

THE GAFFER: NIGEL ADKINS

Welcome back for this afternoon's SkyBet League One game against Swindon Town - it feels like a long time since we were last at the Lanel

We've had three away trips, the first being the mouth-watering Emirates FA Cup Third Round tie at Old Trafford. I must say the support you provided the players on the day was magnificent. Thank you. We so nearly managed a result that would have seen Manchester United return to play at a full house here at Bramall Lane.

The players demonstrated the grit and resilience that is required to be successful, with a dramatic comeback at Wigan Athletic on the Tuesday evening following the late Saturday afternoon kick-off in front of almost 75,000 supporters.

A draw away from home, especially against opposition higher than you in the league, adds another point to the total. However, the manner of the spirit and character shown by the players gives me belief that the heart and soul in this team is strong.

A couple of decisions went against us on the night and at 3-0 down with 20-odd minutes left against strong opponents, it is always going to be a challenge. It was a challenge that the players met head on, another goal from Billy Sharp and a brace from Matty Done levelled the scores. The team finished the game very strongly, with a superb level of fitness and intensity, it is a shame that we ran out of time in our search for the winner.

The third away trip in a week was at Colchester United and again, thank you to all who travelled to support the team - a great effort.

Billy scoring again, this time from the quick distribution of Academy graduate George Long, put us in front. Colchester started the second-half very strongly and gained momentum to level, but I must congratulate the players on winning the game with a David Edgar goal from a corner in the later stages. It takes grit, resilience, character and a team spirit to achieve an away victory.

It's not just the players, though, we have a togetherness and belief to achieve throughout the club. Andy Crosby's organisation at set-plays has again proved profitable, whilst Dr Jim Moxon went out of his way for the team to attend a fixture to give Billy an important injection to help him play.

Our medical and sports science team have been very busy recently, providing care and attention in recovery and fitness protocols for the team, with new part-time addition Jules Hayton adding vast experience in that area.

The January transfer window provides an opportunity that we are endeavouring to take to keep improving the group. It also applies to players moving on as we manage budgets and the size of the squad.

Finally, welcome to Swindon Town's players, management and supporters who have made the long trip north and we wish them a safe journey back to Wiltshire after the game.



'MY GOAL', CLAIMS EDGAR



UTB can confirm the goalscorer of United's late winner last weekend.

"The scorer of the winning goal at Colchester was Sheffield United's No.34, David Edgar!" said David Edgar after the game, clearing up some confusion.

"Fair play to Bash, he got across the front of his marker and got a flick on, but the final touch came off me, that's for sure, although it wasn't the prettiest of goals, I am claiming it."

Media sources at Colchester originally thought Chris Basham had netted, but after closer inspection, the Canadian added a vital touch.

A number of media outlets will still have Basham as the scorer as it is difficult to amend, once the official stats provider, who supply numerous sources including newspapers and websites, names who they think is the goalscorer but the matter is now with the Football League to have defender David duly credited.

With that settled, the Canadian skipper acknowledged it was a job well done in Essex, as United enter today's clash just a point off the top six. David says if it has to be substance over style in a bid to break into the play-off pack in the coming weeks, then so be it.

He continued: "It doesn't really matter who scored the winning goal, it is another three points on the board, but it was definitely fortunate. The winning goal was for those 800 or so hardy souls who had made a long, long trip down to Colchester on a cold winter's day."

"It was a tough second-half, we were far from our best, but we ground out an important win and gave the

fans a moment to enjoy. We were disappointed with the goal we conceded, but we showed our fighting spirit to snatch a winner at the death."

David is confident the Blades are now firmly on the right track as Bramall Lane prepares to welcome in-form Swindon Town this afternoon and the Birmingham City loanees points to the camaraderie within the squad as key to United's upturn in results and performances in recent weeks.

He added: "It was a tough week for everyone connected with the club with three games on the road.

"For the players, Old Trafford was mentally draining, Wigan took a lot out of us having fought back from 3-0 down and credit to Colchester they came out with a point to prove in the second-half and took the game to us.

"But we have a real togetherness and team spirit within the squad. We work our socks off individually and collectively and as a team we never believe or accept we are beaten."

January is always regarded as an important month for all teams and United are no different with David believing there is still more to come.

He finished: "We are slowly but surely finding our consistency, we haven't suffered with injuries and suspensions of late but we know there are good players waiting in the wings to take the starting jerseys if we don't perform. We are going to have to win ugly at times, but things are coming together and if we keep progressing and improving then we will give ourselves the best possible chance of being successful."



FULLY-FOCUSED DEAN IS HAPPY TO STAY

Dean Hammond says he is focused on helping the Blades win promotion to the Championship rather than about his own long-term future, having committed himself to United until the end of the current campaign.

The experienced midfielder, who has described representing the club as an 'honour', extended his loan from Leicester City on the eve of last Saturday's clash against Colchester United, having previously signed at Bramall Lane in late October.

