




of their learning process and I think plenty of players learnt lessons from both of those games.






Fleetwood will provide another stern test for the players but here's hoping we can get back to winning ways this afternoon.


## STEWART IN MARINERS LOAN MOVE

Jamie Sendles-White came off the bench in Northern Ireland's Under-21 Championship qualifying defeat to Scotland on Tuesday afternoon.








# CAPTAIN'S COLUMN



Having won promotion via the Play-Offs the season before, Fleetwood made a sound start to their first ever campaign in the third tier, not losing until the start of September. At the season's conclusion, they finished in 10th place on 63 points, just six points off the final Play-Off place.

wins in all competitions since the start of the season, a sequence that included seven defeats from those opening twelve matches. Enter Steven Pressley, who came in to replace his former Scotland teammate. Since taking charge, the Scot has taken Fleetwood to the area final of the Johnstone's Paint Trophy where they were knocked out on penalties by Barnsley. 2016 appeared to mark an upturn in fortunes for the Fylde coast side and they only tasted defeat twice in January and February, Last Saturday's 0-0 draw at Chesterfield halted a run of three straight defeats while the Cod Army have not picked up three points since the 1st March when they overcame promotion

#### CHRIS MAXWELL

The stopper started out at Wrexham, rising through the ranks at the Racecourse Ground then going on to make his first team debut aged 18. In May 2012, he signed for newly-promoted Fleetwood before spending time back on loan with the Welsh outfit and helping them to lift the FA Trophy. After a further loan stint at Cambridge he has since established himself as first choice between the sticks for the Cod Army.



#### STEPHEN JORDAN

Jordan came through the youth system at Manchester City, quing on to make 19 appearances after making his bow in 2003. Made the switch to Burnley in 2007. spending seven years at Turf Moor and playing for the Clarets in the Premier League. Spells followed with the likes of Sheffield United. Huddersfield Town and Dunfermline before he signed for Fleetwood in July 2013. Is now closing in on 70 appearances for the Cod Army.




#### AMARI'I BELL

A former loance at the County Ground, the defender made eleven appearances for the Town last season during a loan stint from Birmingham City before spending the remainder of the campaign at Gillingham. An academy graduate at St. Andrews, Bell made his Blues debut in January 2014 and has also enjoyed loans at Kidderminster Harriers and Mansfield Town. Signed for Fleetwood in the summer of 2015 following the expiration of his Birmingham contract.



#### MARCUS NILSSON

Nilsson joined the Cod Army on a deal until the end of the season at the beginning of February, A former Sweden youth and senior international, the defender started his career with Helsingborgs before completing a move to Dutch side, FC Utrecht, Three years later, he was back in Sweden, on loan with Kalmar. After spending nearly two years at Kalmar, he put pen to paper on a contract at Highbury.



#### TYLER HORNBY-FORBES

The full-back joined Fleetwood in the summer of 2014 from hometown club, Preston North End. Initially a part of the development squad at Highbury, he was promoted to the first team squad in November 2014 and went on to make his bow in a 1-0 win over Yeavil Town at Huish Park. Nailed down a regular place in the line-up last term and has 20 appearances for the Cod Army this term.



#### STEFAN SCOUGALL

The midfielder is currently on loan at Highbury from fellow League 1 side. Sheffield United. Joined the Cod Army on a 26-day loan in mid-March having made 16 appearances for the Blades this term. Scougall started his career north of the border with Livingston, coming through the ranks to break into the first team. After four years at Almondvale, he made the switch to Bramall Lane in January 2014. Has over 70 Sheffield United appearances to his name.



#### THOMAS GRANT

The Aberdeen-born midfielder was reunited with former boss. Steven Pressley - who gave the 20-year-old his debut as a teenager at Falkirk - in January. He penned a deal until the end of the season at Highbury following his release from his contract with the Bairns. He spent the second half of last season on loan at Arbroath finding the net twice for the Red Lichties. Made his Cod Army bow against Walsall in March.



#### **ASHLEY HUNTER**

Once part of the youth ranks at Derby County, Hunter would go on to sign as a scholar at Burton Albion. After his release by the Brewers he would spend time on trial with Northern Premier League side, Ilkeston, After impressing with the Derbyshire outfit, he was snapped up by Fleetwood in January 2014. Made twelve appearances during his first season with the Cod Army and now has over 30 outings to his name.



