



Good afternoon and welcome to The County Ground for today's Sky Bet League One encounter with Bolton Wanderers.



Tuesday night was brilliant and we were thrilled to succeed in the penalty shootout against Oxford United in our Checkatrade Trophy game.

I thought it was very important after a few negative results to come out of the game with what was regarded as a win. It is obviously nice to win a game of that magnitude against our local rivals and we'll take that in any way we can at the moment.

It was a fantastic evening for Will Henry who saved three spot-kicks in the shootout to help us secure the extra point. 
# STEVE ANDERSON

Let's move on to today's visitors, Bolton Wanderers. They are currently in a transitional period following an ownership change in the

summer and started the season very well under Phil Parkinson, who we all know is a very successful manager at this level. However, the wins have dried up of late so no doubt they will be trying to get back on track this afternoon.
















# NATHAN THOMPSON


Good Afternoon everyone and welcome to The County Ground for our game against Bolton Wanderers.

#### BOLTON WANDERERS

The Trotters have made a mixed start to life in League One as they look to bounce straight back and secure a return to the Championship at the first time of asking.

It has been a miserable few years for everyone connected with Bolton. Following their relegation from the Premier League in 2012, the club have been forced to deal with a string of off-field financial problems and have struggled on the pitch as a result.

Having to cut their cloth accordingly in the Championship, Wanderers continued to struggle and were thrashed 4-1 away at Derby County on April 2016 to consign them to life in the third tier of English football for the first time since 1993.

However, expectations are now high at the Macron Stadium following the appointment of the experienced Phil Parkinson as the club's new manager in the summer, who knows League One inside out having spent a lengthy spell at the helm of Bradford City in this division.

Add to that the fact Bolton have been able to keep hold of the likes of Josh Vela, Jay Spearing, Zach Clough, Gary Madine, Mark Davies and Liam Trotter, in addition to drafting in quality players in the ilk of Mark Beevers and Chris Taylor, hopes are high for a successful season at Bolton.

It was a good start for the new era as well with Wanderers winning their opening four fixtures in League One, before finishing the month of August unbeaten on the domestic front. However, things have turned sour since and that fine early season form has been followed up with no victories in their last six outings, which included a 2-0 defeat at home to Oxford United last weekend.

Bolton fans expect and Phil Parkinson's side will be hoping to get their season back on track with a victory at SN1 today.

# GARY MADINED

R&W TAKES A CLOSER LOOK AT ONE OF BOLTON WANDERERS' DANGERMEN THIS AFTERNOON...

The lethal finisher joined the Trotters on a free transfer in 2015, becoming the club's first signing of the summer transfer window. Having risen through the ranks at Carlisle United, the 26-year-old made his debut for the Cumbrians as a 17-year-old in March 2008 after coming on against Nottingham Forest as a sub.

Madine went on to score 22 goals in 83 outings for Carlisle before sealing a move to Sheffield Wednesday in January 2011. He opened his account for the Owls in just his second appearance, and he went on to

help the club achieve promotion to the Championship during the 2011/12 season.

Loan spells at Carlisle, Coventry City and Blackpool then followed before the forward penned a two-year deal with Bolton. Following a fruitful pre-season, Madine went on to finish last season with six goals in 36 games as Wanderers suffered relegation.

However, Madine has enjoyed a good start to this term, notching three goals in the opening month to fire Bolton to the top of the League One table. The striker will be looking to get back on the goal trail this afternoon in a bid to breathe new life into the Trotters' season.

## MEET THE REST...

#### WILLIAM JAASKELAINEN

Son of Wanderers legend Jussi, the youngster signed his first professional deal with the club prior to the start of the 2015/16 season. Has represented Finland at U18 level and has featured for Bolton's U18s and U21s sides.

