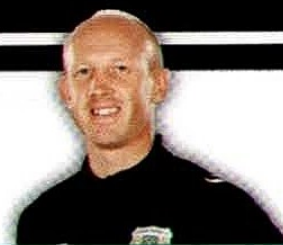

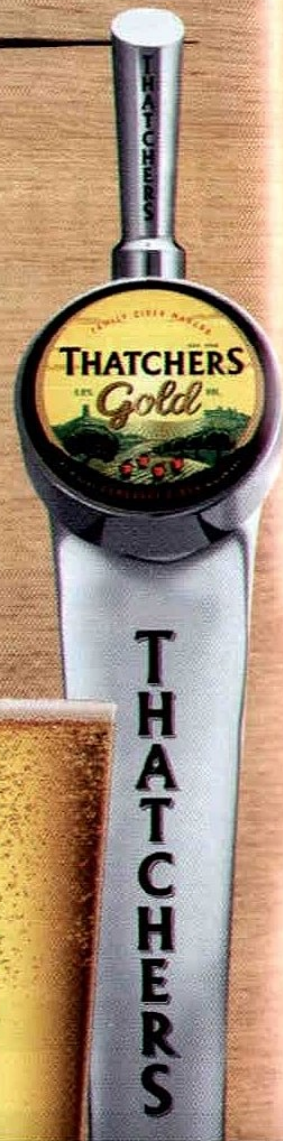

Of course, we don't want to jinx anything but we're determined to keep this run of form going at home especially whilst we look for that consistent winning formula on our travels.

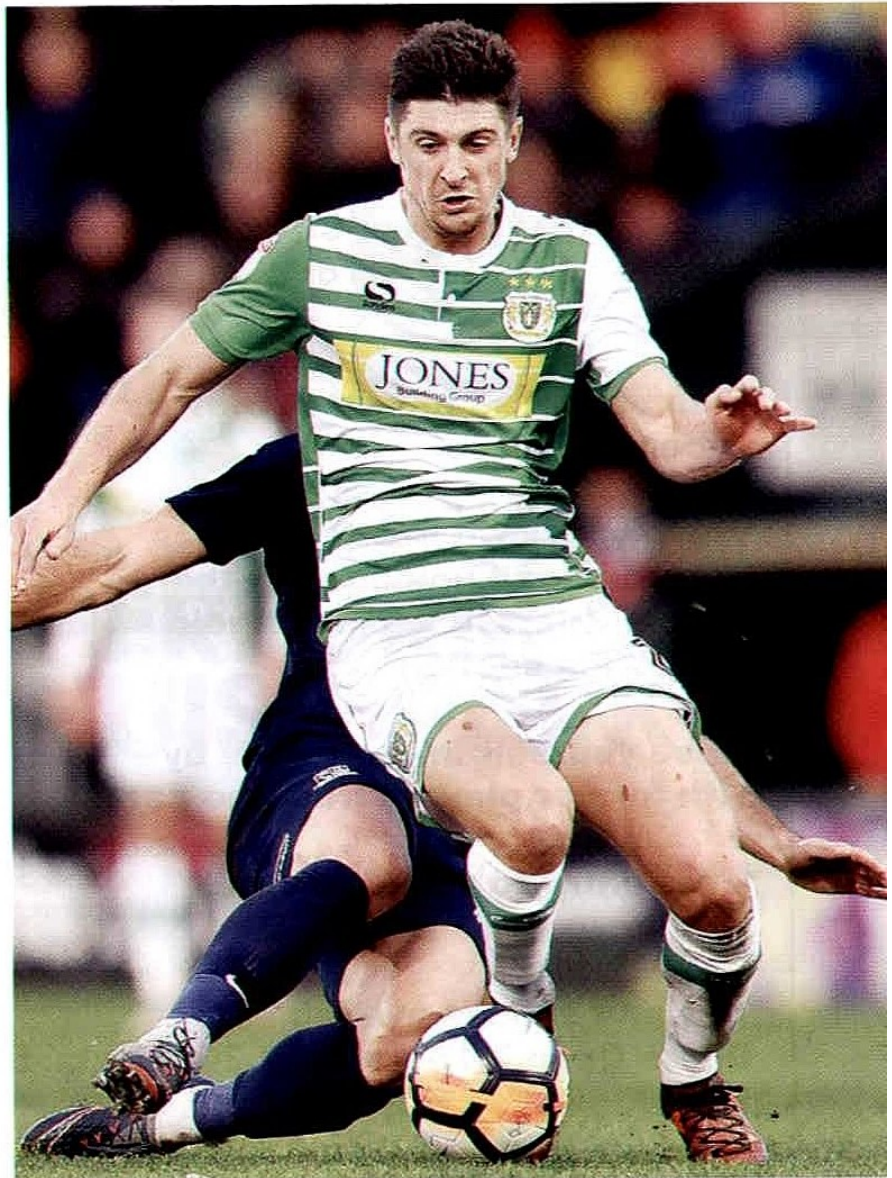
It was a long way to go to Carlisle United to get beat and more so for the supporters who had to make that gruelling 660-mile round trip in one day.

