract in July 2013 after impressing Phil Brown with his performances in pre-season. That season he featured 15 times for the first team before going on to establish himself as part of the first team last term. He made 28 appearances and scored eight goals as the Blues won promotion to League 1. Has found the net three times this term from 16 appearances.

**WILL ATKINSON**

The midfielder started his career at Hull City with current Shrimpers boss, Phil Brown. Spent time on loan with the likes of Port Vale, Rotherham United and Plymouth Argyle before joining Bradford City. He was part of the Bantams side that enjoyed an incredible 2012/13 season but was released at its conclusion and went on to sign for Southend. Interestingly, Atkinson has won promotion from League 2 with three different sides: Rochdale, Bradford and Southend.

**RYAN LEONARD**

A graduate of the youth system at Plymouth Argyle, Leonard joined the Shrimpers before the 2011/12 season after impressing while on trial. After a knee injury kept him sidelined for a portion of his first season at the club, he bounced back the following campaign. In 2013/14, he finished as the Supporters' Player of the Season and made nearly 50 appearances for the Blues in all competitions last term scoring one of the goals that took Southend to Wembley.

**DAVID WORRALL**

The wide-man started his career with Bury before joining West Bromwich Albion. After loan stints away from the Hawthorns with the likes of Accrington Stanley and Shrewsbury Town, he re-joined Bury in January 2010. Three years, a promotion and over 150 appearances later, he moved to Rotherham United. Spent time on loan at Oldham Athletic during his stint with the Millers and signed for Southend in July 2014.

**LUKE PROSSER**


Once a youngster at Tottenham Hotspur, Prosser spent time on loan in the non-leagues - including Salisbury City - before joining Southend from Kidderminster in 2010. Established himself in the team during the 2012/13 season and has been a regular fixture ever since.

LUKE O'NEILL

An August 2015 deadline-day signing from Burnley after initially signing a loan deal with the Blues, the full back made his name with Mansfield after starting his career at Leicester. Spent time in non-league football and on loan at a host of Football League clubs.

STEPHEN McLAUGHLIN

The midfielder is back at Roots Hall on a permanent basis after helping the Blues achieve promotion while on loan from Nottingham Forest last term. Started his career in his native Ireland before joining Forest in 2013.

**ADAM BARRETT**

An experienced head at the back for the Blues and a self-confessed Southend fan, Barrett is in his second spell at Roots Hall. The defender started his career with Leyton Orient before spells at Plymouth Argyle, Mansfield Town and Bristol Rovers. First joined Southend in 2004, helping the Shrimpers go from League Two to the Championship before moving to Crystal Palace after six years at Roots Hall. Was most recently with Gillingham before rejoining Southend.

**NOEL HUNT**

The Irishman started out in his homeland with Shamrock Rovers then moved to Dunfermline Athletic in 2003. After three years with the Pars, he joined Dundee United where he bagged 23 goals in 64 games – a goalscoring rate that alerted Reading to his services. In his five years with the Royals he would help the Berkshire side into the Premier League before leaving in 2013 to join Leeds United. Signed for Southend in the summer of 2015.

GARY DEEGAN

Formerly of Coventry City and Northampton Town, the experienced central midfielder joined Southend in the summer of 2014 after a successful trial. The Irishman has also plied his trade north of the border with Edinburgh side, Hibernian.

DAVID MOONEY

DANGER MAN

R&W takes a closer look at one of the Shrimpers' attacking threats this afternoon...

Mooney arrived at Southend in the summer as Phil Brown looked to bolster his squad ahead of their return to League 1. The experienced striker began his career in native Ireland with Shamrock Rovers, Longford Town and Cork City before signing for Reading in 2008. While he never made an appearance for the Royals he spent time on loan with the likes of Norwich City, Charlton Athletic and Colchester United ahead of a move to Leyton Orient in 2011. Has found the net against Town for the latter trio including a goal in the second leg of the Play-Off semi-final at the Valley which ended in a penalty shoot-out victory for Swindon. Mooney enjoyed his most prolific spell in front of goal for his last employers, scoring 21 times in all competitions as Orient reached the Play-Off Final at Wembley in 2013/14. Moved to Roots Hall following the O's relegation last term and has six goals to his name this season.

**KEVAN HURST**

A winger who is also comfortable playing in a central position, Hurst has been with the club since the summer of 2012 when he joined on a free transfer from Walsall. Has also represented Boston, Stockport, Chesterfield, Scunthorpe, Carlisle and Morecambe.

