As you know, there are no easy games in this league and still a lot of points to play for. We needed a winning run - but two games do not constitute a run



in my mind. It is only a start and we need keep that going this afternoon.



I would also like to take this opportunity to congratulate Joe Morrell, on behalf of everyone at the club, for his call-up to Wales Under-21s this week, for the midweek game with Liechtenstein. We hope that he comes back safe and sound for this afternoon's game.

Joe Morrell has certainly enjoyed a whirlwind month at Cheltenham Town.

The midfield ace has made his Football League debut, grabbed a stunning first goal for the Robins and even won an international call-up for Wales Under-21s this week.

And the Bristol City loan star is eager to now kick on even more as he looks to help bring the good times to the LCI Rail Stadium.

ROBIN FEATURE INTERVIEW



"It's been a pretty good month and that certainly capped it!" An early Sunday morning phone call from the Welsh set-up completed what has been an unforgettable September for loan signing for Joe Morrell.

Just hours after helping the Robins secure a first away win in Sky Bet League Two since February at Chesterfield, the young midfielder was given a call-up by Wales Under-21 boss Robert Page and jetted out to Liechtenstein.

But level-headed Morrell is eager to take it all in his stride after what he concedes has been the perfect first month at Cheltenham Town.

"I was absolutely delighted to get the official call from Wales. I've probably played for my country at different age groups around 40 times, but a first Under-21 call is special," he said.

"I got it Sunday morning and it was

straight down to camp and then out to Liechtenstein. It's my first time there but I doubt there will be any sightseeing. We have a job to do and mine is to impress and play my part.

"The call-up is recognition for what I have done at Cheltenham and I am indebted to the club. Teams were not queuing up to take me on loan, but Cheltenham gave me that chance.

"The support of the galler and my team-mates is crucial and hopefully I can kick-on now and keep producing for the rest of the season."

Morrell was thrust into the starting line-up against Stevenage for his Football League debut on September 2, when Nigel Atangana was a late withdrawal with illness.

The 20-year-old has hardly looked back since, winning the man of the-match award on debut and cementing his place in the engine room of the side. "WE ARE PLAYING WITH CONFIDENCE AND ENJOYING THE STYLE OF FOOTBALL WE'RE PRODUCING - THERE IS REAL BELIEF IN THE SQUAD"

But the Ipswich-bern ace believes there is still even more to come from his game.

"The transition has been made easier for me by coming into a team that is playing well and with confidence," he said.

"We have tried to play a passing, techincal game; that has helped me to adapt. The style is one I am used to and the lads have been really helpful.

"Hopefully this is just the early stages of a long career for me and I'm still picking things up and trying to learn. I'm really mjoying it.

I feel there is more to come. I've only been here for a month, but everything I have seen has been positive and we could have picked up a lot more points than we actually have. We've all spoken about the importance of going on a run now."

Morrell's move to Cheltenham ceme just before transfer deadline day – when he swapped Ashton Gate Stedium for the LCI Rail Stadium alongside team-mates Taylor Moore and Freddie Hinds.

However, he admits the game with Stevenage was not his first appearance at Whaddon Road – that actually came for Wales Under-16s against England in 2011.

"I was 1.5 and it was only my second game for Wales," Morrell said. "The match was live on Sky and all my mates from Bristol came to watch.

"We lost and I gave away a ponalty, but it was a memorable day and my first taste of playing at Whaddon Road.

"Thankfully this time has gone a little hetter," he smiled. "It's been a fantastic month with my Football League debut, the call-up and my first goal.

Morrell has quickly been taken to the hearts of every fan in red and white, with his performances earning rave reviews and seeing him named the Autovillage Player of the Month earlier veek

And the iconic image of him wheeling away in absolute delight after scoring his first Fontball League goal against Mansfield has quickly become a social media hit shared by fans and friends alike.

"It was a nice feeling," said Morrell, "I saw Freddie Hinds is claiming it for telling me to shoot more... so I am going to make sure I claim his first goal too!