#### CONOR McLAUGHLIN

A Northern Ireland senior international, McLaughlin has been with the Cod Army since July 2012. First came to England in 2008 when he joined Preston North End's academy along with brother, Ryan. Made his senior bow in January 2010.

#### NATHAN POND

A Fleetwood icon, Pond has been with the club for more than ten years and is the only player ever to have played in seven different divisions with one club - a feat that has earned the full-back a place in the Guiness World Records.

#### EGGERT JONSSON

The experienced centre-back joined Fleetwood on a free transfer in the summer of 2015. An Icelandic international, Jonsson has also plied his trade with the likes of Heart of Midlothian, Wolverhampton Wanderers and Portugese side, Belenenses. Comfortable in midfield and at the back



JIMMY RYAN

The former Eire Under-21 international started his career at Liverpool, winning FA Youth Cups with the Anfield side in 2006 and 2007. After a short loan spell with Shrewsbury Town, he turned the move to Shropshire permanent before completing a switch to Accrington Stanley just eight months later. He would go on to make 129 appearances for Stanley and has also plied his trade with Chesterfield and Scunthorpe ahead of signing for Fleetwood last summer.



#### DAVID HENEN

On loan from Everton until the end of the 2015/16 campaign. the Belgian youngster initially joined Fleetwood in November before it was later extended. Formerly with Greek side, Olympiacos, Henen has only netted once in 12 appearances for the Cod Army: scoring in the 5-1 win over Swindon back in November



#### **KEANO DEACON**

The 19-year-old is a graduate of the youth system at Fleetwood and was handed a squad number for the 2015/16 campaign. The young midfielder made his Cod Army bow last weekend when he came off the bench against Chesterfield.

#### **NICK HAUGHTON**

Plucked from non-league outfit, Runcorn United by Fleetwood in February 2014, Haughton's first season with the Cod Army saw him pick up the club's Young Player of the Year award. Has made 23 appearances this term.

#### SHOLA AMEOB!

A vastly experienced striker who made his name with Newcastle United, plying his trade with the Magpies for nearly 14 years. Since leaving St. James's Park, he has spent time with Crystal Palace and Bolton before joining Fleetwood in February.

#### WES BURNS

On loan at Fleetwood until the end of the season. Burns graduated from the youth ranks at Bristol City and has spent time on loan at Forest Green Rovers, Oxford and Cheltenham before switching to Highbury in February.




Scouting Report





# JAMES

Having swapped a 9-5 desk job for the bright lights of professional football, the defender declares that he is going to make the most of his opportunity at SN1.



#### It wasn't the best Easter period for Swindon but what's the mood like in the camp at the moment?

I think disappointment more than anything. We wanted to make Friday's result right. We played a good team on Friday and they showed us the level where we want to get to and we wanted to prove that on Monday. It's more disappointment that we didn't show how we usually play.

#### Now we've got the present ticked off, take us back to the beginning of your career. Were you involved with any professional clubs growing up?

When I was about 16 I was with Wycombe Wanderers. I trained with them for a few months around the time they were offering scholarships. I was still at school too so it was a case of either carrying on my full time education and train every day with Wycombe or knocking that part of my life on the head and focusing on my education. I didn't do enough to earn a scholarship in the end and so we chose the education route. I think my parents made my choice for me \*laughs\*. I went on and did my A-Levels then joined British Airways on an apprenticeship scheme straight afterwards.

#### What about the football side of things

#### after you left Wycombe?

I was 18 at the time so when I finished my A-Levels I tried to go down the nonleague route. I started off with Harrow Borough and went into their Under-18s then their reserve and first team. I felt that it was a bit too serious for the level they were at. I just wanted to take a step back and enjoy my football so I decided to drop down a few leagues where there was a bit more of a relaxed attitude.

#### Is it as simple as that to move clubs in the non-league pyramid?

Everyone knows everyone in non-league. All the managers know players they've managed at different teams and there are no real transfers as such so you get managers tapping up players in the same league. You do get a rollercoaster of different players at different clubs every season but it's something you get used to.

#### Did you ever play with or against any famous faces?

Not really. I played against a couple of (what they would call themselves) 'non-league veterans'. The local team to me was Wealdstone FC who are in the National League South now. I was playing with someone called Fergus Moore who was Wealdstone through and through and was playing at something


like the age of 37 so that's probably the closest I got to anyone famous.


