





CLUB MATTERS

ood afternoon and welcome back to the Proact Stadium as we welcome the supporters, directors and officials of today's visitors,

Unquestionably our last home game left us all bitterly disappointed, especially given the fact that the deciding goal came well into time added on. However, that as they say 'is football' and you only have to go back a few weeks earlier when we won ourselves at Yeovil by a goal scored at a similar time.

We all share that disappointment and please don't think for one moment that the dressing room is immune from that feeling as it was clearly etched on the faces of Jack, his staff and all the players.

They are not robots - they are professionals who care and feel it just like you. They are constantly under scrutiny as they are the ones out on the pitch trying their level best to win football matches for this club.

The league table does not currently make pleasant reading, however we must remember there are over 150 games still to be played in this division, so there will certainly be many further twists and turns before the season ends.

Many of you will already be calculating in your own mind just how many points will be required to guarantee safety. The truth is it's pure guesswork and all Jack and our players can do is what they have strived to do since they arrived and that's to accumulate as many points as possible.

Since 2011/12, League Two safety has been achieved by teams gaining a seasonal tally ranging from 43 to

51 points. Predictions are therefore somewhat meaningless with so many games still to be played, but the reality is that only after 46 games does the table seldom lie.

All I can ask is that whilst you are entitled to have your personal views on just how your club has arrived at this point, recriminations and accusations of guilt are best left for another day.

There are over 150 games still to be played in this division, so there will certainly be many further twists and turns

NOW is the time for you to continue what you have constantly done and that is to get right behind YOUR team and hopefully we can finish the season with a run of results that can secure our EFL status.

There is certainly no complacency here at the Proact. Yes, with the benefit of hindsight, some mistakes have been made but Chesterfield FC is far from down and out.

None of us have a crystal ball to predict the future, but we all know that at 3pm today it's game on with three more vital points at stake.

ON THIS DAY

Stuart Basson takes a look at Chesterfield's fortunes on this date in years gone by...

hesterfield's first Football League match played on this day ended in a 2-2 draw with Leicester Fosse in 1900 - and there hasn't been another draw since. The 16 games played in the league since then have ended in nine wins and seven defeats.

Our journey to Hartlepool in 1990 is remembered more for the weather than the result. In bright sunshine, Dave Waller gave us a half-time lead, but as the skies darkened and a blizzard began, the home side fought back to win 3-1. Last time out, a Nottingham Forest side including ex-Spireites Sammy Clingan, Junior Agogo and Ian Breckin beat Chesterfield 2-1 at Saltergate. Pulling the strings for Forest that day was our manager, Jack Lester.


Goalkeeper Charlie Bunyan played his last Chesterfield Town match on this day in 1894; although the side beat Attercliffe 4-1, Bunyan spent long periods of the game inside his opponents' half, joining in the attacks. A furious row with the committee afterwards led to his resignation.

A giant of Spireite defences past was born on this day in 1952. James Joseph "Sean" O'Neill turned pro with Leeds in 1969 but, after a couple of substitute appearances in the UEFA Cup, he was freed by Don Revie and became one of a number of astute Joe Shaw signings, joining Chesterfield in the summer of 1974. He filled six different positions in his first term, displaying a versatility that was to become one of his greatest assets. He soon settled into a defensive role, being equally at home in either full-back



berth or in the centre of defence. Although he liked to get forward and wrong-foot opponents with his trademark "O'Neill Shuffle". there were eight years between his first and second goals for the club. His most memorable, though, was a speculative lofted cross from somewhere near the touchline that drifted in to wreck Hereford's tilt at the highest number of consecutive clean sheets from the start of a season in October 1984.

Freed at the end of the 1982/83



relegation season, Sean became the steward at the Saltergate Club, while playing on a non-contract basis. Although the intention was that he would stick around a bit to help bring young players through, he remained in the first team for another three seasons. In March 1985, he received a Canon League loyalty award and enjoyed a testimonial against Sheffield Wednesday in May of that year. A year later, he retired, with the fifth-highest number of league appearances (442) for Chesterfield to his credit.

