CAPTAIN'S COLUMN




Good afternoon and welcome back to the County Ground. Our midweek postponement has given us the opportunity to identify what went wrong at the start of last Saturday's match and emphasise what was done well. I personally felt the character shown by the team was incredible and to continue to do what was asked of them in what turned into a hostile atmosphere was commendable.

These notes come with a warning but I have a few things I need to get off my chest. Firstly, our goal kicks. The way we have taken our goal kicks is nothing new - it's the same way we did all last season. The theory is by playing out from the back, it allows us to keep possession of the ball and detaches the opponent's striker from the rest of his team. More often than not we do this successfully and the opposition striker has to chase down our defender, then chase down our goalkeeper and then sprint back up the pitch in order to be in an onside position. Although I don't have the data, you can imagine their striker does the lion's share of the running, which is purposefully tactical as it tires his goal-scoring energy.

I can appreciate that on one or two occasions this has been unsuccessful but far outweighing this are the times we have maintained possession from this goal kick and within seconds have gone down the opposite end and scored - I wish I could attach a video to these notes to show this to you. It's a change in mind-set that we use the goal kick to begin the attack, rather than one long-ball lottery to see who can win the header and straight away we're under pressure. I know which one I prefer.

The first goal we conceded on Saturday was simply a misunderstanding between two players. The goal kick worked well and Reffa menaged to maintain possession successfully. It was only once we tried to play into midfield that the pass was intercepted and we conceded. I don't like pointing blame at anyone but I can assure you it wasn't Lawrence's fault. He did exactly what is asked of him.

However, the fans didn't feel this way and from that moment forward the negativity every time Lawerence had the ball in his hands was.



quite frankly, disgusting in my eyes. And I don't say that lightly.

In a home match when a team needs their fans, I felt ours had turned against our own players and if it wasn't for each and every player's strength of character, we could have been beaten convincingly.

Nevertheless, to go on and win the game despite all of this enabled the coaching staff to learn a lot about this group of lads. Under such intense pressure, many players would have reverted to playing long balls but they continued to do what all of our coaches - and even our Chairman - has asked of them and to come away with a 4-2 win was their just

I know this doesn't apply to everyone and I

apologise if you're reading this thinking "that wasn't me". But, to all of our fans, my plea is to stick with us when seemingly it gets tough. Lunderstand frustrations can sometimes boil over but the players on the pitch need you and your encouragement more than you realise. By all means vent after a game but when we're in the mament of conceding a goal, help pick us up and on to victory. We're all aiming for the same result and our fans have a choice: they can actively help us towards it or, without knowing it, hinder us. With your encouragement when we take a knock, you can help instil confidence in us to rectify the situation.

Moving on and today we host a Crewe Alexandra team that currently find themselves bottom of the table. Although there is still a long way to go, Steve Davis will have his players fired up, fighting tooth and nail for every ball. Having been down there ourselves this season, we know every single point is vital and it will be important we stay switched on for the entire 95 minutes.

On a personal note, I was able to play 70 minutes in an Under-17 game this week, which went very well. Although the intensity may not be as high as a first team game, it gave me vital minutes in order to step up my fitness, so I am extremely thankful to Scott Lindsey for allowing me to get involved.


I was also impressed by the technical ability of his team. They mirror our style of play and to see the young lads carry it off with such confidence is a huge credit to Scott. I have no doubt about it, some of his team will be gracing the County Ground pitch very soon.

It was the Christmas period that would help to turn Crewe's fortunes around, starting with a 1-0 win over Bristol City at Gresty Road. They would lose just two of their next

BEN GARRATT

A graduate of the Crewe academy. Garratt made his debut on the final day of the 2012/13 season having impressed for the club's Under-21s. Made his breakthrough into the team the following campaign and was named the club's Breakthrough Player of the Season, Last season, he was named Players' Player and Supporters' Player of the Year, On the international stage, he has been a regular for England's youth squads and went to the U17 World Cup in Mexico



OLIVER TURTON

A versatile member of Steve Davis's squad, Turton has played at full-back, on the wing and in central midfield since making his debut towards the end of the 2010/11 season. Over the next three campaigns, he would slowly tot up the appearances before going on to make 48 appearances last term - the most of any Crewe player. This season, he has also been a regular fixture for the Alex, making 27 appearances to date.