Manager Nigel Adkins has spoken of his admiration for Dean in recent weeks and months, and with the midfielder out of contract at the King Power Stadium in the summer speculation has already begun about a permanent move to S2.

But the player himself has vowed to channel all his energies into helping the Blades regain a place in England's second-tier, believing other matters will take care of themselves if the aforementioned goes to plan.

He remarked: "I'm just living in the present at the moment. I'm just enjoying playing my football and not thinking about anything else.

"We're in the mix and my focus is on trying to do something here. That's what I'm concentrating on, doing well for Sheffield United and nothing else."

The 32-year-old knows what it takes to win promotion, having done so twice in consecutive sessions under the stewardship of his current boss at Southampton, whilst he was a regular in the Foxes side that reached the top-flight in the 2013-14 campaign.

He continued: "I'm loving it and to play for a big club like this is a real honour. Like everyone else, I want to achieve something with the Blades.

"It was always part of my plan to stay because I know the manager well, I've had success under him in the past, and I've seen the ambition here. It's a great club with a superb fan base and excellent facilities that wants to push on, back into the Championship and beyond, why not?"

Reflecting on the win over the U's at the Weston Homes Community Stadium, which came courtesy of



David Edgar's last-gasp strike, Dean was honest in his assessment.

He finished: "That probably wasn't our best performance but it was a winning performance and that's what counts. We got a bit of luck but it was luck that was deserved. It was a hard week with three away games and perhaps that showed a little bit in the second-half.


"We dug it out and that's the sign of a good team. If you can win games when you are not at your best then you are always going to stand a good chance.

And, coincidentally, he's not the only player from the 1994 World Cup I've spoken to recently...

UP THE BLADES

EXCLUSIVE INTERVIEW:

JAY McEVELEY

Skipper Jay McEveley is predicting an entertaining clash against his former club this afternoon, as the Blades look to break into the top six of Sky Bet League One.

And he believes regaining a play-off spot could give United a big psychological edge on their rivals as Nigel Adkins's men look to mount a push for automatic promotion during the second half of the campaign.

The experienced defender is confident the season is now taking shape in a positive manner, a belief that comes on the back of an impressive December which saw Adkins win Manager of the Month, a resolute display at Old Trafford and most recently the late goals at both Wigan and Colchester.





"We aren't where we want to be, we'll be the first to admit that, but things are looking a lot more promising than they were after the loss to Shrewsbury," commented Jay.

"That defeat was a real low point, we had hit rock bottom after an inconsistent few weeks and we knew something had to change and thankfully we have turned things around over a period of time.

"As a team we went back to basics and focused on being difficult to beat, we have conceded too many goals, but we know when we do keep clean-sheets we will pick up points quickly because we have a number of players who will regularly score goals.

"The improvement started at Barnsley, in a game we should have won, but after getting a point there we won four games on the spin in December and have started 2016 well, in difficult circumstances."

The improvement in results on the field coincided with the 30-year-old returning to United's back-four and Jay is more than happy to have played his part in a run of five wins from his last eight starts.

But the versatile defender insists the upturn in United's fortunes has been a collective effort.

He continued: "I started the season well and was enjoying my football and the responsibility of

captaincy, but then I broke my toe against Rochdale and when I initially returned I knew I was still a couple of weeks away from full fitness.

"I played in the JPT game at Fleetwood and then came on for the second-half against Shrewsbury and late on at Barnsley. Then I got my place back against Oldham in the cup and I have started every game since.

"The Gaffer wanted a big, strong back-five to make us tough to beat and resolute and that means I have slotted back in at left-back.

"But since the draw at Barnsley, where the supporters saw how much it meant to us to be at this club, we have been united together, from the fans, to the management and throughout the playing squad.

"We have become more consistent together and it has been a learning curve for everyone. The fans, like they always have here, back you in big numbers and they do play a huge part in our success.

"Against Manchester United, they took over Old Trafford in a crowd of over 74,000. They sung their hearts out from the first minute to the last and at Wigan they were sucking the ball in during the second-half as we fought back gamely from 3-0 down.

"But credit to the players too, we have had a settled squad, not necessarily a team, but a core of players who have given it a real go for each other and that must continue."

Speaking from experience, Jay knows how momentum can put fear into other sides in this division when United begin to make their move up the table. With that in mind he says the Blades must use that to their advantage and finish the month strongly, remarking: "We are there or thereabouts, but we still have plenty of work ahead of us."

"But I know when I was at Swindon and you saw Sheffield United picking up results you start to fear what they are capable of, and having been here for 10 months I know what we are capable of."

"There can be no doubting the quality we already have and if the Gaffer strengthens where he sees fit then we should have a very good chance of this season being a success."

"Hopefully we have had our bad spell in terms of results and also with injuries, because for the first time in recent weeks the majority of the squad has been available for selection."

Looking ahead to this clash against his former employers, Jay says he has nothing but fond memories of his time in Wiltshire.

