
















DARREN SARLL THE GAFFER

I would also like to welcome the management and staff of our opponents today, along with the visiting directors and fans.

Last Saturday we finally recorded an away win, the first for far too long if we want to be up amongst the pace setters. Despite that very welcome result the lack of depth in our squad showed and at the time of writing we are working hard to bring in new lads to help us finish strongly. I never believe a play-off place is impossible to reach, as I've seen what a run of consecutive wins from January can do in this league. We did it in 2011 from a low base like this and we can do it again.

Our opponents today had a very good win over Crewe, coming from behind to snatch a 4-3 win and sit just outside the play off places. No doubt they'll be looking for a win tonight to start a promotion push, so it should be an exciting game!


The transfer window is always difficult for small clubs like ourselves, especially when funds are tight. January is divided into two different markets - those clubs that absolutely must bring players in, usually those at the top and very bottom and those clubs that will do so but only with an eye to the future and only if the deals are sensible. We moved Blair Turgott, Harry Beautyman and Rowan Liburd out to create some room in the budget for incoming players. So far we've added Tom King and recently signed Ben Sheaf from Arsenal on loan, taking our loan player count to three. We are hoping to add two or three more players by the time the window closes tomorrow - we have several in our sights, but if they are permanent transfers the deal must be right or we may as well wait until the summer when there is an abundance of players available on free transfers.

As some of you will have seen, the physical

demolition of the north stand has now started and we've started the journey to build a new North Stand. Part of our planning is to include a Supporters Bar that will be open before the game and at half time to fans in all home sections of the ground, if we can maintain the integrity of compartmentalisation. which we think we can with new ticketing in all areas. The visual improvement from the main A602 should lift the image of the club significantly and provides all sorts of sponsorship opportunities to help fund the club. As we move through the demo we'll update our Mini Bond investors on the design aspects of the stand. Exciting times, but we must deliver on the pitch to make it all worthwhile.



AJONAJA D LEAGUE APP

IT HAS BEEN FOUR GAMES IN A ROW NOW IN THE FIRST TEAM, HOW HAVE YOU FOUND THE EXPERIENCE ON AN OVERALL BASIS?

"Yeah it has been a really good experience, a real learning curve being thrown in especially against Reading in the first game.

"I have learnt a lot from in such a short period of time, which has been really good for me."

WAS THE FIRST READING GAME THE ONE YOU WERE MOST NERVOUS FOR?

"Obviously it was my first one which is an important one, but the importance of the game as well being in the Third Round of the FA Cup.

"It does not get much bigger than that, especially at a club like this where FA Cup runs are important.

"We did well as a team and obviously in defence to get the clean sheet. We probably deserved more out of it than what we got, but it was one of those games."

WHAT HAS BEEN THE BIGGEST CHALLENGE SO FAR?

"The physicality. Especially when you look at the Carlisle game with the two big men they played up front, it is a lot different to youth team football.

"You have got these huge, strong players you are coming up against each week and they don't care about how old you are."

WHAT DO YOU DO TO TRY AND COMBAT THAT?

"If I try and fight them, I will lose, so I have to try and be clever. I need be a step ahead and analyse how I can get the ball ahead of them.

"I cover around Jack, Jack covers around me, we have worked well as a pair to nullify what they have to offer up front.

"Jack is really good, he is always talking to me, always helping me out, but he expects the same back.

"It is good because I am held accountable and have a responsibility to help out the others too."

DID YOUR RUN IN THE FIRST TEAM COME UNEXPECTED?

"It was somewhat unexpected. I was always hoping to get a run of games but my aim was to be in the squad for as much as possible. To get the opportunity to start in the league has been brilliant and I am just trying to make the most of it.

"Like I said, it was my aim to be involved in the senior games, but I thought they would come in short spells."

TELL US A BIT ABOUT THE YOUTH TEAM, OBVIOUSLY YOU PLAYED A BIG PART IN THEIR RUN TO THE FA YOUTH CUP FOURTH ROUND, WAS THERE A PART OF YOU THAT WAS DISAPPOINTED YOU COULDN'T PLAY A PART IN THE TIE AGAINST MIDDLESBROUGH?

