The Dale have surprised many with their start to the 2016/17 campaign and will look to continue their rise up the Sky Bet League One table with victory at SN1 this evening.

Since Keith Hill's return to Spotland in 2013, Rochdale have enjoyed a bucket load of success after returning to the third tier of English football in 2014 and are now looking to push on after cementing their place in the division.

It has been a season to remember for the Dale so far and they come into tonight's game having won seven on the bounce in all competitions. Their current form is a far cry from the start of the term where they were without a victory in their opening seven league fixtures, drawing three and losing four.

However, a 2-1 victory at home to Fleetwood Town proved to be a catalyst with Rochdale yet to drop a point since that win on September 17th. That impressive run has included superb successes over Milwall, Charlton Athletic and local rivals Bolton Wanderers.

Date were fairly quiet in the summer transfer window but were quick to add a mixture of experience and youth to their squad, recruiting the likes of Niall Canavan, Oliver Rathbone, Conrad Logan and Sleve Davies.

There have been 30 goals shared between Rochdale and Town in seven meetings since 2010 and tonight's visitors will be hoping to continue their solid start to 2016/17 with yet another victory.



DANGERMAN

IAN HENDERSOND

R&W TAKES A CLOSER LOOK AT ONE OF ROCHDALE'S DANGERMEN THIS EVENING...

The striker has been with Rochdale since 2013 after bringing his time with Colchester United to an end. Starting his career with Norwich City, the 31-year-old made almost 80 first-team appearances for the Canaries, scoring six goals, before joining forces with Northampton Town in July 2007 following a short stint with Rotherham United.

He then sealed a move to Luton Town before heading to Turkey to ply his trade for Ankaragucu, but it wasn't long before the attacker was back in England after re-joining Colchester. Henderson bagged 11 goals for the U's during the 2010/11 campaign, including strikes home and away against the Dale, before being lured to Spotland in 2013. Became a pivotal figure in Rochdale's promotion to League One in 2013/14, scoring a string of stunning strikes.

He then enjoyed a vintage 2014/15 season after bagging 22 goals to help Rochdale secure their highest-ever league finish. Signed a new contract to keep him at the club until 2018 last term and has started the 2016/17 campaign in fine form, leading Dale in scoring with six goals.

MEET THE REST...

STEVE COLLIS

Joined Dale in January 2013 on noncontract terms before penning a new deal that saw him double-up as the club's goalkeeping coach. Has played for a host of clubs, including Barnet, Nottingham Forest, Yeovil Town and Southend United.

CONRAD LOGAN

The former Leicester City youngster arrived at the Crown Oil Arena in August after spending a successful loan spell with the club during the 2014/15 campaign. Spent 11 years at the King Power Stadium and helped Scottish side Hibernian reached the Scottish Cup Final.

HARRISON MCGAHEY

A summer signing for the Dale after leaving Sheffield United in June 2016, a club he had been with since 2014. Has also represented Blackpool and Tranmere Rovers.

OLLIE RATHBONE

The young talent was released by Manchester United in the summer before putting pen to paper on a deal with Rochdale. Made his debut for the club in the Checkatrade Trophy against Notts County.

SCOTT TANSER

In his third season as a professional having progressed through the ranks at the Crown Oil Arena. The 21-year-old made his debut for Dale as a substitute against Plymouth Argyle on the final day of the 2012/13 campaign and has made just short of 50 appearances for the club.

JAMES HOOPER

Another product of the club's Academy, the striker penned his

first professional deal in June 2015 and made his senior debut from the bench in Rochdale's 2-0 defeat at Gillingham five months later. Currently out on loan at FC United.

ANDY CANNON

Highly-rated at the Crown Oil Arena, the 20-year-old midfielder has become an important figure for the first-team and scored his first Rochdale goal in the 3-2 defeat to Peterborough United on the opening day of the 2016/17 campaign, before notching his second goal just days later against Chesterfield.

SANMI ODELUSI

The young striker is on a seasonlong loan at the Crown Oil Arena from Championship outfit, Wigan Athletic. Joined the Latics from Bolton in July 2015 but endured a frustrating first season at the DW Stadium with injury hampering his progress.