I expect there will be a good crowd and good atmosphere here today as they are one of the few sides not a million miles from where we are in Somerset!

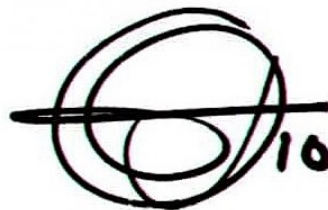
That derby feel, if you like, can make these sort of games that extra bit exciting and we want to couple that with a memorable performance.

Iconic Norwegian trio *a-ha* and nineties pop sensation *Steps* will be performing at Huish Park next summer.

Globally one of the most recognisable bands to hail from the 1980s, *a-ha* will visit Somerset on Saturday, June 9 as part of their 2018 Summer Electric Tour.

The multi-platinum selling group are composed of lead vocalist Morten Harket, guitarist Pal Waaktaar-Savoy and keyboardist Magne Furuholmen.

Widely regarded as true pioneers of both music and video technology to arise during the mid-80s, they are perhaps best known for their huge and instantly identifiable hit 'Take on Me'.

A band who have returned to reclaim their pop crown, *Steps* notched up an impressive 20 million record sales and had seven sold out arena tours between 1997 and 2001.

To mark their 20th anniversary, the

mixed-gender group brought out their highly anticipated album 'Tears on the Dancefloor' which they will perform on Sunday, June 10 in Yeovil as well as some of their classics!

G lovers loanee Matt Worthington is hoping to follow in the footsteps of some notable

Bournemouth team-mates by using experience at the lower levels as a springboard to the Premier League.

Worthington made his top flight debut for the Cherries on the final day of last season, coming on as a substitute against Leicester City.

He's now come to play in Sky Bet League Two for Town to get greater exposure to the rough and tumble of first team football.

And there's plenty of examples in Bournemouth's senior squad of players who have taken a similar route to the top. Harry Arter (Woking), Andrew Surman (Walsall) and Dan Gosling (Plymouth Argyle) all gained

extensive experience in the EFL before making their big breakthrough.

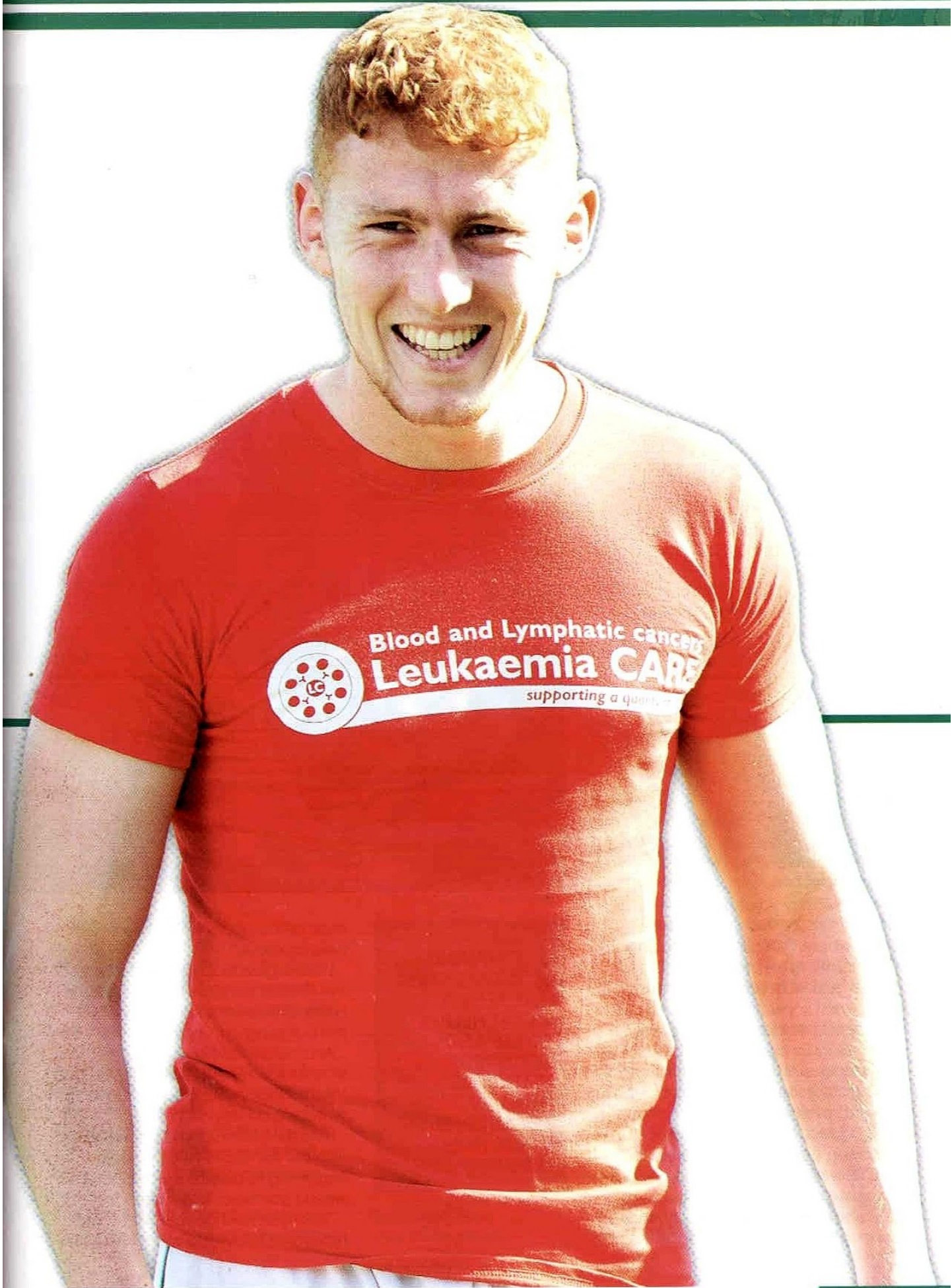
And Worthington is hoping an impressive loan spell with Yeovil will boost his chances of making the grade at Dean Court.

