et me start by extending a warm welcome to Gary Johnson, his staff, the players, directors and the supporters of our visitors to Wiltshire today.


I will be honest and admit that I didn't expect to be writing these notes at this stage of my career, but things change quickly in football and I am honoured to have been asked to take charge of this football club on an interim basis. I have thoroughly enjoyed my time here so far and my promise to you is that I will do whatever I can to help the club whether I'm in charge for a week or longer.

It all started with a phone call from the Chairman at 5pm last Wednesday, explaining what had happened with David and Ben. I was then asked if I would be comfortable to oversee first-team affairs for the game against Yeovil, to which I replied of course. I have spent the last seven years completing my coaching qualifications and I am comfortable with my coaching style and knowledge.

I spoke to my wife, kids and family and with their support it was clear that this was an opportunity I should take. Any manager also needs the support of the players and staff which I feel at the present time I have.

After addressing the players and staff on Thursday morning we had a high tempo training session to which the lads fully committed. The weather obviously played havoc with our schedule but we found an indoor facility on Friday and we worked hard, whilst having a bit of fun as well. With the game cancelled on Saturday the players reported to the ground for a gym session. Sunday was a day off as I believe rest is important to.

I met with the Chairman on Sunday where it was agreed that I would continue to take charge of the team for today's game, so it was then all



hands to the pump to plan the training schedule for the week.

I am really enjoying the role, it is a bit of a shift obviously from what I've been used to as a player, but this

is what I've been working towards. This opportunity has arisen for me and I am going to give it everything I've got. I have asked the players, as a minimum to give me 100% effort 100% of the time.

Finally, we're seventh in the league and we're five points off automatic promotion with eleven games to go - they are the facts. So, my message to you all is t

message to you all is that any team who represents me as interim manager needs to be prepared to sacrifice 8 weeks of their life for, quite possibly the best feeling in football.

Enjoy the game today.







# CHELTENHAM TOWN

The Robins will arrive at The Energy Check County Ground today keen to make it a double after beating Town at Whaddon Road earlier in the season.

It looks likely to be another mid-table finish for Cheltenham this term with Gary Johnson continuing to do a sterling job on a very limited budget. Town currently lie in 16th place in the table and a victory today would only further cement their placed in the middle of the standings.


Much of Cheltenham's success this season has been down to the stunning

form of striker Mohammed Eisa, who has plundered 18 goals so far in what has been a breakthrough season for the attacker. He will no doubt be looking to reach the twenty-goal plateau between now and the end of the season and his form will be crucial to Cheltenham's hopes of finishing this season with a flourish.

The last meeting between these two sides ended in defeat for Swindon with a late, late effort from Danny Wright securing a 2-1 win for Cheltenham at Whaddon Road.

# THE MANAGER GARY JOHNSON

Johnson joined Cheltenham at the end of the 2014/15 season in an attempt to keep the Robins up but he was left with too much to do.

He did, however, guide Cheltenham back to the Football League at the first attempt just one season later. Before joining Cheltenham, Gary achieved success with Yeovil Town and Bristol City, taking both to the Championship. He has also had a stint in international management with Latvia.

As a player, Johnson turned professional with Watford at the age of eighteen but soon opted for a move to Sweden where he joined Malmo FF, combining his playing duties whilst running a successful football holiday business. After returning to these shores, he played part-time football in non-league for Soham Town Rangers, Newmarket Town and Cambridge United.

After hanging up his boots, Johnson spent six years studying for his coaching badges and earned his first managerial job in 1986 when he took over at Newmarket Town. Stints with Cambridge United, Kettering Town and the Latvian National Team followed before he was appointed as the new Manager of Yeovil Town in 2001.

Gary, who's son Lee is the current Boss of Bristol City, guided the Glovers to FA Trophy glory in his first year in charge after beating Stevenage 2-0 in the Final, before romping to the Conference Title the following season in emphatic fashion. They also won the Division Three Title in style and those exploits saw Johnson go on to manage at a higher level with Bristol City, Peterborough United and Northampton Town before returning to Yeovil for a second spell in January 2012.

And Johnson's golden touch with the Glovers continued as he led them to a historic promotion to the Championship in May 2013 - the first time in its history that the club had reached the second tier of English football.

Johnson took over at Cheltenham in March 2015 and he has led them to 16th in the table this season with only a handful of games remaining in the 2017/18 campaign.