#### **BEN ALNWICK**

The stopper joined Wanderers on a free transfer on Transfer Deadline Day in August 2016 after leaving Peterborough United. Helped Sunderland win promotion to the Premier League and has also represented the likes of Tottenham Hotspur, Luton Town, Leicester City, Norwich City and Charlton Athletic.

#### TOM THORPE

Became Bolton's final signing on Transfer Deadline Day in August 2016 after signing for the club from Rotherham United. Began his career with Manchester United and made his Premier League debut against West Ham United in September 2014. Has also captained England at U19 level.

#### ANDREW TAYLOR

The vastly experienced defender started his career with Middlesbrough and helped the club reach the semi-finals of the FA Cup in 2006. Has also featured for Cardiff City and Wigan Athletic, winning promotion to the Premier League with the Bluebirds in 2013. Has been with Bolton since August 2016.

#### DARREN PRATLEY

Has been with Wanderers since the 2011/12 campaign and was named club captain in the summer of 2015. Best known for his time at Swansea City, the all-action midfielder scored

31 goals in 199 appearances during five years with the Swans, helping steer the club to the Premier League.

#### LAWRIE WILSON

The versatile defender joined Bolton in August 2015 after impressing whilst on trial with the club. However, he only featured in 13 games for Wanderers last term and has struggled for game time so far this season.

#### JAMIE PROCTOR

Knows Bolton manager Phil Parkinson well after the two worked together at Bradford City. Has had spells with the likes of Swansea City, Crawley Town, Shrewsbury Town and Fleetwood Town before signing for Bolton in July 2016.

#### KESHI ANDERSON

Signed for Bolton on loan from Crystal Palace on Deadline Day in August 2016, before going on to make an instant impression for his new club after scoring a debut goal against Southend United just days later.

#### MARK HOWARD



The experienced keeper joined Wanderers in July 2016 bringing his time at Sheffield United to an end. Began

his career with Arsenal and has also represented both Cardiff City and Swansea City. Has made 12 appearances for the Trotters so far this term.

#### MARK BEEVERS



Became a key cog in Millwall's defence after joining them on a permanent basis in January 2013, going on to rack up

just over a century of games for the Lions. Scored against Barnsley in the League One Play-Off final last term before signing a two-year deal with Bolton.

#### **DORIAN DERVITE**



Has been with the Trotters after penning a three-year deal following a successful spell with Charlton Athletic,

scoring five goals in 75 games for the Addicks, Started his career with Tottenham Hotspur before heading out to Spain to ply his trade for Villarreal.

#### DAVID WHEATER



Re-signed for Bolton in August 2016 after initially departing the club following the expiration of his contract.

Originally signed for the Trotters in January 2011 after leaving Middlesbrough, where he was club captain and earnt a call-up to the full England set-up.

#### **DERIK OSEDE**



Joined Bolton from the world famous Real Madrid in 2015 after his contract with the footballing giants expired.

Progressed through the famous La Fabrica youth setup and has enjoyed success on the international stage, winning the UEFA U19 European Championship with Spain in 2012.

#### **CHRIS TAYLOR**



The winger has spent the majority of his career in the Football League and made his name with Oldham Athletic.

where he was named in the 2009 PFA Team of the Year. Hit double figures in both 2008/09 and 2010/11 and has also played for Millwall and Blackburn Rovers, before signing for Bolton in the summer.

#### JAMES HENRY



Currently on loan at Bolton from Wolverhampton Wanderers until January 2017. Began his career with

Reading before going on to enjoy stints with Nottingham Forest, Bournemouth and Norwich City. Reached the semi-finals of the FA Cup with Millwall in 2013.

#### **JOSH VELA**



Has risen through the club's Academy and signed professional terms with the Trotters in 2011: Vela is a

natural central midfielder but can also operate on either flank, just behind the strikers and at right-back. Made his Bolton debut in April 2012 after coming off the bench against Swansea City.

