Both Michael Doughty and Darnell Furlong were called back by parent club QPR in the wake of Town's 0-0 draw with Southend United on Monday.



The pair joined the Reds on season-long loan deals in the summer but will now link back-up with the R's for the second-half of the 2016/17 campaign.

Doughty was in his second spell with Town having enjoyed a short stint at SNT last season, and the midfielder made another big impact this term having contributed three goals and four assists.

The 24-year-old was also involved in every goal the Robins had scored in the opening two months of the 2016/17 campaign.

Furlong, meanwhile, joined Town in August 2016 and went on to become a consistent performer for the Reds, notching two goals and three assists in 28 appearances this term.



Good afternoon and welcome to The County Ground for our first Saturday afternoon game of 2017.

Last year was an extremely frustrating year for everybody involved at the football club. Being Captain and a fan of the club I have grown up at since the age of 12, I completely understand the frustration towards us at the moment in time.

I was an avid Spurs supporter as a youngster and understand what it feels like to be part of an emotional rollercoaster every weekend, desperate for the team and club you love so much to do well. So it's with this in mind that I write these notes to you today.

2016 was a very tough year for me off the pitch. I lost numerous people close to me for all sorts of different reasons and I was extremely grateful to see the back of it. However, every experience offers lessons and if I learnt anything from last year it's that when things get tough, we're stronger together than when we are alone.

I believe this applies to this football club as well. Everybody associated with Swindon Town wants the best for this team. If we're going to move forward we need to be united as one. I can appreciate we all show our loyalty in different ways, but if we can support this club together, we will achieve a lot more than if we don't.

Results have been way below the standard we expect and after tweaking and tinkering with different options, there isn't a straightforward answer for that. At this club, we have the raw ingredients for a young, successful team that should be able to dominate League One, we just haven't found the right recipe to bring those components all together.

Take for example our coaching team. I will happily go on record to say that they are the best I have worked with – and we all know I've worked with some big characters at this club.

Take Luke Williams. His knowledge of the game is second to none and, while he may not be the A-lister fans are looking for, I can assure you as players we are extremely lucky to have him by our side. You will only need to speak to players past and present to hear just how fantastic he is and how you will find it hard to find a better coach.

Supporting him, we have some of the hardest working staff in Ross Embleton,

Mike Cooper, Dean Thornton, Paul Godfrey, Alex Seager and Mark Webb, who never get the credit they deserve, as those on the outside simply don't see the work they put in.

And now we have Tim Sherwood as our Director of Football. He's a man who needs no introduction as his name speaks for itself. His experience of top flight football and his track record with nurturing some of our country's brightest young talents in recent times means we are hugely lucky to have him at our club in League One.

I was disheartened to hear at the MK Dons game chants about Lee Power and heated arguments between our fans. We have a chairman who has invested his own money, saved this club from financial difficulty and is trying to implement a system which is sustainable for years to come at this club. In the world of football, that isn't sexy and what fans want to hear, but it's realistic and what needs to be done. It's easy to point the finger of blame at him but he hasn't changed the goalposts this year from previous years which has brought us success.

So where is it going wrong?

If I'm honest, the disappointment of 2016 lies at the feet of us – the players. Nobody else. We weren't simply good or consistent enough and our league position is evidence of that. With the transfer window now open players may find their position in jeopardy but that is football. We all have to take accountability for the part we've played on the pitch and whatever the outcome is for each of us, it's how we overcome it that is the measure of a player. I truly believe your best teacher is your last mistake and with this young group, they will have learned a lot and grown from the last 12 months.

So as cliché as it may sound, a New Year brings a new start and, although half of the season may have now passed, as Captain of a young team I will remain optimistic that it's still not too late.

► The Shrews have played at a total of **SIX** stadiums throughout their history.



The Shrews have struggled in the Sky Bet League One so far in 2016/17 and find themselves firmly in a relegation battle heading into the second-half of the season.

Having just retained their status in this division by the skin of their teeth last term, hopes were high around the New Meadow that the new campaign would be a much more enjoyable experience. However, it hasn't panned out that way and the Salop have got a lot of work to do if they want to avoid dropping back into League Two.

Plenty of work was done in the summer months to try and make the Shrews a competitive outfit with a number of players being recruited. The likes of Adam El-Abd, Gary Deegan and Jim O'Brien added some vital experience to the ranks, while talented striker Ivan Toney arrived on loan from Newcastle United.

