THE MANAGER PENS HIS THOUGHTS AHEAD OF THIS EVENING'S CLASH...

A very warm welcome to David Flitcroft and everyone connected with Swindon Town, particularly a great friend of mine, Matt Taylor, who joined them recently. Matt is a top player but, of course, I hope he doesn't show his quality tonight!

Swindon come into this evening's game following a very impressive 3-0 victory over Luton at the weekend, but we are also high in confidence having stretched our unbeaten run to six matches with a magnificent performance against Morecambe on Saturday.

It was important we backed up our dogged display at Port Vale with a win and I was really pleased with how the lads handled the game, controlling the vast majority of the play and limiting Morecambe to very few chances.

Although it was a more comfortable affair than the previous week's encounter at Vale Park, we still had to show our spirit and determination to preserve a clean sheet - namely in the form of two excellent Adam Collin saves in stoppage time.

Had one of those efforts gone in it may not have affected the overall outcome of the match, but by preserving a clean sheet we continue to develop our

reputation of being tough opponents to face on our own turf.

I was absolutely delighted for Dan Jones, who scored his first goal for us with a brilliant free-kick to open the scoring. That's the sort of quality Dan provides and that strike will give him great confidence moving forward.

His capability at set-pieces is another example of how dangerous a side we are from all areas of the field. We're not solely reliant on forwards or attack-minded midfielders - everyone in this squad is capable of popping up with a goal or an assist and that's something opposition teams hate.

We are still waiting for further news on Shola Ameobi's hamstring injury, which saw him replaced by Jonathan Forte late in the first half on Saturday. Jonathan once again seized his opportunity with a lovely finish to put the game out of Morecambe's reach and tonight he will have a chance to stake a place for a regular starting berth.

HERITAGE PLAQUE PAID FOR BY SUPPORTERS

A Notts fan has generated £450 through fundraising to have a heritage plaque installed at the Mercure Hotel, on the site where the club was founded.

Andy Black will help to unveil the plaque on Thursday 7 December, the 153rd anniversary of the meeting which formally established Notts County Football Club.

The meeting took place in room 102 at the George Hotel on the corner of George Street back in 1864.

However, the men present had been playing matches between themselves and other members as an informal club since 25 November 1862, usually in the Park Hollow between Nottingham Castle and Derby Road.

The Notts Foot Ball Club, as they were known at the time, played their first match against outside opposition the day after the meeting, facing Trent Valley at the Meadows Cricket Ground before losing 1-0 to Sheffield, their first match against a major team, on 2 January 1865.

Nottingham Civic Society have backed the campaign, pledging to pay installation costs.

Notts chairman Alan Hardy said: "We are extremely proud of our status as the world's oldest Football League club and commend Andy's efforts to commemorate our birthplace.

"The meeting that took place inside the Mercure in 1864 was hugely significant for the sport of football and the plaque will be a fitting way for people to learn more about our club's unrivalled history."

BIG INTERVIEW

ADAM COLLIN

Adam Collin believes the summer additions to Notts' goalkeeping department can push him on to greater things between the sticks...

Manager Kevin Nolan brought in Ross Fitzsimons and Branislav Pindroch to push Collin for a starting berth and the former Carlisle man welcomes the competition for the jersey.

"I know there are two people wanting to take my place," he said. "It was the same last season when Scott Loach was here; he was always pushing me all the way.

"Now we have Branislav and Ross who are ready to step in at any time, as they have proven in the cup competitions. It definitely keeps me on my toes. But only one of us can play and I know if I keep doing what I'm doing it'll be me."

There is competition for places throughout the whole squad, not only in the goalkeeping department, following an impressive summer of recruitment by Alan Hardy and Nolan.

"We have two players for each position, which is great for the squad," said Collin.

"We have players who can come off the bench and make an impact on games like Lewis Alessandra did at Port Vale and Jonathan Forte on Saturday. We have players for different situations too, whether we're going for a win or trying to see a game out."

That squad depth, Collin says, is vital as Notts will need contributions from everyone over the course of the season. Having options on the bench could prove pivotal, with the goalkeeper anticipating visiting teams will favour a more cautious approach at Meadow Lane, challenging the Magpies to break them down. But the 32-year-old believes Notts are this season in a stronger position to grind out the victories they need to compete at the top of the table.