JOSH LILLIS



After arriving at the Crown Oil Arena from Scunthorpe United in May 2012, the stopper has became an instrumental

figure for Dale. Made his 200th appearance for the club in = September 2016 - a figure exceeded by only four other goalkeepers in Rochdale's history.

JOE RAFFERTY



Joined Rochdale on a free transfer from Premier League outfit Liverpool in July 2012 and has now racked up over a century of

games for the club. Once skippered Liverpool's U18s side and is comfortable playing either as a defender or as a midfielder.

JIM MCNULTY



The experienced defender was Dale's only everpresent last season and his consistency saw him rewarded with a new contract that will

keep him at the Crown Oil Arena until the summer of 2018. Did not start playing league football until 2006 but has a number of promotions under his belt.

NIALL CANAVAN



Penned a twoyear deal with Rochdale in May 2016 following a successful loan spell with the club at the tail end of last season. Was

previously with Scunthorpe United for whom he made over 150 appearances for. Has featured in 16 games for Dale so far this term, more than any other player at the club.

PETER VINCENTI



An experienced campaigner at this level, the midfielder has become a vital figure for Dale and scored 16 goals in 2014/15 to help steer the

club to their best-ever league finish. Has also represented the likes of Millwall, Aldershot and Stevenage.

MATTY LUND



The midfielder joined forces with Rochdale in July 2013 after being released by Premier League club Stoke City. Scored nine

goals to help Dale win promotion during the 2013/14 campaign and has represented Northern Ireland at U21 level.

CALLUM CAMPS



Highly-rated by Dale, the young talent has risen through the ranks at the Crown Oil Arena and first featured for the first-team

during the 2012/13 season. Has represented Northern Ireland at U21 level and is contracted with Rochdale until 2017.

KEITH KEANE



The hugely experienced midfielder joined Dale on loan from Cambridge United in the summer transfer window until January. Able to

play in a variety of positions in defence as well as midfield, Kean racked up 277 games for Luton Town over nine years before joining Preston in 2013. Has also had spells with Crawley and Stevenage.

NATHANIEL MENDEZ-LAING



Been with Dale since the 2015/16 campaign and notched ten goals last season, exploits that saw his contract extended in May.

Started his career with Wolverhampton Wanderers and has featured for Peterborough United, Sheffield United, Portsmouth, Shrewsbury Town and Cambridge United. Scored a hat-trick against Town in the FA Cup last term.

CALVIN ANDREW



Signed a twoyear contract at the Crown Oil Arena in July 2014, a deal which has since been extended by a further 12 months.

Andrew has become somewhat of a Football League journeyman and has amassed spells with the likes of Luton, Grimsby, Bristol City, Crystal Palace, Millwall and Swindon.

DONAL MCDERMOTT



A graduate of the Manchester City Academy, the attacker left Eastlands in 2011 having had spells on loan at MK Dons, Chesterfield.

Scunthorpe United and Bournemouth. After stints with a string of other clubs, McDermott joined Rochdale in May 2015 and has three assists to his name so far this term.

STEVEN DAVIES



A new signing at the Crown Oil Arena having penned a one-year deal with Dale in the summer following his departure from Bradford

City. Offering a physical presence wherever he has plied his trade, the striker has played for the likes of Tranmere Rovers, Derby County, Bristol City, Blackpool and Sheffield United.

KEITH HILL

In his second spell as manager at Crown Oil Arena, Hill has overseen plenty of memorable moments with the Dale in recent seasons.

Not only is he a hugely popular figure with Rochdale fans now but the 47-year-old was also a firm fans' favourite during his playing days at the club.

Beginning his career with Blackburn Rovers in the late 1980s, the defender made over 100 appearances at Ewood Park before sealing a move to Plymouth Argyle in September 1992. After spending four years down south, Hill moved back up north to sign for Rochdale under Graham Barrow.

Hill become a cult hero during his five season stay at the Crown Oil Arena thanks to his no-nonsense style of defending. After racking up just shy of 200 games for Dale, the defender spent spells with Cheltenham Town, Wrexham and Morecambe before bringing down the curtain on his playing days.

