GOOD AFTERNOON EVERYONE AND WELCOME BACK TO
THE ENERGY CHECK COUNTY GROUND FOR OUR SKY BET
LEAGUE TWO FIXTURE AGAINST CREWE ALEXANDRA.

Let me start these notes by extending a warm welcome to David Artell, his staff, players, directors and fans of Crewe to Wiltshire for today's game.

We are all looking forward to getting back playing at home following a couple of really positive results here recently. We as a group have spoken

at length about turning the page on the first-half of the season in terms of our home form and we have made a good start having achieved back-to-back home wins here.

Our last home game against Forest Green was another very valuable 3 points and totally deserved. We were always comfortable defensively, we

limited them to very few chances and we were able to carve out some really good opportunities of our own.

We certainly bossed the game and I was delighted with the three points and I was delighted with the clean sheet because the back-three were excellent throughout. They really shackled Christian Doidge and

Reuben Reid and left them feeding off scraps, which not too many defences will be able to do this season.


Last Saturday saw us head to the Ricoh Arena to take on Coventry City and it was certainly a frustrating day at the office for us, that's for sure. In all fairness, the first goal is as good as you are going to see and it really was a quality strike, but you've got to regain composure after that, we didn't and we allowed them to double their lead.

You are always going to face an uphill battle from that moment on but I felt the lads responded brilliantly and the momentum was firmly with us heading into the second-half. It was brilliant work from Ellis landolo to set up Ollie Banks and then we probably created more chances away from home than we have in the last two or three games.

Luke Norris forced a brilliant save from their keeper before half-time and then how we haven't scored from the two goalmouth scrambles I don't know. The third goal, which came from our mistake, has then given them a real lift and killed the game off really. However, I always believe in focusing on the positives and it was a real attacking front-foot performance from us.

We have taken the lessons from that defeat and we have told the players that they need to be more ruthless in both boxes. That is vitally important and it is also important that you are ruthless at key times in the game. We need to make sure that we are more clinical in games from now until the end of the season.

I was delighted to be able to bring in Marc Richards last week on a free transfer from Northampton Town. Marc is a player I've chased for quite a while and we know what we are going to get from Marc. He thrives on balls in the box, his hold-up play is good, his link-up play is good and he leads the line with experience and guile. He has also come in and has been driving standards from the off and I am excited about working with him on the training ground.



We were also able to get a deal over the line to sign Keshi Anderson on a permanent and this is a big signing for the Football Club. I see plenty of potential in Keshi and now he is our player we can really drive home what we want to do with him and we can really develop him. The most pleasing aspect was that Keshi, despite having options, wanted to sign for Swindon Town and that is the type of character we want here.

To have Marc and Keshi on board along with Ollie Banks, who has been exceptional since he's come in, gives us even more options and with key players like Timi Elsnik and Chris Hussey coming back from injury, it really does give us great depth heading into the business end of the season as we continue to push to achieve our goal.

Let's keep driving forward together as one.





THREE IN FOR TOWN

It has been a busy January Transfer Window so far for Swindon Town who have made three signings so far in a bid to boost their promotion hopes in the second-half of the season.

Ollie Banks arrived on loan until the end of the season from Oldham Athletic two weeks ago and produced a Man of the Match display in his debut against Forest Green Rovers, before opening his account for the club away at Coventry City last week.

Town then bolstered their strikeforce with the addition of Marc Richards who joined on a free transfer after leaving Northampton Town, putting pen to paper on a two-year deal.

Richards brings a wealth of experience with him to SN1 having earned promotion from League Two on three separate occasions, while he has scored 187 goals in over 600 senior career appearances.

And the Reds were not done there, tying Keshi Anderson down to a permanent deal after the highly-rated attacker impressed on loan during the first-half of the season.

Keshi, who has contributed four goals and seven assists to the cause so far this season, put pen to paper on a two-and-a-half-year deal and will remain at The Energy Check County Ground until the summer of 2020.







However, results have picked up in recent weeks and they also enjoyed a



The last meeting between these two sides took place as recently as December with efforts from Kaiyne Woolery, Amine Linganzi and Luke Norris sealing a 3-0 success at Gresty Road in the final game before Christmas.

THE MANAGER

DAVID ARTELL

Crewe Alexandra announced David Artell on January 8th 2017 as their new manager after Steve Davis was relieved of his duties. Artell took control of the first-team with immediate effect.