"It was a difficult one, because I had played the first three rounds and we had done really well.

To get called up to the
First Team was obviously
my number one objective,
so when that game was
scheduled for the Thursday,
and I was starting at
Morecambe on the Saturday,
there was no way I could play.

"The FA Youth Cup is as big as it gets as a youth team player, but it is a tiny sacrifice to be playing for the seniors."

WHEN DID YOU FIRST ENTER THE ACADEMY?

"I joined at the start of U15s from Sunday league at Hitchin Town. I actually asked the U15s manager at the time if I could just come along and train.

"I came for a few sessions and they liked what they saw, but weren't quite sure whether or not to take me on.

"Then there was a tournament we played down in Tottenham against the likes of Spurs, Arsenal, Barnet and Southend. I did really well and the gaffer signed me up after that."

WHAT WAS YOUR TIME AT SHEPHALBURY LIKE?

"They were good times. We trained three times a week and they used to merge the U15s and U16s together, so as a 15 year old you were playing up a year.

"As a 15 year old that is great because you get to experience playing against older and better players.





GOOD EVENING AND WELCOME TO THE LAMEX STADIUM TONIGHT TO SUPPORT THE CLUB AGAINST SWINDON TOWN.

As we enter February we start to shift the focus at the top end of the Academy - U16s - U18s to professional contract decisions for our 2nd year scholars and also to work experience opportunities for these young players so we can see them playing regularly against men.

In addition, having recently made formal decisions on most of our U16 squad we are now looking at how we can integrate them properly and consistently at U18 football, balancing that with their exam demands and also of course continually searching for potential scholars to come into the building at the end of June ready for pre-season.

Our 2nd years are all at different stages of their development, even now, and this is what makes the next decision so difficult. We do not have the benefit of an U23 squad, where we can be patient and take time with them—we have to make decisions shortly without the benefit of another 2 or 3 years development.

So the natural progression is to send them out into senior non-league football and see how they fare physically, technically and psychologically playing against men, many of whom have probably trod the same path as they are on many years ago.

Getting the Club, the level and the environment are absolutely key and is something we are very much aware of when placing young players up. Hopefully over the next few weeks we will be able to place the majority of these young boys into senior football and they will flourish and be ready for the next challenge that may come their way.


We currently have Claudio Ofuso out on loan at Mildenhall and this is a prime example of getting everything right to suit what he needs at this moment in time. He is scoring (and assisting goals) regularly and is receiving MOM awards on top of excellent feedback and we are really pleased with that particular wok experience agreement. The target is to replicate that for the remaining 2nd year scholars so that we give them the best possible chance of being successful.

Balancing all of that alongside supporting these players at the 'crunch time' in their career is something that I take very seriously as I am fully understanding they are all desperate to be footballers and want every chance and opportunity to succeed - who wouldn't?

Sitting alongside those players, working with them every day and feeling the strains and pressure they go through are our current 1st year scholars. They, along with our 2nd years, are a fantastic group of young men, who work extremely hard every day to get better.

We keep reminding them that every day is an opportunity to improve and they certainly have embodied that spirit. Arthur lontton has really suffered this year with injuries however his spirit and determination to get fit from an innocuous looking injury has been breath-taking. He has worked tirelessly to get fit, never complained, always upbeat and, as he nears full fitness, can look forward to starting his season as many of his mates end theirs! Together with Ryan Schmid, our 3rd year giant of a goalkeeper who has suffered two serious knee injuries they are real examples of good young men who's attitude and desire to do things correctly perfectly align with their playing abilities.

And so to our U16 players. They have been in and around the U18 squad the majority of the season and now, for those who know they have been offered scholarships, it's a time to cement their places in the



team, become an important leading figure rather than a supporting U16 player and start their developmental professional career now rather than losing six months and starting to get going in August.

The league splits in February and at the time of writing we sit fifth in the League and occupy a place in Merit League 1 - where the top sides from the South and South West come together to fight for the top place. We know from last years' experience it is a really good competitive League, one we were in with a chance of winning with three games left.