"A lot of teams will probably come here, treat us with respect and put men behind the ball to make

it tough and awkward for us," he said. "You saw it happen towards the end of last season and it is up to us to break them down.

"We have many different elements to our game which we can implement to make that happen and we are better equipped to deal with it.

With the likes of Alessandra, Forte, Jorge Grant, Terry Hawkrige and the rest of the attacking players we have here, there is a lot of creativity in the team

and we are more than good enough to break teams down."

Collin is pleased with his own personal performances having kept three clean sheets in the first six league games.

But he is keen to point out that having a settled defence has been a huge part of Notts' early success.

"I'm delighted with my own form since the

gaffer has come in," he said. "I'm just trying to be as consistent as I can and keep as many clean sheets as I can. I don't have any set targets in mind on that front.

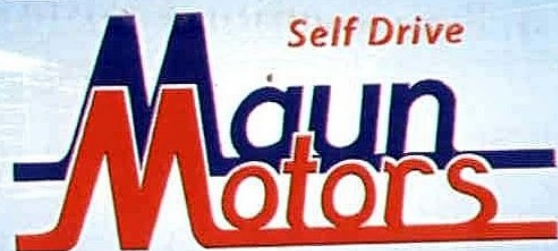
"The manager would rather be winning matches 1-0 than 4-1 because we've got a clean sheet, a goal and a win - it means we've been solid defensively and good enough going forward.

"It's massive for me to have a consistent back-four in front of me. Shaun Brisley and Richard Duffy have been outstanding in the heart of the defence and are forming a good partnership, which makes it so much easier for me to play behind because I know what I'm getting from them nine times out of 10."

The former Rotherham custodian also had words of praise for Mark Crossley, the club's goalkeeping coach, for playing his part in the upturn in Collin's fortunes on the field.

"Mark has been massive for me," said the 'keeper. "Since moving into the role of goalkeeping coach

he's been fantastic. We get on really well and he understands what I need and when. He's my style of coach and has really helped me to turn my form around.

"I don't think we've done anything too different to last season. It's just having consistent training. We do the same sessions on Thursdays and Fridays, with something a little different earlier in the week. It's about knowing what I need going into a match.

"The gaffer wants me to dominate my area which is helped by the defence keeping a high line. If they drop too deep there are too many bodies to come through, which means you can't get to the ball as easily."

Now in his second season at Meadow Lane, the stopper has noted a change in the atmosphere at the club, commending everyone for the positive vibes.

"It's not just come from the players and management but the owner as well," said Collin.

"Alan and Kevin came in at the same time and the feel around the club has changed. You can see improvements in the training facilities.

"We were training on a public park in Ruddington this time last year and there were a number of other things like that which people don't see from the outside. It snowballed and became a big thing which blew up and caused massive problems.

"Now we have a great facility at Basford and up in the Family Stand, which the chairman has put in, for training which has made it a better place to be.

"There is a real buzz here now."

Part of the change in mood and morale has stemmed from the team's ability to consistently pick up results at Meadow Lane. In 2016, the Magpies won just three of 24 home league fixtures, a percentage of 12.5, but it's been all change in 2017.

After Saturday's win over Morecambe, Notts have now emerged victorious in eight of their 13 home

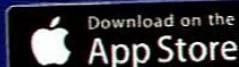

games this year, giving Nolan a 61.5 per cent home win ratio during his eight months in charge.

Collin could not pinpoint a specific reason as to why there has been such a stark contrast in fortunes on home turf, instead attributing the transformation to a number of different aspects implemented by the manager.

"It's down to organisation, planning, training - everything really," he said. "We are so thorough in what we do on the training pitch and all of the video preparation we work on as well.

"Whichever team starts the game, every individual knows their jobs, including the substitutes for when they come on. We all know what we are trying to implement on the pitch and that's been key to our good start to the season.

"Before the gaffer came in we were all over the place," he admitted. "It was a lot of things - our shape, people knowing their roles in the team and not having such a set gameplan, which we have now. It showed

in the results we were getting but we turned it around and we are much better organised now.

"Once a match is done, it's out of the way and all focus turns to the next one, so we'll immediately look to Crawley after tonight."

With Notts in the play-off spots in the early stages of the season, having moved up to third with a 2-0 success over Morecambe on Saturday, hopes are high of a top-seven finish.