As a former defender with Crewe Alexandra, Artell made 82 appearances, scoring six goals. He captained The Alex to promotion to League One in 2012 via the play-offs. Crewe defeated Cheltenham 2-0 at Wembley in what proved to be Artell's final appearance for the club, as he was not offered a new contract and he moved on to Port Vale and then Northampton before helping Wrexham to the Conference Play-Off Final but they lost 2-0 to Newport County.

During an 18-year playing career, Artell made 495 first team appearances for a total of 11 clubs. He won back-to-back promotions in his first two years at his home town club Rotherham United to reach the Championship and he also had spells with the likes of Shrewsbury, Chester, Mansfield and Morecambe.

Towards the end of his playing career, Artell was presented with the opportunity to play International football for Gibraltar and he faced the then World Champions Germany in a European Championship qualifying game. Artell made 7 appearances for Gibraltar before his retirement from football.

Artell embarked on a role within Crewe Alexandra's Academy as operations manager before he succeeded Davis in the New Year of 2017. Artell led Crewe to safety in EFL League Two, finishing in 17th place on 55 points.

David also has a degree in forensic biology after he graduated from Chester University in 2010.

BEN GARRATT



A talented goalkeeper who won back-to-back Player of the Season awards for Crewe in 2014/15 and 2015/16 after making his major breakthrough during the 2013/14 campaign. Arguably the most talented goalkeeper the Club has ever had in its academy, the 23-year-old was a regular in the England youth squads and was in the U17 squad for the 2011 World Cup in Mexico. He continued to impress for the Club's U21 side during the 2012/13 season, before making his Crewe debut on the final day of the campaign as he started in the Academy XI against Walsall. Garratt capped a fine 2013/14 season by being named the club's Breakthrough Player of the Season and followed that up by being named the Players' Player and Player of the Season the following year before again scooping the Player of the Season award last campaign. The 6ft stopper has gone from strength to strength, holding firmly onto the number one spot for 2015/16 & 2016/17 with now over 165 professional appearances to his name.

PERRY NG

Ng is a central defender that progressed through Crewe's Academy & broke into the first team regularly in 2016/17. The 21-year-old impressed for the U23's in the 2014/15 season, being named on the bench on four occasions. He continued to impress in the development set-up in 2015/16 and eventually made his first team bow as a sub against Oldham in November 2015, with his first and only start in 2015/16 coming in a 1-1 home draw with Burton. Having enjoyed an experience-gaining loan spell at Hyde FC at the tail end of 14/15, Ng made 20 appearances last season & has been made Manager Dave Artell's first choice right-back this term.

ZOUMANA BAKAYOGO

Bakayogo initially signed for Crewe on non-contract terms in January 2016 until the end of the 2015/16 season, before agreeing a permanent deal in June 2016. The 31-year-old former Tranmere left-back had been without a Club since summer 2015 following the expiration of his contract at Leicester City. The Frenchman suffered an ACL injury in January 2014 during a loan spell at Yeovil and worked hard behind the scenes for two years in a bid to return to the professional game after making his name in English Football with a successful four years at Tranmere. That work has so far paid off for Bakayogo, who now has over 65 appearances to his name during his time at The Alex and 23 appearances under his belt so far this term.

MICHAEL RAYNES


An uncompromising centre-half, Raynes joined Crewe in May 2017 as Dave Artell's first summer signing.

The 29-year-old penned a two-year-contract after rejecting a new offer from previous club Carlisle United.

Raynes started out his career at Stockport County in 2004 & he was on the books of the club for six years, making 159 appearances before joining Scunthorpe United in February 2010 for an undisclosed fee.

After 18-months with The Iron, he joined Rotherham for a season in 2011/12 before moving on to Oxford United for three seasons, where he made 92 appearances prior to linking up with The Cumbrians in 2015.

Making a total of 97 appearances in his two years at Brunton Park, Raynes opted for a change despite Carlisle making an offer to attempt to keep hold of their Club Captain.

BRAD WALKER

Crewe swooped to sign Walker for an undisclosed fee in the summer of 2017 from Hartlepool United after their relegation out of the EFL last season.

The 21-year-old is predominantly a central midfielder, but is equally comfortable filling in at centre-half.

