MANAGER DAVID FLITCROFT

BORN in Bolton, he played in midfield for a number of Northwest clubs, beginning his career with Preston North End before a move to Chester City.

After racking up nearly 200 appearances for Chester, he moved to Rochdale, after over 100 games at Spotland he had spells with Macclesfield Town, Bury and Hyde before deciding to call time on his playing career.

He opted to move into coaching midway through the 2006/07 campaign, joining old club Rochdale as Keith Hill's Assistant. The pair formed a close working relationship and moved to Barnsley in June 2011. He then became caretaker manager after Hill's departure in 2012/3 season before being offered the job permanently

He then took over at Bury in December 2013 and again performed miracles, steering the club away from the relegation zone and to an impressive 12th placed finish. He was announced as Swindon Town's new Manager on Monday 5th June 2017, putting pen to paper on a two-year contract.



ASSISTANT MANAGER BEN FUTCHER

A towering centre back who plied his trade at Lincoln City, before moves to Boston United and then Grimsby

He then went on to havefurther playing stints with Peterborough United, Bury, Oxford United, Mansfield Town, AFC Telford United, Macclesfield Town and FC Halifax Town, before deciding to bring the curtain down on his playing career

After deciding to move into coaching, Futcher was at Bury alongside Peter Shirtliff, before becoming Assistant to Flitcroft in June 2015. The pair formed a fruitful partnership and helped guide Bury to promotion to League One in 2014/15

He followed Flitcroft to the County Ground earlier this season



LAWRENCE VIGOUROUX

A London born keeper of Chilean descent who started at Brentford and then the Spurs academy before moving to Liverpool in 2014. He was loaned to Town in August 2015 and joined on a three year permanent deal in July 2016.



CHRIS ROBERTSON

An experienced Scottish Centre back with over 30 league starts under his belt with significant spells at Torquay, Preston, Port Vale and Ross County. He joined Swindon this summer after having been released at AFC Wimbledon.



REICE CHARLES-COOK

After starting at Arsenal he made his league debut whilst on loan at Bury in 2014. He then signed a permanent deal at Coventry City in 2014 and made over 50 starts at the Ricoh before signing a 2 year deal at the County Ground in August.



OLIVER LANCASHIRE

Started his career at
Southampton and made his full
debut in 2008 but made only
13 subsequent appearances
before being released in 2011.
After loans at Grimsby he joined
Walsall but was released at
the end of the 2012 season. A
season at Aldershot followed
before a move to Rochdale
in 2013 then Shrewsbury in
2016. He signed a 2year deal at
Swindon in June 2017.



OLLIF BANKS

The January loan signing form Oldham started his career at Rotherham but came to prominence at Chesterfield, making 81 appearances between 2013-16. He moved to Boundary Park in 2016 and had a loan spell at Tranmere before his move south.



MATT PRESTON

The tall defender signed his first contract with Walsall in 2013 before being loaned to Icelandic side IBV, followed by a period at Barwell in the NPL. He was released by Walsall at the end of 2016-17 season, after 41 appearances and joined the Robins in September.



CHRIS HUSSEY

A London born left back that started his professional career at AFC Wimbledon making 70 starts between 2007-10. After a couple of loans he moved to Coventry in 2010 and made over 50 starts. Spells back at AFC Wimbledon, Burton Albion and then under Flitcroft at Bury, before moving to Sheffield United in June 2016, he was loaned to Swindon in July for the season.



BEN PURKISS

A much travelled defender who joined the Robins in June, he came to prominence at York with play off appearances before moving to Oxford United in May 2010, spells at Hereford and Walsall followed before joining Port Vale in 2015.









A product of the West Ham academy system who signed for Swindon, following his release by the Irons in August of 2017 The right back made his full debut whilst on loan at Dundee United and also had a loan spell at Wigan Athletic.



RUISING

The young defender suffered a serious cruciate ligament injury in the Stevenage game this season which has ruled him out for several months. He developed through the Chelsea academy before joining the Robins in January 2017

The experienced 28 year old midfielder has plied his trade at Exeter City, Stevenage, Portsmouth & Cambridge United before joining the Robins in June on a 2 year deal. He started out at the academies at Wimbledon and then Arsenal before being released and made his full debut for the Grecians in 2009.



