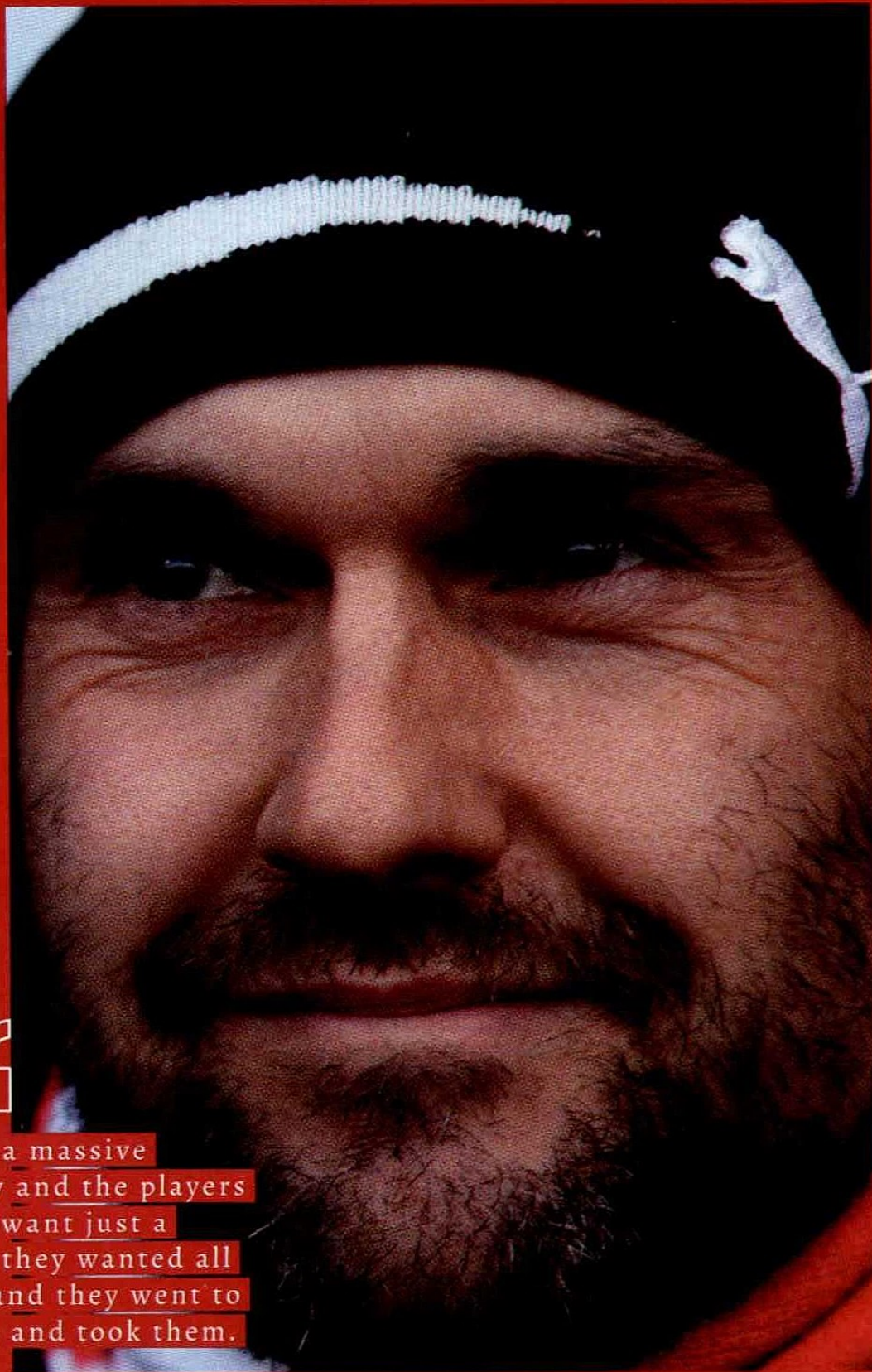

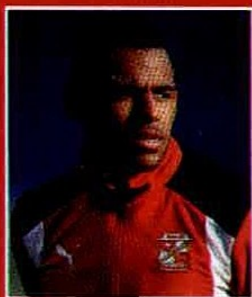

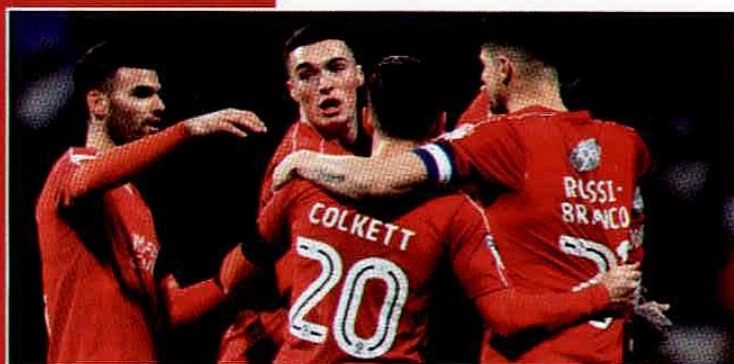

- ▶ United raked in **£5.5m** for star striker **Britt Assombalonga** in August 2014, a transfer which could eventually net Posh **£8m**.