"All three of us from Bristol City have settled in really well and we want to play a big part here over the next few months. The support from the fans and messages has been great and means a great deal to us."

The Robins were flying high in their first season back in the GM Vauxhall Conference as October rolled around.



Dale Watkins' double in the derby at Kidderminster had made it six league games unbeaten and earned the Robins their sixth win in 11 games.

September had come and gone with a fine unbeaten record in both Conference and FA Cup and there were high hopes for what October would bring.

Conference ever-presents Northwich Victoria were the visitors for the first game of the month – and it proved to be a real thriller.

Crowds were holding consistently at around 1.500 for Saturday home games – seems nothing now, but then it was almost double what the average had been the year before.

The 1,606 at Whaddon Road for the visit of Victoria were treated to one of the goals of the season, albeit not by a Robins player.

Derren Vicary scored an unbelievable dipping volley from nearly 40 yards for the visitors, winning a round of applause from Robins boss Steve Cotterill in the process, but in the end it was a consolation.

Jason Eaton carried on his fine early-season form netting a brace, while Keith Knight slammed home his first Conference goal of the season as the Robins ended up the victors by the odd goal in five.

The next game would end in defeat - not that anyone cared.

The Conference League Cup was never a trophy to warm the cockles. It had been long since disbanded for our brief return to the fifth tier in 2015 and it was never much of an attraction.

The Robins were given a trip to Yeovil Town in the first round of what was then called the Spalding Challenge Cup and promptly lost.



Dean Birkby's hat-trick for the hosts meant Watkins' 10th Robins goal counted for very little as an exit was secured at the first hurdle.

The following weekend saw more Cup action as Paulton Rovers of the Western League Premier Division were the visitors in the FA Cup third qualifying round.

The Somerset side were no match for a powerful Robins side who won 5-0 in pouring rain in front of a sparse crowd of just 827.

An own-goal set the hosts on their way before Dale Watkins, Bob Bloomer – with his first of the season – Jimmy Smith and Mark Crisp, with his one and only Robins goal secured a place in the final qualifying round.

The draw saw another home tie, this time against Sutton United of the Isthmian League. Of a more pressing concern to Robins boss Steve Cotterill, however, was the future of on-loan defender Billy Clark.

Signed for a month from Bristol Rovers to cover the absence of Mark Freeman, who had suffered a nasty cut on his leg in the win against Rushden at the end of August, Clark had excelled. A player with more than 250 Football League appearances to his name, he had looked calm, assured and classy alongside Chris Banks.

But with the Robins still a parttime outfit, Cotterill was facing a battle to keep his man ahead of two of the toughest tests of the season, the long trip to Gateshead and the home clash with pace-setters Halifax Town

20 YEARS ON MIKE DAVIS

Mike Davis was synonymous with Cheltenham Town for many decades. His long and successful association started as a youth team player and saw him work his way up through the ranks to eventually be assistant manager.

He was to become Steve Cotterill's trusted number two throughout his time in charge, and later remained as second in command to Graham Aliner.

And he recounts the never to be forgotten 1997/98 campaign with fond memories, as the Robins soared in the FA Trophy and landed the biggest of prizes at the home of English football.

"Our league campaign had gone well that season, we were there or thereabouts as we finished second to Halifax Town, but the FA Trophy was where we really clicked," said Davis, whose wife Debbie still works for the Robins as manager of the club shop.





To play at Wembley is truly special and I was lucky enough to go with my club. My father even travelled back from a holiday in Spain for the final - it was that big a game!

"I remember being at the team hotel the day before, because our game was on a Sunday, and watching the FA Cup Final between Arsenal and Newcastle with Steve. We were all excited and looking forward to the game "It was unchartered waters for us, but we were well prepared because we had strong leadership and we knew the players were good enough to win it. There was a real togetherness and that was the vital ingredient.

"Driving down the motorway from the hotel to the stadium on the bus, all you could see were coaches coming from Cheltenham, I had to pinch myself to realise I wasn't just dreaming.

