### NEWPORT COUNTY



The Exiles are looking for a more straightforward season in the Sky Bet League Two after a rollercoaster 2016/17 campaign.

It looked almost certain that County would suffer relegation to the National League after being cut adrift at the bottom of the table with just twelve games remaining. However, they embarked on a remarkable run of form under Caretaker Manager Michael Flynn and they went on to secure their EFL status on a dramatic final day of the

Flynn was handed the job on a permanent basis following those exploits and he's enjoyed a steady start to the 2017/18 campaign, guiding Newport to a midtable position with the Christmas period fast approaching. County have enjoyed

some great results so far this term and they will be hoping to keep improving in the coming weeks with a Play-Off place not that far away.

Newport's efforts this season have been boosted by the form of former Town loanee Frank Nouble, who has hit six goals in the league so far. Blessed with pace and power, the much-travelled hitman knows where the goal is and he will continue to be crucial to County's hopes of having a good season.


These two sides last met in September 2015 when Town prevailed 7-6 on penalties in a JPT First Round Tie, while they haven't done battle in the league since 1987, when The Reds ran out comfortable 3-0 victors at home.

# THE MANAGER

Newport born and bred, Michael Flynn has a long relationship with the Club.

He began his Newport career as a teenager in the academy before breaking through to the first team and eventually earning a move to pro-football. In 2012, Flynn returned to help fire the Club into the Football League with victory over Wrexham in the Play-Off Final at Wembley.

After initially retiring from playing, he progressed through the roles of first team coach, academy manager, then Football and Business Development Director, before returning as a first team coach under then manager Graham Westley.

He re-signed as a player in January 2017 making his fourth debut for the Club in a 3-1 home win vs Hartlepool.

In March 2017, Michael Flynn was appointed the Club's Caretaker Manager in the face of almost certain relegation from the Football League. Cast 11 points adrift with 12 games to go, the rookie manager was tasked with nothing more than restoring fight and pride into the Club. 12 games later, he and the team had achieved what football pundits had deemed impossible and fought their way out of the relegation zone and retained their League Status in dramatic style.

On 9th May 2017, Michael Flynn was named as the Club's permanent Manager. Not quite ready to hang up his playing boots, Flynn is ready to resume his playing role if the Club needs him. He is currently completing his UEFA Pro Licence at the FAW alongside Thierry Henry.

Newport County's longest serving player, Joe Day is a calming influence at the back. Day began his career with Crystal Palace in 2007. After spending time out on loan at a number of non-league sides, he made his Football League debut in January 2014 for Peterborough United. Later that year. Day joined The Exiles on a one-month loan, making his debut versus Portsmouth on 30th August 2014. Following some impressive displays the loan period was subsequently extended to 28 November 2014.

In December 2014, Day joined the Club on a permanent basis and has recently signed a new two year deal keeping him at the Club until 2019. An excellent shot stopper and a consistent and calm performer, Joe is a favourite among County fans.





### DAVID PIPE

A tireless and committed defender who never gives anything less than 100%. David Pipe captained The Exiles to victory at the Conference Play-Off at Wembley in 2013 but was let go the following year. He re-signed for the Club in May 2017. Pipe has been part of two remarkable seasons at Newport County AFC. In 2013, he led the team to promotion back to the Football League and in 2017 he played a major part in keeping them there.

He played in every game since re-joining the Club in January and epitomised the 'never-say-die' lighting spirit which became key in the team's scrap to cling onto their Football League Status. A favourite among County fans due to his endless energy and committed performances, he's quickly becoming a County legend.


### DAN BUTLER

Signed by Warren Feeney in 2016 on a two-year deal, Dan Butler was one of the few ever-present players throughout the turbulent 2016/17 Season and his consistent performances landed him the South Wales Argus Readers' Player of the Year Award. He began his career at Portsmouth aged ten and made his debut for the club at Just 17-years of age in a 3-0 defeat to Plymouth in the League Cup. Spells with Havant & Waterlooville and Torquay followed before he joined Newport in 2016.

### BEN WHITE - - - -

Aged just 19, Ben White has the composure and ability of a much older player and has been tipped to have a big future. White joined the prestigious Southampton Academy aged eight and remained there until the age of 16. He then joined Brighton and Hove Albion's academy where he has continued to shine ever since. He made his professional debut for the Seagulls against Colchester last season and was a key figure in Brighton's U23 Checkatrade Trophy side last season. He is currently on a season-long loan at Rodney Parade.