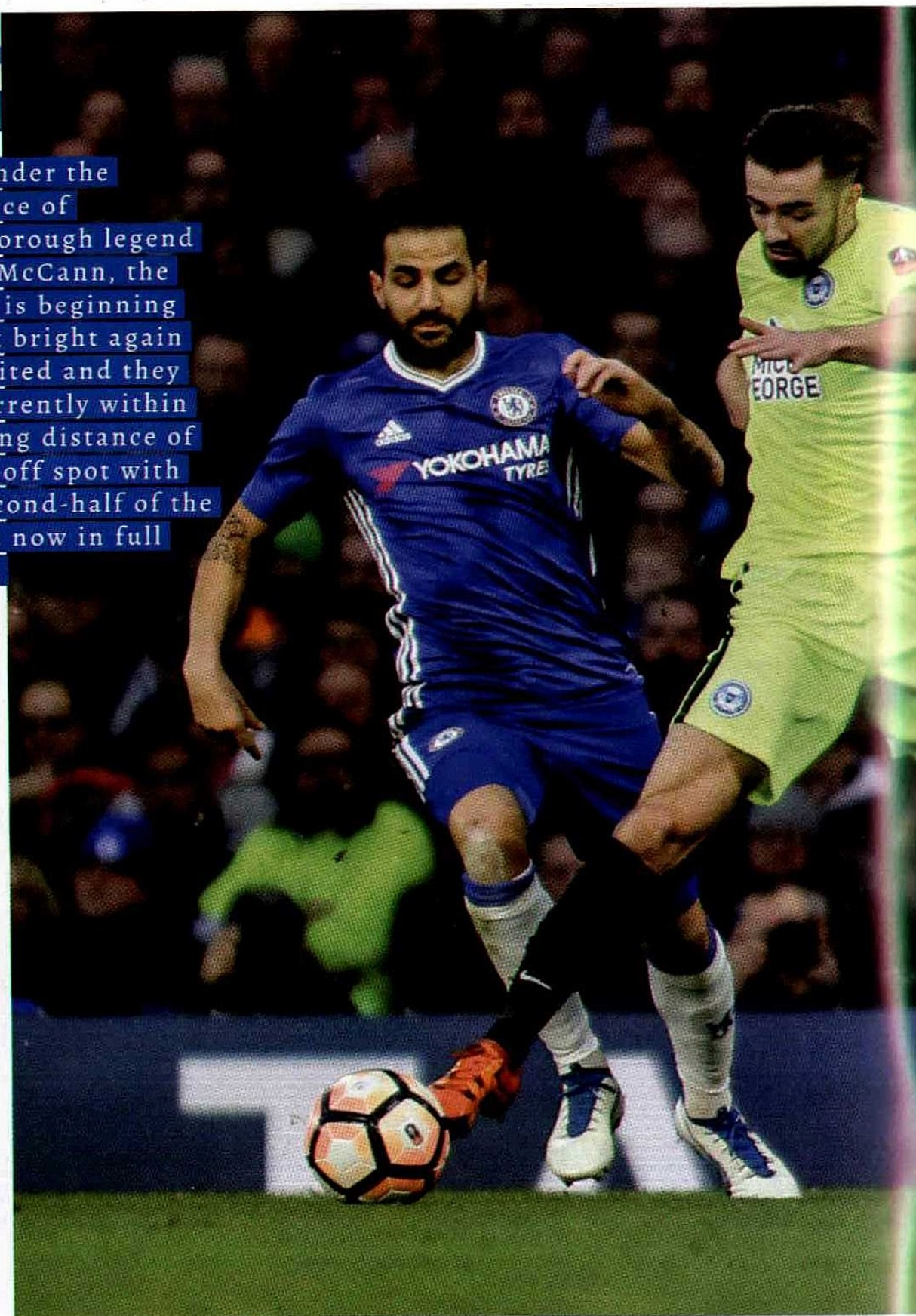

The Posh have enjoyed a steady 2016/17 campaign so far but will be looking to step it up a notch with the Play-Offs still in sight.

In their fourth consecutive season in the Sky Bet League One, Peterborough have been solid rather than spectacular but will be hoping to add some consistency to their results in the second-half of the season.

Following their relegation from the Championship in 2013, Posh have struggled to really challenge for promotion and have also endured a number of changes on and off the pitch, which has ensured that results haven't always been to the desired standard.

However, now under the guidance of Peterborough legend Grant McCann, the future is beginning to look bright again for United and they are currently within touching distance of a play-off spot with the second-half of the season now in full swing.