"The day itself I remember was very hot and I can picture going down Wembley Way. As a kid you dream of

that, you watch every England game, every FA Cup final and remember 1966 and the World Cup. It was magical."

Davis admits the game itself was a difficult one for the Robins as they struggled to battle past Southport until the defining moment arrived in the 79th minute.

"When we scored it was a fantastic feeling, Russ (Milton) floated it in a free kick after good work by Jimmy Smith and the next thing you know Jason (Eaton) has scored with his head. Credit to Steve [Cotterill] because just a few minutes before he made two substitutions and it changed the game," he added.

"I think we all knew that Southport were the better team on the day however Wembley is not the place to go and lose. They gave man-ofthe-match to Brian Butler, which probably says it all really. But the noise when we won, hearing over 18,000 of your fans - that is when the magnitude of what you have done really strikes you."

"We were likeminded and we knew what we wanted to achieve - we worked hard... and that year hard work won a trophy."

Cheltenham – with Cotterill and Davis in tandem – were to enjoy more highs the following season as promotion to the Football League was secured ahead of Kettering Town and Davis revealed how the two men had always had a strong bond that worked

"I was a few years older than Steve and, with him being a young manager maybe he needed my calming influence around him. We had played together for a spell in the



reserve team but he obviously went on to bigger and better things... whereas I had found my level," he smiled.

"We had a chemistry and I guess I was a good foil for him and we just worked well together. I understood him and how to get a message across, and crucially when was the right time. I was the go-between for Steve and the players

"We complemented each other well, but without doubt he was the main man and I had a supportive role. I enjoyed that time and felt I was a good number two – it was all I ever wanted to be."

Davis left his position as assistant manager in 2003 and, although retaining a role in youth development at the club for more seasons, he moved forward in a new career direction.

He was unveiled as the Managing Director of Gloucester-based aluminium specialists CDW Systems Limited in November last year and recently became co-owner and Chairman of the East Manor Group which owns three operating companies with a collective turnover in excess of £10 million a year

"Football is a precarious occupation," admitted Davis, "My heart and soul was always at Cheltenham and it did hurt when it all ended prematurely. I had a brief spell at West Bromwich Albion Academy afterwards working with Dan Ashworth who is now director of elite development at the FA, but I didn't want all the travelling.

"I looked for a new direction in my career and new challenge so I went from football back into industry. I'm really enjoying my current role and where it has taken me.

"I don't get back to Whaddon Road as much as I would like now due to business and family commitments, but I wish the club well," he added. "I've met Gary (Johnson) a few times over the years and obviously know Russ (Milton), Booky (Steve Book) and some of the Directors. It's great to see the recent run of form.

"I have fond memories that never fade away of my time at Cheltenham and particularly the 1997/98 season which was the catalyst for the ongoing success story. We had no real stars and were not the best individually, but collectively we were strong, organised, like minded and mentally tough; together we could deal with the pressure.

"The trophy success was a real springboard for us and a special season never to be forgotten."

The Cod Army were flying high in third place in their first season of Football League action when they visited Whaddon Road.

The Robins were themselves in fine fettle following a superb 1-0 midweek win at Bristol Rovers and the crowd of 2,702 were not disappointed with an action packed game.

David Ball gave the visitors a firsthalf lead with a scrambled goal and they held the advantage until the hour-mark when the Robins struck.

Jeff Goulding had only just entered the fray as a substitute



when he got on the end of another scramble following a Billy Jones corner to slam home his first of the season.

Another Jones corner was the route to the Robins' 74th minute lead as Sido Jornbati leapt highest to head home.

But a dramatic twist happened in stoppage time as first Junior Brown levelled for the visitors and then Robins skipper Alan Bennett saw red for his role in a melee seconds before the final whistle.

In normal circumstances a goal scored thanks to a pretty blatant handball or a fight that saw two men shown red cards would generate the headlines, but this night was unique.

The Robins were on a wretched run of one win in eight as they headed to Vale Park and moods were not lifted when David McGoldrick put the hosts ahead thanks to the intervention of his arm.