Sean played local non-league football while running the Red Lion, in Brimington, before becoming a milkman, then entering the insurance business. After a period as coach and manager of Staveley Miners Welfare, of the Northern Counties (East) League, Sean took up an appointment on the staff at Chesterfield's Centre of Excellence, as Under 16 Coach, in September 2000. He has subsequently coached at Sheffield United, Rotherham United and Doncaster Rovers, Sean retains a strong affection for his club and is a regular visitor to the Proact Stadium.



IN MEMORY OF BRIAN HUGHES A TRUE SPIREITE THROUGH AND THROUGH


Brian was born and raised in Chesterfield. From watching the Spireites at Saltergate in the Compton Street Stand to the Family Stand with his two children (occasionally dragging his wife along).

Moving from Saltergate to the Proact Stadium. Brian continued as a season ticket holder and also received a brick in the wall as a gift for his 50th birthday which reads 'Spireite til I die'.

On the subject of bricks, he couldn't resist the opportunity when it arose to buy more bricks, and lived on Spire Heights, on the site of the old ground, for the last five years.

After being diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease in 2016, Brian could unfortunately no longer make it to the matches. But he continued to follow the Spireites, listening to every match

on the radio, whilst simultaneously watching 'Soccer Saturday' and getting notifications through the BBC Sport app.



Brian was due to be at the match today to celebrate what would have been his 58th birthday on



avid Flitcroft took over the managerial reins at the County Ground following relegation to the basement and he's led the Robins to a play-off berth with a dozen games to play. On the road, though, they've picked up just one point in their last three trips. That draw came at Lincoln City and it was so nearly a win, the Red Imps equalising goals scored by ex-Spireites Marc Richards and Ollie Banks in the last minute. Since then, defeats at Accrington Stanley and Wycombe Wanderers have followed.

Away wins have been earned at Stevenage, Barnet, Crewe Alexandra, Yeovil Town, Port Vale, Mansfield Town, Forest Green Rovers, Luton Town, Morecambe and Carlisle United, those ten wins being a divisional high. Their last five home games have all been won, five wins following a 5-0 home defeat by Luton Town. Swindon nicked a home point against the Spireites with a last-gasp penalty back in November, one of only three draws they've played out in League Two this season.

The man in form is Marc Richards: the man who won a League Two title here at the Proact in 2014 had scored just one goal for Northampton Town this season before his January move, but seven goals in eight games has been his return since the switch. Ollie Banks, another 2014 champion here, has scored three in nine after his recent switch from a loan spell at Tranmere Rovers from Oldham Athletic.

VALIANT WIN

Paul Mullin scored a late winner for chasing Swindon as they edged past Port Vale 3-2 at the County The Valiants thought they had taken the lead inside



four minutes when Nathan Smith powered home but the goal was disallowed for off-side. Neil Aspin's side went ahead when Tom Pope headed David Worrall's free-kick across the six-yard box and Michael Tonge was on hand to slot the ball into the bottom left corner. Swindon levelled when Marc Richards headed in Matt Taylor's cross, before the Robins were then gifted the lead. Vale keeper Ryan Boot's misplaced clearance fell straight to Luke Norris, who slid the ball into the path of Richards and he calmly slotted home. The away side pegged Swindon back almost immediately as Cristian Montano headed in Tonge's corner two minutes before the

break. David Flitcroft's side then won it two minutes from time as Mullin flicked Kyle Knoyle's knock-down over Boot and into the net.

Stephen Wright spoke to sports editor Owen Houlihan from Swindon Advertiser and Swindon fan Simon Coy to find out more about the Robins' manager David Flitcroft and three key players.

DAVID FLITCROFT

Reporter's view: "He came in at the start of the season and his brief was to get Swindon promoted after getting relegated last season. He made a lot of changes and re-shaped the squad.

"There are a fair few loan players and it's basically a completely new team from last season. There's only one who plays regularly who was here last year.

"The jury's still out in some respects. The away form has been absolutely brilliant while home form hasn't been good this season, although it has been better in the last couple of months.

"They've won a fair few games and they're in promotion contention but they've also lost 13 league matches this season so I think a lot of fans are waiting to see what happens between now and the end of the season."



Fan's view: "He's doing a really good job. He knows this level well, having managed Bury and got them promoted.

