

Good afternoon everyone and welcome back to the County Ground for today's visit of Port Vale.



The point we earned at Gillingham in midweek was brilliant. Playing without a physical and recognised number nine striker is difficult enough especially when you have to factor in going to a place like Gillingham because they're such a good side. I thought the way the boys acquitted themselves was brilliant. We had to shuffle things around with the formation and that's always a difficult thing to try and change when you've not got a great deal of time to work on stuff between games but they seemed to pick it up very quickly and I felt that they actually enjoyed the tactical side of it.

So far, we've had a mix of results and overall, we can be fairly pleased. We certainly don't want to see a repeat of that 'win-lose-draw' sequence over the season - of course we want to win more games but overall we're happy with the way things have gone so far.

One of the things that has pleased me the most is just how focused the group appear to be. With the obvious blip of Chesterfield (where there were potentially certain factors that led to that performance), on the whole, I've been delighted with how together the group are and how willing they are to run for each other and work hard for each other.

It's incredibly frustrating for all of us that we've got the likes of Jon Obika and Raphael Rossi-Branco out through injury but it's an occupational hazard in this industry. We have to accept that and find solutions when we've got key players missing.

Turning our attention to this afternoon, Port Vale have started so well that I feel that they are playing without too much to worry about and that's difficult to play against. Often when a team appear to be fairly relaxed and can express themselves a lot, they can make life difficult for the opposition. That said, with so many new arrivals over the summer, I think it's hard to know exactly what to expect from them at the moment. From what I've seen, they are going to try and have the ball as much as they can and try to play through the middle of the pitch so it could be an interesting game.

After three games away from home, it's good to be back at the County Ground. We love the pitch here and it's great when you get behind us. We're so well supported that it could be the difference so everyone is looking forward to playing here again.



PORT VALE

A summer of change has seen a new manager and a whole host of new signings from home and abroad arrive at Vale Park for the 2016/17 campaign.

After the departure of former incumbent, Rob Page during the offseason, Bruno Ribeiro was unveiled as the Burslem side's new gaffer in June, bringing with him a wealth of coaching experience and knowledge from across the continent. A former player in England himself, the 40-year-old has wasted no time in re-shaping the Valiants' squad in his image, bringing in no fewer than 14 new faces. One of those still at Vale Park is Michael Brown who will now serve as Ribeiro's assistant as Vale look to make their mark on League One this season.

Bringing in bodies would have been a priority for the new manager, with a number of departures at the end of last term. Unfortunately for Ribeiro, Carlos Saleiro – a summer addition from Portugal – found it difficult to settle in the Potteries and has had his contract cancelled this week.

On the pitch, Vale have made a good start to the campaign, remaining unbeaten in the league so far. On the opening day, they held last season's Play-Off semi-finalists and one of the fancied teams to have a good crack at promotion this time around. Bradford City to a 0-0 draw at Valley Parade. The only blot on their

copybook came in the EFL Cup first round, where they were knocked out by Cartisle United. 2-0 down at the break, a solitary goal from Anthony Grant was not enough to overturn the deficit at Brunton Park.

Their first home match of the new campaign yielded a 2-0 victory over Southend United with young striker, Anton Forrester notching for the first time this season before Remi Streete added a second after half-time to seal a first win of 2016/17. While Town were battling to a 1-1 draw at Gillingham on Tuesday night, the Valiants picked up all three points at home to Rochdale with Nathan Smith scoring the only goal in a 1-0 win at Vale Park - a result that sees them sit fourth in the fledgling League One table, joint-second with Scunthorpe United and Gillingham on goal difference.

Last season's 2-2 draw at the County Ground halted a sequence of defeats in Wiltshire that stretched back nearly a decade, with their last win in Wiltshire coming in October 2005.

In five visits to SN1 since, the Valiants have lost four and drawn one, shipping 19 goals in the process and scoring just four in reply.



JAK ALNWICK



The 6'2' stopper joined Vale from Newcastle United in August 2015 having made six appearances for the Magpies over the course of the 2014/15 campaign. A graduate of the youth

A graduate of the youth ranks at St. James's Park, the 23-year-old has also spent time on loan with Gateshead and Bradford City. After impressing in the early days of his Valiants career, he was rewarded with a two-and-a-half year contract.