He graduated through the youth set-up at Hartlepool, going pro in 2013 & making 123 appearances for the club, scoring ten goals, before leaving to link up with Dave Artell at The Alex. Walker has been a near ever-present for Crewe so far this term.

CALLUM AINLEY

Academy graduate Ainley had a surprise first call-up to the Crewe first-team squad in September 2015 against Swindon and made his debut late on as a substitute whilst still a scholar.

The promotion to the senior squad straight from the U18's came after an impressive start to the season, netting four goals in three games in the U18 PDL2.

Ainley dropped back into the U23's after three first-team appearances, but he was reinstated in February 2016 and moved from strength to strength to make a total of 17 appearances for the season, netting his first senior goal in the final home game of the campaign against Doncaster.


Last season, the 19-year-old featured far more regularly, making 31 appearances and he has been a near-ever present this term, contributing a number of impressive displays.

TOMMY LOWERY

Lowery was rewarded with a pro contract following the end of his scholarship in May 2016 after an impressive season for both U18 and U23 sides.

The youngster penned a one-year-deal, with the option of a further year, and made his mark in the first-half of 2016/17 before injury curtailed his progress. The 19-year-old made his League Two debut at Luton in October 2016, making nine appearances during that season. Starting 2017/18 in the first team starting XI & now fully recovered from injury, 'Miniستا' as he is dubbed by the Crewe faithful, is hoping for a big season in Dave Artell's side.

PAUL GREEN

Green joined Crewe in January 2018 on a loan deal from Oldham Athletic until the end of the season.

The 34-year-old started out at Doncaster in 2001, making 279 appearances for the Club over seven years before joining Derby County in 2008. He enjoyed four years & 143 appearances with the Rams before representing the Republic of Ireland in the 2012 European Championships, signing for Leeds United on his return. After two years at Elland Road, part of which was spent out on loan at Ipswich, he moved to Rotherham in 2014 & enjoyed a further two years with the Millers in the Championship. Green featured regularly in 2016/17 for Oldham, playing 47 times, but found appearances harder to come by during the first half of the current campaign.

CHRIS PORTER

Experienced front-man Porter linked up with Crewe in summer 2017 after the Club fought off a number of other suitors to land their man. The 33-year-old target man banged in 16-goals in League Two for Colchester in 2016/17 in his 39 game season. He started his career at Bury in 2002, scoring 20 in 78 over three seasons before switching to Oldham Athletic. Another 31 goals in 75 games followed at Boundary Park before two seasons north of the border at Motherwell prior to his £400,000 move to Derby in 2008. For Porter's standards, nine goals in 50 at Pride Park was a meek return before he got 23 goals in 118 games for Sheffield United from 2011-2015. He moved to Colchester in 2014 & enjoyed three seasons in Essex, scoring a total of 30 goals in 95 games. He has nine goals to his name so far this term.

CHRIS DAGNALL

Dagnall penned a two-year-deal with the Alex in July 2016 after the striker left Hibernian. The 31-year-old has scored over 135 career goals in over 500 games after starting out at Tranmere in 2003. A 2006 move to Rochdale is when Dagnall really started to hit the headlines, scoring 57 goals over four seasons, including 20 in one season, helping Dale to promotion from League Two. Two years at first Scunthorpe and then Barnsley followed, before Daggers spent two years at Leyton Orient from 2013, scoring twice on his debut against Crewe, before scoring one and assisting three in a 4-1 win over the Alex at Brisbane Road in 2014/15. After turning down a new Orient contract following Wembley Play-Off Final heartbreak in 2015, Dagnall switched to India for six months to represent Kerala Blasters before joining Hibs on a six-month deal in January 2015. The striker ended his debut Crewe season as the Club's top scorer, notching 17 goals in 2016/17 and he has seven goals so far this season.


