£311 WON WITH LATICS STRIKE IT LUCKY

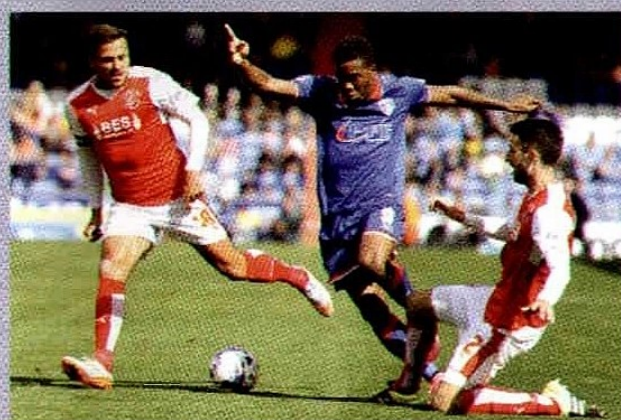
Latics Strike It Lucky paid out another £311 in prizes when Chesterfield were sent packing from SportsDirect.com Park over the Easter break.

Tonight you can purchase both the original programme and the 16 page extra for the combined price of £3.

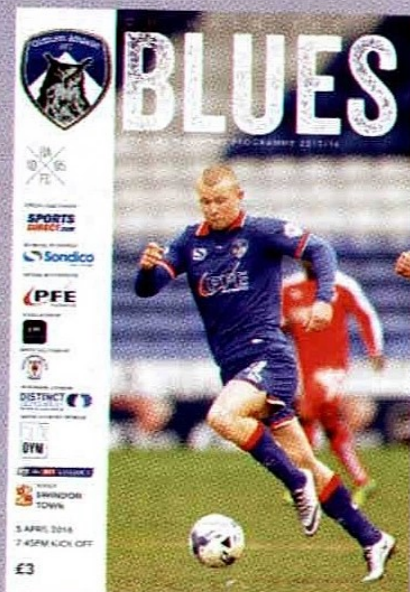
In the original issue you can read interviews with

Athletic recorded a valuable point against league leaders Burton Albion, playing out a goalless draw.

The Brewers had the better chances in the game, however, it would be Latics that dominated and looked a threat all afternoon.

The closest chance of the game fell to the visitors as Burton central defender Tom Flanagan headed against the crossbar in the first half.

The point for Latics keeps them in the final relegation spot, one point off Blackpool. Manager John Sheridan was forced into a change as Anthony Gerrard missed the game with illness, meaning James Wilson partnered Brian Wilson at the heart of the

Latics defence and Tim Dieng moved into midfield.

It would be Latics that dominated the first half and they went close on two minutes after Curtis Main's cross strayed inches over the crossbar.

The league leaders were lucky to still have 11 men on the field after battling work from Aaron Amadi-Holloway saw him brought down by Tom Flanagan on the edge of the box.

He suspiciously looked like the last man, but the referee only booked the central defender and Mike Jones' free kick from 20 yards went well over Jon McLaughlin's crossbar.

Athletic were taking the game to the hosts

and they were backed by an army of supporters who were making all the noise in the first half.

However, despite Latics' dominance, they had to be wary of Burton's attacking threat.

Stuart Beavon was proving to be a nuisance in attack but an excellent block from J.Wilson on 20 minutes denied the forward having a clear run on goal.

Burton should have taken the lead just after the midway point of the first half but a superb block from Brian Wilson denied Lucas Akins from 12 yards.

That would be the hosts best effort of the half but minutes later, it would be Latics that went close through Tareiq Holmes-Dennis.

The Charlton loanee received the ball on the edge of the box from a corner but his shot, which was destined for the bottom corner, was blocked on route to goal.

Latics were winning the midfield battle as Dieng, Carl Winchester and Liam Kelly

combined to pick off the Burton attacks. It would be a set piece which tested Latics 10 minutes from the end of the first half. Mark Duffy's corner found the head of Flanagan at the back post and his powerful header hit the crossbar and went away from danger.

Whilst Latics continued to keep possession, they were struggling to create clear cut opportunities in front of goal. Latics came out for the second half with the same intensity as the first as they continued to take the game to the league leaders.

Flanagan headed over the crossbar from a Duffy corner but it would be Latics who took control of the game.

Attacking the Latics fans, they showed their appreciation after a superb display of possession play which resulted in a corner. Curtis Main was almost released on the right but the defender got back in time to deny him, and it would be the Doncaster loanee which almost got on the end of a

Holmes-Dennis cross on the hour mark but the goalkeeper did well to deny him. Joel Coleman had to be alive two minutes later as Duffy curled a free kick towards the top corner but he excellently tipped the ball wide.

Both sides made changes as Jake Cassidy came on for Latics, replacing Holloway, who had put himself about in attack. He put himself about in attack and 10 minutes from time, he pulled the ball back to captain Liam Kelly but he took a heavy touch and the ball went away from him. As the game approached its climax, it

became an end-to-end encounter with both sides winning corners.

Whilst Latics' corner could not fall into the path of an attacking man, Burton's corner was cleared by a strong fist from Coleman who made sure they could not build momentum.

Deep into additional time, J.Wilson was forced into some last ditch defending as he excellently cleared the ball from the onrushing Calum Butcher.

That would be the last bit of incident in the game as Latics recorded a valuable away point against the league leaders.

JONES BREAKS THE TENSION

Mike Jones' late strike was enough to seal a valuable three points against relegation rivals Chesterfield.

After coming on as a second half substitute, he produced a piece of brilliance with only 10 minutes remaining to win the game for Latics. However, the victory did come at a cost as Aaron Amadi-Holloway was stretchered off on the hour mark and Timmy Thiele appeared to have dislocated his shoulder.

Defender Anthony Gerrard returned to the side after missing Saturday's game through illness.

It was a first half which lacked quality but it was Latics that had the best chances of the half.

However, the game would take a while to come to life as both sides cancelled

each other out in the opening exchanges.

Aaron Amadi-Holloway provided the first real bit of quality of the afternoon on eight minutes as he held the ball up well, turned and crossed into the box but it was just ahead of Curtis Main. As Latics were starting to build up some momentum, the heavens started to open.

Chesterfield's first shot of the game came on 13 minutes as Gboly Ariyibi fired over from the edge of the box. Whilst the Spireites went close at one end, Athletic almost took the lead a minute later but Holloway's volley from six yards went wide of Tommy Lee's goal.

Matt Palmer, who returned to the side after missing Saturday's draw against

Burton Albion, fired wide from 25 yards after a promising run as Latics continued to pepper Lee's goal. Midway through the half it was again Holloway who went close but his header from a Palmer corner again just went wide of Lee's goal.

