





GOOD EVENING AND WELCOME BACK TO SIXFIELDS FOR THE VISIT OF SWINDON TOWN.

We were really pleased to secure an excellent win against Chesterfield here on Saturday. That made it back to back home wins for us and was especially pleasing given we have spent some time talking as a group about the need to improve our home form. That is still a work in progress of course, but the last two results have been steps in the right direction.

As I said after the game on Saturday, I felt it was an efficient rather than a spectacular performance. We were delighted with the result and three points, even though we know we still have some areas where we can improve. However, overall the signs are good that we are making progress and we have been delighted with the work of the players and the way they have responded to what we are asking of them.

I must also offer a word of praise and thanks for your support. You have been very patient and vocally supportive of us over the last couple of games and we will need that to continue. We will keep working hard to improve all aspects of our game and if you can keep up your fantastic support it will be a huge help. Things won't happen overnight but we are on the right road.

A number of our injured players are approaching fitness. They have been working hard and we hope to have Gabriel Zakuani and Alex Revell back on Saturday with Brendan Moloney available not long after that. At the time of writing Luke Williams was still being assessed but hopefully he will also be back sooner rather than later. When they do return, our squad will be that much stronger and deeper with increased competition for places but we won't rush anyone back. We are entering the most important part of the season and when the players do return we want them to stay back, so we will always err on the side of caution rather than take any sort of risk. Another player who is working hard and making good progress is Sam Hoskins. Sam won't be ready this season but he is still an important part of the group and it is great to see him progressing.

In recent weeks we have allowed Joe laciofano to join Corby Town on a work experience. Joe has really impressed me since I arrived, but I really want him to play senior first team football against experienced players, week in, week out. He is almost above the level of the youth team now, it isn't a major challenge for him and once anyone gets comfortable and isn't challenged, they don't improve. Another young player who has impressed me, Shaun McWilliams, has really felt the benefit of his loan spell with King's Lynn, and I think some time at Corby will really help Joe. The terms of a work experience loan mean he will train with us during the week, and he is still eligible to play for our first team and our under 18s as well as Corby, but we really want him to have the experience of playing first team football on a regular basis. I know the Corby manager, Gary Mills, from my time at Rushden and I know Joe will be well looked after so it is an ideal move for his development.



GOOD EVENING AND WELCOME BACK TO SIXFIELDS.

We come in to tonight's game on the back of an excellent 3-1 win over Chesterfield on Saturday. It was a result I felt we deserved, and we were always in control of the game.

John-Joe O'Toole is certainly in good form at the moment, having scored at Walsall he scored twice in the first half on Saturday to put us well on our way. They were typical John-Joe goals, he has that great knack of timing his runs to perfection and he was in the right place at the right time twice on Saturday. The first goal owed a lot to a great delivery from Hiram Boateng and the second to the persistence of Keshi Anderson.

I got on the scoresheet early in the second half to put us 3-0 ahead, getting the final touch to another excellent set play delivery from Matt Taylor. Normally I'm not too bothered about whether I get on the scoresheet or not as long as the team win, but I have to admit I was pleased to score on Saturday. The disappointment of the Walsall game was still raw and I wanted to put that behind me as soon as possible. It was great to get a goal to reward the team and the supporters and I was pleased to help us on our way to three important points.

Our performance level perhaps dipped a little bit in the second half but we remained effective if not playing at the top of our game and saw the game out – thanks to a couple of good saves from Adam Smith when required, to record a really good win.

As the Gaffer said afterwards we need to maintain the standards and intensity of our first half performance over ninety minutes but as he also said, that will come as the fitness levels improve and as we play together more as a group. It is easy to forget how many players we welcomed into the group in January.

Before we leave the subject of Saturday, just a quick word for Michael Smith. He started his first game for the club on Saturday and I thought he did really well. It was his first ninety minutes for a while and his commitment and energy was first class. For a player of his presence he has an excellent touch and like a lot of the boys, he could have been really pleased with his performance.

Tonight we know we face a really tough game against Swindon Town. Swindon are a side with a reputation for playing football the right way. We saw in the game at the County Ground in September they are patient, they look after the ball well, and they are a threat. We will need to be at our best this evening.

GOOD EVENING AND WELCOME BACK TO SIXFIELDS AS WE PLAY HOST TO SWINDON TOWN.