He said: "It's important to get first team games under your belt at a young age if you can and I'm pleased to get this opportunity at Yeovil.

"It's a definite step up from Under-23s football. It's definitely more physical and is quicker as well. It certainly toughens you up both mentally and physically.

"Over the second half of last season I was lucky enough to train with the first team at Bournemouth and rub shoulders with some really good midfielders.

"I learned a lot from playing with people like Harry Arter, Andrew Surman and Dan Gosling.

"Jack Wilshere was on loan there from Arsenal at the time too. You could see his quality straight away and to be training with an England international was great.

"They're all established in the Premier League but a lot of the lads dropped down the levels or had loan spells before that happened.

"Harry Arter was released by Charlton and went to Woking in non-league before he got another chance at Bournemouth.

"Surman and Gosling played at lower levels too and they both benefitted from getting that first team experience.

"That's got to be my aim too. I want to do as well as I can for Yeovil and help them climb the table during my loan spell here.

"Hopefully Bournemouth will be pleased with my development and it will help my long-term career with them."

Worthington is the latest in a long line of Bournemouth players to move to Huish Park on loan, following Harry Cornick, Ben Whitfield, Matt Butcher, Josh Wakefield and Brandon Goodship in spending a spell in south Somerset.

He added: "They all benefitted from their time here and I spoke to some of them before I made my move here.

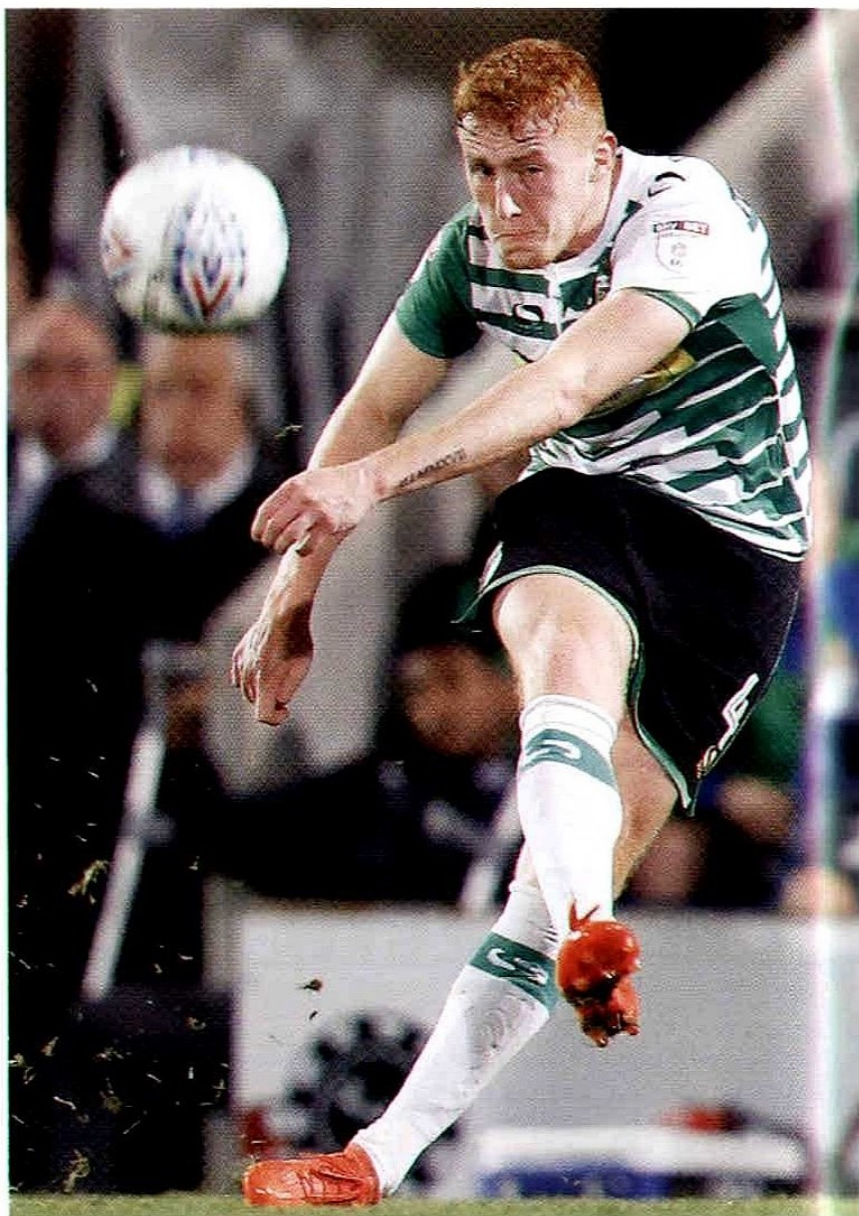
"I know Harry valued his time here and he's now made the move to Luton where he's playing regularly in a team pushing for promotion.