A big talking point of the first half came on the half hour mark as Tom Anderson brought down an onrushing Curtis Main as he raced through on goal.

The referee raced over to the central defender and brandished a yellow card, which was probably fair due to the covering men.

Jonathan Forte was proving to be a constant threat down the left hand side and he was the next to go close.

He raced to the byline, took on full back Liam O'Neill and fired across the box but it was inches off Holloway who was lurking at the back post.

As the half was petering to a close, Main tested the palms of Lee from inside the penalty area but he saved well low to his left.



WITH SUPER STRIKE

The second half started much the same as the first and it took a while to get going.

Liam Kelly curled over the crossbar on 50 minutes and five minutes later provided a good cross for Forte who headed wide at the back post.

A low point of the game came just before the hour mark as Holloway was stretched off with his leg in a brace.

Jones came on to replace the forward in what turned out to be a superb switch. The supporters were doing everything to get behind the lads in a game which would be decided by a superb bit of quality.

Substitute Jones picked the ball up in the middle of the park, took on his man and fired an unstoppable strike into the bottom corner to win the game for Latics.

It could have been even better for Athletic as straight from the kick off, Timmy Thiele lobbed Lee from distance but he just got back on his line in time to tip over.

Chesterfield started to pile on the pressure in a bid to get something out of the game with Jay O'Shea instrumental in their attacks.

With a minute remaining he gained space in the box but his shot was blocked by captain Kelly.

Six minutes additional time was signalled by the referee but in the first minute of that, Thiele was forced off

with a shoulder injury.

He was replaced by Jake Cassidy as Latics looked to see the game out.

It would prove to be a nervy ending as Chesterfield threw everything forward in a bid to get something out of the game but O'Shea's shot eight minutes into additional time went over the bar and the referee blew his whistle to signal a massive win for Latics.

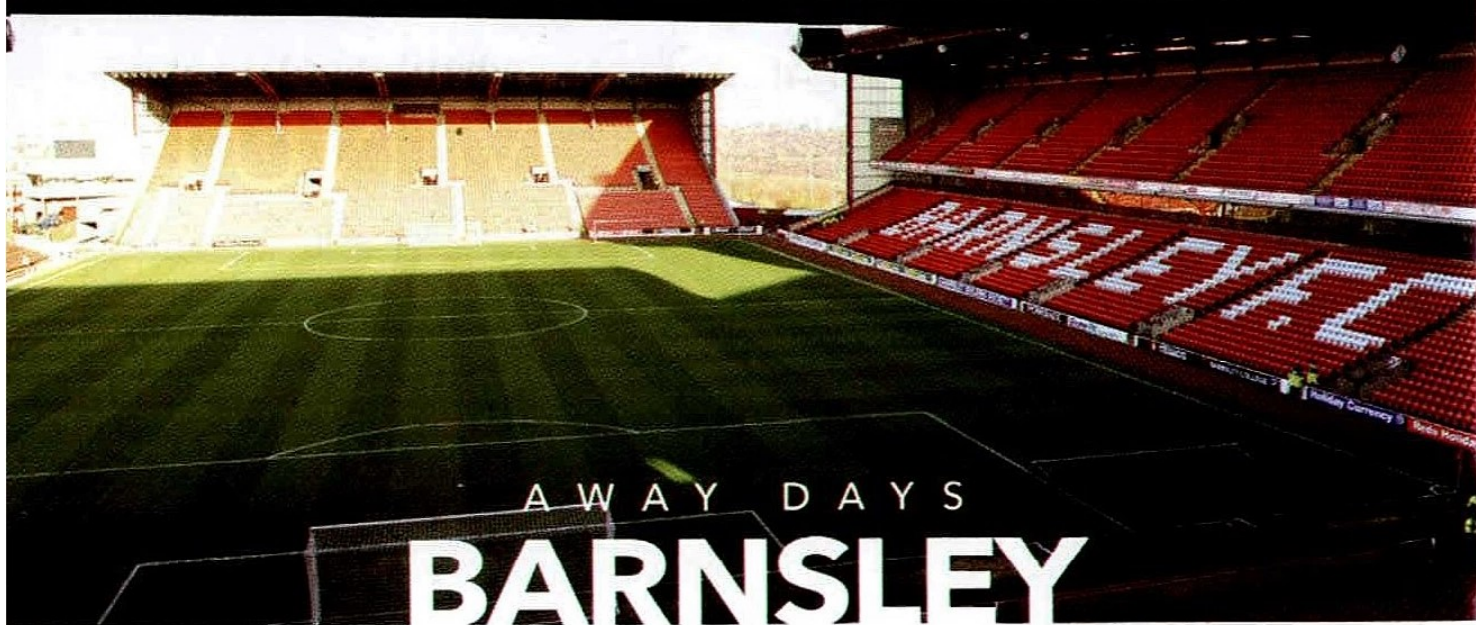

POST CODE FOR YOUR SATNAV: S71 1ET

DIRECTIONS: Take the M62 east and join the M1 travelling South. Leave the M1 at Junction 37 and take the A628 towards Barnsley. Stay on this road (the ground is well signposted) and you will eventually see the ground on your right. There are a couple of car parks located at the ground, but they are mainly for permit holders only. In-between the ground and the MetroDome is a car park for visiting supporters, called Queens Ground, which costs £4 Cars, £8 Mini Buses and £15 Coaches. Otherwise you can try parking at the MetroDome itself (although it can be slow to get out of after the game has finished) or street parking.

COACH TRAVEL: Latics as always will be operating coaches, Adults £12, Concession £9, coaches depart at 17.30 prompt. To book telephone 01617855150



WHAT'S IT LIKE WHEN WE GET THERE?

Latics fans are housed in the new North Stand, where the facilities are good. The normal allocation for away supporters is 2,000 tickets although, if demand requires it, then the whole of this stand can be allocated (6,000). An unusual feature of the stadium is a purpose built stand for disabled supporters. This is a three floor structure that sits at the corner between the East & South Stands. There is also an electric scoreboard at one corner of the North Stand, on top of a security control room. The teams come out from one corner of the ground between the North and West Stands.

TICKET PRICES: Adults £23, Over 65's £16, 17-21 £16, 12-16 £10, Under 12 £5. Add £2 to all prices if paying on matchday.



If you are after a pre-match drink away supporters generally are recommended to avoid the town centre, especially pubs near the train station. Most visitors recommend the Metro Dome, a leisure centre within a few minutes walk of the away end. Its bar has a good atmosphere, serving a selection of ales and decent food. However, it does get very crowded.

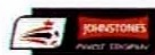

After neat build up on the edge of the box, Jones received the ball in the penalty

Holloway was causing a nuisance in attack, winning headers and flick ons, and a minute later he was fouled on the edge of the box.