Journeys to Plymouth, Newport and Bristol mixed the games up and the boys then really stepped up and put in some excellent performances. Let's hope the current group can replicate those performances should we maintain our position and qualify for the League 1 spot.

CHRIS DUNLAVY

AS ALEXIS SANCHEZ AND A RELUCTANT HENRIKH MKHITARYAN PASS EACH OTHER ON THE M6, FEW ARE IN ANY DOUBT OVER WHO GOT THE BEST DEAL.

Manchester United are getting a striker of proven Premier League pedigree who scored 80 goals in 165 games for Arsenal.

The Gunners, meanwhile, get a playmaker who looked about as comfortable at Old Trafford as a Liverpool fan in the Stretford End.

Still, the Armenian will have to be very bad indeed before the deal looks as horrific as these misjudged swaps.

FABIO CANNAVARO AND FABIAN CARINI - 2004

To this day, nobody can understand why Inter opted to exchange a world-class defender for Fabian Carini, a young Juventus goalkeeper without a single Serie A game to his name.

Whatever the reason, Juve couldn't believe their luck. At 30, Cannavaro was in the prime of his career and, installed alongside former Parma teammates Gigi Buffon and Lilian Thuram, won back-to-back Scudetto. In 2006, he captained his country to a World Cup, won the Ballon d'Or and joined Real Madrid for £7m.

Though Carini would represent Uruguay for a decade, he played just four times for Inter and by 2009 was back in South America.

JAMES BEATTIE AND KEVIN DAVIES - 1998

No stranger to a duff swap (as manager of Inter, he gave Roberto Carlos to Real Madrid in exchange for Ivan Zamorano) Roy Hodgson was at it again as manager of Blackburn.

In 1998, the current Palace boss offered Southampton £7.5m plus James Beattle for in-form striker Kevin Davies. Bad move. Davies bombed, scoring just once as Rovers were relegated from the Premier League. Beattie, meanwhile, kept the Saints in the division, scoring the first of 76 goals in 235 games for the club along the way.

FRANCESCO COCO AND CLARENCE SEEDORF - 2002

So many times have Inter been stitched up that it's tempting to wonder if their transfer business is conducted by the Chuckle Brothers.

Amongst some serious competition, the deal that took Seedorf to City rivals Milan (for free!) in exchange for full-back Coco is probably the worst.

What inter got was a preening, injury-prone playboy more often seen on the cover of Hello than in the San Siro. What they lost was arguably the finest all-round midfielder of his generation, and one who would subsequently win every honour going with Milan. Crazy.

DAVID LUIZ AND NEMANJA MATIC - 2011

Though hardly a disaster on the pitch, Chelsea's coffers took a major hit when they gave Benfica Matic and £20m for Luiz in the summer of 2011.

Why? Because just three years later, Jose Mourinho paid the Portuguese champions £21m to buy Matic back, effectively raising the fee for Luiz to £41m Whoops.

But wait. Luiz himself was then sold to PSG for £50m and bought back for £34m. And, last summer, Matic was flogged to Man United for £40m. The upshot? Chelsea are actually up on this seemingly neverending deal by £15ml.




Dave Flitcroft was announced as Swindon Town's new Manager on Monday 5th June 2017, putting pen to paper on a two-year contract.

Born in Bolton, Flitcroft began his career with Preston North End in 1992 and played for Lincoln City, Chester City, Rochdale, Macclesfield Town, Bury and Hyde before deciding to call time on his playing career.

He opted to cut his teeth in coaching midway through the 2006/07 campaign, joining old club Rochdale as Keith Hill's Assistant. The pair formed a close working relationship and they were both snapped up by Barnsley in June 2011. And it was at Oakwell where Flitcroft was handed his first shot at the big time after he was placed in Caretaker charge following Hill's departure during the 2012/13 season. He then took over at Bury in December 2013 and again performed miracles, steering the club away from the relegation zone and to an impressive 12th placed

A WARM WELCOME TO THE LAMEX STADIUM TO THE PLAYERS, OFFICIALS AND SUPPORTERS OF SWINDON TOWN FOR TONIGHT'S SKY BET LEAGUE 2 FIXTURE. SWINDON, LIKE STEVENAGE, WERE VICTORIOUS AT THE WEEKEND, WINNING A TIGHT CLASH 4-3 AT HOME TO CREWE.