A return to Rochdale then beckoned with Hill being given the task of

working with the club's youth players, but it wasn't long before he was trusted with first-team matters after being asked to step into the breach in December 2006 on a temporary basis following the sacking of Steve Parkin.

However, Hill was soon handed the gig permanently and awarded a three-year contract after leading Dale from the relegation zone into the top half of League Two. He would then take Dale to two Play-Off Finals before succeeding at the third time of asking, securing the third and final automatic promotion spot at the end of the 2009/10 campaign.

Rochdale's success only continued as they enjoyed a memorable first season back in League One, equalling their best-ever league placing since regional football was abolished and recording a stunning league double over League One powerhouses, Southampton.

Those achievements didn't go unnoticed and Hill was snapped up by Barnsley following the culmination of the 2010/11 season, but a return to Spotland soon followed after Hill was sacked by the Tykes in December 2012.

And that reunion has proved to be a successful one with Hill guiding Dale back to League One in 2014, before masterminding a superb run to the Fourth Round of the FA Cup during the 2013/14 campaign, beating Championship outfit Leeds United in the process.

Hill also took Rochdale to the Fourth Round of the FA Cup the following season in addition to just missing out on the Play-Offs in League One, setting a new club record by securing an impressive eighth placed finish.

John, we're in the middle of October now so how have you adapted to life in Swindon so far on and off the field?

Very well I think. I'm really enjoying it so far and the challenges that it brings and off the field it has been fine too. I'm living in Swindon now and I'm enjoying that and everyone that I have spoken to around the club and around the place has been very positive.

Everybody has been very welcoming so it has made it quite easy for me.

You arrived at SN1 from Woking in the summer following a few years in non-league, so how have you found that step up into professional football?

When I knew I had signed for Swindon I was very excited and I had a lot of belief in my own ability that I would be able to make the step up. My performances have been pretty good but there are things that I need to adapt to and get used to.

That's only natural and coming back into full-time football takes a while to get used to. Coming into a new club and playing with different and new players takes a bit of time to gel as well, but it has all been positive and there are no concerns from me.

What have been the biggest differences for you in regards to playing in non-league and now plying your trade in League One?

The standard is noticeably different and the professionalism of the teams – they are much more organised. You look at the Conference and there were some really good players that played in that league and some good sides, but as you get higher up the leagues teams are much more organised, they are much more well-drilled and a lot more work gets put into the finer details in matches, which you probably don't get in the Conference.

From a personal point of view, when I was a part-time player I tried to treat myself as a fulltime player anyway so I would have a routine and do my own work individually. I would go to the gym, train with my club and it is an unrelenting fixture list in the Conference like it is in League One, so you would be playing all the time.

But there has not been too much of a transition so I think that has helped me and I'm just enjoying it. I love the chance to come and play football every day and once you drop out of that and go into non-league you tend to appreciate it more.

The fans have really taken to you at The County Ground and you opened your account for the club earlier this month – how have you rated your start to life as a Town player?

My start has been positive but it is one to build on. I think I can do better, I know that, and I have gained belief in the fact that I can play at this level and do well.

There are areas of my game that I would like to work on and get better at. I scored but I would have liked to have had a couple more by now, I've had chances but I've not been able to put them away. I'm getting into good areas which is important and I think any player would tell you that it is great to have the fans' backing. I'll be trying to play football to entertain the fans and try to please them through hard work and the ability I have.

The club's style of play really seems to suit you down to the ground too...

I'm a footballer and I like to have the ball at my feet and show what I can do with it. The style of play was a massive factor in why I wanted to play for Swindon because I think I fit into it well.

We're working on it at the moment because the results haven't been so positive but we're a realistic group and we know we need to tweak a few things and change a few things to change the results around.


But, like I said, I'm really enjoying playing at the minute and hopefully once the results turn round it will make the place a bit more positive.


We've got full confidence and the management have as well. We do


the right things and we work hard every day and we always try to go out there and get the three points.

You saw it with Leicester City winning the Premier League, it is an all-round package that you need to do on a gameday and there are a couple of areas that we need to do a little better in.