JON GUTHRIE

Devizes-born, Guthrie once plied his trade in the non-league pyramid with Wiltshire side, Pewsey Vale before impressing the Railwaymen while on trial in 2012. After a loan stint with Leek later that year, he established himself in the Crewe Under-21 side before starting his first senior game during the 2012/13 season. Comfortable at both centre-half and left full-back. he has now racked up over 50 appearances for the Alex.



BEN NUGENT

The towering defender is a product of the academy at Cardiff City, graduating from the youth ranks to make a total of 14 appearances during a three-year stint with the Welsh side. During his time with the Bluebirds. he spent time on loan at Peterborough United in 2013/14 before making 29 appearances during a loan stint with Yeavil Town last term. Arrived at Gresty Road on a free transfer in the summer of 2015.



PERRY NG

A versatile young defender who only recently made his first team debut. Ng impressed for the Alex's Under-21 side over the course of 2014/15, earning him a place on the bench on four occasions last term. Spent the latter part of the season on loan at Hyde. This term, he made his senior bow against Oldham Athletic at the end of November and has only one other outing to his name so far. The centre-half is also comfortable operating in either of the full-back positions.



DAVID FOX

Experienced midfielder who joined the Alex in the summer of 2015 after leaving previous club, Colchester United. Fox started his career at Exeter City and Manchester United before making a move to Blackpool in 2006. Over a century of appearances and three years later, he spent a season at Colchester before moving to Norwich City. Was part of the Canaries' squad for four years before moving to the U's in 2014.



JAMES JONES

In his second year as a professional after signing his first contract ahead of the 2014/15 season. The central midfielder made 25 appearances last term before netting his first senior goal in the 3-2 win at Colchester last month. Capped at junior international level by Scotland, Jones was named Crewe's Breakthrough Player of the Year at last May's annual awards. Has 12 appearances to his name so far this season.



BRADDEN INMAN

After starting his career in his native Australia, Inman impressed scouts from Newcastle United and would move to the northeast to link up with the Magpies' academy. Would feature regularly for the Under-21 side before joining the Alex on loan. Made an immediate impact netting eight goals during his stay at Gresty Road. At the expiration of this deal at St. James's Park, he opted against signing a new contract and joined Crewe.



JAMES BAILLIE

The right back signed his first professional contract in the summer of 2014 and made his debut as a substitute on the opening day of the 2014/15 season. He went on to make 14 appearances during his debut season, contributing two assists.

CHRIS ATKINSON

The midfielder came through the Huddersfield Town youth set-up going on to make 13 first appearances and netting one goal for the Terriers. Spent time on loan with the likes of Tranmere, Bradford and Chesterfield before joining the Alex in 2014.

GEORGE COOPER

A highly-rated winger who graduated from the youth ranks into the first team at Gresty Road at the end of the 2013/14 season. Last term, he made 25 first team appearances and was named League One's Young Apprentice of the Year.



SEMI AJAYI

Currently on loan from Championship outfit, Cardiff City, Ajayi is due to stay at Crewe until the end of February following injuries to fellow defenders, Harry Davis and George Ray. He came through the ranks at Charlton Athletic before earning a move to the Arsenal academy in 2013. Couldn't make his mark with the Gunners and joined the Bluebirds in June 2015. Made five appearances during a loan spell with AFC Wimbledon earlier this season.



MARCUS HABER

The Canadian international joined Crewe in the summer of 2014 after leaving previous club, Stevenage. Started his career with hometown side, Vancouver Whitecaps in 2009 before moving to West Bromwich Albion after just one year. Would not make an appearance for the Baggies but gained experience with loan spells at Exeter City and St. Johnstone in Scotland. Would also spend time on loan at Notts County during his stint at Stevenage.

RYAN COLCLOUGH

DANGER MAN

R&W shines the spotlight on one of Crewe's attacking talents...

Another product of Crewe's renowned academy, Colclough made his debut for the Alex in a draw with Levton Drient in September 2012 but saw his progress halted by a broken jaw sustained against MK Dons the following week. He recovered towards the end of the 2012/13 campaign and returned to the first team fold, scoring his first goal against AFC Bournemouth. Just four months and ten appearances into the next season, he suffered a hernia injury that would keep him out of the game for 16 months. He made the perfect comeback from injury in March 2015, stepping off the bench to net a lastgasp winner at Sheffield United. He would net once again from his remaining six appearances last term as the Alex avoided the drop. This season, he has been an important part of Crewe's side, contributing seven goals from 27 appearances.