# SCOTT FLINDERS

Flinders started his career at Barnsley, making his debut in 2005. In the same year he made five appearances for England Under-20s. The Rotherhamborn 'keeper moved to Crystal Palace in 2006 and had loan spells at Gillingham, Brighton, Yeovil, Blackpool and Falkirk before making a permanent move to Hartlepool in 2009. Flinders went on to make 252 appearances for Hartlepool, and famously scored with a 94th minute header against Bournemouth in 2011. He joined Cheltenham in August 2017 and was rewarded with a new deal in December of that year.

# JAMIE GRIMES

After spending seven years in non-league, Grimes made his Football League debut with Cheltenham in 2017 after a move from Dover. He appeared 72 times for the Whites across two seasons, helping them to a play-off finish. Grimes is a no nonsense centre back who has captained Cheltenham in the absence of Aaron Downes and Kyle Storer.

# TAYLOR MOORE

The young defender has represented England at every age group from Under-17s to Under-20s, captaining the Under-19s. Born in East London, he spent time in West Ham's Academy set-up before moving to France where he later joined Lens. He moved to Bristol City in 2016 and spent the second half of last season at Bury, making 19 appearances to help the Manchester club avoid relegation. Moore joined Cheltenham Town on loan from Bristol City in August 2017 and has made over 20 outings so far.

# ILIAS CHATZITHEODORIDIS -

Cheltenham completed the loan signing of full-back Ilias Chatzitheodoridis from Brentford in January 2018. Chatzitheodoridis started his career in his native Greece where he combined playing for local club Mas Kallitheakos with training part-time with Arsenal's Greek academy. After impressing on trial, he signed a two-year scholarship deal with the Gunners in 2014. Chatzitheodoridis made 44 appearances and scored one goal for the Under-18s over two seasons. He signed with Brentford in the summer of 2016 before agreeing new terms with the Bees in 2017 until the summer of 2019.





# HARRY PELL

One of the key figures in Cheltenham's title-winning season, Pell has cemented himself as a real fans' favourite. Usually a centre midfielder, Pell found himself on the right towards the end of last season and finished with four goals in his last seven games. Never seen without a smile on his face, the midfielder signed a two-and-ahalf-year deal in January 2017 to remain at the club. His powerful running in midfield is a particular strength to his play.




# **KEVIN DAWSON**

Dawson teamed up with boss Gary Johnson following his move from Yeovil in the summer of 2017. The duo was previously together at the Glovers where they reached the Championship. Dawson can play on the right or centrally, and he scored three goals last season including one on the opening day.

### CARL WINCHESTER

Carl Winchester was brought in during the January transfer window of 2017, from Oldham, as Gary Johnson looked to strengthen his squad in the fight against relegation. Winchester is a nimble and fleet-footed midfielder with a good eye for a pass. Winchester has been named captain during this season and he's been a near ever-present.

# JOE MORRELL

Wales youth international Joe Morrell made his debut for Bristol City at the age of 16 and has recently spent time on loan with Sutton United and Margate. The central midfielder featured as a substitute in the 5-0 win over Plymouth Argyle for Bristol City in August before moving to the LCI Rail Stadium on loan.

### DANIEL WRIGHT

A bulldozer of a striker, Wright is a typical target man who can accelerate too. Wright scored 22 goals in Cheltenham's promotion season and also scored the goal that confirmed Cheltenham's place in League Two last season. He previously had stints with Gateshead and Kidderminster before moving to the LCI Rail Stadium.

# MOHAMED EISA

Mo Eisa was signed by Cheltenham Town in the summer of 2017 after an impressive record in non-league football. The Sudanese striker spent his early career in non-league football with Dartford, Corinthian and Greenwich Borough. At Greenwich he scored 57 goals in 100 appearances in all competitions before leaving the club in June 2017 to join the Robins. Eisa earned a new deal until 2020 in August 2017 after his impressive start to the campaign for Cheltenham and he is the club's top scorer this term with 18 goals to his name so far.

### CHRIS OGDEN

Chris was signed by Bobby Smith in 1978 from home-town club Oldham - where he had made his League in December 1971. He played in every Town game until losing his place at the end of January and, after making just two appearances in 1979/80, Chris moved to Rotherham. He Joined Cheltenham from Bath in July 1982, aiding them to the Southern League Midland Division title. Chris left in 1984 when work commitments took him to the USA. STFC 31 apps / CTFC 101



After 18 months at Leeds without a first team call-up, Harry came south to the County Ground in May 1935. But he made only seven senior appearances in three seasons - although he won Western League championship and runners-up medals with the reserves during that time. Harry signed for Cheltenham in July 1938, staying there until May 1940 - when he played the last of five games for Swindon as a war-time guest. STFC 12 apps / CTFC 48



