The reaction the boys showed at Bath after losing narrowly to Chelmsford in the previous game was really good (especially considering we had key players missing and went down to 10 men). And then to beat a strong St Albans side who were level on points with us at the top of the table before the game was great. We spoke beforehand about the importance of staying at the top after working so hard to get there, and that is exactly what we did. It was a tough game, but we deservedly came through as the winners in the end - showing a bit of character along the way. The aim is to stay there now!

Today is a fantastic opportunity to cause one of those famous cup upsets that we see every year. MATCH PREVIEW SWINDON TOWN



Dartford can look forward to their biggest cup game at Princes Park in seven years when they take on League Two promotion chasers Swindon Town.

It's only the second time in the history of Princes Park that Dartford have hosted a Football League side in a competitive match, a rare opportunity to become giantkillers. Whilst the Darts go into The Emirates FA Cup first round tie having maintained and stretched their lead at the top of the National South last weekend, their former Premier League opponents are two divisions above in fifth place.

As well as prize money and coverage on a national level, Tony Burman is hoping the feel good factor returns to Dartford, he spoke to www.kentonline. co.uk after the draw was made and said: "It's a good draw for us. It will be a big day for the club and the town and I hope it'll bring in a big crowd. It's something we can all look forward to", he added: "It would be nice to get the enthusiasm going again and bring back some good times. Everyone deserves it", he continued: "These days are something we all want to look forward to and be proud of what we've achieved as a football club and get the interest back".

Last weekend, a consecutive 2-1 victory this time at home to St Albans City moved Tony Burman's side two points clear at the summit of the National South. Richard Sho-Silva returned to the defence to partner Ronnie Vint, Mark Onyemah started after recovering from a minor injury and Tom Bonner was on the bench after being sidelined by a head injury against Bath City. Keaton Wood was suspended for the league win but will be available against Swindon Town. Andy Pugh will miss out after his red card appeal was rejected, the striker was sent off in the 2-1 win over Bath City. The Darts welcomed the win over St Albans City, a side they have struggled against in recent meetings, thanks to a former Dartford player. Tom Bender scored an own goal in the second half which turned out to be decisive. Earlier in the match Sho-Silva caused some trouble with his long throws into the Saints box and on six minutes Elliot Bradbrook nodded one in for the opener. The Saints came back with an equaliser five minutes before the interval when Charlie Walker fired beyond Deren Ibrahim. In the second half Bender's own goal gave Dartford an important three points on a day other promotion challengers slipped up.

Burman was delighted with the outcome and in his post match interview he said: "We had to dig in, we had a bit of luck which we haven't had in other games", he added: "What's pleasing is from last Saturday, seven days in football, we've gone and won two games as a reaction from losing at Chelmsford City".

Swindon Town will know preparation will be key to avoiding an upset at the first round stage. Ben Futcher, Assistant Manager told www.swindontownfc.co.uk: "We've seen the draw and it is somewhere we've not been before. Dartford are doing quite well in the league so it will be a tough game away from home, but one we're looking forward to," he added: "The early rounds are tough because the non-league sides can be banana skins and it will be a tough match, but we'll prepare as we would for a league game and we'll go there looking to win".

The Robins will want to avoid slipping on a 'banana skin' after doing exactly that a year ago. After a 1-1 draw with National League side Eastliegh they lost 3-1 at home in the replay. Swindon Town also lost to non league opposition two years in a row in 2012 and 2013, both times against Macclesfield Town, Crawley Town in 2010 and Histon in 2008.

Last weekend, the Robins defeated Port Vale, the side Dartford lost to in a F.A Cup replay seven years ago after the 1-1 draw at Princes Park. The 3-0 victory earned David Flitcroft's side back to back wins in which they took the lead early in the second half, through Matty Taylor's freekick. With twenty minutes remaining Paul Mullin made an impact grabbing the second goal of the afternoon and Kellan Gordon netted his first professional goal, seconds after entering the action as a substitute.

Away from home, the Robins have a strong defence conceding just five times on their travels in eight fixtures. They have won six of those matches on the road only losing twice. Luke Norris leads the way in the goal scoring charts with seven to his name and Mullin is behind with four league this term.

After relegation last season, Flitcroft was named boss in June and has made a solid start to life at the County Ground. The former Chester City, Rochdale and Bury midfielder started his managerial career at Barnsley just five years ago. He guided the Tykes to safety, moved to Bury to repeat the feat and took the Shakers up to League One, now the 43 year old hopes to get Swindon Town back up.

The Wiltshire club have been members of the Football League since 1920, they won the League Cup in 1969 beating Arsenal 3-1 at Wembley and reached the Premier League in 1993, finishing bottom in their only season in the top flight conceding a record 100 goals.