#### LIAM TROTTER



Won the FA Youth Cup with Ipswich Town in 2005 after beating a strong Southampton side featuring

the likes of Gareth Bale, Adam Lallana and Theo Walcott. Has proved himself to be an energetic midfielder and joined the Trotters from Millwall in July 2014.

#### JAY SPEARING



The midfielder was named Bolton's Player of the Month for August following an impressive start to the 2016/17

campaign. Has been with the Trotters since August after leaving boyhood club Liverpool. Made his Liverpool debut against PSV Eindhoven in the Champions League in December 2008.

#### SAMMY AMEOBI



The pacey winger is the brother of former Newcastle United striker Shola, and progressed

through the ranks with the Magpies before making his debut for the club in May 2011. Has pace to burn and boasts plenty of natural ability. Joined Bolton in August 2016.

#### ZACH CLOUGH



The highlyrated striker has decided to remain with Bolton despite attracting interest from a number of clubs



# **MANAGER**

PHIL PARKINSON

With Bolton looking for an experienced figure to help steady the ship, Parkinson was the man chosen to usher in a new era at the Macron Stadium.

The former Bradford City boss put pen to paper on a two-year contract with the Trotters in early June and has been tasked with guiding his new club back to the Championship at the first time of asking.

As a player, Parkinson spent the majority of his career with Reading after making his Football League debut for Bury in 1988. The former Leeds United trainee then signed for the Royals for a fee of £50,000 in July 1992.

The 48-year-old enjoyed unprecedented success during his time with Reading and was named the club's Player of the Season two years in a row from 1997 to 1999. The former midfielder was also a key member of the 1993-94 Football League Second Division Championship-winning team.

Parkinson then captained Reading to promotion from the Second Division in 2001-02 and capped off a memorable season with his testimonial game at the Madejski Stadium, which was attended by 20,000 fans. Parkinson is regarded as a Royals legend and was voted as one of the club's best-ever central midfielders with 60.3% of the votes.

After leaving Reading in early 2003, Parkinson began his managerial career with Colchester United and led the U's to safety. And Colchester went from strength to strength under the guidance of the former midfielder, achieving an unlikely promotion to the Championship at the end of the 2005-06 season.

Spells with Hull City and Charlton Athletic followed before Parkinson took over the reins at Bradford City in August 2011. During his time with the Bantams, Parkinson was best known for leading the club to the 2013 League Cup Final at Wembley against Swansea City – becoming the first-ever manager to take an English fourth-tier team to the final of a major cup competition at Wembley.

Parkinson then guided Bradford to promotion to League One via the League Two play-offs that same season, before masterminding an outstanding 4-2 victory over a strong Chelsea side in the FA Cup in January 2015.


The ex-Robin will be inducted into the club's Hall of Fame and will be presented with a special club tie on the hallowed turf at SN1 prior to kick-off today.











Let's go back to Tuesday night now and what an evening it was for you! Just talk us through what was going through your mind prior to the penalty shootout?




And obviously I was buzzing with the end result.








### **IDEAN THORNTON**

### ON THIS DAY:

### 8 OCTOBER

### 1910

After losing 15 out of their first 16 visits to Southampton, Town went five unbeaten with a convincing 4-0 win at The Dell. England international Harold Fleming hit a brace, Freddy Wheatcroft and Bob Jefferson netting the others.

### 1927

Swindon travelled to Penydarren Park at Merthyr in Division Three South. 5-1 behind at the break, the visitors went down 8-2 - a scoreline that would represent the Welsh club's highest goal tally during their brief League history.

### 1955

Geoff Fox made his debut for Town the day after signing on as player-coach on a part-time basis. There was no manager at The County Ground at the time - and there had not been one for the past six months, since Maurice Lindley's contract was not renewed. Exeter's 1-0 win consigned Fox's new club to a fourth home defeat of the season.

### 1985

Trailing by a single goal following a League Cup Second Round first leg tie at Roker Park, Swindon went 4-2 in arrears just before half-time in the home leg. But they stormed back through Andy Rowland [58 mins] and an equaliser from Bryan Wade as full-time loomed. Wade struck again nine minutes into extratime to seal victory.