#### Talk us through the lifestyle of a typical footballer at that level...

We normally had training Tuesday and Thursday then the game on the Saturday. If we had a game in midweek we'd have training at the weekend but it's a completely different atmosphere. There's not so much emphasis on stuff like dietary requirements. You've got your training but outside of that the boys just carry on with their social lives. You normally get a few on a Saturday that would turn up a bit worse for wear and we'd have to change the team accordingly! I still enjoyed it all the same.

#### Then during the week you worked in an office and even managed to complete a degree. Did the less physical nature of your day job have an effect?

That was the benefit for me. Football is such a risk career - I suppose when I was younger that's why the education side took priority. When I got into British Airways it was set out: that was going to be my career path. I therefore wanted to make the most of that and that's why I did the degree. Football is a gamble and it's a bit of luck if somebody sees you or you get a chance which is why I chose education. It was a nice surprise for it





to pan out for me to choose a different career path. Football doesn't last forever and I'm hoping I can achieve as much as I can in a short space of time. Then afterwards I still have a career pathway to go back to if I wanted.

#### Had you been on trial with any other clubs before coming to Swindon?

I went to Borehamwood about a year or two ago but I think it's hard because if you go down the non-league path at that level then they treat it as full -time but you don't necessarily get the money side of things with it. I felt that by going down the BA route, I could have a very nice job and also have the financial rewards with it. For me it was either all or nothing: I'd either like to be playing football with people I know, enjoy myself and have my normal Monday-Friday job or be all-in like I am now where I'm at a professional club, I can take it seriously and put all my focus into

#### Where did Swindon Town come into the equation?

I was invited down in the summer. I actually took my annual leave from British Airways to come here on trial and used all of it up! If I didn't get offered anything I wouldn't have had a holiday at all last year and would just have been back at BA. Thankfully after about three weeks everyone here decided I was worth offering a contract to and giving a chance to.

#### And in doing so you're yet another one off that non-league production line...

Definitely. It's impossible to catch everyone because there are so many people that want to play football and there are so many places that clubs can look with their resources. I'm just fortunate that Swindon

are one of those clubs that don't stereotype non-league footballers and don't - like other jobs - just look at peoples' CVs. They look at the practical side of things and how you do in training and they're willing to offer a chance to anyone. Hopefully through some of my performances this year I've shown why they saw something in me and hopefully I can continue that.

#### Eleven starts so far this season. Has that exceeded your pre-season expectations?

By far. When I signed I thought my role would be very much a supporting role as and when needed. The first year was just to focus on myself: build myself up, get into a routine and get used to the different aspects of it like the physical, the tactical and the mental side. The number of starts and chances I've been given has definitely exceeded what I expected.

#### What about this afternoon's opponents. What sort of test are Fleetwood going to

At their stadium earlier this season it was different. They've got a very small pitch and therefore they introduced a very high pressing game on us hoping that would lead to us making mistakes with our philosophy and style of play. I think they pulled it off quite well. In terms of today we're at home and the pitch is much bigger. We'll still look to use the same philosophy and hopefully we can take more care of the ball, create more chances and be able to control the game.







# HALL OF SERVICE


Swindon Town Football Club are delighted to launch a new Hall of Service for those who have served the club in a non-playing capacity. The first two inductees are Mike Spearman and Andy Rowland.



A former player, coach and caretaker manager, Andy Rowland was a key part of the fabric at SN1 for twenty years. Initially signed in 1978 from Bury, he would go on to net nearly 100 times for the Town in all competitions. His best season tally came in 1979/80 when he scored 28 goals as Swindon reached the League Cup semi-final. In 1985/86, he helped Town clinch the Division Four championship with a then-record points total. After retiring, he stayed at the club in a coaching capacity and was involved with the youth and reserve teams while he was also in caretaker charge of the team for a brief spell in the mid-1990s. Andy is already an STFC Hall of Fame inductee.



Mike Spearman has been an important figure at Swindon Town during an association with the club that has spanned 40 years. After a number of years' service, he ascended to the position of club Chairman in the 1990s and presided over Town's Division Two title-winning campaign in 1995/96. A familiar face in club boardrooms up and down the country as an ambassador of the football club, Mike was also the Chairman of the Swindon Town Football in the Community Trust until last year when he was made Honorary Patron. Still a regular visitor to the County Ground on matchdays, in May 2015, he was awarded the title of Honorary Life President of Swindon Town.