Under the management of Paulo Di Canio, the Robins were in pole position to win promotion to the Championship in the 2012-13 season, leading the division prior to the controversial Italian opting to leave the County Ground in February 2013. Town eventually finished sixth, losing out to Brentford in the play-off semi-finals.

Fast-forward to the current day, Jay says he is full of admiration for the philosophy of caretaker boss Luke Williams, who is leading Swindon up the table following the unfortunate resignation of Martin Ling because of health reasons.

On today's fixture, United's No.19 says the Blades will have to maintain the high standards of recent weeks if we are to get the desired result



to hopefully overtake sixth-place Peterborough United.

The skipper concluded: "Luke is someone I know well from my time there, he believes in total football and nobody will make him change his mind."

"This makes Swindon dangerous opposition and we know we will have to be at our best to get a positive result. They have got several good players and despite losing the likes of Gladwin and Byrne, they still have a strong core and they are in top form of late."

"They still have several goal-scoring threats and we will have to ensure we are determined and solid at the back, as they have scored four times in the last two league fixtures."



A hard-fought victory over Bolton Wanderers at Leyland, home of the Lancashire FA, saw United extend their unbeaten run in the league to six matches.


A header from diminutive midfielder David Brooks six minutes from time settled the contest in the Blades' favour, after Ben Whiteman had earlier hit the inside of a post.

At one point someone suggested that we should have a permanent black armband as a part of the

kit design for next season - the usual football black humour, but a fair point. We spent so much time mourning loss last year that it was untrue.

Of course, I knew Shred, who didn't? I had met both Howards and Ken before, but Woody, Hodgy and Baldy were good friends. I got to know our former players through working for the club and thought the world of them. Because Woody's visits were less frequent due to him living in the States they also tended to be the most expensive as he did like a pint or four of proper beer when he was over







here, I tended to get roped in with him as a willing accomplice. Bless you Woody - my liver sends its fondest regards.

Hodgy was like your favourite Granddad. He was just a lovely, genuine, brutally honest legend who loved Sheffield United, without question. His regular phone calls were looked forward to, as were his and wife Brenda's regular visits 'home' for the game. She often said that she suspected he would sooner be at Bramall Lane than with her at home. Sometimes she may have had a point! I don't like funerals, but sadly, over the course of a year, I seemed to have a season ticket.

My relationship with Martyn was slightly different. He was not just a work colleague, but a very good mate. Because he was a Blade, I knew him before we worked together, but getting to know him, you quickly realised that he was a thoroughly nice bloke - not many had a bad word to say about our Baldy. He was good company and would do anything for anyone, as long as they were Blades, of course.

Cookie, our programme editor and part of our media team, had many adventures with Baldy. They travelled to away games together over many years, spending hours and hours sitting side-by-side talking absolute rubbish. Travelling together saved time and money and also swelled the coffers of the De Rodes Arms at Marlborough, the owners of that establishment should be able to retire on the profits of Cookie and Baldy's countless visits for all-you-can-eat breakfasts on a Saturday morning or a carvery ahead of an evening trip.



One of my favourite Baldy tales is from a weekend at Exeter we had a few years ago. It was the last game of the regular season and a few colleagues took the opportunity to have the weekend away. As well as Baldy, Cookie and myself, there was Richard Batho, who worked with us a few years ago, and Dave McCarthy, our operations guy.

The idea was a good one, travel down together in a mini bus, have a night out in Devon, go to the match the following day and then come back to Sheffield en masse. Simple and a real plan, especially as there was still all to play for in the game.

We organised transport and designated Richard as the driver, so all we needed were some digs for the night on the doorstep of St James Park. All good so far.

Dave Mac did the research and announced that he had sorted a caravan on the biggest caravan park in Europe, located in Exmouth, a short drive away from

our destination and all for the unbeatable price of a tenner a head split between those going. What could possibly go wrong?

The Journey down was a doddle, we arrived at the caravan site in good time. Too good as it happened, apparently the caravan wasn't ready, but the bar was open so we relocated for a couple of hours. A couple of us had Blades-related shirts on and we were accosted by a lad who was originally from Bleddis, had lived there a good many years and was a Blade as well. Thankfully he knew where the caravan number was (not far from him), which was a good job as we would never have found it in a million years. He also produced some tea bags, milk and sugar - top man.

Now, as I have said, this was the biggest caravan park you have ever seen, hundreds of the things. Pretty well every other rental van was fairly new and quite palatial. Ours looked like the one mum and dad had in the 1960s, I think it was a Bluebird. The worst on the whole park. The curtains had been thoughtfully closed to hide the true horrors awaiting the bargain holiday makers. It was truly gothic, bright orange-stained velour upholstery, brown carpet, brown walls, brown cupboards and even brown water when you turned the brown taps on. The television worked at least, well, that is if you wanted to watch just ITV. We sat and looked at each other, stood and looked at each other. It was no use, we went to the pub.

Now, we turned up in Exmouth on the day that it was either shut or had been evacuated. Mind, we had sunk a few and had a good craic, but I was one of the first back to Chez Grim and that's when it dawned on me that the night was going to get worse, for two reasons... 1. I was sharing with Cookie.