### MARK O'BRIEN

Mark O'Brien wrote his name in the football history books last term when his 89th minute winner against Notts County on the last day of the season saved Newport County from relegation to the National League. He began his football career in Ireland before he joined Derby County making his professional debut at the Club just 12 months later aged Just 16. In that season, he was named Derby County's Academy Player of the Year, and Republic of Ireland's U16s Player of the Year.

It was a dream start for the Irish teenager but a routine medical scan towards the beginning of the next season picked up a heart problem which required immediate surgery. Despite a full recovery, taking nearly a season away from football had hampered his progress with the first team. He continued to impress in the youth system, however, and during his 6 years with the Club would go onto make over 30 first-team appearances.

### **JOSS LABADIE**

A no nonsense destructive midfielder, Joss Labadie epitomises County's resilience and never-give-up spirit. Labadie began his career at West Brom. Whilst playing multiple times for the reserve team and being send out on successful loans, Joss was unable to make an impression at the Club and eventually moved to Tranmere Rovers. A two-year spell at Notts County followed, then a year at Torquay United before moving to Dagenham & Redbridge.

He joined The Exiles in June 2016 on a two-year deal and made an excellent start for the Club with a match-winning goal on his debut. He is the Club Captain and he played a vital role in County staying up last season.

### ROBBIE WILLMOTT

A fan favourite and now in his second spell with the club, Robbie Willmott's pace and versatility has made him an ever-popular character with County fans young and old. Robbie began his career at Cambridge United coming up through The U's Academy, he scored 19 goals in 108 games for United before Luton Town cashed in on him for £50,000. Two years and one 'Team Of The Year' appearance later, Robbie was released from Luton and re-signed for Cambridge.

After joining the club from Cambridge United in January 2013, Robbie was vital in County's National League play-off promotion winning season and was a regular in the Newport team until his release by Terry Butcher at the start of the 15/16 season. Willmott spent three years away from County before returning after spells at Ebbsfleet and Eastleigh.

### MATTHEW DOLAN

Matty Dolan was one of the Exiles' first signings of the window and joined County following a very successful season at Yeovil Town FC where he was voted the Club's Player of the Season. Michael Flynn called Matty Dolan his "top target" when the creative midfielder signed for the club and has been a revelation in the County midfield since arriving in the summer.

Born in Hartlepool, Matty began his career with Middlesbrough and after several loan spells he signed permanently for Bradford City before moving to Yeovil Town on apermanent basis. 77 appearances and seven goals later, Michael Flynn recruited Matty to be a regular in the midfield at Rodney Parade.

### PADRAIG AMOND

Amond started his career at his hometown club Shamrock Rovers and continued to play in Ireland before venturing to Portugal where he made 17 appearences for Pacos de Ferreira. Padraig then moved on to Sky Bet League 2 for the first time playing over 80 times for Morecambe. Spells at Grimsby and Hartlepool followed before his eventual move to The Exiles this summer.

Amond scored on his debut in the 4-1 homecoming match vs Chesterfield in the first home game of the 2017/18 season.

### FRANK NOUBLE

County's number 10 possesses both great power and terrific pace. An aerial presence as well as skilful on the ball from wide positions, Frank can play anywhere on the forward front line and be ever-effective. Starting his career at Chelsea, Frank joined West Ham United after leaving The Blues, turning down a professional contract to instead sign for Gianfranco Zola's Hammers.

Since then Frank has played for 15 different clubs, County being his 16th. During that time the forward has played for clubs such as West Brom, Swindon Town Swansea City, Wolves and even a spell in China with Tianjin Quanjian.

Frank enjoyed a fantastic home debut for The Exiles scoring a 13-minute-hat-trick in the homecoming match against Chesterfield. The prolific strike has also played for England at youth level experiencing a total of 10 appearances across both England U17 and U19 level.