### 2000

Town recorded their last home win over neighbours Oxford - prior to Tuesday. A goal in each half from Alan Reeves and Guiliano Grazioli secured a 2-1 verdict. A 'double' was completed in March when Steve Robinson hit both goals in a 2-0 victory in the final encounter at the Manor Ground.


#### 2013

The last eight games played by Town on this date have all been at the County Ground. Three years ago when Plymouth were beaten 2-1 in the League Trophy - Ty Belford and Raphael Rossi-Branco were both making their senior debuts.

Facing a three-goal first leg deficit against top flight Saints, Town started off like a train. They forced four corners in the first six minutes - on their way to an impressive tally of 16 on the night. It took the visitors 87 minutes to force their only one!

Swindon should have pulled a goal back just 17 minutes in after Mark Wright had upended big Dave Bamber in the box. Chris Kamara's penalty was placed wide of Shilton, but unfortunately also wide of the upright.

Kamara beat the keeper again on the half hour when his fierce shot went closer than the spot kick, but glanced off the same post to safety.

At half-time, Lou Macari switched from the usual 4-3-3 to a 4-2-4 formation. Centre-back Tim Parkin had to go off with a rib injury, Dave Hockaday plugging the gap and Bryan Wade coming on up front.

However it was more of the same from Town, with

Kamara stinging Shilton's palms in the opening minute of the half before the England keeper clawed away a Bamber effort just after the hour. A minute later, Wade was denied when his shot was deflected past Shilton but Gerry Forrest cleared off the line.

With twenty minutes to go, the visitors had another amazing escape. Shilton was beaten again when a Bamber header thudded against the bar, the ball rebounding to Wade who smashed it back in, only to see it rebound off the legs of the fortunate Forrest once more.

But the Town tidal wave just kept coming towards Shilton, who somehow got a touch on a shot from Bamber from point blank range three minutes later.

Steve White came on for Peter Coyne with ten minutes left and it was soon his turn to terrorise the Saints defence and his shot on the run flew past the keeper, only to thump against the underside of the bar and clear.


The visitors' only effort of note came just prior to that, when Colin Clarke forced Fraser Digby to save.

It was said that the Town stopper had so little to do, he should have been charged for admission! Lou Macari summed up the night's events by calling it 'a nil-nil annihilation'.

On his way to a career best 11 goals for the season, Chris hit four between Christmas and New Year - with a brace coming in a storming encounter against Oxford

at the Manor, where Town came back from a three-goal deficit at the interval!

Former Town defender Frank Burrows took him back to Portsmouth, but he was re-signed by Lou Macari during the first week of the Fourth Division title-winning campaign. Chris missed the first half of the season through injury but was influential as the club then went on a 21-game unbeaten run. And he missed just four games as Town completed a second successive promotion.




### DISABILITY MATCH AGAINST NORTHAMPTON



Just over five years later, a trip to Wembley was the prize in the Coca-Cola Cup semi-final. Setting off early for radio coverage, we'd already arrived at Burnden Park when the second leg was postponed...so much excitement & expectation eventually evaporated.


Almost two decades ago, another match lingers long in the memory, because of the 'media circus' surrounding it - Swindon suffered a heavy away defeat, 7(seven)-0 my colleague Stuart Mac began crying during his full-time report, his tears were compared to Gazza at Italia '90! "And finally"...thank you for your interest in my recent "Oldham adventure", lost between commentary-box and touchline at full-time but privileged to describe that 17-pass early contender for "team goal of the season", scored by Jon Obika - remember BBC Wiltshire brings you every game & every goal throughout the 2016/17 campaign - here's to a charge up the table, gaining momentum from the EFL Trophy victory over Oxford here on Tuesday - well played Will Henry (and his mum, a proud parent indeed after the penalty shootout)!