2... Him and Baldy were a nightmare when drunk together.

They returned somewhat refreshed in the early hours and in good spirits. The caravan lurched as Cookie's ample frame slid into the bed at the side of mine. Baldy was next door.

Now, at some point that week some idiot had been daft enough to upload a version of the CD that Ronnie Sharp did of all the old Blades terrace songs. Now, in the wee small hours Baldy wanted to share the tunes with his travelling companions.

"I love you JG," cooed a sloshed Baldy as Ronnie belted out a Lane classic, funny for the first hour. I politely advised where I was going to stick his iPhone if he didn't stop, whilst he nearly fell off the bed in the next room as Cookie turned over at the other side of a paper-thin wall.

The following early morning (I am always up first) I got my own back. Apparently, if you throw bits of remnant pizza on the roof of a caravan, the gulls attack it like a scene from Pearl Harbour, hitting the roof like hailstones and waking up drunken colleagues. It was funny.

When Baldy finally raised his head, I think it was his idea to try and lure a gull into the caravan with bits of banana, strategically putting pieces towards the shower, where Cookie was trying to clear his head. I don't know who was more petrified when they came face to face, Cookie or the gull?! It wasn't a nice sight for the gull, that's for sure.


The game was much less fun, I have to admit, but Baldy was one of the very best and any time in his company was a pleasure. Many of you will know that anyway, but it was a fact.



JAN AAGE FJORTOFT

Many #twitterblades will follow former striker Jan Aage Fjortoft on social media and that is where UTB made contact with him to set up this interview. You think we have it cold at this time of year? He was driving in temperatures of -16 in his native Norway when he spoke to us and recalled his Blades memories from the 1990s. He played less than a year at Bramall Lane but clocked up 23 goals for the club and will always remember his time in Sheffield, particularly as his daughter was born in the city!

»

Jan, who also played in his homeland, Austria and Germany, began his English career with today's visitors, coincidentally making his debut for them at Bramall Lane. After Swindon, he moved on to Middlesbrough before Howard Kendall tempted him to S2...

"It was a fantastic time for me," said the former Norwegian international. "It started with Howard calling me at a stage in my career when Middlesbrough were playing one up front and had signed Fabrizio Ravanelli for big money. Howard called and said he wanted to take me on loan, I didn't want that. So he said he wanted to buy me and after talking to Middlesbrough, the deal was done very quickly. I had a good rapport with Howard and that was one of the keys to the move.

"I loved playing at Bramall Lane, a very underestimated stadium in my opinion. It inspired me to score goals, although it helped having a really good team at the time, we created a lot of chances.

"We had some very interesting games. I remember the first game of the season against Sunderland, when I combined with our Greek friend Vass (Borbokis), he set me up and I did likewise; and the season before, the play-off semi-final at Ipswich, when I scored and lost my head. There's also a couple of Blades goals that I class in my top ten, when I look back at my time with United it is filled with scoring goals.

"The Play-off Final at Wembley, though, is a bad memory. I've said before that I didn't think we were properly prepared for that game and there is a picture somewhere of everyone lying on the turf disappointed and I'm just standing there because I thought that


performance was a consequence of what we did in training, we were not prepared."

Despite the play-off heartache, Jan began the following season scoring goals and was well into double figures before that January day which Blades fans of a certain age will still want to forget. He recalls: "I think the supporters

called it 'Black Thursday', the day myself and Brian Deane were sold," continued Jan.

"I played for four clubs in England and I had a principal that when my club came to me and said they had agreed a fee with another club then it was telling me they wanted me to go, for whatever reason. I remember a

game against Bury, I was in the shower and Charles Green came in and said we have agreed a fee with Barnsley, who were in the Premier League at the time. I met Jenny Wilson the following day and that was it. I was at Barnsley when they told me that United had also sold Brian Deane and I thought that they were kidding. I'm told that day is still part of the folklore with Blades fans. I've kept in touch with Brian, who has managed in Norway, so that day gets brought up a lot."

He adds: "When I signed for Barnsley I continued to live in Sheffield, I loved my time in the city.

"Because you are always on the move as a footballer, a lot of people didn't buy houses and in my playing days I bought just one - in Dore. We lived next door to the Abbeydale Tennis Club and it was very friendly up there. I still

keep in touch with the owner of the Tennis Club. We had a great time in Dore, I have three children and the middle one, Lisa, was born in Sheffield. I still have very fond memories of the city.

"I always look out for the results of my former teams but I don't get back so often, although I did go to Swindon last season. I took my son and he asked why I don't go back and I said I'm always looking to tomorrow and if you did go back often then it wouldn't be so cool.

"I keep in touch over Twitter, though, that's my football communication. I speak to Blades fans and there's a few former players on there too. I enjoy Twitter, it is great to keep in touch."

Jan would need far more than 140 characters, though, to share the following amusing story with his followers on the social

networking site, as he recalls an incident inside Bramall Lane.