Peterborough are still sticking to their guns when it comes to their model and they currently boast a number of talented young players on the books, including creative force Marcus Maddison who has helped himself to six goals and ten assists so far this term.

The Posh also enjoyed a run in the FA Cup this season and reached the Third Round of the competition, earning a plum tie away at Chelsea where they were beaten 4-1 by the Premier League leaders.

All in all, it looks set to be a big few months for United who certainly have enough quality in their ranks to try and make a late push for the Play-Offs. They will also be hoping to get back to winning ways this afternoon after suffering a heavy 5-1 defeat away at Bury last time out.

Town have locked horns with Peterborough once already this term with a Michael Doughty penalty and a Jack Baldwin own goal securing a share of the spoils for the Reds at the ABAX Stadium in September 2016 after Gwion Edwards and Marcus Maddison had twice fired the hosts ahead.



DANGERMAN

TOM NICHOLS

**R&W TAKES A CLOSER LOOK
AT ONE OF PETERBOROUGH
UNITED'S DANGERMEN THIS
AFTERNOON...**

The talented striker signed for the Posh in February 2016 for an undisclosed fee from Exeter City, putting pen to paper on a bumper four-and-a-half-year deal before scoring on his debut against Chesterfield.

A product of the Grecians' Academy, Nichols quickly proved why he was so highly-rated and went on to bag 34 goals

in 133 outings for Exeter. The 23-year-old's exploits in front of goal alerted a host of clubs, and that interest only intensified after he scored against Liverpool in the Third Round of the FA Cup to cap off a Man of the Match display.

Known for his finishing and aerial ability, Nichols' 2015/16 campaign came to a premature end in April of last year due to injury, but he has bounced back in fine style this term and leads Peterborough in scoring with ten goals to his name, while he has also contributed five assists to the cause.

MEET THE REST

MARK TYLER

The Peterborough legend re-joined the club on loan from Luton in March 2016 and acted as backup to first choice stopper Ben Alnwick. Is now back at the ABAX Stadium on a permanent basis and combines his playing duties with a coaching role.

DION HENRY

Highly-rated by Posh, the young stopper made his debut for the club during the 2015/16 season following an injury to Ben Alnwick. Has been tipped for a bright future and spent the first part of this season on loan at Boston United.

JEROME BINNOM-WILLIAMS

Signed for the Posh from Crystal Palace for an undisclosed fee in the summer. Impressed on loan for Burton

Albion in the Sky Bet League One last term and offers plenty of pace and power on the left side of defence.

HAYDEN WHITE

Another defensive recruit in the off-season, White spent the vast majority of last season on loan at Blackpool and impressed despite their relegation to League Two. The former Bolton Wanderers defender is a right-back by trade but loves to bomb forward as much as he can.

DOMINIC BALL

Currently on loan at the ABAX Stadium from Championship side Rotherham United, Ball is most comfortable at centre-back but can also operate as a defensive midfielder or at full-back. Began his career with Tottenham Hotspur and spent last season on loan at Rangers in Scotland.

LEONARDO DA SILVA LOPES

Burst onto the scene at the tail end of the 2015/16 campaign and featured

in a number of games under then Caretaker Boss Grant McCann, despite being just 17 years of age. Boasts blistering pace and has two goals and two assists in thirty outings this term.

ADIL NABI

Arrived at Peterborough from Premier League outfit West Brom in January 2016 and made six appearances for the club. Able to play both as an attacking midfielder and as a striker, Nabi is good on the ball and has a keen eye for a pass.

MARTIN SAMUELSEN

The talented youngster returned to the Posh for a second spell on the opening day of the January Transfer Window, joining on loan from West Ham United until the end of the season. Samuelson scored twice in twenty games for Peterborough last season and has won three caps for Norway.

LUKE MCGEE

Arrived on loan from Premier League side Tottenham Hotspur in the summer and has impressed for the Posh so far, seeing his deal

extended until the end of the season. Turned professional with Spurs in July 2014 and put pen to paper on a new contract the following year.

MICHAEL SMITH

Signed for the Posh in July 2014 after joining from Bristol Rovers. Has become a firm fans' favourite at the ABAX Stadium

and was awarded a new contract in 2016. Won his first senior cap for Northern Ireland last season and just missed out on their Euro 2016 squad.

ANDREW HUGHES

His exploits for Newport County, where he made over 100 outings, caught the attention of Peterborough in the summer of 2016. Hughes is

a reliable defender but is also keen to get forward and put a shift in at the other end of the field. Helped Newport achieve promotion to League Two in 2013.

RYAN TAFAZOLLI

Another fresh face in a new-look backline for Posh this season, the centre-back was an imposing figure at the heart of the

defence for Mansfield last term and attracted plenty of interest in the summer. Opted to link-up with Peterborough however and has impressed so far this season.