"I'm very impressed so far. He's got a solid footballing brain and I like what I've seen.

"The team are playing the right way so I hope we hang on to him because I think he will take us up, whether it's this season or next season!

THREE TO WATCH



MATTHEW TAYLOR MIDFIELDER

Reporter's view: "He's a veteran who's been around for years and played in the Premier League at Bolton and Portsmouth.

"He's very good from set-pieces and has made a big difference, bringing a lot of experience into the midfield."

Fan's view: "Experience is the word for Taylor. He's got a good head on his shoulders.

"He scored a free-kick a few games ago which was absolutely phenomenal from about 40 yards

"He's a really solid, experienced player who brings a level of experience and calmness to the side. He makes a big difference."

TIMI ELSNIK MIDFIELDER

Reporter's view: "Timi was signed on loan at the start of the season from Derby County.

'He had two months out injured around November time and the team really missed him. Since he came back in he's made a big difference to the team.


"To be honest, he's probably a class above League Two. Time is very skilful on the ball. He can pick a pass and sees a lot of things that other players don't see.

"He just makes them tick in midfield and they always look like more of an attacking threat when he's in the team."

Fan's view: "He's one for the future. He's energetic and a good voung player.

"Timi is not even 20 yet but I think he's somebody worth watching. I suspect he'll want to impress against Chesterfield, what with him being on loan from Derby!

"He's young and he'll make mistakes but he will get better and better."





MARC RICHARDS FORWARD

Reporter's view: "He was released by Northampton and we signed him during the January transfer window.

"Marc has come in and scored a few goals already. He's made a big impact up front."

Fan's view: "Chesterfield fans will know Marc from his time at the club. He's been a journeyman throughout his career, but wherever he's gone he's scored a few goals.

"He's experienced and sharp around the box. If a chance comes. he takes it

"He's been an excellent player and a really good signing. We needed someone who can score for fun and so far that's what he's doing."

LEIGH EDWARDS

THE UNLIKELY LADS

Football historian Leigh Edwards profiles five big-name Swindon Town players not usually associated with the club



OSSIE ARDILES

Former Argentina international midfielder Ossie Ardiles made two league appearances for Swindon Town in 1989/90. Together with Ricky Villa, the World Cup winner made headlines with his transfer from Huracan to Spurs in July 1978. He helped win the FA Cup in 1981 and UEFA Cup in 1984, moving to QPR in May 1988. Appointed Swindon's player-boss in July 1989, he plotted their 1989/90 Second Division play off final success, but they were denied promotion due to an illegal payments scandal. He took charge of Newcastle United in March 1991, then managed West Brom and Spurs before coaching overseas.



CLENN HODDLE

Ex-England international midfielder Glenn Hoddle was player-manager as Swindon Town reached the Premiership in 1992/93. Signing professional for Tottenham Hotspur in April 1975, he starred as they won promotion in 1977/78, then won the FA Cup in two consecutive seasons and the UEFA Cup in 1984. He moved to Monaco in July 1987 and helped win the French title in 1987/88, becoming Swindon's player-boss in August 1991. Scoring once in 64 league games for the Robins, he left to take charge of Chelsea after the 1992/93 play-off final triumph and later managed England, Southampton, Spurs and Wolves.



MEIL WEER

Midfielder Neil Webb was capped 26 times by England before joining Swindon Town. The son of former Reading favourite Dougle Webb, he turned professional with the Royals in November 1980 and moved to Portsmouth in July 1982. He helped win the Third Division title in 1982/83, then moved to Nottingham Forest in June 1985 and scored in their 1989 League Cup final triumph. A former Millwall apprentice, 'Razor' turned professional in March 1986, moving to Spurs a month later. He returned to Millwall in June 1988 and joined Southampton in February 1989. Appearing in the 1992 ZDS Cup final, he rejoined Spurs in July 1992 and joined Liverpool for £2.5m in July 1993. He starred in their 1995 League Cup final triumph, then played for West Ham and Crystal Palace before joining Swindon in August 2001. Scoring once in 15 league games, he has since worked in the media.