This is our first game under the midweek lights at Sixfields for some time, but starting tonight we play at home on three of the next five Tuesdays. I often think that midweek matches have their own special atmosphere, the floodlights seem to add to the theatre a little, so hopefully we are in for a cracking game tonight!

We recorded an important victory over Chesterfield here on Saturday. John-Joe O'Toole set us well on the way with two well taken goals and then Marc Richards added a third just after half time. It was an important victory in the context of the season and as far as the league table is concerned and I felt we were good value for the win. I felt we always looked in control and while Justin Edinburgh admitted afterwards there is still room for improvement, it was a good way to reward all of you who braved a bitterly cold afternoon to come and support us.

Last week we were delighted to extend our partnership with Opus Energy. Opus have been our back of shirt sponsors for a number of years now, and this extension follows on from us extending our partnership with the University of Northampton last year. To have both organisations extend their link up with us says a lot about the club and the way we work with our partners. We are all very grateful to Andy and the team at Opus, they are a major Northampton employer and the players often visit their premises on Moulton Park to meet their staff. It is a partnership that is working well and one that we are really pleased to see extended.

In conjunction with the Supporters Trust and the Standing at Sixfields group, we recently ran an online survey to gauge the views of supporters on the idea of introducing a safe standing area at Sixfields. The survey ran from last November until early January and more than 500

supporters responded. We would like to say a big thank you to everyone for your input. The results of the survey can be downloaded from ntfc.co.uk and we will now be sharing the results of the survey with the SAG (Safety Advisory Group) who oversee safety regulations at Sixfields so we can look into further detail together.

Last Friday night we staged an event to highlight the work of our Community Trust here at Sixfields. It was great to see so many attend, and to see the level of interest there is in our community work. The recent transfer window was a challenging time, and while we were pleased with the signings we made, it was certainly a difficult window to work in. An additional rule to consider, and one that some clubs fell foul of, is the three club rule – ie a player is only allowed to play for two clubs in one season. So, if a player played in say the first round of the EFL Cup, or even played in the first round of matches in the Checkatrade Trophy, and then went out on loan until January, they then can't go out on loan again. It seems to be a rule that simply stops players playing and that cannot be good for players, clubs or the sport in general and that may need to be looked at.

Back to back Saturday away games await us, and we face trips to Southend United and Fleetwood Town in the next week and a half. There are some miles to be covered there, so we say thank you in advance to those of you who are travelling to support the team.



ast summer saw the arrival of 23-year-old Matt Derrig, so fresh out of the University of Northampton that he graduated with his degree one day and took a full-time position at Sixfields the next week. A real life example of how the partnership between the two organisations is working.

"When I started I had nothing definite in mind to follow university," he tells me, "Just an original plan to get the best degree possible and then work in sports media. But that took fresh focus when I spotted an advert from the Cobblers.

"They needed someone to help cope with the various media outlets on matchdays. I applied and was soon on board. That all escalated gradually and when it came to graduation in June last year I came straight to work full-time a few days later."

Head of Media Gareth Willsher is delighted to have Matt on board. "As the media work has become more demanding it was clear we needed to respond to that," he says.


Matt is ideal and balances the areas we are already experienced in. He has real strengths in design and graphics and has helped us to hugely increase our output.





DOPING WAS THE LONGEST-RUNNING AND BIGGEST SINGLE ISSUE IN SPORTS NEWS LAST YEAR, WITH CLAIMS OF RUSSIAN STATE-SPONSORED CHEATING LAID BARE IN TWO DAMNING REPORTS BY PROFESSOR RICHARD MCLAREN, THE BUILD-UP TO THE RIO GAMES OVERSHADOWED BY THE SCANDAL, AND THE SUSPENSION OF TENNIS STAR MARIA SHARAPOVA.

In the coming months, sports' leaders will be under mounting pressure to finally decide how to regain trust in the world's anti-doping regime. When the two International Olympic Committee (IOC) commissions have concluded their work, the organisation must punish Russia.

With more positive results from the re-testing of Russian samples from London 2012 and Sochi 2014 expected, and with the country already having been stripped of the bobsleigh and skeleton World Championships in March, should it also be banned from the winter Olympic Games next year?

Russia has now admitted some doping took place, but continues to contest any government involvement, and there are serious doubts that it can persuade athletics' governing body, the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF), to lift its suspension of the country's track and field athletes in time for the World Championships.