JACK BALDWIN

A powerful and no-nonsense centre-back, Baldwin has re-established himself as a pivotal figure for Posh after being ruled out of

action for more than twelve months with ruptured knee ligaments. Can also play at right-back and in midfield and is known for his ability on the ball.

GWION EDWARDS

Posh snapped up Edwards from Crawley Town in the summer of 2016 and the tricky wide player has made the step up to League

One with ease. Boasting plenty of pace and skill, the 23-year-old is a real crowd pleaser and he has contributed nine goals and four assists so far this season.

MICHAEL BOSTWICK

The rugged defender can also play in midfield and he adds a real physical and committed presence to the Posh line-up.

Known for his crunching tackles and his venomous shots, Bostwick has been with Peterborough since 2012 and helped Stevenage climb from the Conference to League One.

CHRIS FORRESTER

Was handed the captain's armband in the summer and has been a key figure for the Posh since his arrival from St Patrick's Athletic in 2015. His

sublime range of passing and impressive engine has attracted admiring glances from a host of top clubs and international recognition arrived in March 2016 when Forrester was called up to the senior Republic of Ireland squad.

MARCUS MADDISON

Sealed a move to Posh from Gateshead in 2014 and has handled the step-up with ease, proving his class on a number of

occasions. A raw talent, Maddison has become a fans' favourite at the ABAX thanks to his flair, pace and ability from set-pieces. He has six goals and ten assists to his name this campaign.

SHAQUILE COULTHIRST

Was once on the books of Tottenham Hotspur and joined Peterborough in January 2016, scoring twice in 19 games.

Has pace to burn and is able to play anywhere in the attacking zone, which makes him a useful asset. Has represented England at U19 level.

LEE ANGOL

Made the switch from Luton Town in the summer of 2015 but has struggled to find consistency during his time with Peterborough.

Picked up an injury in pre-season which has hampered his progress but he's got pace to burn and is an excellent finisher.

PAUL TAYLOR

Has been linked with a move away during this Transfer Window but is still an important figure for Posh and has hit five goals for the club this

season, in addition to contributing seven assists. Can play out wide or as a central striker and has also plied his trade for the likes of Ipswich, Rotherham and Blackburn Rovers.

The former Posh favourite was handed a four-year deal in May 2016 following a successful spell as Caretaker Boss at the ABAX Stadium.

Having parted company with Dave Robertson and Graham Westley during a turbulent 2015/16 campaign, Posh brought in McCann to help steady the ship and he did just that, guiding his side to three wins and one draw in four games.

Before he opted to concentrate on becoming a coach, the Belfast native carved out a successful playing career in the lower leagues of English football. Beginning his playing days with West Ham United in 1998, the former midfielder was shipped out on loan to Cheltenham Town, Livingston and Notts County, before joining Cheltenham on a permanent deal in January 2003 after making just four appearances for the Hammers.

McCann featured in over 150 games for the Robins and was snapped up by Barnsley on loan in November 2006, scoring a last gasp equaliser on his debut against Ipswich Town. That prompted The Tykes to part with £100,000 in order to make him a permanent asset in January 2007.

However, it wasn't long before he was on the move again and a move to Scunthorpe United followed in January 2008. McCann racked up over a century of games for the Iron and attracted the interest of Peterborough United, making the move to the Posh in May 2010. McCann enjoyed huge success at the ABAX Stadium and was named Club Captain upon his arrival. He also has the rare achievement of being promoted via the Play-Offs three times with three different clubs.

McCann notched 35 goals in nearly 200 games for Posh but his finest moment came in 2011 when he scored a free-kick to seal a 3-0 success against Huddersfield Town in the League One Play-Off Final at Old Trafford. He also scored in both Semi-Final legs against MK Dons.

The former creative force finished his playing days at Linfield but his stay lasted just six weeks before he returned to Peterborough to take up a coaching role. Now the main man at the ABAX Stadium, McCann has guided his troops to the fringes of the Play-Off places this season and he will be hoping to help his side break into the promotion picture during the second-half of the season.