CIAN BOLGER

The defender signed for Southend in the summer of 2014 from Championship side, Bolton Wanderers. Prior to joining the Trotters, Bolger had been with Leicester City and has also enjoyed time on loan with Colchester United and a spell with Southend.

MICHAEL TIMLIN

A former Town employee, Timlin started his career with Fulham and spent time on loan with Scunthorpe and Doncaster in the early part of his career. A former Eire Under-21 captain, the midfielder made over a century of appearances at SNT before joining the Blues.

DRUMMING UP SUPPORT

Famous Town fans are few and far between but Ed Stewart-Lockhart, a Season Ticket holder at SN1, tells the story of one that many might not be aware of...

How many famous Swindon Town fans can you name from history? Melinda Messenger? Much past that and most people would be struggling. However, this week, following a petition that gained over 3,000 signatures, marks the unveiling of a commemorative plaque in Cirencester to an avid Town fan who sold millions of records around the globe and is still considered to be one of the greatest drummers of all time.

Cozy Powell was born in Cirencester in 1947 and supported Swindon from childhood, through a little bit of thick and a lot of thin. When not at the County Ground he found time to play for and with some of the biggest names in rock music: Rainbow, Whitesnake, Black Sabbath, Jeff Beck, Brian May and many more. Famed for his ability to combine hard hitting with his jazz influences, Cozy was even successful as a solo artist with his

band Cozy Powell's Hammer, along with future Whitesnake members Bernie Marsden and Neil Murray, and Deep Purple and Rainbow keyboardist Don Airey. Their track 'Dance with the Devil' hit Number 3 on the UK Charts in 1974. Don Airey remembers the time fondly. "Our tour manager Bob Adcock supported Liverpool, Frank Aiello [vocalist], Arsenal, myself Sunderland and Bernie Marsden the Villa. As Swindon were in the fourth tier at the time and us all in the first, Cozy used to take a bit of stick if Swindon had succumbed to the likes of Northampton or Torquay but he was no less staunch in his support for all that." Cozy liked to play football in his replica Swindon kit and the band would always be glued to the BBC results service wherever they were on a Saturday afternoon. Murray recalls that later in his life he even liked to bring the local paper with him on tour in order to catch

up on the news from the County Ground. Perhaps most bizarre was Powell's insistence that the sleeve notes from his 1979 solo album 'Over The Top' list him as having appeared 'courtesy of Swindon Town Football Club'!



Having played all over the world, Cozy eventually settled near Lambourn. However, he tragically died in a car accident on the M4 on 5th April 1998. He was 50 years old. On Thursday, Brian May and many of Cozy's former bandmates gathered at the Corn Hall in Cirencester to remember one of the West Country's most successful musicians. We should remember him as one of Swindon's biggest fans.

But it was Swindon who raced into a two-goal lead inside twenty minutes - although it could have been a far different story had it not been for the heroics of Phil Smith, who denied the visitors on three occasions early on.

He was in the right place at the right time to stop a fierce Adam Barrett header and then thwarted Theo Robinson. But his third save was the pick of the bunch, as Gordon Greer looked to have diverted a Lee Barnard effort past him. Smith somehow got his hand to the ball to claw it to safety.

Danny Wilson's men responded to the keeper's efforts by racing to the other end to snatch a 13th minute opener.

A low cross from the right from Anthony

McNamee was tapped home by Reading loanee Hal Robson-Kanu.

That lead was doubled within six minutes when Osei Sankofa was adjudged to have impeded Billy Paynter in the area. Simon Cox hit the penalty past former Town youngster Steve Mildenhall and into the bottom left corner.

And it could have been 4-0 by the half hour, both Sean Morrison and Paynter failing to find the target with headers.

A further opportunity came on 52 minutes when another loanee, Owain Tudur Jones, brought Mildenhall into action. But chances for either side were at a premium during a quiet second half.

However, Swindon were handed the chance to add a third goal in the final minute of normal time. A Michael Timlin was ended when he was upended by Robinson and referee Karl Evans again pointed to the spot. Cox firing home his 22nd goal of the season.

Within a week the he had hit another five to take his side well clear of danger.