The long-anticipated reform of the World Anti-Doping Agency (Wada) must also be decided. Will it be granted the autonomy, additional resources, and sanctioning power that many in the anti-doping community are demanding?

These are the difficult questions international sport must wrestle with over the coming months as it tries to recover from the worst doping scandal in history.

There could be more bad news on the way however, with reports that the names of athletes who had bags of blood confiscated as part of Operation Puerto in Spain may be revealed. And could the Fancy Bears hackers cause more mayhem with further revelations?

THREE YEARS AGO NEXT WEEK, NORTHAMPTON TOWN SIGNED FORMER ABERDEEN, OLDHAM ATHLETIC AND BURTON ALBION DEFENDER ZANDER DIAMOND ON LOAN TO HELP TRY AND KEEP THE CLUB IN THE FOOTBALL LEAGUE WITH THE COBBLERS SIX POINTS ADRIFT AT THE FOOT OF LEAGUE 2.

Thirty-six months on we caught up with Zander to look back on the last three years and to find out more about the Scotsman's career.

The 31-year old grew up in Glasgow and was engrossed in football from an early age. Every weekend would consist of watching and playing football and trying to recreate what he'd seen on the television and learn from some of the biggest stars in world football.

"As a young boy Saturday night was always football night on TV," he recalled. "The Premier League was starting to grow and Match of the Day was on, and up in Scotland there was SportScene which showed the SPL highlights so it was quite a night! There was then Italian football on the Sunday and seeing all of the big stadiums and all of the great players each week instantly made you want to go outside and kick a ball around."

"The 1994 World Cup was the first major tournament that I'd seen and we used to try and replicate what happened in the games. A particular player that I looked up to in that era was Celtic's Paul McStay. He spent his entire career there and won a lot of trophies. He'd play week-in week-out and gave his all for the club and watching him whilst growing up made me want to aspire to that."

Zander managed to catch the eye of Scottish clubs early in his junior career and was offered to train with his boyhood club Celtic when he was just 10-years old, but they weren't the only side in for the young central defender.

"Celtic came calling and wanted me to train a couple of nights a week and play in a few games," he said. "Aberdeen also came in for me and I was keen to give it a try with them. I'd go up to Aberdeen during the school holidays and they'd closely analyse our performances. At that stage they were giving a lot of first-team opportunities to the younger boys in the youth ranks which luckily enough happened to me further down the line. I played a tournament in Holland with them when I left school and then there was a 2-year deal on the table when I was 17. To come out of school and straight into a professional contract was fantastic and that's when the hard work really started."

Moving full-time to a professional club at 17 proved difficult for Zander, but with hard work came success and it was a fruitful first year in professional football.

"I had to move away from my home in Glasgow when I was 17. A lot of people think moving away for football is easy but I was 3 hours away from my family and living in digs with 4 or 5 other boys and training every day. It was tough. But in my first full year we won the Youth Cup final and the manager came to me and said I'd be making my first-team debut the following Saturday. To get a squad number when I'd just turned 18 was fantastic and I haven't looked back since.

"It's then that you realise you're playing a tough game and you have to adapt to it very quickly. I'd also like to thank Steve Paterson for handing me my debut and that set me on my path to a career in the game." Zander was part of an Aberdeen side which tasted European football when they qualified for the UEFA Cup in the 2007-08 season and played alongside former Cobbler Josh Walker against come of Europe's biggest sides.

"European football was amazing, we all still talk about it now," he said

We had a qualifier against Dnipro which was when there started to be a lot of money in Ukrainian football. We got a 0-0 draw at home and managed to score first over there which gave us a huge away goal. We defended for our lives, they hit the post, bar and eventually got it to 1-1 but we put our bodies on the line throughout the 90 minutes and went through to the group stages.

"I was only 21 at the time and it was a brilliant achievement for the club. We were watching the draw and were in a group with Panathinaikos, Lokomotiv Moscow, Atletico Madrid and Copenhagen, which was unbelievable. People wrote us off and never gave us a chance but we exceeded expectations. We lost the first game in Greece, drew at home to Lokomotiv where I managed to score and got beaten in Madrid. But the way the group went if we could beat Copenhagen we'd be through to the knock-out stages.