He concludes: "I'd left and was returning to play with Barnsley. I got on well with Simon Tracey, he was a good guy. He seemed to be permanently on a diet, like myself, and we were always having a go at each other's size.

"So when I came back to Bramall Lane with Barnsley, we were lined up in the tunnel and the Blades lads were having a go at me, we used the same gym at the time so I saw them regularly.

"Simon said to me that he knew all about my chips, I used to try it on him in training all the time, but I responded by saying 'my dear fat friend, the only chips you know about are the ones you put in your mouth' and after a laugh, we went out onto the pitch and, yes, that's right, I went one-on-one with him, I chipped him and scored!"



NEWCASTLE UNITED

Three of United's most memorable games against Newcastle were in cup competitions.

Back in March 1961, Second Division Blades beat the First Division Magpies 3-1 at St James's Park in the FA Cup Sixth Round. A hat-trick from Billy Russell inside the first 18 minutes of the game gave United a famous victory.

In the Football League Cup the Blades beat Newcastle in both the 1969-70 and the 1988-89 seasons.

The first of these victories was a 2-0 home win with goals from Alan Woodward and John Tudor, whilst the second victory came courtesy of a 3-2 aggregate win. This second success followed the impressive 3-0 home win in the first-leg courtesy of two goals from Brian Deane and one from defender Paul Stancliffe. The Blades were again in a lower division than the Magpies at the time of these games.


Ironically one of the Blades' scorers in the 1969-70 game, John Tudor, became a favourite at St James's Park after he joined them in 1971 as part of a player-exchange deal, in which the Blades received goalkeeper John Hope and forward David Ford.

NOTTINGHAM

Nottingham's two famous clubs, Forest and County, have a long history of games against the Blades.

United first played league games against Forest in the 1893-94 season and against County in the 1897-98 season.

A curious link between Notts County and the Blades in more recent times has been the number of County managers who have had links with United, either because they have also managed United or played for the Blades. Those who




The 1988 League Cup meeting with the Magpies

have managed both clubs include Jimmy Sirrel, Neil Warnock, Howard Kendall, Russell Slade and Steve Thompson.

Those who have played for United and managed County include John Barnwell, Gary Brazil, Billy Dearden, Craig Short, Keith Curle and Shaun Derry. Derry and Short also played for County.

There have been many memorable games with Forest with some of the best occurring in the last 25 years.

In the league there was a run of such games in the early 1990s. In 1990-91 United won their first league game of the season in a



thrilling 3-2 home win which kick-started the fight against relegation.

A season later, 1991-92, United completed a fabulous league double winning 4-2 at home and 5-2 at the City Ground. A 2-0 win at Forest in the relegation battle at the end of the 1992-93 season was memorable not only for the win but

also because it was popular Forest manager Brian Clough's last home league game.

No summary of memorable games against Forest would be complete without a mention of the 4-3 play-off semi-final home win of 2002-03 to complete a 5-4 aggregate triumph. This was arguably one of the most tense and emotional games ever witnessed at the Lane.

NORWAY

During the 1990s the Blades signed four Norwegian players, believing they would cope with the physical demands of the English league.

Three of these featured regularly for their national team, which was doing well qualifying for two World Cup Final tournaments in 1994 and 1998.

The first of these signings was striker Jostein Flo from Sogndal at the start of 1993-94. He was joined later in the season by defender Roger Nilsen. Both gave their all for United but they could not prevent the club's relegation from the Premiership in 1994.


Flo made 53 appearances for Norway and Nilsen 32. Both are now involved in the coaching and management side of the game, with Flo most recently Director of Football at Stromsgodset and Nilsen manager of IF Floya's women's team.

During the 1996-97 season the Blades signed striker Jan Aage Fjortoft from Middlesbrough. One of Norway's most successful internationals with 71 appearances and 20 goals, he proved a popular player with Blades fans, scoring some memorable goals. His career since retiring from playing has involved coaching and television work, including being one of the pundits on Sky Germany.

As the decade closed perhaps the least well known and least

successful of these Norwegian imports was central defender Anders Jacobsen. He made 12 league appearances for the Blades before joining Stoke City. He later returned to Norway as a player and then coach.

During the 2010-11 season the club signed on loan Norwegian international winger Bjorn Helge Riise. He had one or two useful performances for the Blades, most notably in the 2-0 home win against Leeds United, scoring one of the goals.

NORTHERN IRELAND INTERNATIONALS

Over the years United have had surprisingly few players capped by Northern Ireland.

The United players who have won such honours have been defender Colin Hill and later winger Keith Gillespie.

Blades striker Jamie Ward was called into squad whilst at the Lane but did not win his first cap until after he had joined Derby County. Now at Nottingham Forest, he has helped his national team qualify for the 2016 European Championships in France.







- Had England won the rights to the 2018 or 2022 World Cups, it was hoped that the County Ground would have become a training venue for teams playing in Bristol







Stability has been a missing ingredient in the Swindon Town story this season, yet they can dare to believe a push for promotion to the Championship could still be within their grasp with 20 games left to play.

