



I would also like to welcome the management and staff of our opponents today, along with the visiting directors and fans.

Our defeat at Cambridge surprised me. I watched the game live from the US and, although I wasn't too thrilled with our first-half performance. I thought we did more than enough to win the game in the second half, but if you don't score when on top you're always susceptible to a sucker punch. Darren said afterwards that he felt he'd been robbed and the stats support that view. However, clinical finishing and taking half chances comes from a supreme confidence in the outcome and I'd like to see our lads a lot more confident in their approach to these games. We have a squad full of talented players, a great mixture of youth and experience and we all want to get back to our early season form and make a run for the play offs at the very earliest opportunity.

Turning to today, well, it's FA Cup time again and we'll be giving everything we've got to reach the next round. Cup competitions provide a chance for players and management to forget the league - these games are completely different and must be played in a completely different way, Generally, the further we go the more difficult the tie of course, but that just makes this competition so great. To compete for the right to play a top club is what these games are all about. So let's all get behind the lads today!

Events off the pitch have been interesting, to say the least. With just over 1m of funds ringfenced in the bank to build the North Stand, the tender process took longer than I'd have liked made a little longer by the quotes not being where I want them to bel We're now in the value engineering phase - which is a nest way of saving we need to make the building fit the funds we have. I'm confident this will be concluded this month and we'll be ready to start securing the site for demolition towards the end of the month or early in January. The project has a 26-week delivery time, so we'll still be on course for opening at the start of the 2018/19 season, subject to some minor agreements with the council on our lease.

I've been looking forward to this game ever since the draw. Your support has been great so far, so let's help get the lads over the line and into the 3rd round hat!

STEVENAGE STANDS WITH EFL FOR RAINBOW LACES CAMPAIGN



In a League first, EFL Clubs across the country will unite in their support of LGBT+ inclusivity by turning their corner flags rainbow coloured to raise awareness of Stonewall's Rainbow Laces campaign.

The bespoke rainbow coloured comer flags sit at the heart of a wide range of activities that the EFL and its Clubs will be undertaking as part of the Rainbow Laces campaign between 25 November and 3 December 2017.

As Stevenage Football Club doesn't host a home EFL game during the above dates, we will be supporting the Rainbow Laces campaign on the Saturday 9th December fixture v Wycombe Wanderers.

In a show of solidarity to support lesbian, gay, bi and trans-gender fans, players and staff across the game the EFL will change its logo to a bespoke rainbow coloured version whilst Clubs have also been provided with rainbow laces, captain's armbands and programme adverts. PGMOL officials have also been provided with rainbow coloured laces for EFL matches.

Stonewall's Rainbow Laces campaign aims to make sport everyone's game with national teams, leading clubs, professional players, fans and grassroots players from across football showing their support for LGBT+ people in sport.

The EFL's support for Rainbow Laces forms part of its wider LGBT+ work delivered in conjunction with Clubs through its Equality Code Of Practice. This includes delivering activities, setting policies, and advising on recruitment and education at Clubs.

Shaun Harvey, EFL Chief Executive said: "We are proud to support Stonewall's Rainbow Laces campaign again for this season, Ensuring a safe and welcoming environment for supporters attending EFL matches remains a key priority but the EFL and our Clubs are committed to providing a positive experience for all that stretches well beyond the 90 minutes of play.

"Our specific Rainbow Laces initiatives this year will see all EFL Clubs come together to raise awareness of this important issue delivered through a range of activities which this season include converting all comer flags at EFL grounds up and down the country into rainbow colours. This follows the introduction of the bespoke EFL rainbow logo which celebrated the League's burgeoning relationship with Stonewall earlier this year.

"The campaign very much compliments the ongoing work our Clubs are undertaking as part of the EFL Equality Code of Practice. Whilst acknowledging there has been progress made in this area, there is still work to be done. ONCE THE BRIGHT YOUNG THING FRESH OUT OF NON-LEAGUE, TOM PETT IS NOW AN EXPERIENCED CAMPAIGNER AT BORO AS HE APPROACHES THE END OF HIS FOURTH SEASON AT THE CLUB.