"We managed to beat them 4-0 at home and were drawn against Bayern Munich in the final 32. For any kid growing up they'd always be a team you'd watch on TV so to be drawn against them and play home and away was great. We managed to draw 2-2 at Pittodrie and lost 5-1 at the Allianz Arena but for the experience alone at 21-22 years old it was fantastic.

"The calibre of player was unbelievable. Luca Toni, Miroslav Klose, Lukas Podolski, Lucio, Phillip Lahm and Oliver Kahn were all in the Bayern team, Sergio Aguero and Diego Forlan were playing for Atletico, Moscow had Peter Odemwingie at his peak and Copenhagen had Marcus Allback who was a top Swedish striker in his time. I was the only player to play every minute of every game in that run so I'm proud of that too. That summer was Euro 2008 and some of those players were playing and it was unreal to come up against this type of quality.

"It was a good time for Scottish football in that era because Celtic and Rangers were at their peak, Rangers got to the UEFA Cup final, Celtic were in the last-16 of the Champions League and the Scottish national team were performing really well."

After 15 years with Aberdeen, Diamond felt it was time for a change and in the summer of 2011 he was offered a deal with Oldham Athletic following a chat with then-manager and former Leicester City striker Paul Dickov.


"He (Dickov) called me and wanted to sign me so after a couple of days I joined him at Oldham Athletic. I'd been at Aberdeen since I was 11 and Scottish football was changing so I thought it was a good time to move clubs. I enjoyed it but I probably didn't appreciate how good the standard was in League One. From a Scottish perspective the teams here don't necessarily roll off the tongue but when you play you realise how good the players are and there's a lot of seasoned pros. "If I'm being brutally honest I didn't adapt too well and had a couple of injuries which didn't help. I then went to Burton Albion and got to the play-off semi-finals in the first season but the following year I wasn't in the team and wanted to go out and play football. That's when Chris Wilder rang me when the club were cut adrift at the bottom of the league and they wanted me in for the final 16 games. He was confident that we could get ourselves out of trouble so I came in and we managed to help the club survive in the Football League. I'm quite proud of the fact that I came here and managed to play a part in keeping the team up. I'm the only player left from that squad and that is something I'm very proud of.

'We survived with a win against Oxford United on the Saturday and I signed my permanent deal the following Monday. The first year was a little bit disrupted by injuries but the second year obviously needs no introduction! We cantered the league and were putting in great performances. It was a team that knew how to win football games even when we were playing badly and to go from almost dropping out of the Football

League to running away with the title in such a short space of time was fantastic.

'That group of players will go down in the history of Northampton Town and we achieved something special. When you step back and look at so many games undefeated people may think it was too easy but we could only beat what was in front of us and we'd started to become a scalp for teams because we were so many points ahead but even when we were playing poorly we'd dig out a draw or edge out a win when we were dead and buried.

"Since I've been here the supporters have been great with me. I'd like to think I've given the club a good part of my career and we've gone from getting out of relegation trouble to winning the league and that's something the fans appreciate. Hopefully now we can start to improve in League One and consolidate and then see where that takes us but I certainly think my time here has been successful so far, and hopefully there are some more good times to come!"



A TEAM OF STAFF AND STUDENTS FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTHAMPTON WILL SPEND THE NEXT 10 MONTHS SUPPORTING A NORTHAMPTON MAN AS HE PREPARES TO ROW 3,000 MILES ACROSS THE ATLANTIC OCEAN.

n December, 47-year-old Kingsthorpe businessman Alan Bustin-Mulkern will depart from the Canary Islands in a 10-metre vessel, and row for 3,000 miles – arriving at the English Harbour in Antigua some 45-60 days later. Known as the Talisker Whisky Atlantic Challenge, the transatlantic race is billed as the 'World's Toughest Row'.

Alan is undertaking the challenge to promote and raise funds for the ABF The Soldiers' Charity – a charity that supports soldiers, veterans and families – for life. It's a cause close to Alan's heart. "I am an ex-regular soldier who served for 10 years in the Royal Artillery, and I am currently commissioned as an Officer with the Leicester, Northants and Rutland Army Cadet Force," he explained.

With his military background, Alan is used to extreme exercise. "I have participated in mountaineering, triathlons, ultra-running and mountain biking," he explained. But not having a nautical background or any experience in rowing makes Alan's endeavour a little unusual.