Swindon Town Boss Dave Flitcroft sat down with the local media in the wake of the thrilling 4-3 win over Crewe Alexandra at the weekend. "Sometimes the substitutions do work and sometimes they don't but you plan your changes before a game if it is going right or if it isn't going right. You've only got 90 minutes to affect change and sometimes you've got to be decisive. If they do work or they don't work I stand by that and you will get some right and you will get some wrong.

"The second-half performance was a real front-foot performance and there was a real purpose to what the boys did and Tails' (Matty Taylor) quality on the left-hand side was evident. He got the ball in a lot and we circulated the ball a lot quicker to him and Kellan (Gordon) and that was the change.

"When you've got Luke Norris and Marc Richards upfront, you've got to get the ball in but with better quality and we did that in the second-half really well. There are a lot of positives to take from today's game."

On Timi Elsnik's first goal he says that it changed the mentality of the players. "I said to the players at half-time that the next goal was important and, if Crewe get it, then we stay on task, we keep going to the game-plan but we keep getting the ball wide and throwing it into the box.

"With the wind changing we needed to make sure that we created a tempo and a purpose in their half of the pitch which we absolutely did. Going 3-1 down was the turning point for me and getting a goal back through Timi, you could feel that edge and you could feel that momentum shift. The players started believing, the fans were amazing in the last twenty-minutes, they were driving us on and there was a real atmosphere inside the ground. It was a real spirited fightback and I'm chuffed for the fans and certainly chuffed for the players."

Flitcroft was especially complementary about the home debut of Marc Richards. "He knew what I thought about him and he knew I wasn't just paying lip service. We had a real good meeting and the big decision was the fact that we do create opportunities and I felt as though from crosses we really needed someone to engage and get on the end of it.

"He looked at our stats, he looked at the stats from the other clubs he could have potentially gone to and he felt this was the right football move for him. The guy is pristine and the reason why he is still playing at that level is the fact that he keeps himself in absolute pristine knick. It was a good chance to say to the younger players after the game that it is a great opportunity for them to be in the same dressing room as Ben Purkiss, Matty Taylor and Marc Richards.

"They are great leaders and to draw that experience off them is great and I hope the young lads learn off them."






John Goddard signed for Town on a three-year-deal in May 2016 after The Reds paid an undisclosed fee to Woking for his services

Football historian **Leigh Edwards** profiles five
notable post-war
Swindon Town's,
goalscoring partnerships

ERNIE HUNT 8 Mike Summerbei

England U-23 striker Ernie Hunt was Swindon Town's leading marksman in four successive seasons including their 1962-63 promotion triumph. Born locally, he turned professional at the County Ground in March 1960 and netted 82 goals in 214 League games for Swindon prior to joining Wolves for £40,000 in September 1965. He was top scorer as they regained top-flight status in 1966-67 and moved to Everton in September 1967, then Coventry City in March 1968. Later with Doncaster and Bristol City, featuring in their 1973-74 FA Cup run, he ran the Full Pitcher pub in Ledbury, then became a window cleaner.

Brilliant winger Mike Summerbee was capped eight times by England after leaving Swindon Town. Signing professional at the County Ground in March 1960, he starred in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion success and was leading marksman in 1964-65. He netted 39 goals in 218 League games prior to joining Manchester City in August 1965, amassing a vast collection of domestic and European honours under the Joe Mercer/Malcolm Allison partnership at Maine Road. Later playing for Burnley, Blackpool and Stockport County, he became a successful businessman and his son Nicky also starred for Swindon Town.

DON HOGERS G PETER NOBLE

England U-23 winger Don Rogers scored twice in Swindon Town's 1969 League Cup final success. Signing professional at the County Ground in October 1962, he featured in Swindon's 1962-63 promotion campaign and was ever-present in four successive seasons. He starred as Swindon won promotion again in 1968-69 and the Anglo-Italian Cup in 1970, reuniting with Bert Head at Crystal Palace in November 1972. Moving to QPR in September 1974, he rejoined Swindon in March 1976 and netted 148 goals in 412 League games overall for the Robins, then played for Yeovil Town. He ran his sports shop in Swindon.