REMI STREETE



Another former Magpie on the books at Vale Park, Streete returned for a second spell in the Potteries last summer following a short loan stint with the Valients

in October 2014. After being recalled by Newcastle, he then spent time on loan with Glasgow Rangers. Last weekend, he netted his first senior goal to help Vale beat Southend 2-0.

KJELL KNOPS



The Dutchman was Bruno Ribeiro's first signing of the 2016 offseason, joining from MVV Maastricht in his homeland. A former club captain at Maastricht,

Knops has spent his whole playing career in the Netherlands. After starting with Roda JC in 2008, he was also with Echter Voetbal Vereniging before signing for Vale in the summer.

CALVIN MAC-INTOSCH



Mac-Intosch is another summer recruit from Dutch football, moving to the Potteries from SC Cambuur. The defender was once on the books at Ajax, spending 12 years in their renowned academy

system before turning professional at Haarlem. He then spent four years at Telstar and was at Cambuur for two seasons between 2014 and 2016.

NATHAN SMITH



A graduate of the academy at Vale Park, Smith signed forms with the club in the summer of 2015. After a spell with Stafford Rangers on loan the previous season, the defender was

on loan for virtually alf of last term at National League side, Torquey United. He made nearly 40 appearances for the Gulls and has featured regularly for the Vale so far this season.

PAULO TAVARES



The Portuguese midfielder has spent his entire playing career in his homeland and is no stranger to current Vale boss, Bruno Ribeiro having worked with

him at his previous club, Vitoria Setubal in the Portuguese top flight. Starting out with Senhora ha Hora, Tavares then spent eight years with Leixoes.

SAM FOLEY



The attacking midfielder – who can also operate on the left side of midfield – was a summer 2015 arrival from Yeovil Town fresh from claiming the Glovers' Player of

the Season award. Has also enjoyed stints with the likes of Shrewsbury Town, Newport County and Cheltenham Town before joining the Valiants. Scored six goals for Vale last term.

JEROME THOMAS



The former England youth international was once on the books at Arsenal before joining Charlton Athletic in 2004. He made over a century of appearances for the Addicks then turned a

loan move to Portsmouth permanent. His next extended stay was at West Bromwich Albion and has most recently been with Crystal Palace and Rotherham United before joining the Vale

ANTON FORRESTER



Once part of the academy at Everton, Forrester signed for Blackburn Rovers in 2013. He spent the majority of the 2013/14 campaign on loan at Bury where he

netted six league goals and last term he made a handful of appearances for Morecambe. Signed for the Vale in the summer and is already off the mark for his new club.

MEET THE REST...

RYAN BOOT

The young goalkeeper once spent a short time on trial with then-Premier League side, Fulham in 2013. Has spent time on loan with the likes of Worcester and Norton.

CHRISTOPHER MBAMBA

Previously with IFK Gothenburg in Swedish football, the defender signed for Vale in July 2016. Has made three appearances so far for the Valiants.

QUENTIN PEREIRA

A summer arrival from Stade de Reims in French football, Pereira can operate in midfield and behind a striker. Once of Sochaux in France.

ANTHONY DE FREITAS

A graduate of the youth ranks at AS Monaco where he was a key figure in the B-team on the French Riviera. Signed a two year deal at Vale Park in the summer.

JAMES GIBBONS

The 18-year old is yet to make a senior appearance for the Valiants but was on the bench for Bruno Ribeiro's side last weekend.

SAM KELLY

Ex of Norwich City, the midfielder can play on the left side as well as in central midfield. Has also spent time with Everton and Cambridge United.

JJ HOOPER



A graduate of the youth academy at Newcastle United, Hooper spent a season with Northampton Town before dropping into non-league football with Alfreton Town. Netted

twenty times for Havant & Waterlooville during 2014/15 and joined Port Vale at the start of last term. Scored five goals for the Valiants last season.

RIGINO CICILIA

The striker has spent his entire career in continental football with the likes of Alemannia Aachen and Roda JC. Most recently with RKC Waalwijk before joining Vale

ALEX JONES

Currently on loan from Birmingham City, the young striker was on loan at Grimsby Town last term as the Mariners secured a return to the FFI.



MANAGER

BRUNO RIBEIRO

The former Leeds United and Sheffield United midfielder was appointed manager of the Valiants in the summer and has been tasked with sparking a revolution at Vale Park.