PAUL INCE

Midfielder Paul Ince gained 53 England caps before playing for Swindon Town. Initially with West Ham, he moved to Manchester United for £1m in September 1989 and was England's first black captain. He amassed numerous honours, including the 'double' in 1993/94, joining Inter Milan for £8m in July 1995. Later with Liverpool, Middlesbrough and Wolves, he joined Swindon in August 2006 and made three league appearances while at the County Ground. He became Macclesfield Town's player-boss in January 2007 and has since managed MK Dons, Blackburn, MK Dons again, Notts County and Blackpool.







BLACKPOOL FANS PLAN **EFL PROTEST**

Blackpool supporters are planning a march at the EFL headquarters in Preston in March to demand the governing body take action over the club's current owners.

The Seasiders are still run by the Oyston family - who are at the centre of a longrunning stand-off with supporters.

Blackpool fans have been frustrated with the lack of response they have received from the EFL over their current owners and feel that a protest is the only way to get through to them.

The march has been organised by a supporters group called 'The Tangerine Knights'. It is also understood that they are encouraging fans of other clubs to attend.

RISE IN DISCRIMINATION

There has been a 38% increase in incidents of discrimination across the Premier League and the English Football League this season. That figure includes incidents surrounding topics such as racism, homophobia, antisemitism, disability and sexism.

Since August 2017, there have been 111 incidents reported, as of February 2018. Sixty-four of those have been found across the EFL. At this stage last season, there had been just 29 complaints made throughout the EFL.

Kick it Out have made it easier for such incidents to be reported, which suggests why there has been such an increase. The EFL said: "The success and increased awareness of the Kick it Out reporting services, which includes the use of the reporting app, is having a positive impact as more and more people are becoming confident in detailing discriminatory behaviour."

ANNUAL EFL EXIT TRIALS

Young footballers hoping to revive their football careers and earn a second chance were put through their paces in the EFL Exit Trials earlier this month. These specific trials give players between the ages of 15 and 16, who haven't been given a contract with their former club, a chance to get a new one with another team.

Scouts from across the country attend in order to assess the talent that has slipped through the net at other clubs in the UK, in the hope of finding a player worthy of being given a scholarship.

Last year, 260 players attended the trials with 70 of them receiving interest from clubs. Two examples of players to have been picked out from an EFL Exit Trial in the past are Marvin Sordell and Theo Robinson - who both signed for Watford in separate years.

EFL TRUST'S TEN-YEAR ANNIVERSARY

Monday, February 12 saw a special celebration take place at EFL house in Preston to commemorate ten years of the EFL Trust - the official charity of the EFL. The Trust helps to improve the lives and communities across the country through the power of sport.

Hayley McQueen hosted the event to mark ten years and was joined by Mike Phelan as well as EFL chief executive Shaun Harvey. The afternoon saw a variety of different stories and memories shared from the ten years since the EFL Trust was founded.

Since being set up in 2008, the Trust has been busy securing funding and distributing it to each of the 72 EFL teams, who help run projects to improve the community and society within the local vicinity of their club.



Carlisle manager **Keith Curle:**





SHIRT TALES

Continuing in the series, Pete Whiteley from the Community Trust looks at another memorable shirt from the past.



Before replica kit sales and shirt sponsorship, you might expect the same strip for season after season. However, occasionally the kit man might pull out a joker and this seemed to be the case in the 1972/73 season.

The official home strip for the season was the round-neck, long-sleeved blue with white trim worn since 1965. As for the previous couple of seasons, there was no badge. The shorts were plain white while the socks were white with blue hoops on the turn-over that many consider to be a classic design.

The first change to the official home kit was the use of contrasting red socks in a game against Port Vale. Despite the loss in that game, this odd change was repeated for a game against Bolton. At a time when match officials really only wanted a contrast on shirts, there seemed little reason for this!

In October's home game against Rotherham, the team turned out in short-sleeved with a v-neck. Regardless of the 3-2 win with a brace from Ernie Moss, these shirts were never seen at Saltergate again.

Oddly, for five games through the home campaign, there was an alternative home shirt that was the same round-neck style as the blue one but in all-white. This wasn't the official change colour as this was a red version of the home shirt. Third shirts were not generally used then and there seemed to be no clubs in the Third Division that posed an issue for both red and blue.