Striker Peter Noble was ever-present in Swindon Town's 1968-69 promotion and League Cup 'double' triumph. Starting with Consett, he joined Newcastle United in November 1964 and moved to Swindon in January 1968. He scored their winner in the League Cup semi-final replay and netted twice in Swindon's 1970 Anglo-Italian Cup final success. Scoring 62 times in 216 League games while at the County Ground, he joined Burnley in June 1973 and was an FA Cup semi-finalist in 1973-74. He was top scorer in 1978-79, then played for Blackpool. Later running his own sports shop in Burnley for 20 years, he died in May 2017.



ALAN MAYES & ANDY ROWLAND

Fast striker Alan Mayes was leading marksman as Swindon Town reached the League Cup semi-finals in 1979-80. Initially with QPR, he joined Watford in November 1974 and helped win the Fourth Division title in 1977-78. He moved to Swindon in February 1979 and formed an exciting partnership with Andy Rowland. Sold to Chelsea for £175,000 in December 1980, he rejoined Swindon in July 1983 and was top scorer in 1983-84, netting 65 goals in 151 League games overall before joining Carlisle United in July 1985. He later played for Blackpool, Wycombe Wanderers and had a spell as Harrow Borough manager.

Former England Youth striker Andy Rowland was Swindon Town's leading marksman in two consecutive seasons. Initially with hometown Derby County, he moved to Bury for £7,000 in August 1974 and was ever-present in 1975-76. He helped them to reach the League Cup fifth round in 1977-78 and was top scorer three times, reuniting with Bobby Smith at Swindon for £80,000 in September 1978. Featuring in their 1979-80 League Cup run and 1985-86 Fourth Division title campaign, he netted 80 goals in 287 League games while at the County Ground and was later the Robins' coach, serving them for 18 years.

STEVE WHITE & DUNGAN SHEARED

Ex-England Schoolboy striker Steve White was top scorer in Swindon Town's 1986-87 promotion success. Initially with Mangotsfield United, he joined Bristol Rovers in July 1977 and moved to Luton Town in December 1979. He helped win the Second Division title in 1981-82, joining Charlton Athletic as part of the Paul Walsh deal in July 1982. Returning to Bristol Rovers in August 1983, he joined Swindon in July 1986 and starred alongside Duncan Shearer. He was a promotion winner again in 1992-93, netting 83 goals in 244 League games before moving to Hereford United in August 1994, then Cardiff City and Bath City.

Striker Duncan Shearer was capped seven times by Scotland after leaving Swindon Town. He impressed with Inverness Clachnacuddin prior to joining Chelsea in November 1983 and moved to Huddersfield Town in March 1986. Joining Swindon for £250,000 in June 1988 and twice helped them qualify for the Second Division play-offs. He was leading marksman in four successive seasons, netting 78 goals in 159 League outings before being sold to Blackburn Rovers for £750,000 in March 1992. Moving to Aberdeen in July 1992, he later played for Inverness Caledonian Thistle and was Buckie Thistle's player-manager.



SAM PARKIN 8 TOMMY MOONEY

Ex-England Schoolboy striker Sam Parkin was Swindon Town's leading marksman in three successive seasons. He turned professional with Chelsea in August 1998 and moved to Swindon in August 2002, starring alongside Tommy Mooney as they qualified for the Second Division play-offs in 2003-04. Scoring 67 goals in 124 League games prior to joining Ipswich Town for £450,000 in July 2005, he moved to Luton Town for £325,000 in August 2006 and helped win the Johnstone's Paint Trophy in 2009. He joined Walsall in July 2009, then played for St Johnstone, Queen of the South, St Mirren and Exeter City.