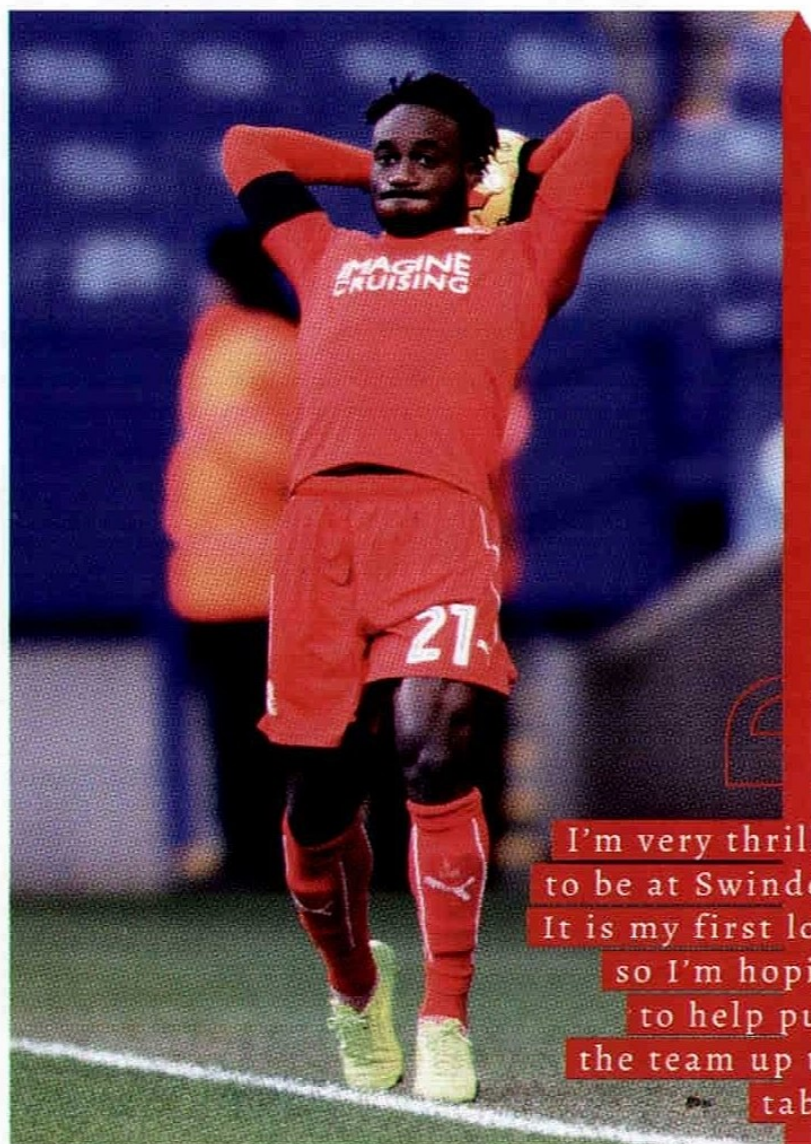
You are all here until the end of the season so what would you like to achieve from this loan spell on a personal basis?

1933

Not a 24th birthday for Town's amateur keeper Sid Giles to celebrate, as Clapton Orient put seven goals past him in east London. Sadly, Sid died from leukaemia just five years later.

1956

Despite progressing to the Fourth Round of the FA Cup, Swindon gained only their second League win since November - a 2-1 winner over high-flyers Torquay. Bob Edwards and Dave Gibson notched the goals.

1961

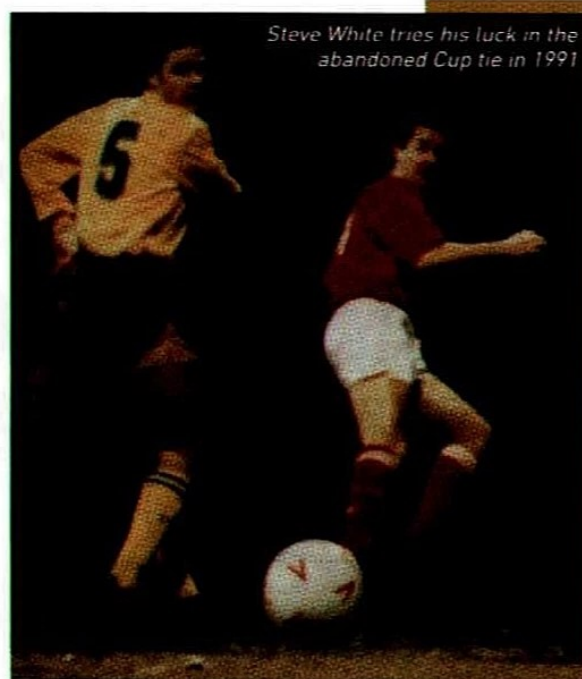
After going nine League games without a win, Town inflicted a 4-0 defeat on Bury. Teenage strikers Cliff Jackson and Mike Summerbee grabbed two goals apiece in front of a near 10,000 crowd at The County Ground.

1991

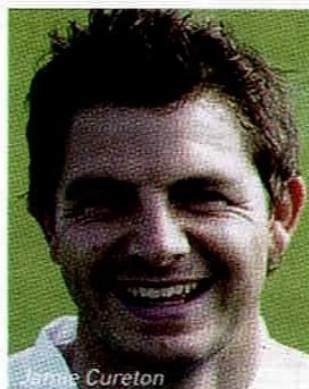
A late Steve White goal against Orient saw Swindon secure a passage into the Fourth Round of the FA Cup at the fifth attempt! In the first in East London, Duncan Shearer struck early in a 1-1 draw. The County Ground replay also stood at 1-1 when it was abandoned due to a frozen pitch after 54 minutes and two other dates for the meeting also fell victim to the weather.