ALEC DOWNIE

A Glaswegian, Alec was only 5'9" but was a sturdily built 13 stones. After failing to make his mark at Third Lanark, he spent two years - 1900 to 1902 - at the County Ground, during which Town struggled to survive. But he made a good enough impression to secure a move which saw him make nearly 200 appearances for Manchester United. Alec was at Gresty Road for three years from July 1911. STFC 90 apps



TED WARE

After making 100 appearances for both Brentford and Clapton (later Leyton) Orient, Ted was unable to establish himself in the Town side. He played in the early games of 1936/37 while Stan Wilcockson was injured but was then consigned to the reserves (where he scored eight times) until Easter. A switch to Alex brought more success and he was 'ever-present' there in 1937/38. STFC 5 apps / CAFC 68




GARETH WHALLEY

Gareth came through the ranks at Gresty Road to make his League debut there in September 1992. Six years later he moved to Bradford, quickly helping them to promotion to the top flight in 1999. Towards the end of his stay there, Gareth made a brief return to Crewe on loan. He arrived at the County Ground in August 2005 on a three-year deal, but he missed half the season through injury and made only two further appearances for the club. STFC 29 apps / CAFC 239



MARLON BROOMES

Short of central defenders early in 1997, Steve McMahon brought in the then 19-year old on loan from Blackburn. During a two-month stay, Marlon made one of his two appearances for the England under-21 side - against Switzerland. He did not join Crewe until twelve years later, spending the second half of 2008/09 trying to keep the Gresty Road club afloat in League One. STFC 12 apps / CAFC 19



FRANK HANDLEY

A native of the Potteries, Frank had made around a hundred appearances in three seasons with Bristol Rovers prior to a switch to Birmingham and District League football with Crewe in 1910/11. He signed on at the County Ground in May 1911, following Town's Southern League title success. Frank would enjoy another at Swindon in 1913/14, having already played in every tie as the club reached a second F.A Cup semi-final in 1912. He returned to his roots during the Great War. STFC 133 apps / CAFC 12




FRED CHANDLER

Hampshire-born Fred had made his League debut against Town, scoring in a 7-1 win for Reading in January 1933 and Swindon secured his signature three years later. He stayed just one season, netting six of his seven goals in the first ten games. Fred was sold to Alex for £100 in August 1937 and he remained at Gresty Road throughout the War, eventually joining the backroom staff there in the summer of 1947. STFC 22 apps / CAFC 201



TOMMY ARMSTRONG

A little striker, at just 5'6", Tommy had spent all his career in his native Scotland prior to his move to the County Ground at the age of 27 in August 1933. He took over from Town icon Harry Morris, who had been top scorer for the previous seven seasons in succession, but Tommy ended 1933/34 with a healthy 24 goals from 33 games. After two years with Swindon, he spent another two at Gresty Road, from 1935 to 1937. STFC 70 apps / CAFC 79



KEITH EAST

Like Fred Chandler, Keith was a former Pompey striker, signed for £200 by Bert Head in May 1964. But, despite netting 20 goals in 26 reserve appearances, he was given only four League outings in 1964/65. That all changed the following season under Danny Williams, when he bagged nine goals in a week in the November on his way to 24 in 35 starts. Keith left the County Ground in December 1966, later joining Crewe for the 1971/72 term - his last in League football. STFC 50 apps / CAFC 37



PETER COYNE

A former England schoolboy international, Peter had twice been allowed to drift into non-League football when his career was resurrected by Lou Macari in August 1984. He went on to net forty goals in three seasons at the County Ground, with two successive promotions from the Fourth to the Second Division. Crewe had signed Peter from Cheshire League football in 1977 and his four years with the Railwaymen saw him hit fifty goals. STFC 137 apps / CAFC 144



MARK GARDINER

The blond striker signed for Town shortly before his 15th birthday in December 1981 and in 1984/85 hit 11 goals in the F.A. Youth Cup as Swindon reached the Fourth Round. Top scorer for the reserve side with 18 in 1985/86, Mark was not given a single start in the Fourth Division title campaign. He left for Torquay in February 1987 and in August 1988 arrived at Crewe - where he would gain two promotions in seven years with the club. STFC 15 apps / CAFC 259

There seems to be a real buzz amongst the boys at the moment, what has been your take on the mood in the dressing room currently?




Having now been involved for a couple of weeks, is the quality there for you to see in terms of having the players to finish the job and achieve promotion?

Who is the best player you have played with?



Favourite holiday destination?



From our throw-in, it was a poor one, it was hooked to their player, two of our players stood off him and he was able to find the top corner from out

of nowhere. Plymouth's two goals were great finishes but it wasn't a true reflection on the first-half, although we were still pleased with the players at half-time and we told them so.

We found our way back into the game with Sol scoring at the near post, but then one of our defenders didn't deal with a long ball over the top, he tried to bring it down, he was caught in possession and we were 3-1 down, so it was a harsh lesson for that player and he needs to learn quickly to defend.