"Ben and Matt are good mates of mine and I know they really enjoyed their spells here last season as well."

Worthington is part of another Cherries duo at Huish Park this season, joining striker Sam Surridge in making the move this summer.

He added: "Having Sam here has been a great help to me and definitely helped me settle in because he came here first.

"We're good mates anyway and we can help each other make the

most of the opportunity we've got here at Yeovil."

Worthington has had a brief taste of the Premier League, replacing Ryan Fraser in Bournemouth's game with the outgoing champions.

And he admits he was a bit starstruck when he took to the field to take on players he'd spent the season watching on television.

He said: "Although I'd been training with the first team, I wasn't really expecting to play so it was a surprise when I got the call to come on.

"Leicester had people like Mahrez, Ndi and Andy King in their midfield,

all great players, and here I was coming up against them.

"I'd seen them on TV and thought what great players they were and here I was trying to take them on and beat them.

"It was a brilliant experience and definitely gave me a taste of something I'd like to experience more in the future."

Worthington has established himself at the heart of the Town midfield in recent matches, playing alongside captain James Bailey.

The 19-year-old has adopted more of a holding role, a position he enjoys,

which has allowed Bailey more freedom to get forward.

He said: "Although I have played at right-back, central midfield is the position that I prefer.

"I like to get on the ball and try to dictate play and it's been working with me sitting quite deep and Bails playing a bit further forward.

"There's still improvements to be made but I think we've struck up quite a good understanding in the games we've played so far."

What is so frustrating about Yeovil Town's form away from home is that they could hardly have asked for a better start to the season at Huish Park.

At home, the Glovers look capable of beating any side in Sky Bet League Two, with their attacking flair, ambition and creativity causing problems no matter the opposition.

With Yeovil's victims in Somerset this season including Accrington Stanley and Coventry City, this week's opponents Swindon Town and Notts County should not cause any fear for a side who would be in the play-offs if the table was decided purely on results at home.

In seasons gone by, the suspensions to Francois Zoko and Olufela Olomola would have been a hammer blow to Yeovil, but in Sam Surridge, the club have a striker who they can rely on to add goals and fit into whichever system Darren Way chooses to play.

With Otis Khan and Rhys Browne flanking him, and numerous other attacking options in Jake Gray, Alefe Santos and Jordan Green, there is always a belief that Yeovil will score goals at home.

This is what makes the current situation away from home all the more troubling, for this team has potential by the bagful and plays with a fearlessness not seen in several years at Huish Park.

If the team could take those performances onto the road and perform with the same verve and vigour in their away matches, this would be a side with ambitions of pushing into the top half of the table.

There is still time for Way and his players to turn things around on their travels, and it is something they must do if they are to progress beyond their current league position.

Before we have to concern

ourselves with away form again, though, we have the matter of two of League Two's high flyers in the next four days.

With both Swindon and Notts County sides that look to take the game to their opponents, Yeovil should find the space on the pitch to take the attack to them.

Impressive performances against Stevenage and Southend United sent the Huish Park faithful home happy in their previous two matches.

If they can replicate that form today and on Tuesday, few would bet against them.

A Town XI, comprised of the club's Under-18s, were knocked out of the Somerset Premier Cup on penalties by Wincanton Town.

Paulius Golubickas and Nestor Shako gave the visitors a two-goal advantage at the break before two home goals forced the tie into extra-time.

The young Glovers went back in front through Jack Rice but a Wincanton strike in the 117th minute, after Golubickas missed from 12 yards, ensured spot-kicks.

Winky's goalkeeper made himself

the hero, saving twice in the shootout to seal his side's place in the third round.

Chandler Hallett was called into action early on as the hosts began brightly in boggy conditions. The Yeovil stopper was almost embarrassed shortly after but was relieved to see the ball drop wide of his goal after his clearance was charged down.

Slightly against the run of play, the visitors went ahead. Neat play from Joe Tomlinson provided the opportunity for Golubickas to dispatch and he made no mistake from close range.

The Lithuanian forward turned provider moments later, threading through for Shako who finished with aplomb.

Wincanton scored twice to send the contest into extra-time and Rice restored Yeovil's lead on 92 minutes.

Then Golubickas had a glorious chance to make it 4-2 but had his penalty saved before the Wasps levelled late on to setup a 12-yard shootout.