Danny Lafferty and Jones stood over the ball but it was the latter which struck the ball against the wall.

"I don't think we have had any luck this season... but things have changed."

Is it any coincidence that Latics' upturn in fortunes has come about following the return of **Anthony Gerrard** to SportsDirect.com Park?, writes Tony Bugby.

Since the 30-year-old central defender made his debut in the win at Shrewsbury Town, Latics are unbeaten in seven games.

And 13 points from a possible 21 has greatly enhanced their prospects of staving off the threat of relegation from Sky Bet League One.

"It could be coincidence, it could be the other loan signings brought it. It could be down to a lot of things," explained free agent Gerrard who has signed a contract for the remainder of the season.

And Gerrard finds himself in a similar situation to last March when signed for Latics on loan from Huddersfield Town and the team was again on the slide down the table, a position he helped arrest.

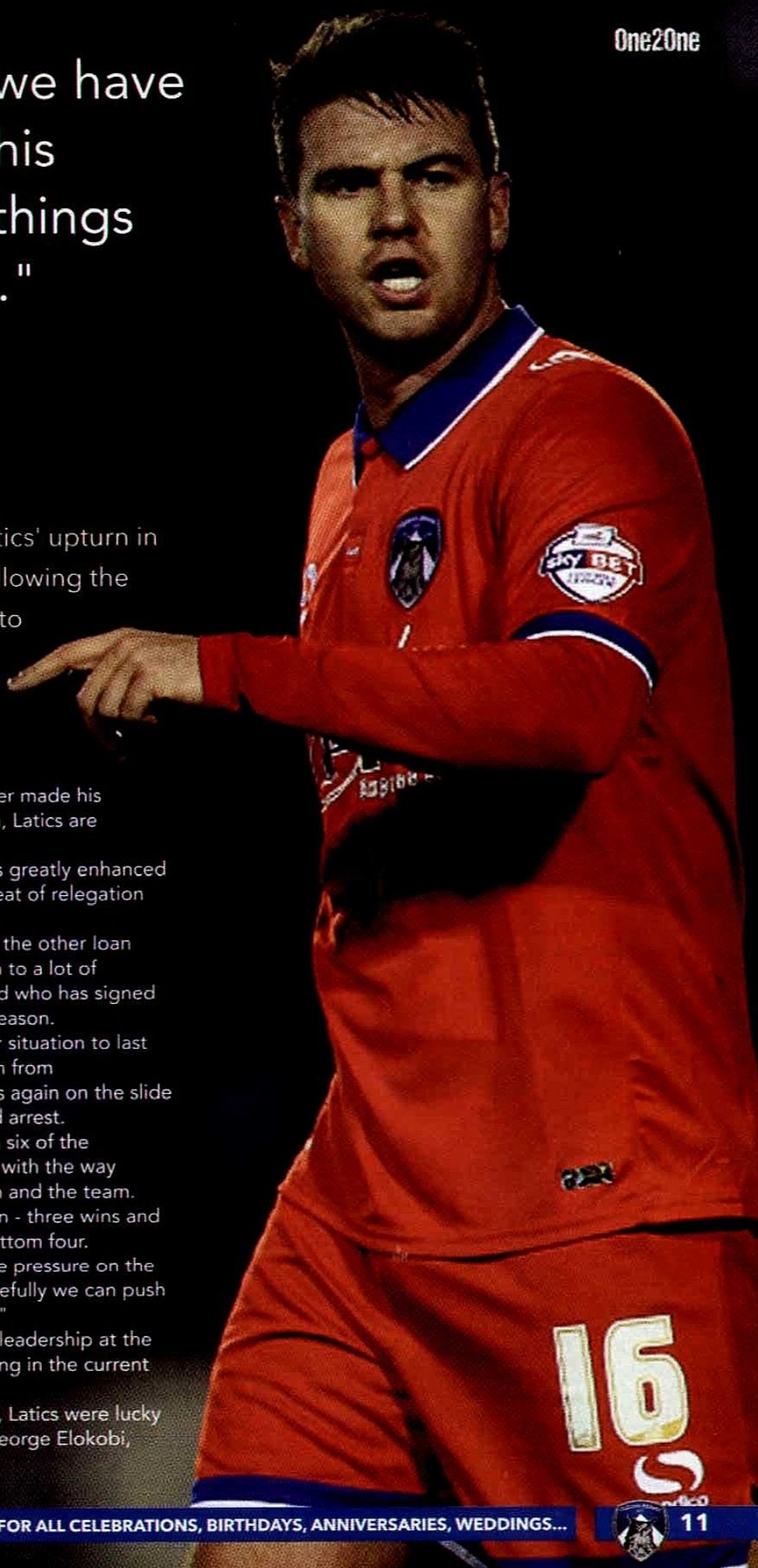
This time Gerrard, who has played in six of the unbeaten seven games, is delighted with the way things have gone so far, both for him and the team.

He explained: "We are on a good run - three wins and four draws - but we remain in the bottom four.

"We have to keep it going to pile the pressure on the clubs just above us in the table. Hopefully we can push on up the league and out of danger."

Gerrard has also provided steel and leadership at the back, something that had been lacking in the current campaign.

Remember at the end of last season, Latics were lucky to have three leaders in the team, George Elokobi, Adam Lockwood and Gerrard.

Latics have certainly tightened up at the back since Gerrard returned as only four goals have been conceded in those seven games.

He said: "We have been defending well and it is simply a case of making sure everybody is well organised and knows their role."

"We have added steel to the back four and it has also been a case of restoring confidence after a difficult season."

Gerrard added the only focus is ensuring Latics finish the season out of the bottom four.

"When you consider the position we were in when I arrived, that would be a massive achievement as we were a long way from safety," he explained. Gerrard is not fazed by the challenge confronting him after Latics last season also flirted with the relegation places at one stage late in the season.

He explained: "Last season I thought we were unfortunate to be down near the bottom when you could see the fine margins."

"I don't think we have had any luck this season, but things have changed and hopefully we will be safe with two or three games to play. "We don't want it going down to the crunch and the last game because then it is how the players react to pressure."

And with five of their seven games in March at home, Gerrard believes it is a great opportunity to take great strides towards safety if they can re-establish home rule.

He said: "We haven't done well here which could be down to trying to force the game and be on the front foot."

"Our away record has been good and we have more freedom while there is a lot of pace in the side which suits us more."

Gerrard is also impressed by the job John Sheridan is

doing to keep Latics in League One.

He said: "I have a lot of time and respect for him. He is doing a fantastic job."

"He lets you know what he wants and does things the right way. If you are rested or dropped, he will tell you why."

"Today there are a lot of managers who won't confront or pull you up and they whisper behind your back."

"All you want from a manager is honesty, and you get that with Shez."