However, the new faces were unable to help their team get off to a flying start this term and one league win in August set the tone for what was to come. In fact, the Shrews have only recorded five victories in the Sky Bet League One in 2016/17, including just two wins on the road, and that poor form has left them mired in the bottom four.

It has also been a far from stable campaign at the New Meadow after

Micky Mellon left the club in October 2016 to take over at non-league outfit Tranmere Rovers. Paul Hurst was the man to replace him and the former Grimsby boss has made a slight difference to Shrewsbury's situation, although there is still a lot of work to be done.

And their cause hasn't been helped this week with the news that joint top scorer Ivan Toney, who had helped himself to seven goals for the Salop, has returned to Newcastle United and looks set to head out on loan to another club. The Shrews have already strengthened in the winter window though, paying an undisclosed fee to prise centre-back Aristote Nsiala away from Hartlepool United.

Town have already locked horns with Shrewsbury once this season with the two sides playing out a 1-1 draw at the New Meadow back in October 2016, where an Ivan Toney strike cancelled out John Goddard's early effort for the Reds. With the two sides both battling at the wrong end of the table, this afternoon's game will act as a six-pointer for whoever can come out on top.



DANGERMAN LOUIS DODDS

R&W TAKES A CLOSER LOOK AT ONE OF SHREWSBURY TOWN'S DANGERMAN THIS AFTERNOON...

The Shrews pulled off a significant coup in the summer when they persuaded the striker to turn down a new contract at Port Vale in order to put pen to paper on a two-year deal at the New Meadow.

Born in Sheffield, the 30-year-old began his career with Leicester City and turned professional in 2006, before spending stints out on loan with the likes of Northwich Victoria, Rochdale and Lincoln City. He then turned down a new deal with the Foxes in order to join Port Vale in 2008, where he became a firm fans' favourite.

Scored seven goals in 36 matches to help fire the Valiants to promotion to League One during the 2012/13 campaign and finished last season with eight strikes in 44 games, form that saw him crowned the club's Away Travel Player of the Year. The creative force made over 280 appearances for Vale during eight years with the club, notching over 50 goals in the process.

Dodds has wasted little time in making an impression at his new club and leads Shrewsbury in scoring with seven goals to his name so far this term, while he has also contributed three assists to the cause.

MEET THE REST

MARK HALSTEAD

Joined the Shrews in June 2014 after parting company with Blackpool, his home town club. Represented the Tangerines on one occasion in the Premier League after coming on as a sub against Chelsea, but found first-team opportunities hard to come by at Bloomfield Road.

CALLUM BURTON

The young shotstopper first joined his boyhood club when he was still at school and has represented England at youth level, making his debut for England U16's in a 1-0 win against Spain before being capped at U17 and U18 level. Made his Shrews debut against Swindon on the final day of the 2015/16 campaign.

CALLUM GROGAN

The young defender captained Town's youth team last season and was offered a professional deal in the summer. Was released by Bolton Wanderers as

a youngster but was snapped up by Shrewsbury after impressing for the Liverpool FC Foundation College.

DOMINIC SMITH

First featured for Salop during the 2012/13 campaign just a few months after leaving school and has also represented Wales at U19 and U21 levels. Signed his first professional contract in March 2014 and enjoyed a breakout campaign in 2015/16, making 24 appearances in all competitions before penning a new two-year deal in March 2016.

JOE RILEY

Riley became Shrewsbury's eighth addition of the summer after arriving from Bury for an undisclosed fee, putting pen to paper on a two-year deal. The right-back began his career with Bolton Wanderers in 2011 before joining Bury in January 2015, scoring twice in 57 appearances.

SHAUN WHALLEY

Began his career at Norwich City's Academy before spending time in non-league and the lower reaches of the Football League with the likes of

Accrington Stanley, Wrexham, Southport and Droylsden. Secured a move to Luton Town and was part of the Hatters' side that won promotion from the Conference back into the Football League. Joined Shrewsbury last season and notched seven goals after Christmas.

ETHAN JONES

Highly-rated by the Shrews, the young striker has progressed through the ranks at the New Meadow and signed his first professional contract in October 2015 at the age of 17. Jones, who can also play as an attacking midfielder, was part of the Town youth team that reached the final of the Football League Youth Alliance Cup last season.