Ribeiro started his playing career in his native Portugal with Vitoria Setubal progressing through the youth ranks and going on to make his senior debut in 1994. He would stay with the topflight outfit for three seasons. Towards the end of his first stint in Portugal, he was spotted by then-Leeds United manager, George Graham who moved to sign him in the summer of 1997. He made an impact on his second appearance for the club, netting against Sheffield Wednesday at Hillsborough and would go on to make over 30 appearances for the Elland Road side in his first season in England. At the

start of the 1998/99 campaign, he picked up an injury that would ultimately cost him his place in the side under new manager, David O'Leary. In October 1999 he was on the move to Sheffield United where he struggled to hold down a regular place in the side so, in January 2001, he was sent out on loan to Uniao de Leiria in his homeland. He finished his playing career at Setubal having racked up over 300 career league appearances as well as five caps for the Portuguese Under-21 side.

In March 2011, he took his first steps in coaching with his last employers having previously been in charge of the club's Under17s. After 11 months at the helm he was relieved of his duties and went on to take charge of Farense and Moura Atletico Clube in the Portuguese lower leagues. In January 2015, he was back at Setubal where he steered the club away from relegation at the end of 2014/15.

His next appointment was abroad with Bulgarian champions, Ludogorets Razgrad where he was in charge for just two months before being sacked. In the summer of 2016, he was handed the reins at Port Vale and has overseen an unbeaten start to the league season.







Port Vale could line up in a 4-3-3 system this afternoon.



You scored your first professional goal at QPR last week, how much did that mean to you to get off the mark?

Obviously, a lot - I used to go to watch QPR when I was younger. It's been a long time coming after thirty-odd appearances and no goals. It's something I'm probably not used to but this is a much higher level than where I was playing previously but I'm delighted to get the goal. I had a lot of friends and family there too which made it even more special.

Did it mean more to you scoring at Loftus Road of all places given that connection you have with the place?

Yeah, definitely. I used to go as a kid. My best mate who I used to go there with was in the stands watching too. I've grown up with that being the main stadium I knew so it was nice to score there and nice to get us back in the game even though it ended on quite a sour note in the end.

Let's go right back to the start of pre-season. It was a bit different for you this time around compared to last year, wasn't it?

Definitely. I think this year the boys are a lot fitter than we were last year. This year has been a very aggressive pre-season in terms of maintaining our fitness. The trip away to Ireland did wonders for team bonding and I think we've been able to keep the main crop of players from last year. There have been a few ins and outs but not as drastic as last year and that has probably helped the team.

How important is that team bonding?

It's a very isolated lifestyle being a footballer. You spend most of the day with players you play with so it's really important that you get on with each other. It shows on the pitch especially in the first game of the season, you could see how ecstatic all the boys were after the goal went in.

It looked to be the same at QPR when Jordan Stewart scored. You, Brad and Jordan all live together so that must have been quite a moment for all of you?

Definitely! Jordan isn't one that is short of confidence so Brad and me were delighted for him to score. He took the goal very well and I think that's what he's been waiting for. He struggled a bit last year to get used to the lifestyle but he's come back in as probably one of the fitter players, has worked hard and it's just rewards for what he's done.

On a personal level, how much have you developed over the past year or so?

A lot. Perhaps not so much abilitywise — I've always believed I'm
good enough to play at this level
if I put my mind to it but it's the
little things in training. Things like
your fitness, being tactically aware
and your positioning. All that kind
of stuff. The coaches have been
fabulous and have really helped
me to develop my game over
the past year and I'm looking
forward to this season, hopefully
progressing even further and
adding more goals and assists to

Do you feel you've got over that initial step up in standard?

It probably took longer than I thought. It usually takes a couple of months anyway depending on what kind of lifestyle you have, to get used to new surroundings. The coaches have been fantastic, the boys believed in me from day one even when I didn't believe in myself as much as I should have but this year I feel more comfortable and more aware of where I am. I feel I'm ready to


progress and contribute to the team.

It seems like that belief is coursing through you especially against Coventry. At times, their full-back didn't know which way to turn when you were running at him...



Hopefully I'll be able to bring that more consistently over the course of the season.

Town have got a balanced record so far – won one, drawn one and lost one – is that a good start to the season?