Striker Tommy Mooney missed just one match as Swindon Town qualified for the Second Division play-offs in 2003-04. Initially with Aston Villa, he joined Scarborough in August 1990 and starred as they reached the League Cup fourth round in 1992-93. He moved to Southend United in July 1993, then Watford in March 1994. A key figure in their 1997-98 Second Division title triumph and 1998-99 First Division play-off final success, he moved via Birmingham to Swindon in July 2003. He netted 19 goals in 45 League games before joining Oxford United in July 2004, then Wycombe, Walsall and UD Marbella.

in the history of
football in the town.
This weekend he
takes a look back at
where the club was
ten year ago

This evening we welcome back Swindon – who were last here just 60 days ago in the 2nd round of the FA Cup.

As the end of January draws closer, I take this opportunity to reflect on our equivalent fixture ten years ago.

Peter Taylor had taken control of the reigns at Stevenage some three months earlier from the previous incumbent, Mark Stimson.

Having been in charge of twelve matches, Taylor's record had been won 6, drawn 2 and lost 4.

Archives

The date was Saturday February 2nd and Stevenage were away to Exeter City in the Conference.

Coincidently, Peter Taylor's very first game in charge of the Boro was away at Exeter on November 10th in the 1st round of the FA Cup. One might call that game a baptism of fire for Taylor as his new team succumbed to the Grecians 4-0.

Boro's previous match before this fixture was a nonevent 0-0 draw away at Farsley Celtic in front of a small crowd of just 500. In fact, Stevenage's fortunes had dissipated markedly since Peter Taylor had joined the club and the team that journeyed down to St James' Park in early February bore little resemblance to the team that went there in November.

The squad included Tyrone Berry who replaced recently departed Craig Dobson. Making his debut for Stevenage that afternoon was Sammy Moore whose job in centre-midfield was to team up with Junior Lewis and Daryl McMahon. So, the starting line-up for this fixture comprised: Alan Julian, Lawrie Wilson, Ashley Westwood, Mark Arber, Fred Murray, Tyrone Berry, Sam Moore, Junior Lewis, Daryl McMahon, Scott Laird and Steve Morison. Substitutes were Ronnie Henry, Ollie Allen, Mitchell Cole, Isaiah Rankin and Clark Masters.

It was evident to all that the Stevenage squad which started the season full of hope and anticipation was now a mere shadow of the outfit that had took the club to Wembley - for the very first time in its history some nine months previous.

With both sides adopting a 4-4-2 formation, Peter Taylor had to draw on all his experience to satisfy the expectation of the Stevenage faithful.

As referee Linnington blew his whistle to start the game, the roar went up from the 3,436 attending fans. Sadly, it proved to be a very one-sided match with The Boro coming off second best.

On the 24th minute, Exeter's Matt Taylor beat keeper Alan Julian to a high ball and comfortably headed home.

Eight minutes later, Steve Basham was on hand to tap home a rebound after Alan Julian had parried away a shot from Dean Moxey. Just three more minutes went by when Exeter scored again. Alan Julian was, unusually, beaten by a long-range shot from Adam Stansfield.

Half-time couldn't come quick enough for a struggling Stevenage and manager Taylor took the opportunity to shake-up the team by withdrawing Junior Lewis and Daryl McMahon and replacing them with Ollie Allen and Mitchell Cole.

The new formation failed to produce any results as Stansfield was able to score the Devonians fourth goal on 55 minutes with an easy closerange tap in.


So, twice in three months, Exeter had beaten Stevenage with the same result, 4-0.

The stats in this game said it all with Exeter notching up 9 shots on target with Stevenage none!

Peter Taylor said after the game: "We need to learn that we must work a lot harder, we must close people down a lot quicker and be sharper all over the pitch".

Ten years ago this very weekend. I remember it well. How time flies.



WHAT CAN BORO SUPPORTERS EXPECT?

Away fans are mostly housed in the Coppice Terrace at one end of the ground, where up to 1,800 fans can be accommodated after this area was recently extended.