To ensure he's up for the challenge and in tip-top form – physically and mentally – Alan has partnered with the University's Sport Sciences and Sports Psychology teams for advice. The University is working with Alan on his nutrition, as well as coping strategies for the long hours and days he will spend alone on the ocean. The teams are also supporting him by developing a structured training programme to improve his all-round fitness, which will involve periodical performance analysis tests over the next year.

"Working with the University of Northampton is vital to the success of the project, and it's great to take advantage of the wealth of work that they're undertaking in the area of endurance sport," explained Alan. "We're working together to develop pre-expedition training, and exploring the various rowing strategies that can be adopted throughout the crossing."

Wolves piled forward in the second half and Peter Knowles went close with a spectacular overhead kick. The decisive goal came in the 71st minute when Dave Wagstaffe volleyed home Terry Wharton's cross. Bob Hatton and Wharton went close to extending Wolves' lead in the closing stages.

Ex-England Amateur international centre-forward Bobby Brown helped Northampton Town to reach the top-flight in 1964-65.

He starred as Barnet won the Athenian League title in 1958-59 and scored in that season's Amateur Cup final. Representing Great Britain in the 1960 Rome Olympics, he played as an amateur for Fulham in the top-flight before turning professional with Watford in November 1961.

Moving to Northampton in November 1963, he netted 22 goals in 51 League games, joining Cardiff City in October 1966 where injury curtailed his career.






KEEPER GOFF GAINING EXPERIENCE







NORTHAMPTON TOWN IS PLEASED TO SUPPORT THE FOOTBALL V HOMOPHOBIA CAMPAIGN.

FOOTBALL V HOMOPHOBIA (FVH) TAKES PLACE ALL YEAR ROUND AND THE CAMPAIGN HAS ITS MONTH OF ACTION IN FEBRUARY.

t is an international campaign to tackle homophobia and prejudice against Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual & Transgender (LGBT) people in football. The aim of FvH is to make football safe and welcoming for everyone.

In the past few months polls have shown that whilst football fans would be more accepting than ever of a gay player in their team, as many as 72% of football fans have heard homophobic abuse at football matches.

Using homophobic or transphobic language towards someone because you don't like the way they play football, manage a team, make a refereeing decision or because of whom they support is wrong. It's against the Laws of the Game and can be a criminal offence, but most importantly, it can make football an intimidating and unpleasant place for fellow fans, players, match officials and administrators of the game.

In recent years, professional footballers Robbie Rogers and Thomas Hitzlsperger, both of whom played in England, publicly announced that they were gay. Both of these players have talked about the challenges of being gay men within professional football, and the impact that anti-gay jokes, language and chanting can have on confidence and self-esteem. Welsh International Jess Fishlock has also spoken about anti-gay abuse she has suffered on social media and has said, "Homophobia in all sports and all genders is a terrible thing. It really shouldn't be a

reason why someone doesn't play a sport and it certainly shouldn't be a reason why someone gets abused for playing a sport."


Attitudes in Football are changing, but everyone needs to make sure that the language we use and the way we behave reflects this change. Fans can make a real difference to the culture of football, and we'd like your support.

SWINDON TOWN ARE TONIGHT'S WELCOME VISITORS

Swindon Town are visiting Sixfields tonight looking to put some points on the board to move away from the bottom four.

Head Coach Luke Williams is assisted by Director of Football Tim Sherwood, and rather like the Cobblers, they have had an up and down season so far.

They have recorded some impressive victories, 3-0 home wins against Charlton and Rochdale as well as a 1-0 success over Bradford City stand out, while their most impressive win on the road was a 2-1 success at Bolton in January.

They weren't able to build on that result unfortunately, suffering narrow defeats against Peterborough United, Bristol Rovers and Oxford United, in a highly charged County Ground derby.

On Saturday the Robins lost 1-0 at Bury. James Vaughan's 37th-minute penalty was enough to win a cagey contest. Raphael Rossi Branco was penalised for holding Bury

striker Tom Pope from a corner and Vaughan smashed the spot-kick down the middle for his 18th goal of the season. Swindon replied with Ben Gladwin's long-range strike clipping the bar before Fankaty Dabo and Jermaine Hylton went close either side of the break. Charlie Colkett fired wide in stoppage time but defeat saw the Robins drop into the bottom four.

The Robins play a style of football that is very easy on the eye, and rather than be reliant on one main scorer, they share the goal threat across the side.