A much travelled Dublin born forward who has made over 140 starts for 10 different clubs. He has featured for both league and then non league clubs before resurrecting his league career in 2015, joining Rochdale from Ramsbottom United. After 2 seasons at Spotland and 54 starts he joined Swindon this summer following a trial



The Congo born defender signed on loan on deadline day from Bristol Rovers. He started his career in South Wales with Cardiff before signing for the Gas after his release



The 23 year old Keeper joined Swindon last month after leaving Conference side Barrow on a free transfer. He has had spells at Reading, Bashley, Hungerford, Gloucester, Bath, Basingstoke, Peterborough & Luton where he played in their play off semi with Blackpool in 2017.



The 19 year old midfielder joined Swindon on a season's loan from Derby County where he made his debut as a sub back in August He has made a dozen appearances so far with 3 goals to his name.





MARC RICHARDS

A proven goalscorer who signed for the club last month from Northampton. He began his career at Blackburn with loans to Crewe, Oldham, Halifax & Swansea, before a move to Sixfields in 2003. Further spells at Barnsley, Port Vale & Chesterfield followed before he returned to the Cobblers in 2014.



The forward started at Brentford with loans at Borehamwood. Northampton & Dagenham before a move to Gilingham in 2014. He made 70 starts for the Kent outfit scoring 25 times before a reported £150k move to Swindon this summer



MATTY TAYLOR

The much travelled midfielder joined Swindon in August having left Northampton Town. He started at Luton and also played for Portsmouth, Bolton Wanderers, West Ham United, and Burnley .He has now racked up close to 700 league appearances with over 80 goals, he is especially dangerous with his trademark free kicks.



KAIYNE WOOLERY

LUKE NORRIS

The pacey forward spent his early years around the non league scene before being signed by Bolton from Tamworth for a £10k fee. After a loan at Notts County he was released and joined Wigan before a mid season loan to Forest Green where he scored twice in 16 appearances. He joined Swindon for £350k this summer.



KESHI ANDERSON

The 22 year old striker is on loan until January from Crystal Palace. He has also had spells away from the Eagles at Doncaster, Bolton & Northampton. He has nearly 50 total appearances with 10 goals.




PAUL MULLIN

The Liverpool born striker spent time at Huddersfield Town but didn't make a 1st team start before being released in2014. After a trial he signed for Morecambe and went on to make 122 starts scoring 25 times. He elected to move to Wiltshire this summer for an undisclosed fee.








Stevenage doubled their lead on 38 when Liam Nolan's misplaced cross field pass was picked up by McKee who advanced before firing into the bottom corner.

On the stroke of half time Sean McConville handed the reds a lifeline when, after a clumsy King tackle on Kayden Jackson, he curled the resultant free kick past Tom King in the visitor's goal and into the top corner.


The second half again started slowly and Aaron Chapman made a fine save on the hour as he deflected a Smith strike from distance over the crossbar.

Billy Kee pulled Stanley level on 70 minutes when he received a short corner from McConville in the box, turned his marker before slotting the









ball into the far corner.

Erico Sousa had replaced the returning Harvey Rodgers on the hour with Callum Johnson reverting to a defensive role, and the diminutive Portuguese was proving a livewire down the Stanley right. However it was the home goal that had the next close shave as Newton beat Chapman low to his right but the ball hit the post and rebounded to safety.

A few minutes later the home comeback was complete as Sean McConville jinked into the box and his low shot was deflected past King who was wrong footed, and the ball rolled into the corner.

Kayden Jackson went close to getting the goal his endeavours deserved but the keeper got enough on his effort to gather the ball before it crossed the line.

Stanley played out the remaining minutes and could have added to their advantage but settled for another massive three points.



MEET OUR NEW SIGNINGS

January was a busy month at the Wham Stadium, as John Coleman bolstered his squad with no fewer than seven additions.

Four signed on permanently, while three loanees arrived looking to continue the next stage of their development in their fledgling careers.

As ever we were first on hand to welcome all of our new signings, lets meet the new lads:

JIMMY DUNNE

20-year-old Dunne was the first of the winter arrivals, signing on loan from Premier League Burnley.

He'd spent the first half of the campaign at Barrow and impressed enough to earn himself a move to the EFL.

The Republic of Ireland-born player has played 21 games for the Bluebirds and scored two goals – he can play at full back or in the heart of the defence.

He made an immediate debut at the beginning of January

as a second half substitute at home to Chesterfield, before making his first start on Saturday.

"It's definitely a step up for me," said the Manchester United Academy graduate. "I've been on loan at Barrow and that was exactly what I needed for my development. "I think that there is going to be more quality and more pace in this league, it's going to be tough but I can't wait to get started.