RYAN WINTLE

The teenage winger joined the Alex from North West Counties Premier League side, Alsager Town after impressing while on trial. He was rewarded with an 18-month deal after scoring nine goals in 30 appearances for his previous empleyers.

BILLY BINGHAM

Formerly with West Ham and Crystal Palace, the youngster made his breakthrough in football with Dagenham & Redbridge, making over 100 appearances and helping the Daggers into League 1. After six years in London, he joined Crewe in the summer of 2015.

CALLUM SAUNDERS

A graduate of the Alex academy, he signed his first professional deal in the summer of 2014. The son of former Wales international, Dean, he made six appearances for Crewe last term after making his debut on the opening day of the season.

FRASER MURDOCH

Put pen to paper on his first professional deal in the summer of 2014 after impressing in youth football. A Scotland youth international, the frontman missed much of last season through injury before playing for the Under-21s at the end of the campaign.

It must have been pleasing to get 90 minutes under your belt again for the first time in nearly a month.




There's been a lot of change over the past few months. What's it been like as a group of players adapting to those changes?

Like the giant defender, Billy Bodin had also made just two previous starts but he was selected up front after impressing the new boss in two warm-up games in Italy.

And it was he who gave Swindon the opportunity to go ahead with halftime loaming, the referee deciding that a challenge on him from Dave Artell was worthy of a spot kick. The defender, plus teammates Adam Dugdale and Danny Shelley were all cautioned for protesting before

Callum Kennedy struck home from 12 yards.

Town were fortunate to be leading, as Alex had been given numerous chances to punish their hosts during the 45 minutes. Two fell to Shelley and another to Shaun Miller.

Crewe came close to levelling matters early in the second period when Byron Moore saw his effort deflected wide of the post by Flint with Phil Smith beaten but they went further behind just after the hour when new skipper Risser showed good control before firing a bullet of a volley past former City and Rovers keeper Steve Phillips.

McCormack, Connell and Simon Ferry were all introduced in the final halfhour and all had chances to increase Town's advantage, although all were wide of the target.

But the visitors did concede again with 13 minutes left, when Flint sent home a thumping header from a corner. So three points were safely in the bag, with another 90 to follow!





Fraser Digby was kept busy by Saints' forward line and Town's defence stood firm until 13 minutes from time. Matt Le Tissier's pin-point delivery from a corner was met by Watson who had made a run towards the ball on the edge of the sixyard box. His goal-bound header travelled across to the far corner where Ling could not prevent it from going in, taking the tie to a replay at the Dell.

Finally, thank you and congratulations to Mike Boswell who won the recent auction for a full set of Premier League





Will Randall's been here a long time so it's good to see him progress through the age groups to earn a move to Wolverhampton Wanderers.



He's had to put up with a lot psychologically; he sustained a major injury and was out for 14-18 months a while ago, which is a long time. To come through that and continue his progress is testament to his attitude and his mental strength to try and achieve what he wanted to achieve. No doubt he will continue to listen, learn and implement during the next stage of his development at Wolves. I know Scott Sellars, the U21 manager at Wolves and I'm sure Scott's wealth of experience and knowledge is something that Will can tap into and take into the next stage of his development.

It's always nice to see players come through, especially ones that have been here a long time. It shows that if the commitment, desire and application is there from the players and their families then they can achieve their goal. This has been an 11-year process at the club so there is a lot of

hard work that he's put in along with the dedication of all the academy staff. Will has worked with lots of coaches through his academy career and every one of them had an input into his development. This will give the other academy players a major boost and hopefully the first and second years can use this as a vardstick to where they need to be in order to achieve their goals.

The Under-18s are continuing their fantastic run of games. We've included some Under-17s games too recently running out 4-1 winners against Wolves. The game was used primarily for the first years to get some game time along with first team captain, Nathan Thompson on his road to recovery. The second years are in their final vear and it's important that they give themselves the best opportunity to achieve their professional contracts. I've been in meetings at the college this week with regards to their

academic progress to make sure that they are adhering to their requirements from a callege point of view but more importantly completing the initial framework from their apprenticeship scheme. It's pleasing to see that they're all on target and not only achieving but are taking extra units of work to increase their grades further and come out with a better achievement at the end of their framework. Only when the second years complete their apprentice framework, we as a club can sit down and give them a decision on their futures for the following season. This is no different to our current Under-16s who will be told of their apprenticeship offers at the start of March. We have six spaces available for next year's intake and we feel that these six will be taken from our U16s. Dur Head of Education will be in contact with all the schools in the U16 age group to make sure that they are achieving A-C grade in their core subjects of English, maths and science. It's paramount that the U16 players achieve these grades in order to be considered for an apprenticeship programme. This is in line with the LFE who work with us alongside the Football League in subsidising the apprenticeship scheme. Along with our day release programme for the U12s, U13s and U14s, all schools are contacted to make sure that the players are all hitting their own unique targets.