The departure of manager Mark Cooper in October became inevitable amid a slump in form that eventually saw the Robins fail to win in ten successive league games, with the exit of his replacement, Martin Ling, last month adding to the uncertainty at the County Ground.

Despite the difficulties that come with a double managerial change, Swindon's players have responded impressively and they arrive here under the watch of interim boss Luke Williams on a run that has seen them win six of their last eight League One games, with strikers Nicky Ajose and Jonathan Obika in hot form of late.

GOALKEEPERS

Lawrence Vigouroux

(22) – A highly promising goalkeeper who was on Tottenham's books before he moved to Liverpool in 2014. He is currently on loan at Swindon and has got the first-team football he has been craving this season.


Tyrell Belford (21) –

Another young 'keeper who cut his football teeth with Liverpool, he moved to Swindon in 2013 and is pushing Vigouroux for a spot in the Robins side. He has been capped by England at junior international levels.

at St Mary's. On loan at Swindon for a second successive season, he is making his mark once again.

Brandon Ormonde-Ottewill (20) – Another youthful member of this Swindon defensive line-up, he moved to the club last summer after his dream of breaking into the star-studded Arsenal first-team came to an end.

Brad Barry (20) – This talented youngster started his career with Brighton, but failed to make a first-team



Nathan Thompson

(25) – A stalwart of the Swindon cause since he made his first-team debut in October 2010, Thompson has emerged as a leader of a youthful Robins squad. With plenty of competition for places in this team, he faces a battle to get a start at Bramall Lane today.

James Brophy (21) – This rising star made his mark in non-league football before he got his chance to shine in League One after a move to Swindon last summer. He has made 14 League One appearances so far in his debut season as a Robin.


DEFENDERS

Raphael Rossi Branco

(25) – This Brazilian got his break in English football with Brighton, but that deal turned sour and he had to wait to get his chance with Swindon in 2013. He is a versatile performer who is at home in a full-back role or in midfield.

Jordan Turnbull

(21) – The Southampton academy is noted for its success in producing top quality players over the last decade and Turnbull is one of many to have come through the ranks




breakthrough with the Championship club and joined Swindon last summer. He has seen plenty of first-team action this season.

MIDFIELDERS

Drissa Traore (23) – An Ivory Coast-born star who arrived at Swindon via a spell with Notts County, he has proved to be a valuable squad member for the Robins. Traore started his career in France with Le Havre.

Jeremy Balmy (21) –

This Swindon squad is loaded with talented youthful performers and this rising star is pushing for a regular spot in their line-up. Like Traore, this Frenchman started his career with Le Havre.



Yaser Kasim (24) – An Iraqi international who started his senior career in English football with Brighton, he made the move to Swindon in 2013. He has worn the captain's armband during his time as a Robin.

Fabien Robert (27) – This Frenchman made a flying start to his Swindon career, as he bagged three goals in the opening month of the season. He has not proved to be quite so prolific in recent months and will be keen to get back in the scoring groove this afternoon.

Anton Rodgers (22) – After leaving Oldham in

the summer of 2014, the son of former Liverpool manager Brendan, found a home for his talents at Swindon. He has been capped by the Republic of Ireland at Under-19s level.

Ellis Landolo (18) – A youngster who made a move to Swindon last summer, he has made a couple of League One appearances so far this season as he strives to confirm he has what it takes to shine at this level.

FORWARDS

Jonathan Obika (25) – Much was expected of this striker as he made

his way through the ranks at Tottenham, but he struggled to plot a route into the first-team. He has been in Swindon since the summer of 2014 and will be a goal threat today, after scoring three times in his last two League One appearances.

• Nicky Ajose (24)

– Swindon's potent striking duo of Obika and Ajose will carry their hopes for the rest of this season and this one-time Manchester United graduate has been in sparkling form of late, scoring a brace in his last two appearances. Has scored 13 goals so far this campaign.

Jermaine Hylton (22) – Signed in last year's January transfer window, Hylton adds to the competition for places in a talented Swindon attacking line. He will be looking to score his first goal of the season if he gets his chance today.

Michael Smith (24) –

This striker has been with Swindon since a move from Charlton in January 2014 and he will be keen to get his first goal of this campaign today. Smith scored twice against the Blades in last season's dramatic League One play-off semi-final.



THE UNLIKELY LADS

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles big-name Swindon players not usually associated with the club...

MIKE SUMMERBEE

Brilliant winger Mike Summerbee was capped eight times by England after leaving Swindon Town.

Initially with Cheltenham Town, he moved to the County Ground in March 1960 and was an important figure in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion success. He netted 39 goals in 218 League games prior to joining Manchester City in August 1965, amassing a vast collection of domestic and European honours under the Joe Mercer/Malcolm Allison partnership at Maine Road.

Later playing for Burnley, Blackpool and Stockport, he became a successful businessman and his son Nicky also starred for Swindon.