Gerrard says it is good to be back after what has been a challenging season.

He was out of contract and left Huddersfield Town in the summer but it came as a shock when nobody came knocking at the door bearing in mind most of his career had been spent in the Championship with Cardiff, Hull and Huddersfield.

Gerrard continued:

"There were no offers, not even to come and train. That's football, it can be a fickle business."

"It was a blow, but I am not the first player it has happened to, and I certainly won't be the last."

"I was surprised because I had played most of my football in the Championship, playing many good games."

"Nobody liked to feel they are not wanted and loved. But it has changed and it is great

to be back at Oldham.

"They were quick on the ball in offering me a contract and it made common sense to sign, even though I had other things in the pipeline."

"I knew what I was coming into, knew the players and it was not a step into the dark so it was a good fit."

Gerrard added it had been difficult not being paid for nearly seven months, especially with a family to provide for.

Before signing for Latics, Gerrard spent the first half of the season playing non contract and for free at Shrewsbury Town to keep match sharp.



"I knew what I was coming into, knew the players and it was not a step into the dark so it was a good fit."

He added that it is a case of rebuilding his stature and reputation in the game.

"If I can help keep Oldham up, then hopefully somebody will see that I have done a reasonable job," he said.

After two seasons as a regular at Huddersfield, Gerrard found himself out of favour in 2014/15, his third campaign at the club which he left in not the happiest circumstances. At one stage last season a proposed move to America to play in the MLS broke down. And after that happened came the loan move to Latics. Gerrard added that before signing for Latics for a second time, a move overseas had again been a distinct possibility.

It would not have fazed him, even with a young family as he explained: "I have known players in this country who have turned down moves because they are too far from home and their family.

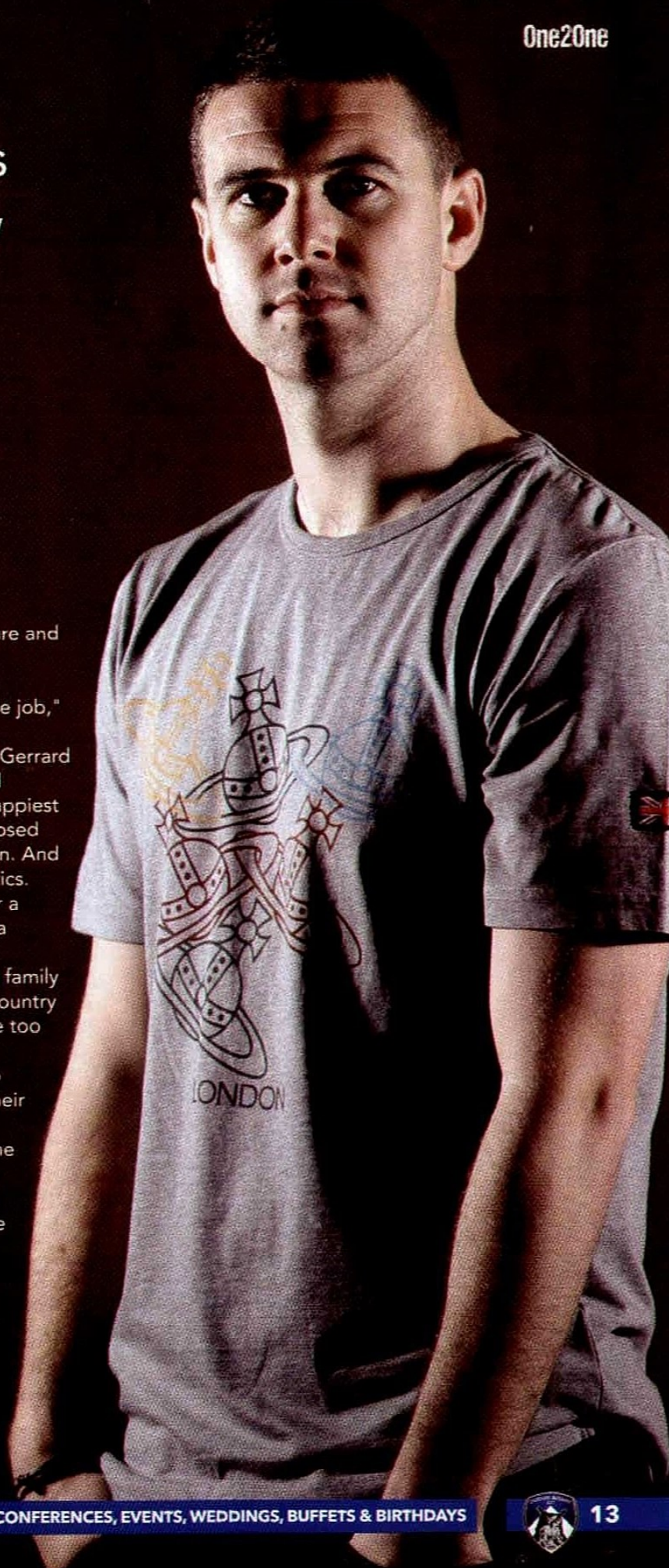
"I have young children and I would like them to experience different cultures and to broaden their horizons.

"It is something I would not rule out doing in the future, but who knows what might happen?"

Gerrard, who only recently turned 30, says he would relish to play at Championship level once again.

He said: "When you turn 30, there is a notion you are in decline which is not the case, and I don't see myself as being in decline.

"When you play centre half, experience speaks volumes and you can only be coached certain things. You learn a lot from playing regularly and consistently and I have been doing that since the age of 19."

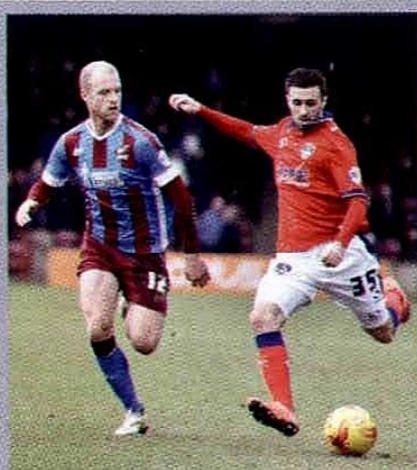

"Before our goal on the half hour mark, we had four or five great chances to take the lead. When it is like that you think they are going to go down the other end and score but we defended well."