Only Chris Day and Ronnie Henry have more appearances than Pett in the current squad and being one of the senior players is a role he embraces.

"I never wanted to be one of those players that jumped around for an extra tenner a week. I did the same staying at Potters Bar for two years, Wealdstone for two to three years.

"With each club I could have moved earlier but I feel it is important to serve the clubs well and try to make a big impact over a period of time.

"I also got lucky with the fact that this dub is so close to home, it is very convenient for me.

"I love playing for those fans that travel for us and the training ground is unbelievable, I don't believe you are going to get any better training grounds in this league, let alone League One."

Not known to many, Pett's first working relationship with Darren Sarll goes back many years.

"I actually did the college scheme here at Stevenage. That was straight out of school from leaving Year 11, so instead of sixth form I did two years at Hitchin.

"The first year was under the gaffer and the second year under Steven Payne when Darren went to Brentford.

"I learnt a lot from Steve and give credit to him for the kind of player I am today. I learnt a lot that year and have a lot of good memories. I really enjoyed college."

Pett then joined Potters Bar Town at 17 where he would soon become club captain. Whilst playing part-time, he started a fulltime job at Dame Alice Owen's School as a PE teacher.

After two seasons as the standout player at the club, Pett joined Wealdstone at the age of 20. Despite a good start to his career on the pitch, Pett kept all options open as he enrolled at University to study for a Sporting Exercice Science degree whilst at Wealdstone.

"Wealdstone was probably my best memories as a footballer. We were really successful, won a number of titles and I made friends that I will stay in touch with forever; you just don't get that bond in normal teams."

After two seasons at Wealdstone, rumours began to circulate about his next move as teams in the EFL began to show interest.

"That was a crazy time; I remember being away on holiday at the time. The amount of times you heard people whispering Who are you going to sign for?

"At the end of my final season, I think we had won the league already and Graham Westley got me in on a trial.

"it was a two-day trial and I did alright. It was all a bit daunting at the time, but I remember speaking to Graham after and he asked me a few things about what I would want to do after football and his words were "Well, we are going to offer you a contract." I was a little bit taken back and then it became a little bit real.

"There were sniffs from Luton and a few other local teams, but Stevenage were the only club I had trials with. It was one of them that were the first offer on the table and I didn't want to take my chances with."

"So, after that it was about what I was going to do about my Unido I give it up?

"Mum and Dad really pushed me to stay and kept telling me that I would read the rewards when I am older."

Now as a full-time professional footballer, it ended up taking Pett two and a half years to complete his degree, finally finishing this summer.

"My tutor has been fantastic - Neil Bangs at Middlesex University. He was really good for me and understanding given my circumstances. I don't think I have attended one lecture but I met him a couple of times away from them.

"He was always asking about my football and he has been to watch a few games.

"So I have got a degree now, which is obviously great to have in my armoury for when Lleave football.

"The amount of players who wonder what they are going to do after, I didn't want to be like that. It is also a nice little retort to the number of little comments people make insinuating I am thick – not anymore.

"I think I am lucky in the sense that I have come from having a job and living in the real world before turning pro.

"I know what it means to work and I think someone like Newts is the same, he worked 9-5 every day for however long.

"When you get an opportunity you have got to take it with both hands, some people take being a footballer for granted.

"But I worked hard and I am very glad now that I did those studies."

Pett thrived in his first year at Boro and cemented his place as a firm fan favourite, scoring goals and attacking full-backs with pace and wizardry aplenty.

The season ended at Southend United in the League 2 play-offs, a remarkable debut season.

"I think that was most memorable season in a lot of ways. We performed so well as a team and to make the play-offs was a great achievement. "Not many pundits would have expected us to make such a run so it was super exciting to be part of.