Only once before have the Darts faced the Robins and that was way back in 1933. The F.A Cup second round tie ended 1-0 to the hosts Swindon Town. In the thirties Dartford faced Swindon Town Reserves on six occasions, twice in the London Combination Second Division and four times in the Southern League. In each of the three campaigns Dartford won one and lost the other.

Dartford have won 3, drawn 8 and lost 19 against Football League opposition in The Emirates FA Cup.

The Darts last beat Football League opposition in the 1968/69 season when the knocked out Aldershot 3-1 in the first round at home. The other two victories were against Exeter City in 1961/62, the first game ended 3-3 and the replay was won by the Darts 2-1. In the historic 1935/36 cup run Dartford beat Cardiff City 3-0 in the first round, the season the Darts lost 3-2 to top flight Derby County in the third round.

Four of the last five FA Cup ties against Football League teams have ended in a replay. In 2010, the Darts lost 4-0 at Port Vale after a 1-1 draw. In 1989, Exeter City were held 1-1 at Watling Street before overcoming the Darts 4-1 in the second match. In consecutive seasons Dartford drew with AFC Bournemouth 1-1 in 1984 before losing 4-1 and a year later drew 0-0 prior the 2-0 replay defeat. Bradford City ended that sequence with a 4-1 win at Valley Parade in 2014.

The 8th December 1984 will go down in the memory of many Dartford supporters as one of their most memorable experiences.

CLUB FACTFILE THE MANAGER - DAVID FLITCROFT



Dave Flitcroft was announced as Swindon Town's new Manager on Monday 5th June 2017, putting pen to paper on a two-year contract.

Born in Bolton, Flitcroft began his career with Preston North End in 1992. A move to Chester City took place the following year and the tough-tackling midfielder went on to play a key role in the club's promotion to Division Two.

Flitcroft agreed a switch to Rochdale in 1999 and it proved to be a match made in heaven with The Dale reaching the Division Two Play-Offs in 2001 /02, in addition to making it all the way to the Fifth Round of the FA Cup the following season.

Flitcroft went on to have short spells with Macclesfield Town, Bury and Hyde before deciding to call time on his playing career.

He opted to cut his teeth in coaching midway through the 2006/07 campaign, joining old club Rochdale as Keith Hill's Assistant. And it was at Oakwell where Flitcroft was handed his first shot at the big time after he was placed in Caretaker charge following Hill's departure during the 2012/13 season.

It did the trick too with Flitcraft guiding his side to some impressive results on their way to securing their Championship status in dramatic circumstances, exploits that led to the former player being handed the top job on a permeant basis.

He then took over at Bury in December 2013 and again performed miracles, steering the club away from the relegation zone and to an impressive 12th placed finish.

It got even better the following season as, after some impressive work in the transfer market, The Shakers set a new club record for points picked up on their way to securing automatic promotion to League One.

Following a spell working in recruitment for Leicester City, Flitcroft was back in management earlier this month after taking over at The County Ground where he'll be hoping to add another promotion to his CV.



Swindon Town Football Club was founded by Reverend William Pitt of Liddington in 1879.

The team turned professional in 1894 and joined the Southern League which was founded in the same year.

Originally playing in black and white with the addition of blue sash for away games, the club changed to black and red quarters on entry to the Southern League in 1894. The club changed again in 1897 with green shirts, with white sleeves. Town changed their shirts to the more familiar red in 1901. Initially a dark maroon, a lighter shade was chosen for the start of the 1902-03 season and also resulted in the club's nickname "the Robins" appearing in print for the first time in programme notes for the first game.

Swindon reached the FA Cup semi-finals for the first time in the 1909-10 season, losing to eventual winners Newcastle United.

In 1910-11, Swindon Town won the Southern League championship, earning them a Charity Shield match with the Football League champions Manchester United. This, the highest-scoring Charity Shield game to date, was played on 25 September 1911 at Stamford Bridge with Manchester United winning 8-4. Some of the proceeds of this game were later donated to the survivors of the Titanic.

Swindon entered the Football League in 1920 as a founding member of Division Three and defeated Luton Town F.C. 9-1 in their first game of the season. This result stands as a record for the club in League matches.

The club secured their first ever promotion in 1962/63. Bert Head's young side finished second in Division Three and included players like Ernie Hunt and Mike Summerbee.

In 1969 Swindon beat Arsenal 3-1 to win the League Cup for the first and only time in the club's history. Roger Smart opened the scoring before two goals from club legend Don Rogers sealed victory, a triumph that still stands as Town's greatest ever achievement.

As they were not a First Division club, Swindon were denied entry into the Fairs' Cup (latterly the UEFA Cup and Europa League) so a two-legged, Anglo-Italian League Cup Winners' Cup tie against Coppa Italia winners AS Roma was arranged. Town triumphed 5-2 on aggregate. Later on in the 1969/70 season, Town won the inaugural AngloItalian Cup competition, beating Napoli 3-0 in the final.