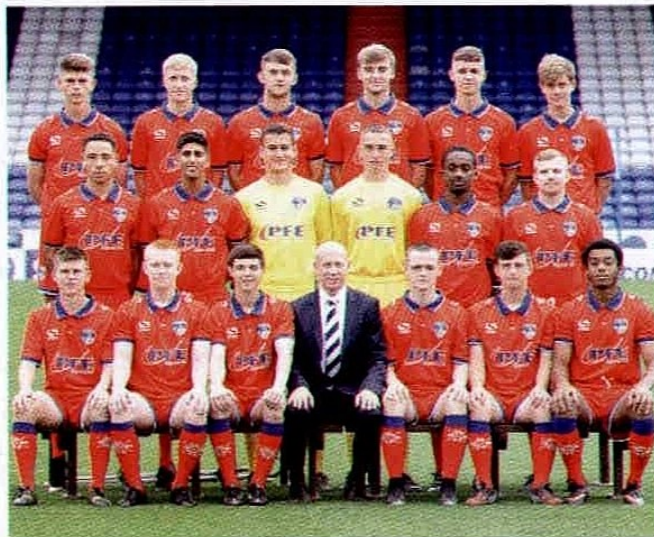

OFF TO A FLYER



Two games, four goals. Debuts don't come much more spectacular than that of Marcus Rashford.

The Manchester United striker, who turned 18 only in October, followed up his brace against FC Midtjylland with two goals and an assist in Sunday's 3-2 victory over Arsenal.

"He isn't affected by the venue or the crowd or by the pressure you have in these massive games," said teammate Juan Mata. "He's a special player and we're very happy for him."

Of course, a flying start is no guarantee. But if these glittering debuts are anything to go by, young Rashford could be set for stardom.

MARCO VAN BASTEN - AJAX

Van Basten was just 17 when he replaced the ageing Johan Cruyff during an Eredivisie match against NEC Nijmegen in April 1982. Nine minutes later he hoisted his gangly 6ft 2ins frame above two defenders to nod the first of 153 goals for the Dutch giants. It would take him 12 months to really hit his stride, but once the goals started to flow, they never stopped. Sadly, after 276 goals in 373 games and three Ballon d'Ors, injury ended his career at the age of 28.

PELE - SANTOS

Popular legend has it that the Brazilian legend hit four goals on his debut for Santos. Which is true - to an extent. Pele, aged just 15, did score four times, yet the game in question was little more than an exhibition against local no-hopers Cubatao.

His professional debut - and his first appearance wearing

that iconic No.10 - came against Corinthians Santo Andre a month later, with Pele scoring once in a 7-1 demolition. It would prove to be the first of 15 goals in his first 11 games and, as Europe's big guns circled, Brazil's government declared the teenager an official 'national treasure' to prevent his sale.

CRISTIANO RONALDO - SPORTING LISBON

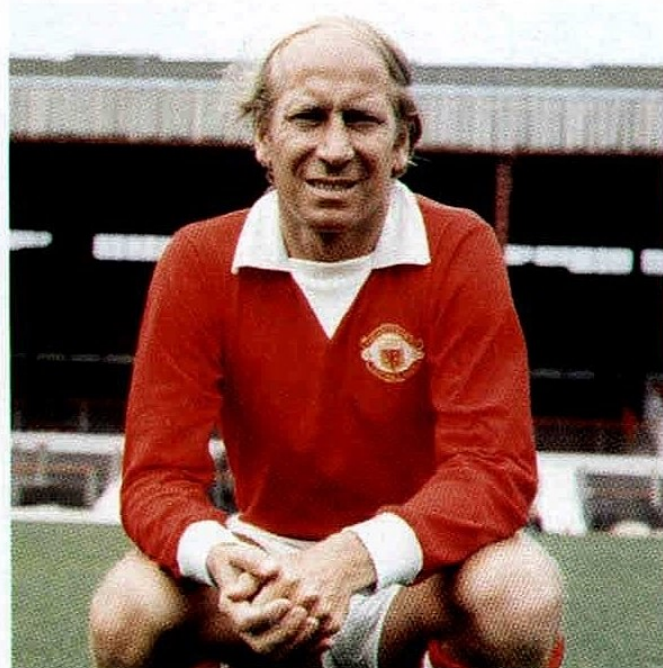
Talk about starting as you mean to go on. Already watched by scouts from Arsenal and Liverpool, a shorter, skinnier Ronaldo marked his Sporting debut against Moreirense with a run from the halfway line, a flurry of stepovers and by a calm finish which he celebrated by whipping his shirt off. Still just 17, he bagged another before the game was out, alerting the rest of the world to his phenomenal talent.

BOBBY CHARLTON - MANCHESTER UNITED

Charlton, aged 18, had just returned from national service in Shrewsbury when Matt Busby enquired if he was fit to make his debut against - fittingly enough - Charlton in October 1956.

"I actually had a sprained ankle, but I wasn't going to admit to it," said the 78-year-old, who scored 260 goals in 807 games for the Reds. "So just I crossed my fingers and said 'Yes'."

It was lucky he did. Starting up front against the Addicks, Charlton started as he would go on, scoring two howitzers from the edge of the area in a 5-1 win.

GUNNAR HALLE

In the latest of a series on Latics' leaders, Tony Bugby looks at players who have played for Latics and later made the move into management. Today he spotlights **Gunnar Halle**, the Norwegian who spent five memorable years at the club between 1991/96, and who is manager of his country's under-16 and 18 teams having had a stint in club management in his home nation.



THE PLAYER

When Halle signed for Latics in 1991 they were on the cusp of winning promotion back to the top flight of English football for the first time in 68 years. They were heady days under Joe Royle and Halle admits it was quite an adventure moving to England, a path not so well trod by Norwegians a quarter of a century ago. "There were not many Norwegian players over here, only Erik Thorstvedt and Jan-Age Fjortoft at the time. And we paved the way for many others to make the same journey, especially as the national team was doing well at the time," he explained. Halle, who signed for Latics from Lillestrom for £280,000, still has great affection for Latics and still visits the club and also to see friends he made while at the club. He said: "I have good memories of my time with Latics, a nice club that was good for me as I was playing all the time. "They were not the biggest club, but a family club and it was a good time for the club and, as players, we appreciated being part of it. "Joe Royle was a great manager. He always supported me and he was a big influence on my career." Halle, who made 212 appearances for Latics scoring 21 goals, was the regular right back during the three years

spent in the top division, though there was the occasional foray into midfield.

He went on to spend 12 years in English football later playing for Leeds, Bradford City and Wolves before ending his career where it began at Lillestrom. "I have happy memories of playing in England and don't regret coming here. And when Oldham decided to sell me, it was good for my career, and I thank them for that," he explained.

Halle also won 64 caps for Norway and appeared for them in both the 1994 and 98 finals of the World Cup.

He also scored a hat trick for his country in a 10-0 win against San Marino in a World Cup qualifier.

Halle says management wasn't on the radar during his playing days which ended at almost 39 years of age.

"In the beginning I didn't think of management/coaching, but as I got older you look at things differently and it all came about quickly."