"There were a few words from friends and people in the game about what it would be like to work under Graham but I didn't know any different.

"At the time when you are doing all your running and your late training, that was normal to me and there was nothing I could compare it with.

"I think that is partly what Westley thrived off, the amount of players that he brought in who appreciated the chance that they were given...

"I still laugh about it with Ronnie and Daisy now with the amount of things that have changed. 'Remember doing this, remember doing that!'

"But at the end of the day, we got results and we got wins. It was never a bad camp and it was an unbelievable first year for me."

With Graham Westley out and Teddy Sheringham In, there was a bit of a culture change at the club that summer.

"Yeah that was a real change and a bit of a shock. There was a bit of banter going around our Whatshapp group about him coming in as manager.

"Obviously he is a massive name and a massive person in football, but even though it didn't go to plan, I still learnt a lot off him. I think things could have been a bit different if we could have avoided some of the big injuries.

"But at the end of the day it is a results driven business, the chairman had to make a decision and to be fair, Darren has come in and done an unbelievable job.

"I don't think we had an identity under Sheringham

and that was one of our problems.

"I think if someone was to come watch us now, they would be able to tell in 15-20 minutes what we are about. I think under Sheringham we didn't quite have that.

"It was a great experience for both us as players and him in his first job, I am sure he would have learnt a lot as well."

With Darren Sarll at the helm, Tom Pett and the boys came up just short in their challenge for the play-offs last season but the improvements made were clear.

"I think last year we did run out of steam. Teams managed to work out how we were playing and put more effort and time into spotting us. Godden's injury was massive, he was in great form and we just couldn't quite get over the line.

"But I think we have learnt a lot. The manager said he has learnt a lot about himself and about the team and you do learn from your mistakes.

"I think we have brought in a few players to improve us this year and it is the best start we have made in how many years.

"From last year, I think we have definitely improved so who knows what can happen this year.


"Every player goes into the start of the season wanting to win the league or win promotion. Of course as the season goes on you have to adjust your expectations but we believe in ourselves here.

"I think individually we are all up there. I just think we need to put it together as a team like we did last year in certain names.

"Last years' experience will only help us and with so many younger players coming through, we can pass on what we have leamt and help them as they grow."




They will speak to all members of staff including the First Team Management Team and observe not only our training sessions, but our games on Saturday and Sunday.

Now, though, he faces arguably the toughest test of his career after taking charge at basket case Sunderland.

Relegated from the top flight in May, the Black Cats now lie bottom of the Championship and last weekend set a new English record of 20 home games without a win.

So can 'Cookie' prove there's life after international success? Here a few who did - and some who didn't.

BOBBY ROBSON

Architect of England's finest moment since 1966, Robson famously led a Gazza-inspired outfit to the semi-finals of Italia 90. Unfortunately for the FA - and us - they'd already told the 57-year-old his contract would not be renewed.

That error was thrown into sharp focus over the subsequent decade as Robson won two Dutch titles with PSV Eindhoven, two Primeira Liga crowns with Porto (where he was known as Bobby-five-o due to the number of 5-0 victories), signed Ronaldo for Barcelona and won a Cup treble, then returned to England where he guided Newcastle into the Champions League.

England, meanwhile, bombed out out of Euro 92 in Sweden then failed to qualify for World Cup USA 94.

LAWRIE SANCHEZ

Michael O'Neill beware. Plucked from Wycombe to lead Northern Ireland in 2004, the former Wimbledon striker inherited a team that hadn't won in three years and was ranked a lowly 124th in the World.

By the time he left in 2007, they were up to 27th and, after a stunning 3-2 victory over Spain, top of their Euro 2008 qualifying group.

It was Premier League Fulham (to replace Chris Coleman, no less) who took the bait in a move that bombed for all parties.

Northern Ireland's fortunes took a nosedive. Sanchez, meanwhile, won just four of his 24 matches at Craven Cottage and was sacked with Fulham in the relegation zone. He wouldn't work in management again for four years.