I was pleased with the way we started the game at Portsmouth last weekend. I'd mentioned it the previous week about how you can lose a game depending on how you start. That happened the week before so we had to learn from that. We went to Portsmouth and found ourselves 4-0 up after twenty minutes which is fantastic.

The boys played some really good stuff and won the game 6-2. They've heard me say before that if you can win a game 10-0 then win a game 10-0 but I wasn't too bothered about that. We'd got ourselves into a good position early on in the game so I wanted us to showcase the different actions that we work on in training. It was a perfect opportunity for us to do that. In the second half we were up against the wind a bit but we still played in a manner where we dominated possession and I felt we came away winning comfortably against a good academy side and performed to a high standard.

On Tuesday we played Wolverhampton Wanderers in an Under-17s game. It gave a chance for a few of the boys who have not played recently to play and what's pleasing for me is that these boys come straight into the team and play exactly how I want them to. It shows that they take on board what I'm coaching even though some of them haven't had a lot of game time. What helped was the experience of Nathan Thompson. We cleared it with Wolves that we were planning on playing Nathan after his long term injury and the plan was for him to play 60 minutes. I've got to say that his presence on the pitch and in the dressing room was a great learning tool for the players to play alongside such a great player and a brilliant captain. He was outstanding.

We go to a Championship club where the facilities are ridiculous: a multi-million pound facility with indoor pitches and 3G pitches, hundreds of full-time staff then we turn up on a rickety old minibus and play in the manner that we do and win the game comfortably. It just shows that we're doing something right at this football club. We're producing players that we sell to these big clubs such as Will Randall. Will has been at the club since the age of seven. He's worked extremely hard with some good coaches and we've coached him in the right way in the youth team and in the first team. He's going to have a bright future.

Two decades ago, I could only have dreamt that I would be writing my own column as the editor of Swindon Town's matchday programme.

On Saturday 20th January, 1996 I climbed the steps of the north stand as a wide-eyed, rosy-cheeked (it was cold) seven-year-old and witnessed my first ever football match: Swindon Town against Hull City. In fact, Sir Bobby Robson's famous quote springs to mind - "It's a small boy clambering up stadium steps for the very first time, gripping his father's hand, gawping at that hallowed stretch of turf beneath him and, without being able to do a thing about it, falling in love."

I know - so far this column has been so saccharine that it should come with a government health warning but it's remarkable how much I remember from the game: the seemingly off-green of the pitch (in fact, quite similar to the 'petrol green' Castrol GTX third shirt from the following season), that unmistakeable smell of burgers and cigarette smoke, the itch from the collar of that season's shirt that I had received as a birthday present, proudly displaying "Otrebski 11" on the reverse. People naturally assumed that Ryan Giggs was the inspiration behind the choice of number but a certain attack-minded converted midfielder who grazed on goals that season was the real reason. I still remember Tony Grant's lob nestling in the back of the net, I still remember the corner of the Stratton Bank which was still a terrace after the redevelopment of the old Shrivenham Road stand and I still remember asking my dad why the away supporters were singing different songs.

Twenty years on and I'm still in the Arkell's stand on matchdays, And loving every minute.

Last Saturday was probably up there in terms of one of the biggest emotional rollercoaster rides I've been on watching the Town. To go from being pretty much rock bottom twenty minutes in, to that renewed sense of hope at half time to the utter euphoria at Jon Obika's second goal. I was even half-tempted to tweet from the official club account after Nicky Ajose's breakaway goal, 'think Sir Don's second at Wembley in '69 and you'll have a vague idea of how it looked'. I'm glad I didn't though. I could already imagine the torrents of abuse that would have come my way...

In a similar vein, I saw my counterpart at Ipswich Town went viral earlier this week when he tweeted that he'd missed Leeds' opener at Portman Road so was unable to relay what had happened to those following the updates online. The perils of manning an official Twitter account! After the postponement earlier this week, here's hoping Town can continue the form from last Saturday and come out on top in the 'Railway Derby'.

Enjoy the game.