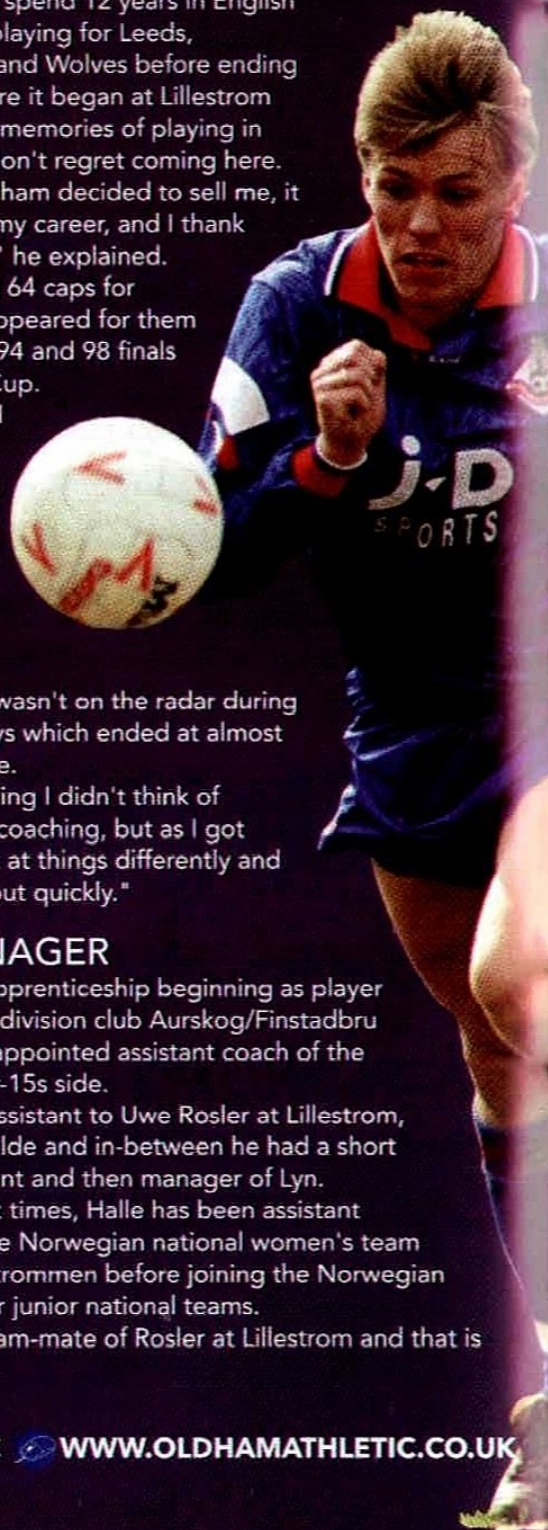
THE MANAGER

Halle did an apprenticeship beginning as player coach at third division club Aurskog/Finstadbru before being appointed assistant coach of the national under-15s side.

He was later assistant to Uwe Rosler at Lillestrom, Viking and Molde and in-between he had a short spell as assistant and then manager of Lyn.

In more recent times, Halle has been assistant manager of the Norwegian national women's team and No 2 at Strommen before joining the Norwegian FA to manager junior national teams.

Halle was a team-mate of Rosler at Lillestrom and that is



how they came to team up together in management. When Rosler came to manage in England, initially at Brentford and later at Wigan Athletic and Leeds United, he asked Halle to join him.

"I decided not to come, but may be one day I will manage in England," he explained.

Looking back, Halle says he enjoyed his brief stint in total command at Lyn, though the club was in crisis and it was a baptism of fire.

"When I took over it was absolute chaos. The club went bankrupt in the middle of the season. It was tough, but a good experience."

Halle accepted an offer from the Norwegian FA in October 2014 and has worked with teams from under-15 to 18 level. He said: "I coached the under 16 and 17 teams last season, but this year I think it is going to be the under-16 and 18s."

"I enjoy working with young players and we have some good ones coming through in the age groups I have worked with."

Halle selects Royle and George Graham, his manager at Leeds, as massive influences on his career.

He said: "Joe was the manager who had the faith to sign me, and he made a big impact on me. He helped me learn how to play in England."

"I also enjoyed working with George Graham at Leeds. He was very well organised, his teams always had good shape and he was also strict. I had success at Leeds and enjoyed playing for him."

"There were other managers I also learnt from. You pick up things from all of them and then you make your own stamp as a manager."

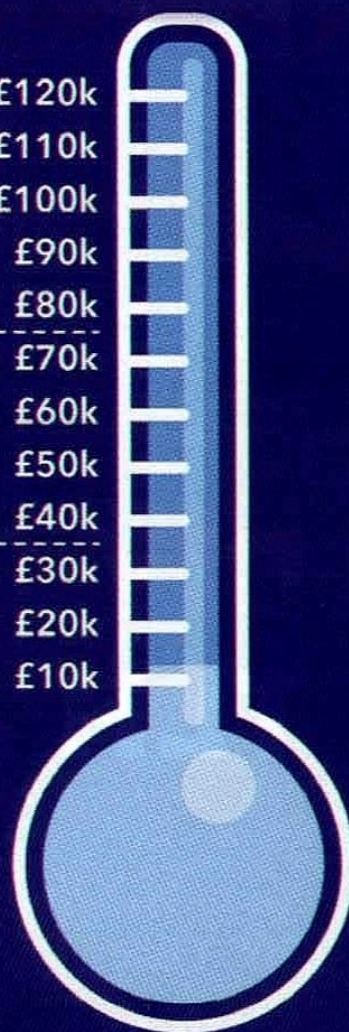

Bramall Lane is a great place to watch football as the stands are located close to the pitch, the views are generally good, as well as the atmosphere too. On the concourses there are television screens showing the game going on inside as well as a betting outlet. Food is available in the form of Pukka Pies (Meat & Potato, Chicken Curry, or Cheese & Onion, all £3.30), Sausage Rolls (£2.70), Cheeseburgers (£3.30) and Hot Dogs (£3.30). Prepare to be searched on entry into the ground by the stewards. The Club have automatic turnstiles, meaning that you have to insert your ticket into a bar code reader to gain admittance.

TICKET PRICES: Adults £20, Senior Citizens £13, Students £11, Under 18's £9. Wheelchair £13, helper free. This game is currently all-ticket for Latics fans... If a decision is made to go to pay on day, prices will increase by £2. The stadium has automated turnstiles and you will need a ticket for entry.

Top Tip
Pubs close to the ground tend to be for home fans only. About a ten minute walk away at the bottom of Eccleshall Road is a recently opened Wetherspoons Outlet called the 'Sheaf Island'. Whilst a little further away on Wellington Street is the Devonshire Cat. This pub has around 12 hand pulled beers on offer, serves food, has a large screen TV, welcomes families (until 7pm) and is listed in the CAMRA Good Beer Guide. Although there are bouncers on the doors, away fans are allowed into the pub wearing colours.