2006

Eleven years ago today, Jamie Cureton scored his first goal for Town - in his 15th appearance for the club. Stefani Miglioranzi, Rory Fallon and Lee Peacock also found the target in a 4-2 home win over Bournemouth.



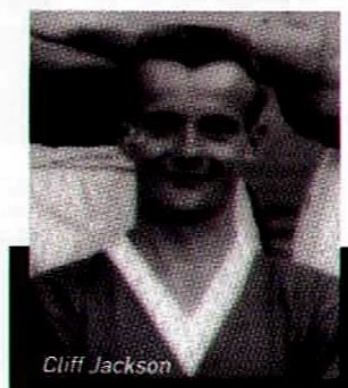

LOU MACARI'S RED AND WHITE ARMY

30 YEARS ON

For one weekend at the end of November, Macari's men had occupied a play-off position for the first time in the season but this result - against bottom of the table Newport - put them into the top four, with every prospect of them grabbing one of the coveted top two places.

But, by midway through the second period of this Sunday afternoon encounter, all Town had to show for their efforts was Jimmy Quinn's 18th minute header - his first for the club since returning from Blackburn.

So, at that point, boss Macari decided to take off Mark Gardiner and send on Dave Bamber. It would prove to be an inspired substitution as the big striker once again proved his worth by providing a goal and an assist in the closing twenty minutes.

Just four minutes after coming on, Bamber rose at the far post from a corner on the left to head the ball downwards and it fell for central defender Tim Parkin to stab home from barely a yard out.

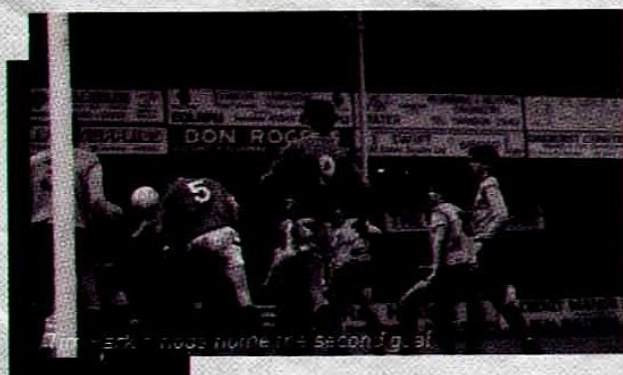
Then, with six minutes of normal time remaining, Fraser Digby launched the ball long and Bamber muscled his way past Steve Sherlock as the left-back attempted to remove his shirt from his back and slid the ball under the advancing keeper, Roger Freestone.

Town had come close to adding to their tally on several occasions during the first hour - Quinn heading wide, Peter Coyne thumping a shot against the bar and Parkin seeing another header cleared off the line by Linden Jones.

Digby was rarely troubled in the home goal, but he was a mere spectator on 55 minutes when a 25-yard drive from Steve Berry - who would be signed by Swindon two months later - struck the crossbar.

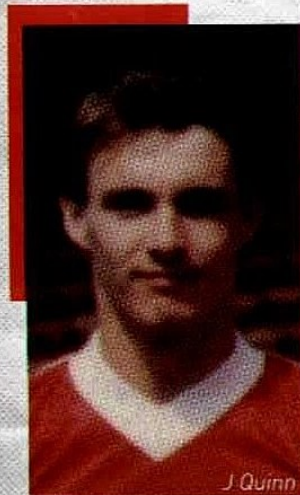

After just three months with Northern Premier League club Oswestry, Jimmy was offered a trial at The County Ground by John Trollope - and signed a contract just after Christmas.

His 15 goals in 35 starts in 1983/84 earned him a move to Ewood Park, but Lou Macari re-signed him midway through 1986/87 to bolster the club's chances of gaining a second successive promotion.

A further 43 goals in 86 games preceded another move by the Ulsterman in the 1988 close season - to Leicester for a tribunal-fixed fee of £210,000.

Jimmy returned to The County Ground for a third stint in early October 1998 when, with the club sitting in 20th position in the second tier, he followed Steve McMahon as player-manager. He kept Town up, but in 1999/2000 they were in the bottom four before the end of August and there they stayed.

After being axed, Jimmy immediately resumed his playing career - turning out for Cricklade the following evening!

We had an in-house game last week which pitted our U16's against our U18's and we do it quite often. It is important the scholars get to play against each other and it gives the U16's a certain understanding of where they need to be in terms of physically, mentally, tactically and technically as well because they know then that they have some work to do.

We haven't quite finalised the decisions on who is coming into the club next season and that decision will be made at the end of January. We'll sit down in the next ten days and make that final decision and we do understand it is a tough time for the boys, particularly the U16's as a lot of them have been here a long time.

It is always one of the worse nights of the year telling the players that we have to let them go and it is devastating for them and for us. It is really important that parents and players know it is an upsetting time for us because we can't pick everyone and it is important we try and make the right decision.