We know plenty of young footballers like to unwind and play video games like FIFA 17 during their down time, but you are very active with your own Football Academy, Core Football Coaching. How did you get involved in that side of football?







It was just through the love of football really. When I went part-time I started coaching and started my own coaching business, which works with schools and kids in Surrey and Berkshire. We've got an Academy in Reading where we try to develop gifted players and then try and offer them a pathway into clubs. We're playing Swindon in a couple of weeks so maybe a couple of the kids could get spotted by Swindon, which would be great.

It keeps me busy, it is something I love, I've done my B license and I see it as something I enjoy.

I wanted to do something that involved football. Working with kids is great and when I'm not playing football I'll be watching football or talking about football, so I definitely see myself coaching at some point.

On to tonight's visitors and Rochdale are flying at the moment. Just how tough a test will this evening's game be?

It is going to be tough. We've already watched them a little bit and done some work on the opposition, like we always do. We know it is going to be a tough game, they play a bit like how Northampton played here a few weeks ago and we are going to have to be at our best to get a result.

There is no reason why we can't and we need to get back to The County Ground being a bit of a fortress. Hopefully tonight can be the start of that.



Town's Head Groundsman, Marcus Cassidy has had his work cut out in recent weeks to keep the pristine County Ground playing surface in perfect condition following a gruelling playing schedule...



After tonight's game and Saturday's game against Walsall we would have played eight home games in the space of five and a half weeks.

Now the weather is changing the grass growth slows down so it is pretty much about getting your preparation right, your timings right and getting your repair done straight after a game. What we do in-between games is make sure the fertiliser is on the pitch when it needs to be because that keeps it healthy and strong.

We have a massive aeration programme which is getting air into the soil and it helps the drainage, so luckily the club gave me a good budget for fertilising and aeration and that helps to keep the pitch nice and strong when we've got a busy period of games.

The pitch does stay in good condition. We do have the odd problem with it but I'm well aware that the pitch has to be good so there is pressure on me to produce. It keeps me on my toes and I'm not going to rest on my laurels. If the management or the Chairman feel the pitch hasn't performed, then they are the first to tell me.

I'm a big believer in not doing too much because you can actually overwork a pitch. If you go out there and keep rolling it then you are just compacting it, so the key is to get on there when the time is right.

There is no point in going out there if we haven't got a game in two weeks and just rolling the hell out of it because it is just going to have a negative effect, so it is all down to timings.

1902

Swindon progressed to the third qualifying round of the FA Cup with a comfortable 5-0 win over Chippenham Town. Despite the defeat, visiting keeper Fred 'Tich' Hemmings - he stood just 5'7" - gave such an impressive performance that he was signed by manager Sam Allen straight after the game.

1924

Town recorded a sixth successive home win and fourth clean sheet with a 4-0 victory against Bournemouth. Bertie Davies 2, Jack Johnson and Arthur Ruddlesdin were the successful marksmen.

1958

The top tier - the seated section - of the then new Shrivenham Road stand was opened for the first time. Previously at the Rushmoor Arena in Aldershot, the new structure added 1,421 to the seating capacity at the County Ground. The seats in the centre block could be purchased for six shillings [30p!]

1980


John Trollope made his 765th League appearance for Town, breaking the one-club record held by Jimmy Dickinson of Portsmouth. Carlisle were the visitors who forced a 1-1 draw at the County Ground.

1990


Argentine international Nestor Lorenzo, who had played in the 1990 World Cup final in Italy, was signed by his fellow countryman Ossie Ardiles on a loan deal from AS Bari. The move was completed just before Christmas.

2005

Then non-League Stevenage Borough arrived at the County Ground in the League Trophy. Just 1,771 turned up to see Rory Fallon give Town a fourthminute lead. Watford loanee Hamer Bouazza added a second eight minutes into the second-half.

The visitors were unable to muster an effort on goal until the 35th minute, when Bob Bloomer fired over after being put through by former Swindon loanee Dave Caldwell.

But Town's response to that was immediate when a 'route one' move initiated by Digby was finished when Leigh Barnard fired home from Bamber's knock down.