GEORGE WARING

The tall striker started his career with Premier League outfit Everton before leaving to join Stoke City as a 19-year-old. Waring scored 6 goals in 19 games during a fruitful loan spell for Barnsley in 2015, before helping fire Oxford United to promotion to League One last term. Currently on loan from Stoke,

JAYSON LEUTWILER

The stopper arrived from Middlesbrough in June 2014, becoming the first Switzerland born-player to join Shrewsbury. Began his career with Swiss giants FC Basel and has been capped by his country at U17, U18, U19 and U20 level, but has now opted to represent Canada at senior level. Enjoyed a stellar first season with the Shrews, breaking the club record for most clean sheets in a league season with 22.

OLIVER LANCASHIRE

Arrived at the New Meadow in the summer of 2016 after turning down the option of a new deal with Rochdale, where he was Club

Captain last season. Standing at 6'1, Lancashire is an imposing figure at the heart of the defence and has been a key figure for the Shrews having racked up 21 games so far.

MAT SADLER

The vastly experienced defender started his career with Birmingham City and featured in the Premier League, before earning a big money move to Watford. Joined the Shrews on loan in July 2010 and became a hit with the Town faithful. Has had spells with Walsall, Crawley and Rotherham before returning to Shrewsbury in 2015.

RYAN MCGIVERN

With versatility one of his biggest strengths, McGivern has been in demand throughout his career and was highly-rated at Manchester City. Has also featured for the likes of Leicester City, Crystal Palace, Bristol City, Hibernian and Port Vale, in addition to winning over twenty caps for Northern Ireland.

JUNIOR BROWN

Although a natural full-back, Brown can also play higher up the pitch and has done just that this season, helping himself to four goals and an assist. Plied his trade for FC Halifax Town and Northwich Victoria after being released by Crewe before joining Fleetwood Town, where he was a key figure in the club's dramatic rise up the football pyramid.

JACK GRIMMER

Returned to the Shrews from Fulham in the summer of 2016 for his third loan spell with the club. Helped Salop secure promotion and avoid relegation in his first two spells at the club and also scored a 96th minute winner against Sheffield Wednesday in the Fourth Round of the FA Cup to set up a dream tie with Manchester United last season.

ADAM EL-ABD

Shrewsbury pulled off quite a coup in the summer when they managed to persuade the 32-year-old to put pen to paper on a two-year deal. The defender is able

to boast bags of experience having made over 300 appearances for Brighton and Hove Albion, while he has also won seven caps for Egypt on the international stage. Was on loan at The County Ground for a chunk of the 2015/16 campaign.

IAN BLACK

The Scottish native turned pro with Blackburn Rovers but returned north of the border to join forces with Inverness CT in 2004, for whom he made over a century of appearances. ABU OGOGO

Moved to Arsenal after spending his youth days with Wimbledon and went on to rack up well over 230 games for Dagenham & Redbridge, becoming club captain in the process. Played most of his career at right-back but was moved into the centre of midfield after joining the Shrews last term, where he cleaned up at the club's End of Season Awards ceremony.

JIM O'BRIEN

Joined Motherwell in 2008 after making just one appearance for Celtic. Following a successful spell at Fir Park, the

attacking midfielder moved south of the border to join Barnsley and went on to feature for Coventry City and Scunthorpe before penning a two-year deal with Shrewsbury prior to the start of this season.

AJAY LEITCH-SMITH

The striker joined Crewe Alexandra at the age 7 and rose through the ranks of the club's fabled Academy before signing his first professional deal in 2008. Featured over 100 times for Crewe before having spells with Yeovil Town and Port Vale, notching 11 goals in 37 matches for the latter last season. Is the Shrews' second top goalscorer this term with five.

SYLVAN EBANKS-BLAKE

Once regarded as one of the EFL's best strikers, the frontman started his career with Manchester United and went on to hit 21 goals in 66 games for Plymouth Argyle. That form earned a £1.5million move to Wolves, where he notched 61 goals in 177 outings. Has since had spells with Ipswich, Preston and Chesterfield and joined the Shrews on loan in the summer.



MANAGER

PAUL HURST

The 42-year-old was announced as Shrewsbury Town's new manager in October 2016 and was immediately tasked with trying to guide the club away from the Sky Bet League One relegation zone.

Hurst left his post at Grimsby Town in order to move up a level having led the Mariners back to the Football League last season, leaving the side just outside the League Two play-off places on goal difference.

It wasn't that long ago that the former left-back was still lacing up his boots having only retired in 2008. Born in Sheffield, he began his career with Rotherham United in 1993 and went on to rack up nearly 500 appearances for the Millers, scoring on 13 occasions.