Despite a number of management changes, Swindon went through a long unsuccessful period culminating in them being relegated in 1982 to the Fourth Division.

Following the appointment of Lou Macari in 1984, they were promoted as Division Four champions in 1986 with the club achieving a Football League record of 102 points, becoming the second club to score over 100 points in a season and breaking no fewer than 16 club records in the process. A year later they defeated Gillingham in the Third Division play-offs to achieve a second successive promotion.

Macari left in 1989 to take charge of West Ham United with former Argentine international Ossie Ardiles replacing him. In his first season Swindon were Second Division play-off winners beating Sunderland 1-0 at Wembley. However, the club later admitted 36 charges of breaching league rules, 35 due to illegal payments made to players, and were relegated to the Third Division. A later appeal saw Swindon Town being allowed to stay in the Second Division.

Swindon progressed well during the 1991-92 season, Glenn Hoddle's first full season as manager, and just missed out on the Second Division play-offs.

In 1992-93 Swindon beat Leicester City 4-3 in the Division One play-off final to achieve promotion to the Premiership bringing top-division football to the club for the first time.

They were relegated at the end of 1993-94 after recording only five wins and conceding 100 goals. The following year, Swindon were relegated for the second successive time and slipped into Division Two.

Swindon won the Division Two Championship in 1996 under the stewardship of former Liverpool midfielder Steve McMahon.

The club were relegated to League Two in 2006 which meant that they became the first ever former Premiership team to be demoted to the lowest Football League division.

Paul Sturrock was appointed manager in November 2006 and he guided Swindon to promotion to League One in his first season with the club.

In 2008 Swindon Town was taken over by a consortium fronted by local businessman Andrew Fitton.

A disappointing season then followed, as Maurice Malpas endured a tough spell at the club, leading them into relegation trouble from which Danny Wilson did well to rescue them - guiding them to 15th in League One at the end of the 2008/2009 season thanks to some standout performances from the likes of Simon Cox and Gordon Greer.

The 2009/10 season, which was highlighted by the emergence of striker Charlie Austin, ended in Play-Off Final heartbreak for Wilson's men as they went down 1-0 to Millwall, the club's first defeat at Wembley.

After relegation back to the basement division in 2010/11, former West Ham United, Sheffield Wednesday and Celtic striker Paolo Di Canio took the reigns at The Energy Check County Ground. The Italian led the club to the League Two Title in 2011/12, securing an instant return to League One in his first season in charge.

The 2011 / 12 season was also a memorable one in the cup competitions. The club were awarded the Ronnie Radford Award for their efforts in eliminating Premier League side Wigan Athletic in the Third Round of the FA Cup, triumphing 2-1 in front of a packed The Energy Check County Ground. Di Canio also led his team out at Wembley in the Final of the Johnstone's Paint Trophy where they lost 2-0 to Chesterfield.

After making the Play-Off semi-finals in the 2012/13 season - eventually losing to Brentford on penalties in the second leg after netting a dramatic, injury-time equaliser - Town would make it to Wembley at the end of the 2014/15 campaign. Under the stewardship of Mark Cooper, the Robins would reach the national stadium following a breathtaking 5-5 draw with Sheffield United in the semi-final second leg at

the The Energy Check County Ground. Unfortunately for Swindon's young side, they were beaten 4-0 by Preston North End in the final.

Following a slow start to the 2015/16 season, Mark Cooper left his role as Manager of the football club and his position was filled by Martin Ling.

As a result, First-Team Coach Luke Williams was promoted to the role of Head Coach and he successfully led his side to safety last term, but he could not repeat the trick in 2016/17.

Dave Flitcroft was appointed as Town's new First-Team Manager in June 2017

OPPONENTS: SWINDON TOWN



Lawrence Vigouroux has established himself as a key figure at SN1 and he will no doubt be looked upon to play an instrumental role in Town's bid to seek an immediate return to League One.

The firm fan favourite first arrived at The County Ground in August 2015 on a season-long loan deal from Premier League outfit Liverpool. He wasted little time in making the number one jersey his own and he finished his debut campaign in Wiltshire with 36 outings under his belt. However, Vigouroux really came to the fore during the 2016/17 campaign, producing a string of brilliant displays to keep twelve clean sheets, despite the Reds' relegation to the Sky Bet League Two.



Lancashire began his career as a youth player for Crystal Palace before joining Southampton's academy. He captained Southampton's under-18 side and turned professional in July 2006, making his senior debut in 2008. Lancashire had two loan spells at Grimsby Town in 2009/10 and, following his release by Southampton, joined Walsall in July 2010. He made 58 appearances for Walsall, but was released in the summer of 2012 and subsequently went to Aldershot Town. In July 2013, Lancashire made a permanent transfer to then-League Two side Rochdale, after leaving relegated Aldershot.