FRANZ BECKENBAUER

When you win the World in your first managerial post, the only way is down. Nevertheless, Der Kaiser beat the odds.

After success with Germany at Italia 90, the legendary defender briefly took charge of Marseille, guiding them to the top of Ligue One and the quarter finals of the European Cup before firebrand owner Bernard Tapie moved him 'upstairs'.

He then had two spells in charge of Bayern Munich, winning the Bundesliga in 1994 and the UEFA in 1996. Beckenbauer promptly turned his back on management, leaving behind a career win percentage of 56 per cent.

FRANCE • 1988-90 AND 1994


A notorious pragmatist, Bilardo's attritional style which often saw seven players defending at all times - didn't make for a feast of entertainment. Luckily, his Argentina side that won the World Cup in 1986 contained Diego Maradona.

Thereafter, he wasn't so lucky. The Maradona he signed for Sevilla and Boca Juniors in the nineties was fatter, slower and rarely came to training. Bilardo lasted less than season at both.

By 1998 he was managing Guatemala and, a year later, Libya. His final stop was a short-lived stint at boyhood club Estudiantes before he retired to TV punditry in 2004.








Dave Flitcroft was announced as Swindon Town's new Manager on Monday 5th June 2017, putting pen to paper on a two-year contract.

Born in Bolton, Flitcroft began his career with Preston North End in 1992 and played for Lincoln City, Chester City, Rochdale, Macclesfield Town, Bury and Hyde before deciding to call time on his playing career.

He opted to cut his teeth in coaching midway through the 2006/07 campaign, joining old club Rochdale as Keith Hill's Assistant. The pair formed a close working relationship and they were both snapped up by Barnsley in June 2011. And it was at Oakwell where Flitcroft was handed his first shot at the big time after he was placed in Caretaker charge following Hill's departure during the 2012/13 season. He then took over at Bury in December 2013 and again performed miracles, steering the club away from the relegation zone and to an impressive 12th placed finish.

SWINDON TOWN

Both sides had comfortable passages to this stage of the competition. The Robins saw off Dartford 5-1 while Stevenage routed Nantwich 5-0.

After last weekend's defeat to Newport Swindon Town manager David Flitcroft told the Swindon Advertiser his side need to get to grips with playing in front of a home crowd if they are to mount a serious promotion push this season.

Their 1-0 defeat to Newport County was a fifth league loss at the Energy Check County Ground so far this season and has left the Town boss bewildered as to the difference between the club's home and away form. In a game which lacked any real clear-cut chances for both teams, Flitcroft's troops were undone in the 75th minute as Ben Tozer headed home to give Newport a lead.

Matt Preston came closest to levelling the score for Town with a late header, which crashed against the crossbar, but other than that, neither goalkeeper Joe Day or Town's Reice Charles Cook had a great deal of work to do.

After the defeat, Town are now eighth in League Two, a position propped up by superb away form. The disparity in results is so great, that on home form alone, Swindon would lay 20th in the table whereas on their away form, they would be six points clear at the top of the league standings.

Speaking after the game, Flitcroft admitted there was a problem with Town's home form which is stifling their season.

"It's a defeat and when you add that to another defeat, we spoke to the players, with January looming, there is a disparity in the home form," he said. "It's an individual responsibility to perform at home that we now need to focus on and make sure the players out there want to play at home and do it in a manner that I expect. I don't think there is a barrier in the players' minds, there is a disparity and I'm not going to ignore that and say it's not there, because it is.

"After 20 games we are still assessing the squad and if we have to recruit or do something different then we will."

The 43-year-old also said he expects many clubs will not only look forward to coming to the County Ground because of the facilities, but suggests their results may also provide encouragement for the visitors.