Their January transfer window business included a hectic deadline day two weeks ago. In came former striker Nicky Ajose, returning to the club on loan from Charlton Athletic, while youngster Jesse Starkey was signed from Brighton on an 18 month contract. Fellow Seagull Rohan Ince made the same move, but he is at the County Ground on loan. Midfielder Sean Murray checked out, he signed for League 2 side Colchester United.







Tim Sherwood was appointed the club's Director of Football in November.







DID YOU KNOW?

In December 1906 Bernard Vann scored within 12 minutes of his Cobblers debut in the 2-1 victory over Swindon Town

In 1970 the Cobblers played at the County Ground, Swindon but not against the Robins, the opponents were Exeter City in a FA Cup second replay that they won 2-1. Goalkeeper Keith Welch injured himself in the warm up before the match at Swindon in April 2001 and Adam Sollitt took over in a game that ended 1-1.

After scoring the goal that earned the Cobblers a 1-1 draw v Swindon in December 1923 Colin Myers went off injured and a Doctor in the crowd went into the dressing room and declared Myers had a dislocated shoulder.

In November 1984 Kevin Poole made his debut in the Northampton goal as Alan Mayes of Swindon missed a penalty in a 4-0 victory for the Cobblers.

Bert Russell became the only Northampton player to score a hat-trick in his last ever game for the club when he did so in the last game of the 1931-32 season in a 4-1 victory v Swindon.

A 1-0 home victory v Swindon in September 1939 was expunged when war was declared the following week. On the 28th December 1946, the Cobblers equalised against Swindon after being 1-2 down. A linesman ruled out the goal and while the Cobblers players were disputing the decision the Swindon players rushed up the field and scored a third goal.

NEWS ROUND-UP

MATTY TAYLOR became the first player in 30 years to swap Bristol Rovers for Bristol City when the two clubs agreed an undisclosed fee for the striker on transfer deadline day. The 26-year old, who had a minimum fee release clause inserted in the new contract he signed last summer, scored 19 goals in 33 appearances for Rovers this season.

ZACH CLOUGH has joined Nottingham Forest from Bolton for a £2.5m fee. Clough, 21, scored 21 league goals in 59 appearances for the Trotters.

BRADFORD have signed striker Charlie Wyke from Carlisle. The 24-year old former Middlesbrough trainee scored 32 league goals in 77 league games for the Cumbrians.

PORT VALE midfielder Anthony Grant, 29, has joined Peterborough for an undisclosed six-figure fee. Striker Craig Mackail-Smith, 32, has meanwhile re-joined the Posh on loan from Luton.

GILLINGHAM have signed forward Josh Parker on a deal until the end of the season. The 26-year old former QPR trainee had a brief loan spell at Sixfields back in 2010, making 3 appearances under lan Sampson.

GOALKEEPER Jak Alnwick has joined Rangers from Port Vale for an undisclosed fee. Alnwick, 23, made 31 appearances for Vale this season.

BURY have meanwhile signed experienced stopper Joe Murphy, 35, on loan from Huddersfield.

LAST WEEKEND'S ACTION

A review of Saturday's Sky Bet League 1 action.

Sheffield United left it late but a 1-0 win at Peterborough saw them move five points clear at the top of the table on Saturday. Billy Sharp's goal on 87 minutes, his 20th of the season, proved decisive at the ABAX Stadium while at Glanford Park second-placed Scunthorpe were surprisingly beaten 1-0 by Shrewsbury, Freddie Ladapo the match winner.

Millwall meanwhile moved into the top six, Fred Onyedinma's goal enough to edge out Southend 1-0 at the New Den.

At the other end of the table Oldham hauled themselves out of the bottom four with a 3-2 win at home to bottom-markers Coventry while the in-form James Vaughan scored the only goal of the game for Bury against tonight's visitors at Gigg Lane.

In the three remaining games Josh Parker headed home deep into stoppage time to give Gillingham a 1-1 draw with Port Vale, Ricky Holmes scored for Charlton in a 1-1 draw vs AFC Wimbledon and a late goal from Kane Hemmings earned Oxford a 1-0 home win over MK Dons.

THE UNLIKELY LADS

OSSIE ARDILES

Former Argentina international midfielder Ossie Ardiles made two League appearances for Swindon Town in 1989-90. Together with Ricky Villa, the World Cup winner made headlines with his transfer from Huracan to Spurs in July 1978. He helped win the FA Cup in 1981 and UEFA Cup in 1984, moving to QPR in May 1988. Appointed Swindon's player-boss in July 1989, he plotted their 1989-90 Second Division play-off final success but they were denied promotion due to an illegal payments scandal. He took charge of Newcastle United in March 1991, then managed West Brom and Spurs before coaching overseas.