Andy Lindegoard and Vale's Jason Talbot were then shown red cards for a brawl midway through the first half before Vale went on to claim two more goals in an easy win.

And then the drama unfolded.



Robins boss John Ward conducted his post-match press conference as normal, finishing seconds before 10pm when Robins secretary and director Paul Godfrey made a startling announcement.

Ward was off to be Carlisle manager with immediate effect. The Robins board had negotiated a 'transfer fee' of a substantial six-figure sum and the boss of nearly five years was off.

Another round of interviews were done and it was announced that Ward's assistant Keith Downing would be taking charge as caretaker boss, with his former boss' encouragement to take it full time.

All this began to filter through to startled supporters on their way back down the ME, who suddenly had something more pressing to chat about, rather than handballs and red cards for fighting.

Class act Wellens then added the second with a delightful chip over Steve Book before Richard Walker made the game safe late on with a powerful strike.

The one massive bright spot of the afternoon was the return to Robins colours of a certain Grant McCann.

The midfielder returned on loan from West Ham for a second stint – one that would be made permanent in January for a club record £50,000 fee.

t's a local fixture this afternoon between two sides who look like they're starting to gather some momentum as the season moves into its third month.

Whilst Gary Johnson's side are now unbeaten in four league games with ten points from a possible 12, David Filtcroft will be just as optimistic in the opposing dugout with his Robins outfit having won four of their last six matches, only losing to high-flying Netts County and Coventry City.

Following back-to-back heavy home defeats to Crawley (0-3) and Barnet (1-4) just over a month ago, a hengover from last season's relegation appeared in full swing. An impressive 3-0 win away at fancied Luton followed, though, and Flitcroft's side haven't really looked back.

Their recent run of good form has seen the Wiltshire side climb to ninth in the League Two table, just one win behind fourth-placed Coventry City as they begin to eye an immediate return to the third tier.

Relegation to League Two saw a mass turnover of players in the close season, with 14 departing the County



Ground and 12 arriving permanently, as well as an additional five loanee additions.

Despite the influx of new faces on show, it has been a slightly longerterm Robin who has taken centre stage this season. Luke Norris struggled for form in front of goal last season at the County Ground, but has already netted seven goals in 12 appearances this time around - with five in his last seven.

The 24-year-old is an injury doubt

for this afternoon though having appeared to dislocate his shoulder in last weekend's win over Cambridge.

"He's in a sling and I'm presuming the shoulder has popped again but I can't give a definitive on that," Flitcroft told the Swindon Advertiser after the game.

In their last local game this season, Flitcroft's side won 2-0 at Forest Green Rovers in front of the Sky Sports cameras thanks to goals from Olly Lancashire and Matt Taylor.

DID YOU KNOW?

Swindon won the Anglo-Italian Cup in 1969/70, beating Napoll 3-0 in the final. The Robins also beat Juventus home and away in the group stage.

Young goalkeeper who joined the Robins from Liverpool, initially on loan, for the 2015/16 campaign. Having featured 37 times during his loan spell, the 23-year-old shot-stopper made the move permanent at the start of last season and was almost everpresent at the County Ground, Before moving to Anfield, Vigouroux had previously spent time in the academies of both Brentford and Tottenham Hotspur, along with a loan spell at non-league Hyde.



33-year-old Purkiss brings experience to the new-look Rabins defence after his summer arrival from Port Vale. Starting out at Sheffield United, the defender moved to Gainsborough after failing to make a league appearance at Bramall Lane. A lengthy stint with York followed, before spells with Oxford, Darlington, Hereford and Walsall. After making 85 appearances for the Saddiers, Purkiss has been with Vale for the past two campaigns.



OLLY LANCASHIRE

A product of the Southampton academy. Lancashire made a handful of appearances for the Saints as they dropped into League One in 2008/09. His senior career was established at Walsall, though, spending two years at the Bescot Stadium before switching to Aldershot for 2012/13. With the Shots dropping out of the league, the 28-yearold defender moved to Rochdale for three seasons before spending last year at Shrewsbury Town.