In Flitcroft's mind it is another thing his squad need to overcome and he wants to counteract. "My manager's office isn't far from the away dressing room and you can hear teams celebrate, because it is a big scalp coming to Swindon," he added. The players have to stand up to it. We are a big team in League Two and a club with tradition so the players will have to embrace that. When I interviewed the players before signing them we talked about the responsibility, but up to now we haven't done it as well as we have away from home. There seems to be a non-pressure away from home, they're good players but they're not making the right decisions at home."



The centre-back is a reliable presence at the heart of the defence.




John Goddard signed for Town on a three-year-deal in May 2016 after The Reds paid an undisclosed fee to Woking for his services.

MIKE SUMMERBEE

Brilliant winger Mike Summerbee was capped eight times by England after leaving Swindon Town. Initially with Cheltenham Town, he moved to the County Ground in March 1960 and was an important figure in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion success. He netted 39 goals in 218 League games prior to joining Manchester City in August 1965, amassing a vast collection of domestic and European honours under the Joe Mercer/Malcolm Allison partnership at Maine Road. Later playing for Burnley, Blackpool and Stockport County, he became a successful businessman and his son Nicky also starred for Swindon Town.

OSSIE ARDILES


Former Argentina international midfielder
Ossie Ardiles made two League appearances
for Swindon Town in 1989-90. Together with
Ricky Villa, the World Cup winner made
headlines with his transfer from Huracan to
Spurs in July 1978. He helped win the FA Cup
in 1981 and UEFA Cup in 1984, moving to QPR
in May 1988. Appointed Swindon's player-boss
in July 1989, he plotted their 1989-90 Second
Division play-off final success but they were
denied promotion due to an illegal payments
scandal. He took charge of Newcastle United
in March 1991, then managed West Brom and
Spurs before coaching overseas.

DAVE MACKAY

Former Scotland international wing-half Dave Mackay had a spell as Swindon Town's player-manager. He helped Hearts win all three major Scottish honours before moving to Spurs in March 1959, skippering their 1960-61 'double' success and two further FA Cup triumphs. He joined Derby County in July 1968 and was joint 'Footballer of the Year' as they won the Second Division title in 1968-69. Swindon's player-boss from May 1971 until November 1972, scoring once in 26 League games, he managed Nottingham Forest, Derby's 1974-75 League Championship, Walsall, Doncaster and Birmingham. He died in March 2015.

GLENN HODDLE

Ex-England international midfielder Glenn Hoddle was player-manager as Swindon Town reached the Premiership in 1992-93. Signing professional for Tottenham Hotspur in April 1975, he starred as they won promotion in 1977-78, then won the FA Cup in two consecutive seasons and the UEFA Cup in 1984. He moved to Monaco in July 1987 and helped win the French title in 1987-88, becoming Swindon's player-boss in August 1991. Scoring once in 64 League games for the Robins, he left to take charge of Chelsea after the 1992-93 play-off final triumph and later managed England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves.



BRIAN MARWOOD

Former England international winger Brian Marwood helped Swindon Town to win promotion to the top-flight in 1992-93. Signing professional for Hull City in February 1978, he was leading marksman in their 1982-83 promotion triumph and moved to Sheffield Wednesday for £115,000 in August 1984. He joined Arsenal for £600,000 in March 1988 and starred in their 1988-89 League Championship success, moving to Sheffield United for £350,000 in September 1990. Joining Swindon in March 1993, he scored once in 11 League games and joined Barnet in August 1993. He became PFA chairman, since working in the media.

TERRY FENVICE

Versatile defender Terry Fenwick was capped 20 times by England before joining Swindon Town. Signing professional for Crystal Palace in December 1976, he featured in their 1978-79 Second Division title triumph and followed Terry Venables to QPR in December 1980. He scored in the 1982 FA Cup final, then skippered Rangers to the Second Division title in 1982-83 and 1986 League Cup final. Reunited with Venables at Tottenham Hotspur in December 1987, he joined Swindon in September 1993 and made 28 League appearances while at the County Ground. He later managed Portsmouth and Northampton Town.