"I've been lucky enough to be given this opportunity to step up a league, test myself and continue to learn about the physical side of defending."

AKEEL FRANCIS

No sooner was Zanzala's move announced, Stanley completed the signing another forward, free agent Akeel Francis, as Coleman looked to boost his attacking options following the departures of loanees Jonny Edwards and Mallik Wilks at the beginning of January. Francis signed a short-term deal following his release from Rotherham United and impressed the Stanley staff during a trial period prior to his signing.

"I like it here already," said Francis, who started his football career with Bradford City at the age of eight. "I felt comfortable from the moment that I arrived, I feel like it could be a good fit for me.

"I like to think of myself as a pacey and powerful striker who can finish, I hope I can show that here, I want to impress straight away and help the side towards promotion."







CHARLIE ROWAN

Charlie Rowan is a centreback and he arrived at Accrington Stanley, onloan from Premier League Watford, in January 2018.

The 20-year-old has captained his age group sides at Vicarage Road and comes to the Reds looking to make his EFL debut.

He's yet to make that debut but looks to be an able deputy should he be called upon. "I'm really pleased to be here," said Rowan, after finalising his loan deal. "This is my first loan move and I couldn't ask for more than to be at a good club, who are up there fighting for promotion.

I've watched the team a couple of times, they play football the right way and there are lots of good players here. Hopefully, I can break into the managers plans, get some minutes under my belt and help the rest of the lads continue picking up points.

"It's going to be a test for me, firstly breaking into such a good side and also out on the pitch I'm expecting it to be much more of a physical battle than I would get in development football."



DANNY WILLIAMS

Winger Williams completed a busy 48 hours at the Wham Stadium becoming the fourth arrival ahead of the trip to Cheltenham

The 29-year-old signed a permanent contract following his release from Scottish Premiership club Dundee.


Williams had spells in the non-leagues with FC United, Clitheroe, Kendal Town and Chester, before making the move to Scotland with Inverness Caledonian Thistle.

The winger enjoyed a successful time with Inverness, winning the club's first ever Scottish Cup Final and playing in Europe.

Williams played 108 games for Thistle, scoring five goals; he's yet to make his Stanley debut.

"This is a really ideal move for me," said Williams, who becomes the fourth player to join Stanley this week. "I've always wanted to play in the English Football League, to get a move to a club so close to home and pushing so high up the table is brilliant, who wouldn't want to get involved with a team like that.

"I'm a left winger and I've been playing up in Scotland for the last five years, I enjoyed my time up there, but I felt like it was time for a change and time to come a bit closer to home."



JONNY MAXTED

Maxted joined Accrington Stanley from Guiseley in the January transfer window of 2018.

Prior to joining, the 25-yearold goalkeeper caught the eye of the Stanley management team with two outstanding performances against the Reds in the FA Cup First Round.

Following an impressive performance in the original tie that ended 0-0, Maxted saved two penalties from Billy Kee and Scott Brown as the non-league side knocked Stanley out of the Cup in a replay. "It was one of those where I got the phone call and I just couldn't say no to it," he said after signing.

"I spoke to Paul Cox and he told me that he wasn't going to stand in my way, I'm thankful for that. It's brilliant that I've got the opportunity to come in to a side pushing for promotion.

"For me, it's a return to the Football League, which I've been out of for about three years now. I've worked hard for this chance to come and I'm looking forward to getting to work with the club."

OFFRANDE Zanzala

Highly rated Derby County striker Zanzala, signed a loan deal until the end of the season from Derby County. Zanzala had previously had a loan spell with fellow Sky Bet League Two club Stevenage and also Chester at the start of the 2017-18 campaign.

He made his debut as a late substitute during Stanley's 2-0 victory, away at Cheltenham on 13th January 2018.

He joined the Rams at the age of 12 and signed professional terms at Pride Park in March 2015, finding the back of the net regularly for the Championship club's age-group sides ever since.

In 2015/16, Zanzala played a key role as Derby U21s lifted the Barclays U21 Division 2 title ahead of Arsenal, before enjoying his first taste of senior league football during a one-month loan spell with Stevenage.

Speaking after making the move to Stanley, he said: "This is a massive chance for me, it's a new challenge and I'm looking forward to the first game and to show everybody here what I can do.

"There's a huge difference from Under 23s football to coming and playing men's football, the speed of the game, you have to adapt and change physically and you have to become a man and lead a responsible lifestyle."

Please keep walkways clear