### ARTHUR BRIGGS

At almost 33, Arthur was an experienced keeper with 250 appearances to his name when he arrived at bottom of the League Town in 1933. A point from a goalless draw on his debut - in front of a meagre 1,528 - was enough to take them above Newport. He went on to play in every game in 1933/34 before losing his place to Fred Houldsworth. Arthur joined County in June 1935, making his debut against Swindon in the August. STFC 73 apps / NCFC 41



### STEVE JENKINS

Initially signed on loan from Peterborough by Andy King in October 2004, Merthyr-born Steve had played over 500 games in a 14-year career. Like his predecessor in the number six shirt - Andy Gumey - he was able to slot in anywhere in the back four or as a defensive midfielder. Injuries limited Steve's Town appearances in 2005/06 and any hopes of a further stay went with Iffy Onuora. In October 2006, Steve joined Newport where he was appointed player-coach in lune 2008. #### PAUL BODIN

Paul had two spells with both Newport and Town. He first joined County as a 17 year old, but did not make their League side until his return there in January 1988. Less than six weeks later Lou Macari signed him for Town, putting him straight into a Simod Cup semi-final at Luton. 'Zippy', as he was known to his teammates, left for Palace in a half-million pound deal in 1991. But he was back ten months later, stroking home the penalty that took Swindon into the Premiership. #### **GARY EMMANUEL**

Gary came to the County Ground in July 1981 in a player-exchange deal that saw Brian Williams switch to Eastville. Rovers had been relegated from the Second Division that summer and unfortunately Gary recorded an unwanted 'double' when Town went down twelve months later. The midfielder hit nine goals for Town, seven of which came away from home. He moved to Newport in July 1984 but had to wait until the March for his League debut. STFC 131 apps / NCFC 15



### STEVE AIZLEWOOD

Newport-born Steve made his League debut for his home town club in April 1969, when just 16. The former Wales schoolboy international centre-half stayed at Somerton Park another seven years until Danny Williams signed him for Town for £13,000 as an eventual replacement for Frank Burrows - who would sign him for Portsmouth in 1979. Steve's transfer was one of the first to be decided by a tribunal. STFC 138 apps / NCFC 216





#### KENNY STROUD

Town signed the Swindon and England schoolboy forward at just 14, in January 1968. #### BILLY LUCAS

Standing just 5'6", Billy had no League experience when he was signed by Ted Vizard from Wolves in 1937 aged 19. An inside-forward, he went on to score 47 goals for Town either side of the last War. In March 1948 Billy joined Swansea Town in an £11,500 deal – a record for both clubs. He was appointed playermanager at County in December 1953 and had three further spells there, taking charge of over 750 games up until 1974. STFC 192 apps / NCFC 99



#### PAT TERRY

Londoner Pat, having failed to secure a regular place in the old First Division at The Valley, left to join Newport in 1956. He quickly made his mark there, notching 32 goals in two seasons. Pat went on to serve five other clubs before arriving at the County Ground from Reading in February 1967. Town were then in the bottom four of the Third Division, but Pat's seven goals in 18 games helped them to a respectable eighth place finish. In 1967/68, he hit two hat-tricks in a 19-goal tally. 
### **BOBBY WOODRUFF**

Signed by Town straight from school in 1956, Bobby went on to be a member of the side that won promotion for the first time in the club's history in 1963. He made his League debut as a centre-forward in February 1959, but his first extended spell in the first team came at left-half. An early exponent of the long throw, Bobby could propel the ball over forty yards ! He left Swindon for Wolves in 1964. Johning Newport ten years later, he played his final League game in January 1976. STFC 205 apps / NCFC 58




### ROY CARTER

Cornishman Roy came to the County Ground in a £22,000 transfer from Hereford in late 1977. He rarely missed a game in 1978/79, hitting eleven goals from midfield. His highest tally for Town came three seasons later when he top-scored with 15, six coming from penalties. But he also missed one against relegation rivals Newport, which proved to be costly. Also a reliable centre-half, Roy went on to spend four years with County from 1983 to 1987. STFC 236 apps / NCFC 180



### WYN HOOPER

Wyn progressed through the ranks at Somerton Park at the same time as Steve Aizlewood, making his League debut there a month earlier than the defender. After impressing in two F.A.Cup ties against Town in November 1975, Wyn followed Steve to Swindon a year later – although his debut was delayed by bad weather until the February. A knee injury severely hampered his progress and he was released in the close season, joining Aldershot. STFC 6 apps / NCFC 197






## IN-DEPTH WITH...

Matt, you've been at the club for a couple of months or so now, so how have you settled at the club on and off the pitch?










## HAPPY BIRTHDAY MARION CHILDERS


made headers, they've made tackles and Northampton only had one decent chance in the first-half.