DAVE MACKAY

Former Scotland international wing-half Dave Mackay had a spell as Swindon Town's player-manager.

He helped Hearts win all three major Scottish honours before moving to Spurs in March 1959, skippering their 1960-61 'double' success and two further FA Cup triumphs. He joined Derby County in July 1968 and was


joint Footballer of the Year as they won the Second Division title in 1968-69.

Swindon's player-boss from May 1971 until November 1972, scoring once in 26 League games, he managed Nottingham Forest, Derby's 1974-75 League Championship-winning side, Walsall, Doncaster and Birmingham.

OSSIE ARDILES

Former Argentina international midfielder Ossie Ardiles made two League appearances for Swindon Town in 1989-90.

Together with Ricky Villa, the World Cup winner made headlines with his transfer from Huracan to Spurs in July 1978. He helped win the FA Cup in 1981 and UEFA Cup in 1984, moving to QPR in May 1988.



Appointed Swindon's player-boss in July 1989, he plotted their 1989-90 Second Division Play-off Final success but they were denied promotion due to an illegal payments scandal. He took charge of Newcastle United in March 1991, then managed West Brom and Spurs before coaching overseas.

GLENN HODDLE

Ex-England international midfielder Glenn Hoddle was player-manager as Swindon reached the Premiership in 1992-93.

Signing for Tottenham in April 1975, he starred as they won promotion in 1977-78, then won the FA Cup in two consecutive seasons and the UEFA Cup in 1984. He moved to Monaco in July 1987 and helped win the French title in 1987-88, becoming Swindon's player-boss in August 1991.

Scoring once in 64 League games for the Robins, he then took charge of Chelsea after the 1992-93 Play-off Final triumph and has since managed England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves.



BRIAN MARWOOD

Former England international winger Brian Marwood helped Swindon win promotion to the top-flight in 1992-93.

Signing for Hull City in February 1978, he was leading marksman in their 1982-83 promotion triumph and moved to Wednesday for £115,000 in August 1984. He joined Arsenal for £600,000 in March 1988 and starred in their 1988-89 League Championship success, moving to United for £350,000 in September 1990.

Joining Swindon in March 1993, he scored once in 11 League games and joined Barnet in August 1993. He became PFA chairman, since working at Manchester City.

TERRY FENWICK

Versatile defender Terry Fenwick was capped 20 times by England before joining Swindon Town.

Signing professional for Crystal Palace in December 1976, he


featured in their 1978-79 Second Division title triumph and followed Terry Venables to QPR in December 1980.

He scored in the 1982 FA Cup Final, then skippered Rangers to the Second Division title in 1982-83 and 1986 League Cup Final. Reunited with Venables at Tottenham in December 1987, he joined Swindon in September 1993 and made 28 League appearances while at the County Ground.

NEIL RUDDOCK

Ex-England international central defender Neil Ruddock played for Swindon during the 2001-02 campaign.

A former Millwall apprentice, 'Razor' turned professional in March 1986, moving to Spurs a month later. He returned to Millwall in June 1988 and joined Southampton in February 1989. Appearing in the 1992 ZDS Cup Final, he rejoined Spurs in



YOU MAY NOT KNOW...

- 36 players have made League appearances for United and Town, including current Blade Jay McEveley and two goalkeepers - Tom McAlister and Frank Talia. Danny Wilson, meanwhile, has managed both clubs.
- Swindon are one of two non-league clubs to beat United in the FA Cup at Bramall Lane. In January 1908 the clubs drew 0-0 at Swindon but Southern League Town triumphed against top-flight United, 3-2, in the replay, scoring the winner in extra-time.
- Left-back John Trollope made his first league appearance for Swindon on 20th August 1960, that season's opening day, and his final appearance on 8th November 1980. In total he made 770 league appearances for Swindon (including three as a substitute) and holds the league record for most appearances for one club. Between 1961 and 1968 he made 328 consecutive league appearances and 368 in league and cup.

July 1992 and joined Liverpool for £2.5million in July 1993.

He starred in their 1995 League Cup Final triumph, then played for West Ham and Crystal Palace before joining Swindon in August 2001. Scoring once in 15 League games, he has since worked in the media.

PAUL INCE

Midfielder Paul Ince gained 53 England caps before playing for Swindon.

Initially with West Ham, he moved to Manchester United for

£1million in September 1989 and was England's first black captain. He amassed numerous honours, including the 'double' in 1993-94, joining Inter Milan for £8million in July 1995.

Later with Liverpool, Middlesbrough and Wolves, he joined Swindon in August 2006 and made three League appearances whilst at the County Ground. He became Macclesfield Town's player-boss in January 2007 and has since managed MK Dons, Blackburn, MK Dons again, Notts County and Blackpool.

LUKE WILLIAMS INTERVIEW

Luke Williams never expected to be in control of Swindon Town's fortunes as they headed into the second half of this League One season, but that is the position he has found himself in over the last few weeks.