GLENN HODDLE

Ex-England international midfielder Glenn Hoddle was player-manager as Swindon Town reached the Premiership in 1992-93. Signing professional for Tottenham Hotspur in April 1975, he starred as they won promotion in 1977-78, then won the FA Cup in two consecutive seasons and the UEFA Cup in 1984. He moved to Monaco in July 1987 and helped win the French title in 1987-88, becoming Swindon's player-boss in August 1991. Scoring once in 64 League games for the Robins, he left to take charge of Chelsea after the 1992-93 play-off final triumph and later managed England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves.

BRIAN MARWOOD


Former England international winger Brian Marwood helped Swindon Town to win promotion to the top-flight in 1992-93. Signing professional for Hull City in February 1978, he was leading marksman in their 1982-83 promotion triumph and moved to Sheffield Wednesday for £115,000 in August 1984. He joined Arsenal for £600,000 in March 1988 and starred in their 1988-89 League Championship success, moving to Sheffield United for £350,000 in September 1990. Joining Swindon in March 1993, he scored once in 11 League games and joined Barnet in August 1993. He became PFA chairman, since working in the media.

TERRY FENWICK

Versatile defender Terry Fenwick was capped 20 times by England before joining Swindon Town. Signing professional for Crystal Palace in December 1976, he featured in their 1978-79 Second Division title triumph and followed Terry Venables to QPR in December 1980. He scored in the 1982 FA Cup final, then skippered Rangers to the Second Division title in 1982-83 and 1986 League Cup final. Reunited with Venables at Tottenham Hotspur in December 1987, he joined Swindon in September 1993 and made 28 League appearances while at the County Ground. He later managed Portsmouth and Northampton Town.

FRANK MCAVENNIE

Former Scotland international striker Frank McAvennie had a loan spell at Swindon Town in 1993-94. He starred for St Mirren before joining West Ham in June 1985 and was top scorer as they were third in the top-flight in 1985-86. Moving to Celtic in October 1987, he scored twice in their 1988 Scottish Cup final triumph and rejoined West Ham in March 1989. He helped win promotion in 1990-91, moving to Aston Villa in August 1992, then Celtic again. Loaned to Swindon in February 1994, he made seven League appearances before rejoining St Mirren. His colourful life story is titled 'Scoring – An Expert's Guide'.



NEIL WEBB

Midfielder Neil Webb was capped 26 times by England before joining Swindon Town. The son of former Reading favourite Dougie Webb, he turned professional with the Royals in November 1980 and moved to Portsmouth in July 1982. He helped win the Third Division title in 1982-83, then moved to Nottingham Forest in June 1985 and scored in their 1989 League Cup final triumph. Sold to Manchester United for £1,500,000 in June 1989, he was an FA Cup winner in 1990 and rejoined Forest in November 1992. He was loaned to Swindon in October 1994, making six League appearances, then played for Grimsby Town.

NEIL RUDDOCK

Ex-England international central defender Neil Ruddock played for Swindon Town during the 2001-02 campaign. A former Millwall apprentice, 'Razor' turned professional in March 1986, moving to Spurs a month later. He returned to Millwall in June 1988 and joined Southampton in February 1989. Appearing in the 1992 ZDS Cup final, he rejoined Spurs in July 1992 and joined Liverpool for £2,500,000 in July 1993. He starred in their 1995 League Cup final triumph, then played for West Ham and Crystal Palace before joining Swindon in August 2001. Scoring once in 15 League games, he has since worked in the media.

PAUL INCE

Midfielder Paul Ince gained 53 England caps before playing for Swindon Town. Initially with West Ham, he moved to Manchester United for £1,000,000 in September 1989 and was England's first black captain. He amassed numerous honours, including the 'double' in 1993-94, joining Inter Milan for £8,000,000 in July 1995. Later with Liverpool, Middlesbrough and Wolves, he joined Swindon in August 2006 and made three League appearances while at the County Ground. He became Macclesfield Town's player-boss in January 2007 and has since managed MK Dons, Blackburn, MK Dons again, Notts County and Blackpool.