But the Penrith-born goalkeeper is keeping his feet on the ground.

"We're delighted with the start we've made but we're not going to get carried away because the league is still very tight," he said.

"We always thought we could do well this season but we didn't want to shout about it. We'd rather just go about our own business and let the results come.

"We're trying to be consistent and pick points up, even if it means a couple of draws to keep us in the top 10 because that is where we want to be."

After losing more than half their league fixtures last season and suffering relegation back to League Two, ending a five-season stay at that level, something had to change at Swindon.

This, after all, was a team which reached the play-off semi-finals twice in three years, so to see such a sharp contrast in fortunes required some self-reflection.

Chairman Lee Power conducted "a review of everything that was happening at the football club" which saw Luke Williams and former Tottenham and Aston Villa manager Tim Sherwood leave their roles as head coach and director of football respectively.

Power appointed David Flitcroft, a promotion-winner from this level before with Bury, with the hope of an automatic return to the third tier.

He said: "I needed to find someone well-versed in getting promotion and David obviously got Bury out of this league. His teams are always fit, experienced and dogged, and his knowledge was second to none. I just felt that's what we need for this season."

The Robins started the campaign well but consecutive home defeats - 3-0 against Crawley and 4-1 against Barnet - saw them tumble down the standings before a 3-0 victory at Luton on Saturday got them back on the right track.

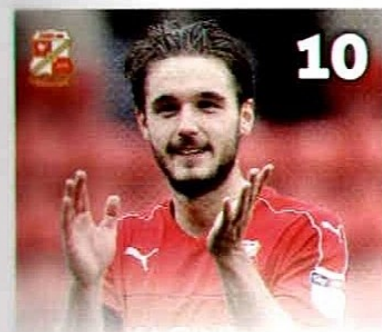

A stunning 2015-16 campaign, during which he scored 17 goals in 41 National League games, alerted a host of EFL clubs but it was Swindon who snapped him up on a three-year deal.

However, Goddard only scored three goals last season as the Robins were relegated to League Two, where he will hope to exert his creative influence this term.

Following retirement in 2011, he joined the coaching staff at Rochdale before moving to Barnsley when Keith Hill was appointed manager at Oakwell.

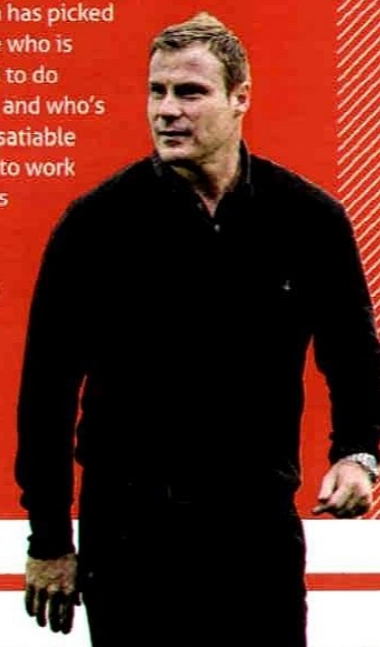
Hill's sacking in December 2012 provided Flitcroft with an opportunity to demonstrate his own management skills and he took it with both hands, leading the Tykes to safety after inheriting the Championship's bottom side.

However, when Barnsley found themselves bottom again 12 months on, Flitcroft was sacked and took charge at former club Bury nine days later.

After guiding the Shakers to safety, he masterminded a promotion the following season, winning 1-0 at Tranmere on the final day to pip Wycombe and Southend to the last automatic spot.

Sacked by Bury in November last year, Swindon offered him a chance to return to the game, something for which he was most grateful.

He said at his unveiling: "The chairman has picked someone who is prepared to do anything and who's got an insatiable appetite to work as hard as anyone to put Swindon back on the map."

RECOLLECTIONS

'MR NOTTS COUNTY', BBC RADIO NOTTINGHAM'S CLUB CORRESPONDENT COLIN SLATER, CRANKS UP THE NOSTALGIA TO RECALL SOME IMPRESSIVE CUP VICTORIES...

Port Vale, where Notts won 10 days ago, and Swindon Town, tonight's visitors, have both had extraordinary cup achievements, made all the more remarkable by the fact they were operating in the league's third tier at the time.

As we shall see, their cup exploits did not adversely affect their league successes.