Jonathan Forte missed out from the squad altogether as he suffered with illness.

It was a quiet opening to the game, however it was the hosts who enjoyed the early possession.

Iron striker Tom Hopper had the first half chance of the game as he chased a through ball into the box. He won the race against Joel Coleman, however his lob was well over the crossbar.

Jim O'Brien was next to go close for Scunthorpe United after creating space on the edge of the area but his tame effort was collected by Coleman. Latics were struggling to get hold of the ball in the early stages, but they had their first real chance of the game on 16 minutes.

The ball was played long for Curtis Main, he held the ball up well and fed it into the path of the onrushing Carl Winchester and his rasping strike was just wide of Luke Daniels' goal.

Two minutes later, Latics again could have taken the lead as James Wilson's looped cross into the box was controlled by Mills but his strike went inches past the far post.

That was the best it got for Latics in the first half as the game turned into a scrappy affair.

Just after the half hour mark, Coleman had to be alert to save a Conor Townsend free kick from 25 yards. The goalkeeper did well to tip the ball wide of the goal after the Hull loanee got the ball up and over the wall.

Three minutes later, Paddy Madden had the hosts best opportunity of the first half as he headed against the bar at the back post.

As the half was coming to a close, Mills received the first booking of the game for a late challenge on Scott Wiseman. The second half started much the same as the first ended as neither side were controlling the game.



ANOTHER AWAY POINT

The first chance of the second half fell to the Iron, and they really should have taken the lead.

Jamie Ness' free kick into the box was straight onto the foot of Tom Hopper but he missed his kick right in front of goal and the chance passed.

That was a let off for Latics and they had to be aware from the resulting corner as the corner was onto the head of Murray Wallace but he headed inches over Coleman's goal.

Sheridan made changes and brought Jake Cassidy and Mike Jones on and changed to a 4-4-2 formation and Latics had a lot more joy on the ball.

It was Coleman however that had tip wide a shot from Madden on 65 minutes, whilst five minutes later he saved from Conor Townsend.

Latics started to put the pressure on and were rewarded with the opening goal of the game on 78 minutes.

Palmer did superbly on the right hand side and he laid the ball into Lafferty from 12 yards and he steered into the far corner to put Latics ahead.

Scunthorpe threw caution to the wind and went in search of the equaliser. Substitute Gary McSheffrey tested the palms of Coleman on 83 minutes, however 10 minutes after Latics took the lead, they were pegged back.

After a cross into the box was not dealt

with, Wooton picked up the ball at the back post and steered into the bottom corner to equalise.

It was a tough one to take for Latics but they almost managed a winning goal in the final minute through Cassidy but Daniels was behind the ball to save.

That result, although disappointing to concede late on, meant Latics went six games unbeaten and a point nearer to safety.

THE UNLI

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS profiles ten big-name Swindon Town players not usually associated with the club.

MIKE SUMMERBEE

Brilliant winger Mike Summerbee was capped eight times by England after leaving Swindon Town. Initially with Cheltenham Town, he moved to the County Ground in March 1960 and was an important figure in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion success. He netted 39 goals in 218 League games prior to joining Manchester City in August 1965, amassing a vast collection of domestic and European honours under the Joe Mercer/Malcolm Allison partnership at Maine Road. Later playing for Burnley, Blackpool and Stockport County, he became a successful businessman and his son Nicky also starred for Swindon Town.



MIKE SUMMERBEE

DAVE MACKAY

Former Scotland international wing-half Dave Mackay had a spell as Swindon Town's player-manager. He helped Hearts win all three major Scottish honours before moving to Spurs in March 1959, skipping their 1960-61 'double' success and two further FA Cup triumphs. He joined Derby County in July 1968 and was joint 'Footballer of the Year' as they won the Second Division title in 1968-69. Swindon's player-boss from May 1971 until November 1972, scoring once in 26 League games, he managed Nottingham Forest, Derby's 1974-75 League Championship, Walsall, Doncaster and Birmingham. He died in March 2015.

OSSIE ARDILES

Former Argentina international midfielder Ossie Ardiles made two League appearances for Swindon Town in 1989-90. Together with Ricky Villa, the World Cup winner made headlines with his transfer from Huracan to Spurs in July 1978. He helped win the FA Cup in 1981 and UEFA Cup in 1984, moving to QPR in May 1988. Appointed Swindon's player-boss in July 1989, he plotted their 1989-90 Second Division play-off final success but they were denied promotion due to an illegal payments scandal. He took charge of Newcastle United in March 1991, then managed West Brom and Spurs before coaching overseas.



OSSIE ARDILES

GLENN HODDLE

Ex-England international midfielder Glenn Hoddle (pictured right) was player-manager as Swindon Town reached the Premiership in 1992-93. Signing professional for Tottenham Hotspur in April 1975, he starred as they won promotion in 1977-78, then won the FA Cup in two consecutive seasons and the UEFA Cup in 1984. He moved to Monaco in July 1987 and helped win the French title in 1987-88, becoming Swindon's player-boss in August 1991. Scoring once in 64 League games for the Robins, he left to take charge of Chelsea after the 1992-93 play-off final triumph and has since managed England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves.



KELY LADS

BRIAN MARWOOD

Former England international winger Brian Marwood helped Swindon Town to win promotion to the top-flight in 1992-93. Signing professional for Hull City in February 1978, he was leading marksman in their 1982-83 promotion triumph and moved to Sheffield Wednesday for £115,000 in August 1984. He joined Arsenal for £600,000 in March 1988 and starred in their 1988-89 League Championship success, moving to Sheffield United for £350,000 in September 1990. Joining Swindon in March 1993, he scored once in 11 League games and joined Barnet in August 1993. He became PFA chairman, since working in the media.

TERRY FENWICK

Versatile defender Terry Fenwick was capped 20 times by England before joining Swindon Town. Signing professional for Crystal Palace in December 1976, he featured in their 1978-79 Second Division title triumph and followed Terry Venables to QPR in December 1980. He scored in the 1982 FA Cup final, then skippered Rangers to the Second Division title in 1982-83 and 1986 League Cup final. Reunited with Venables at Tottenham Hotspur in December 1987, he joined Swindon in September 1993 and made 28 League appearances while at the County Ground. He later managed Portsmouth and Northampton Town.