## KEVIN BADDELEY

Stratton born Kevin signed for Town in 1981 after spending the first year of his pro career at Ashton Gate. After appearing in 90 League games he was on his way out of the County Ground when new boss Lou Macari kept him but on a monthly contract. The reprieve was only temporary as he signed for Wealdstone at the end of October 1984 and just a few weeks later he was back in the south-west with Cheltenham, where he stayed for two years. STFC 111 apps / CTFC 48



Signed as a part-time pro for Town in October 1938, Eddie had to wait until Boxing Day 1939 for his first team debut. His first lengthy run in the side was an 18-month spell at left-half from January 1947 until May 1948. After helping the Colts as player-coach, he left Swindon in 1952 prior to spending 1953/54 at Whaddon Road. Eddie's playing career came to an end after another spell as coach, this time to a US Air Force side based at Burderop. STFC 107 apps / CTFC 6



### CHARLIE HENRY

A former Town apprentice, Charlie spent nine years at the County Ground after signing as a pro. Starting as a full-back or centre-half, Lou Macari moved him forward to an attacking midfield role with great effect as he hit 18 goals in 37 appearances when Town stormed to the Fourth Division title in 1986. In 1989. Charlie moved to Aldershot and was still there when the club folded in March 1992. He spent the remainder of that season with Cheltenham. STFC 269 apps / CTFC 8





### BILLY TUCKER

With Steve Aizlewood about to depart for Portsmouth, Bobby Smith signed Billy from his former club Bury in June 1979. Town were involved in 17 Cup ties in 1979/80 and Billy missed just one. In December he came off the bench to head home a late equaliser at Highbury in the League Cup Fifth Round. Appointed reserve team coach a year later, Billy gave up full-time football to study accountancy. He left for Whaddon Road in July 1981, staying two seasons. STFC 51 apps / CTFC 40



### **BRIAN HUGHES**

After joining the County Ground staff as a 15-year old apprentice, Brian made his League debut on the same day as Charlie Henry - who came on to replace him - in August 1980. Given infrequent starts until after John Trollope had taken over, Brian had a run in the side from mid-February. He left for Fourth Division rivals Torquay in 1983, scoring in both games as they did the double over Town. In the first of four seasons at Whaddon Road - 1984/85 - he hit 27 goals from midfield. STFC 80 apps / CTFC 227




### HARRY MORRIS

Signed from Swansea Town's reserve side for just £110, Harry enjoyed a remarkable career at the County Ground. It started with hat-tricks in his first two games, on the way to a 48-goal haul in 1926/27 - when he netted in eleven successive games! Top scorer in all seven seasons here, Harry passed the 30-goal mark on four occasions and twice hit five goals in a game. After a year in Bradford, Rafa signed for Cheltenham in 2014 but was there only four months before he returned to Scotland. STFC 87 apps / CTFC 13



### KEN SKEEN

A product of the same Cheltenham junior side - Baker Street YMCA - as Mike Summerbee, Ken's career almost ended before it had taken off. He suffered badly burned legs in a camping accident and was out of the game for two years. Ken signed pro for Swindon in September 1964 but was rarely given a run in the side before making his mark in the F.A.Cup run of 1967. After seven years at Oxford, he joined Cheltenham in the summer of 1974. STFC 22 apps / CTFC 87



### ARNOLD DARCY

An early Bert Head signing, Arnold gave Town good value for their £1,500 outlay - staying eight years. He had made his League debut for Accrington four years earlier, in 1952. Despite his small stature, he fought off several rivals for his number eleven jersey - until having to give way to graduates from the club's youth scheme from 1961. Arnold left the County Ground in May 1964, spending the following season at Whaddon Road. STFC 238 apps / CTFC 40



Swindon's Wembley 1969 substitute WILLIE PENMAN - who passed away in December - was appointed manager at Whaddon Road in July 1973. His new post was intended to be that of player-manager, but registration rules prevented it as, a few weeks earlier, he had signed as a player for League of Ireland Dundalk. His former Town and Walsall teammate John Smith was in charge there, so after overseeing. Cheltenham fortunes on Saturdays, Willie flew out to Ireland to play on Sundays!





It must help to have come in and have played the amount of games you have


For sure. I wasn't sure how much I would play when I first signed so it is very promising to have got all these minutes and games under my belt so far.

You have come up against some big teams and some big strikers during your time here, how important has that been for your development?


Every striker offers a different threat so it has been interesting playing against different forwards and I feel like I take different things from different games and I look to apply them in the next game.