FRANK MCAVENNIE

Former Scotland international striker Frank McAvennie had a loan spell at Swindon Town in 1993-94. He starred for St Mirren before joining West Ham in June 1985 and was top scorer as they were third in the top-flight in 1985-86. Moving to Celtic in October 1987, he scored twice in their 1988 Scottish Cup final triumph and rejoined West Ham in March 1989. He helped win promotion in 1990-91, moving to Aston Villa in August 1992, then Celtic again. Loaned to Swindon in February 1994, he made seven League appearances before rejoining St Mirren. His colourful life story is titled 'Scoring – An Expert's Guide'.

NEIL WEED

Midfielder Neil Webb was capped 26 times by England before joining Swindon Town. The son of former Reading favourite Dougie Webb, he turned professional with the Royals in November 1980 and moved to Portsmouth in July 1982. He helped win the Third Division title in 1982-83, then moved to Nottingham Forest in June 1985 and scored in their 1989 League Cup final triumph. Sold to Manchester United for £1,500,000 in June 1989, he was an FA Cup winner in 1990 and rejoined Forest in November 1992. He was loaned to Swindon in October 1994, making six League appearances, then played for Grimsby Town.



PAUL INCE

Midfielder Paul Ince gained 53 England caps before playing for Swindon Town. Initially with West Ham, he moved to Manchester United for £1,000,000 in September 1989 and was England's first black captain. He amassed numerous honours, including the 'double' in 1993-94, joining Inter Milan for £8,000,000 in July 1995. Later with Liverpool, Middlesbrough and Wolves, he joined Swindon in August 2006 and made three League appearances while at the County Ground. He became Macclesfield Town's player-boss in January 2007 and has since managed MK Dons, Blackburn, MK Dons again, Notts County and Blackpool.

VEIL BEDDOCK

Ex-England international central defender Neil Ruddock played for Swindon Town during the 2001-02 campaign. A former Millwall apprentice, 'Razor' turned professional in March 1986, moving to Spurs a month later. He returned to Millwall in June 1988 and joined Southampton in February 1989. Appearing in the 1992 ZDS Cup final, he rejoined Spurs in July 1992 and joined Liverpool for £2,500,000 in July 1993. He starred in their 1995 League Cup final triumph, then played for West Ham and Crystal Palace before joining Swindon in August 2001. Scoring once in 15 League games, he has since worked in the media.



THE MOST FAMOUS MEETING BETWEEN STEVENAGE AND SWINDON TOOK PLACE ON A WET AND WINDY JANUARY AFTERNOON IN 1998.



Boro were sitting in an uncomfortable seventeenth place in the Vauxhall Conference at the time whilst their hosts were riding high in the second tier of English football.

But as the BBC FA Cup report stated that non-league Stevenage Borough pulled off the biggest upset of the FA Cup third round when they beat Swindon 2-1 away.

Giuliano Grazioli was Stevenage's hero, securing victory for the in the 65th minute with a superb goal from 25 yards. Mark Walters had put first division Swindon ahead in the sixth minute, before Jason Soloman equalised in the 23rd minute.

"WE travelled to Wiltshire in a confident frame of mind, really believing that we could pull of an upset," Neil Trebble, who was forced to watch from the bench while still recovering from a hernia operation, recalls. "We had the experience of the previous year's FA Cup meeting to fall back on and in the end the dreadful weather conditions were also a big leveller. When you look back on it that victory was a launch pad for many thinks at the club. It put us in the national spotlight and led to the two matches against Newcastle United.

"Aside from the result my main memory of the day was the dreadful weather condition that the Stevenage fans had to ensure. Looking to the right from the bench we could see the gale force wind driving the icy rain into the faces of the fans packed on the open away terrace. As for the game although we were a goal down at the interview to a great strike from Mark Walters



we felt we were the better side, and after the break, with the weather in our favour we made the most of it.

"The wind certainly played a part in our winning goal. An attempted kick from their goalkeeper came back in the wind and Gary Crawshaw was able to poke the ball through to Giuliano Grazioli who finished well. But after that I have to say in all honesty that Grazioli's dive as a celebration was the worst I have ever seen!"