FRANK McAVENNIE

Former Scotland international striker Frank McAvennie had a loan spell at Swindon Town in 1993-94. He starred for St Mirren before joining West Ham in June 1985 and was top scorer as they were third in the top-flight in 1985-86. Moving to Celtic in October 1987, he scored twice in their 1988 Scottish Cup final triumph and rejoined West Ham in March 1989. He helped win promotion in 1990-91, moving to Aston Villa in August 1992, then Celtic again. Loaned to Swindon in February 1994, he made seven League appearances before rejoining St Mirren. His colourful life story is titled 'Scoring - An Expert's Guide'.

NEIL WEBB

Midfielder Neil Webb was capped 26 times by England before joining Swindon Town. The son of former Reading favourite Dougie Webb, he turned professional with the Royals in November 1980 and moved to Portsmouth in July 1982. He helped win the Third Division title in 1982-83, then moved to Nottingham Forest in June 1985 and scored in their 1989 League Cup final triumph. Sold to

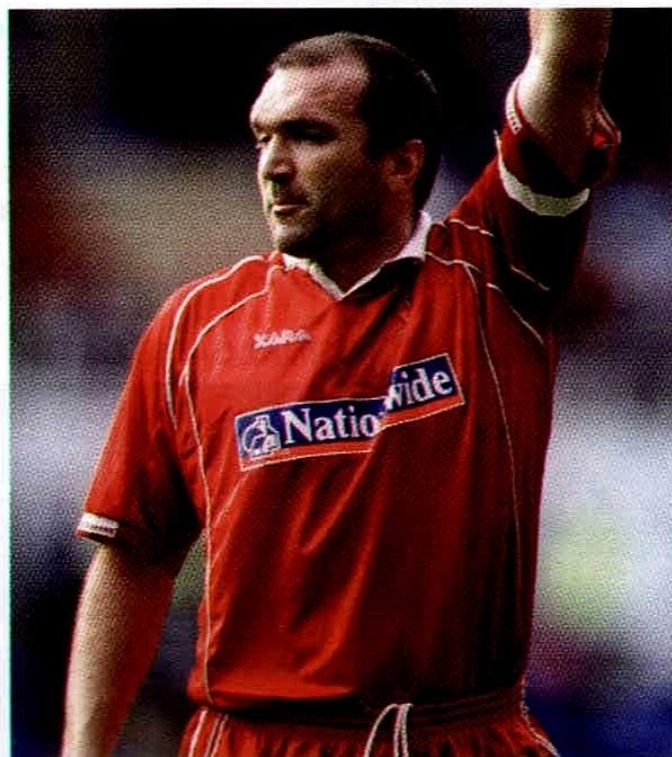
Manchester United for £1,500,000 in June 1989, he was an FA Cup winner in 1990 and rejoined Forest in November 1992. He was loaned to Swindon in October 1994, making six League appearances, then played for Grimsby Town.

PAUL INCE

Midfielder Paul Ince gained 53 England caps before playing for Swindon Town. Initially with West Ham, he moved to Manchester United for £1,000,000 in September 1989 and was England's first black captain. He amassed numerous honours, including the 'double' in 1993-94, joining Inter Milan for £8,000,000 in July 1995. Later with Liverpool, Middlesbrough and Wolves, he joined Swindon in August 2006 and made three League appearances while at the County Ground. He became Macclesfield Town's player-boss in January 2007 and has since managed MK Dons, Blackburn, MK Dons again, Notts County and Blackpool.

NEIL RUDDOCK

Ex-England international central defender Neil Ruddock played for Swindon Town during the 2001-02 campaign. A former Millwall apprentice, 'Razor' turned professional in March 1986, moving to Spurs a month later. He returned to Millwall in June 1988 and joined Southampton in February 1989. Appearing in the 1992 ZDS Cup final, he rejoined Spurs in July 1992 and joined Liverpool for £2,500,000 in July 1993. He starred in their 1995 League Cup final triumph, then played for West Ham and Crystal Palace before joining Swindon in August 2001. Scoring once in 15 League games, he has since worked in the media.

DARKEST HOUR

During Swindon's only season in Premier League to date (1992-93 season) they got relegated and conceded 100 goals, holding the unwanted record for most goals conceded in a season and most goals conceded at home in a season with 45.

FACT OR FICTION?

Swindon's first season in the Football League was in the 1920-21 season, where they finished a respectable fourth in the Third Division. The club banned media outlets from attending press conferences. Instead, Swindon Town FC will put out interviews conducted by its own press officer on its website and a social media app.

MANAGER LUKE WILLIAMS



Luke was initially appointed as caretaker manager following the departure of Martin Ling in December 2015. He managed two wins from his first two games in charge and was subsequently appointed on a more permanent basis, until the end of the 15/16 season.

He started his coaching career with The FA before moving onto roles with Leyton Orient, West Ham United and Brighton & Hove Albion. Luke joined Swindon Town under Mark Cooper and has worked as first-team coach and assistant manager before taking over first-team affairs.

LAWRENCE VIGOROUX

LAWRENCE VIGOROUX

The Liverpool goalkeeper is currently on loan at Swindon until the end of the 2015/16 season. Vigoroux was snapped up by Tottenham in 2012 before moving to Merseyside in the summer of 2014 after leaving White Hart Lane. Last term the former Chilean youth international was a regular for the Under-21 side at Anfield. So far this season he has made 33 appearances in all competitions, including 30 in the league keeping four clean sheets.

TYRELL BELFORD

Belford signed a deal with Swindon in the summer of 2013 following his release from Liverpool's Academy. The highly-rated youngster was at Coventry before he was snapped up by the Anfield outfit. He made his debut in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy win over Plymouth Argyle and helped secure Swindon's place in the Area Final, saving two penalties in the shoot-out win over Stevenage in the Area Semi-Final. Made his league debut against Leyton Orient in February 2014 and made 3 appearances this season.

JORDAN TURNBULL

The centre-back is back on a season-long loan from Southampton after a successful stint at Swindon in 2014/15. Turnbull started out in the Academy at Swindon before moving

to Southampton in 2007. In recent seasons he has featured regularly for the Under-21 sides at St. Mary's. This season he has made 32 appearances in all competitions scoring 3 goals in the process.

NATHAN THOMPSON

A product of the STFC Academy, Thompson made his breakthrough into the first team during the 2012/13 campaign. The tough-tackling defender was a regular as Swindon made the League One Play-Offs that term. One of the first names on the teamsheet and a firm fans' favourite ever since, the two-time Player of the Year winner is the current skipper at the County Ground.

JAMIE SENDLES-WHITE

The defender signed for Swindon after leaving Hamilton Academical's in January 2016. Having joined QPR as a fifteen year old, Sendles-White had loan spells at Colchester and Mansfield, he made his football league debut in October 2014 at Fratton Park and went on to make seven appearances before being recalled by his parent club. He has also been capped 9 times by the Northern Ireland Under-21 team.

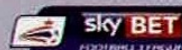