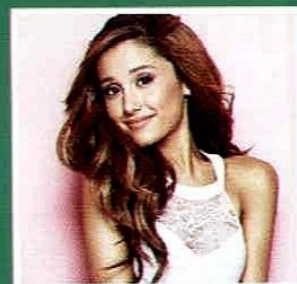
Antonio Falanga's team were the unfortunate party, seeing two efforts clawed away by Wincanton's number one, and suffered a disappointing cup exit.

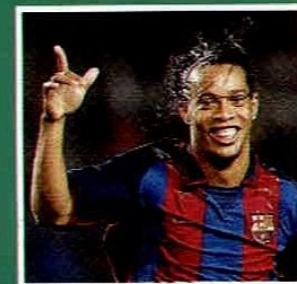

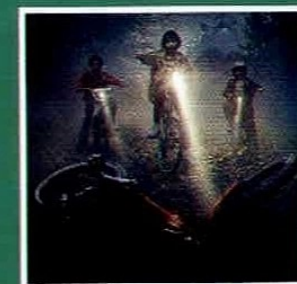

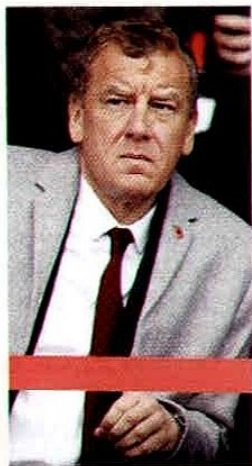

It wasn't long ago that Swindon Town were in the upper reaches of Sky Bet League One competing for a place in the Championship.

In 2014/15, the Robins were battling it out for automatic promotion with Bristol City, MK Dons and Preston North End but missed out and subsequently endured a heavy defeat to the latter in the play-off final.

The following summer saw a massive turnover in players with the Wiltshire outfit losing several key men including Ben Gladwin, Massimo Luongo and Nathan Byrne. That trio in particular were instrumental in Town's aims to get to the second tier and without them, they finished 16th.

A number of ins and outs occurred ahead of 2016/17 which, once again, unsettled the Swindon ranks and this time it proved fatal as they suffered relegation to the bottom tier.

David Flitcroft was then appointed the club's manager and has since steadied the ship.

The ex-Barnsley boss got his side off to a flyer with an opening day win against last season's League Two play-off semi-finalists Carlisle United.

Since then, Swindon have lost half a dozen times in the league. However, they remain in the top seven and impressive wins over Luton Town and Mansfield Town prove why the talent they have should see them compete at the top until May.

The Sky Blues loaned Charles-Cook to Nuneaton for further senior experience which led to him becoming number one in the Midlands. He lost his place at the Ricoh Arena and moved to Swindon in the summer.



★ **DEFENDER – OLLY LANCASHIRE**

Basingstoke-born Lancashire graduated from Southampton's youth system and attracted interest from Liverpool and Manchester City in his late teens.

After 17 Saints outings and three separate loans to Grimsby Town, the defender transferred to Walsall.

A short spell at Aldershot Town followed before a lengthy period with Rochdale where he won promotion to League One in his first season.

Lancashire rejected a new deal at Dale to sign for Shrewsbury Town but found chances hard to come by and terminated his contract to join Swindon in June.

A veteran of the game, Taylor began at Luton Town and moved to Portsmouth in 2002, helping them reach the Premier League in his first season.

The midfielder scored a number of excellent goals for Pompey and earned a big money move to Bolton Wanderers.

West Ham paid millions for his services four years later and he assisted in their promotion to the top flight. Taylor was involved in Burnley's Championship triumph in 2015/16 and has since featured for Northampton Town.

The 35-year-old has made over 680 appearances in his career.



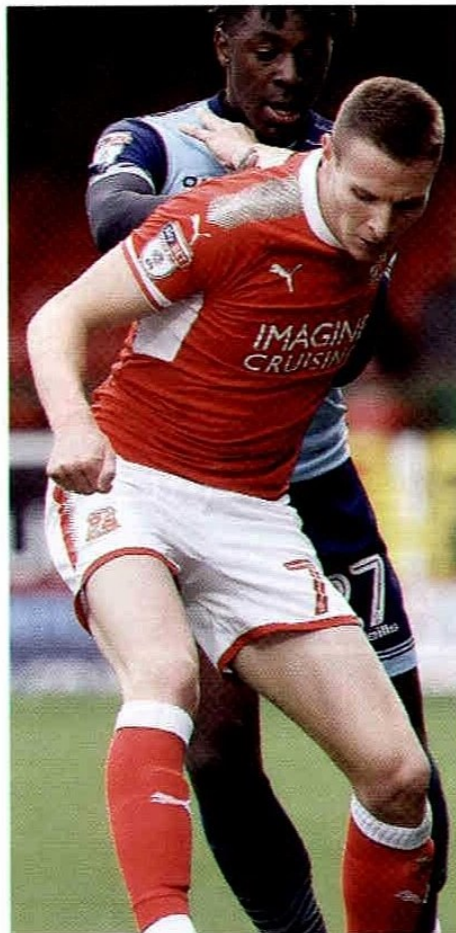

Following a career in the lower leagues most notably with Chester City, Bury and Rochdale, Flitcroft joined the coaching staff at the latter in 2011. He spent just a year in Keith Hill's backroom setup before following him to Barnsley. The 43-year-old became caretaker boss when Hill was sacked during the 2012/13 campaign and after winning two out of his three games in charge, he was appointed permanent chief. Flitcroft kept the Reds in the Championship on the final day of the season but was relieved from duties in November 2013 following a poor run. He performed better as Bury boss, guiding the Shakers to promotion from League Two. However, an 11-match winless run ended his time with the Greater Manchester club. After eight months out of the game, Flitcroft was named manager of Swindon.