Famous Cup

Lloyd Briscoe takes
his regular look
in the history of
football in the town.
This weekend he
takes a look back at
Swindon's success
in the League Cup
final in 1969 as well
as a famous clash
between the two
sides from the past.

Whenever I think about Swindon Town, I am always reminded of the Don Rogers era and that famous League Cup final tie with Arsenal in 1969. Way back in those hazy days, I seem to recall everything being black and white. Might have been something to do with the old telly my mum rented from Rediffusion, or was it Rumbelows?

January and February 1969 were one of the wettest months on record. The ground was saturated. In their wisdom, the authorities of the old Wernbley Stadium decided to hold the "Horse of the Year Show" on the hallowed turf, just a week before the League Cup Final.

Archives

Come the day (March 15th 1969), the pitch was in such a state that Arsenal wanted to call it off. However, Swindon Town of the old 3rd Division, were happy to play, so the game went ahead. The fact that the Wembley pitch was a quagmire with scarcely a blade of grass upon it was neither here nor there. The aristocrats from Highbury might have grumbled, but it suited Swindon down to the ground.

Both club colours are red and white. So, on the day
Arsenal wore yellow shirts and blue shorts whilst Swindon
wore an all-white strip.

Arsenal began the game by putting Swindon under pressure right from the off. Swindon's attacking play was kept to a minimum by Arsenal's more experienced defence and the game developed into a one-way affair.

The first goal actually came from Swindon on the 35th minute. Arsenal's Ian Ure made a complete dogs breakfast of a back-pass to his goal-keeper Bob Wilson, allowing Swindon's Roger Smart to capitalise.

The second half was again one-sided with Swindon's tactics being akin to that of the defence of the Alamo. The breach came on the 86th minute when Bobby Gould for Arsenal headed home to take the game into extra time.

A role-reversal took place where Swindon really took the bout by the scruff of the neck and started to boss the game. The heavy, claggy pitch suited Swindon and just before the break, Don Rogers was on hand to tuck home a loose ball after a goal-mouth melee. The Robins fans

In the 2nd period of extra time, Arsenal went all-out attack and threw the kitchen sink at Swindon. However, on the 109th minute, Ian Ure again lost the ball to Roger Smart, who sent a long ball over to a waiting Don Rogers, midway between the half-way line and the Gunners penalty area. Rogers ran – unopposed – all the way through the mud, rounding Bob Wilson to secure a sensational 3-1 victory for Swindon Town.

Thank you, dear reader for allowing me to indulge in a match that is imbedded in my memory of when I was very young.

Now to something more recent. January 3rd 1998 to be precise.

Round 3 of the FA Cup.

Having already disposed of Cambridge United in Round 2, non-league Stevenage Borough were looking for a big name in round 3. When Swindon came out of the hat, Stevenage fans were not disappointed. We'd never previously been to Swindon, so we were all looking forward to a great day out at a big club.

It has to be remembered that Swindon were close to the top of the 2nd tier of English football, whilst the Boro' were 17th in the Vauxhall Conference. This was a huge game for Stevenage.

It was a blustery day and with the wind at their backs, Swindon's Mark Walters scored after only five minutes. However, with three up front, Boro's equalised on 22 mins when Jason Soloman curled a left foot shot into the top corner of the Swindon net.

During the second half a storm of biblical proportions struck the game. Such was the wind that Swindon 'keeper, Fraser Digby, took a goal kick, only for it to roll back for a comer kick to Boro!

The frozen Stevenage fans were being soaked at the open away end, but cheered heartily when Guiliano Grazioli scored the winner for Boro. A crowd of 9,422 had witnessed a giant killing.

Boro' for the first time in their short history, were in the hat for the 4th round.



WHAT CAN BORO SUPPORTERS EXPECT?