I'd say the first two performances were very good and that's what we've been focusing on. With our performance against Chesterfield I'd say there were a few lapses in concentration and I don't think







we can blame anything else. On the day they were probably more clinical with their chances but looking back at the clips, there were some positives to take and we'll use that going forward.

It's certainly not a case of being eased into the games programme. At the moment the games are coming thick and fast. Is that a good thing?

It's a good thing after a loss because we're able to quickly turn around and focus on another game. I don't think it's been good with our squad size. A few people have taken a hit with injuries which has been unfortunate but I think everyone is here to play football and is happy to play football so long may the games come.

After three away games on the spin, how much are you looking forward to being back in front of a home crowd again?

I was really impressed by the support we had against Coventry. I thought all the players felt it and it really helped to push us forward, especially in the second half when they were wearing. I'm looking forward to the support again this afternoon and hopefully it will be another three points to help make our home stadium a fortress.

How important is that support going to be over the course of this season?

Massive. We're in the game and all the players are focused on the job in hand but you can definitely hear the support through the team. In the second half against Coventry we were pressing and you could sense the goal was coming but the fans pushed us even more.


We try and analyse each game as it comes. In the build up to the Coventry game it was a long wait through pre-season for that fixture so it was nice to start with a win.



Coventry are a big club in this league and the team we saw out on the pitch that day will probably get added to a lot more over the next few weeks before the window closes so it was nice to pick up three points against a club that are going to be strong later on in the season. The QPR fixture was a tough one because with a small squad and a fixture so soon after the first game of the season, it's very difficult to juggle what changes to make and make sure we're putting a team out on the pitch that's going to be competitive. At the same time we had to make sure we had enough in reserve to try and play again a couple of days later. It was a fantastic performance by the boys that went out at Loftus Road. It was a really good game to watch if you were a supporter of either team - I felt it was a proper cup game. Last Saturday was the first real disappointment of the season. We looked a bit tired off the back of the QPR game but that can't be an excuse. We all know the schedule especially in this league so we've got to accept that and make the best of those circumstances.



From a players' perspective, this hectic start to the season is probably a good thing - after a negative result at the weekend, you can try and put that right pretty soon afterwards. If that's the case with the whole team, the performance gives everyone a



lift. From a coaches' perspective, in terms of preparing the team, you have to make sure you give everybody the chance to recover appropriately for the next game both tactically and physically. It's a bit of a different feeling for a coach because you don't feel that you get enough time to do as much work as you'd like to send the boys into that next game fully prepared.

Today's opponents have seen an incredible amount of change over the summer and that can have its positives and negatives looking from outside, in. You start to wonder if they can be as organised as they'd possibly like to be but at the same time a lot of fresh new faces can create a new vibe and give everyone a bit of a lift. They have a new manager, new players and that can take the club in a different direction so they are an unknown quantity that we have to be prepared to go and get a good result and a good performance against.

Swindon Town's board of directors awarded a contract to Rimes and Sons to transport the team to all away games in 1934/35 in a '28-seater motor coach'. The sum of £87 was agreed!

1949

1966


Stan Harland made his Town debut in a 2-2 draw at Brighton - the first of 210 consecutive first team appearances for the club.

Wolves' Andy Mutch was signed in a £250,000 deal, partnering Norwegian Jan Age Fjortoft up front in Town's Premiership season.


2004

LOU MACARI'S RED AND WHITE ARMY

BOLTON WANDERERS 1 SWINDON TOWN 2

23 AUGUST 1986

After remaining unbeaten in the league since the turn of the calendar year, Town faced a tough task at Burnden Park on the opening day of 1986/87. Lou Macari kept faith with those who had been part of that 21-game run by leaving out all five of his close season recruits.

Martin Ling was handed a seat on the bench but there was no place for Jimmy Gilligan, Alan McLoughlin, Tim Parkin or Steve White.

Bolton also had an effort cleared off the goal line when a Steve Elliott header beat Ken Allen; Chris Ramsey averting the danger.



A bit like the World Cup or the Euros every team has a separate base so the boys won't get a chance to mix with the other teams. We're staying in The Hague where we have a training base. Another aspect we try to cultivate on trips away like this is the social aspect - the boys are working together and are in each other's company virtually all the time. Ultimately, the football takes care of itself and we need to make sure we're building and bridging the gap between our normal games programme and a competitive games programme like this.