Swindon went all the way to Wembley, where they achieved a sensational victory over top-flight Arsenal in March 1969 to become the ninth holders of the Football League Cup.

It cannot be claimed that Arsenal manager, Nottingham-born Bertie Mee, fielded a weakened team to assist Swindon's ambitions. The Gunners' line-up included such household names as Bob Wilson, Frank McLintock, George Graham and John Radford.

On the day, Swindon showed the same ability and spirit that had taken them to the final and ran out convincing 3-1 winners, Don Rogers scoring two of their goals and Roger Smart the other. Bobby Gould netted for Arsenal.

En route to Wembley, Swindon overcame two other top-flight clubs, Coventry City in round four and Burnley in the semi-final. This went to three matches before being decided in Swindon's favour on a 5-3 aggregate score. Between these two rounds Swindon also conquered Derby County, who were on their way to winning the Second Division championship.

As if all this wasn't enough, in the same 1968-69 campaign Swindon were promoted from the Third Division to the Second - a fantastic double.

Port Vale fell one hurdle short of booking themselves a Wembley showpiece appearance in the FA Cup final of 1953-54.

They had already disposed of Darlington, Southport, Queens Park Rangers and First Division Cardiff City in rounds one to four before landing the plum draw to face Blackpool in the fifth round.

Blackpool were the FA Cup holders, having beaten Bolton Wanderers 4-3 in the memorable 1953 final, generally referred to as the Matthews Final, even though Stan Mortensen hit a hat-trick!

Vale pulled off a dramatic 2-0 triumph, both their goals being scored by Albert Leake who, operating as a wide player, scored seven FA Cup goals in eight ties.

Vale were also reliant on outstanding defensive strength, conceding only one goal in the run-up to the semi-final. At the same time they were creating a new record of goals conceded in the league, with only 21 recorded in the 'goals against' column, an astonishing record. It helped Vale finish as deserving champions of the old Third Division North.

But in the FA Cup semi-final they conceded two goals to West Bromwich Albion who, at that time, stood on top of the old First Division but had to come from behind at half-time, Leake having given Vale an early lead in front of Villa Park's 68,220 crowd, of whom 25,000 were Vale fans.

Vale's manager was Freddie Steele, a centre forward in his playing days which included a spell with Mansfield Town, who he later managed. He won six England caps, scoring eight times, before a serious injury cut short his international career.

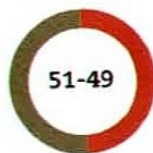

The Cobblers failed to take a single point in League One and were also bundled out of the Carabao Cup by QPR. Was the trigger pulled too soon? Perhaps, but the former Spurs defender can at least console himself that he lasted longer than this lot...



IAN CATHRO - HEARTS

Edinburgh doesn't have to cast his mind far back to see a much earlier victim of the sack race. Heart axed Cathro on 1 August - four days before the start of the current Scottish Premier League season.

Appointed in December, the 31-year-old won only five of his 22 games in charge and embarrassing defeats to Dunfermline and Peterhead in the Betfred Cup proved the cue for an extraordinary pre-emptive strike.

JORN ANDERSEN - MAINZ

Harsh doesn't cover what happened to Andersen on the eve of the 2009-10 season. Having succeeded Jurgen Klopp in the summer of 2008, the Norwegian promptly led Mainz into the top-flight.

The start of a perfect partnership? Not quite. As preparations for the new season began, Andersen's strict rules and inflexible methods antagonised everyone from the changing room to the boardroom. Itching for a chance to pull the trigger, a cup defeat to fourth-tier VFB Lubeck offered a gift-wrapped opportunity and on 3 August, four days before the season opener, Andersen was gone. For his sins, the 54-year-old is currently managing North Korea.



MARK ROBINS - HUDDERSFIELD

Four games? Robins would have loved that luxury. The former Manchester United midfielder's second full season as Huddersfield boss didn't make it past the first weekend of the 2013-14 campaign. A 4-0 drubbing at home to Bournemouth left supporters jeering and Dean Hoyle issuing a boardroom summons. By 9pm, the pair had agreed an "amicable" split. Local MP - and Terriers fan - Jason McCartney was less diplomatic.

"I watched Robins' body language and communication with the players at the game and there was nothing," he said. "Players just looked confused."