We have got to factor in the age groups below and what talent we think lies beneath us as well as what talent sits above us, so it is quite a trying time for everyone in terms of trying to make informed, correct decisions and you don't always get it 100% right but, in the main, we're not too far off.

It was an important game last weekend and it was a good, competitive match. It was played as a proper fixture and we treat it as a normal game. It was very competitive and it told us one or two things that gave us a few question marks, which is exactly what we want from those sort of games.

We play Yeovil Town away today and the U16's will play on AstroTurf and the U18's will play on grass. We're expecting a tough fixture because they've been doing quite well this year and none of the fixtures are easy this season. It is mentally preparing yourself for the journey down to Yeovil in the minibus because it is a good couple of hours and then getting off the bus, getting ready and going out and performing well.

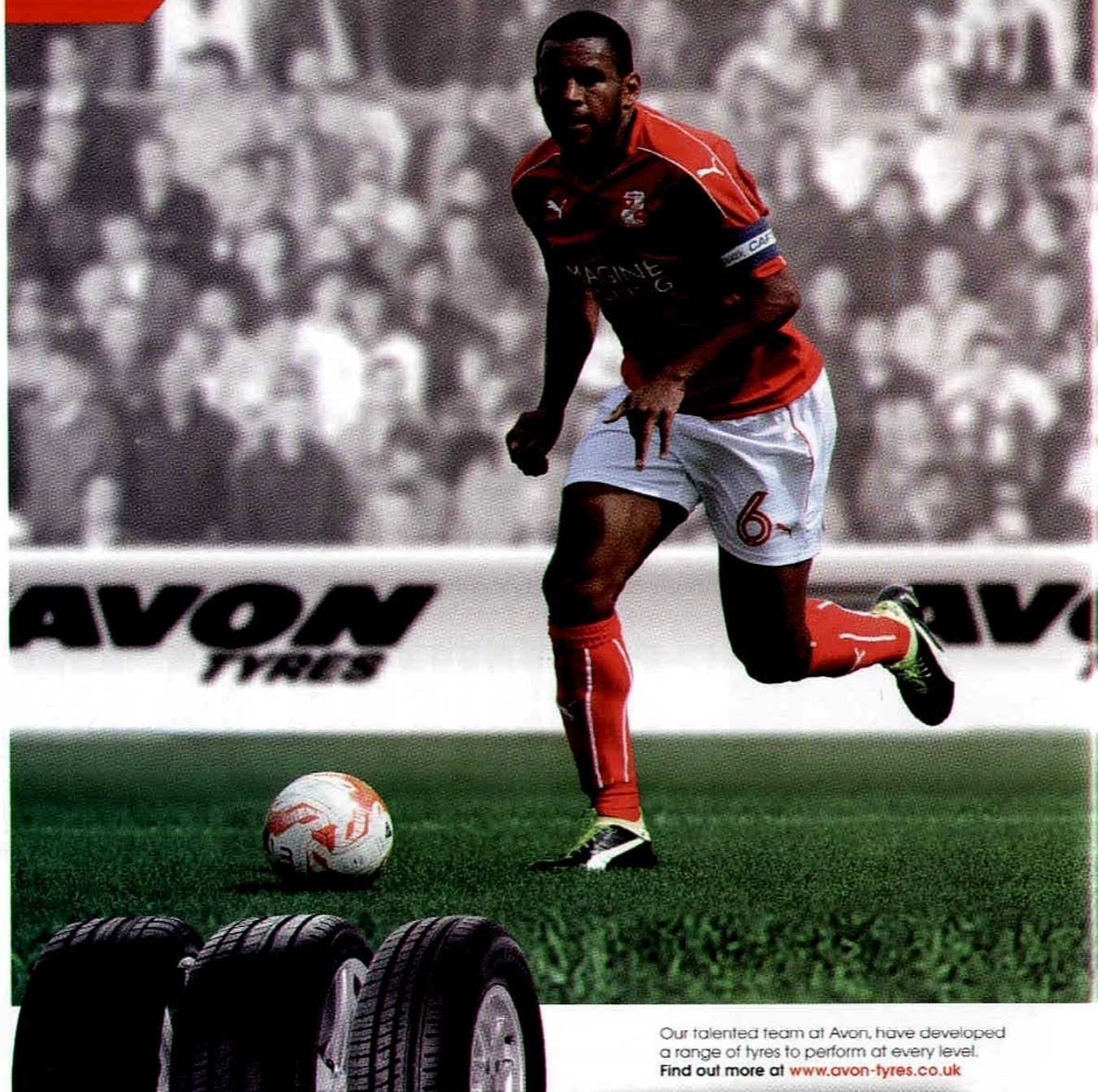
Jeremy Newton will watch the U16's to throw his eye over them and I'm hoping the U18's impress. The U18's are coming up to decision time on their pro contracts but the club won't make any final decisions until at least the transfer window is out of the way and they know where they are in terms of finances for next year. That will determine how many pro contracts are offered for next year so until that time the boys have to knuckle down and try and do as well as they can.