Recently I have been amazed at the money earned by Premier League players. It certainly means that smaller clubs will surely never again reach the Premier League as it is creamed off by the big boys who just appear to look after their own interest. I remember about ten years ago driving into Burnley and I stopped for some fish and chips. The shop was called Connelly's Plaice and there was John Connelly frying the fish and chips. Having won league championship medals with Burnley, had a big-money move to Manchester United and indeed played for England in the 1966 World Cup, he was quite happy in a chip shop and to talk about his career. 

# A FOOT IN BOTH CAMPS

While David Ball and Amari'l Bell are current squad members at Highbury, we take a look back at others who have served both clubs.

Tall midfielder Jonathan Smith, a key figure in Paolo di Canio's League Two title winning side in 2011/12, was on loan at Fleetwood from Morecambe during 2005/06. He arrived at the County Ground at the same time goalkeeper David Lucas



left for Rochdale.

While Smith was here, another former Swindon man was assisting at Highbury - winger Paul Edwards. The Mancunian had been signed by Roy Evans but rarely featured under his successor Andy King.

Bootle-born Pat Jackson spent the 1954/55 season at Highbury - with the original Fleetwood FC that folded in the 1970's. In 1948, during his four years with Town, he married boss Louis Page's daughter Philomena.

Going back further, between the Wars three players had links with Swindon and Fleetwood.

Joe Eddleston had six seasons at the County Ground before ending his career in the north west. Brought up in Oswaldtwistle, between Blackburn and Accrington, the striker - just 5'5" - also served both those clubs during his 14year League career. Five were spent in the Third Division North with Nelson where he netted 100 goals. With Town he scored 66 in 219 games.

During Eddleston's stay another forward spent a brief spell with Swindon and two with Fleetwood - Tom Devlin. He cost the club almost twice as much as the legendary Harry Morris but made only two



senior appearances while here. His career also took him to France, Switzerland and the USA as well as back to his native Scotland.

When Eddleston departed in 1932 his replacement was Cyril Quinn from Blackpool, where he had spent more than three years but scored just six goals in 39 games. He had been on loan at Fleetwood for the second half of 1931/32.





# WEARE THE CHANNES







Last week, we were delighted to be able to take some of Day Release boys to Seven Barrows - the stables of Nicky Henderson, the famous race horse trainer.



I'd like to say a big thank you to Camilla Henderson who organised the day for us along with her father. Camilla works in the academy as our psychologist for the foundation and development phases as well as the scholars. We felt a visit to the stables would be a good opportunity for the boys to see the workings of a different sporting environment. The players didn't know they were going and the visit was part of our Day Release Programme based around lifestyle. I must admit that it was a very informative day out for everyone including myself. Racing is

more of an individual sport than football so it was an eve-opener into their varying routines; the times they get up and what they need to do on a daily basis. Race horses also need the right fuel just like elite athletes do and it was important to see if the players could understand that and see that, in all sports, there is a preparation and thought process. We were there for about an hour and a half in total and we got to see some really famous horses including Sprinter Sacre. We also got the opportunity to speak to Nicky's vet and find out about their preparation.

Jeremy Newton is currently with the Foundation Phase in the Netherlands. I know he mentioned that in his previous set of notes but just to add that the Development Phase follow on Sunday and are back on following weekend. Going abroad is all about the players coming together. They generally just come into training for an hour or so then see each other at games but don't have much time to get to gel outside of that. We're staying in the centre of Den Haag which means they'll share rooms. All the food, the training and games are managed for them so it's a chance for them to understand what it's like being away from home for a while and gelling with teammates. For the staff it gives us a chance to see a bit more about their characters and how they develop. While we're out there, we'll set them tasks and challenge them to see if they have the right physical and mental capabilities. We're in the middle of the half-term break at the moment but that doesn't mean things shut down at the academy. As well as the time away, the remaining age groups will still be taking part in domestic fixtures.

# SUPER — SAYS

Perhaps it would be best to draw a line under Easter 2016 in the first paragraph of today's notes. This is despite sitting in my kitchen still surrounded by chocolate and having just participated in my 17th Easter egg hunt with my nephew, Stanley.