The round-neck crew style shirt was effectively retired that season with a collar and v-insert used for the next few seasons. The round-neck was part of the 2000/01 season but then, like most other seasons, we managed to stick to one kit for all the home games.





ETC ACADEMY DEVELOPMENT DAY


The Emerging Talent Centre recently took part in the Academy and ETC Development Day.





ince my last report, new Alfreton Town manager Chris Moyeses has continued to move the club away from the Vanarama National League North relegation zone. Two successive wins were followed by a 2-1 setback at strugglers Gainsborough Trinity.

The Reds soon got back to winning ways with a good 2-1 home win over Tamworth, Alfreton coming back from a goal behind with goals from Brendan Daniels and former Spireite Craig Westcarr, who scored a late penalty.

This was followed by a narrow 3-2 defeat to league leaders Salford City, Alfreton's goals coming from Luke Shiels and a last-minute effort from Marcus Marshall to leave them in 16th place, five points above the relegation places.

Alfreton have still to play their postponed Derbyshire Senior Cup semi-final tie with Ilkeston Town at the Impact Arena.

All our sides in the Evostik Northern Premier Divisions are now holding mid-table positions.

In the Premier Division, Mickleover Sports are highest placed in 13th position. Their most recent game saw them go down 3-1 at promotion-seeking Warrington

Buxton are three places lower in 15th position, having recently



parted company with manager Martin Mackintosh, Former Doncaster Rovers defender Tim Rvan has taken over in a caretaker capacity. Their most recent results have seen two away defeats to Stourbridge and Barwell Town, both by 2-1 score lines.


You and Louis know each other very well what do you think are Louis' strengths as a player?


How are settling in at the club, Louis?

Mark Innes was a versatile player who spent over three years with Chesterfield after arriving from Oldham Athletic, initially on loan. Nick Johnson spoke to the 39-year-old Scot about his time at the club and found out what he is doing now...



ark joined Chesterfield from Oldham in a loan swap deal in 2001 which also saw Mark Allott arrive at Saltergate, with David Reeves moving in the opposite direction. A change of manager led to a period of uncertainty before Mark signed permanently.

"Nicky Law left and went to Bradford City so I was a bit unsure what was going to happen," he admitted. "David Rushbury took temporary charge and then they offered me a twoand-a-half-year contract. Me and Mark Allott both agreed to sign and then David Rushbury got the job for the rest of the season and the following season.

"I enjoyed it at Chesterfield. Even though Saltergate wasn't the best or the prettiest stadium in the world, it was still a good place to play. The fans were close to the pitch, which generated a good atmosphere and there was a good team spirit at the club.

"We played some good football and had a good group of lads. We had a good social life, with team bonding nights out and things like that. The only downside was that while I was there, I picked up quite a few injuries and I missed a few games."

Reflecting on his departure from

the club, Mark said: "The week before Roy McFarland said he was going to let me go, I'd played in the first team and in my opinion and I think in the supporters' opinion, I'd had a good match, so it was a bit of a surprise.

"He wanted somebody in that he had a chance of getting and he said to me that he needed to get a player out in order to get this player in. Because I'd had a few injuries, it hadn't helped me and I think that's why he said I could go."



After a spell at Port Vale, Mark dropped down into non-league, playing for Hyde United, New Mills and Mossley. He ran a tiling business with a friend for a few years before deciding that he wanted to get involved in coaching youngsters. "I started doing my badges and ran football courses for a number of years," Mark explained.

"Then I got in at Rochdale with the youth academy for a year before setting up my own coaching academy three years ago - which I run in Oldham, for children aged 2-11 years old - and that's going well. I'm also working as a PE teacher in schools from Monday to Thursday.

"I have a toddler academy on a Saturday for 2-5 year olds. That's all about the balance, agility, coordination and things like that. Then on Friday nights I've got my junior academy for 5-11 year olds. It's good to be involved in some sort of capacity and I'm really enjoying it."

Mark retains an interest in the club and hopes to visit the Proact. "Mark Allott is still a good pal of mine and we've spoken a couple of times about coming back and watching a game," he added. "I've not been to the new stadium, so it would be nice to come down and watch a game."