When Barnard was upended by the keeper soon after the interval, Bamber was handed the chance to net a third to virtually seal victory for his side. But his spot kick was too close to the diving Marples. Bamber had a second bite when the ball came back to him, but he struck the rebound against the bar and the Spireites were let off the hook.



A 6'3" striker, Dave came into professional football after graduating from Leicester University with a degree in economics. Arriving at the County Ground initially on loan, he failed to score in his first ten outings. But on his return he wasted little time in grabbing eight in just 13 appearances.

The 1986/87 campaign saw Dave net ten League goals plus another ten in Cup competitions as Town made another step up:

He hit a further 17 goals during his third and final season in Wiltshire, before joining the Hornets. The fee was decided by a tribunal and, although the £105,000 was much less than expected, it still worked out at almost seven times the amount paid to sign him!

At time of writing we're just coming out of a very bad run of results, and morale is very low within the fan base.


Of course we've seen these bad times come and go previously so it's important that supporters stick together and try and bring about a positive outcome in the coming crucial weeks.

It has been a very busy time at the Academy in recent weeks. The Day Release Programme has been going really well with our current U12s, U13s, U14s and U15s.







Swindon Town Football in the Community Trust launches New Disability Football project

Disability football in Swindon has received a major boost following the announcement of more than £1m in grants to EFL club community trusts up and down the country including Swindon Town Football in the Community Trust.

The "Every Player Counts" programme is funded by the Wembley National Stadium Trust (WNST) and administered by the EFL Trust. STFITC Trust are one of 25 clubs that been selected to run the programme.

Mike Evans Director of Operations, at the EFL Trust, said: "The strength of this innovative partnership with WNST is that, rather than having some general national goals, it targets specific local needs. The unique positioning of EFL clubs and their community trusts at the heart of their communities, provide a strong understanding of what is needed to deliver a project that makes a difference to local people."

The WNST trustees have awarded 23 grants, totalling £1,070,450 over three years, benefitting 25 clubs around England (one grant covers the three clubs in Nottinghamshire). These clubs cover the length and breadth of the country, from Plymouth to Carlisle and Southend to Shrewsbury and are located in a mixture of built-up metropolitan boroughs and more rural locations – all aimed at giving the programme as wide a focus as possible.

The grants awarded reflects this diversity of need. A number of clubs will be involved in developing new impairment specific projects focusing on for example, autism, mental health, learning disabilities, amputees or powerchair football. Some will be expanding their pan-disability football offer in new locations or with new audiences. Others will be using their skills and experience support local grassroots community clubs to develop their own in-house disability football capacity.

The over-riding aim of the scheme is to increase the amount of disabled people participating in football, breaking down the barriers that have prevented them from doing so. Since the London 2012 Paralympics, we have seen a major increase in the number of disabled people playing sport or wanting to do so. This programme builds on previous work at both WNST and EFL Trust and will continue the expansion of the opportunities available to disabled people to get involved.

It is not a 'talent pathway' programme - that is rightly the responsibility of the FA and the other governing bodies overseeing disability football. Of course, if one of the projects discovers a future international or Paralympian, that would be a great achievement, but it is not a required indicator of success. Nevertheless, it is a key consideration for each club. that anyone getting involved in playing through one of these funded projects has a clear exit route to continue their football experience if that is what they want - whether it is just for fun,

To which I say, I try not to live in the 1970's, and neither should some members of the football media industry, who appear to be somewhat confused by or resistant to concepts of change and transition.

Managerial stability is quite capable of allowing things to deteriorate further, as anyone who watched the last two months of Steve McMahon's later seasons in charge will know. In short, why have Nigel Adkins when Mauricio Pochettino is available? Or, at the other end, when will this man you've based your entire existence on receive a higher calling? [I'm looking at you, AFC Bournemouth.]

If you've read the book "The Numbers Game", the authors came to the conclusion that the result of any one match is around 50 percent dictated by luck. When, on Match of the Day 2, it was asked (apparently with some degree of seriousness) whether or not Manchester City were in





He speaks his mind (always welcome) and has done excellent things for Rochdale in two spells. You'd have to be incredibly mean spirited not to wish them well (apart from their two league fixtures with Swindon of course), and tonight will be a challenge.