The departures of two managers over the course of this campaign has shaken the foundations at the County Ground, yet the team have hit some of their best form in the last few weeks as Williams has impressed in his elevated position.

Back-to-back wins against Southend and Crewe - and the eight goals Swindon have scored in those two matches - have set them up perfectly for this eagerly-anticipated trip to Bramall Lane, with their youthful leader relishing his role over the last few weeks.

"There is a lot more pressure on matchdays than during the week," said Williams as he reflects on his first couple of games as a manager. "There is so much to do during the games and in the build-up, but I know these players well and that has helped me."

"I try to remain calm and remain analytical on the touchline. I try to remove as much emotion as I can. It's not easy. I expect fans to be emotional and express themselves. That's why we do it as a job and other people come here to watch it as a spectacle."

Williams may be a managerial novice, but he impressed in his coaching role at Brighton after cutting his coaching teeth in the youth team set-ups with Leyton Orient and West Ham.

The respect he commands at Swindon was highlighted as he was invited to take on first-team duties following Martin Ling's sudden exit last month, with two wins from his opening two matches

in charge confirming he has embraced the task presented to him.

"We were fortunate enough to have Martin (Ling) here and his experience helped us all," he reflects. "He changed the shape of the team and we've continued with that and it's bringing us goals and it's making us a team that can always be a threat."

"There are a lot of young players in this team and they have been selected heavily on their technical ability. You have to show trust in players and we do that at Swindon. Consistency is always going to be an issue with young players, but we want to control matches and show what we can do on the ball."


"These players are tremendously brave. They will make mistakes at times and we have to support them through it. These boys are hurt when they make mistakes but what you see is they don't crumble, they don't go hiding and they don't make excuses."

The form of strike duo Jonathan Obika and Nicky Ajose will be crucial to Swindon's hopes for the rest of this season, with their young manager impressed by the qualities of a pair who have scored seven goals between them in Williams's first two games as the club's manager.

"I wouldn't want to play against them," he adds. "Between them they've got everything and the team are delivering the ball to those boys time and time again."


"I still don't think you've seen the best of Jonathan. I struggle to find something that he hasn't got that could take him to the top level."

"Then you have Nicky, who is a goal machine. He is so driven by goals and I think they are forming a great partnership."





Blades Statistician ANDREW KIRKHAM delves into the archives to enlighten Unitedites with topical figures...

GOALS GALORE

In 2015 something happened at Bramall Lane for the first time since 1929.

It was Unitedite John Taylor who pointed out that the Blades had scored in every home game - league and cup - in 2015. This has happened only twice before, in the successive years, 1928 and 1929.

One reason for a goal in every home game in those two years was the change in the offside rule for the 1925-26 season. The present rule of two players needed between the receiving player and the goal-line replaced the requirement for three players. This brought a large increase in goals - 4,700 in 1924-25 to 6,373 in 1925-26 (from 1,848 games in both seasons).

2015 SCORES

We played 30 competitive home games in 2015, 15 last season and 15 this. A summary of these 30 games, split into last and this season, is listed below, including the frequency of goals scored, ie. the number of times we scored one goal, two goals etc.

The most common scoreline in the 30 games was a 1-2 defeat - this happened six times.

2015 SCORERS

Nineteen players scored the 61 goals. 13 scored this season, five of whom also scored in 2015 last season, as did six others. The leading scorers were Jose Baxter 11, Che Adams 9, Billy Sharp 7 and Matt Done 6. There were 11 penalties (Baxter 8, Sharp 2 and Adams 1).

Chris Basham started 27 of the 30 games, finished all but one, scoring only one goal.

1928 AND 1929

We were in the top-flight for both these calendar years. We played many fewer home games than in 2015, but we scored more goals per game:

- ▶ **1928** - 23 games, 65 goals, most common scoreline: 3-1 (6 times)
- ▶ **1929** - 22 games, 61 goals, most common scoreline: 1-1 (3 times)

In 1928 Harry Johnson scored 30 home goals and in 1929 he was top scorer again with 12, giving him a total of 42 out of 126 Lane goals over the two calendar years.

BLANK-FREE SEASONS

We have scored in every home game in two peace-time seasons: 1895-96 with 17 home games (15 league, 1 FA Cup and 1 Birmingham Cup) and 1925-26 with 25 games (21 league, 2 FA Cup and 2 County Cup).

The last time we nearly repeated the feat was in 1970-71, scoring in all but one of our 22 competitive home games - we drew 0-0 with Norwich in April.

GROUNDS AGAIN

It was pointed out by a keen reader of UTB that there was an error in this part of the Peterborough programme about neutral grounds.

I stated that we had played competitive games on 20 neutral grounds - unless you knew better. Someone did.

On 22nd August 1988 we played Halifax Town in the Yorkshire and Humberside Cup and, because their ground was unfit due to bad weather, the game was played at Huddersfield Town's Leeds Road - and technically the attendance was zero as the game was played behind-closed-doors. Francis Joseph scored the only goal.