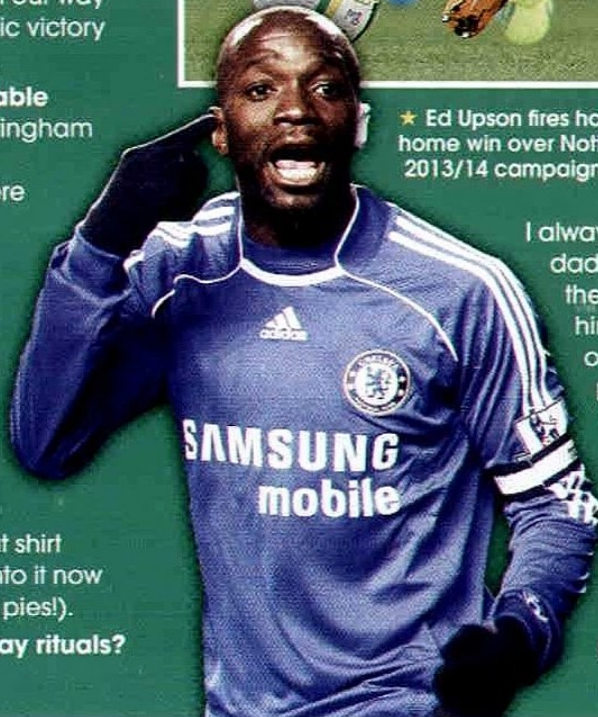

★ **86-89 MINUTES**

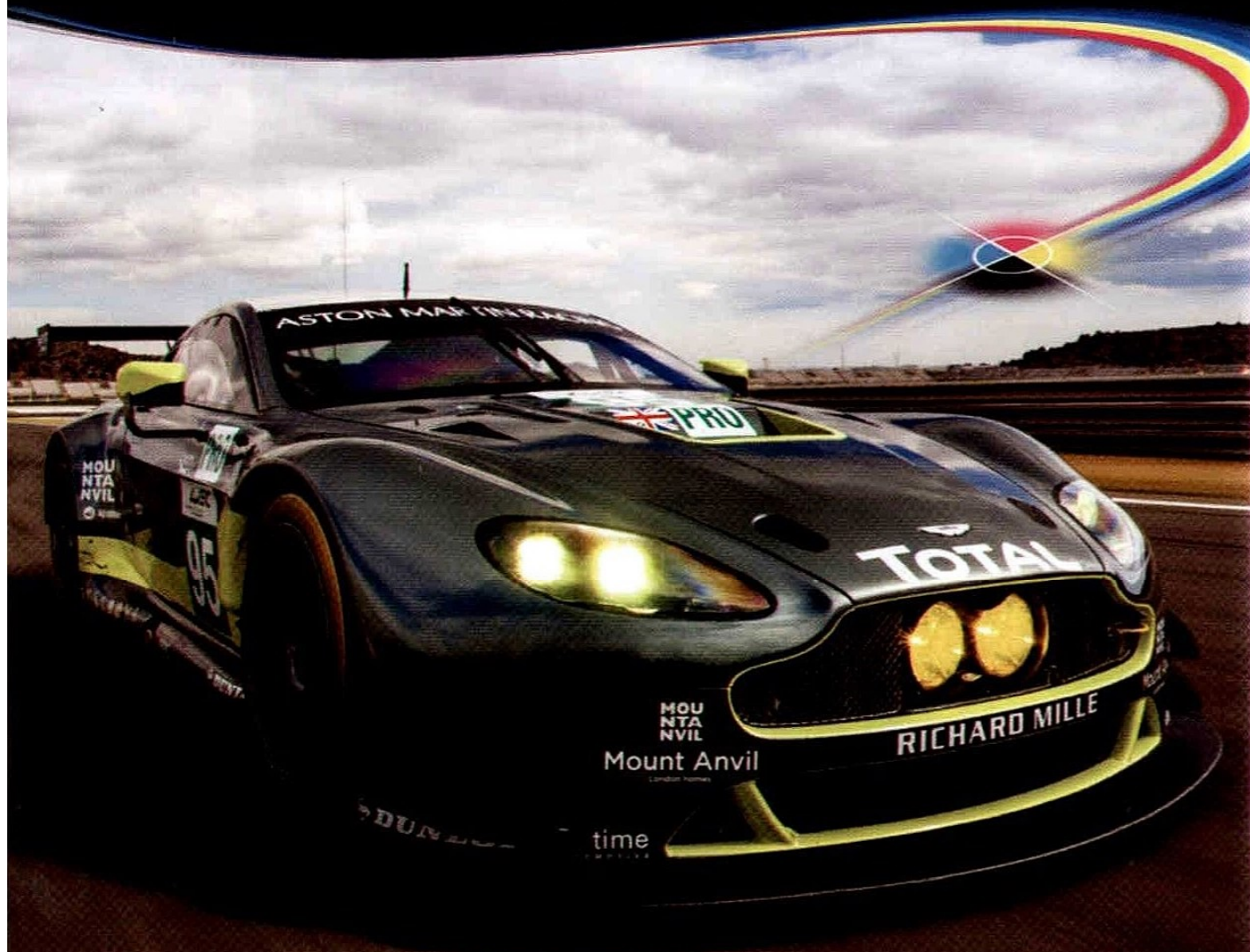

Sixteen league games without defeat had seen Gary Johnson's side consistently maintain their position near or at the head of the table. By the middle of November, and after a struggle to see off Bath City after a replay, the FA Cup had almost been a distraction from the main prize of chasing the Football League; unheard of for Town, the side that was as famous for killing giants as David, he who conquered Goliath.

After Bath came another local rival in the form of Cheltenham Town, three years a League club themselves after beating Yeovil 3-2 to win the Conference title. By now, the Whaddon Road side had earned another promotion but came to Somerset struggling for consistency and form so although it didn't feel like a giant-killing, the Glovers were playing a side two divisions above.

Any thought the FA Cup might have lost its appeal among the Huish Park faithful was banished when nearly 6,500 fans turned up on a sunless Saturday, November 16, 2002. But they would be left disappointed as a capable, efficient and at times dominant Robins display saw Steve Cotterill's team progress to round two.

Right-back Neil Howarth set up the first goal on seven minutes when he crossed for burly striker Julian Alsop to finish off from close range. Although it was the only goal of the first period, Cotterill's side were comfortable and always seemed to have another gear; Yeovil's only real clear chance fell to Howard Forinton who delayed his shot too long - chance gone!

Forinton spurned another chance early on after the break and it proved costly as Martin Devaney struck a second goal on 62 minutes.

The breakthrough sparked a mini revival of a game that was going nowhere, Abdelhalim El Kholiti striking the post late on but it wasn't to be Yeovil's day.

More cup action followed as the Glovers hosted Mangotsfield United in the Somerset Premier Cup. The Mangoes were bright early on before Abdoulaye Demba scored on 20 minutes. Adam Simms equalised before half-time and it took the home side until the last minute, literally, of extra-time to win the tie, Demba scoring his second.