His cross was met perfectly by Peter Thorne who cushioned a header into the back of the net. Thorne could have added another and Gooden was kept out by the goalkeeper before Town doubled their advantage. Tony Grant, signed on loan from Everton, thundered into a tackle in midfield to win the ball back and found Wayne Allison on the halfway line. The striker turned and played a lofted through-ball into the path of Grant who had continued his run forward. Spotting Roy Carroll off his line, Grant's next touch was a first-time half volley that looped over the 'keeper and in. The Tigers' Bobby Davison found himself one-on-one with Fraser Digby but volleyed over the bar as the visitors looked for a way back into proceedings.


JANUARY WOULD SEE TOWN PROGRESS IN BOTH LEAGUE AND CUP...



Allison and his header was touched home by the lurking Kevin Horlock inside the six yard box. Town's next outing was due to be an FA Cup tie against Oldham Athletic but that was postponed meaning Carlisle were the subsequent visitors to SN1. After squandering chances in the first half Martin Ling's endeavour to harry a defender on the edge of the area forced a hurried backpass to the goalkeeper. Tony Caig's clearance went straight to the feet of Thorne who took a touch and blasted Town in front. Steve McMahon's men added a second when they kept the pressure on after building an attack. Ling worked the ball to Gooden on the right and his cross was headed in by Allison. The visitors halved the deficit when Warren Aspinall took advantage of some defensive hesitation and squared the ball for Rory Delap to fire in.

The re-arranged FA Cup tie the following Wednesday saw Town frustrated against the Latics and they spurned an opportunity to take the lead when Allison was hauled down on the edge of the box. However, Horlock's penalty was turned around the post by a diving Paul Gerrard. In the last minute of normal time, the home side found the winning goal. A cross-field pass was headed back across the box and picked out Ling who had found space between two defenders. The substitute launched into an acrobatic bicycle kick and sent the ball flying into the back of the net to tee up a quarter final meeting with Southampton.

almost £400,000 towards their clubs in just a couple of months. We are lagging behind at present but we know we can - and will - do better.



After experiencing the English festive football tradition for the first time, the Frenchman is looking forward to kicking-off 2016 against the Shrimpers this afternoon.



Town tasted defeat twice over Christmas at the hands of Gillingham and Burton Albion but Robert says that he enjoyed the atmosphere that both matches produced. "It was the first time [I experienced it]," he said. "The atmosphere in the stadium was really great. It was busy in both the stadiums – at Swindon and Burton – so it was a good time. Unfortunately we lost both games."

Last Saturday's fixture at Port Vale was postponed due to a waterlogged pitch, something that the midfielder believes will help Swindon in the long run.

"I think it's a good thing," he said. "Burton didn't play before so at the end of the game they were

more fresh so it was an important thing and I think it [the break] is better for us for the next game. We're going to be fresh and we can play a good game."



This weekend we're in a futsal tournament where West Bromwich Albion, Brentford and Swansea will all visit us. In the Under-9s to Under-12s phase we tend to play a lot of futsal in December and January because of the weather.

Our Foundation Phase starts at the Under-6s age group and runs to Under-12s. Our 'pre-academy' runs for the Under-6s, Under-7s and Under-8s. All players in these age groups still play with their local teams while training with us. For our Under-8s, we arrange around 12-15 games against other academies to see what level our players are currently at. U8s who have developed to a level we feel is enough to be offered a contract with Swindon Town will sign ready for the U9s season. U9s to U12s will then be reviewed each year and players will need to earn another year's contract with Swindon. After Under-12s they go into the Development Phase where they are led by Alan McLoughlin and it becomes more about tactical knowledge and understanding of different formations and systems involved incorporated into a six-weekly cycle. My role is to make sure that all our players in the Foundation Phase have fun but also master technique and are composed and creative on the ball.

As our programme is so intense and our players may be with us on four or five occasions over the course of a week, it limits the boys' opportunities to do other sports. With Tom Huelin (lead academy sports scientist) and Dan Watson (Foundation Phase strength and conditioning coach) we've discovered different ways of allowing our lads to play other sports that relate to the physical nature of football while keeping it a fun activity that they can do with their teammates. That way, if it doesn't work out with us for whatever reason, they still have had an opportunity to try other sports. We've put on martial arts sessions, boxing workshops, a fun-based but physical dance session and we're also looking at gymnastics and tennis too. They're also screened at the start, the middle and at the end of the season. This all links into the multi-sport aspect of our foundation: can we create athletes that can play football?