Hurst was a regular at left-back and was part of the Rotherham side that beat Shrewsbury Town 2-1 at Wembley to win the Football League Trophy in April 1996. The defender then put pen to paper on a new two-year contract in 2004 and went on to have a short spell on loan at Burton Albion towards the end of his career.

After parting company with the Millers after 15-years at the club at

the end of the 2007/08 season, Hurst hung up his boots and took joint charge of Northern Premier League outfit Ilkeston Town alongside Rob Scott in January 2009. The pair enjoyed great success having led the club from ninth to second in the league, before securing promotion to the Conference North via the play-offs.

The duo were soon on the move and made Boston United their next destination in May 2009. And, yet again, more success was to follow with Hurst and Scott overseeing a treble-winning campaign which included promotion to the Conference North and success in the Northern Premier League Challenge Cup.

But they opted to resign from their posts in March 2011 and were announced as the new management team of Grimsby Town the following morning. Still suffering a hangover in the wake of their relegation from

the Football League the previous season, the Mariners managed to salvage an 11th place spot come the end of the 2010/11 campaign.

Grimsby secured another 11th place finish the following season following a late collapse, before suffering defeat to Newport County in the play-off semi-finals during the 2012/13 season. Hurst was made sole manager of the club in January 2014 and he eventually achieved promotion with Town last year in the National League play-off final at Wembley after overseeing a 3-1 victory over Forest Green Rovers.

Hurst, who also has a degree in Professional Sports Writing and Broadcasting, has started to stamp his own mark on Shrewsbury and will be looking to bolster his squad this month as they attempt to climb out of the relegation zone and preserve their League One status.


You've played twenty-two games so far this season so that must be huge for your personal development to be getting so much regular first-team football, mustn't it?



1933

Town, four points off the bottom of Division Three South, made the short journey to second-placed Reading - where a first-half hat-trick from Jack Palethorpe saw the Elm Park men hand out a 7-1 thumping of the visitors.



1961

Brentford were the last League opponents on this date - 56 years ago! Without a win in their last eight league games, Swindon went ahead through Ernie Hunt on 15 minutes but conceded an equaliser with twelve minutes left.

1966

Town signed two players - wing-half Brian Richardson and winger Tommy Henderson who, at just 5'3", was one of the smallest to play league football for the club. Both made just a dozen first team appearances before departing within three weeks of each other in the July.



1995

Two goals in 12 second-half minutes against Isthmian League Marlow saw Swindon safely through to the Fourth Round of the Cup. Jan Age Fjortoft and Luc Nijholt were the scorers.



2012

Five years ago today, Town dumped the then Premier League side Wigan out of the FA Cup to reach the Fourth Round for the first time in 16 years. A near 14,000 crowd saw Paolo Di Canio's side come back from a goal down to go through. New signing Paul Benson came off the bench for the second-half to net a 76th minute winner.

Town were making their second visit of the season to Craven Cottage, having taken all three points with a 2-0 win there back in October.

Prior to this Third Round Cup tie, boss Lou Macari took the players away - to Grittleton House School north of Chippenham - following an Associate Members Cup defeat at Brentford on the Tuesday.



Swindon were full value for their win, with man of the match Dave Bamber and Steve White 'terrorising' the Londoners' defence all afternoon.



It took the Cottagers 37 minutes to mount their first attempt on target, but Fraser Digby was untroubled by Keith Oakes' effort.

And just a minute later, Town struck.


Bamber smashed an effort against the upright following good hold-up play from White and then Bamber's follow-up was blocked but earned his side a corner. Leigh Barnard swung over the corner and this time Bamber powered a header home from the edge of the area.

It could have been 3-0 by then, with John Vaughan making a fine save from Jimmy Quinn early on before a shot from White was kicked off the line by Wayne Kerrins.

As the game entered the closing stages, Town always looked likely to increase their lead rather than concede and John Marshall had to make a last-ditch clearance from the line to keep out another Bamber header.

Signed just 15 months after appearing for Albion in the 1983 FA Cup Final, Chris soon became a crowd favourite at The County Ground with his effort and energy.

Initially brought in on loan, his move was secured ten weeks later - despite those early days seeing him shown two red cards in his first six games!

Chris missed just three games the following season when Swindon strolled to the Fourth Division title in style.

His third and final campaign with Town saw him miss only one game prior to December, which was a suspension following a pre-season dismissal in Malta.