An FA Cup exit plus a struggle against a side miles below them in the pyramid wasn't enough to create panic, but would it turn out to be anything other than a blip?

It was with a sad whimper that one of the most extraordinary careers in international football drew to a close on Monday night in the San Siro.

Gianluigi Buffon, a goalkeeper who will surely go down in history as not only one of the greatest of our time, but of all time, ended his international career with the play-off defeat that consigned Italy to missing out on a World Cup finals for the first time since 1958.

Buffon, Italy's number one since the play-offs to qualify for France 98 aged 19 years old, had hoped to emulate his idol Dino Zoff and win next year's World Cup in his 40s. He would also have become the first player in history to have represented his country at six different World Cup finals.

Neither dream was to be realised.

Buffon, ever the gentleman, was quick to put his own aspirations and feelings aside in a tearful interview after their exit was confirmed; he was almost embarrassed to be tearful at the end of the game in case it put children off wanting to play for the Azzuri, comparing the defeat with Italy missing out on the Euros in 1992 and the unrest it created in the country when Buffon was in his teens.

Buffon displays rare insight for a footballer, particularly in the modern age. That in the first minutes after the curtain falls on one of the most glittering careers in our game's history the player's first instincts are to reflect upon the social implications of Italy's failure to qualify just shows that Buffon is not cut from the same cloth as many of his peers, and speaks volumes about the leadership that Buffon has provided his team.

That sentiment is shared throughout football; Buffon has held himself up to the highest standards throughout his career. Whether it be warmly applauding the opposition's national

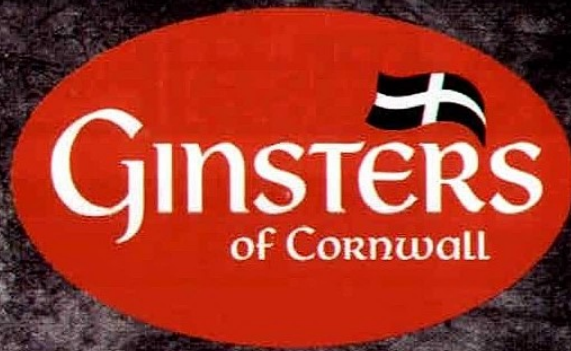

anthem whilst a chorus of boos rings out from the Italian terraces, to sporting embraces at the end of matches, or chastising his own fans when his view of common decency is not upheld, Buffon has been so much more than an outstanding goalkeeper. He has been the very definition of the professional role model. The no.1's no.1.