27-year-old midfielder Linganzi joined the Robins this summer after departing Portsmouth. The Congolese man found the net once for Pompey last season as the South Coast club won promotion to League One. A product of the Saint-Etienne academy, Linganzi moved to England with Blackburn in 2009, and has since spent time with Accrington and Gillingham. A brief return to France followed for the 2015/16 campaign before he came back to join Portsmouth.



Developed in the academy at Arsenal, Dunne made his senior debut after dropping down to Exeter in 2009. 127 appearances later, he moved to Stevenage where he continued as a regular performer in the third tier. Having fallen out of favour with Graham Westley. Dunne was sent out on loan to St Johnstone in Scotland before joining Portsmouth for a season in League Two. He made Cambridge his home for the last two seasons though and joined the Robins this summer.



Another new arrival this season as David Flitcroft looks to mould a side capable of challenging for an immediate return to League One. Gordon arrives at the County Ground on a season-long loan deal from Championship Derby County, joining along with his Rams teammate Timi Elsnik. The 19-year-old midfielder has featured once at Pride Park, and has so far appeared seven times for Flitcroft's side.



Forward Anderson is another loan signing for the Robins this season, joining temporarily from struggling Premier League outfit Crystal Palace. The 22-yearold has enjoyed similar loan spells with Doncaster, Bolton and Northampton since joining the Eagles from Barton Rovers in 2015 He has made 40 appearances in his four loan spells to date, finding the back of the net nine times - two of which have come so far for Swindon. His loan deal runs until January.



Another former Walsall player amongst the Robins' back line, 22-year-old Preston came through the ranks with the Saddlers, only leaving the Bescot Stadium this summer to move to Wiltshire, Birmingham-born Preston came through the academy with Walsall and spent time out on loan with Icelandic side IBV as well as - more locally - Barwell. The defender made 50 appearances for Walsall after skippering the youth team, but joined David Flitcroft's side this summer.



MATT TAYLOR

Hugely experienced wing-back Taylor made the Robins his seventh club this summer after leaving Northampton, Taylor broke through with Luton before lengthy spells with Portsmouh, Bolton and West Ham saw him rack up over 300 top-flight appearances. With his career winding down, the 35-year-old has dropped down the leagues in recent vears but still netted eight times for the Cobblers last. season to show he's not quite finished just yet!



Woolery was arguably the Robins headline capture of the summer, paying a fee in the region of £350,000 to prise the forward away from Wigan on a three-year contract. The 22-year-old hit the headlines when scoring twice for Forest Green Rovers in the National League play-off final in May, but he only appeared once for Wigan after joining them in January. Woolery had previously played 24 times during a three-year stay with their Lancashire rivals, Balton.



An injury doubt for this afternoon after picking up a shoulder injury last weekend, 24-year-old forward Norris is the Robins top scorer so far this season with seven goals in 12 games. The Stevenageborn goalscorer made his senior breakthrough with Brentford where he spent time on loan with Boreham Wood, Northampton and Dagenham. A permanent. move to Gillingham saw him make 79 appearances before joining Swindon ahead of the 2016/17 season.

SWINDON TOWN INCHARGE DAVID FLITCROFT

David Flitcroft was announced as Swindon Town's new Manager on Monday 5th June 2017, putting pen to paper on a two-year contract.

Born in Bolton, Flitcroft began his career with Preston North End in 1992 but he only made a handful of outings for the club before spending a short stint on loan with Lincoln City.

A move to Chester City saw him rack up nearly 200 appearances before joining Rochdale, clocking up over a century of games at Spotland too. Short spells with Macclesfield, Bury and Hyde followed before ending his playing career.

He rejoined Rochdale as Keith Hill's assistant and the pair were both snapped up by Barnsley in 2011. It was at Dakwell where Flitcroft was handed his first shot at the big time after Hill's departure, Flitcroft guiding his side to Championship survival in dramatic fashion.



He steered Bury to survival in League Two hefore following it with promotion to League One the season after in his most recent managerial role, before returning to management with the Robins this