If demand requires it then part of the Whinney Hill side can also be allocated. This small stand has a mixture of seating and terrace and has the benefit of some cover, unlike the Coppice Terrace which is open to the elements. Adam Hodson a visiting Stockport County fan adds: "As it was raining I decided to head for one of the 200 or so seats in the Whinney Hill stand. I found that there is very little leg room between the rows of seats, of which there are only four. I was though located very close to the playing action as I sat in the front row."

Whilst Shirley Lawrence a visiting Swindon Town supporter tells me: "We had a pleasant day at the Crown Ground. Before the game we went to the Crown Pub which was crowded, but as they had six staff serving, we were able to get our drinks relatively quickly. Inside the ground there was not much atmosphere due to the away end being uncovered. Although we had over 800 supporters who were in good voice, the noise just wasn't carried around the ground."

Although the Wham Stadium (but still known to many fans as the Crown Ground) is on the smallish side, it is set in a picturesque area, with views over fields and hills behind the Coppice Terrace at one end of the ground

On one side of the ground is the Main Stand, which at first glance looks like one stand, but in fact it is comprised of two small stands; the Main and Thwaites Stands. They sit on either side of the half way line, with an open gap between the two. Both are all seated covered stands and have a row of floodlights at the back

To compensate for the fair slope of the pitch which runs up along the ground from the Coppice Terrace to the William Dyer Electrical Stand at one end, the Thwaites Stand has less rows of seats than the Main Stand. Both these stands also have an unusual array of tubular steelwork, running across the top of them.

Opposite is a very small covered seated area, called the Whinney Hill side. This former terrace had seating installed before the start of the 2009/10 season, in order that the Club could meet Football League stadium criteria. Behind this stand is a relatively new housing development, which overlooks the ground, meaning that some residents can see the game for nothing.

Both ends are fairly new looking affairs, of which the home end, the William Dyer Electrical Stand is covered, whilst the Coppice Terrace opposite is open to the elements. The William Dyer Electrical Stand has now reverted back to being all terrace after having some rows of seating for a number of seasons. Another unusual aspect of the ground is that it has a total of eight floodlight pylons, with three on either side of the ground and another being located at one end. There is also a large video screen located in one corner of the ground in-between the Whinney Hill side and Coppice End.

WHERE TO EAT AND DRINK?

There is a Club Bar at the ground, however this is for home fans only. The nearest pub is the Crown, which is just behind the ground on the main Whalley Road and welcomes all supporters.

A little further down Whalley Road (five minutes' walk in the direction of the motorway), is the Greyhound pub, which is a Sam Smith's house. John Schmidt a visiting Darlington fan adds: "If you go from the ground to the main road and head towards the town centre, then five a minute walk away, down on the right is the Grey Horse pub, It is only a small pub but served decent real ale. This area also seemed to be good for street parking.

If you arrive early and have a bit of time on your hands then you may consider visiting the 'Peel Park Hotel' in Turkey Street. This pub serves food and is listed in the CAMRA Good Beer Guide. It also overlooks Peel Park, the site of Accompton Stanley's old ground. Go along Whalley Road (A680) towards the town centre. Before reaching the town centre turn left onto the 86237 Queens Road (if you miss this turning proceed into the town centre and turn left onto the A679 Burnley Road). Continue along Queens Road into Penny House

Lane. At the end of this road you will reach a T-junction with the A679 Burnley Road. Tum left onto the Burnley Road and then go almost immediately right into Alice Street. Then after passing Peel Park School turn left into Turkey Street. The Peel Park pub is up on the right. The red brick wall opposite the Peel Park pub is the only structure that remains from the Peel Park ground.

AND WHERE TO PARK?

Leave the M6 at Junction 29 and take the M65 towards Blackburn. Continue past Blackburn towards Accrington and leave the M65 at Junction 7.

Then take the left-hand exit at the roundabout onto the A6185 towards Clitheroe (this is in the opposite direction to Accrington). At the first set of traffic lights turn right onto the A678, towards Padiham, and then at the next traffic lights, turn right onto the A680 towards Accrington. After about half a mile along the A680 you will pass the Crown pub on your left. Take the next left into Livingstone Road and then an immediate left for the Club car park. The car park is on the small size and costs £5 and as you would expect it fills up pretty quickly. Otherwise street parking.