And so defeat in the play-offs brings to a premature end the international career of one of the greats. Juve fans get to appreciate San Gigi for a few more months until he finally hangs up his gloves for good. The rest of us can only say 'Grazie'.

Whilst many a neutral in Yeovil would've been pleased for Huddersfield Town reaching the Premier

League against the odds back in May, one family in the town would've enjoyed much stronger emotion.

Martin Cranie, born and bred in Yeovil, was part of the 18-man squad at Wembley which defied the odds to confirm the Terriers' spot in the top flight.

Now enjoying life in one of the top leagues in Europe, the ex-Barnsley man reflects on what has been a head spinning spell at the John Smith's Stadium since moving there in 2015.

"It's been mental," he said. "When I first signed, we were battling around relegation for a couple of years and then the new manager (David Wagner) came in and changed everything around the place.

"Everyone saw what happened last season, it was unbelievable and now we're in the Premier League."

Now 31 and back in the country's top division with a third separate club, the former Glovers' two loan stints at Huish Park seem a long time ago.

Joining from Southampton - having become an Academy graduate at St Mary's - Cranie made 12 appearances for Town, something he's pleased to have done.

"It's nice to say that at some point I played for my hometown where I was born and I'll always be grateful for that," he said.

"I always check on a Saturday to see how the lads are getting on and I thoroughly enjoyed it when I was there - it was nice to get back and play a few games for them.

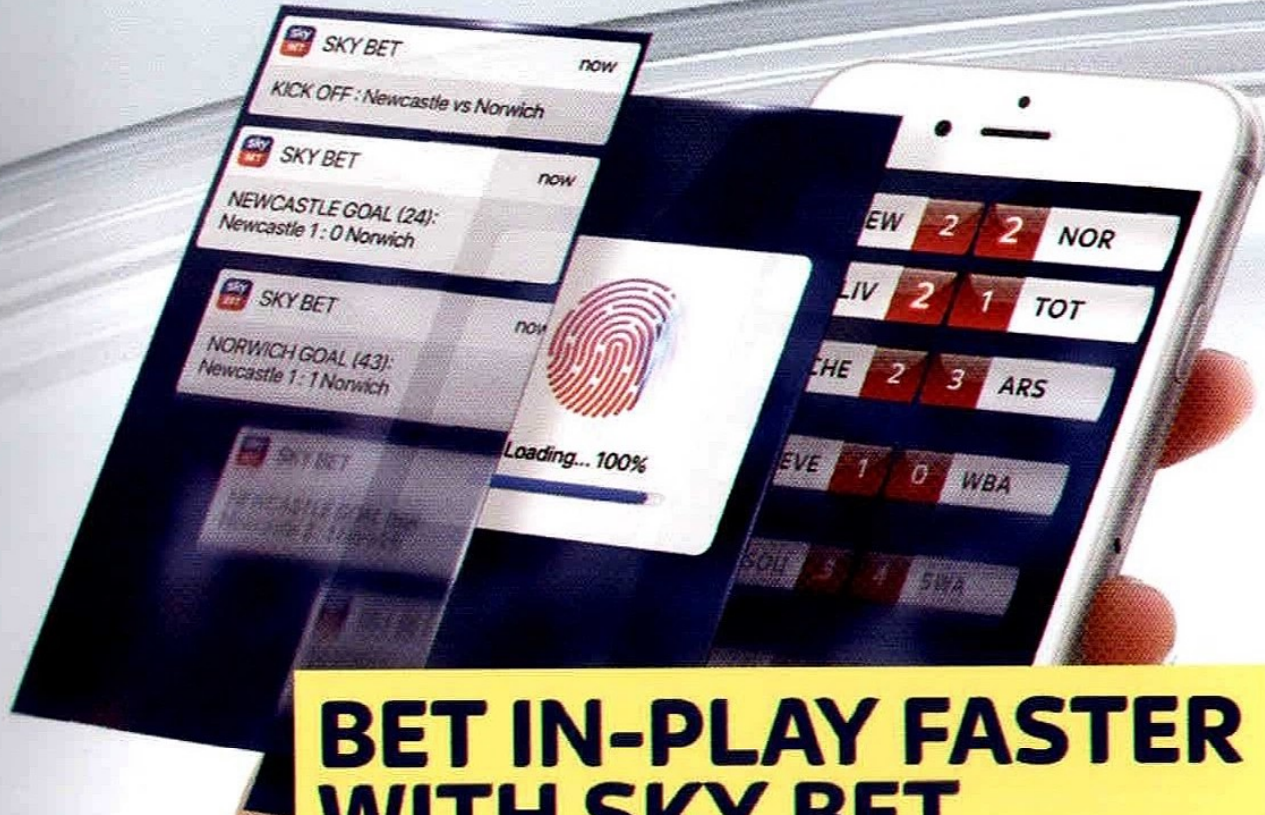
"My mum still lives in the area so I try and get back down whenever I can but I'm a long way from Yeovil."

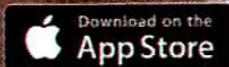