In 2016 Lancashire joined Shrewsbury Town. Hei joined Swindon in the summer of 2017 after terminating his contract with Shrewsbury. He is the Swindon Town captain.



James Brophy is preparing to enter into his third season with Town after first arriving at The County Ground in the summer of 2015.

After impressing during a successful trial, the flying wing-back was handed a one-year deal at SN1 and he impressed during his debut season in professional football, earning a new deal prior to the start of the 2016/17 campaign.

Brophy, who plied his trade for Edgware Town prior to his move to Wiltshire, scored his first goal for The Reds against QPR in August 2016 and he finished last term with 33 games under his belt. Luke Norris bolstered Town's attacking options in August 2016 after arriving from Gillingham for an undisclosed fee, putting per to paper on a three-year deal at The County Ground.

The powerful striker, who has previously plied his trade for Hitchin Town, Brentford, Boreham Wood, Northampton Town and Dagenham & Redbridge, opened his account for The Reds in November 2016 against Exeter City.

After finishing last season with six goals to his name, Norris will be looking to improve on that tally in 2017/18 and help fire Town to promotion from the Sky Bet League Two.
SELECTED PLAYER PROFILES

WILL HENRY - GOALKEEPER

Highly-rated goalkeeper Will Henry will be looking to kick on this season after making real progress in 2016/17.

Henry burst onto the scene in April 2016 after saving a penalty on his Town debut away at Rochdale. Once on the books of Bristol City, the talented stopper signed a professional deal that summer and went on to make seven appearances in 2016/17, while he was also invited to an England Elite Goalkeepers Camp on more than one occasion last term. He will now be looking to impress in pre-season in order to stake a claim for the number one jersey at SN1.

DION CONROY - DEFENDER

Dion Conroy enjoyed a fine start to life at The County Ground and he will no doubt look to establish himself as a key figure at the heart of the defence in 2017/18.

The central defender signed for Town from Premier League giants Chelsea for an undisclosed fee in January 2017, putting pen to paper on a two-and-a-half-year-deal. He was chucked right in at the deep end and, despite being unable to help Town preserve their League One status, he produced a number of hugely encouraging displays at the heart of the defence.

Good with the ball at his feet and more than capable of getting stuck in when it comes to the physical side of the game, Conroy, who has also plied his trade for Aldershot, will no doubt have a big part to play for The Reds in League Two.

JOHN GODDARD - MIDFIELDER

John Goddard signed for Town on a three-year-deal in May 2016 after The Reds paid an undisclosed fee to Woking for his services.

The attacking force bagged 20 goals in all competitions for Woking during the 2015/16 National League season, winning the club's Player of the Season Award and earning a move to The County Ground as a result.

Despite it being his first season as a professional footballer, Goddard adapted well to life in League One last season and he opened his account for Town away at Shrewsbury in October 2016.

Goddard, who has also won two caps for England C, finished the 2016/17 campaign with three goals and five assists in 48 outings, and he will be looking to go from strength to strength this season.

ELLIS IANDOLO - MIDFIELDER

Ellis landolo put pen to paper on a professional deal with The Reds in August 2015 following a successful trial period.

Once on the books of boyhood club Gillingham, the attacker caught the eye of Town whilst plying his trade for the Soccer Elite FA Academy, paving the way for a move to Wiltshire.

landolo made 13 outings during his debut season at SN1 before featuring on 15 occasions in 2016/17, scoring his first-ever goal for the club courtesy of a stunning effort from long-range against Luton Town in December 2016.

Town opted to hand the 19-year-old a new one-year deal earlier this summer and he will now be looking to play a key role in The Reds' bid to secure an immediate return to the Sky Bet League One.

TOM SMITH - MIDFIELDER

Tom Smith will be looking to cement himself as a firstteam regular in 2017/18 having shown his quality in his previous three seasons as a professional at The County Ground.

The highly-rated midfielder was handed his first professional contract in the summer of 2014, going on to make his first-team debut away at Preston North End in 2015 before opening his account for the club with a stunning effort against Crewe Alexandra in September 2015.

Smith featured twelve times for Town last term while he spent a short spell out on loan with League of Ireland First Division outfit, Waterford, scoring once in ten outings.

He will now be hoping to establish himself as a key figure in the Town midfield ahead of the 2017/18 campaign.

SCOTT TWINE - ATTACKER

Fresh after making his Swindon Town debut at the tail end of last season, Scott Twine will be hoping to make an impact in his first season as a pro footballer.

Having notched over 30 goals in a stellar season for the U18's, the striker was rewarded with a first-team debut away at Charlton Athletic on the final day of the 2016/17 campaign, replacing Islam Feruz in the second-half.

Twine will now be hoping to impress throughout pre-season in order to force his way into the manager's plans