But an ankle injury then kept Chris out for five weeks and he struggled to hold down his first-team place. He made just one appearance of the final ten in the league and was frozen out of the play-offs.

Town are unbeaten in their last four league games at SN1 and Brophy is hoping to extend that run this afternoon by securing what would be a huge three points.


"Shrewsbury are a good team and they try to play football like we do and that makes for a more entertaining game for the fans," he added.





WITH JEREMY NEWTON

Nutty provides details on all the latest goings on from within Town's Academy...

The boys are back in and it has been nice to see them all following their little break over the Christmas break. The U18s have been back in this week and have been testing and making sure that they are ready to go for their game against Bristol Rovers today.

The Academy boys have got games this weekend where the U9's-U13's play Aldershot today, the U14's and U15's are going to Colchester on Sunday and the U11's, U12's and U13's are playing Wolves on Sunday. It is a busy weekend already and we've got some really good games coming up with fixtures against Arsenal across the board to look forward to at the end of the month - that will be a good test for everyone.



We are making sure we are ready to go to Holland in April and the Development Reviews are back up as well, so it has been a busy start to 2017 already. Every six weeks we have every player from the U13's upwards come in with their parents and we go through an evaluation of their last six weeks and look at setting them objectives for the following six weeks. It is


making sure that they achieve those objectives within the six weeks so that we can set them more objectives to enhance their development.

Where we don't want to be is having to re-evaluate those objectives because they haven't met them, so it is a case of sitting down together and making sure that the players' objectives are similar to the ones the coaches set themselves in order to make sure that they are achievable and realistic, otherwise there is no point in setting the objectives.

The next six-week block will see us change the system to a 4-3-3 and every six weeks the U13's through to the U18's change their system to increase their knowledge and challenge them as players. Sometimes it is hard because there will be an overload in certain areas but I don't want the coaches to change it, I want the coaches and the players to try and work out where they can relieve the pressure or maximise the pressure in their favour.

It is about enhancing the players' knowledge as well as the coaches' knowledge because if the players at Swindon's Academy are released at some point, then they have had a great understanding of playing in different systems and playing in different scenarios. That is going to benefit them in the long run.



their heads down and concentrate because there are reserve games coming up that some of them might be involved in.



It is all part of the learning curve and I hope they take that on with them for the rest of their careers.



We were also extremely privileged to be able to visit some local schools who work with children with physical and



The BBC Wiltshire Broadcaster this week reveals what springs to his mind when he thinks about today's opponents...

I tend to find it impossible to think about Shrewsbury without remembering the former Gay Meadow. There was basking on a sunny away terrace towards the end of the 1995/96 season as Town rounded off their Division Two title campaign with another win [via goals from Kevin Horlock and Shaun Taylor], plus other eclectic parts of the ground that gave it a charm of its own.

I always personally enjoyed the statue situated behind one end, permanently choosing to spurn the action and stare into the town centre instead. It was rather frustrating that no-one ever managed to hit it despite having seen errant shooting on more than one occasion.

While for visiting fans, the charm of such places, or the run-down state of Doncaster's Belle Vue, were a once a year novelty, the

reality of Shrewsbury's need to move was pretty evident when you would see the periodic pictures of flooding from the nearby river, and the challenge of converting it into an all-seater venue should the club ever get an extended Championship stay made the need for a move self-evident. The future has little room for sentiment.

Trying to take the feel from unique grounds into new homes is always a challenge, but the range of banners you get at the New Meadow is also satisfying. "Breathe on 'em Salop" is always one that stands out, along with the blue and amber colours, do all help to set Shrewsbury apart a little bit from their peers.

It's interesting that Scunthorpe already have plans to leave their Glandford Park home after a relatively short stay – it opened in 1988.




The move certainly doesn't seem to have done their ability to fight for a place in the Championship any harm, but it is a ground that lacks something to really define it as distinctively of Scunthorpe United, bar them getting a hatful of goals against Swindon on all too many recent occasions.

As for today's game, it's a reminder how the term "six pointer" is one that is used with relish and that it has yet to be confined to the FA Cup's big bin of "ironic" clichés.

The language of football is something that's taken on a rather strange life of its own. Terms go in and out of vogue. "Pressing" is very much in, while increasingly the concept of playing "between the lines", which I think has origins overseas, is now creeping into the lexicon, while the "win percentage" is now seen as a legitimate way to assess the ability of managers and coaches, despite the lack of contextual assistance.

I'm sure Swindon would just settle for it being a "three pointer" today, as it was at the end of last season.