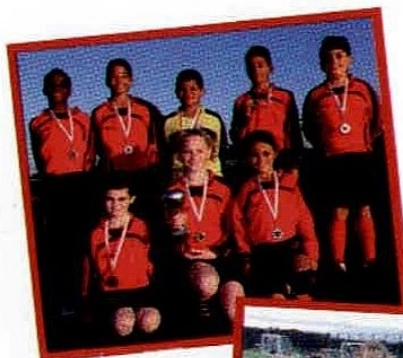

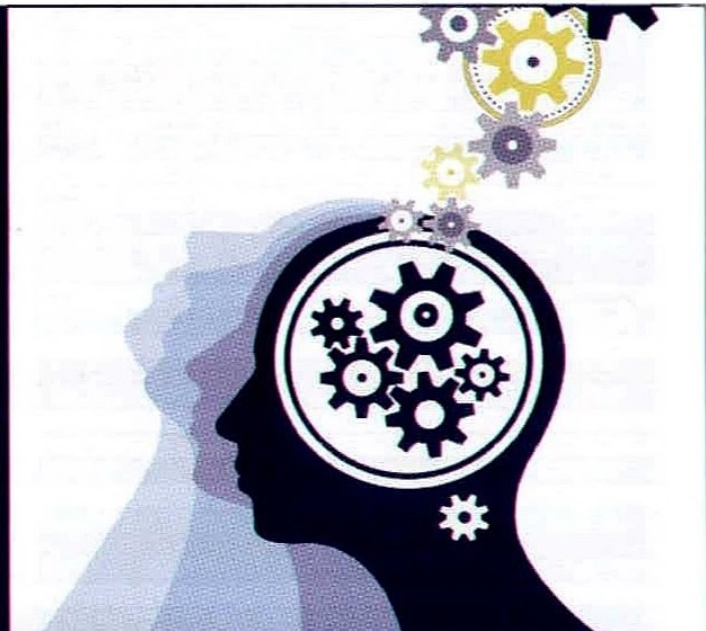

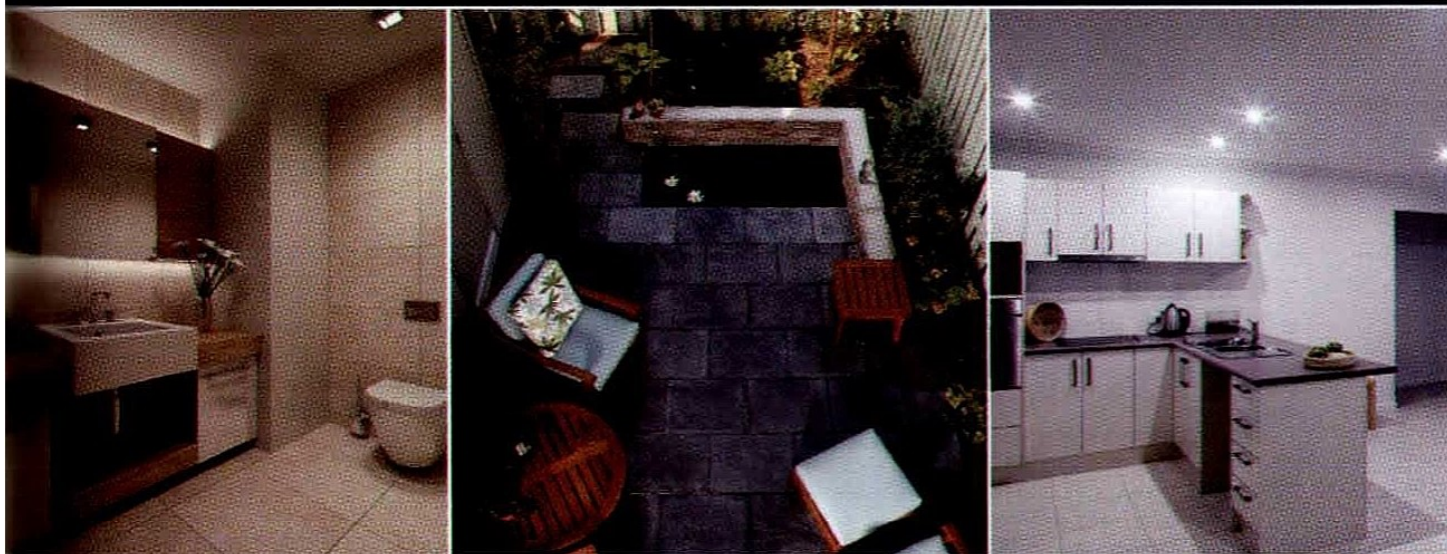