All of our Foundation Phase coaches buy into our philosophy and are excellent with their respective age groups. We do a lot on mastering the football in game-related practises and we are seeing massive benefits in our players' ability to deal with the ball under pressure and make

creative decisions. Before Christmas we played Manchester United and Tottenham Hotspur which was great for the boys. On merit, the boys will go and play up an age group which is meant challenge them. Sometimes we might even do the opposite and drop them down an age group.

Recently we've looked at Bio Banding players with their growth/maturity level - in simple terms, game formats which work best for our players at certain ages. U6-U8s play 6v6 and 7v7, U9s and U10s play 7v7, U11s play 9v9 and U12s play 11v11 on a three-quarter size pitch and goals. It's all about long-term development and variety with our games programme as well as formats and pitch sizes which are important too. We will do what we think is best for every individual, with constant group meetings and player reviews every 12 weeks with parents. The review will come at the end of the programme although decisions we make are solely the best for every individual and discussions for player development will take place with all academy staff involved followed by the player and their parents.

The football techniques will develop with the positive learning environment we create at Swindon Town. Everything we do will be fun for our players to want to come to football and learn. They are still children and we have to make sure that we develop the person as well as nurture their talent. We all want to do the best we can to see as many players from the Foundation Phase make it into our first team squad.

Twice a month we look to play against a Category One or Category Two club (Man Utd, Tottenham, Southampton, Stoke, Leicester, Liverpool and Swansea to name a few) which gives us six games a month alongside our usual games programme which includes Oxford, Bristol Rovers, Cheltenham, Plymouth, Exeter, Yeovil and Bournemouth. We know we've got players that need to be challenged and these extra games are probably most important to make sure that they're getting that challenge.



Firstly I'd like to wish you all a happy and healthy New Year. I hope everyone enjoyed the festivities. With last winter being my first without football, I can safely say I enjoyed this Christmas a lot more than I did last year.

I was very shocked and saddened to learn that Martin Ling had decided to step down as manager in the days following the defeat to Burton. I was chuffed with the appointment when it was announced in November and I don't think there can be any doubt that in his short time as manager, the team's performance had picked up significantly. Martin's been very brave in talking about his problems in the past and his health has to come first. I'm sure it was a very difficult decision for him to take considering his obvious love for the club. I know we're all together in wishing him all the very best for the future. I thoroughly enjoyed playing in his Leyton Orient team and it's been great to see him again in the last couple of months. He leaves the team in a healthier position than he inherited it in and a number of the players in the squad have returned to form under his guidance. I can remember the scenes in the dressing room that night like it was yesterday. Very few things in professional football can surpass a last minute goal, especially one that completes a miraculous recovery. We had Rory Fallon's chest to thank that night for our leveller. Rory was one of the best impact substitutes I played with in my career. I spoke to him during my radio programme a few weeks back and alongside recovering from a serious knee injury, he's now running a successful artisan ice cream business in Yorkshire with his wife. More and more of my footballing peers are reaching the end of their football careers so it's great finding out how former teammates are getting on and what they are turning their hands to. Over the last six months I've caught up with Rory, Matt Heywood, Eric Sabin, Stef Miglioranzo, Brian Howard and Rhys Evans to name a few. When I think of memories like that night

at Vale Park it's no surprise that we have all remained mates.

2016 is going to be a massive year for sport with the Olympic Games and the European Championships. To have three home nations and the Republic of Ireland involved in the Euros is a mouthwatering prospect. I think the draw was pretty kind to England and the Welsh and unfortunately not so nice to the Irish. A summer holiday for me is not complete unless you're searching out a TV screen by the sea to watch an obscure group game encounter. I can recount so many great memories from holidays abroad involving international football. France '98 was watched with my youth team compatriots in Cyprus. Euro 2000 from Greece with some of the young Chelsea professionals and the German World Cup in 2006 from Ibiza with a group of friends from home. No matter where I've found myself in the world I'll do my utmost to watch every game I possibly can. I might even get over to France in the summer to take in the atmosphere for real.

Back to more pressing matters and the opportunity to achieve a league double over Southend United this afternoon. The team somewhat rode their luck at Roots Hall in late August to win 1-0 in the searing Essex sunshine. They're currently occupying a position just outside the Play-Offs so it'll be a very difficult match today. After two successive defeats I'm sure the players and staff are motivated to get back to winning ways to start 2016 with a real bang.




