
time, so the way Tom handled himself and went about his business was very, very impressive.

CDANNY HYLTON

R&W TAKES A CLOSER LOOK AT ONE OF LUTON TOWN'S DANGERMENTHIS EVENING...

The forward signed for the Hatters in the summer, penning a two-year deal after leaving Oxford United following the expiration of his contract. He scored on his debut in a 3-0 win against Plymouth Argyle on August 6th 2016, before going on to bag a superb hat-trick against Wycombe Wanderers the following month.

Hylton began his career with Aldershot Town and was part of the team that won the Conference Premier Title and the Conference League Cup. A move to Rotherham United followed in June 2013 but the move didn't work out for the 27-year-old who was soon shipped out on loan to Bury and AFC Wimbledon.

He was then transfer-listed by the Millers at the end of the 2013/14 campaign and joined League Two outfit Oxford United in June 2014, finishing as the Yellows' top goalscorer with 16 goals in all competitions at the end of the 2014/15 season.

Hylton has been in fine form for Luton so far this term and leads the club in scoring with twelve goals to his name.

MANAGER

NATHAN JONES

THE FORMER DEFENDER TOOK CHARGE OF THE HATTERS IN JANUARY 2016, PUTTING PEN TO PAPER ON A TWO-AND-A-HALF-YEAR DEAL WITH THE LEAGUE TWO CLUB.


Jones began his career with Welsh outfit Merthyr Tydfil, before sealing a £10,000 move to Luton in the summer of 1995. A spell in Spain with Numancia and CD Badajoz followed before the defender returned to these shores with Southend United.

Stints with Exeter City and Scarborough came next before Jones went on to enjoy hugely successful spells with both Brighton and Hove Albion and Yeovil Town, for whom he made

over 150 appearances for both clubs.

After hanging up his boots, Jones became Assistant Manager and then First-Team Coach at Yeovil before taking up a U21 Professional Development Coach role at Charlton Athletic. After leaving the Addicks, Jones became Assistant Head Coach at Brighton and Hove Albion in July 2013, becoming First-Team Coach following the arrival of Sami Hyypia as the Seagulls' new manager.

Spent a short spell as Caretaker Boss of Brighton before reverting back to Assistant Manager and then First-Team Coach. Jones has led Luton to the play-off places in League Two this season.



CHRISTIAN WALTON



The goalkeeper began his career with Plymouth Argyle in 2005 before joining Brighton & Hove Albion, where he completed his scholarship

before signing a three-year professional contract in the summer of 2013. Made his debut for the Seagulls against Tottenham Hotspur in October 2014. Currently on a season-long loan at Luton Town.

SCOTT CUTHBERT



Hugely experienced defender has been on the books at Luton since May 2015. Began his career with Celtic in his native Scotland before having loan spells with

Livingston and St Mirren. Joined Swindon Town in July 2009 and would later become the Reds' Vice-Captain. After leaving SN1 the defender joined Leyton Orient before sealing a move to Luton, where he is currently the Club Captain.

JOHNNY MULLINS



Joined Luton in May 2016 after bringing his lengthy association with Oxford United to an end, for whom he made over a century of appearances Helped the Yellows

gain promotion to League One last season and also captained the club at Wembley in the 2016 Football League Trophy Final Mullins graduated from Staffordshire University in 2008 with a degree in Professional Sports Writing and Broadcasting.

OLLY LEE



Signed professional terms with West Ham United in 2009 but failed to make the grade at Upton Park and spent spells on loan

at Dagenham & Redbridge and Gillingham before being released by the Premier League outfit. Then had stints with Barnet and Birmingham City before joining Luton in August

CAMERON MCGEEHAN



Has been at Luton since 2014 after originally joining the club on loan from Norwich City, where he captained the Canaries' U18s side to glory in the 2012/13 FA Youth

Cup, scoring in both both legs of the final against former club Chelsea. Signed a permanent deal with the Hatters in July 2015 and has been a key figure ever since, scoring 14 goals last term to win the club's Young Player of the Season Award.

ISAAC VASSELL



Penned a onevear deal with the Hatters in the summer following a successful trial spell with the club. Began his career with

Plymouth Argyle in 2011 before being sent out on loan to Truro City, Bideford and Weymouth, Joined Truro on a permanent deal after being let go by Plymouth at the end of the 2013/14 season.

The talented attacker has enjoyed a campaign to remember so far and has impressed in this competition in particular.

"Individually it has been a massive part of my season because I've started every game bar one and it is good to get a lot of game time," he told R&W.