He had a better Easter football-wise, taking in his first live match at his local club Hampton and Richmond and seeing them beat Leatherhead 2-0. I'm a little bit concerned that his favourite player was the goalkeeper and that his best part of the experience seems to have been half-time. I don't know what drinks and crisps they are serving up at Beveree Stadium but he hasn't stopped taking about it. Plenty of time to make him into a centre-forward yet.

I think everyone was very optimistic going Into Friday's game against Wigan that the team could continue the unbeaten run. Unfortunately what I and many others probably hadn't accounted for was the tremendous form the Latics were in when they arrived in Wiltshire. I don't think for one minute they were underestimated. Speaking to Luke Williams in the build-up he clearly felt that it was going to be a very difficult game against a team that he expects to go up automatically. They were very impressive in all departments. I'd say that they are the best team I've seen at this level over the last couple of seasons: very organised, full of power and energy. I can only imagine that they are training at that intensity every single day. Of course the finances at the club will have been a significant factor if they are to make it back into the Championship at the first time of asking. However, credit must go to the manager Gary Caldwell for the team he's put together and the style that they have adopted. Having said all that, there wasn't much between the two sides in the first half. Will Grigg again showed his predatory instincts against Swindon to give them a half-time lead. I'm sure he must have had the opportunity in the summer to join Championship clubs so that in itself shows you the pull of a club like Wigan at League

The disappointing result was compounded by Nathan Thompson's late sending off. I don't think there were too many complaints from anyone at the time and I must say how impressive it was to see Nathan come straight

out and speak to the media like he did after the game. It's easy for players to give the usual cliches and give the supporters what they want to hear but you never get that from the skipper. You get honesty, no excuses and he should be commended for that. It's easy to get in your car and shoot straight off when things haven't gone your way and I'm sure I was guilty of that in the past. I can't remember being too talkative when I received my merching honours on a couple of pocasions in Swindon red.

Nathan's presence was obviously missed in Lincolnshire on Monday and the least said about the day the better. It's not been a happy away ground over the last two campaigns. The wheels came off the automatic promotion push a year ago at Glanford Park and Monday wasn't a great day at the office for anyone. Not least my BBC Wiltshire colleague, Andrew Hawes who spent the eight hour return Journey coughing and sneezing when he wasn't out cold on the back seat. At one stage it looked like I may be about to get my full commentary debut - that would have been some introduction. Aided by steak and ale pies we made it through as the action on the pitch deteriorated.

It'll be a test of the players' characters today after the two defeats so they will need the supporters behind them. It's important to remember at this point that the trials and tribulations of the Autumn could have left the club with a very difficult challenge of remaining in the division. Yes, it's disappointing that the Play-Off challenge has faltered but there are still a number of positives to take from this season. The performances of Brad Barry. The flourishing partnership and apalscoring of Nicky Ajose and Jon Obika. The recent emergence of Ellis landalo. The continued presence of Nathan Thompson. Off the pitch, we have a club on a sound financial footing with the prospect of a brand new training ground on the horizon. That in itself excites me and I, for one, am optimistic that the challenge

for Championship football could become a more realistic prospect for a club with it's own training facility in the Borough.

With eight games remaining there's still plenty for the players to play for before the summer break. Firstly it's important to go into next season with momentum. It may be a goal target that the centre forwards have got their eye on (I know I riled Nicky boasting about my totals recently!) Players may be playing for a new contract or the loan players might have the challenge in these remaining games of impressing their parent clubs in time for July's pre-season. Irrelevant of the importance of the game, you never know who's in those stands watching and all the players will have their motivational factors before the final whistle blows on the 8th May.

One thing's for certain this afternoon: Fleetwood will be fighting for their lives so the players will have to match their endeavour first and foremost and hopefully the entertainment we've become accustomed to at the County Ground this season is back in abundance this afternoon.

Just a quick London Marathon update for you. Just four weeks to go until I'll be taking on the 26 miles and my knee has been causing me a bit of trouble. Thankfully my old Swindon Physio, Dick Mackey has been looking after me and I'm hopeful that I'll be as right as rain come April 24th. If anyone is feeling particularly charitable post-Easter I would very much appreciate some help with my fundraising. I'm running for Coram, a London-based charity that's been helping vulnerable children for over 275 years. I've been sucked in to buying all the running gear but I've also been kept warm by a Swindon Town wooly hat circa 2002!