Away fans are housed in the IP Office Main Stand (towards the St James' Terrace End) on one side of the pitch.



Due to the redevelopment works taking place at St James' Park, away fans are allocated just one section of seats (Block M), with means that just 350 tickets are made available to visiting supporters. This modern stand is covered and has good facilities, It is also free of any supporting pillars, meaning that you get a good unobstructed view of the playing action. I personally have enjoyed my visits to St James' Park, with no problems experienced.

WHAT IS ST JAMES' PARK LIKE?

The ground is undergoing somewhat of a transformation at the moment, with half the stadium seeing building works taking place. In October 2017 demolition commenced of the old Grandstand on one side of the pitch. This is being replaced with a new 2,800 capacity seated stand, that should take 12 months to complete. In addition, a new terrace is being constructed at the St James' Terrace end of the ground.

The existing IP Office Main Stand was opened in 2001. This smart looking all-seater stand, is single tiered, with some executive boxes located in the middle to the rear. It runs down one side of the pitch and has the team dugouts located out front. At one end is the Thatchers 'Big Bank' covered terrace, which was opened in February 2000 and replaced a former open terrace. This stand is quite impressive looking and with a capacity of just under 4,000, means it is now the largest terrace left in the Football League. Unusually both the IP Office Main Stand & Thatchers Big Bank Stands, have an open gap between the roof and back of the stands.

WHERE TO EAT AND DRINK?

There is a Social Club at the ground itself, which allows in away supporters.

Paul Stillwell a visiting Luton Fan informs me: "'Just a minute walk from the away end of the ground is the St Anne's Well on Well Street. Local ales, nicely cooked food, Wi-Fi, BT and Sky Sports and friendly bar staff. It is very popular with away fans." About a ten minute walk away on Stoke Hill, is the Stoke Arms, which also has BT and Sky Sports.

Otherwise, the ground is walkable from the city centre where there are plenty of pubs. Mike Faulkner from Somerset, recommends the Duke Of York and the Amber Rooms in Sidwell Street. Whilst Tony Fort recommends "The Victoria' on Victoria Road (follow Victoria Street from the back of the Grandstand). As Tony says: "You can park here (for free) but it is a good 10-15 minutes' walk from the ground and steep! The pub is great, very studenty, but full of friendly Exeter supporters. Both the food and ale were excellent both from a quality and value perspective."

Whilst Mick Hubbard adds: "We walked on from the city centre towards the ground and, instead of following Old Tiverton Road which leads to the ground, we forked right, up Blackboy Road and stopped at the Bowling Green pub, which is about a quarter of a mile from the ground. We enjoyed this pub very much - good beer (i.e. proper ale), comfortable and quite airy, very friendly (locals were hospitable and fans of both clubs mixed amicably) and a separate pool table for those so inclined. A definite recommendation."

HOW TO GET THERE AND WHERE TO PARK?

Leave the M5 at Junction 30 and follow signs for Exeter city centre along Sidmouth Road (A379) and then onto Rydon Lane (A3015).

Take the Sidmouth Road turn off (B3183) towards the city centre. Keep going towards the town centre as the road becomes Heavitree Road. On nearing the city centre take the fourth exit at the large roundabout onto Western Way. At the next roundabout take the second exit onto Old Tiverton Road, then turn left into St James Road for the ground. There is street parking, but quite a way from the ground as there is a local residents scheme in operation.




The nearest railway station is St James Park, which is adjacent to the ground and only a short walk away, However this station is on a local line and most fans will arrive first into the mainline stations of Exeter St Davids or Exeter Central, from which you can then get a local train to St James Park.

Exeter Central is the closer of the two mainline stations is just under a mile away from the ground and should take around 20 minutes to walk. As you come out of the main station entrance, turn left and proceed along Queen Street. As the road bends around to the right, continue straight on along the pedestrianised area. At the end of this area (where it meets the High Street) turn left and then continue along Sidwell Street. After the roundabout turn left into St James' Road for the ground.