MARIO BEEN - APOEL

If Cathro thinks he wasn't given a fair crack, spare a thought for Dutchman Mario Been. The former Feyenoord boss was appointed by Cypriot champions Apoel in May. By 28 July - just three games and 63 days later - he was back on the plane to Holland. Having scraped past Luxembourg minnows F91 Dudelange in the first round of Champions League qualifying, a first-leg defeat to Romanian side Viitorul Constanta prompted a full-scale terrace rebellion.

"I have never experienced such a thing," said a furious Been. "I am 100 per cent sure we would have qualified but the fans here have no patience."

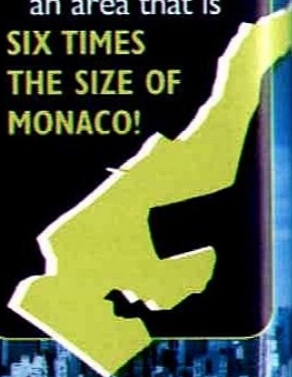

imon Clark is encouraged by the progress being made by the Under 18s this season.

The young Magpies began the campaign with a 4-0 loss at Lincoln City but have responded with a series of positive displays, which have left the club's lead professional development phase coach satisfied with the group after the opening month.

"We're in good shape at the minute," Clark said. "Our expectations at the start of the season were that it would not be easy for us up to Christmas.

"We are coming up against teams who will have eight or nine second-year scholars playing, whereas we're without some of our stronger second years and have some long-term injuries.

"Within the first month of the season we have played Lincoln twice, Rotherham and Mansfield all away from home. They all play totally differently to us; they get the ball forward quickly and rely on a lot of pace, power and strength.

"But we are finding that dominating the ball sees the opposition lose their legs a little bit and we are stronger for that. We grow into games and do the right things.

"Against Rotherham you could see we had a lot of momentum and they were struggling to hold on to us.

For such a young side, it's a great credit to them and really exciting for what is to come after Christmas and for next season.

"This group of first-year scholars, with some Under 16s, will make up the majority of the youth team next year and they'll be in good stead for the experience they'll have picked up this season."

Clark is certain the youngsters will see the benefits in their development sooner rather than later as his young side continues to adapt well to playing above their age group.

"I said to the Under 16s and first-year scholars recently, 'Imagine where you'll be in six months' time, never mind a year'.

"They will have had 12 months' experience playing more than 30 games at a level above so they'll grow in stature, strength and develop game nous.

"If you don't find solutions against bigger, stronger, more physical lads you will go under, but that hasn't been the case of late. We've been better on the ball and created chances so it's invaluable experience for them."

'PLAYING TO THE FINAL WHISTLE' - OVER 50s 'EXTRA TIME' FOOTBALL RETURNS!

On Monday 4 September we saw the return of 'Extra Time', a social inclusion project to help men over 50 keep their body and mind active.

Since its creation in 2010, the project has helped hundreds of men stay active and pursue their passions through two-hour sessions once a week.

Run by FITC coaching staff between 10am-12pm at Melbourne Park, YMCA Community Centre, 'Extra Time's' all ability-encompassing project allows men to meet sport-minded individuals while enjoying the game they love.

Magpies legend Les Bradd spoke highly of the project, saying: "There aren't many projects that receive such a committed response.

"As a former player, I know how important it is to keep physically active as you get older but nothing should stop you from playing the sports you love."

Sport can play a huge part in the physical and mental stimulation of participants during their later years. Micky Ryan, an 'Extra Time' participant after recovering from a triple heart bypass, added: "The project has helped me overcome the mental and physical limitations I suffered as a result of my operation. The coaches are aware of all our abilities,

ailments and niggles and make sure we get the best out of our sessions."

Activities Manager and former Magpie Ian Richardson, who leads the project, explained: "'Extra Time' plays a massive part in participants' physical wellbeing. We have guys who have come every week for months now and I would recommend any man over 50 comes along and gives it a go!"

One such man who took up the opportunity to keep fit and play sport is Notts supporter liaison officer Dougie Pullen, who said: "For me, at the ripe old age of 66, 'Extra Time' is central to my fitness programme.

"The guys all get along well and everything is done in a friendly, sporting environment. We are there primarily to enjoy ourselves and to keep fit.

"There is a healthy sense of camaraderie among us and some of the guys meet together socially as well. Come along and join us for a taster session but, be warned, 'Extra Time' can be addictive!"
